Caking the rap

Spain's Supreme Court has ruled in favour of a National Court sentence of three and a half years in prison for the Mallorcan rapper Valtonyc.

The rapper, whose real name is Josep Miguel Arenas, was found guilty of glorifying terrorism, insulting the Spanish crown and inciting violence against politicians in some of his songs.

Arenas argued during the appeal against the sentence that his lyrics were protected under the right to free expression and that they

were not offensive.

The Second Chamber of the court rejected his defence, ruling that the lyrics lauded terror groups such as the ETA and GRAPO and slandered the former king Juan Carlos I.

The court added the rapper's songs contained explicit death threats aimed at politicians and that such content was not protected under free speech laws.

Arenas said he was being put in prison for speaking out against oppression and persecution in Spain which he added was and continues to be a "fascist state."

"I'm going to lose my job, be away from my family and friends for expressing myself," he said in a statement

Juan Manuel Olarieta, the rapper's lawyer, said he would seek to appeal the sentence before Spain's Constitutional court in a bid to have it overturned.

The lyrics cited by the court in their ruling included ones which said the Mallorcan politician Jorge Campos deserved a "bomb of nuclear destruction."

More than 200 cultural figures including writers and actors have said signed a letter in support of Are-

Russian drugs ring busted

THE trial of the Russian mafia in Mallorca has begun with the absence of its leader.

Two of the defendants, Mikhaili Rebo and Leonid Khazine, have had their prison sentences reduced to two years and 19 months respectively. They are part of an 18-strong Russian cartel called Tambovskaya which established itself on the island.

The court case started on February 19 without Gennadios Petrov, the head of the organisation who was arrested in his house in Calvia.

The Prosecution intends to fine Rebo € 1.6 million, and Khazine (who had mitigating circumstances) €26.000.

Lawyers for the defendants argued for their acquittal on the first day, but prosecutors produced nearly 500 pages of indictments in response

According to the prosecution, the criminal group consisted of individuals from Russia, the US, Switzerland and others in Europe who settled in the Balearies and the Costa del Sol.

Among other activities, the ring was guilty of murder, arms trafficking, extortion, fraud, forged documents, bribery, drugs trafficking and giving out 'beatings by order.'

Bulldozers began the demolition job on the hotel on January 24, and residents are also disgruntled by the noise pollution that has ensued.

A formal complaint has been issued to the council with an expectation of some form or cleaning operation or compensation.

The old hotel will be replaced by a new four-star resort which is expected to open in the summer of 2019.

Army barracks fight off sexual abuse

MILITARY justice officials have begun inquiries into two alleged cases of sexual assault in the Gerona and the Palma army barracks.

Two female soldiers have made complaints to army authorities over the accusations which reportedly involve a corporal and a lieutenant respectively.

The first case is said to have come to light after the alleged victim decided not to apply for professional renewal in the armed forces. Her captain asked why and the soldier made the accusations to him at the Gerona barracks.

The captain then informed General Francisco Javier Varela, the army's chief of staff, who has opened a disciplinary file and sent it to a military court in Cataluña. It is now reportedly conducting initial inquiries into the case.

The second case allegedly took place at the barracks of the 47th Infantry Regiment in Palma last November.

A solider there requested medical leave due to harassment she claims to have received from a lieutenant.

Proceedings for that case have been passed onto the Territorial Military Law Court in the city which has opened inquiries.

The lieutenant has also been assigned elsewhere in the army although it is unclear if this was in connection with the accusations.

Military justice officials will now determine whether the accusations need to be taken further. The Ministry of Defence has said protocol has been applied in the cases and both alleged victims have been offered psychological and legal support.


International Care Patient Assistance (ICPA) reportedly billed the hospital despite EU patients having health cards.

THE Balearic government is set to extend the size of the Albufera Natural Park by almost 420 hectares on its 30th anniversary of being declared a protected area. Francinca Armengol, the head of the government, said the expansion would help preserve and improve the site.



A MAGICAL display is taking place in the hills and mountains of Mediterranean Spain.

For a few weeks in January and February hundreds of thousands of almond trees erupt into blossom, with the countryside briefly transformed into a spectacular fairytale landscape of delicate pink and white hues.

Grown mostly in Andalucia, Aragon, Cataluña, Valencia, Murcia, form an important part of the local diet, being used to prepare everything from soups and sauces to cakes, pastries, marzipan and nougat.

And the country is now the world's second-largest producer of almonds after the United States.

More than 100 varieties are currently grown, but only five are produced on a commercial scale, with the marcona form - known as the queen of almonds - widely considered to be the best quality in the world.

Spring watch



A Harramacho looks on and (inset) revellers gather in the village square.

IT is an ancient festival of unknown origin.

Taking place in the hamlet of Navalacruz in the foothills of the Sierra de Gredos mountains, Avila, the Los Harramachos ritual is thought to be a pre-Roman call to protect livestock and children and boost fertility at the onset of spring.

During the event revellers dress in fearsomelooking costumes made from sacking, animal skins and natural materials, concealing their faces with animalistic masks.

And a number of different characters are involved in the annual celebration, which took

The Harramachos themselves are brash. masked individuals with a frightening appearance, although they do not participate in the ritual

The Heifer is the incarnation of evil and wears a set of cow antlers and a bell at the waist, with three black crosses painted on his face.

He chases women and lifts their skirts with his horns, before fighting and 'dying' in the village square.

El Vaquero carries chorizo, wine and bread, and traditionally rewarded children who rang

The mayor is the highest-ranking of the Fifths boys who turned 18 during the previous year and can be recognised by his black cloak and long stick that is used to leap the Chico River several times at a point of his choosing during a key part of the ceremony.

He temporarily becomes mayor of the village during the festival.





TEN members of a leftist group charged with public order offences over an antitourism protest have claimed they did not take part in the demonstration.

Five members of the Arran group. which organised the protest in Palma's harbour, said they were not in Mallorca when it took place. Another five claimed they did not participate in the protest which took place in July last year.

Two of the members have admitted

Two anti-tourist protestors 'fess up

they were at the demonstration, according to sources reported in the Spanish media. The 12 people charged are set to testify in court in hearings scheduled be-

Forty people took part in the protest against mass tourism on the island in the harbour area next to bars and restaurants filled with holidaymakers in July 2017.

A video posted online appears to show people setting off smoke flares and waving banners next to boats moored in the port. Police were able to identify the 12 people charged from the video and from witness statements. Authorities and restaurant owners claim the group went into the terraces of food and drink establishment and covered diners in smoke and confetti. Arran said it was peaceful.



Protest held against 'Catalanisation' of islands

AROUND 2,500 people took to the streets of Mallorca's capital to protest what they said was the forced imposition of Catalan culture on the Balearic Islands.

The demonstration, organised by the Mos Movem group, was called following the Balearic government's announcement that workers in the island's health centres would be required to speak Catalan.

Politicians from the Partido Popular and Ciudadanos, as well as Jorge Campos of the recently founded Actua Baleares regionalist party, joined the protests in Palma held on Sunday.

Campos said the Catalan language should never be made a requirement for medical staff on the islands and that health centres were losing great employees as a result.

Demonstrators marched from the Placa d'Espanya to the Consolat de Mar building carrying banners which bore slogans that said: "We are Balearic, not Catalan," among others.

Ursula Mascaro, a spokesper-

son for Mos Movem, said the islands were not part of an "imaginary" Catalan land.

"We do not accept the imposition of Catalan because we don't want it. We are bilingual and we understand each other, but we do not want to communicate in standard Catalan," she said.

The Obra Cultural Balear, a

pro-Catalan group on the island, said people on the islands had the right to speak Catalan and to communicate with hospital staff in the language.

Jaume Mateu, a spokesperson for the group, said: "We will not allow any retrenchment in the matter of linguistic rights, especially if that comes from the administration."

Wildlife trade pledge smacks of tokenism

SPAIN has announced it is to tackle the illegal wildlife trade.

It is the country's first crack at confronting the issue, and comes after a gang of monkey traffickers were recently caged by Guardia Civil investigators.

Animal rights campaigners will be overjoyed at the news the country long-known as the gateway to Europe for poachers operating in Africa and the Americas is finally acting to address the problem. But will the government's measures make a difference?

The official plan speaks of increases in funds for awareness campaigns and the provision of alternative livelihoods for communities involved in poaching, but crucially, it does not have a specific budget.

Wildlife trafficking is among the most profitable criminal activities in the world, worth hundreds of millions of Euros per year.

Demand is unlikely to be stemmed by an educational crusade, while it will surely be difficult if not impossible to convince local people profiting from the trade that they should seek new employment. Conservation biologists say that in reality, Spain will need to spend millions to make even a small change.

And based on previous pledges by a Spanish government which has a long history off flouting or simply ignoring environmental laws, the level of investment is likely to be lacking.

While this week's announcement has been widely cheered by animal lovers, including many readers of the *Euro Weekly News* website, time will tell whether it is simply a token gesture.

Exam cheats

TWO Nigerian men who falsified documents in order to take a Spanish language exam to get citizenship have been arrested by police in Palma after one of the teachers at the centre alerted the authorities.

Court ruling

THE High Court has ruled that two non-Spanish women who worked as prostitutes at a club in Palma were exploited and are entitled to €4,000 each in compensation for moral damage.

Proposed ban on tourist cars

THE government of Spain's Balearic Islands is planning widespread new climate change regulations in Mallorca, Menorca, Ibiza and Formentera in a bid to be greener and protect the 'endangered' environment from carbon dioxide

It is proposing to ban all tourists travelling from the mainland in diesel vehicles from 2025 and in petrol vehicles

By 2020, car rental firms will be obliged to have to have at least two per cent of their fleet in electric vehicles, rising to 100 per cent within the following 15 years.

And from 2025 islanders will not be able to purchase diesel cars or petrol vehicles from 2035.

It's currently estimated that 35 per cent of CO2 emissions in the Balearic Islands comes from road traffic, but no new regulations have been proposed for boats yet.

Island leaders also want the closure of all the power stations and want to see solar panels installed in large car parks, new buildings and industrial buildings of more than 1,000 square metres.

At the moment, only 2 per cent of the energy produced on the Balearics comes from renewable energy sources.

Local councils will have five years to replace all public lighting on the islands to LED

President of the Balearic government Francina Armengol said: "The rules place the Balearics at the forefront of the communities in the fight against climate change with measures that accelerate the transition from diesel and petrol to 100 per cent clean mobility, with electric public transport and vehicles.

"The goal is to lay the foundation for the future of the Balearic Islands to work fully with renewable energies and to grow smartly and sustainably, respecting what we most cherish: our territory and our environment.

"The proposed law is ahead of the fu-

ture and looks to the long term, planning the society we want on the 2050 horizon, with concrete and timed measures.

"It will allow us to fulfil the international commitments acquired in the Paris Agreement."

The proposals will have to go out to public consultation before being ap-



Airbnb facing huge fine for 'illegal rentals'

WORLDWIDE rental and home-sharing company, Airbnb, is facing a huge fine in Spain for ignoring the law and offering 'illegal' rentals.

The Balearic Islands government has slapped a

 \in 300,000 fine on the company for advertising properties that do not have a holiday rental licence - a measure that was introduced last August.

The company has 15 days to answer the charge and avoid the penalty.


Tourism officials on the islands have described the flouting of the law as 'very serious' and say the company has been repeatedly warned that what it was doing was illegal.

The €300,000 fine includes sanctions for advertising 20 homes in Mallorca without the legal require-

Airbnb says they haven't received any official notification of a fine and local families could lose €100 million because of the new tourist rental laws in the Balearics.

They estimate that last year the Airbnb community generated more than €500 million for the Balearic Islands' economy.

Airbnb says they want to continue to work with the government in the Balearics to develop a 'progressive home-sharing regulation.'

Justice at last

AFTER a decade of agony Helen and Len Prior have finally received a payout for their illegally demolished home.

"Now this is over, we just want to try and recover our lives, we have lost 10 years that no amount of money can ever replace," Helen said.

It comes as the couple, both in their early 70's, were paid a settlement of almost €236,000 by Vera Council.

Helen thanked lawyers Victor Martinez and Jose Contreras for their "hard work over the last 10 years," but pointed out that the payout is "very poor" since it does not even cover the original €350,000 cost of their

"The house was legal and demolished for political reasons, we were scapegoats," she said. "I was awarded €1,500 for 'moral damages' and my husband €7,500 for 10 years of suffering, ridicu-

"In any other EU country the amount would have been much higher," she added.

The Priors' story made international headlines after their home was bulldozed over 'planning irregularities,' although the couple insist the build was legal after the town hall granted them a municipal

construction licence in 2002.

But their two-storey dream villa was pulled down in 2008 and they were forced to live in a garage for four-anda-half years, with the demolition order later annulled by the Constitutional Court.

In 2016 they won a court battle entitling them to €425,185 in compensation, but the Andalucian High Court of Justice later ruled that they should receive just over half that amount.

They had initially requested €800,000 which included a € 200 000 emotional damages claim, but the latter was reduced to less than ≤ 10.000 .

Gerardo Vazquez, lawyer and spokesperson for the Abusos Urbanisticos Almanzora No (AUAN) campaign group, which has been helping the Priors through their ordeal, said: "As a spokesperson for AUAN, I am very happy for the Priors.

"I hope that you can at least continue with your lives more peacefully.

"With the good humour that has characterised them during the last 10 years that their struggle has lasted, they have shown great tenacity and resistance and are an example to all of us.

"I give all my love and admiration to the Priors."

And Helen added that at least "our case has helped others.

"We have supported AUAN and fought to change the laws to protect the innocent and those that bought property in good faith."

Politicians from the local Popular Party have called for a public apology to the Priors via social media.

The submarine was taken out of service for three months after suffering damage to its conning tower.

Commander Codd was leading a training course when the incident occurred, as the group practised observing shipping By Matt Ford

movement while controlling the craft at periscope death.

Captain John Atwill, prosecuting, said that the commander did not carry out observations himself, relying on those of the trainees, who focused on a nearby yacht and failed to spot the tanker. He added: "Commander Codd's decision to focus on teaching, not safety, compounded the error carried out by the students."

Captain Sean Moore, defending, said: "This is a failure that will live with him for the rest of his life.

"No officer becomes teacher of the Submarine Command Course because they are good enough, they must be the best the submarine service has to offer

"Perisher is widely acknowledged as the toughest command course in the world."

Judge Advocate Robert Hill said while sentencing: "You have, save for this incident, an exemplary record. It was more in the nature of a momentary aberration than a careless attitude."

The case will reportedly affect Commander Codd's 'career progress' and €88,000 annual salary.

A licence to print money

STATE-OWNED FIRM TO DESIGN WARSHIPS

SPAIN appears set to build new warships for the United States (US).

The news comes after the US government confirmed that it has chosen Spanish state-owned shipbuilding company Navantia to head the conceptual design of its massive multi-billion Euro frigate programme.

And the decision places the shipbuilder - the fifth biggest in Europe at the head of the queue to construct the boats on behalf of the US

The programme, dubbed FFG(X), will see the first of the frigates completed by 2020, with a second due in 2021, after which the Navy will buy two per year until reaching a total of 20 at a cost of 'no more than \$950 million (€767 million) each,' according to a US Department of Defence report.

This timeframe does not allow for development of a completely new design, therefore the Navy has requested that the FFG(X) be based on an existing 'parent' ship, with the Australian Hobart-class destroyer, itself based on Navantia's F100/Alvaro de Bazan-class frigate, having

Having beaten off competition from four other firms, Navantia will now work alongside partner General Dynamics Bath Iron Works, a shipyard located on the Kennebec River in Bath, Maine, to design the frigates

The US has ordered a warship that can keep pace with aircraft carriers, and the FFG(X) programme will equip the Navy with "sufficient capacity to achieve the objective of maritime security control and operations, as well as provide support to naval combat groups," Navantia said in a statement.

The frigates will be equipped with guided missiles and will have

the capacity to destroy enemy ships over the horizon, detect submarines, defend convoys, employ electronic warfare systems, and defend against swarming small boat attacks.

The F100-class design has seen Navantia contracted to the world's largest warship programmes, including the Australian and

It last year agreed to work with Bath Iron Works on US military projects in a reverse of a relationship which began more than 40 years ago, when the American company helped provide technology to build ships for the Spanish Navy's Santa Maria-class fleet.

Spanish oil company inks €1.2bn 'mega deal'

SPANISH oil and gas firm Cepsa has announced a €1.2 million mega deal with the United Arab Emirates.

The 40-year agreement will see the multinational bag a 20 per cent stake in the Umm Lulu and Satah al-Razboot (also known as SARB) offshore oilfields from the Abu Dhabi National Oil Company.

It is the biggest contract inked by the company since its €1.76 billion acquisition of South East Asian exploration and production company Coastal Energy in 2013.

Cepsa was bought by Abu Dhabi's International Petroleum Investment Company (IPIC) in a €267 million 2011 takeover.

IPIC was in 2016 merged with Mubadala Development Company PJSC, an investment vehicle owned by the Abu Dhabi government and classed as a National Wealth

FAST FOOD AND BREAKFASTS ON RISE Grub's up for restaurants

SPANISH diners are visiting more bars and restaurants than ever.

Sales in the catering sector increased by 2.5 per cent in 2017, with overall revenue topping €36 million, according to American market research company the NPD Group.

It is the third consecutive year that the industry has demonstrated positive growth, with the number of visits climbing by 1.3 per cent, or 98 million.

Each customer also spent an additional 1 per cent, an average of €4.88.

NPD Group Executive Director Vicente Montesinos said: "The improvement in an economic context has favoured recovery in terms of traffic. while the increase in visits and a growing average expenditure allowed the market to exceed € 36 million in sales for the first time since 2011 "

But the market has not yet recovered to pre-financial crisis levels, with the number of visits and expenditure both below the totals for 2005-2007.

The annual average number of visits per individual during that period was

And the latest statistics show that eateries serving products quickly are the main driver behind the growth, with fast food restaurants, tapas bars and coffee

There is also a trend away from traditional Spanish fare, with American-style hamburger and Italian restaurants outstripping their rivals.

Chains also eclipsed independentlyowned businesses in terms of both the number of visits and the amount of money spent, accounting for 23 per cent of the overall catering market.

Breakfast and lunchtime demonstrated the greatest increases in diners during the week, while the number of people eating out at weekends also shot up.

Mr Montesinos added: "At the beginning of the [financial] crisis the first thing that was hit were breakfasts eaten outside the home, because unemployment increased and labour mobility decreased.

"Then, around two million people lost their jobs in 2009 and the lunch industry

"But with the economic recovery we are seeing more jobs and an increase in the number of people eating out, including breakfast, lunch and dinner."

Minister to tour London

SPAIN has moved to quash Brexit fears.

Speaking to the national congress, Development Minister Iñigo de la Serna revealed that Spain continues to view the UK as one of 11 key construction and infrastructure markets despite voting to leave the EU.

The official went on to confirm that he has a trip to London lined up later this month, during which he will offer support to Spanish companies competing for major UK infrastructure contracts, including construction of the HS2 high speed train and expansion of Heathrow Airport.

The whistle-stop tour will see the official hold a series of key business meetings plus bilateral talks with his UK government peers, before he visits some existing Spanish-led pro-

FLORIDA AND BALI CHEAPER THAN SPAIN Long-haul savings sky high

SPANISH hoteliers may have shot themselves in the foot.

Rising room prices, plus a weak United States dollar and competition from the Middle East mean it can now be cheaper to spend two weeks in far flung locations including Thailand, Dubai and Florida.

It comes after several years of record-breaking tourist figures. with 82 million holidaymakers choosing Spain in 2017.

But research by price comparison website TravelSupermarket has revealed that in 2018 various long-haul destinations are considerably more cost-effective than the Costa del Sol. Balearic and Canary Islands.

For example, over the upcoming May half-term, a week in a four-star Abu Dhabi hotel costs around €350 per person, compared with €620 in Menorca and €475 in Tenerife.

A similar break in Dubai based on a seven-night stay for a



family of four flying from London Gatwick on the last weekend in May - is priced at €350, while Florida costs €420.

In summer, Pattaya in Thailand and the Indonesian paradise of Bali are up to 20 per cent cheaper than Ibiza or Menorca, according to TravelSupermarket's Emma Coulthurst.

"People may think their holiday budget can only stretch to short haul and they can't afford

long haul, so don't consider it.

"But the reality is, long-haul destinations can offer incredible



value this summer... it is really worth doing your research and comparing both to see what else you can get for your money.

"But, be realistic on weather. Florida, for example, is also coming up cheaper this July and August and offering some incredible deals - but the weather at that time of year is incredibly hot and humid."

US holiday firms have slashed prices by up to 35 per

slump,' with travellers less-inclined to visit the country in the wake of his appointment.

Ms Coulthurst added: "Brits have always been one of the US's biggest markets and Florida, particularly Orlando, can't afford for us not to go there."

Abu Dhabi and Dubai have also made cuts of around 10 per cent, while Spanish hotel prices have increased by around 8 per cent since 2016.

It is however cheaper to eat and hire a car in Spain.

More than 20 million British holidaymakers visited Spain last year, the most of any country, but 2018 forecasts predict a fall in numbers.

The 2016 Spanish boom came in the wake of terrorist attacks in Turkey, Egypt, and Tunisia, although travel agent Thomas Cook recently announced that it will fly to the lat-

De Guindos fears raised in Brussels

HE appears set to be named vice-president of the European Central Bank.

But the European Parliament has raised concerns over the appointment of Spain's Finance Minister, Luis de Guindos, to the coveted role.

In government office since 2011, the conservative politician announced he will step down 'in the coming days' after Ireland's Philip Lane - his sole rival pulled out of the race.


He has been slated to replace Portugal's Vitor Constancio for months, although it was Lane who most impressed senior members of the parliament's monetary and finance committee during a non-binding, closed-door hearing with the two candidates in Brussels.

He had little support from ministers, however, while De Guindos has been backed by influential countries including France and Germany. A final decision is expected in March.



And all because my friend took a leaf from the Michael McIntyre show by using his equivalent of that 'Send to All' game to pass on his innocuous joke.

What email etiquette did he contravene? His emailed joke was openly addressed to everyone in his address book. I could see all his dozens of friends' addresses, and they could all see mine. In this age of easy digital pilferage that put all our addresses out there in the wild, it's easy pickings for the spammers.

So here's this week's tiny but vital email etiquette tip: when you want to forward the funniest thing since seg-

mented whole wheat, hide the addresses of your inflictees.

Here's how:

- 1) Compose your email.
- 2) Address it to your own email
- 3) Then add your recipients one by one with the BCC button.

BCC officially means 'Blind Carbon Copy'. It's the subversive variant of the CC 'copy' function, responsible single-handedly for swamping workplaces with avalanches of digital

BCC is a really sneaky way to copy someone into correspondence without the original addressee being aware of it. All BCC addresses are hidden from all other recipients, so no one can harvest valuable contact details from your address book

By addressing an email to yourself and then BCC-ing your recipients, their details remain sacrosanct and they'll only hate you for the inanity of your joke, not for revealing their email addresses to all.

While we're at it, here's another obvious but surprisingly common email fault: keeping everything in your In-

All it takes is to make folders/directories in your email program's lefthand navigation column, and every day drag your dealt-with emails from the Inbox into their respective folders: Business, Friends, Lovers, Potential lovers, Final demands, Absolutely final demands, whatever folders suit your particular needs. It makes finding the email you want a whole lot easier

One more tip: delete those huge attachments from your emails once you're done with them. In some programs you just right-click the attachment symbol and choose delete.

Your email program will become much more responsive without the burden of all those forwarded cat videos. So do it right miaow.

IT'S said that a resigned Mariano Rajoy would allow Carles Puigdemont, currently skulking in Waterloo, to receive an honorary designation from Cataluña's pro-independence parliament. This would be acceptable so long as he receives no public money and possesses no administrative powers, Madrid has hinted.

Two months after the regional elections, Cataluña still does not have a government because the pro-independence parties whose combined majority allows them to call the shots, wanted Puigdemont as president. It must be him or no-one, they threatened, so the Madrid compromise would be one way of investing someone - possibly Elsa Artadi - so that Cataluña finally has a semblance of a government.

Although with Puigdemont as a string puller and an acknowledged presence in Belgium there would be no change in secessionist ambitions and this particular remedy could turn out to be worse than the disease.

Well a) she hadn't actually helped me with anything and b) now she's offering to not help me with something else.

I explained again that I don't need priority boarding as I always have Special Assistance due to my disability but, because of their new

luggage policy, I felt I had no choice other than to pay for priority boarding. Nowhere on their luggage details do they state that passengers using Special Assistance are able to keep their hand luggage with them free of charge.

I only discovered that little gem buried in their FAOs. Is it so hard to make it easy for people to know that or is it, as I suspect, an easy way to nick more money?

She confirms again there is no refund as they are 'a non-refundable airline'! What the hell does that mean??? I asked to be transferred to a supervisor at which point she says, 'I can't transfer you to a supervisor, if you're not happy fill out a form, goodbye'. And then she disconnects our chat!! And that was the end of my chat. How rude. This is not 'customer service' - this is 'customer alienation.'

Ryanair boast about how they are 'making things better' for their passengers, Really??? I then get a box come up asking me to fill in a survey regarding my experience. I asked them to send me copy of the chat so if anyone thinks I'm exaggerating I have the proof. I'm sure that nowhere on the booking page or the priority boarding does it say Special Assistance passengers do not need to pay. My nickname is 'Relentless' so I won't let this go and it's not even about the money, it's the principle.



LEGALLY SPEAKING

Permission to use your vehicle

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



ASSUMING your insurance covers multiple drivers, you may allow any qualified driver to use your vehicle. However, in order to avoid problems if the driver is stopped, it is recommended that the vehicle driver is given a document proving that they have the owner's permission to drive the vehicle

This may seem like an inconvenience, but it is for your protection. If the vehicle is stopped, the officers who come across a vehicle driven by somebody other than the registered keeper will question the legalities of the driver, which is in your best interest, as if it is stolen they will find out very soon.

Otherwise, if a vehicle is stolen but not vet reported as such, there could be no reason for the

Guardia Civil or police to doubt the person driving the vehicle has the owner's permission, and so it could otherwise go unchecked. But of course there could be a genuine reason for somebody other than the registered keeper to drive the car, which is what this document would help to prove.

Simply download the document and complete it, or complete the online version and print it, and attach a copy of both the owner's driving licence. and a copy of the licence of the person given permission to drive. It should be completed in full, including a term of validity, and then dated and signed.

What is rental registration?

To a recent enquiry about noisy renters you replied that the landlord must include a registration number on his advert. Does this apply to companies that manage properties for rental for the

landlord? I ask because I never knew this and I have not seen it on any adverts. Where would the registration be placed and how many digits should it have?

MF (by email)

Good question. The regulation of shortterm tourist lettings is handled by each one of Spain's 17 autonomous regions, so the rules are different from Andalucia to Valencia to the Balearic Islands. Furthermore, most of the regulations are quite new and the land-



lords may have up to a year to comply in some areas. My own quick search showed that practically no one is in compliance yet. There have been many bureaucratic delays in obtaining the registration but it has been made easier in some areas so you should find the numbers used before too long. And, yes, the letting agencies will be required to include the registration number for each property they advertise on the internet.

Upcoming wine region

PRIORAT, as one of the upcoming Spanish wine regions, has recorded an extraordinary leap in quality and reputation over the last decade.



This small area which qualifies as Denominacio d'Origen Qualificada (DOQ) is in Tarragona Province in Cataluña and is one of only two regions - alongside Rioia - to qualify as DOCa, the highest qualification.

It produces mainly red and powerful wines. Characterised by a terroir of volcanic origins with black slate and quartz soil known as llicorella, with vineyards on terraces at 100m - 700m, the area has low yields due to the rocky soil which does not allow water accumulation.

Wine production in the area dates from the 12th century, when monks from the Monastery of Scala Dei introduced viticulture and the prior ruled as a feudal lord, giving rise to the name Priorat.

At the end of the 19th century, the phylloxera pest devastated the vineyards and replanting was undertaken only in the 1950's. In the 1980's bulk wine production was phased out

and bottling of quality wine was introduced.

The traditional grape variety in El Priorat is the red Garnacha tinta, which is found in all the older vineyards. Other red varieties are Garnacha Peluda, Cariñena, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah

White varieties are Garnacha blanca. Macabeo, Pedro Ximenez and Chenin.

The traditional reds are a single grape bottling of Grenache and Carignan, or a blend of these with French grape varieties including Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, or Syrah. Usually aged in oak barrels for 18 months followed by six months in the bottle, Priorat wines have a consumption optimal two years later.





HE purchase of Spanish homes by foreign buyers is sky rocketing.

And the real estate market has recovered faster since the financial crisis than most of the country's other industries.


The Spanish Mediterranean coast remains among the top destinations for those on the hunt for luxury homes, complete with pristine golf courses and, above all, sea views.

According to the latest data published by Spanish notaries. there were more than 50,000 purchases by foreign investors in the first half of 2017, marking a 13.4 per cent year-on-year increase.

ATTRACTING birds to your garden is easy if you have the right plants that will provide water, food, shelter and protection from predators.

Birds do best in gardens with multiple storeys of plants from ground covers, shrubs as under storeys, to taller tree canopies as an upper

Providing water in the dry months in safe places for birds to drink, is the sure way to have birds attracted to your garden. A steady, reliable source of water is a primary need, even more than food, if other sources of water are not nearby.

If you provide water, birds will visit regularly, if you provide food plants, they will stay longer and if you provide safe shelter as well, native birds may start to nest in your garden. Migratory birds will only visit but are more likely to visit if you have a food source as well as

There are many plants that can provide food for the birds. As different bird species have different requirements of seed, nectar or insects, a variety of different plants are needed to attract the bird species you wish to support in your garden.

Bird lovers paradise, a garden for the birds

The best way to provide food is to use a lot of native plants and have a wild zone for allowing naturally occurring non-invasive native plants even the plants considered weeds in the ornamental and vegetable garden - to go through their full life cycle.

Many plants considered weeds are useful plants for birds to feed on for the flowers, nectar and seeds.

Birds usually prefer to arrive onto the upper storey to survey a garden for food and dangers before entering, and different species build their nests in the upper storey for safety from ground based predators.

Each bird species has different needs however, so many smaller birds will look for nesting places in the under storey that has dense thickets to prevent larger predators from entering. So to attract a wide range of birds, having a wide range



of plants that give good protection is important for diversity.

Plants that provide nectar include Sages (Salvia species), Grevillea species, Torch lilies (Kniphofia species), Lobelia species, Penstemon species, Verbena species, Sunflowers (Helianthus), Thyme (Thymus species), Lavender (Lavendula species), Honeysuckle (Lonicera species), Ice Plant (Sedum species), Firethorn (Pyracantha species) and

> Barberry (Berberis species).

Seed plants include Sunflower (Helianthus species), Coneflower (Echinacea species), Aster species, Zinnea species, Cumin (Cuminum species), Calendula species and many others.

Attracting birds can just be a matter of widening the range of plants that you normally grow, which may provide even more interest to your garden as many bird food plants are very attractive.

Hedges and thickets of plants will provide safe nesting places for smaller birds, and tall trees can have nesting boxes installed to make trees a ready-made nesting place.

Applying natural mulches around your garden will help birds find materials to build the nests.



February jobs for the garden

IT may not quite be spring yet, but now is a great time to start getting stuck into your garden

Although temperatures are on the up, there is still a risk of some chilly days ahead, so make sure you protect any

plants that are extremely averse to the cold by wrapping them in insulation, such as garden fleece.

This is also a good time to clear your garden of any fallen leaves or debris in time for spring, as well as clearing out your shed

or greenhouse.

You could also get structures and plans in place for what you want to plant when it gets a bit warmer.

If it is fairly warm where you live, you could start sowing seeds in parts of your garden that receive a lot of sunlight.

Keep the seeds and seedlings covered at night to protect them from pests and then plant in wellprepared soil when it gets warmer.

Also make sure to keep up with your pruning, but leave cherry, plum and apricots trees until summer, as pruning these trees now could make them vulnerable to Silver Leaf disease.

Those that use the flexi cord should be aware they were designed for people who live in apartments to enable dogs to be taken down to the garden to relieve themselves.

Those that use them in the streets are not aware of the danger these can cause since there is no control when they are extended and again this is not a suitable tool for training. I have known many people to trip and indeed get hurt.

The standards of training have certainly diminished. Most 'trainers' have been to a training school themselves for four to six months, then give themselves a title 'I am a dog trainer'.

Some join American organisations on the internet which give out certifi-

cates without putting the person through a test to see how they handle dogs. Note I use the word 'dogs', every type of dog is different to handle and so much depends on the breeders and puppy school teachers, best to look before you book!

All good schools will spend at least half the time explaining to owners many aspects of the dog including, most importantly, feeding the correct type of dried food, as food affects behaviour and many skin problems. Today one does not need to march around

and help on feeding, grooming and their general attitude towards their pet.

Dogs must be respected by children who in turn need educating and taught that this is not a furry baby or toy, it is a canine live creature.

Young married couples must think hard before taking on a dog as one must think of their lifestyle including a future family, since everything changes once the lady gets pregnant. Dogs do get jealous and a good trainer will explain about dangers etc. Many of you reading this article may not realise that I never trained a dog! (I educated people.)

Never forget children need to be taught to respect animals. It is always a good idea to allow them to feed the dog and explain we never touch the dog or bowl when the dog is eating.

Before training a dog one must do research and understand how much work, cost and time is needed, plus the most important fact that dogs should never be allowed to be on their own for more

Dangers of a 'butcher's dog' diet

IN the vein of the clean eating health food trend that involves going back to basics and consuming raw, unprocessed food, some dog owners are rejecting traditional pet food and going back to a more old-school 'butcher's dog' diet consisting of raw meat.

This food is still often bought pre-prepared so it can be easily served and frozen for conve-

However, a recent study has suggested these raw meat products could contain bacterial and parasitic diseases, which are not necessarily a problem for dogs although they can suffer from food poisoning - but they can become carriers of the bacteria.

This can then be spread through their faeces, which could then make their owners seriously ill.

Storing the meat at -20°C could help to kill the bacteria and handling the food sensibly should help minimise the risks.

Always make sure to wash your hands with hot water and soap after handling the dog

Italian tycoon fights to avoid prison

SCHADENFREUDE is a German word meaning the gaining of pleasure at someone's bad fortune and there may be one or two people around the world who are revelling at the fall of Italian Flavio Briatore, the former manager of the Benetton and Renault F1 racing

He had risen from being a restaurant manager and insurance

salesman to become a highly successful businessman although he was found guilty of several acts of fraud in the 1980's but escaped imprisonment thanks to a general

His latest problem however involves his 63-metre Superyacht Force Blue and the thorny and age old problem of non-payment of

In this case, it was alleged (and later proven) that the Cayman Islands registered vessel was actually operating in Italian waters from July 2006 to the spring of 2010 and should therefore have paid €3.6 million for unpaid VAT.

There was a further charge of improperly declaring the yacht's fuel exempt from VAT, thereby saving a further €800,000 in duty.

The yacht was seized and sits in the port of Genoa whilst appeal follows appeal and currently Briatore had his initial sentence of 23 months imprisonment reduced to 18 months whilst the yacht's captain and an administrator of Autumn Sailing Ltd, the offshore company that owns the yacht, also received 18-month sentences although other defendants had charges dropped.

It is expected that a further appeal will be made against the sentence received by all three men.

In the meantime, the former chairman of Queens Park Rangers football club and current manager of Fernando Alonso who is the father of one of supermodel Heidi Klum's children, will continue to fight his corner but currently without access to Force Blue.

the plant to significantly increase its competitiveness, but will also allow further future investments into the site



Following the Sevilla match, Greizmann and co host Leganes at the Wanda Metropolitano and will be confident

Barcelona will continue their push towards the title and look to keep up their unbeaten record as they host Leganes at the Camp Nou.

The Catalan giants sit seven points clear of Atletico at the top of La Liga following their 2-0 win over Eibar last weekend and are still yet to lose in the league this season (W19 D5).

Valencia remain locked in a battle with Real Madrid for third place and will be confident of grabbing all six points from their La Liga double header as they first host Real Sociedad on Sunday before heading to Athletic Bilbao next Wednesday.

Madrid will also be hopeful of getting all six points but may suffer from fatigue as their schedule begins to hot

After travelling to Leganes yesterday (Wednesday) Real Madrid host Alaves on Saturday before playing their third game in six days against Espanyol on Tuesday.



Spain edge nearer to Rugby World Cup

SPAIN took a huge leap towards qualifying for the 2019 Rugby World Cup after beating top-of-the-table rivals Romania 22-10 in Madrid.

Los Leones haven't qualified for a World Cup tournament since 1999, but moved top of the table after overpowering the Oaks at a packed Estadio Nacional Complutense in Madrid.

Early tries from Benat Auzqui and Sebastien Ascarat eased the pressure on the hosts, as Brad Linklater also kicked

four successful penalties in front of almost 16,000 fans.

Spain now sit one point clear of Romania on 21 points at the top of the group following the victory and two wins from their remaining fixtures against Germany and Belgium in March will guarantee Spain's place at the World Cup.

The winner of the group will

qualify outright for the Tokyo World Cup next year and will go into Group A alongside Ireland, Scotland and Japan as well as the winner of a playoff.

Los Leones host Germany in their next group game on March 11, before heading to Brussels to face Belgium in their final group game on March 18.

Knocked off his perch

Federer overtakes Nadal as World No 1

RAFAEL NADAL has congratulated Roger Federer after the Swiss superstar overtook him to become ATP World Number One.

The 36-year-old claimed his third Rotterdam Open ATP trophy as he beat Grigor Dimitrov, but climbed back to the top of the rankings by beating Robin Haase at the quarter-final stage.

In doing so, Federer became the oldest man ever to become World Number One, surpassing Andre Agassi's previous record of 33, and also beats the overall record set by 35-yearold Serena Williams in May 2017.

The Swiss star also claims the men's record for biggest gap between spells as World Number One. He was last at the top of the world rankings in November 2012 and reclaimed the title five years and 106 days later.

Since returning from injury 13 months ago, Federer has won three out of the five Grand Slams available and former World Number One Nadal has now congratulated his long-time rival on his return to the top.

Speaking to Spanish radio, Nadal said: "Roger Federer has amply demonstrated what he is and did not need to return to No 1 to prove it. At his age he has achieved something very complicated and we must congratulate him."

While Nadal was full of praise for Federer, he admitted that the time may be com-
