Death crash probe

Max 4 years for officer accused of 14 crimes

A Guardia Civil officer who caused a deadly car crash while high on a cocktail of drugs and alcohol can only serve a maximum of four years in prison.

The news has sparked outrage and comes after the Malaga Prosecutor's Office confirmed that the 45-year-old culprit, named only as Miguel CL, committed a 'thoughtless act' that was not premeditated.

And under Spanish law, this means that he can only be convicted for a portion of the most serious of the 14 crimes of which he is accused.

The sergeant, who was off duty at the time, was held after triggering a pile-up on the A-7 motorway near Torremolinos last summer.

He collided with a Renault car before spinning into a taxi carrying a family of tourists

from Bahrain and Kuwait. with the impact killing two women aged 30 and 47 and a 25-year-old man while nine others including one child were hospitalised.

Prior to the smash the offi-

cer was driving at almost 150 kilometres per hour, 50 above the speed limit, and later tested positive for alcohol, cocaine and sleeping pills.

He tried to flee the scene in the wake of the incident, and scribed as having 'shining eyes and dilated pupils.'

Kidnap death probe horror

A MANHUNT has been launched after a goat herder was beaten to death by a mysterious gang on the Costa del Sol.

The victim - a 37-year-old from Alcala de los Gazules in Cadiz - and two other men were reportedly held hostage in a farmhouse between Casares and Manilva in what detectives currently believe was a case of mistaken identity.

"There is only wind and goats there," a niece of the owner - a 55-year-old who lives there with his deaf and dumb sister plus two employees - told Spanish media. "They make money raising cattle and goats.

"Luckily my aunt was not there on the night of the attack as she has heart problems and was in Manilva after falling sick," she added.

The violent incident unfolded when a group of hooded and armed individuals stormed the property before tying the three men up.

They aimed kicks and punches at the trio while shouting at them to "show us where you keep the drugs," police revealed in a statement.

And after they failed to receive a reply, they beat one of the men to death before fleeing.

The other two bloodied and bruised hostages then managed to untie themselves and alert the police.

After an initial probe, investigators believe the gang intended to steal drugs from a rival mob but raided the wrong address since neither the dead man nor his colleagues have any connection to drug trafficking.

Today, any type of costume - from cartoon characters to nuns to pirates - can be worn to avoid the demons wicked touch.

€5.2m legal claim

Brit rocker to sue after 27-year ordeal

A BRITISH former rock star who was jailed for a murder he did not commit has launched a €5.2 million lawsuit against the Spanish

Gary Owens, 56, spent 30 months in high security Spanish prisons after being arrested in Tenerife with wife Jayne, 50, in 1991.

The couple were held in connection with the death of Norwegian nightclub owner Torbjorn Heta, whose body was found at the bottom of a Marbella well.

And the guitarist, whose band A II Z played with Black Sabbath and Iron Maiden after hitting the British heavy metal charts in the early 1980's, is now suing for damages.

His lawyer Luis Tatay, based in Valencia, revealed that a claim has been filed with the Ministry of Justice in Madrid.

He said: "Mr Owens has suffered for more than 25 years under a criminal investigation, two-and-a-half years in prison and been extradited from the UK to Spain.

"If the Ministry fails to

respond to the claim, we have the options of seeking a trial before the Audiencia Nacional [a special high court] and appealing to the Supreme Court."

It comes after the Stockport-born rocker was freed without being charged in 1993 before returning to the UK in 1995 on the advice of the British Embassy in Madrid.

He moved to Scunthorpe in Lincolnshire where he set up an internet business, a cyber cafe and a publishing

But in 2008 a European Arrest Warrant was issued in his name and he was taken to London before being extradited to Spain the following year, after unsuccessful appeals to the High Court, the House of Lords and the Supreme Court.

He was again released from prison three months later after Jayne - with whom he has a 21-year-old son - paid

He remained on bail until September 2016, when he was told there would be no trial and was eventually refunded the money.

Speaking to the Euro

Weekly News last year, Mr Owens said: "I want to know how the Spanish justice system can destroy my life, breaking its own laws with its legal representatives committing crimes to falsely imprison me?

"For 25 years I have been accused of a crime, that there was no evidence for, I have never been charged, and I have been falsely imprisoned, my music career has been ruined and my businesses destroyed.

"We have been unjustly treated by the Spanish and British justice systems, we are claiming compensation from the Spanish justice system for false imprisonment and human rights breaches."

Mr Heta's murder remains unsolved, although Mr Owens admits he knew him, adding: "I had met the man who was murdered as he owned a 24track state-of-the art recording studio in the basement of his villa. I was being given the chance of recording a solo album there "

Currently living in rural Malaga, he believes that the killing was orchestrated by British drugs gangs who had him set up.

Mugged off Sex attack sparks outrage

woman has sparked demands for improved security.

It comes after a 22-year-old squatter was held in Torremolinos after taking selfies on a mobile phone stolen from his 23vear-old victim.

She was beaten unconscious and woke up half naked as the mugger violated her.

The incident has left residents of the central La Nogalera neighbourhood up in arms.

"We've been asking for security to be reinforced for years." said Antonio Dominguez. founder of the Torremolinos Gay Merchants' Association. "We know that groups are active in the area, there are young guys who take advantage of tourists when they leave bars and clubs.

La Nogalera is located at the heart of the town's thriving LGBTQ+ community, and the

zone in question includes a series of nightspots arranged around a labyrinth of tunnels beneath blocks of flats

Several business owners recently asked the council to install security cameras after a spate of muggings, but no deal has been agreed, leading a number to buy their own.

"It has gone from very bad to bad, because at one point the number of robberies was unbearable, but you still can't let your guard down," an employee at the Aqua Club venue told

Police estimate that 70 per cent of such crimes are not reported, while an official from the town's Local Police station confirmed that more officers are patrolling the area, including two in plain-clothes.

The lively nightlife has regularly been slammed by furious residents who complain about noise and rubbish left behind by increasing numbers of revellers.

Spain's never-ending corruption problem

THE news that Spain has risen in a global corruption ranking may

The country has been plagued by scandal in recent years, with members of the Royal Family, political parties, large corporations, and the police implicated.

Its Transparency International Corruption Perceptions Index score has now dropped by eight points (out of 100) since 2012, with its latest tally of 57 worse than most other European nations.

According to official figures, almost 1,500 individuals faced corruption trials in Spain between July 2015 and the end of 2016, while the issue has long ranked as the second biggest cause for concern after unemployment among the population.

In 2013 a European Council report questioned the integrity and impartiality of Spain's chief anti-corruption prosecutor, who was appointed by the government, and issued a series of 11 recommendations to help Spain tackle the problem.

But three years later, it concluded that none had been 'implemented satisfactorily.

Some blame religion, since Catholicism allows for confession and absolution of sins, while others claim that corruption is a habit born in dictatorial times, when cheating the state was akin to an

And unless political forces can come together and deal with the issue as a state policy transcending individual parties, it appears that systematic corruption is here to stay.










'Fake Chinese blood'

Gang stage death of expat's husband

FIVE men - including an ex-police officer - have been convicted of staging the death of a wealthy man to extort €1 million from his wife on the Costa del Sol.

They must each serve a year and nine months in prison for fraud after the terrified expatriate paid tens of thousands of Euros.

The ruse came after the German couple's relationship broke down, with the gang claiming to possess evidence that would see her arrested for his 'murder.'

The former Guardia Civil officer and a professional photographer reportedly posed as detectives, visiting the pair's Marbella home in full police uniform, complete with badges and guns.

They showed her a number of photographs of her husband's blood-stained body lying on the floor of a morgue, before demanding €1 million to dispose of the 'evidence' against her, threatening her with 21 years in prison if she failed to stump up the cash.

But the blood later turned out to be a fake product of the type used during Halloween.

It had been bought from a Chinese bazaar, and turned green a day after the men produced a bloodied t-shirt as further proof of the man's death.

A lawyer who was in on the hoax acted as the exclusive point of contact for receiving the money.

The other two men - a computer specialist and a dentist who are both friends of the couple - provided personal information about the victim, allowing the gang to convince her that she was under constant police surveillance.

She later told investigators that she became fearful for her life after she was unable to come up with the money, although she did pay a total of €60,000 over a period of several weeks.

The photographer admitted in court that the images had been staged, while the woman's husband remains wanted in connection with the scam after he vanished in the wake of the incident.

Expat torture rap

A FRENCH expatriate wanted for kidnap and torture in his home country has been held on the Costa del Sol.

The Nantes-born man - named only as AK - allegedly abducted and tormented a man, beating him, burning his skin and even cutting off one of his fingers.

He and three others suspected of carrying out the atrocities are thought to have been hired by a drugs gang.

It comes after French authorities issued a European Arrest Warrant for the 29-yearold, leading National Police investigators to swoop on a Marbella property.

Although not at home, he was tracked down near the house and has been remanded in custody while extradition proceedings begin.

If found guilty he could face 30 years behind bars, according to reports.

Priest keeps faith after unholy crime

A PARISH priest has vowed to continue his work after being attacked by a man who later appeared outside the church screaming that he would 'take mass in your f*****g place.'

The dramatic incident unfolded in the mountain village of Almogia, around 40 minutes inland from Malaga.

It came after Francisco Aurioles had delivered a service, when a 'dishevelled middleaged man' entered his office.

He was carrying a shopping bag and produced a piece of paper on which he scrawled '€21.50' before informing the clergyman that he was under house arrest and that his predecessor had often given him money.

When Mr Aurioles told him he did not have any cash the man sat down and "told me he would not move until I handed over the money," according to local media.

And when the priest tried to leave the room the man followed before "throwing himself to the ground in a fit of rage and hitting me with his

bag, scratching my forehead."

He was eventually thrown out by a group of parishioners who heard the commotion, but returned on the following two days, beating on the door of the building and shouting obscenities.

Investigators from the Guardia Civil have been informed, with the victim set to launch a formal complaint.

Mob boss hunger strike

A COCAINE kingpin recently held on the Costa del Sol has gone on hunger strike as a money laundering trial goes on.

Jose Ramon Prado Bugallo, better known as Sito Miñanco, was arrested in Algeciras, Cadiz, where he was working on day release as a car park security guard, returning to Algeciras prison at night.

It is the first time that the 62-year-old Galician, who has spent most of the last 27 years behind bars, has been charged with money laundering, with his daughter, exwife, ex-sister-in-law and a businessman

friend also implicated.

All five face prison sentences and a collective € 10 million fine if found guilty.

But Miñanco has spoken angrily of his 'humiliating' treatment at the A Lama prison in Pontevedra, Galicia, and has informed officials that he no longer intends to eat until moved elsewhere.

More than 40 people were arrested in the latest crackdown on drug trafficking in Spain, with detectives believing that Miñanco continues to head one of the largest drug smuggling cartels in the country

THOUSANDS of retirees took to the streets of the Costa del Sol calling on the Spanish government to raise pensions in line with inflation, after they received an increase of just 0.25 per cent this year.

Protestors turned out in their droves in all the main towns and cities including Malaga, Fuengirola, Marbella and Estepona.

Out of pocket

In Malaga they gathered in Plaza de la Constitucion shouting, "Thieves, thieves!" and "I donate my 0.25 per cent to (Spanish Prime Minister] Rajov."

Organisers of the demonstrations, including some of biggest worker unions in the country, have called on Madrid to stop blocking changes to pensions law.

THIS year's Vuelta a España cycle race is to receive a sprinkling of Marbella glitz.

It comes as Sports councillor Javier Merida revealed that the peloton will depart from glamorous Puerto Banus ahead of the event's second stage.

"The Vuelta is addictive and Marbella is addicted to the Vuelta," he said.

Starting on Avenida de las Naciones Unidas, the riders will pedal nine kilometres to Ojen, from where the race proper will start.

The 164-kilometre stage will end at the Caminito del Rey walkway in Ardales after passing through Coin, Pizarra, Alora and El Chorro, with the finish line atop the 570-metre Alto de la Mesa peak.

La Vuelta gets underway with an eight-kilometre individual time trial around Malaga City on August 25, while

A urine sample from the four-time Tour de France winner contained twice the legal limit of asthma medication salbutamol, but the case appears set to drag on as a legal team battles to save his career.

Pole position for drugs bust

TWO Polish expatriates are being quizzed after more than 80 kilos of cannabis was found in their van.

The men, aged 31 and 37 and resident in Mijas, were held on the A-92 motorway in Granada.

on his mobile phone as he headed towards Murcia.



FIVE Costa del Sol Local Police officers have been jailed for selling drugs after seizing them from traffickers.

The men - all stationed in tourist hotspot Mijas - reportedly stole classified information to track down criminals before launching a series of unauthorised raids using official cars, badges, uniforms and weapons.

But the culprits were allowed to escape during the swoops, after which the crooked officers loaded any drugs they could find into their cars, knowing that if they were caught by colleagues they could easily justify being in possession of the

One of the five - who was on long-term sick leave - would then use his contacts 'from the drugs underworld' to sell the narcotics on.

A sixth individual who was not employed by the police was also

convicted after he agreed to stash drugs at his home, with detectives finding 162 kilos of hashish there during a probe.

It comes after the Spanish Supreme Court overturned an earlier decision by Malaga's Provincial Court, which acquitted the men after finding that wiretaps used in the investigation were 'invalid.'

They must now serve prison sentences ranging from three-and-a-half to five years and have been banned from police duty for 20 years.

The sentences were delivered in the Provincial Court.

Lottery jackpot

LUCKY punters holding two tickets bought in the UK and on the Costa del Sol shared the €176 million rollover jackpot in last Friday's giant EuroMillions draw.

Each ticket holder will receive around €88 million, the National Lottery said.

The Spanish ticket was reportedly sold in the Carrefour shopping centre in La Linea de la Concepcion, Cadiz, and was purchased by a syndicate of around 140 Manilva residents who will each receive more than ≤ 600.000 .

Jail term for cat butchers

A MALAGA judge has sentenced a couple, who poisoned eight of their neighbour's cats, to eight months in prison.

Five of the animals died from 'circulatory and metabolic failure,' while the surviving three will need special diets and medication for the rest of their lives.

It comes after the pair, aged 68 and 71, were accused of throwing balls of raw meat laced with toxins through a dividing wall.

They claimed they had become infuriated by the animals' relentless yowling.


Sin too deep

FIVE men aged between 21 and 55 have been hurt in a collision between two cars on the A-397 between San Pedro de Alcantara and Ronda.

Four were taken to the Serrania Hospital with minor injuries before being discharged a few hours later.

The smash is the latest to occur on the notoriously dangerous mountain road.

It comes on the first day of operation, of a new average speed camera system on the A-397, as the Directorate General of Traffic (DGT) tries to reduce the number of accidents on the main access road to Ronda from the Costa del Sol.

It is the first such system to be installed on a singlelane road in Malaga Province, and covers the stretch between kilometres 28 and 30.5 in both directions

Motorists will be fined for exceeding an average speed of 60 kilometres per hour between those points.

With two fixed and two mobile radars already in use, the 48-kilometre road is now the most heavily-monitored in Malaga.

In 2015, there were 70 accidents involving 56 vehicles in which five people died, four suffered serious injuries and 47 others were hurt.

High speed drama

Boats and helicopter chase smugglers

POLICE have seized an estimated 1,300 kilos of cannabis after a Hollywoodstyle chase involving five boats and a helicopter in the Strait of Gibraltar.

Footage released by the Spanish Tax Agency shows incredible pictures of a high-speed pursuit with a speed boat heading straight towards a Spanish police vessel, seemingly with the intention of ramming into it.

The chase is believed to have taken place when a Tax Agency helicopter managed to track four launches, three of which were loaded with boxes.

While police pursued the boats in the water, with officials reportedly firing warning shots to prevent a collision, a helicopter recorded the scenes from

Those on the boats decided to dump the boxes into the sea during the chase before they eventually managed to get away from the authorities.

Officials then returned to retrieve the dumped narcotics, recovering 42 boxes

of hashish after the boats managed to escape.

The sting comes days after more than 3,000 people protested in La Linea de la Concepcion against violence and aggression brought on by drug trafficking in the region.

At the rally, local journalist Juan Jose Tellez read out an extensive list of demands to the government from the 21

anti-drug associations taking part.

He said: "The rally has achieved the miracle of bringing you all together to demand urgent measures from those responsible for the different administrations on both sides of the border, and the dangerous situation we are in "

He also spoke how a new police station, more agents, the improvement of the 'rudimentary' media against the technology of organised crime are needed, while also requesting a court specialised in drug trafficking, to award just and severe penalties to 'those who rule, here, there or in Europe, receive them.'

Several high profile drug related busts and incidents have occurred in the region recently, including the break out of an infamous drugs baron from a La Linea hospital.

Around 20 hooded men stormed the hospital to break out Samuel Crespo Dominguez who allegedly runs the largest drug trafficking organisation in

A RUSSIAN MP is among 19 people who have appeared in a Spanish court accused of money-laundering for a Russian mafia gang.

The cases are said to relate to the purchases of properties in the Costa del Sol and Balearic Islands by 'moneyed' individuals.

According to reports, the cases date back 10 years to 2008, when 20 Russian mafia suspects were held by Spanish police.

Prosecutors allege that money laundering by Moscow gangsters in Spain first began in the 1990's, when wealthy Russians started purchasing luxury villas in the Balearic Islands and the Costa del Sol.

They also believe that more than €50 million of mafia cash was laundered through said property purchases in Spain by the so called 'Tambovskaya-

Mayshevskaya' gang, based in St Petersburg.

Alleged bosses Gennady Petrov and Alexander Malyshev remain at large and are suspected of being in Russia.

Petrov was arrested during the police raids in 2008 but fled

two years later after convincing Spanish authorities that he needed to tend to his sick mother in his home country.

Most of the suspects face sentences of up to five-and-a-half years in prison plus fines that could reach up to \in 100 million.

Bridge too far

DOZENS of residents have been left furious at the behaviour of Ronda Council.

It comes after 50 members of the public were invited to attend a plenary session to discuss the cutting of traffic for six-and-a-half hours per day on the famous Puente Nuevo bridge.

The move by the council has been widely panned, with a social media poll suggesting that more than 90 per cent of the town is against the decision.

But when Traffic Councillor Pacqui Gonzalez took to the floor, several of those present began to heckle, with "this woman tells more lies than Pinocchio," and "scoundrel" clearly audible.

Mayor Maria Teresa Valdenebro Rios eventually became so exasperated that she stopped the debate and moved straight onto voting on a motion to scrap the scheme raised by the opposition without allowing them their say on the matter.

While some outraged onlookers left immediately, voicing their disapproval as they went, others remained until the mayor instructed Local Police officers to have them removed

The motion was rejected after the council voted against it.

Missing links

Cave art reveals stone age secrets

By Joe Gerrard

ARCHAEOLOGISTS working in three Spanish caves including one in Malaga Province - have said art work discovered there was produced 65,000 years ago.

The team added they were produced 20,000 years before modern humans arrived on the Iberian Peninsula which has led them to claim they were painted by Neanderthals.

Joao Zilhao, from the University of Barcelona and a coauthor of a study on the findings, said the archaeologists' findings suggested the species was more advanced than previously thought.

The art showed Neanderthals, who died out around 40,000 years ago, were capable of language, advanced cognition and symbolic thought, Zilhao said.

Neanderthals have traditionally being considered mentally inferior to the Homo Sapiens that followed them.

Artwork from the La Pasiega cave, Cantabria, as well as others in Maltravieso, Caceres and Ardales, Malaga was analysed using uranium-thorium dating technology which can reportedly determine precise sample ages.

The drawings in the Cantabria cave, which resemble a ladder-like shape, are around 64,800 years old according to data from the tests.

That makes them and artwork tested in the Caceres and Malaga caves among the oldest known pieces of art on the planet if results from the tests are correct.

Josefina Zapata, a palaeon-

tologist from Murcia University, told Spanish media today's modern humans were likely the result of a complex evolutionary process which Neanderthals contributed to.

Zapata and Zilhao worked together on another excavation in Los Aviones which unearthed broken and pigmented shells. These were dated back some 115,000 years.

Human traffickers used voodoo tricks

A HUMAN trafficking gang that operated in Spain and the UK and forced women into prostitution has been broken up following simultaneous police raids in the two countries.

Twelve people have been arrested and four women have been safeguarded.

It is claimed that the gang 'recruited' their victims in Benin City, Nigeria forcing them to eat a raw chicken heart and drink whisky, taking clippings of their hair and nails and using voodoo

The criminals then used fraudulent documents to traffic the women to Europe, where they were housed in squalid conditions in Italy for several days.

Once they arrived in Spain the women were hidden in their madam's houses and forced to clean and take care

of the children, whilst the organised crime group made arrangements for the submission of applications for asylum by the victims.

The ring leaders were based in Torrelavega, Spain. It is claimed they controlled the whole network from the city and if the women could not pay their debts their family was threatened by phone.

A European Arrest Warrant was issued by Spain and a house search took place in the UK as one of the individuals was living in Manchester. The UK-based culprit was arrested alongside seven in Cantabria, two in Vizcaya and two in Alicante in Spain.

Man Utd fans held

A POLICE officer was left injured after alleged public order and assault offences by Manchester United football fans in Spain.

Five arrests were made for causing serious public disturbances, destruction of furniture and assaults on the Local Police after the football game in the city of Sevilla.

The men had stayed on in the city following Manchester United's 0-0 Champions League draw with Sevilla on Wednesday.

It is claimed rocks were thrown at a hotel, a police car windscreen was smashed, motorcycles were pushed over and a biker attacked.

Local Police and National Police officers who tried to calm the scene were allegedly attacked by the five Brits, aged between 27 and 30 years old.

Migrant numbers triple

Emergency services overwhelmed

THE amount of people who came to Spain by boat as migrants stood at almost 22,420 last year, with nearly 250 people losing their lives at sea.

Migrants arriving in the country by land and sea numbered almost 28,590 in 2017. The amount of people travelling on other routes into Europe fell, according to a human rights group.

The Andalucian Human Rights Association (APDHA) said there were no adequate structures or means to offer people dignified treatment when they arrived.

This was evident in Malaga, Barbate and Motril, some of the main entry points for those arriving by sea.

"The measures of containment agreed with origin countries, repression exercised against migrants and closing Europe's borders have not

been capable of stopping the movement of people," the group said

"The reality is unbearable," they added.

More than 6,000 people have died trying to reach Spain in the last 20 years, according to data from APDHA.

The group said the figure could be higher because for every person that was confirmed dead there were two unaccounted for.

Extreme poverty, armed conflicts and a lack of opportunities for the future meant that for many leaving their countries for Europe was the

only alternative, they added.

Morocco was the main country of origin for migrants arriving in Spain. Algeria, Guinea, the Ivory Coast, Gambia and Syria followed but sub-Saharan Africans were the largest single group, APDHA said.

Figures showed there was a fall in the number of women making the journey to Spain but that the number of migrant children arriving had risen by more than 66 per

Wooden craft, jet skis, toy boats and surfboards were among the ways used to make the journey, according to the

APDHA said: "Barbed wire, patrol boats, returns, death and suffering cannot continue to be the response of this country to people fleeing war or hunger."

The singer captioned the advert: "Trust and believe I'm coming for you too Barcelona. See you June 28."


But she faced a furious backlash from supporters of independence in the troubled region.

The Barcelona gig is the star's only Spanish date on her Witness world tour, which began in Canada last September.

Tickets, which cost up to €104, are due to go on sale on March 7.

Cataluña remains without a regional government in the wake of an enforced election in December.

The poll was imposed by Madrid in the wake of an illegal independence referendum organised by pro-separatist politicians.

Ousted Catalan president Carles Puigdemont remains in Belgium and faces arrest if he returns to Spain, while a number of his former allies have been jailed.

Police officer dies

A POLICE officer died after supporters of Athletic Bilbao and Spartak Moscow clashed on the streets of the city in northern Spain.

It is believed the Ertzaina officer suffered a heart attack during the violent scenes in San Mames near the stadium that has left an unknown number of people injured.

The officer was rushed to the Basurto hospital but he could not be resuscitat-

Flares were fired and glasses, bottles, stones and even golf balls were used as weapons turning the area into a battle zone.

More than 600 police were on duty after warnings that trouble may erupt with the 2,500 travelling Russian fans.

Fake taxi driver held

POLICE in the south of Spain have taken a 'taxi' off the road that had no MOT, no licence, no legal meter, a broken seat and a window jammed shut with wood to prevent it from opening.


Suspicions of the Local Police in Sevilla were raised when they spotted the general state of disrepair of the vehicle as it dropped off two tourists at the train station in the city.

Easter flight fear Ryanair boss warns of strikes

LOW-COST Irish airline Ryanair's CEO Michael O'Leary has warned of potential strikes in Europe during Easter week.

Earlier this month O'Leary warned of possible disruptions as the airline prepares to extend its recent recognition of pilot unions to cabin crew staff but did not specify what markets were likely to be

He said the airline would rather see bookings damaged by the uncertaintv around a strike than give in to 'laughable' union demands.

According to respected news agency Reuters he told a press conference in Lisbon, "We had a strike in Germany on December 22... we expect the next one will be in Ireland - or

maybe it will be in Portugal - during Easter week."

However, no flights were cancelled during the four-hour strike in Germany before Christmas which O'Leary referred to.

Irish pilot union FOR-SA/IALPA has not announced any strike plans, but has said pilots had rejected an offered pay rise from Ryanair.

It added that the airline was refusing the union's demand to be recognised as the exclusive body for collective bargaining.

O'Leary said he was making 'significant progress' in talks with SPAC, the Portuguese pilots union, but management had offered a pay rise directly to Portuguese pilots and that 75 per cent of pilots had accepted the

A Ryanair spokesperson said, "As we explained in our Q3 results on February 5 last 'as we finalise union discussions along similar lines to that agreed in the UK, we expect some localised disruptions and adverse PR so investors should be prepared for the same'."

The February thirdquarter results statement said, "In certain jurisdictions unions representing competitor airlines will wish to test our commitment to our low cost, high pay/high productivity model to disrupt our operations

"We are fully prepared to face down any such disruption if it means defending our cost base or our high productivity model."

Blazing controversy

Police slammed over shock video

POLICE in Spain have attempted to defend their actions after a video appears to show officers 'ignoring' a man lying unconscious on the ground after leaping from his apartment to escape a fire.

The 40-year-old man jumped around six metres from his first-floor balcony and lav unconscious on the pavement as officers appeared to ignore him.

He is now in an intensive care unit in hospital in a critical condition.

The incident happened in Calle Espinosa in the San Anton neighbourhood of Cartagena in southern

A video shot by a neighbour shows that, for more than two minutes, members of the Local and National Police forces ignore the critically injured man lying on the ground.

However, the Local Po-

lice of Cartagena say that the video 'is only an extract' of what happened, and that, moments before the officers, immediately after arriving at the scene, had approached the person to check their status, and, once they found that he was unconscious, and did not respond, called the

health teams to act.

The Local Police stress that its officers are trained in first aid and say that 'a person in that state cannot be moved because of the risk of causing more serious injuries.

Therefore, they say that the actions of the officers 'was the correct one."

Gangland killers



A COURT CASE involving 35 members of MS-13, the murderous street gang also known as Mara Salvatrucha, is underway on the Costa Blanca.

A total of 12 sessions are scheduled for the trial, which will run until May, with the defendants facing prison sentences of two to 30 years for a range of charges including illegal weapons possession, attempted murder, conspiracy to murder, money laundering and drug trafficking.

It comes after a major police sting saw investigators swoop on the gang's Spanish headquarters in Ibi, Alicante, plus cells in Madrid, Barcelona and Gerona in the wake of a wiretapping probe.

The crackdown was designed to stop the organisation from expanding its operations in Spain, where it had been receiving funds from kingpins in the dangerous Central American country of El Salvador.

It also prevented the assassination of two people, including a man who witnessed the stabbing of a Romanian member of the Latin Kings - an enemy crew - in Alicante Port.

Among those on trial are several local bosses, who allegedly orchestrated violent territorial battles with rival gangs and set up drug trafficking networks.

But the majority are 'soldiers,' many of them children, who committed robberies and other petty crimes to pay the monthly membership fee of

According to reports, defence lawyers have negotiated a number of reduced sentences in exchange for confessions, although this has not been made official with the trial due to recommence on Thursday March 8.

Originating in Los Angeles, United States, most MS-13 members are from Central America, particularly El Sal-

They are famed for the tattoos covering their bodies and their motto 'Mata, roba, viola, controla' (kill, steal, rape, control). The gang is mostly active in the US. El Salvador, Mexico. Guatemala, Honduras, and Canada, and was planning to gain a foothold in Spain.





Digital giants Netflix and Amazon could enter the bidding, although there exist doubts over whether they have the technical capacity to stream live matches to millions of viewers.

The rights to the Spanish La Liga for 2019-2022 are also set to be sold over the next few months, and La Liga president Javier Tebas has admitted he is aiming to rake in €1.3 billion per year, a 30 per cent increase on the current deal.

But industry experts say he is being optimistic after Sky recently paid just over €4 billion for the 2019-2022 English Premier League rights, 16 per cent less than the previous agreement.

A report from Credit Suisse said: "Mediapro seems to be trying to generate interest in the football rights from new over-the-top (OTT) players, but the lack of OTT interest in the recent UK Premier League... suggests global OTT players such as Amazon are less likely to bid for Spanish domestic football."

Outlook: Brexit, Italian election in focus



Euro

EUR/GBP: Holding firm at £0.88 EUR/USD: Up from \$1.22 to \$1.24

Speculation that the European Central Bank (ECB) will remain dovish on the subject of monetary policy for the foreseeable future has countered the impact of a run of positive Eurozone data over the last few weeks.

That being said, the euro is still standing firm against rivals like the pound and US dollar.

Italy will be taking to the polls in March and most experts expect the election to result in a coalition government, with Silvio Berlusconi's conservative alliance projected to take the biggest share of votes.

The impact this would have on the euro largely depends on which parties Berlusconi allies himself with. If Berlusconi opts for Matteo Salvini, the euro would be pressured lower thanks to his opposition to the single currency

and preference for returning to the lira.

GBP/EUR: Down from €1.14 to €1.12 GBP/USD: Up from \$1.38 to \$1.40

After getting off to a fairly positive start to the year, the pound failed to sustain its initial momentum and has reversed gains against a number of the majors. Demand for the pound eased on concerns that government fissures will have a negative impact on Brexit negotiations.

Investors were also concerned as EU Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier intimated that the UK achieving a transitional deal after Brexit should not be taken for granted.

Brexit worries prevented the pound from deriving much benefit from the Bank of England (BoE) indicating that rates could rise sooner than currently forecast at its first policy gather-

Any Brexit related news is liable to be the driving force behind pound exchange rate movement over the next few weeks. UK data will also be of interest, as any reports which reduce the chances of the BoE increasing interest rates in 2018 will put the pound under pressure.

USD/GBP: Down from £0.72 to £0.71

USD/EUR: Down from €0.81 to €0.80

The Federal Reserve increased interest rates in December 2017, but the move had been so long expected that it failed to boost the US dollar. In fact, USD exchange rates actually softened as the Fed implied that interest rates would only be raised a further three times in 2018 rather than the four times hoped for.

The US dollar remained on soft form for much of January, although the currency has since recovered from its worst levels against the

The Fed is forecast to increase borrowing costs at its March gathering, and if it indicates that a further three adjustments could be made over the rest of the year we could see the US

Welcome to the future AI DOMINATES MOBILE WORLD CONGRESS

MORE than 2,000 companies and 100,000 people have flocked to Barcelona for the annual Mobile World Congress.

The wireless industry's biggest trade show also offers ideal networking opportunities for executives, bankers and analysts to get together.

Major trends at this year's show include cybersecurity, ultrafast fifth generation mobile networks and blockchain technology.

But the stars of the show are the latest smartphones, artificial intelligence (AI) devices and autonomous drones.

Highlights so far have included the launch of Samsung's Galaxy S9 handset, featuring an improved camera and augmented reality functions designed to challenge Apple's iPhone X.

The South Korean giant also showcased an updated version of its digital assistant Bixby, demonstrating how it can live translate a piece of text.

Chinese tech firm Huawei unveiled its first 5G-capable chip, enabling its devices to access faster internet speeds, before using the AI of its flagship Mate 10 Pro phone to drive a Porsche sports car round an obstacle

The company is now comfortably the world's third biggest smartphone maker behind Samsung and Apple after bagging a 10.4 per cent market share in 2017.

Spanish company Telefonica - one of Europe's top three telecommunications firms - revealed its plans to move some focus from fibre, mobile and television to value-added services, big data and cognitive intelligence as it presented its AI-powered digital assistant Aura.

Set to be launched in Spain, the UK (where it will be called O2 Ask), Germany, Argentina, Chile and Brazil over the weekend, Aura is the result of a collaboration with Facebook, Google and Microsoft.

And it will shortly become one of the first digital assistants to be inte-

grated with Google Assistant, benefiting around 120 million customers who use Android devices, and Cortana, Microsoft's digital assistant used by more than 600 million worldwide.

Telefonica chairman-CEO Jose Maria Alvarez-Pallete also revealed in a keynote speech some of Europe's biggest telecommunications players, including Telefonica, Deutsche Telekom, KPN and Orange, are working to develop a 'global data portability ecosystem' allowing customers to take usage data with them when they travel.

Elsewhere Nokia - whose phones are now licensed by Finnish company HMD Global - announced a revamped 4G version of the classic 8110 'banana phone,' while Sony unveiled its new Xperia

Outrage over sexist PR firm

SPANISH PR agency Impulsa Comunicacion has lost two major clients over a sexism row.

Coca Cola and glass repair company Carglass have dropped the Barcelonabased firm after a woman was turned down for an account executive position because 'the successful candidate will work with Carglass and Coca Cola... they need a man who can handle the pace of working with big companies.'

Rejected applicant Carla Focada tweeted an image of the email, captioning the image: 'It is incredible that companies that practice gender-based discrimination in the workplace still exist.'

And after the post went viral - prompting public slap downs from both named brands - the Impulsa website was mysteriously shut down.

Corruption in Spain exposed

SPAIN has risen in a global corruption ranking.

It comes as Germany-based nongovernmental organisation Transparency International released its 25th annual Corruption Perceptions Index, which lists 180 countries according to how they are perceived by the public sector.

Each is given a score of zero to 100, with 100 being the least corrupt. pain scored 57 - one point less than in 2016 - to finish joint 42nd in the table alongside Cyprus, Dominica and the Czech Republic.

The least corrupt countries were

New Zealand and Denmark, which scored 89 and 88, respectively, with the UK finishing joint fifth with 82, the same score as Canada, Luxembourg, Netherlands and Germany.

Somalia, with a score of nine, South Sudan (12) and Syria (14) were the three most corrupt countries, with two thirds of nations scoring less than 50.

The 2017 index is based on 13 surveys covering factors including the enforcement of anti-corruption law, access to information, political conflicts of interest and expert assessments.

Uranium mine scheme sparks pollution panic

A SPANISH plan to open a uranium mine near the Portuguese border has sparked outrage.

"Portugal will do everything it can to obtain the relevant information and, from there, ensure safety and zero impact on our side," said Joao Matos Fernandes, Portugal's environment minister.

Speaking to an environmental parliamentary commission, the official was quizzed how the government would ensure that pollution from the mine would be confined to Spain.

He replied that "we have performed all due diligence alongside Spain," but added that organisation of the scheme "has created a problem" after his requests for updates were ignored or answered "inadequately." And he has now demanded a meeting "because due protocol has not been fulfilled

satisfactorily by our counterpart."

Spain carried out an environmental impact analysis on the prospective site at Retornillo, around 40 kilometres from the border in rural Salamanca, Castilla y Leon, in 2013.

Since then the mine has been discussed repeatedly in diplomatic channels, with Spain adamant that the project has not yet been given the green light. But announcements posted on the website of Australia-based mining firm Berkeley Energia suggest that construction is due to begin later this year, leaving environmental campaigners and oth-

The project is reportedly being financed by the sovereign wealth fund of the Sultanate of Oman, which has contributed more than €105 million.



Spain among Euro leaders for private schools

AROUND 31 per cent of pupils in Spain study at privately-run secondary centres, the fourth-highest level in Europe, according to da-

The country came behind Belgium, Malta and Britain in terms of the number of students enrolled at the schools. Around 28 per cent study in publicly-funded charter schools and 3 per cent in private centres.

Around 69 per cent of Spanish pupils are being educated in public secondary schools and 68 per cent in public primary schools, according to figures reported in Spanish

The European average of the number of students studying at state schools is around 81 per cent, with Ireland, Finland, Poland and Germany the highest in terms of enrolment.



STUDENTS: 31 per cent study in privately-run centres.

Charter schools in Spain are financed and supported by the government but are privately run. Around six out of 10 of these schools are controlled by the Catholic Church, with the rest belonging to cooperatives and other groups.

Charter schools and public schools are part of the same network with studies showing that the former receive less money on average per student than public schools.

The government spends around €2,670 per pupil on charter schools compared to around €5,348 in state schools, according to the Centre for Sociological Research (CIS).





Charities on life support... but charity begins at home!

THERE appears no let-up in allegations of misconduct by charity aid workers. UN believes more than 600 women and children suffered sexual abuse and exploitation by its peacekeepers. Oxfam workers in Haiti reportedly paid teenage prostitutes with rice. aid staff swapped wheat for sex in Africa, while those in charge knew what was going on 10 years ago.

Many charities do fantastic work, but disillusionment takes its toll. Very high executive pay, immoral behaviour, rather self-righteous finger wagging, chugging and other aggressive marketing ploys will inevitably bring lasting changes. Oxfam's far from an isolated case. The whole charitv section needs root and branch reform.

Infuriated supporters of Oxfam are already withdrawing their contributions. But is this missing the point? Abuse is rampant in all sectors, and all organisations (political parties, churches, schools, colleges, businesses) are inclined to nip in the bud reports of abuse in order to protect their reputa-

This encourages further abuse because perpetrators don't fear repercussions and victims doubt they'll be believed. What's needed is an independent body to scrutinise all claims of abuse, safeguards and sanctions across the whole

So, let's support charities we trust - like Cudeca here on the Costa del Sol - and reduce the UK foreign aid budget so that it's in line with other countries.

The Department for International Development (DfiD) now has a statutory requirement to spend 0.7 per cent of Britain's gross national income on development aid annually. In 2016 this came to £13.3 billion! The appalling Oxfam scandal simply demonstrates

how impossible it is for staff at DfiD to manage this huge amount of taxpayers' money and ensure it's properly spent.

British taxpayers are still sending financial aid to India, now one of the world's fastest growing economies. They're still sending money to Nigeria, the world's sixth-largest oil producer, while we have such scandalous problems in need of funding at home...



ME neither, which is why we should all go quickly and grab our passports before it's

This sounds melodramatic, overly so perhaps as I'm going to update you on how to obtain an emergency UK passport, but there again, not having a valid travel document when you need it can really be a drama.

Renewing our passports in good time is obviously the easiest and cheapest option. Our British Consul confirms that if you apply for a passport or a renewal out of summer period there is a quick turnaround. The official waiting time still says four weeks but some are back in two.

Obviously now would probably be a good time to take a look, before the annual, summer rush begins which always causes backlogs because most of us don't think of our passport unless we have planned a trip or a holiday, often realising we can't find it at the last minute or it being stolen whilst

All too common is the unexpected family bereavement or someone being taken ill that sends us in search of the passport; which is not found or is out of date which adds to the

If you are a resident in Spain you can apply for a temporary passport, which will get you there and back. It may be as expensive

as a 10-year passport and only valid for one round trip but if you really need to go, you

More good news is that you no longer need to go anywhere to apply for the emergency document; everything can be done online from www.gov.uk. The Consulate can also offer a courier service to get your emergency passport to you so you don't have to pick it up either; another cost but for many a better option than having the added burden of going to Malaga.

If you have a health card always take it with you. Until the UK leaves the EU the EHIC - European Health Insurance Card remains valid, so remind family and friends to get this when coming over.

When you take out a travel insurance please declare any illnesses. All too often traveller's insurance is declared null and void because they didn't declare a pre-existing condition, such as diabetes, heart condition, etc.

This increases the premium perhaps but if vou have to use your insurance you'll want one that pays out and although the Consulate is there to help, you'll still need to pay your costs.

I have no plans to travel at the moment but I have started checking out Marbella Twin-Towns and who knows, I might get the opportunity to fly off say to Miami Beach to do a bit of recording and I wouldn't want to miss out because I hadn't checked my passport! Maybe we could even make it a group outing so I invite you to do likewise.

Spare a few Bitcoins mister?

Terence Kennedy has watched the price of Bitcoin, convinced it can't go higher. Every day. For years.



TAKE pity on poor James Howells from Newport in Wales. His local council still won't let him sift through the landfill site to find the hard-drive he dumped in 2013. It could be worth €66 million.

Or \leq 33 million when you read this. Or nothing.

Cryptocurrencies are on a rollercoaster ride, and a novelty currency which bought part of a pizza a decade ago, could see you sunning in Monte Carlo today with hot and cold running margaritas. Or wiped out, as the 'bubble will burst' doomsayers pre-

James Howells' discarded hard-drive held the so-called 'blockchain' codes for 7,500 bitcoins he bought for just € 140 in 2009. His computer was trashed in 2013, its codes forgotten.

He's not alone. An Australian threw away a hard-drive with 1,400 bitcoins on it in 2012. His loss today:

€ 12 million. And an American techie used 10,000 of the novel new exchange medium in 2010 to buy a pizza. Some pizza: €88 million today.

Holland's fabled tulip mania of the 1630s, where one bulb could be the cost of a house, has nothing on the madness that's happening right now with 1,400 cryptocurrencies out there and rising.

Even the silly ones attract obscene amounts. Dogecoin was dreamed up as a joke by a couple of technopranksters in 2013. It has no underpinning assets and no actual value,



sniffing from the same glue-pot and desperate to jump on the bandwagon to buy anything bearing the name 'coin,' have thrown nearly a billion euros at it so far.

Potcoin underpins legal and illegal cannabis purchases, Dentacoin is exactly what its name suggests (for dentists), Kanye West sued Coinye into oblivion, there's Titcoin (no, don't ask), and heaven help us all, Trump coin will help to build the wall.

Yes I confess, for a split-nanosecond I was also swept along by the hype, the famous 'FOMO' (Fear Of Missing Out) as I wondered whether to invest my vast and ill-gotten gains in Bitcoin.

Two things quickly become apparant

One: There are more dodgy bitcoin dealers out there than you could shake your savings-book at, and many will also be happy to sell you a bridge.

Two: Do you really want to be known a month, a year or a decade from now, as the loser whose life-savings will barely buy a pizza?

My favourite cryptocurrency of them all? The 'joke' one whose name makes absolutely no bones about what you're getting, yet is still worth double its 2016 cost: Ponzicoin.

BITCOIN: Chock-full of goodness?

Mine the gap

IF you really want to swing aboard the cryptocurrency train, many think Bitcoin has already left the station.

But there are more than a thousand others being 'mined' which might, just might, become 'the next big thing'.

Ethereum cost €1 in 2015. Today it's worth over €700. Maybe next week, double, or nothing. Or search the web for Ripple, Stellar, IOTA or even the cheapie Litecoin.

To buy coins you need a so-called 'wallet,' usually held by a cryptocurrency exchange like Coinbase, Kraken, Bittrex or Coinmama.

But beware: Japan's Mt Gox exchange famously lost 850,000 coins to hackers in 2014. Two months ago the Coincheck exchange lost a breathtaking €400 million.

Personally I'm sticking with normal gold coins - the ones filled with chocolate.

STATISTICS and their cousin averages are slippery customers.

On average when Bill Gates - of Microsoft fame and leader of the Gates Foundation - enters a restaurant everyone in the room on average is a billionaire. Similarly, on average house prices in London recovered by the fourth quarter of 2017 and prices rose on average by £4,000 (\leqslant 4,526) between November and December.

On average London houses now cost £227,000 (\leqslant 256,873) according to the Land Registry. Prices on average appear to be up by 5.2 per cent year on year. Of course statistics and averages can be useful illustrations but they can also hide and disguise some spectacular outliers in the range of prices that houses command. That we all place so much weight on statistics is a good reason to be very cautious of them as well.

Hidden in plain sight is one wealthy man's house. Consider Dr Gert-Rudolf Frick, heir to the Daimler automotive dynasty who placed the Park House Estate on the market in September 2013 for an eye-watering £105 million (€118.8 million).

Park House sits in more than half an acre of private walled gardens in central London. Half an acre of ground close by the museum district in South Kensington to the west of Bucking-

ham Palace and described as 'a country house in the middle of London. From no window can you see a car passing by.'

Boasting six bedrooms, five bathrooms and seven reception rooms it was recorded as the 'finest house to come on to the market in the capital for 25 years.'

But despite adding a five-bedroom house and two one-bedroom flats on the site as part of the package the Park House Estate failed to sell.

Recently reports appeared that a buyer has eventually emerged though it took three and half years to do so and a headline grabbing price cut of slightly more than 60 per cent, too. Which is spectacular, though the selling price of £40 million (€45.3 million) as reported is weighty and considerable in any language. The Park House Estate is without doubt exceptional as is the price sought and realised for it.

A news story headlining a price cut of one individual property or indeed a price rise does not signify a trend nor does it reflect the mood of the market as a whole. It does speak volumes though of the value attached to a given property by a specific willing buyer and seller on any given day. If you really desire that ideal villa you will pay as much as you can sensibly afford for it, but no more than you believe it is worth and less if you can convince the seller.

I HAVE been a Driving Instructor in the UK for 56 years and also employed by the DSA as a Driving Ex-



The importance of protein







PRIORAT as one of the upcoming Spanish wine regions has recorded an extraordinary leap in quality and reputation over the last decade.



This small area which qualifies as Denominació d'Origen Qualificada (DOQ) is in Tarragona Province in Cataluña and is one of only two - alongside Rioja - regions to qualify as DOCa, the highest qualification.

It produces mainly red and powerful wines. Characterised by a terroir of volcanic origins with black slate and quartz soil known as llicorella with vineyards on terraces at 100m - 700m, the area has low yields due to the rocky soil that does not allow water accumulation.

Wine production in the area dates from the 12th century, when monks from the Monastery of Scala Dei introduced viticulture and the prior ruled as a feudal lord, giving rise to the name Priorat.

At the end of the 19th century, the phylloxera pest devastated the vineyards and replanting was undertaken only in the 1950's. In the 1980's bulk wine production was phased out

and bottling of quality wine was introduced.

The traditional grape variety in El Priorat is the red Garnacha tinta, which is found in all the older vineyards. Other red varieties are Garnacha Peluda, Cariñena, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah.

White varieties are Garnacha blanca, Macabeo, Pedro Ximénez and Chenin.

The traditional reds are a single grape bottling of Grenache and Carignan, or a blend of these with French grape varieties including Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, or Syrah. Usually aged in oak barrels for 18 months followed by six months in the bottle, Priorat wines have a consumption optimal two years later.





Natural gardens


LIVING in Spain, relaxing, strolling, drinking and eating in natural surroundings is an easy thing to do on as many days as possible, whatever the time of year.

Valentine's Day was a good example even though no Valentina was around.

The morning awoke cold with a four-degree centigrade nip in the air but a bright blue windless day followed and by 1pm it was pleasantly warm to have a tapas lunch on a south facing terrace.

By 2pm one was tempted to strip off for a two-hour early sun tanning and vitamin D topping up session. Then before things started to chill down it was interesting to observe how quickly the natural world reacted to the warm direct sunshine which took the liquid in a south facing thermometer up to 48 de-

For the first time this year the Koi carp were continuously cruising the surface, two plump toads crept out from beneath a large rock and plopped into the pond, a welcome red squirrel ran with amazing balance along the electricity line across the nearby

street, for a second time this month a youngish hedgehog came out of hibernation, and naturally common garden birds visited nesting boxes and the thickest shrubs to see if one met their needs. Sadly rarer species disappeared 15 years ago when copses were felled and many new houses

On the flower front early spring colour is led by the first yellow crocuses, winter jasmine, acacias, euryops, oxalis, nasturtiums until popped in a salad, and aeoniums. The first blues already follow with rosemary, echiums and the first

heads of broccoli for daily eating. Looking through the study window across to the local mountain ridge seems that this afternoon will be as sunny as yesterday, but today I need to give some shrubs and a tunnel path for summer shade along the southern edge of the garden some urgent pruning to achieve some interesting shaping and heavier flowering.

The 20 builder's tubs that comprise today's salad bed are in full production having had no heavy frosts - at least as yet.

There were 21 varieties of salad leaves and flowers

in the starter salad served to guests three evenings ago.

If you have yet to start to eat a few healthy garden flowers and leaves, if not raising vegetables in a raised bed or two, a read through the book Living well from our garden Mediterranean style could be an interesting read on a sunny terrace or in front of an evening fire.

It is most easily obtained speedily and inexpensively from Amazon Books.

Naturally it would be possible to organise a talk on the topic for a local social or gardening club, or radio station.

Link to animal abuse



"THERE is no doubt that there is a link between animal abuse and human abuse," says Dr Rhonda Schulman, a veterinarian at the University of Illinois Veterinary Teaching Hospital.

"The statistics are frightening, but it is important that everyone, including veterinarians, recognise this serious problem because animal abuse in a home is very likely a sign of an even bigger problem within that family."

It is estimated that nearly 90 per cent of pets living in homes where domestic abuse is taking place are either abused or killed, and nearly

60 per cent of women who seek assistance from shelters to escape abuse have had a pet killed by an abuser.

In an abusive situation the family pet is often used by the abuser as leverage to control the person being abused. Threat of harm to a beloved pet can be a very powerful tool for the abuser. Abuse of the pet is also a way to inflict mental anguish on the abused. Many women are reluctant to leave the abuser for fear that the pet will be harmed.

Until recently there have been few options for abused women with pets. Now domestic violence shelters have begun to implement ways to protect not only the women and children but their pets as well. "Abuse can also be self-propagating within a family," says Dr Schulman. "For in-

stance, the mother or father abuses the child and then the child abuses the pet. This is sometimes the only way the child can assume any sense of personal power."

Witnessing the abuse of a family pet can influence children to become abusive later in life, because they have learned the behaviour through observing and identification with the abuser.

Studies have also shown that children who torture animals are at higher risk than others to grow up to use violence against people. Many adults who have committed serial murders or mass violence tortured animals as children

"This means that if a child is exhibiting this sort of behaviour, it is extremely important to take it seriously and intervene while there is still a chance to positively influence the child's development," says Dr Schulman.

"Veterinarians are starting to take a more active role in spotting abuse and providing help for people who are in abusive situations; however, many veterinarians still do not ask questions when presented with suspicious circumstances, either they do not wish to be involved or because they don't know how to help," says Dr Schulman.

It has been shown that women in abusive situations will seek medical care for themselves and their pets when they feel it is safe to do so. They may not volunteer how the injuries came about, but may give such information if asked. "Sometimes all it takes is asking," says Dr Schulman. "As a profession, veterinarians need to start getting involved. Simply posting flyers for the local women's shelter in the veterinary clinic might encourage women to seek help if they need it."In order to help people at risk, we have to work together, and that includes professionals in all areas of health care, including veterinary medicine." says Dr Schulman.

BARCELONA will look to extend their record unbeaten run as they travel to struggling Las Palmas later tonight (Thursday).

The league leaders thrashed neighbours Girona 6-1 on Saturday as a Luis Suarez hat-trick, Messi's brace and a stunning strike from Philippe Coutinho saw the Catalan giants set a new club record of 32 games unbeaten.

Full speed ahead!

FORMULA ONE teams have begun their 2018 pre-season testing in Barcelona.

The first test of the week-long preseason testing officially got underway on Monday; with drama unfolding from the get go.

McLaren got off to the worst possible start as Fernando Alonso lost a wheel after six laps on the first day.

The two-time champion lost control at the final corner of Spain's Circuit de Catalunya and his right wheel came loose of the car.

At the time, McLaren Executive Director, Zak Brown said: "There is no drama. It is quite an easy fix.

"It is what testing is for. All the teams will have a variety of issues. We will lose very little time. No big deal at all."

Alonso had been on course to set the fastest time of the day so far when he crashed out and was back out before the end of the day, setting the fifth fastest time; before they lapped quicker than they managed in the whole of testing last year on day two.

Red Bull's Daniel Ricciardo set the pace on day one and was the only driver to complete 100 laps, finishing ahead of Valtteri Bottas' Mercedes and Kimi Raikkonen for Ferrari.

Testing continues for the rest of the week and after this week's session, another test will take place in Barcelona between March 6 and 9, before the season officially gets underway in Australia on March 25.

Neymar to sit out crucial clash

PARIS SAINT-GERMAIN forward Neymar is expected to miss his side's crucial Champions League tie with Real Madrid after suffering a fractured metatarsal and a twisted ankle injury.

The world's most expensive player played a pivotal role in his side's 3-0 win over Marseille on Sunday, but left the field in tears as he was stretchered off after rolling his ankle.

Fears of a broken ankle were quickly allayed after the Brazilian underwent scans on Sunday and Monday, which reportedly revealed that the injury is not as bad as first expected.

PSG confirmed on their official website "Further examinations on Monday have confirmed

(Neymar has) a twisted right ankle and a hairling fracture of the fifth metatarsal."

While no indication was given as to how long the 26-year-old will be out for, he is expected to miss a number of weeks due to the injury, but should reportedly recover before the end of the season in time for the World Cup.

Madrid take a 3-1 lead to Paris after they came from behind to secure a memorable victory at the Bernabeu. Late goals from Cristiano Ronaldo and Marcelo gave the holders a commanding lead ahead of the second leg after the Portuguese superstar's 100th Champions League goal for Real had levelled Rabiot's opener.

Madrid legend wants Harry at Bernabeu

REAL MADRID legend Raul has admitted he would like to see Harry Kane at Real Madrid in the future, calling him 'one of the best strikers in the world.'

Raul, who scored 323 goals for Madrid in 741 appearances, was full of praise for Kane who has once again been the standout performer of Tottenham this season.

Following his 56 goals in 52 games for club and country in 2017, the 24-year-old has continued to impress with another prolific season for Spurs, notching 35 goals in all competitions already, matching his entire total for the last campaign.

And when asked if he would like to see Kane at the Bernabeu in the future, the former Madrid striker, who was speaking at the 2018 World Sports Awards, told the media: "Why not? Of course, I imagine a lot of teams would like to bring him to their team."

The England striker has continued to be linked with Real Madrid in the past few months, not a surprise for Raul who also said the England man has "great qualities."

"Harry Kane is a typical striker," he said.

"He scores in every single game. I think he has great qualities. I like him a lot.

"I don't know if he wants to change or if he has the opportunity to change, but I think he is doing well. He is one of the best strikers in the world."



"It's not about politicians, it's about democracy" Pep vows to carry on wearing ribbon

MANCHESTER CITY boss Pep Guardiola has said he will continue wearing a yellow ribbon in support of imprisoned Catalan politicians despite an FA charge.

The Catalan said he will continue to do so because "before a manager, I am a human being."

Former Barcelona and Bayern Munich manager Guardiola was charged by English football's governing body last week for breaching 'FA kit and advertising regulations' by 'wearing a political message, specifically a yellow ribbon.'

He first began wearing the ribbon after two key members of the Catalan separatists movement were held without bail after the Catalan independence vote in October, which the government deemed illegal.

According to reports, the ban came after the FA had spoken to Guardiola about the issue in mid-December and gave the Spaniard two formal warnings.

And in spite of the charges against him, the 47-year-old continued to sport the ribbon at Wembley as his side brushed Arsenal aside in the Carabao Cup final on Sunday.

In an interview after the 3-0 fi-

nal win, the Spaniard spoke at length on the matter.

He told English media: "If I broke the rules, I accept the fine. I am a human being.

"There are four guys in prison. There are other guys, who are outside of Cataluña; when they come back, they are going to be jailed, imprisoned for rebellion and sedition.

"It's not about politicians, it's about democracy; it's about helping the people who didn't do absolutely anything.

"You did Brexit. You allowed Scotland to have a referendum about if (they) want to stay (in the United Kingdom) or not. "And, after, the people vote. That is what they ask and they are in jail right now."

The Manchester City boss faces a potential fine and could even be given a touch-line ban for breaching FA rules, but remains adamant that he will continue to wear the ribbon no matter what the consequences.

"I will accept if the FA decide about my behaviour. It's just to be part of something for humanity. That's why I appreciate from Manchester City fans the support."

Guardiola has until Monday, to formally respond to the charge.

Ex-Spain striker Quini dies aged 68

FORMER Barcelona and Sporting Gijon striker Enrique 'Quini' Castro has passed away after reportedly suffering a heart attack aged 68

Widely regarded as one of the greatest Spanish strikers of alltime, Quini scored 231 league goals in 443 games for Gijon while also notching 54 goals in 100 games for Barcelona.

He was also awarded the Pichichi trophy five times, given to the league's top scorer, and represented his country at both the 1978 and 1982 World Cups.

The Spaniard was famously kidnapped at gunpoint after scoring twice in Barcelona's 6-0 victory over Hercules in 1981, being held for 25 days before being released unharmed, and miraculously went on to finish as La Liga's top scorer that season.



Tributes to the former forward have flooded in on social media, with the likes of Lionel Messi, Andres Iniesta and Gerard Pique all sending their condolences, while Barcelona President, Josep Maria Bartomeu also spoke of his 'dismay' at Quini's death.

He wrote on Twitter: "Dismayed by the death of Quini, an extraordinary player and an incredible person who won a privileged place in the hearts of the Barca players and the world of football.

"Our heartfelt condolences to your family and friends."
