'Integrated' jihadist on trial

Moroccan-born Altea resident, pleaded guilty to terrorism charges in Madrid's National High Court.

Together with Abdelillah Migou, he was accused of distributing propaganda as well as recruiting and indoctrinating jihadi combatants for the fundamentalist terrorist group, Daesh.

Migou, who has also admitted his guilt and faces a nine-year-sentence, was in Morocco at the time but arrested in a simultaneous operation by the Spanish police and their Moroccan counterparts in October

Both men were active on social media, where Merabet adopted the role of a 'virtual charismatic leader.

The Public Prosecutor had recommended an 11-year sentence for Merabet as he is also accused of drugs offences. He was a known supplier of hashish and allegedly used the proceeds to finance the jihadi cause, as

A WRONG number helped a doctor to defuse a gender violence offence in Aspe that included death threats.


The doctor from the town's Primary Care centre was alarmed to receive a WhatsApp voice message from an unknown number. As she listened, she heard a male insulting and threatening another man, accusing him of having an affair with his partner.

The doctor could hear a woman in the background and. afraid that the caller would carry out his threats, immediately contacted an off-duty National Police officer who was in Aspe at the time.

Within three hours, police had confirmed that the call and the situation were genuine, and were able to identify and locate the potential victim.

Her partner had fled by then and the authorities immediately launched standard procedures for protecting women at risk from gender-based vio-



IT is one of Spain's most dramatic natural spectacles.

And El reventón de los chorros del río Mundo - literally, the explosion of the Mundo River streams - has this week served up some stunning photo opportunities for thrill seekers.

The rare spectacle only occurs when rainfall above 100 millimetres falls for a prolonged period around 10-15 days beforehand, with a drop in temperature and atmospheric air pressure sparking the breathtaking dis-

The Mundo is the main tributary of the Rio Segura, which flows from its source through Murcia and Alicante before reaching the Mediterranean Sea.

Arising in the Sierra de Alcaraz. mountains in Albacete, Castilla-La Mancha, the river flows out of a limestone cave which is at least 32 kilometres deep before plummmeting 300 metres down a spectacular

The volume of water can be very low during dry periods, but when conditions are right an extraordinary upswelling occurs, pushing millions of litres through the limestone rock in a phenomenon known as 'trop plein' (overflow in French).

And the result is a truly unforgettable sight for the lucky few willing to brave the dangerous, slippery con-

Spanish women set to strike



GIRL POWER: The strike will be followed by demonstrations.

SPANISH women are set to make their biggest ever stand against Spain's macho culture.

It comes as hundreds of thousands of women will hold their first national one-day strike to demand equal salaries and tougher action against domestic violence to mark International Women's Day today (Thursday).

Organised by The Commission for March 8, a collective of feminist groups, the strike takes place under the motto 'if we stop, the world stops.'

While the action is legal and women are permitted to down tools for the whole day, national unions CCOO and UGT have suggested a pair of two hour slots - from 11-1pm and 4-6pm - since workers will not be paid while they are on strike.

The walk out will be followed by demonstrations and rallies in Spanish towns and cities, most of which are scheduled to begin at 6.30-7pm.

And the protest is not restricted to working women, with housewives urged to join the strike, or at least hang kitchen utensils or aprons in the

windows of their homes.

Purple bracelets will also be worn throughout the day, and women are being pressed to avoid buying any non-essential items, particularly feminine hygiene products which critics say are subject to a 'pink tax' in Spain, while boycotting companies considered to exploit the female image.

Men are encouraged to support their partners by assuming responsibility for housework and other domestic tasks, or by joining the protests and

Women in Spain earn an average of 14.9 per cent less than men per hour, while there is a recognised career glass ceiling, with the majority of managerial and directorial positions in the country occupied by men.

Domestic violence also remains a major issue in the country, with 48 women killed by their partners or ex-partners in 2017.

Deadly tree bug devastates inland economy

THE Marina Baja village of Tarbena wants to be classed as a disaster area.

The regional government's policies for eradicating the tree-killing Xylella Fastidiosa from Alicante Province will extinguish practically all almond-growing in the municipality, a town hall communique warned.

The council has just learnt that infected almond trees have been found on seven more parcels of land in addition to the 16 already confirmed. According to EU directives adopted by the Generalitat (regional

government), all trees within a radius of 100 metres must be felled and destroyed wherever Xylella Fastidiosa has been detected.

The effect on Tarbena's scenery, environment and economy will be 'catastrophic,' warned the document which urged the Consell, the Generalitat's Cabinet, to declare villages like Tarbena disaster areas, making available official subsidies and grants.


Practically none of Tarbena's 600 residents earn a living exclusively from the now-devastated almond groves and the village depends largely on

This is the time of the year when visitors flock to the area to admire the almond blossom but Tarbena has until now attracted rural tourism and weekend excursionists year-round.

The local population and the town hall fear that few will want to see a scarred, blighted landscape.

"If this ends up looking like a desert we'll have to leave the village to earn a living," a Tarbena restaurateur predicted. "Practically all of us depend on tourism," he said, pointing out that the town had a dozen restaurants and tourist-orientated businesses for a population of just 600. "Just imagine what tourism brings in."



Four times lucky

FOR the fourth time in just over a month. Denia Council avoided having to pay hefty compensation to developers.

Earlier the Valencia region's Upper Court of Justice (TSJ) ruled that the town hall would not have to pay more than ≤ 53 million for halting three projects in Bosc de Diana and Les Marines.

Now the TSJ has rejected another appeal demanding €3.2 million, plus interest, after Denia Town Hall declassified land at Venta del Burro in Les Rotes, following the withdrawal of the 2005 Transitory Town Plan

This area, known as Els

Canons, contains the remains of bunkers and an anti-aircraft battery dating from the Civil War that ended with Franco's victory in 1939. It was classified as development land in 1972, a ruling that was reversed by the regional government in 2013.

The court decisions gave weight to Denia Council's stance that once again there were no signs of development on the land, maintained councillor Maria Josep Ripoll.

This, she said, endorsed Denia Town Hall's policies despite 'constant murmurings' which claimed that declassifying land would entail multimillion compensation payouts.

Bad spellers and bad owners

TWO frightened and confused dogs found recently in Busot were obviously abandoned and not lost.

One of them, a male, had a badly-spelt note in Spanish tucked in its collar: "My owners are fed up with me and don't want me any more. I'm neutered."

The dogs, one black and apparently the mother of the light-coloured male, have been rescued by Busot's animal protection association,

At present they are quarantined in a boarding kennels paid for by BARC which is also picking up the vet's bill.

BARC has put up posters throughout Busot and via the social media is offering €300 to anyone who can provide information that will help to identify the dogs' former owners. Once located, they intend to report them to the courts.

"The dogs, now named Zeus and Hera, are extremely shy but now that they are with us we can help them to begin trusting the human race," BARC said.

Committee member Angela Argeles explained that the number of abandoned animals is increasing in Busot. The association took in 35 dogs in 2017 but has already assisted 20 this year and is becoming overwhelmed as they do not have a shelter and exist on donations and volunteers who foster the dogs in their own

It's time to end the gender no-pay gap

SPAIN'S feminist strike is to be applauded.

The decision by Spain's working women and housewives to take a stand against issues including domestic violence and salaries is a brave one in a country with a strong male bias.

Whether or not today's industrial action and demonstrations spark genuine change remains to be seen, but the Spanish government has been wise not to contest the strike.

And if the turnout is anything close to the inspiration for the event it will undoubtedly be a resounding success.

In 1975 the women of Iceland decided to strike for equal rights. Around 90 per cent of the female population took part, and the event brought about a seismic shift in the way women were viewed, placing it at the forefront of the fight for equality.

It was known as the Women's Day Off and five years later Iceland elected Vigdis Finnbogadottir, the world's first democratically-elected female leader.

In Spain, women simply hope to be seen as equals.


Heavily over-represented in part-time and temporary jobs, women also spend double the amount of time on unpaid work such as caring for family members of household chores than men, according to the National Institute of Statistics.

While progress has been made since the 1970s, when women were unable to vote, obtain a passport or buy property without their husband's permission, there is still a long way to go.

And today could mark an important step along that road.

Experts justify crematorium shut down

THE decision to close the crematorium in San Juan in 2013 was proportionate to the risks involved, experts said.

The company that owns the crematorium is suing 11 town councillors who voted to close the installation and have now been questioned

The councillors were not competent to order the closure, even as a precautionary measure, the owners maintained, claiming that they based their decision on a regional government report that lacked 'definitive conclusions' regarding the alleged hazards.

Five years ago, this concluded that the crematorium posed a health risk for the population and warned that its owners need to ensure the best possible conditions to minimise that risk.

Environmental Health chief Jose Vicente Marti Biosca and the Unit's chemical engineer Juan Francisco Sanchez Perez were responsible for endorsing the study that prompted the

Both have now ratified their endorsement to the judge and defended the decision to shut down the crematorium.

Carbon monoxide emissions exceeded the limits established by Spanish law and the presence of cancer-causing dioxins and furans exceeded the recommendations of prestigious international bodies, the study had warned.

Both scientists acknowledged that the town hall had acted with 'caution and prudence.'

He also doubts that the moon landing ever occurred outside a film studio and is not convinced that the sun is much bigger than the moon.

He bases his scepticism on Pythagorean geometry and maintains that according to round-Earth theories there should be 80 metres of curvature between Benidorm and Playa de San Juan, 33 kilometres away

Priest retracts Facebook denunciation

ALFAZ'S parish priest, Fr Miguel Angel Schiller Villalta has apologised for declarations made earlier this year.

The diocese has also made public Fr Schiller's letter of apology to the Vicar General, written at the bishopric's request.

The letter also said that he was aware that he had made 'inappropriate declarations that caused pain and scandal.'

He also withdrew his Facebook statements accusing the Church of being corrupt. "Not all bishops and priests are corrupt pederasts," he wrote.

"I apologise for the harm that my affirmations and for the language used have caused the Church, my fellow priests and any people I may have offended," the letter continued.

Franco-era names erased from streets

THE deadline for a list of streets in Alicante City that will require renaming due to their links with the Franco regime passed last Monday.

A commission is now set to determine which streets will be accepted and which will not under Historical Memory laws. These laws require localities to erase traces of the dictatorship from public spaces.

The Historical Memory Commission will also seek a consensus on what the new names are to be before they go to the authorities for approval.

District boards will also be required to vote on the proposed changes but these votes are nonbinding.

Fernando Marcos, the city council's historical memory spokesperson, said the streets would be 'alicantinised' and that the new names would be acceptable to everyone.

Maria Jose Espuch, from the

Compromis group on the council, said the process, which should have served to dignify Alicante's streets, had become a 'deplorable circus.'

Espuch's comments come as Spanish media reported on Sunday that residents in the south of the city disapproved of 10 out of 13 of the proposed new names.

They have asked for Plaza de la Division Azul to be renamed after Alicante judo athlete. Maria Bernabeu.

Regional government generosity for TRAM

THE region's rail operator FGV will spend €32 million of its 2018 budget on Alicante Province's TRAM.

Of this, € 5.6 million goes to the Torregrossa Tunnel just outside Alicante City where work restarted last December following a halt of five years after the regional government of the day ran out of cash.

Once completed, the tunnel will shorten journeys and increase the frequency of trains between Alicante City, Campello, Benidorm and Denia.

The lion's share of this year's assignment, €23 milllion, will be spent on Line 9 between Benidorm and Denia, where renovation and modernisation began in 2015 and is due to be completed by next year.

FGV's 2018 plans include replacing rolling stock and electrifying the section linking Benidorm railway station and the new stop at the nearby mainline bus station.

THE fish farm off Calpe has apparently become home to a type of critically endangered

Grupo Andromeda Iberica, which is also responsible for fish farms off Altea and Villajoyosa, announced that employees inspecting cables at the Calpe installation found them clustered with thousands of young bivalves that shared many similarities with fan mussels (pinna nobilis).

As these are a threatened

species, Grupo Andromeda Iberica immediately contacted the Catholic University of Valencia's Institute of Environmental Research and Marine Science (Imedmar), which has a laboratory at Calpe's fishing port.

"They are trying to identify this species, as there are two types of fan mussel on our coast," a spokesman said, explaining that the experts suspect the larvae belong to both species and must determine how many there are of each.

"We hope that a good number are Pinna Nobilis," said Jose Rafael Garcia March, an Imedmar investigator and lecturer in Marine Science at the Catholic University.

Another Imedmar lecturer, Jose Tena, also pointed out that fish farms are installed in deep water over abundant

silt, which attracts numerous bottom-dwelling species.

"The larvae have found an ideal structure of cables with nooks and crannies to provide hiding places," Tena

Grupo Andromeda's Tahiche Lacomba, attributed the presence of the larvae to the new. plaited safety cables that the company now uses to moor the fish farm's cages and which give them shelter.

The 32-year-old woman was eventually able to escape the house and immediately reported the incident to the police at the Northern District Police Station.

Police were then able to track down the two Ecuadorian men, aged 41 and 46, in less than 24 hours and arrested them on suspicion of sexual assault and holding a hostage.





Not yet covered by the health care system?

There is now a Special Agreement for the provision of assistance to people who are not covered by the Health-care system, which is signed with the 'Generalitat', allowing access to the basic portfolio of assistance services by the National Health Care System, within the Valencian Community.

(**not including supplementary benefits** such as pharmaceutical, orthotic and prosthetic benefits, dietary products or non-urgent medical transportation).

In order to benefit you must meet the following criteria:

- **1.** be registered in a town within the Valencian Community
- **2.** have no access nor receive any form of benefits from the Health Care System, nor have access to a public health care protection system under any other name
- 3. have proof of residency in Spain for a continuous period of at least one year immediately prior to the application date.
- **4.** be registered (empadronado/a) at the time of filing the application, in a town belonging to the territorial scope of the Region



The special agreement for the provision of health care cannot be renewed until the period of one year has expired, from the day after the expiry of the previous one.

What are the fees and how are they paid?

- The monthly fee for under 65 years old is 60€
- The monthly fee for 65 or older is 157€ (dependent on age on the date of which the corresponding monthly fee is due)
- These charges must be paid in full each calendar month.
- The fees are to be paid by direct debit from a valid bank account in the applicant's name.
- The payment must be made within the first ten calendar days of the month.

Basic Information

1. There are many types of property or real estate rights auctions in Spain, some of those carried out by the courts (judicial), but there are also other types carried out by the Tax Agency (Spanish tax authority) for example.

2. The judicial or court auctions of real estate assets are regulated in the Civil Procedure Law (LEC), in articles 655 and following clauses.

Who can take part in them? In principle anyone can bid at a property court auction. If you are not a Spanish national, you must obtain an NIE number and register it. The NIE is the Foreigner Identification Number, and it will be your tax identification number in Spain.

office can help you, and in general any lawyer or expert in the matter who has experience in the court real estate properties auction process, because as we note below, it is important to make some checks and verifications on the property.

Basic issues to consider

First, you must have the necessary funds available to bid. To participate in the auction, according to the article number 669 of the LEC, you must consign or deposit in the court the equivalent to 5 per cent of the court survey value of the prop-

If your bid is successful you must pay the balance and if you do not in the stated time period, you may lose the deposit paid.

It is essential to understand and study exactly the property, asset or right to be auctioned: that is, if it is the totality of the rights on the property, a part of it, or if it is the full domain (property right in full) or only the usufruct (the right to enjoy the use of the property).

You should also study in detail the court file and essentially the court surveyor report, which will usually be part of the execution and auction process and is where you can check the most relevant aspects of the

It is important to make all possible checks related to the real estate property, as if it were an ordinary purchase. That is, analyse not only the registration situation of the property and its charges, but if possible, also its

cadastral status, if it has an occupancy licence, its urban situation according to municipal planning, etc.

If possible, it is recommended that you visit the property to see if it is occupied or not, note its appearance, check the area,

In summary, it is essential to minimise the risks of a purchase of a property through a public auction, so in addition to the financial and economic part of the operation, the legal, urban, cadastral situation of the property must be checked, for the purpose of determining whether it is a good investment

The manager of another cafe in the square stated that the birds reduced his takings by at least €200 a year, as he often had to replace orders when they were spattered with droppings.


"They are waiting to pounce when we bring out food, sometimes the customers give them food," he said.



Protecting marine diversity

THE Oceanographic Foundation in Javea has presented the first results of its study on marine biodiversity in the area.

The pioneering project wants to put 'value' on the wealth of local marine life so residents are aware of what it would mean to lose it.

The managing director of the Oceanographic Foundation, Leocadia G Bartual, and project director, Francisco Torner, presented the results to the mayor, José Chulvi, and the heads of several of the council's departments.

As they explained, choosing Javea as the epicentre of this study is not random, as it is a 'hot spot' for sea creatures. It has the most marine biodiversity on


the Valencia coast, besides the Illes Columbretes.

Another part of the project is educating residents and tourists to get them involved in the conservation and regulation of marine diversity.

To achieve this, exhibitions, documentaries and talks will be put on in schools.

Sister act

Girls 'sold by sibling' freed

TWO girls aged 16 and 17 have been freed by the National Police after their sister sold them for ≤ 20.000 .

Both girls had, according to the police, been sexually assaulted by their Romanian father and had fled to the home of their elder sister for safety.

Once there, the sister and her husband negotiated with other local Romanian families to sell the girls for €10,000 each to be married to members of these other families.

The first girl was sold to a local family close to the sister in Zamora (Castile and Leon) and when rescued by the police was found to be ill and had received no medical treatment because the matriarch of the family didn't think it necessary.

The second girl was sent to Valladolid - also in Castile and Leon - and when released advised the officers that she had been sexually abused by the husband of the sister who had sold them.

In total seven people were arrested for their involvement in this matter and the two girls are now being looked after in a youth

Arms dealer held in raids

IN an investigation that has taken almost seven months to complete, officers from the Guardia Civil have arrested an illegal arms dealer and seized a number of firearms.

Having becoming aware of a number of transactions involving illegally held firearms, a squad was formed to track down the arms dealer and the investigation concentrated on the area of Logroño in La Rioja.

The main suspect was a 52-year-old local man who it was believed had at least 20 guns obtained in Spain and more recently from the Czech Republic with authorities in that country confirming their belief that the dealer had taken delivery of at least three firearms from sources there.

In addition to the guns, the investigation revealed that the man had acquired large quantities of ammuni-

tion, as well as steel bearings of various calibres that would allow him to make the ammunition even more

Once sufficient evidence was collected officers raided two addresses in the area and discovered a horde of illegal firearms and gun making equipment.

Nineteen pistols, three ri-

fles, spare parts, ammunition and gun making equipment were seized alongside computer equipment and documents.

Some of the pistols recovered were originally manufactured to fire blanks, but the arrested dealer had machined out the barrels to turn them into viable weapons.



As a result of new evidence provided by the cashier's family the judge has ordered police to focus their investigations on the floor of the Mercadona store. They are expected to remove some floor tiles in a search for clues about the whereabouts of Maria.

Javier, who remains the main suspect, committed suicide after leaving the area.

Gib Brexit concern

Spain's powers a 'disgraceful affront'

tar have said they will use 'all instruments' at their disposal to counter proposals that Spain should have veto powers over the territory in Brexit talks.

The Government of

Gibraltar called the plans, which are currently in their draft stages pending final approval from Britain and the EU, a 'disgraceful affront' to the territory.

The plans come under Clause 24 of the draft legal text published alongside the Withdrawal proposed Agreement put out by the EU this week.

They specifically grant Spain veto powers over Gibraltar's status during the transition period that would follow Britain's departure from the bloc, according to

Authorities in Gibraltar are concerned such a veto could result in the territory's exclusion from transitional arrangements.

Gibraltar's government has released a statement in which they said it was in the interests of both Spain and the territory to have a

sensible Brexit plan going forward.

"The existing threatening language of vetoes and exclusions is an unnecessary provocation in what is already a tense environment as the United Kingdom prepares to leave the European Union," they said.

"Any such plan should put the interests of citizens and business in the area first," the government added.

Gibraltar's government said if Spain used the veto to exclude Gibraltar it would be one of the most discriminatory measures taken against a small territory in recent European history.

"The truth is that nobody stands to gain anything at all by excluding Gibraltar from the transition or from the future relationship agreement.

He was part of a scientific team undertaking research in the waters and islands in the Antarctic and the vessel was close to the Spanish naval base Juan Carlos I on Livingston Island at the time of

After discovering that the captain was missing, the ship undertook a search of the area and discovered his body in the freezing waters six hours later.

According to the Spanish Ministry of Defence, his body is being taken to the port of Ushuaia in Argentina and will then be returned to Spain.

Peggy is an incredible lady for 100 years old, she is a very good ambassador for Ciudad Patri-





TV's big two boost profit

SPAIN'S TV duopoly has strengthened its grip on the market.

Media group Atresmedia, owner of channels Antena 3 and La Sexta, reported a profit of €142.1 million, a 10 per cent increase on 2016 and its best result since 2008.

Meanwhile Italy-based Mediaset, the country's leader in audience ratings and advertising revenue through its channels Cuatro and Telecinco, among others, raked in €197.5 million profit for an increase of 15 per cent.

Bargains for Brits abroad

BRITISH holidaymakers are bargain hunters while the Spanish are 'memento shoppers' according to a new survey.

The study by American market research consultant Horizon Consumer Science saw more than 22,000 globetrotters from 37 countries quizzed over their shopping habits while travelling.

And the results showed that British tourists tend to overlook premium brands and local products in favour of items that they can pick up more cheaply than in the UK, including tobacco and alcohol.

They also spend little time planning

where to shop while abroad and tend to head to wherever is most convenient.

Other nations displaying similar behaviour include Sweden, the Netherlands, Brazil, Denmark, Malaysia and New Zealand.

"People motivated to find bargains will put discounted prices ahead of factors such as whether the items are culturally important or unique to the places they are visiting," the report

But Spanish tourists are more likely to seek items that will "serve as a reminder of their trip," it added.

"The items need to be different than what they can buy at home, but they don't necessarily need to signify the destination

"It is the buying experience itself that creates an important part of the

"It might be that the shopper buys something they can get at home, such as a luxury handbag, but, because they bought it on a trip, they are reminded of the place every time they use it."

Other memento shoppers include the Swiss and Poles.

Tax boon for flush expats

SPAIN is among five European countries trying to attract rich expatriates via attractive tax rates.

According to Dutch professional services firm KPMG LLP, foreign residents of France, Spain, Ireland, Germany and the Netherlands earning average salaries of €250,000 per year now fork out less tax and social security than those living in the

In Spain, expatriates receiving their salaries from companies registered outside the country pay a special rate of 24 per cent on income up to €600,000.

Air fares set to plunge in Spain

SPAIN will soon have the cheapest air fares in Europe.

It comes after Development Minister Iñigo de la Serna revealed that national air navigation manager Enaire is to lower tariffs by 12 per cent.

Rates have been frozen since 2012 and were expected to fall by 4 per cent this year.

But by tripling the cutbacks, officials expect the price of flights to tumble.

Mr de la Serna said that the

scaling down of tariffs will "make the European navigation service more competitive," adding that he expects carriers "to maintain a policy of co-responsibility with the effort that is being made" and transfer a portion of the savings to ticket

Secretary of state for infrastructure, Julio Gomez-Pomar, added that the government is "pushing" and "insisting" for airlines to slash ticket prices.

Gender equality boost

SPANISH QUARTET MAKE GLOBAL RANKING

FOUR major Spanish companies have been included in Bloomberg's Gender Equality Index 2018.

Electricity firm Iberdrola, and telecommunications behemoth Telefonica plus banking groups Santander and BBVA all appear in the business media specialist's latest ranking of the world's 104 most gender diverse businesses.

Spanning 24 countries, the report comes as thousands of women strike across Spain to mark International Women's Day today (Thursday).

Chosen companies demonstrate diversity from director level and most have developed a 'structured strategy' aimed at ensuring diversity in the

Marta Garcia-Valenzuela of Madrid-based consultancy firm Talengo explained that the Spanish quartet do not yet have such initiatives in place, although plans are reportedly on the table.

"There is less discrimination against women because they are mothers... but companies have to realise that talent and leadership have no gender, whereas the usual model in Spain corresponds to a male aged over 40 and born into a particular family," she said.

Talengo is working alongside companies keen to break these established patterns including Telefonica, where president Jose Maria Alvarez-Pallete has introduced several initiatives aimed at promoting multiculturalism, gender equality and 'generational inclusion.'

A special committee has been charged with implementing the schemes, and in 2017 the number of women contracted by the firm increased by 12per cent, with 42 per cent of current managers female.

Elsewhere, BBVA Culture and Communications director Enrique Gonzalez said that his company is also committed to boosting women via in-

ternal promotions, manager training and changing the way in which internal vacancies are listed

Iberdrola is the only energy firm included in the Bloomberg Index and has five women on its board of directors, while the total number employed has increased by 50 per cent in the last decade and the company's recently-appointed chief executive officer is female.

But Roberto Martinez, director of the 'family protection' foundation Masfamilia said that more must be done.

"Women are discriminated against because they are mothers, and worse, because of their capacity to be mothers in the future," he said. "There is no magic solution, only determination and the need for the government to help companies."

Bust toy chain says Spanish stores 'will remain open'

TOYSHOP chain Toys 'R' Us has moved to calm Spanish shoppers.

An official from the embattled brand said that its stores in Spain will stay open after announcing that its 106 UK stores will be shut down, with around 3,200 staff facing redundan-

The firm's American parent company last September filed for bankruptcy protection in the UK and Canada after racking up debts of more than €4 billion and failing to make a profit since 2013.

Jean Charretteur, Toys 'R' Us director in France, Portugal and Spain, said: "Our stores are being transformed and modernised while we seek new and better locations to expand our network in the Spanish market."

STAFF TO STRIKE OVER CONTRACT DISPUTE Amazon 'fails to deliver'

EMPLOYEES at American e-commerce giant Amazon's biggest warehouse in Spain are to go on strike.

The decision comes after more than 74 per cent of the 1,100 staff working at the multinational's depot in San Fernando de Henares, Madrid, voted in favour of the move.

It follows months of talks over disputed working conditions during which the two parties failed to strike a deal.

The previous agreement expired at the end of 2016, but a revamp proposed by Amazon officials sparked outrage among workers.

The main bone of contention is reportedly the decision to switch from a bespoke agreement (convenio in Spanish) to a standard version designed for logistics companies by Madrid's regional government.

Under the terms of the new agreement, salaries for existing staff would be frozen indefinitely while new employees would earn less than before.

In addition, workers would continue to only have one in every five weekends off, and supplementary payments

for sick leave would be slashed.

Ana Berceruelo, an official responsible for collective bargaining for Spain's largest trade union, the Workers' Commissions, said: "The company says it has a problem with absenteeism, but we say it is directly related to workload."

She went on to explain that working in the warehouse involves walking up to 20 kilometres per day, with the unions slamming the 'musculoskeletal

diseases' and occupational risks in-

Under the current agreement, Amazon pays staff 100 per cent of their salaries when they are off sick for the first time, and from the fourth day of any later periods of illness.

But the firm aims to reduce the payments to 50 per cent.

"They say that people go on the sick because of these payments," said Ms Berceruel. "They are also branding local doctors as liars."

The staff are happy about one of the suggested changes, which would see many of the 800 people currently employed on a week-by-week basis handed permanent contracts, since the new agreement only allows a maximum of 25 per cent of the workforce to be tem-

Amazon said in a statement that its salary packages are "in the high range for the logistics sector, with a complete package of benefits including private health insurance, a pension plan, and life insurance."

But an attempt to make peace by calling 'friendly and concerned' meetings with groups of 30 employees backfired and led to the strike call.

"They tried to influence us by speaking to us in smaller groups... I do not know if this has been done in any other company but it was grotesque and had a rebound effect," a source told Spanish

A date for the strike is set to be announced shortly.

The future of commuting?

AN international technology firm headquartered in Spain has bagged a €2.8 million development contract for a futuristic train.

The civil works division of Carbures has been commissioned to design and engineer a prototype passenger 'capsule' for the proposed Hyperloop One project to link Dubai with Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates.

Chaired by Virgin tycoon Sir Richard Branson, Hyperloop One is an American company that aims to move travellers at airline speeds for a fraction of the cost.

The prototype is earmarked for delivery by the end of the year, and will consist of a 700-metre tube which will be equipped with thousands of intelligent sensors allowing the system to be tested.

MASTERPIECE RAKES IN MORE THAN €55M

Picasso piece breaks record

A MASTERPIECE by Spanish artist Pablo Picasso has smashed the British record after selling for £49.8 million (€56.2 million) at auction.

The Malaga-born painter's Femme au Beret et a la Robe Quadrillee (Marie-Therese Walter) was bought by a telephone bidder at Sotheby's London.

It was the prize piece in a 47lot sale of impressionist, surrealist and modern art, and obliterated its £35 million (€39 million) estimate to become Europe's second-most expensive artwork after Giacometti's Walking Man sculpture, which sold for £65 million (€73.4 million) in 2010.

Painted in 1937, the same year as other Picasso masterpieces, including Guernica and The Weeping Woman, it depicts the head and shoulders of his French mistress and muse Marie-Therese Walter.

The couple met 10 years earlier, when he was 45 and she just 17, and their daughter Maya was born in 1935, but by the time the painting was completed Marie-Therese was vying with Dora Maar, the model for The Weeping Woman, for Picasso's attention.

The brightly-coloured 22inch high painting had never appeared on the market before, with the former owner having acquired it from the artist's private estate, according to Sotheby's catalogue.

London-based art adviser Gurr Johns - which buys and sells artworks for moneyed clients - landed the piece plus the sale's three other Picasso paintings, splurging £73.8 million (€83.4 million) in the

A day earlier, the company splashed £38.9 million (€43.9



snapped up at least nine other Picasso works.

It remains unclear whether the purchases were on behalf of a single or multiple clients.

Sotheby's first major auction of the year raked in £136 million (€153.6 million), down on last year's £150 million (€169.5 million) but still a sign of market strength, according to an official.

But despite including the most expensive artwork ever sold on British soil, it was eclipsed by Christie's total of £149.6 million (€ 169 million).

The sales come ahead of the opening of the Tate Modern exhibition 'Picasso 1932 - Love, Fame, Tragedy', which opens today having transferred from the Musee National Picasso,

It includes the masterpiece Le Reve, an earlier portrait of Marie-Therese Walter which was bought in 2013 by American billionaire hedge

fund manager Steven A Cohen for \$155 million (€ 127.2



Spain's Ibex firms reveal profit boost

SPANISH businesses have been reaping the rewards of an economy that has grown for 17 consecutive quarters.

It comes as accumulated profit for 34 of the 35 firms listed on the Ibex 35, Spain's principal stock exchange, reached €40.1 billion in 2017 according to new data from national security watchdog the Comision Nacional del Mercado de Valores.

The total represents a 16.2 per cent year-

on-year increase.

And the companies also brought in 7.6 per cent more than in 2016, with revenues approaching €474.2 billion, equivalent to the combined expenditure of all of Spain's public agencies.

Banking group Santander topped the Ibex 35 net profit chart with € 6.6 billion, while mining company ArcelorMittal pulled in the greatest revenue of just over €56 billion.

Quite a few diners agreed to give up their firstborn in return for using a restaurant's free Wi-Fi.

They were of course victims of pranks played by software designers, who perhaps need to get out more.

But there was method in their madness: making people aware of what they might be giving up by simply clicking 'I agree' to get past the Terms and Conditions of whatever juicy software or service being offered.

Hands up if you ever read that fine print? In the early days I used to, until it became the length of a Jackie Collins bonkbuster and twice as te-

Now developers can sneak virtual-

ly anything into the T&Cs and most of us wouldn't know it. If you did you might be horrified.

When a shiny new app asks for access to our e-mail accounts, we click 'Yes' without hesitation. When it asks if it may raid our precious contacts lists, we agree.

Give up whatever shred of online privacy we still have left? Certainly. May the app track how many times we visit Pornhub? Click 'Yes' and 'If you liked pneumatic Morris Dancing, here are 28 other perversions you may enjoy.

A Guardian journalist recently spent an entire week just reading 146,000 words of the T&Cs covering everything he wanted to do that week, and said it made him want to

He had to read 21,000 words just to use his iPhone. Booting his laptop, opening Gmail and checking Twitter

took another 35,000 words of his life.

And who knew when buying a Kindle book from Amazon, that it's not actually yours, as thousands of people found out suddenly a decade ago when the company remotely deleted users' copies of George Orwell's 1984 and Animal Farm from their devices without so much as a how's yer father, because of a copyright dispute.

The supreme irony was of course that it involved 1984, the dystopian novel where Big Brother controls everything.

But as long as there are lawyers there will always be fine print. Which we will rarely, if ever, read.

Unless of course it's something along these brief lines:

'I don't claim this software is good for anything. If you think it is, cool. If it doesn't work, that's too bad. If you don't like this disclaimer, that's too bad. I reserve the right to do the absolute minimum provided by law, up to and including absolutely nothing.'

Reading the **EULA-gy**

LAWYERS are divided on whether the typical T&Cs none of us read are actually enforceable.

These 'end-user licence agreements' (or EULAs) are certainly contracts, usually considered to be legally binding. But our inability to negotiate them violates common law principles of fairness, so they may not be worth the pixels they're written on.

In an ideal world we'd know what we're agreeing to. Those days evaporated when we all discovered the pressing need for a way to tell everybody online exactly what we had for breakfast.

To show how ridiculous it all is, a bored Apple iTunes lawyer once sneaked a prohibition into the music service's T&Cs, forbidding using iTunes for the design, manufacture or production of nuclear or biological weapons.

THE 88th Geneva International Motor Show opens once again today (Thursday).

There will be more than 110 World and European Premiers paraded at this year's show. Over the last two days at 15-minute intervals the world's press has been briefed by top designers, professional race drivers and the prestigious brand ambassadors of the exhibiting brands.

Nearly 10,000 members of the world's press have swarmed over the exhibition halls close by Geneva Airport where 900 cars are exhibited over more than 77,000 square metres of exhibition halls with more than 700,000 visitors expected to attend over the next 11 days.

Among the luxury and bespoke manufacturers exhibiting are three British Brands, Rolls Royce Motor Cars, Aston Martin and McLaren. The Rolls Royce 'Phantom' was confirmed by the world's media as the 'Best Car in the World' on the shores of Lake Lucerne six months ago. Rolls-Royce will show why by showcasing three very different Phantoms models each pitched at a different potential buyer of the marque.

Aston Martin has returned to Geneva buoyed as the fastest growing automotive brand, with swelling profits and the announcement last week of the highest

revenue performance in its history. At the centre of a bullish Aston Martin exhibit is the new Vantage, which is making its global show debut. Still to be tested by the world's media, this is the first

opportunity to get up close to Aston Martin's thoroughbred twin-turbocharged V8 sports coupe. McLaren is exhibiting what it bills as the 'ultimate road-legal track car'; the 'McLaren

Geneva and sets hearts racing. Solar Yellow and Laurel Green detailing echoes the helmet livery of the legendary Ayrton Senna F1 driver and three times World Champion at the wheel of a McLaren. Just 500 examples will be produced and all are already 'assigned.' The science of lying

ACCORDING to scientists, most people are generally quite bad at recognising if someone is lying


As visual cues vary depending on the person and the situation, they are often unreliable and considered too subtle to be distinctive.

Research reveals that we each tell dozens of lies on a daily basis, but that we're only detected about half the time. Physical cues such as avoiding eye contact and having a higher pitched voice are often unreliable as skilled liars know how to control or disguise them.

A study from the University of Granada revealed the area around your nose often gets warmer when lying, which has been appropriately named the 'Pinocchio Effect'.

This tick is easy to detect as the flow of blood to the cheeks usually increases when this happens.

Meanwhile, psychologists have claimed it is easier to detect lies from language and speech than body cues. Liars allegedly distance themselves from the subject subconsciously ('that man' instead of using their name) and will also use a disproportionate amount of first person pronouns such as 'me' and 'I', as well as more formal lan-



RECENT research from GAES, a company that specialises in hearing correction in Spain, has revealed that only one in 10 Spaniards get their ears checked from time to time, while 20 per cent revealed they have never had an ear exam.


Pain in the hip and outer thigh




Vanishing Beauty: a photographic odyssey

PORT, a fortified wine similar to Marsala and Madeira, is produced exclusively in the Douro Valley in northern Portu-



Though typically red and sweet, port - taking its name from the city of Porto - also comes in dry, semi-dry, rose and white vari-

Rich and sweet, it is also high in alcohol content due to the addition of neutral grape spirits, known as aguardente. This is done to halt fermentation, leaving residual sugar which boosts the alcohol level prior to storing and ageing in sealed glass bottles or barrels.

More than 100 varieties of grapes, all suitable for long-ageing wines, are sanctioned for port production, although only five - Tinta Cão, Tinta Barroca, Tinta Roriz, Touriga Francesa, Touriga Nacional - are widely cultivated.

The four main styles of port are:

Ruby: Bright red with full bodied fruitiness; the most extensively produced and generally does not improve with age.

Tawny: Sweet or medium dry, made from

red grapes. Can be aged for years in wooden barrels and as a result of the oxidation gradually mellows to a golden-brown colour and gains a caramel, nutty flavour.

White: From white grapes, can go from dry to very sweet. When matured in wood for long periods the colour can darken substantially.

Rose: A new style made like rose wine, with flavours of strawberry and caramel.

Apart from white port, which can be served chilled, port should be served at around 16°C.

Vintage ports need to breathe and require decanting. Once opened they are best consumed within a short period although aged types may keep for several months.





The Dia de l'Arbre at the Puntes de Gosalvez

THIS Sunday, the Dia de l'Arbre (Day of the Tree) returns to Campello between 10am and 1pm.

This time, the local council in the form of Councillor Cynthia Alavés will be arranging for the planting of 800 trees in the recreational area of Les Puntes de Gos-

There will be 300 Ceratonia silicua (common name Carob tree), 200 Tetraclinis articulata (a form of Moroccan Cyprus), 200 Pistacea lentiscus (hailing from Greece and known for its aromatic resin) and 100 Celtis australis (known as a Nettle or Hackberry tree).

Councillor Cynthia Alavés, said that "unlike the previous years it has been decided to carry out a day of reforestation in the Paraje de Puntes de Gosalvez to celebrate the day of the

"This year this activity is more forestry than ever and the work of planting will be

harder than if planted in urban plots where the characteristics of the land facilitated the work.

"The objective is to implant new arboreal and shrub species in this area in order to increase biodiversity, protect and conserve our environment, as well as to value such a representative area of our municipality. With this initiative we also want to highlight that this natural space, typical of our municipality, is of a high environmental quality."

The species that will be used in reforestation have a high ecological value and have been chosen based on their adaptation to the environment with the aim of trying to achieve the greatest possible success in the establishment of new plants, this year.

As well as the planting, work will be undertaken to save the plants by use of protectors that will keep rabbits, rodents and goats

from attacking them and will also act to defend the plants against humidity and temperature.

Five members of council staff will regularly inspect the area for dead plants which will be replaced and to irrigate the land as and when necessary.

The council will supply all of the tools necessary for the planting and children will be encouraged to write and draw about the activities of the day.

There will be a free brochure explaining the characteristics and curiosities of the introduced species and the council is laying on a free bus that will be making trips from the Casa de Cultura to the picnic area and back.

Those who plant trees can name them so that as they grow, the individuals involved will be able to show their commitment and contribution to a healthier environment for the future.





AIRBNB is sending out inspectors to assess thousands of properties listed on its home rental service, in an effort to reassure customers of their quality.

The plus programme is aimed at winning over travellers who are sceptical of the current rating system drawn from guests' comments.

The volume of misleading reviews that have been posted through Airbnb has become a big enough problem to spawn a website devoted

to horror stories.

These have ranged from an overcrowded, dirty, hippy commune in Pasadena, California, to a Paris vacation ruined in a mouldy, bug-ridden apartment.

"You realise over time that you do have to take more responsibility for your platform, you have to be hands on, you have to make judgements," said Airbnb CEO Brian Chesky in an interview with The Associated

The plus programme will

initially cover about 2,000 properties in 13 cities including: Barcelona, Cape Town, Los Angeles, London, Rome and Sydney.

It is of course a fraction of the roughly 4.5 million properties listed on Airbnb across 81,000 cities worldwide.

At a time when the company's growth has been slowing, by the end of the year Chesky expects 75,000 homes to be verified in 50 cities.

Despite its popularity

though, Airbnb remains unprofitable, posting a loss of \$75 million (€60.8 million) on revenues of nearly \$2.6 billion (€2.1 billion) in 2017.

Chesky is responding by developing Airbnb into more of a traditional hospitality company instead of an industry renegade.

Changes include discounts and perks for frequent customers, and the addition of bed and breakfast inns and boutique ho-



A dog is not a human baby

ANTHROPOMORPHISM (not for those that love their dog!) is the word that is used when we believe dogs have the same feelings and emotions as humans and they understand our language. A mistaken belief, of course.

Dogs are not small, fur-clad human beings. They are canines. True, they are man's best friend and companion because their natural instincts and hierarchical society blends into our own. and because they show loyalty and devotion to the hand that feeds them.

As we have seen in wolves, this bonding between man and dog happened thousands of years ago when both man and wolf lived similar nomadic lives as hunters, roaming the

country to seek food.

The dog's adaptation to our way of life was assisted and accelerated by man using selective breeding to develop the most desirable features, first to work for us and then to turn them into

Even so, there remain of course fundamental differences between us and our dogs. To take just one example, dogs live totally in the present

They do not worry about the past. They do not dream about the future.

They are not endowed with imagination or feel grief, hate, jealousy or greed or other emotions that bedevil our human society. They do have a high sensory ability which is often mistaken for a kind of sixth sense.

They will understand that certain words like 'Sit', 'Stay', 'Down' require the right reaction if they are to be rewarded with a tit-bit or praise. They will understand whether your tone of voice and your facial expressions are good or bad when you are talking to them, in whatever language, but they will not understand longer

We often attribute human emotions to dogs when, in fact, they are reacting instinctively. We assume our dog is happy to see us when we return home and it looks pleased and wags its tail. All it is doing is reacting in the same way a wolf puppy reacts when the pack returns with food from a hunt.

It behaved in the same way when it

was feeding from its mother along with the rest of the litter. It is true the dog is enjoying a pleasurable experience but it is not pleased in human terms.

Another example of anthropomorphism is when we believe our dog is 'sulking' when it returns home from a stay in kennels, or is grieving over the death of a member of the family.

In the latter case, what it will be feeling is the loss of a higher member of the 'pack' and the anxiety caused by no longer knowing its position in the family hierarchy.

It will also be confused by the vibrations of distress it picks up from the family. Once the 'pack' has settled down again, the dog will make a quick recovery, for it lives in the present and doesn't mourn the past.

So please do not attribute dogs with human emotions. Try, instead, to understand their simple canine minds, which are untroubled by so many of



Built in 1979, the tank is fitted with a Jaguar XJ6 5.9litre petrol engine and has a top speed of approximately 77 km/ph (48 mph).




