'rapist' he

SPANISH police have arrested a wanted British man in Alicante City, convicted of five rapes in the UK, who was found living in a van and using a fake identity.

The unnamed wanted man was convicted of five rape charges on two victims in the 1980's, including one on a 15year-old girl and he faces a life sentence.

The British authorities issued a European Arrest Warrant in 2016 and last July officers in Spain were tipped off that he was living somewhere on the country's eastern coast.

Spanish police said the man was arrested in Alicante City on the Costa Blanca after he had used a fake identity to contact his relatives in the UK on social

They said, "That enabled investigators to follow his digital trail until they tracked down where he was hiding.

"Investigators found that he was a person who moved about in a van he lived in. which made finding him more difficult as he didn't leave any physical trace of

his movements.

"But, after nine months of investigations, the van he used as a home was tracked down and the rapist arrested after a watch was put on the vehicle."

The man will now appear before an extradition hearing in Madrid.

Human traffic

155 held as migrant smugglers busted

MORE than 150 people have been held as police swooped on a Chinese human trafficking gang that smuggled people into the UK.

The gang reportedly charged a flat fee of €20,000 in exchange for fake passports plus transport from China via Spain.

Most of the arrests took place in Barcelona, where migrants were hidden in rented flats before being flown to Britain and Ireland.

While in the Catalan capital their passports were confiscated and replaced with bogus documents printed in China.

They were also taught key English phrases used at border control to improve their chances of getting through.

Other suspects were held in Alicante, Malaga, La Linea de la Concepcion (Cadiz), Madrid, Ibiza, Aviles (Asturias), Bilbao and Castellon.

The majority are Chinese, among them four figureheads who have been charged with

Kidnap attempt was false news

A MAN of 33 was detained after his WhatsApp voice message describing an attempted kidnap in Campello went viral.

A boy of 13 whom he claimed was one of his pupils was accosted by an older man at the TRAM stop, he said.

The reality was noticeably different, a statement from the Guardia Civil in Campello announced soon afterwards.

A man in his 50's did approach a boy of 13, offering him a lift in his car. He did not touch the boy at any time and nor did he display any type of aggressiveness despite the WhatsApp's claims that he embraced the boy and grabbed him by the neck.

The boy, described as 'unperturbed,' refused the lift but witnesses reported the incident and a married couple accompanied him to the Guardia Civil to make a statement while officers contacted his mother.

Attempts to find the driver have been unsuccessful but investigators tracked down the person who sent the WhatsApp, who said that the message had been intended for his family on-

The Guardia Civil statement reminded the public that spurious reports prompting the mobilisation of the police or emergency services are a breach of public order under Spain's Penal

Historic marches took place in more than 200 Spanish towns and cities in a united stand against a range of issues including domestic violence and the gender pay gap.

And estimates suggest that more than five million people took part in the two-hour 'feminist' strikes that preceded the rally, which was

backed by 10 unions and some of Spain's most important female politicians and cultural figures.

Public transport was ravaged and some of the marches brought traffic to a standstill as protesters congregated under the slogan 'If we stop, the world stops.'

The event places Spain at the cutting edge of feminist movements

The mayor of Madrid, Manuela Carmena, tweeted "This isn't only

about calling for true equality, but also about facing the need to change how the world treats women," while her Barcelona counterpart Ada Colau said that she joined the strike "to show that without women the world really does

But the Spanish government did not agree, after the ruling Popular Party said that the strike was "for feminist elites and not real women with everyday problems.'

THIS weekend the city of Valencia welcomes spring in style during the annual Las Fallas festival - a loud, boisterous fiesta where the city is literally set alight.

The festival started as a celebration of St Joseph, the patron saint of carpenters, but has since evolved into a five-day fire extravaganza. The quiet city's population of around one million more than trebles in size during the celebrations as people flock from across the globe to witness the festivities.

The festival is all about the creation of 'ninots' - huge lifelike statues made from wood, cardboard, paper-machè and plaster which are paraded through the city streets, then destroyed in a giant firework display at midnight on the dot.

The ninots tend to depict lewd, satirical scenes relating to current events and will often make fun of Spanish politicians or Spanish celebrities.

These bawdy giants can cost up to €60,000 to create and are crafted by local neighbourhood or-

ganisations. The labour process is intensive and can take up to 12 months to complete so as soon as that year's festival is over, work already begins for the next event.

During the early evening on the final day of the festival, a group of people with axes chop carefully placed holes in the ninots and fill them with fireworks.

On the run up to midnight, the streetlights are all switched off, the crowds start to chant and the fireworks are lit as the clock strikes 12.

In recent years, the local firemen have come up with methods to protect the town's buildings from being accidentally set alight by the fireworks, including covering them with fireproof material.

Every year, one of the ninots is saved from obliteration by a popular vote. The pardoned statue - called the ninot indultat - is then displayed in the local Museum of the Ninots along with the other lucky escapees from previous years.

Cat shot dead with firearm

THE Guardia Civil in Aspe are investigating the death of a cat that was shot while inside fenced land.

The cat named Bella lived in a registered colony of 12 cats on the Montesol urbanisation. She was 12 months old and had been sterilised at the beginning of this year.

Once the Guardia Civil have identified and located the wrongdoer, animal protection associations, Bigote de Gato and Proyecto Ces Aspe intend to take legal action independently of any

official prosecution.

Bella was found badly wounded by the volunteers who feed and look after the

Originally suspecting that the cat had been run over, after taking her to an Alicante City vet, they learnt that she had been shot. The .22-calibre bullet had entered her spine and her injuries were so severe that eventually she had to be put to sleep.

"In order to obtain a firearms licence an applicant

has to be in full possession of their mental faculties,' said Adriana Aznar, Proyecto Ces Aspe's president.

"But we feel it's very serious matter when a person kills an animal in a colony that is controlled by a town hall."

Montesol residents were also fearful for the safety of their children, knowing that the cat had been killed with a dangerous firearm on an urbanisation where children habitually played in the



Padron push targets foreign residents

ALTEA Town Hall launched a campaign to persuade and remind residents to register on the Padron.

Although this also affects the Spanish population, it is especially aimed at the town's foreign-born residents, explained Mari Lavios, councillor responsible for Participation and Foreign Residents.

Those from countries within the European Union who have previously registered on the Padron nevertheless still need to confirm that they are still resident every five years. Those from other countries should do so at two-vearly intervals. Lavios said.

"It is very important that the local population realises the importance of registering," the councillor stressed. "Our subsidies and allocations from the central government depend on the municipal Padron.

The number of registered residents directly affects street cleaning, citizens' services and social services amongst other things, all of which need to be proportionate to the real size of the town's population."

Council on top of complaints

BENIDORM'S City Council registered a total of more than 3,380 incidents and complaints from residents last year and resolved more than 2,270, or 87 per cent.

The figures, which come from the ruling Partido Popular's urban spokesperson Jose Ramon Gonzalez de Zarate, showed an increase of 22 per cent compared to the previous

Data also suggested people in Benidorm were making greater use of new technology such as social media to alert the council

to issues in the city.

Reports made by Facebook increased by 26 per cent on 2016 levels, those made through the Linea Verde application by 47 per cent and by email 39 per

Requests made for the council to address issues by phone fell by 20 per cent, while those made in person dropped by 14 per cent.

More than 500 of the incidents reported were related to companies providing services for the council and were dealt with by them.

'Let the kind acts be what remains'

OUR thoughts are with the family of Gabriel Cruz Ramirez.

The tragic eight-year-old's body was found in the boot of his father's girlfriend's car 12 days after he went missing in Nijar, Almeria.

More than 3,000 people flocked to Almeria's Cathedral to pay their respects at his funeral on Tuesday, with several high ranking Spanish politicians in attendance.

And while much ire has been directed towards the prime suspect in the case, it is the words and advice of the child's mother, Patricia Ramirez, that should resonate the most.

Carrying herself with great dignity throughout the horrific ordeal, she appealed "for rage not to spread any further, for nobody to retweet rage-fuelled things, because that is not who my son was, and it is not who I am."

Her words came after a vengeful social media storm erupted in the wake of Gabriel's body being discovered, with the suspect even being physically attacked while surrounded by po-

And yet the woman who could have been forgiven for feeling the most hatred instead chose to vilify those who reacted with anger to the death of her son.

In doing so, she captured the hearts of a nation, and in a world that feels less-tolerant than at any time since the middle of the last century, her unflinching dignity should serve as a valuable lesson to us all.

"This budget is the result of the economic policy that we started in 2015. It will allow

us to get out of the economic adjustment plan," he said.

Cllr Rosello added the council had been able to get

out of the plan because rules on budgetary stability, spending and debt have been met. The plan was introduced in 2012 when the council took a €12 million loan to settle debts with suppliers.

This year's gross savings of €7.5 million has come from the council paying €3.9 million on its debts which has in turn made €3.8 million for investment. The council was around €15 million in debt as of last December, according to reports.

You're paying how much for your investment?? By Sam Kelly, Managing Partner, Chorus Financial.



Sports ground starts a turf war

A SAN VICENTE resident threatened to take the town hall to court over a new sports ground in Villamontes.

In response to residents' requests for a sports area, €45,800 was spent on clearing land and installing artificial turf removed from elsewhere in the town although a dissenting resident now argues that the land was classed for educational

Meanwhile the Villamontes residents themselves are unhappy with the result.

This was not what they wanted, and the recycled artificial turf was not in good condition, they said. Pachi Pascual, an Opposition councillor, maintained that residents' opinions had not been taken into account and wanted to know what action would be taken over the threatened legal proceedings.

Town Planning councillor Marilo Jorda denied that residents were excluded from the project and said they had been shown the plans at the town hall. She also stated that the present installation was provisional, as the land was earmarked for educational use but the sports area did not infringe planning regulations.

Bridging the gaps

ANOTHER of the bridges on Alicante Province's FGV railway network is undergoing renovation, this time on Line

Dismantling the bridge over the N-332 in Gata took two days, and although all work was carried out at night, traffic was obliged to make a detour via the AP-7 motorway.

The bridge's old deck was removed and another put into place using a heavy-duty crane that had to be located on the N-332 owing to lack of sufficient space adjoining the

The old deck, which was built in 1914, is 16 metres long and FGV has agreed to cede this to Gata Town Hall, which will decide its future location.

The work in Gata is part of FGV's nearly € 1.8 million programme of inspecting and repairing Line 1 and Line 9 bridges, which include the bridge that crosses the CV-759 in Villajoyosa and another in Teulada over the N-332.

2013 during Jaime Lloret's time as mayor, following an agreement with the Taylor Wimpey construction company.

The municipality received € 1.85 million in cash and a promenade for the Paradis beach. In exchange, the town hall authorised Taylor Wimpey to exceed the construction limit when building apartments on the site of the former BBVA bank residence.

He was very satisfied, said Villajoyosa's current mayor Andreu Verdu, as the land had fetched €200,000 more than expected and that money could be used to benefit residents. "Besides, when they build a hotel on the land, that will create jobs and improve our tourist offer," Verdu added.

"Miguel Barcelo had a history of dedication to public service that speaks for itself. He was especially dedicated to Benidorm, where he served as a councillor, and also to Spain," the mayor said.

Barcelo was born in Benidorm and spent some of his childhood in Barcelona before he and his family left the city during the Spanish Civil War.

He studied in Madrid after the conflict and returned to Benidorm to work in the farming and tourism business. His brother Jaime served as the city's mayor from 1969 to 1971.

Barcelo served as a senator for Alicante Province from 1986 to 2008. He previously stood in Spain's first democratic elections since the death of Dictator Francisco Franco but failed to win a seat.

Much ado about a uniform

AN official communique has spelt out why Benissa mayor Abel Cardona is currently under investigation by the courts.

He is accused of perverting the course of justice by failing to take disciplinary measures against a municipal employee who lent a disused Local Police uniform to someone who wanted to dress up as a policeman during Benissa's Moors and Christians.

The CSIF civil servants' union lodged a formal complaint of continued prevarication arising from this episode, the town hall explained. Instead Cardona verbally reprimanded the municipal employee involved.

"Such is the magnitude of the case," the communique said.

Until the communique was issued it was only known that Abel Cardona had failed to penalise a police inspector, with no other details. Since then other unions representing municipal em-

> ployees have been quick to defend the mayor.

'This is a toxic use of politics favouring interests that do not benefit the local population,' the communique stated

Valenciano law goes to Spain's highest court



JUSTICE SERVED: The Valencia Upper Court of Justice is bringing plurilingual teaching to the Constitutional Tribunal.

PRESIDENT of the Alicante Provincial Council, Cesar Sanchez, pledged to continue defending the language rights of parents, children and teachers.

He was 'very satisfied' that the Valencia Community's Upper Court of Justice (TSJ) was referring regional legislation on plurilingual teaching in state schools to the Constitutional Tribunal, he

A decree that clearly favoured Valenciano was suspended last year as a precautionary measure following an appeal by the Diputacion, which claimed it discriminated against Spanish speakers.

The region's Education chief Vicent Marza later announced that he was scrapping the pro-

gramme that planned to teach all classes in Valenciano, Spanish or English.

A watered-down version was nonetheless introduced for first-year infants last September and a new plurilingual law has now been passed by the regional parliament.


This was due to be introduced next September although the TSJ considered that the new norms 'merely maintained' Marza's suspended plurilingual programme.

Not only does the TSJ believes this is anti-constitutional but it also understands that the Education department failed to comply with the suspension order by passing another decree.



The plant, which was built in 2000, has the capacity to treat around 8.4 million litres of water a day.

Its performance rate stands at between 77 and 96 per cent, putting that figure closer to almost six million litres.

That amount then ends up in the sea, according to official data from the local Sanitation and Water body reported in Spanish media.

The plant is currently being run by the companies Sociedad Agricultores de la Vega and Purification of Mediterranean Waters, who charge authorities more than €865,000 for their services.

Laid to rest

Thousands attend funeral of Gabriel

THOUSANDS of people are estimated to have turned out for the funeral of Gabriel Cruz, the eight-year-old boy whose body was found after a 12-day search.

Angel Cruz and Patricia Ramirez, Gabriel's father and mother, were joined by mourners including Spain's Interior Minister and Deputy Prime Minister.

The funeral took place on Tuesday at Almeria's Cathedral de la Encarnation and was led by the Bishop of Almeria Monsignor Adolfo Gonzalaz Montes.

Police have arrested Ana Julia Quezada, the girlfriend of Angel Cruz, after officers reportedly found the body of the eight-year-old in the boot of her car. Spanish media have reported that she has since confessed to killing Gabriel.

Mourners gathered outside the cathedral shouted "You are not alone" and "We are all Gabriel."

Patricia Ramirez thanked everyone for their support and messages of affection when speaking to the media at the service.

"I have no words of thanks for all the good deeds from people involved, although this has not had a happy ending," she said.

She added she did not wish for people to talk about Ouezada.

"This woman does not deserve to be covered. let us not talk about her," she said.

"The little fish is swimming to heaven and I would like all the people to send a fish with a nice word wherever they want," she added.

Fishes were the eight-yearold's favourite animal and became a symbol of the search efforts while they were ongoing.

Hundreds of people paid their respects to Gabriel when his coffin arrived at a chapel dedicated to his memory on Monday.

Around 12,000 people in Almeria City held a fiveminute's silence for the eight-year-old following the discovery of his body on

King Felipe, the Junta de Andalucia President Susana Diaz, Sevilla mayor Juan Espadas and Malaga mayor Francisco de la Torre observed a minute's silence at a

Towns across Almeria also held minute's silences and authorities in Nijar declared three days of mourning following the news that Gabriel's body had been

Quezada was placed under surveillance shortly after she allegedly found a t shirt at the bottom of the Las Aguilas ravine. It was said to belong to Gabriel and confirmation came later that it had traces of his DNA on it.

She was arrested in the early hours of Sunday morning after officers saw her remove something from a well on the Cañada de la Soledad farm, in Rodalquilar.

Guardia Civil officers who watched her do this then asked to search her car and found Gabriel's body in the boot, according to police.

It has since been reported that Quezada confessed to killing the eight-year-old. She allegedly told police she acted in self defence after he attempted to assault her.

Results from a postmortem examination found Gabriel had died from asphyxiation.

A family life dedicated to restoring value in La Marina's traditional gastronomy

FROM their first family restaurant, Casa Federico, in 1980, the Cervera family have led the gastronomic field in La Marina. They now have eight highly successful traditional restaurants in Denia including a unique gastronomic show house located in central Denia (El Condado).

In the late 70's, gastronomy in Denia suffered as a consequence of massive tourism and lack of innovation in the catering industry. Most of the restaurants in the city had abandoned the traditional dishes and opted for menus combined far from the culinary identity of the area.

The family Cervera decided to turn their family home, located at the start of Las Marinas in Denia - into a traditional family restaurant. It was 1980 and **Casa Federico** was the chosen name. They served rice, stews, salted, preserves, marinades and coupled ingredients... just as they made themselves at home before opening the business.

- Fresh food prepared daily and at the time of order

- Fresh and local products

Fish came from Denia's own lonja, produce and vegetables purchased from local markets.

- Food prepared to its 'punto'

A commitment on the part of the chef, a certain risk in the search for the perfect taste.

- The fusion of gastronomy and environment

In Casa Federico, the family opted for natural materials such as a glassware with traditional furniture of wicker chairs and wooden tables, avoiding the plastic or aluminum that proliferated then.

- Transparent and open kitchens

Guests see what they are going to eat. Everything forms part of a singular experience.

- A complete menu

They revolutionised the sector with complete menus, featuring starters, seconds and dessert.

- Format 'picaeta' - tapas!

The restaurant opted to share traditional dishes in picaeta version (tapas).

- Personalisation

In Casa Federico, a rice was prepared for two, six or 13 people. Every table had its own cauldron.

- Dishes from the home's daily menu to restaurant table

Original staple dishes that were traditionally prepared in the home every day of the year were brought to the tables of their restaurant

- Bet on training, a stable staff all

From the first day they bet both on the training of now 120 staff and on the dissemination of traditional gastronomy. The restaurants have the 'Tourism Quality Commitment' certification from the Tourism Institute of Spain (TurEspaña).

- Sustainability and ecology

Sustaining the environment, both social and heritage. From the daily purchases from their restaurants, through to the choice of buildings for new openings.

For 10 years the Cervera family dedicated itself exclusively to their first restaurant, Casa Federico. During this decade a concept of gastronomy of La Marina was consolidated and the subsequent openings pivoted on it.

Snakes on a plane

More than 800 illegal animals seized

POLICE are quizzing 17 people in Spain after wild reptiles worth more than €150,000 were seized in the Netherlands.

Three Spanish men were held at Amsterdam's Schipol Airport as they waited to board a flight to Madrid with 200 Mexican snakes, lizards, and turtles, including many protected species, in their luggage.

A probe revealed the trio to be members of a dedicated wildlife trafficking ring, leading police to swoop on homes and warehouses in Madrid and Castellon, unearthing a further 600 animals.

Many of them were legal species that had been frozen alive, with licences issued to keep them used to sell on.

Nine suspects have been remanded in custody and eight others questioned in connection with the plot, which reportedly saw wildlife from America, Asia, Africa and Oceania illegally smuggled to Spain for the black market pet

Most of the species involved were endangered in the wild and highly desired by private collectors, with some fetching as much as €50,000 for a single individual.

The gang had a network of contacts around the world and used drug-trafficking-style mules to bring the animals to Europe, although some were traded 'legally' using forged documenta-

Battle royal

Spain to debate monarchy insult laws

THE Congress of Deputies in Madrid is set to consider a proposal to decriminalise insulting the crown at a meeting tomorrow.

The proposal has been tabled by the Catalan leftist Partido Esquerra Republicana de Cataluña (ERC) on the grounds that the laws violate the right to free speech.

The ERC said democracies such as Spain had to ensure that citizens had full rights to freedom of expression.

"In recent years there have been several examples in which people, artists or satirical magazines have been persecuted for making use of their freedom of expression in respect to the royal family." the party said. The news comes after Mallorca rapper Valtonyc recently lost an appeal against a three year jail sentence handed to him over song lyrics that authorities said insulted the royal family. The ERC said this was one such example of free expression being violated by the laws.

"These actions, beyond the ethical, moral or political considerations that each on has, should not appear in the Spanish Penal Code.

"Speech like this should be considered as free expression which is a fundamental right in the Spanish Constitution," the party said.

Laws covering insults made to the country's monarch come under Section Three of Article 490, as well as in Articles 491 and 543 of the Criminal Code.

Mortgage loans expenses. Is it worthwhile to claim these following a new ruling by the Spanish Supreme Court?

DEAR lawvers.

We had planned to claim against the bank for the expenses we paid for the mortgage deed that we signed before a notary in Spain. We have since learned that the Spanish Supreme Court has issued a ruling saying that the costs have to be paid by the client and not the bank, therefore is it worth

Thank you for your inquiry.

Our office has actually helped many consumers to recover a significant proportion of the money they paid for these expenses.

Despite all of the publicity, the fact is that this new ruling by the Supreme Court has not changed to any great extent what the local courts had ruled on, since many of them were not ruling in line with the Supreme Court decision of 12/23/2015, where it was indicated that the taxes should be paid by the bank.

First of all we must state, that we cannot comment formally on the new decision, because up to the time of writing (March 5, 2018) it has not actually been published.

There is only a press release from the General Council of the Courts, saying that the Supreme court has decided that the AJD tax on mortgage should be paid by the client and not by the bank; and the part of the tax (which is minimal) relating to notary expenses by half but these two new decisions have not yet been published.

Secondly, as I pointed out at the beginning, the truth is that the judges of first instance (*ie the local ones), at least the ones of the courts of Denia and those who know the province of Alicante, have agreed the negation of the clause by which the bank imposed the payment of all expenses to the client.

They agreed that the bank should return the costs of notary, registration and management and registration of the deed, but not the tax AJD, therefore, in the ruling of the Supreme Court, is it sensible or worth claiming?

In accordance with our professional experience, it is still appropriate to claim, because even though it is true that the AJD tax was a big part of the claim, the balance can still involve a significant amount, which on an average loan can exceed € 1.500.

In addition, our experience tells us that in the case where you are a consumer and you have not negotiated this clause, your chances of success are extremely high.

Finally, please note that there is, in my view, an obvious intention to discourage consumers affected by this clause, because this ruling has been announced by the media as signifying the end of the claims from consumers which is not true

In addition, it has been decided that only one court for each province will deal with all these claims, with the delay that this

The truth is that you can claim for your rights and we encourage you to do so, without risk, and that it is possible that this ruling by the Supreme Court may be reviewed by the Court of Justice of the European

This is because according to the dissuasive principle of consumers and users rules, it would be appropriate, from our point of view, to ask the banks to repay all of the mortgage expenses. This could dissuade them from including these abusive clauses, because if they do not do so, and the Courts only make them pay back part of it, they will continue to include them in their contracts.







€6m solar storm erupts

'LIKE GOING TO WAR WITHOUT WEAPONS'

SPAIN'S biggest research and development centre for renewable energy is unable to spend money.

The Solar Platform in Almeria (PSA) has reportedly been handed millions of Euros in European Union grants, but restrictions imposed by the Spanish government have left bosses unable to splash out.

Set up in the Tabernas Desert during the 1970's, the centre is the most important for solar thermal energy in Europe.

Ex-PSA director Sixto Malato said: "Spain has installed the equivalent of two nuclear power stations in solar thermal energy plants... if it occupied 1.5 per cent of the world's deserts, we could generate enough electricity for the entire planet."

The PSA has designed technology used by major power plants in the United States, China and North Africa, and is a popular proving ground for new solar energy systems.

Around €6 million-worth of funding cannot be spent after the Spanish Treasury, in 2016, began to roll out measures designed to limit outlay.

The latest ruling was approved in January.

It blocks public research agencies from spending more than half of their funds until the 2018 National Budget is approved, with Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's embattled Popular Party thus far unable to get its plans approved by Spanish Congress.

The standoff has seen 14 researchers - 35 per cent of the team - laid off from the PSA, leading to Malato handing in his notice.

One of them, a woman who has several children and had worked there for 15 years told Spanish media: "Our problem is due to the state of science in Spain and the scarcity of work opportunities for highly trained people, I used to get the best grades in my class, and now my employ-

ment prospects are the most unstable."

The constraints have also impacted on research, with several projects months behind schedule. Waterspoutt has a €3.5 million budget to develop water purification technology for Uganda in southern Africa, but there is no-one in charge of it after the lead researcher was, in February, made redundant.

Researcher Eduardo Zarza said how an experimental steam generation system, which is among the platform's 'most emblematic' has been out of action for four months as he is unable to buy spare parts.

Malato confirmed that a number of requests for the Treasury to exempt 15 EU science contracts from the spending restrictions have not been answered to date.

Planemaker to axe 3,700 jobs as jet projects fail to take off

AIRBUS has warned that up to 3,700 jobs - including 800 in Spain - could be lost as it downscales assembly of its A380 and A400M planes.

The European manufacturer said that the cuts would also affect the UK, France and Germany as issues continue to plague Europe's priciest civil and military aerospace projects.

Production of the A380 superiumbo, the world's biggest passenger jet, will be slashed from six to eight per vear from 2020

The underperforming project was almost axed until Dubai's Emirates airline ordered 16 of the planes for € 12.85 billion

And just eight A400M troop transporters will be built, down from a forecast 15 this year and 11 in 2019, after losses soared beyond €8 billion.

NOT GRAPE NEWS AFTER HARVEST SLUMP Wine prices to increase


WINE lovers are facing a price hike in the wake of last year's catastrophic grape harvest.

Global wine production last year fell to its lowest level in half a century after vineyards in Spain, as well as the world's two other top producers France and Italy, with the weather to

Extreme and unseasonal hot and cold temperatures ravaged all three countries, with the areas producing Spanish Rioja and Italian Prosecco coming off worst.

Dan Jago, chief executive of posh wine merchant Berry Bros and Rudd, told UK media: "We'll start to see those [2017] wines coming to the market now and I think for higher volume, lower price wine you will see cost increases.

"Prices for things like Pinot Grigio or generic Spanish reds will rise by between 10 per cent and 30 per cent and it's how much of that retailers will pass on," said the former Tesco wine business chief. "Prosecco was very hard hit by frost, so there will be less

of it and the price will go up."

According to The International Organisation of Vine and Wine, global wine production plummeted by 8 per cent in 2017 after the worst grape harvest since 1961.

The fall is set to see 2.9 billion fewer bottles hit the market this year.

A senior figure in the wine industry said that the sector had endured a 'perfect storm' in 2017, with issues affecting wine-growing regions across the planet.

"There is price pressure in two places, right at the top end, in premium claret, and in entry level wine," he

explained. "In a £5 bottle only 50p is for the wine so you are looking at a small increase of say 12.5p... on a £100 bottle of wine you've got a material price change.

"In a good year producers will try and profit and in a bad year they will try and eat some of the losses, it's in their interests to do so. At some point prices will have to reflect the cost of production but supermarkets will work hard to keep wine affordable because like eggs, milk and a loaf of white bread, people know the price of a bottle of Pinot Gigio."

Shot in the arm for civil service

SPANISH civil servants are to receive their first pay rise since 2009.

It comes after unions thrashed out a deal with the government which will see employees receive between 6.1-8.8 per cent boost in wages over the next three years.

Civil servants lost 11-23 per cent of their buying power in the wake of the economic crisis.

Tens of thousands of jobs axed as Spain imposed austerity measures on the central administration, army. justice and public health

The CC OO union confirmed the agreement in a statement after it earlier rejected the government's proposed 1 per cent pay

"We're moving towards an increase that will recover their lost purchasing power," said CC OO official Antonio Cabrera.

SPAIN SLAMMED IN SMOG SMACKDOWN

Green tax reforms looming

THE Spanish government is aiming to increase taxes on diesel fuel.

A raft of other environmental levies will also be reformed as Finance Minister Cristobal Montoro, revealed that the bulk of such taxation will be managed by the country's 17 regional governments.

And chief among the proposed changes is a move to scrap current tax breaks for drivers of diesel and other highly polluting vehicles.

The announcement comes after European Commission (EC) lawmakers in Belgian capital Brussels again slammed Spain over its low income from environmental taxes.

In a report on the Spanish economy, the EC officials pointed out that green taxes in Spain last year generated incoming funds equivalent to 1.9 per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), compared to

the European Union (EU) average of 2.4 per cent.

The document points out "the low level of taxes on unleaded gasoline and diesel" in particular "the case of diesel, on which Spain applies the minimum excise duty, despite the fact that diesel has a higher carbon and energy content than unleaded petrol."

It continues: "Taxes on transport only generate half the income in Spain than in the rest of the EU (0.2 per cent compared to 0.5 per cent of GDP)."

The EC has issued a number of scathing reports on the situation in Spain since 2012, with the International Monetary Fund and Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development following suit.

But while most developed countries have raised tax or applied restrictions on diesel, Spain has done nothing notable to date, according to the

The Spanish government is in danger of being hauled before the EU Court of Justice for consistently breaching recommended limits of nitrogen dioxide (NO2) in Madrid and Barcelona since 2010.

NO2 is a by-product emitted by both petrol and diesel motor engines that can trigger breathing and other respiratory problems in otherwise healthy peo-

In December 2016 Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy pledged to raise an additional €500 million annually through green taxes, but the scheme was shelved shortly after-

The government's latest batch of proposed reforms aims to transfer responsibility to the regional governments, while suggesting that road taxes on the most polluting vehicles could also be raised if local councils become involved.

New minister choice sparks fear and fury

ROMAN ESCOLANO is Spain's new Economy Minister.

The 53-year-old from Zaragoza replaces Luis de Guindos, 58, who recently left to become Vice-President of the European Central Bank.

Escolano has resigned from his position as Vice-President of the European Investment Bank (EIB), to accept the role.

The first major appointment of Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's second term in office, the move was condemned by opposition parties and unions.

Albert Rivera, leader of the Cuidadanos party said: "The balance is not positive for Spain, because in the end what we gain with de Guindos leaving we lose with Escolano's march back to Spain."

Secretary General of the CC OO union, Unai Sordo, added that he believes Escolano will continue de Guindos' approach, "increasing social in-



SEMANA SANTA SPECIAL: What to expect from the upcoming

Semana Santa is coming to town

With Easter almost upon us for another year, David Noon recounts the weird, wacky and wonderful traditions that make the Semana Santa period so spectacular in Spain



I watched on in awe as spectators lined the streets three or four people deep, scrambling in order to see the cofradias (brotherhoods) clad in all manner of coloured, hooded gowns.

Some were carrying candles, others silver staffs, while many more were tucked away, huddled bare-footed beneath the floats that carry religious effi-

It was at the sight of the costaleros making their way with the image of the Virgin Mary atop that sent the crowds into raptures.

Coupled with the bright colours of the brotherhoods as well as the long, loud blasts on the horns, the beating of the drums and the smell of incense, it is fair to say that my first experience of Spain's Easter holiday was a sensory awakening like no other.

If truth be told, it was one of the more surreal moments of my life and I wasn't entirely ready for it.

And I wasn't the only one to be overwhelmed by the situation. Next to me, a group of older ladies dressed head-to-toe in black lace wailed in the streets as tears streamed down their

25-year-old teacher Engteacher from Sevilla, tells me 'Semana Santa in Sevilla is like nowhere on earth.

"In Sevilla, the emotion during Semana Santa is like nowhere else," he says. "My father used to carry the floats and now I take my turn. It is a duty and an honour to be a part of the celebrations.

He adds: "If you are a kid growing up in Sevilla, you always want to be a part of the Semana Santa processions when you are older.'

While Semana Santa is celebrated in

South America and Easter is a staple of most Western calendars, nowhere on earth quite marks the resurrection of Christ with as much vigour and enthusiasm as Spain.

A week of celebrations, traditions and most importantly processions is enjoyed by all as traffic grinds to a halt to allow the ceremonies to take place.

In Sevilla, 50,000 robe-wearers take part in the most iconic procession on the planet which sees thousands descend on the country from across the





In total 58 different brotherhoods all take their turn to parade through the street, with some cofradias containing as

THE National Sculpture Museum donates over 100 images for use during the processions in Valladolid, making it one of Spain's most artistic parades.

• One of Spain's most unusual (and most politically incorrect) Easter celebrations is held in the town of El Bierzo in León. While knocking back glasses of special wine-lemonade, the locals replace the usual 'saludos' with 'salir a matar Judíos' (let's

go kill the Jews). The tradition stems from a 14th century dispute between a nobleman named Suero de Quiñones and a Jewish lender, which resulted in a grizzly end for the Jewish lender after he mocked the death of Jesus.

• If the sight of hundreds of hooded men wasn't frightening enough, the Catalan town of Verges in Girona has stepped up the fear-factor a notch. On Maundy Thursday five of its residents, including three children, dress up in skeleton costumes, carry Death's sickle and dance around the streets to the

 \bullet If you thought get out of jail free cards were reserved for Monopoly, then think again. Each year, the government chooses a handful of Catholic inmates to be freed from their prison term. The tradition was brought in by

Skeletons, pub crawls and other (lesser-known) traditions



King Charles III in 1759, after a riot broke out in a Malaga prison when inmates found out Easter processions would be cancelled due to a plague outbreak. They forced their way out, carried Jesus's image through the streets and then returned to

• In León thousands of thirsty Easter revellers recreate the pub crawl that led to one of the city's well-known character's death. In 1929, Genaro Blanco was relieving his bowls against a wall after a day on the cervezas when he was struck by a rub-

> bish truck. Year after year, more followers have joined the bar-hopping procession, the record being 15,000 in 2005.

• Much of Semana Santa's traditions relate to the idea of Christian penance. That is no more prevalent than in the town of Cuenca where participants in the 'Road to Calvary' procession mock Jesus on his way to the cross. For 12 hours, members of the public jostle the nazarenos, or penitents, and prevent them from carrying Jesus's image through the streets.

• Although not as gruesome as the ones seen in parts of South America, the Via Crucis in Valverde de las Veras is not for the faint hearted. Participants, known as

empalaos, have their bodies strapped to a wooden cross and then walk barefoot through the streets.

50.000 people take part in Sevilla's processions

3,000 as nazarenos (the hooded figures).

The hooded nazarenos, dressed in colourcoded medieval robes to match their cofradia. And their faces

are covered to repent en masse and in anonymity.

Yet spare a thought for the men crammed beneath the pasos (floats). Weighing up to five tonnes, the pasos can require up to 100 men to carry.

As the procession moves forward, there is few more moving sights than the shuffling of bare feet beneath the floats as each man grips the shoulder of the next man in front of him.

In the breaks in the procession, you can see the sweat pouring off those carrying the floats, especially during the heat of the day time celebrations.

This year, things get underway on March 25 and run through until March

While I have never quite experi-

40-50 men are usually needed to carry each float, however the number can be as many as 100

enced anything like my maiden (and only) Semana Santa in Sevilla, each procession I have witnessed in the vears, cities and towns since has in one way or another been special.

For while the rituals can all be traced back to the 16th century and each celebration includes hooded-figures, processions, horns (sometimes at ungodly hours) and effigies of religious figures, every town or city has its own unique take on the Holy Week.

Andalucia is largely considered to play host to some of the most emblematic (and somber) celebrations.

Along with Sevilla, Malaga and Granada are also famous for their Easter celebrations.

Malagueno-cum-Hollywoodmegastar Antonio Banderas usually makes an appearance at his hometown's processions and has even joined the ranks in carrying floats in

Even in the smaller Costa del Sol town of Estepona, the procession takes an emotional twist as it stops on Calle Terraza to allow for (a rather uncomfortable) five minutes of gypsy singing which takes place from a balcony overlooking the effigy of the Virgin Mary.

Meanwhile in Madrid around 20 processions take place, in the build up to Easter Sunday.

The main event, the Tamborada del Domingo de Resurección, takes place on Easter Sunday at mid-day in the

Whichever Brotherhood has been chosen for the year assembles dozens of drummers who beat out a constant

What's behind the hoods?

IT must have been said a thousand times, but the nazarenos worn by the brotherhoods strike an uncanny similarity to the outfits donned by white supremacist group the Ku Klux Klan.

Of course, there is no political similarity but from a purely visual perspective the site of nazarenos does take some getting used to.

While Zamora, close to the Portuguese border lays claim to the oldest Semana Santa celebrations in Spain, dating back to 1179.


The city's population increasing five times during Holy Week, as up to 300,000 people flock to watch the ancient traditions.

Mobile phones may improve road safety

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

A TEAM of researchers at the Universidad Politecnica de Madrid have been working on a project suggesting that rather than leading to potentially deadly distractions, a mobile phone can help road safety by advising drivers of safer speeds.

The technology behind intelligent speed adaptation systems (ISA) has been around since the 90's, mostly aimed at warning drivers who exceed the speed limit.

In theory, the technology can also be used to block the functions of the mobile and even prevent use when driving, although this part of the system has seemingly not been welcomed by many, despite the obvious safety benefits.

Through this latest development of the system, the researchers in Madrid have been developing ways that the technology can identify other hazards which may need speed adjustment such as bends, the camber of the road, the elevation etc.

It can even take into account the meteorological conditions, which may affect the adhesion to the road or visibility, for example, and the amount of traffic in each

The technology can also identify the type of vehicle in which it is travelling, adjusting its reports accordingly.

The system obtains the information in real time and establishes the safest speed for the next section of the road contemplating and calculating the conditions re-

ported, the stopping distance and the lateral acceleration of the vehicle as objective criteria. To the user, the mobile indicates the level of deceleration necessary.

For the definition of the interface, the analysis of the impact on the level of attention required to receive the information of the system is carried out.

Although there are no plans to release the system any time soon, the prototype has been tested in a vehicle, with different drivers, analysing their response to warnings and their degree of satisfaction and compliance with the limits set.

Can they force him to sell?

Can you advise on our situation? We have a holiday home in Spain, owned by three brothers, with shares of A 50 per cent, B 25 per cent and C 25 per cent. Brothers A and

B are resident in Spain. Brother C is resident in the UK. A and B want to sell, C does not. Can A and B, with their 75 per cent ownership, override

In principle, no, you cannot. The only legal way to force a sale of a shared property is to go to court. Even a minority owner can bring this action.

The judge will usually try to mediate among the parties but if they cannot



agree, the judge can order the property sold at public auction and the proceeds divided among the owners according to their shares. This auction generally ends badly for all parties.

One way to handle this might be to offer the holdout brother a larger share of the sale price than he is legally enti-

May's road to Brexit: a road to nowhere

BREMAIN IN SPAIN - a group campaigning for the rights of British citizens in Spain and the EU - points out that public reactions to Theresa May's recent speech have been as mixed as the PM's own messages.

While some have praised May for adding clarity and detail to her Brexit 'plan,' others criticised her obvious continuation of delusional thinking and unrealistic expectations.

Sue Wilson, Chair of Bremain in Spain, says: "While May publicly acknowledged that the UK cannot obtain everything it wants from any deal, she's still under the delusion that the EU needs us as much as we need it. May stated that we need to face hard facts and that 'life is going to be different.' It was noticeable that she chose the word 'different' rather than 'better,' so she is no longer pretending that leaving the EU will be beneficial to the UK."

May listed five tests for Brexit: that it respects the referendum result; is a lasting solution; protect jobs; maintains an outward-looking, tolerant democracy and protects the unity of the UK.

Wilson continued "Brexit itself, or at least May's hard version of it, would damage every one of her own tests. May's insistence in respecting the 'will of the people' as of June 23, 2016 is no respecter of democracy or the people if she only considers how they felt at that particular

snapshot in time. So many voters have reconsidered their feelings about leaving the EU, now that the true facts and ramifications are known. The 'will of the people' today is demonstrably different to how it was on referendum day and should not be ignored."

The most scathing attack came from Guy Verhofstadt, who said: "Theresa May needed to move beyond vague aspirations. We can only hope that serious proposals have been put in the post. While I welcome the call for a deep and special partnership, this cannot be achieved by putting a few extra cherries on the Brexit cake."

Wilson commented that "May's red lines are turning pinker by the minute - she needs to wake up and to accept that the EU has rules in place to protect the integrity of the single market and its members, and that the UK is not a special case.

"May's latest catchphrase, 'ambitious but practical,' is just another meaningless sound bite. I have written to Number 10 with my own suggestion on a replacement, when they have run out of ideas. I think in relation to Brexit, 'pointless and cancelled' just about covers it," she con-



LET'S start this week with a nod to the tribute to Sir Bruce Forsyth on BBC 1, last Sunday. An artist pal who knows a thing about 'the business' ('hola' from España, Ian) would have been thrilled that Sir Bruce was remembered at the London Palladium. SUCH a nice man phoned from 'Windows' in India the other day, offering to fix a problem my computer didn't have.

Like growing numbers of scamresisters with a nasty streak, I strung him along happily for nearly half an hour before he finally slammed down the receiver with, I presume, a cheery wave of the fist.

There are of course real support people out there doing sterling work for those who need help when tech goes wrong or ain't quite right.

Not that the firms that have taken our money for a product with the offer of support always make it easy to get it. An hour on hold while being Vivaldi'd into a coma by customer service is enough to unhinge the sanest of us.

So what to do when your shiny new tov refuses to cooperate, your

software turns hard or the gadget supposed to change your life won't even let you change its bat-

Yes you could phone a friend, as the quiz show has it, or even an (expensive) independent technician. Or indeed customer support.

But there's another way. These days there's pretty much an online forum for everything, peopled by kindred souls ready to give their time and expertise freely to those using your very same products or

Buy technology and if it goes wrong (or even if it doesn't), why not sign up for the user forum that's sure to exist for it? Simply Google the name of your product and add the word 'forum' after it, and you'll be gob-stoppered at what pops up.

The other day I struggled to

mount a memory chip in my computer. Within minutes YouTube had served me up a dozen useful videos, job done.

Trust me, whatever has happened to you with your product has happened to dozens, even hundreds of others, so why would you tear your hair out trying to reinvent that wheel?

And at least you will never suffer the indignity inflicted so famously on one hapless customer, unable to get her new computer up and running despite nearly an hour online with the call centre

Finally he asked her if she still had the box the computer came

"Here's what you do," he instructed. "You pack it all back in the box, take it back to the store and tell them they should refund your money, because you are simply too stupid to own a comput-

He was of course fired.

Forums linked to product manufacturers are often a safe start. IBM. Dell. Firefox. Adobe and thousands of others all endorse forums linked to their products. Their own support staff may even visit these sites and sometimes help

Their help is always free. As with my friend from 'Windows India', if money is mentioned a rodent should be smelled.

Once you get a taste for being part of a dedicated online community, who knows what other heights you may reach?

There are forums for geeks. forums for fans, forums for feminists, even forums for those who like joining forums.

I did however draw the line at signing up for one I stumbled across last week: www.icechewing.com.

British buyers are still keen

BRITISH and foreign interest in the Spanish housing market remains strong according to the latest figures from the Spanish Land Registrar's Association for the last quarter of

The amount of homes purchased by foreigners reportedly increased to 15,266 in this time period, the highest it's been during these particular months for several years.

It also marked a 20.4 per cent increase from 2016, while housing sales in general in Spain were up 19.8 per cent.

The British led the international interest in Spanish homes at the end of 2017, making more than 2,300 purchases, followed by the French and Germans registering more than 1,200 and 1,100 purchases respectively.

Zapatero sells house after price cut

THE former president of Spain, Jose Luis Zapatero, has revealed that he has finally found a buyer for his villa in

He managed to sell his home in Eras de Reneuva for \in 390,000, but this is almost half the price of \in 670,000 he originally set.

Zapatero began to build the house in 2011 with the intention of it being one of his main residences, and it is in one of the most exclusive areas of the city.

However, he soon abandoned the idea of returning to the place where he grew up, and the house was left halfbuilt without any interior decoration for several years.

It is perhaps not surprising that the house has robust security facilities including a range of surveillance cameras and a large exterior wall.

It boasts a master bedroom, four en-suite bedrooms, a spacious living room, gym, home-cinema, cellar and swimming pool.

No real estate agency was involved in the deal as it was carried out directly between Zapatero and the buyers. The new tenants are already remodelling the interior of the building, which had been on the market for

fruit on trees that you can keep to less than two metres tall and around a metre wide can allow you to find a space even in a container on a balcony or ter-

Have your own fruit by pruning and thinning

The secret to robust, large fruit is in the pruning and thinning. I recently visited a local orchardist who specialises in growing peach trees that he takes directly to sell in the mar-

He showed me how over 20 years he had refined the best way to have the best quality fruit was to prune the trees hard, to allow plenty of open space between branches in winter, and to remove over half the fruits forming in spring to have space between the immature developing fruit.

This gives less quantity but greater quality, something that the home gardener usually prefers. His trees were less than two metres tall so he could hand pick them without damage to the fruit or himself and the tree was easily accessible with the wide spacing between branches to access all the fruit.

In gardening circles this method is called forcing. Pruning and thinning forces the

plants to produce flowers and fruits that are larger and healthi-

The reduced number of produce get the benefit of the whole plant's root system, powered by more efficient exposure of sunlight to the remaining leaves and fruits due to the thinning out, and shortening of branches.

The technique can be used in the domestic garden to have fruit trees in small spaces, with quality fruit that can be picked fresh when ripe knowing that it has not been subjected to any chemical treatments.

Flea prevention time

FLEAS are ugly, nasty parasites that are one of the most difficult critters to get rid of. Which is why, prevention, all year long, is necessary.


Fleas are about ¼-inch long, are black/brown in colour, have no wings but do have long hind legs, which they use for jumping from one host to another. Fleas require a host - your cat or dog - in order to survive, as they live off their blood.

Fleas can be found all around the world, no matter the climate, however, they particularly like living in grass, which is where your pet will most likely be exposed to them.

Outdoor prevention

Because fleas burrow deep into the grass, as well as under branches, leaves and soil, just waiting for a host to latch onto, one of the most effective ways to prevent fleas from hopping onto your pet is to keep your lawn well groomed.

It is also important to always rake

the leaves as flea larvae don't like light. Watering your lawn on a regular basis may also help keep fleas from

residing in your lawn. "A majority of the fleas and larvae will be within 50 feet of your dog's favourite resting spot, so focus on those areas," reports Pet Supplies Review.

Another line of defence is topical medications, the best of which are available through your veterinarian. There are many different prescriptions available so contact your vet to determine which one is most appropriate for your pet.

Cleaning

Regular house cleaning, such as vacuuming weekly and regularly washing your pet's bedding, will go a long way toward preventing fleas.

Infestation control

If your dog is uncontrollably scratching itself: to determine if the cause is in fact fleas, do a couple of things. Look under your dog's fur for dark specs. Those black bits are flea dirt, they are actually flea faeces. Pick them off the pet and place them onto a wet paper towel. If the specs morph into something that resembles a bloodstain, then your pet has fleas.

Flea dirt is a lot easier to spot on

lighter coloured pets. On darker coloured pets, comb through their fur with a flea comb, its bristles are very close together and it will pull out any

Now what?

It is impossible to know how long the fleas have been living off your pet, so it is also impossible to locate all the areas within the house where the fleas may be living. Not only do you have to treat your pet, but you also have to treat your entire house.

Before buying every flea-destroying product on the market, thoroughly vacuum your house. Remove the vacuum bag, seal it and destroy it immediately, fleas are hearty parasites and will continue to live in the vacuum bag if not destroyed.

For dogs and cats (they can share fleas) a specially formulated flea bath product, available at your vet or pet store, will do the trick. Shampooing will have to be accompanied by extensive brushing with a flea comb.







Time for change! GOLF is set to undergo radical changes - with amendments to the game's rules set to be implemented from 2019. According to reports, golf's

R&A and USGA confirm rule changes from 2019

into play.

In another move, the time for searching for lost balls will be reduced from five minutes to three, but instead the plan to have penalty or free drops from an inch have been changed and will now be taken from knee height.

David Rickman, the R&A's executive director of governance, explained to British media: "Our previous proposal had a number of difficulties with it. particularly around how close certain players would get to the ground in certain circumstances.

"Knee-height gave us that balance, gave us the ability to preserve the randomness of the drop. "But by being significantly lower than shoulder height and by allowing a player to get their eyes over the ball, they can be much more precise in terms of the dropping procedure."
