# Murder probe suspect held

A MAN has been arrested in Almeria on suspicion of multiple crimes including homicide, robbery with violence and a crime against public health.

An investigation began at the beginning of March when the body of a 48year-old Argentine woman was found at a house on Calle Agua Amarga.

According to reports, at first the death seemed to be from natural circumstances but after an autopsy it was revealed that the woman had died by asphyxia.

The house where the victim was found was allegedly being used as a point of sale for narcotics; with two rooms in the house found being used for growing marihuana.

From that moment the investigation was focused on people who regularly visited the house, including an individual who reportedly didn't turn up for work on the night of the alleged murder.

After further investigation, officers were able to place the man in the house during the hours that the crime is believed to have taken place and police then attempted to locate him.

Thirteen hours after the body was discovered, the 40-year-old Spaniard was arrested and charged with crimes against public health, robbery with violence and homicide.

# Thousands attend funeral of Gabriel

Thousands of people are estimated to have turned out for the funeral of Gabriel Cruz, the eightyear-old boy whose body was found after a 12-day search.

Angel Cruz and Patricia Ramirez, Gabriel's father and mother, were joined by mourners including Spain's Interior Minister and Deputy Prime Minister.

The funeral took place on Tuesday at Almeria's Cathedral de la Encarnation and was led by the Bishop of Almeria Monsignor Adolfo Gonzalaz Montes.

Police have arrested Ana Julia Ouezada, the girlfriend of Angel Cruz, after officers reportedly found the body of the eight-yearold in the boot of her car. Spanish media have reported that she has since confessed to killing Gabriel.

Mourners gathered outside the cathedral shouted "You are not alone" and "We are all Gabriel."

Patricia Ramirez thanked everyone for their support and messages of affection when speaking to the media at the service.

"I have no words of thanks for all the good deeds from people involved, although this has not had a happy ending," she said.

She added she did not wish for people to talk about Quezada.

"This woman does not deserve to be covered, let us not talk about her," she said.

"The little fish is swimming to heaven and I would like all the people to send a fish with a nice word wherever they want," she

Fishes were the eight-yearold's favourite animal and became a symbol of the search efforts while they were ongoing.

Hundreds of people paid their respects to Gabriel when his coffin arrived at a chapel dedicated to his memory on Monday.

Around 12,000 people in Almeria City held a five-minute's silence for the eight-year-old following the discovery of his body on Sunday.

King Felipe, the Junta de Andalucia President Susana Diaz, Sevilla mayor Juan Espadas and Malaga mayor Francisco de la Torre observed a minute's silence at a Sevilla conference on Mon-

Towns across Almeria also held minute's silences and authorities in Nijar declared three days of mourning following the news that Gabriel's body had been

Ouezada was placed under surveillance shortly after she allegedly found a t shirt at the bottom of the Las Aguilas ravine. It was said to belong to Gabriel and confirmation came later that it had traces of his DNA on it.

She was arrested in the early hours of Sunday morning after officers saw her remove something from a well on the Cañada de la Soledad farm, in Rodalquilar.

Guardia Civil officers who watched her do this then asked to search her car and found Gabriel's body in the boot, according to police.

It has since been reported that Quezada confessed to killing the eight-year-old. She allegedly told police she acted in self defence after he attempted to assault her.

Results from a post-mortem examination found Gabriel had died from asphyxiation.

# Victim stabbed 'in front of family'

THREE defendants found guilty of stabbing and beating a man in an attempt to kill him over a drugs debt dispute have each been sentenced to seven years in

The court in Almeria City also acquitted the defendants for robbery charges as they did not take anything from the victim. One of the defendants was found not guilty of making threats, with the charges not able to be proved.

A fourth defendant was acquitted on all charges with prosecutors unable to convince the court he had been involved in the crimes

The court heard one of the defendants decided to go to the victim's home to settle a debt concerning

The defendant asked the other two to go with him. The three waited outside the victim's house until after they saw him, his wife and son leave to get in their

guing with the victim and pulled him out of the car. The man who had asked the other two to go with him then pulled out a large knife and stabbed him several times in the chest, according to the prosecution.

The three defendants also beat the man who was taken to hospital in a critical condition. He reportedly spent 30 days recovering from the wounds.

The defendants accepted their right not to testify during the hearings, so the court judged the case on the basis of statements they had given to police following their arrest.

Two of the defendants had reportedly admitted to their part in the assault during the police investigation. Officers had forensic evi-

dence gathered from the crime scene which suggested they had been involved.

The court rejected claims by the prosecution that the assault was aggravated by the use of disguises after claims that the defendants wore balaclavas could not be proved.

The defendants will also be required to pay a total of €4,000 to the victim as part of the sentence.

# Transfer resumes

WATER transfers from Granada Province's Negratin reservoir to Almanzora in Almeria have begun seven months after they were first stopped. The transfers will see Almanzora receive 11.5 billion litres of water for irrigation until next May following a rise in water levels at the reservoir.

## **Bone donation**

EL EJIDO'S Hospital de Poniente has taken the first two donations of bone and eye tissue 48 hours apart after two donors were registered. A man donated bone tissue while the family of a deceased woman allowed the donation of her bone tissue and corneas.

#### Care workers

The policemen stand accused of torture and illegal detention after beating the man following his arrest for allegedly assaulting a Guardia Civil officer.



WOMEN in Spain are looking to the future after millions took to the streets to mark International Women's Day.

Historic marches took place in more than 200 Spanish towns and cities in a united stand against a range of issues including domestic violence and the gender pay gap.

And estimates suggest that more than five million people took part in the two-hour 'feminist' strikes that preceded the rally, which was

backed by 10 unions and some of Spain's most important female politicians and cultural figures.

Public transport was ravaged and some of the marches brought traffic to a standstill as protesters congregated under the slogan 'If we stop, the world stops.'

The event places Spain at the cutting edge of feminist movements

The mayor of Madrid, Manuela Carmena, tweeted "This isn't only

about calling for true equality, but also about facing the need to change how the world treats women," while her Barcelona counterpart Ada Colau said that she joined the strike "to show that without women the world really does

But the Spanish government did not agree, after the ruling Popular Party said that the strike was "for feminist elites and not real women with everyday problems.'

# All fired up

THIS weekend the city of Valencia welcomes spring in style during the annual Las Fallas festival - a loud, boisterous fiesta where the city is literally set alight.

The festival started as a celebration of St Joseph, the patron saint of carpenters, but has since evolved into a five-day fire extravaganza. The quiet city's population of around one million more than trebles in size during the celebrations as people flock from across the globe to witness the festivities.

The festival is all about the creation of 'ninots' - huge lifelike statues made from wood, cardboard, paper-machè and plaster which are paraded through the city streets, then destroyed in a giant firework display at midnight on the dot.

The ninots tend to depict lewd, satirical scenes relating to current events and will often make fun of Spanish politicians or Spanish celebrities.

These bawdy giants can cost up to €60,000 to create and are crafted by local neighbourhood or-

ganisations. The labour process is intensive and can take up to 12 months to complete so as soon as that year's festival is over, work already begins for the next event.

During the early evening on the final day of the festival, a group of people with axes chop carefully placed holes in the ninots and fill them with fireworks.

On the run up to midnight, the streetlights are all switched off, the crowds start to chant and the fireworks are lit as the clock strikes 12.

In recent years, the local firemen have come up with methods to protect the town's buildings from being accidentally set alight by the fireworks, including covering them with fireproof material.

Every year, one of the ninots is saved from obliteration by a popular vote. The pardoned statue - called the ninot indultat - is then displayed in the local Museum of the Ninots along with the other lucky escapees from previous years.



# 'Let the kind acts be what remains'

OUR thoughts are with the family of Gabriel Cruz Ramirez.

The tragic eight-year-old's body was found in the boot of his father's girlfriend's car 12 days after he went missing in Nijar, Almeria.

More than 3,000 people flocked to Almeria's Cathedral to pay their respects at his funeral on Tuesday, with several high ranking Spanish politicians in attendance.

And while much ire has been directed towards the prime suspect in the case, it is the words and advice of the child's mother, Patricia Ramirez, that should resonate the most.

Carrying herself with great dignity throughout the horrific ordeal, she appealed "for rage not to spread any further, for nobody to retweet rage-fuelled things, because that is not who my son was, and it is not who I am."

Her words came after a vengeful social media storm erupted in the wake of Gabriel's body being discovered, with the suspect even being physically attacked while surrounded by po-

And yet the woman who could have been forgiven for feeling the most hatred instead chose to vilify those who reacted with anger to the death of her son.

In doing so, she captured the hearts of a nation, and in a world that feels less-tolerant than at any time since the middle of the last century, her unflinching dignity should serve as a valuable lesson to us all.



# The search for Gabriel Cruz

SEVERAL Guardia Civil units were joined by hundreds of volunteers to try and find Gabriel Cruz Ramirez. who disappeared after leaving his grandmother's house in Las Hortichuelas.

A specialist police team made up of forensics officers, underwater officers. dogs and a scientific unit all took part in the search. It began after the eight-year-old was reported missing on Tuesday February 27.

In a separate development a man was arrested on Friday March 2 by the Guardia Civil for allegedly breaching a restraining order preventing him from contacting the boy's mother

A rally under the banner 'We Are All Gabriel' took place on Friday March 9 in the town of Puerta Purchena at 12pm to raise awareness of the search.

Police were first alerted to the disappearance of the eight-year-old shortly after his parents realised he had gone missing.

Gabriel left his grandmother's house at around 3.30pm to go and play with her neighbours around a 100metre walk away.

His family said he usually spent holidays and weekends at the house in Las Hortichuelas, near Nijar. He did not arrive at the neighbour's house and was reported

missing at around 8pm.

His parents did not believe Gabriel got lost, which would have been out of character for their son who they said was well behaved. They added he knew the area well and regularly took the route while visiting his grand-

More than 400 people, including police officers and local residents, searched for the eigh-year-old the following day.

They were split into 15 groups which covered 23 search areas across Nijar. Aerial, canine and underwater units were all deployed as part of the search.

claimed she had found one of his t-shirts near the Barranco Las Aguilas sewage treatment plant on Saturday March 3

By Sunday March 4 the search area had been expanded to a radius of five-kilometres from the track where Gabriel is believed to have been taken from.

Leading politicians including Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy, Interior Minister Juan Ignacio Zoido and Junta de Andalucia President Susana Diaz all offered words of support to the family during the search.

The operation to find Gabriel continued throughout the following week until

the early hours of last Sunday when police arrested Quezada on suspicion of killing him. She has since confessed, according to reports in Spanish media.

The 43-year-old reportedly told officers that the boy had got in her car voluntarily on the way to his grandmother's.

He then tried to assault her so she acted in self defence to stop him and killed him as a result, according to reports on her police interrogation.

Police have taken her to the scene of the crime in order to assist them in their efforts to reconstruct what happened. She is due to have proceedings sent to the



THOUSANDS of protestors were estimated to have taken to the streets of Almeria and other towns in the province for marches to mark International Women's



# Prison for chicken killer defendant

A MAN who allegedly killed four chickens and stole two other birds from a farm in Canjayar has been sentenced to 10 months in prison by a court in Almeria.

The court heard the defendant had broken into the farm and taken the birds away in a sack. He was recognised by Guardia Civil officers on video footage shot by a security camera the owner had installed in response to a spate of similar thefts.

The owner also told the magistrate the defendant had been recognised in the video by police and that between six and eight birds had died or were stolen.

The magistrate also ordered the defendant to pay a € 270 fine and compensation worth €69.27 to the victim for the theft and animal abuse crimes.







# Child abduction figures highest in region

ALMERIA had the highest number of child abductions in Andalucia in 2017, according to a report presented by Spain's Interior Minister.

There were six high-risk disappearances out of a total of 343 in the province at the end of last year, according to the Missing Persons Report.

The report, put out by Juan Ignacio Zoido to coincide with Missing Persons Day last week,

stated there were 211 active cases in the province at the end of 2017. Almeria came behind Cadiz at 840 active cases and Granada with 352.

There were a total of 3,234 missing persons at the end of last year throughout Andalucia, more than half the national total of 6,053. The news comes after police located the body of Gabriel Cruz, from near Nijar in Almeria. who went missing on February

27. The report stated that the number of children abducted in Almeria rose from five in 2010 to 12 by 2017.

It also stated that male disappearances were more common, at around 57.2 per cent of the total, and that 6 per cent of missing persons were under 18. More than 29.6 per cent of cases concerned people between 36 and 50, while more than 28.2 per cent were 65 and older.

The festival takes its name from a conflict between two carnival characters. Don Carnal and Doña Cuaresma.

The figure of Doña Cuaresma became that of an old woman following her defeat of Don Carnal in the traditional story.

Small dolls, or Viejas, representing the woman are filled with sweets and placed on a wooden cross as part of the festivities.

It is stuck in the ground and small local children are responsible for breaking it open to find the sweets inside.

The children also have the chance to eat the Hornazo, a dessert made from a hard-boiled egg. Food such as paella is also eaten by those taking part while they visit green areas such as Los Gurullos and Las Alparatas, in the case of Mo-

The Dia de La Vieja is the only fiesta not represented by a saint, but by a pagan figure. The festival has since been incorporated into the Christian festival calendar in the Almeria Levante



# Hospital receives first donations



HOSPITAL DE PONIENTE: Has received its first tissue donations.

THE Hospital de Poniente has received its first two donations of bone tissue and corneas.

The hospital only joined the Organ and Tissue programme of Andalucian hospitals earlier this year and has now had their first donations. with both coming in the space of 48 hours

The first bone tissue came from a male while the second donation came after the family of a deceased woman agreed to allow the removal of her corneas and bone tissue.

On joining the Organ and Tissue donation programme, manager of the Poniente Sanitary Public Agency, Jose Antonio Hernandez, told Spanish media: "The process to ioin the network of centres included in the donation and transplant programme began at the beginning of 2017 and it has required 11 months of work in which practically all the services of the hospital have been involved, to adapt the processes and operation of our centre to the standards required by the Autonomic

Transplant Coordination, as well as to train all the professionals involved."

As part of the programme, the Hospital de Poniente has reportedly been authorised to receive donations from patients that have died from either brain diseases or cardiac arrests.

Patients can donate hearts, livers, lungs, pancreases and kidneys as well as corneas and bone tissues, with bone tissue transplants also being performed at the hospital.



# Prima doners caged

# €36m 'kebab' scheme skewered by police

A SPANISH police operation against a massive international money laundering operation based on the Costa Blanca and in Barcelona has led to five arrests and 15 people being charged.

The criminal organisation, operating both in Germany and Spain, used a network of food establishments to conceal their activities, fronting as kebab meat suppliers.

Guardia Civil investigations began in summer 2015 when police officers from the Barcelona-El Prat airport discovered that money was being sent from Spain to Germany on a weekly basis.

Running its activities from Barcelona and Alicante, the criminal organisation was transferring large sums of money between the two countries, ranging from  $\in$  90,000 to  $\in$  300,000.

The group justified the

transfers to the airport authorities as payments of Spanish companies to a German company for kebab meat supply.

But the investigation revealed that the Spanish companies did not even run real commercial activities.

Police found that the group, operating since 2012, had built up a network of front companies involved in money laundering.

The Spanish authorities estimate that around €36 million has been transferred and laundered by the criminal network.

Europol has supported the investigation since 2017 by providing analytical and operational support, carrying out data analysis and cross match reporting.

As a result of the operation the Spanish Guardia Civil has blocked 36 bank

accounts and 35 credit cards and seized five properties in the province of Alicante worth approximately €470 000

"This investigation shows once again that criminal business is still largely done in cash," Simon Riondet, Head of Financial Intelligence at Europol, explained.

"Professional money laundering syndicates offer cash courier and compensation laundering services for illicit proceeds. Very often networks of front and shell companies are established in order to facilitate the movement of the money and to provide justification for the proceeds.

"These activities are further enabled by the lack of cash payment restrictions in some EU countries which allow justifying large cash amounts as payments for

trade activities.

"The continued law enforcement seizures of bulk large denomination banknotes and the prevailing trade-based money laundering schemes reinforce the need to discontinue the production and circulation of €500 and €200 banknotes and set an EU-wide framework for restricting or setting a common limit for cash payments."

# Snakes on a plane

# More than 800 illegal animals seized

POLICE are quizzing 17 people in Spain after wild reptiles worth more than € 150.000 were seized in the Nether-

Three Spanish men were held at Amsterdam's Schipol Airport as they waited to board a flight to Madrid with 200 Mexican snakes, lizards, and turtles, including many protected species, in their lug-

A probe revealed the trio to be members of a dedicated wildlife trafficking ring, leading police to swoop on homes

and warehouses in Madrid and Castellon, unearthing a further 600 animals.

Many of them were legal species that had been frozen alive, with licences issued to keep them used to sell on.

Nine suspects have been remanded in custody and eight others questioned in connection with the plot, which reportedly saw wildlife from America, Asia, Africa and Oceania illegally smuggled to Spain for the black market pet

Most of the species in-

volved were endangered in the wild and highly desired by private collectors, with some fetching as much as €50,000 for a single individual.

The gang had a network of

contacts around the world and used drug-trafficking-style mules to bring the animals to Europe, although some were traded 'legally' using forged documentation.



# Ticket to ride for train line

WORK on a €530 million international rail freight corridor connecting Spain and Portugal is underway.

A THINK TANK funded by Spain claims that Brexit offers the ideal opportunity to negotiate a 'new status' for Gibraltar.

Published by the Elcano Royal Institute, of which the largest donor is the Spanish government, the policy paper says that it is the first time that Gibraltar has been pressurised to urgently resolve doubts over its status in relation to the European Union

The report added that while the rock may not be one of Spain's top priorities, the country is keen to

maintain its strong economic ties with the UK.

"Brexit opens the possibility of renegotiating the actual situation of Gibraltar," the researchers said, adding that the current situation "opens the door to a new status for Gibraltar that is favourable to all involved parties and acceptable to the legitimate interests and aspirations of

Gibraltar has been a British Overseas Territory since 1713 despite Spain's repeated claims to sovereign-

ty, and its 33,000 inhabitants voted overwhelmingly in favour of remaining in the EU in the 2016 Brexit ref-

Around 8,000 Spaniards also commute to the peninsula each day for

The Elcano report goes on to say that it is in the mutual interest of both countries to examine how Gibraltar might retain links with the EU after the UK formally cuts ties in 2019, although the authors point out that their view does not necessarily reflect that of the Spanish government.

# Bogus cash con scotched

It comes in the wake of an 18-month probe after a spike in counterfeit notes was reported in Badajoz, Extremadura during summer 2016.



# €6m solar storm erupts

# 'LIKE GOING TO WAR WITHOUT WEAPONS'

SPAIN'S biggest research and development centre for renewable energy is unable to spend money.

The Solar Platform in Almeria (PSA) has reportedly been handed millions of Euros in European Union grants, but restrictions imposed by the Spanish government have left bosses unable to splash out.

Set up in the Tabernas Desert during the 1970's, the centre is the most important for solar thermal energy in Europe.

Ex-PSA director Sixto Malato said: "Spain has installed the equivalent of two nuclear power stations in solar thermal energy plants... if it occupied 1.5 per cent of the world's deserts, we could generate enough electricity for the entire planet."

The PSA has designed technology used by major power plants in the United States, China and North Africa, and is a popular proving ground for new solar energy systems.

Around €6 million-worth of funding cannot be spent after the Spanish Treasury, in 2016, began to roll out measures designed to limit outlay.

The latest ruling was approved in January.

It blocks public research agencies from spending more than half of their funds until the 2018 National Budget is approved, with Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's embattled Popular Party thus far unable to get its plans approved by Spanish Congress.

The standoff has seen 14 researchers - 35 per cent of the team - laid off from the PSA, leading to Malato handing in his notice.

One of them, a woman who has several children and had worked there for 15 years told Spanish media: "Our problem is due to the state of science in Spain and the scarcity of work opportunities for highly trained people, I used to get the best grades in my class, and now my employ-

ment prospects are the most unstable."

The constraints have also impacted on research, with several projects months behind schedule. Waterspoutt has a €3.5 million budget to develop water purification technology for Uganda in southern Africa, but there is no-one in charge of it after the lead researcher was, in February, made redundant.

Researcher Eduardo Zarza said how an experimental steam generation system, which is among the platform's 'most emblematic' has been out of action for four months as he is unable to buy spare parts.

Malato confirmed that a number of requests for the Treasury to exempt 15 EU science contracts from the spending restrictions have not been answered to date.

# Planemaker to axe 3,700 jobs as jet projects fail to take off

AIRBUS has warned that up to 3,700 jobs - including 800 in Spain - could be lost as it downscales assembly of its A380 and A400M planes.

The European manufacturer said that the cuts would also affect the UK, France and Germany as issues continue to plague Europe's priciest civil and military aerospace projects.

Production of the A380 superiumbo, the world's biggest passenger jet, will be slashed from six to eight per vear from 2020

The underperforming project was almost axed until Dubai's Emirates airline ordered 16 of the planes for € 12.85 billion

And just eight A400M troop transporters will be built, down from a forecast 15 this year and 11 in 2019, after losses soared beyond €8 billion.

# NOT GRAPE NEWS AFTER HARVEST SLUMP Wine prices to increase

WINE lovers are facing a price hike in the wake of last year's catastrophic grape harvest.

Global wine production last year fell to its lowest level in half a century after vineyards in Spain, as well as the world's two other top producers France and Italy, with the weather to blame.

Extreme and unseasonal hot and cold temperatures ravaged all three countries, with the areas producing Spanish Rioja and Italian Prosecco coming off worst.

Dan Jago, chief executive of posh wine merchant Berry Bros and Rudd, told UK media: "We'll start to see those [2017] wines coming to the market now and I think for higher volume, lower price wine you will see cost increases.

"Prices for things like Pinot Grigio or generic Spanish reds will rise by between 10 per cent and 30 per cent and it's how much of that retailers will pass on," said the former Tesco wine business chief. "Prosecco was very hard hit by frost, so there will be less

of it and the price will go up."

According to The International Organisation of Vine and Wine, global wine production plummeted by 8 per cent in 2017 after the worst grape harvest since 1961.

The fall is set to see 2.9 billion fewer bottles hit the market this year.

A senior figure in the wine industry said that the sector had endured a 'perfect storm' in 2017, with issues affecting wine-growing regions across the planet.

"There is price pressure in two places, right at the top end, in premium claret, and in entry level wine," he

explained. "In a £5 bottle only 50p is for the wine so you are looking at a small increase of say 12.5p... on a £100 bottle of wine you've got a material price change.

"In a good year producers will try and profit and in a bad year they will try and eat some of the losses, it's in their interests to do so. At some point prices will have to reflect the cost of production but supermarkets will work hard to keep wine affordable because like eggs, milk and a loaf of white bread, people know the price of a bottle of Pinot Gigio."

# Shot in the arm for civil service

SPANISH civil servants are to receive their first pay rise since 2009.

It comes after unions thrashed out a deal with the government which will see employees receive between 6.1-8.8 per cent boost in wages over the next three years.

Civil servants lost 11-23 per cent of their buying power in the wake of the economic crisis.

Tens of thousands of jobs axed as Spain imposed austerity measures on the central administration, army. justice and public health

The CC OO union confirmed the agreement in a statement after it earlier rejected the government's proposed 1 per cent pay

"We're moving towards an increase that will recover their lost purchasing power," said CC OO official Antonio Cabrera.

# Green tax reforms looming

THE Spanish government is aiming to increase taxes on diesel fuel.

A raft of other environmental levies will also be reformed as Finance Minister Cristobal Montoro, revealed that the bulk of such taxation will be managed by the country's 17 regional governments.

And chief among the proposed changes is a move to scrap current tax breaks for drivers of diesel and other highly polluting vehicles.

The announcement comes after European Commission (EC) lawmakers in Belgian capital Brussels again slammed Spain over its low income from environmental taxes.

In a report on the Spanish economy, the EC officials pointed out that green taxes in Spain last year generated incoming funds equivalent to 1.9 per cent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), compared to

the European Union (EU) average of 2.4 per cent.

The document points out "the low level of taxes on unleaded gasoline and diesel" in particular "the case of diesel, on which Spain applies the minimum excise duty, despite the fact that diesel has a higher carbon and energy content than unleaded petrol."

It continues: "Taxes on transport only generate half the income in Spain than in the rest of the EU (0.2 per cent compared to 0.5 per cent of GDP)."

The EC has issued a number of scathing reports on the situation in Spain since 2012, with the International Monetary Fund and Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development following suit.

But while most developed countries have raised tax or applied restrictions on diesel, Spain has done nothing notable to date, according to the

The Spanish government is in danger of being hauled before the EU Court of Justice for consistently breaching recommended limits of nitrogen dioxide (NO2) in Madrid and Barcelona since 2010.

NO2 is a by-product emitted by both petrol and diesel motor engines that can trigger breathing and other respiratory problems in otherwise healthy peo-

In December 2016 Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy pledged to raise an additional €500 million annually through green taxes, but the scheme was shelved shortly after-

The government's latest batch of proposed reforms aims to transfer responsibility to the regional governments, while suggesting that road taxes on the most polluting vehicles could also be raised if local councils become involved.

# **New minister** choice sparks fear and fury

ROMAN ESCOLANO is Spain's new Economy Minister.

The 53-year-old from Zaragoza replaces Luis de Guindos, 58, who recently left to become Vice-President of the European Central Bank.

Escolano has resigned from his position as Vice-President of the European Investment Bank (EIB), to accept the role.

The first major appointment of Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's second term in office, the move was condemned by opposition parties and unions.

Albert Rivera, leader of the Cuidadanos party said: "The balance is not positive for Spain, because in the end what we gain with de Guindos leaving we lose with Escolano's march back to Spain."

Secretary General of the CC OO union, Unai Sordo, added that he believes Escolano will continue de Guindos' approach, "increasing social in-



I watched on in awe as spectators lined the streets three or four people deep, scrambling in order to see the cofradias (brotherhoods) clad in all manner of coloured, hooded gowns.

Some were carrying candles, others silver staffs, while many more were tucked away, huddled bare-footed beneath the floats that carry religious effi-

In the breaks in the procession, you can see the sweat pouring off those carrying the floats, especially during the heat of the day time celebrations.



Like growing numbers of scamresisters with a nasty streak, I strung him along happily for nearly half an hour before he finally slammed down the receiver with. I presume, a cheery wave of the fist.

There are of course real support people out there doing sterling work for those who need help when tech goes wrong or ain't quite right.

Not that the firms that have taken our money for a product with the offer of support always make it easy to get it. An hour on hold while being Vivaldi'd into a coma by customer service is enough to unhinge the sanest of us.

So what to do when your shiny new tov refuses to cooperate, your

software turns hard or the gadget supposed to change your life won't even let you change its bat-

Yes you could phone a friend, as the quiz show has it, or even an (expensive) independent technician. Or indeed customer support.

But there's another way. These days there's pretty much an online forum for everything, peopled by kindred souls ready to give their

time and expertise freely to those using your very same products or services.

Buy technology and if it goes wrong (or even if it doesn't), why not sign up for the user forum that's sure to exist for it? Simply Google the name of your product and add the word 'forum' after it. and you'll be gob-stoppered at what pops up.

mount a memory chip in my computer. Within minutes YouTube had served me up a dozen useful videos, job done.

Trust me, whatever has happened to you with your product has happened to dozens, even hundreds of others, so why would you tear your hair out trying to reinvent that wheel?

And at least you will never suffer the indignity inflicted so famously on one hapless customer, unable to get her new computer up and running despite nearly an hour online with the call centre assistant.

Finally he asked her if she still had the box the computer came

"Here's what you do," he instructed. "You pack it all back in the box, take it back to the store and tell them they should refund your money, because you are simply too stupid to own a comput-

He was of course fired.

Forums linked to product manufacturers are often a safe start. IBM. Dell. Firefox. Adobe and thousands of others all endorse forums linked to their products. Their own support staff may even visit these sites and sometimes help

Their help is always free. As with my friend from 'Windows India', if money is mentioned a rodent should be smelled.

Once you get a taste for being part of a dedicated online community, who knows what other heights you may reach?

There are forums for geeks. forums for fans, forums for feminists, even forums for those who like joining forums.

I did however draw the line at signing up for one I stumbled across last week: www.icechewing.com.

## May's road to Brexit: a road to nowhere

May stated that we need to face hard facts and that 'life is going to be different.' It was noticeable that she chose the word 'different' rather than 'better,' so she is no longer pretending that leaving the EU will be beneficial to the UK."

May listed five tests for Brexit: that it respects the referendum result; is a lasting solution; protect jobs; maintains an outward-looking, tolerant democracy and protects the unity of the UK.

Wilson continued "Brexit itself, or at least May's hard version of it, would damage every one of her own tests. May's insistence in respecting the 'will of the people' as of June 23, 2016 is no respecter of democracy or the people if she only considers how they felt at that particular

snapshot in time. So many voters have reconsidered their feelings about leaving the EU, now that the true facts and ramifications are known. The 'will of the people' today is demonstrably different to how it was on referendum day and should not be ignored."

The most scathing attack came from Guy Verhofstadt, who said: "Theresa May needed to move beyond vague aspirations. We can only hope that serious proposals have been put in the post. While I welcome the call for a deep and special partnership, this cannot be achieved by putting a few extra cherries on the Brexit cake."

Wilson commented that "May's red lines are turning pinker by the minute - she needs to wake up and to accept that the EU has rules in place to protect the integrity of the single market and its members, and that the UK is not a special case.

"May's latest catchphrase, 'ambitious but practical,' is just another meaningless sound bite. I have written to Number 10 with my own suggestion on a replacement, when they have run out of ideas. I think in relation to Brexit, 'pointless and cancelled' just about covers it," she con-

## Mobile phones may improve road safety

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

A TEAM of researchers at the Universidad Politecnica de Madrid have been working on a project suggesting that rather than leading to potentially deadly distractions, a mobile phone can help road safety by advising drivers of safer speeds.

The technology behind intelligent speed adaptation systems (ISA) has been around since the 90's, mostly aimed at warning drivers who exceed the speed limit.

In theory, the technology can also be used to block the functions of the mobile and even prevent use when driving, although this part of the system has seemingly not been welcomed by many, despite the obvious safety benefits.

Through this latest development of the system, the researchers in Madrid have been developing ways that the technology can identify other hazards which may need speed adjustment such as bends, the camber of the road, the elevation etc.

It can even take into account the meteorological conditions, which may affect the adhesion to the road or visibility, for example, and the amount of traffic in each

The technology can also identify the type of vehicle in which it is travelling, adjusting its reports accordingly.

The system obtains the information in real time and establishes the safest speed for the next section of the road contemplating and calculating the conditions re-

ported, the stopping distance and the lateral acceleration of the vehicle as objective criteria. To the user, the mobile indicates the level of deceleration necessary.

For the definition of the interface, the analysis of the impact on the level of attention required to receive the information of the system is carried out.

Although there are no plans to release the system any time soon, the prototype has been tested in a vehicle, with different drivers, analysing their response to warnings and their degree of satisfaction and compliance with the limits set.







THERE are many astonishing hotels in the world, in an occasional series I will look at Rooms at the Top. Not necessarily the top as in height above sea level, indeed many are at sea level, but rather the spectacular offer to the guest.





## Foods to boost your brainpower



BRAIN GAIN: Eating salmon could keep your mind healthy.

IT'S important to maintain a healthy diet to keep your body in good shape and functioning effectively but eating well is just as important for your mind.

Blueberries could also help to improve short-term memory as they contain protective compounds called anthocyanins, which help to delay short term memory loss according to research from Tufts University, USA.

## Wine: friend or foe?

THERE has been a lot of dispute about how good drinking wine on a regular basis is for your health.

Some studies have suggested wine helps to protect against heart disease, while others reveal that drinking alcohol regularly can damage the brain and cause a wide range of health issues, from liver disease to depression.

Consuming small amounts of alcohol could help to protect some people from developing heart problems, according to research from the British Heart Foundation.

Red wine especially contains several antioxidants, such as quercetin and resveratrol, which may play a part in helping to prevent heart disease and cancer.

However, these antioxidants primarily benefit postmenopausal women and men over the age of 40, and when consumption is limited to two glasses of wine a

Eating well and leading a healthy lifestyle will also produce the same results and there is still little evidence that wine has the same effect on the health of young people, who are less at risk of heart disease.

Health experts advise you don't drink more than 14 units a week and to make you have several alcohol free days a week to give your body rest.





## Water flowing

WATER authorities in Andalucia have agreed to reserve up to two hectometres of the volume to be transferred from the Negratin reservoir for household use in Almanzora towns including Albox.

The news follows a decision from the Technical Commission of the Transfer of Negratin to resume the transfer from the Granada Province reservoir to Almanzora.

Around 11.5 billion litres of water are set to be transferred from Negratin's reserves to Almeria until May, with the transfer having being ceased last August.



## Pest course held for almond tree farmers

THE Agrarian Regional Office of Alto Almanzora, based in Albox, hosted a 15-hour course on pest and disease management in Albox last week

The 15-hour course, known as Integrated Pest Management in Almond Trees, covered diseases likely to infect the trees, as well as prevention and control methods.







IF you are concerned about the quality of fruit available due to the various treatments that they are given to grow, store and transport to just look good for selling, but which often taste way short of how fresh fruit off the tree tastes, then you might consider growing your own.

Normally we think that fruit trees will grow too big for the space we may have available, but fruit trees actually produce bigger and better fruit on trees that are well pruned to keep them small.


Knowing that you can have fruit on trees that you can keep to less than two metres tall and around a metre wide can allow you to find a space even in a container on a balcony or terrace.

The secret to robust, large fruit is in the pruning and thinning. I recently visited a local orchardist who specialises in growing peach trees that he takes directly to sell in the markets

He showed me how over 20 years he had refined the best way to have the best quality fruit was to prune the trees hard, to allow plenty of open space between branches in winter, and to remove over half the fruits forming in spring to have space between the immature developing fruit.

This gives less quantity but

greater quality, something that the home gardener usually prefers. His trees were less than two metres tall so he could hand pick them without damage to the fruit or himself and the tree was easily accessible with the wide spacing between branches to access all the fruit.

In gardening circles this method is called forcing. Prun-

ing and thinning forces the plants to produce flowers and fruits that are larger and healthier.

The reduced number of produce get the benefit of the

whole plant's root system, powered by more efficient exposure of sunlight to the remaining leaves and fruits due to the thinning out, and shortening of branches.

The technique can be used in the domestic garden to have fruit trees in small spaces, with quality fruit that can be picked fresh when ripe knowing that it has not been subjected to any chemical treatments.

You can choose your favourite fruit that will grow in a Mediterranean climate, if you only have space for one, or have as many types as your space and time allows.

If you have existing trees that you want better fruit from you can use forcing by removing every second fruit

> or even two of every three, depending on the quantity over quality that you want.

I remove two-thirds of my loquat tree's fruits to promote the largest fruits, as the trees are normally too abundant in quantity and the edible part of the loquat is small if not forced to become more enlarged.

Pruning to maintain a small tree requires shortening the leading branch, forming an open structure of branching from the trunk, removing branches too close to each other and shortening the side branches to the desired length.



## Flea prevention time



FLEAS are ugly, nasty parasites that are one of the most difficult critters to get rid of. Which is why, prevention, all year long, is necessary.

Fleas are about ¼-inch long, are black/brown in colour, have no wings but do have long hind legs, which they use for jumping from one host to another. Fleas require a host - your cat or dog - in order to survive, as they live off their blood.

Fleas particularly like living in grass, which is where your pet will most likely be exposed

#### **Outdoor prevention**

Because fleas burrow deep into the grass, as well as under branches, leaves and soil, one of the most effective ways to prevent fleas from hopping onto your pet is to keep your lawn well groomed.

It is also important to rake the leaves as flea larvae don't like light. Watering your lawn on a regular basis may also help keep fleas from residing there.

Another line of defence is topical medications, the best of which are available through vour veterinarian.

#### Cleaning

Regular house cleaning, such

as vacuuming weekly and regularly washing your pet's bedding, will go a long way toward preventing fleas.

#### **Infestation control**

If your dog is uncontrollably scratching itself: to determine if the cause is in fact fleas, do a couple of things. Look under your dog's fur for dark specs. Those black bits are flea dirt, they are actually flea faeces. Pick them off the pet and place them onto a wet paper towel. If the specs morph into something that resembles a bloodstain, then your pet has fleas.

Flea dirt is a lot easier to spot on lighter coloured pets. On darker coloured pets, comb through their fur with a flea comb, its bristles are very close together and it will pull out any flea dirt

#### Now what?

It is impossible to know how long the fleas have been living off your pet, so it is also impossible to locate all the areas within the house where the fleas may be living. Not only do you have to treat your pet, but you also have to treat your entire house.




