On the run

Prisoner escapes on way to hospital

An inmate from the Sangonera La Verde Prison became the subject of a police search after reportedly fleeing from custody while being taken for hospital treatment.

The prisoner, convicted of drug offences, escaped shortly before being taken into the Emergency Department of the Virgen de la Arrixaca hospital in Murcia at around 2pm last Saturday.

Police said a search operation had been active since then but refused to provide further details, according to

The inmate, who reportedly has a lengthy criminal record, told prison workers he felt a pain in his foot before the transfer.

Arrangements were made to take him from the prison to hospital which is around

two kilometres away due to there being no x-ray equipment there.

The prisoner ran out of the vehicle that took him for treatment and hit one of his guards before reportedly getting into a waiting car which drove off.

It has not been possible to

establish whether the inmate was able to contact someone before the transfer to arrange an escape plan, according to reports.

The Guardia Civil said neither of the two officers who guarded the prisoner were seriously injured by him during the incident. The escape marks the first from prisons in Murcia for at least 10 years.

The police added the reason for the inmate being transported to the hospital without handcuffs or shack-

les was still to be confirmed. It was a decision that would have been taken by prison authorities, they said.

The news comes after a union representing prison workers criticised the running of the institutions, which they said were under-

The ACAIP union made the claim following the death of a prisoner who allegedly killed himself after taking a mixture of drink and drugs. The cause of death is yet to be confirmed.

Car blaze

FIREFIGHTERS were called to the A-30 motorway to put out a burning vehicle which reportedly set on fire after its engine overheated, with the Guardia Civil confirming that no one had been injured.

Stubbed out

SIX people have been arrested in Alicante as part of an operation that has seen more than 120 people arrested across the country on suspicion of tobacco smuggling.

In the second phase of the operation known as 'Pacote.' which has lasted over a year, Guardia Civil officers have reportedly analysed more than 172,000 computer files and 3,000 different shipments in order to extract enough evidence to enable these arrests.

Those arrested are believed to form part of a criminal organisation that would allegedly use courier companies and rental vans to smuggle tobacco throughout Europe in order to bypass

A total of 124 people have been arrested as a result in provinces including: Albacete, Alicante, Almeria, Badajoz, Barcelona, Cádiz, Castellón, Ciudad Real, Córdoba, Huelva, Jaén, La Coruña, León, Madrid, Málaga, Murcia, Navarra, Pontevedra, Seville, Tarragona, Toledo and Valencia.

Jail rap for sex abuser

A MAN in Torrevieja has been sentenced to four years in prison after pleading guilty to abusing his 10-year-old daughter.

According to reports, the case dates back to 2011. when the girl, along with her two siblings was living with her father following the separation of her par-

And it was reportedly during this time that the man would sexually abused his then 10-year-old daughter on several occasions.

The Public Prosecutor's Office had initially asked for a six-year sentence but an agreement was reached to reduce the man's sentence to four years as he

had pleaded guilty to the

As a result of the plea, the man has also been given a restraining order against his daughter for 14 years.

Wall of smoke

Huge fire rips through factory

THE Moval pallet factory in La Molina has been left decimated after a huge fire ripped through the building on Saturday.

Several firefighters were called to the scene on Calle La Hoya late on Saturday night to tackle the huge blaze after a security guard at the factory had warned of the outbreak of a fire.

The factory, which housed wooden pallets, became engulfed in flames as firefighters initially struggled to control the fire.

Those on the scene reportedly worked throughout the night and some of the morning to control the blaze, which is believed to have left half of the building in ashes and burned through several company vehicles.

No one was reported injured as a result of the fire while the surrounding area is also believed to have been left unaffected.

Investigations are currently underway to determine the cause of the fire and sources have reportedly confirmed to Spanish media that the rest of the factory will now be demolished due to structural damage caused by the fire.

Police guns criticism

OPPOSITION parties have criticised the National Police in Murcia after officers armed with sub-machine guns were deployed in the Santiago El Mayor area while children made their way to school. Government Delegate Francisco Bernabe said they were there due to the high terror alert level.

Crime plan

CARTAGENA councillor Cesar Pion has sent a letter to Sergio Londoño Zurek, the city's mayor, proposing initiatives to reduce crime locally. The document calls for the strengthening of social inclusion and oversight over vouth and family intervention programmes to stop rising crime, Councillor Pion said.

Job figures

THE number of those in work in Murcia has reached its highest level since late 2008, according to Spain's National Institute of Statistics (INS). Figures showed there were around 586,400 people with a job in the province, 81,700 more than at the low point of 2013.

Car fire

FIREFIGHTERS were called to a burning car after the driver noticed smoke coming from the engine and pulled over on the Avenida Doctor Gregorio Marañon in Torrevieja. Emergency services covered spilled fuel on the road with foam before putting out the fire on Thursday.

Bullying drive

MORE than 100 schools in 46 different urban areas in Alicante and Albecete are set to take part in an anti-bullying campaign. The campaign was organised by Oscar Sanchez, a Local Police officer from Elche, who has reportedly spoken to around 16,000 students to date.



SPRING has sprung, but the winter chill lingers on.

Much of Spain has spent the week in the grip of a deep Siberian cold front that brought blizzards, strong winds and giant waves.

The north and centre of the country was badly affected by snow, with almost 200 stretches of road closed and schools shut down in Galicia, Cantabria, Asturias, Castilla y Leon, Castilla-La Mancha and Cataluña.

Meanwhile a second storm battered southern Spain, with fivemetre waves and gale-force winds lashing Andalucia and the Balearic Islands.

A motorist was killed in Jaen Province before a Guardia Civil officer lost his life after being swept away by flood waters while rescuing three people in Guillena, Sevilla.

The Arctic blast saw tempera-

tures plummet, with the mercury in some regions plunging to between 10-15°C below average for the time of year.

And the freezing snap came as the country said an official goodbye to winter on Tuesday, the first day of spring.

Falling on the vernal equinox, the date on which day and night both last for around 12 hours, it usually takes place on March 19, 20 or 21.

On the wing

IT is one of Europe's greatest natural spectacles.

And the annual spring migration of millions of birds from their wintering grounds in sub-Saharan Africa across the Strait of Gibraltar to breed in Europe is in full swing.

With just 14 kilometres separating the two continents at the Strait, the area serves up ideal conditions for huge numbers of large soaring species from storks to raptors including eagles, kites, and vultures

This is because they are not strong flyers, and rely on thermals - the columns of rising air that form above the land as it warms in the sun - to travel.

But thermals do not form over water, meaning the birds have to use the narrowest hop possible. rising as high as possible in Morocco before glid-

Spread over several months, peak numbers are observed from March to May, and on a good day it is possible to see literally thousands of birds of prey, storks and smaller birds make the crossing.

Although some stay in Spain, many continue on

their epic journeys to northern Europe, Greenland or Russia, having already crossed the Sahara, the world's largest desert, with some racking up more than 5,000 kilometres.

But there is concern that the migration is in danger, with the numbers of birds returning to their breeding grounds plummeting in recent years, with some species in danger of disappearing com-

Threats from hunting to illegal poisoning, power lines, wind farms and draining of wetlands have had a devastating effect on populations, which are thought to have halved to 2.1 billion since the 1950s.

Yet it is still a not-to-be-missed extravaganza for nature buffs.

There are a number of dedicated migration watchpoints along the coast between Gibraltar and the kite surfing mecca of Tarifa, Cadiz, and the website c/ is a good source of information should you wish to take your seat for one of the greatest shows on earth.

Local residents have also previously taken issue with a decision to open the bridge

before it is finished. They said people with reduced mobility would not be able to climb it.

Adif, the railway infrastructure body overseeing the works, said they hoped the crossing would open by late this year.

They added they were aiming to install both a level and 'catwalk' crossing at the site and have the two running simultaneously until pedestrians got used to the latter.

NGOs must boost employees' rights

THE revelations about charity employees' wages in Spain are nothing short of a disgrace.

Full-time workers for giant non-profit organisations (NGOs) including the Red Cross, the country's biggest, can earn less than €800 per month gross, while managers bring home €3,500 plus.

The third sector rakes in € 14 billion annually, representing 1.5 per cent of Spain's gross domestic product.

So why can it not afford to pay its staff a decent wage?

NGOs are by definition supposed to balance investments against revenue, but the behaviour of some suggests they are becoming ever more corporate.

And in a sector which aims to tug at the heart strings as it appeals for donations, there is an irony in the fact that many of its employees are victims of the same human rights issues they are battling to overturn elsewhere.

One anonymous staff member told Spanish media: "One major conflict is that many organisations fight for human rights, including employment rights, and there's a perverse logic at work in which they compete to bring down costs to win contracts that the government has outsourced to the detriment of salaries."

This smacks of a worryingly institutionalised corporate approach by charity bosses in Spain, and suggests that NGOs may to an extent perpetuate the problems they were set up to solve.

Rajoy visits Murcia for PP conference

THE Spanish Prime Minister was in Murcia to close the 17th Congress of the Partido Popular (PP) in the region of Murcia last Sunday.

Mariano Rajoy addressed delegates at the conference who were there to discuss the party's platform and strategy for the region.

He told those in attendance that the PP had put the general interest of Spain first when making tough decisions and that the party was 'focused, open and responsible.'

"We are the original party of the Spanish centre-right. We have our record to present to the Spanish people, an accredited trajectory of seriousness, efficiency, solvency and responsible management," Rajoy said.

He added the PP government offered safe pensions in contrast to what he described as false promises from opposition parties.

"The only thing that can put pensions at risk is a return to the erroneous policies that Spain lived under in the years prior to our arrival in government.

"Spain cannot afford to return to policies of economic recession, neg-

ative growth, unemployment and the collapse of public accounts," he

The Prime Minister also highlighted a planned increase in the inter-professional minimum wage. He said the wage, which applies to people on lower incomes, would rise by 4, 5 and 10 per cent in 2018, 2019 and 2020 respectively.

He added an increase in the salaries for public officials would be included in the 2018 budget.

Rajov also addressed issues relating to water and reforms to the system of financing Spain's Autonomous Communities. He said the PP wanted to work with the opposition Partido Socialista (PSOE) to resolve the issues.

"It will be better for everyone in Spain if they are able to get along with the government in matters that affect the Spanish," he said.

The Prime Minister also spoke about the recent debate surrounding permanent prison sentences. The PP

recently lost a vote in the Spanish Parliament to increase the number of crimes the measure applies to.

Rajoy said other political parties should have 'sensitivity' about the issue and that they should be prepared to listen to people who supported the sentences.

"Do not say the victims ask for revenge, because it is a lie and that is an insult to them. What they are asking is for no one to suffer pain like they have suffered," he said.

Diego Conesa, the general secretary of the PSOE in Murcia, said the government had not taken the issue of pensions seriously. He added the PP had broken the Toledo pact between the two parties on the matter.

"You cannot send a letter to pensioners in this country saying that their pensions will rise by €1. They will think that more money was spent on the letter than the increase,"

Francisco Lucas, the deputy general secretary of the PSOE in the region, said the PP's conference was a 'crude' attempt at democracy.

"It is a clear example of the lack of democracy in the PP. It was a pantomime," he said.

Council agrees €629,000

WORKS for the second project of 'Murcia river,' a new green route between Calle Gaspar de la Peña and the Segura river, will begin after the spring festival.

A sum of €629,000 has been allocated by Murcia Council in order for the restoration work to be carried out by the UTE Eneas Servicios Integrales.

The objective is to remodel the landscape of the area with fruit trees, palm trees, horticultural gardens and recreational areas.

Some regions more equal than others

A RECENT report has found that Murcia is among the autonomous communities with the least social mobility, along with Madrid, Andalucia and Cataluña.

The study, entitled: 'Educational Equity in Spain' by the Ramon Areces Foundation, also reveals that Galicia, Castile, Leon and the Basque Country are the regions in which the socioeconomic status of the student has the least influence on their performance.

These areas even rank above the OECD average of countries like Norway. Canada and Finland.

The findings are based on information provided by the latest Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) report of the OECD, in which all autonomous communities took part for the first time (28,864 students aged 15).

Researchers used the three competences of international criteria, Language, Mathematics and Science for the study.

"An equitable educational system guarantees that academic performance is determined by effort and capability regardless of students' social and economic background," say the report's authors.

It was acknowledged that more information would be needed to establish why some regions are falling behind in the assessment.



'Water pact' agreed for Alicante Province

POLITICAL parties in the Diputacion de Alicante have agreed a province-wide water pact with public universities, irrigators and suppliers

The provincial water pact, agreed last Friday, is designed to address issues relating to the supply of water in the Alicante area. The Esquerra Unidedel-Pais Valencia (EUPV) party was the only political group that did not back the pact.

Joaquin Melgarejo, the president of the water pact commission, said the issue of water was a funda-

"This is an extraordinary agreement. For the first time in Spain in a province like ours, which has a structural water deficit, all political parties have

reached a consensus with irrigators, suppliers and technicians," he said.

The pact covers issues such as water infrastructure, deficits, treatment, reuse, management and sustainability. It will now be sent to the Diputacion's Technical Water Commission before going to the province's Water Board for approval.

Raquel Perez, the EUPV's deputy in the Diputacion, said the agreement incorrectly identified the cause of water shortages which she claimed was 'dire' management.

"There is an excess demand for water that has occurred with the PP's consent and the permission of the Segura Hydrographic confederation," she said.

Tree bacteria campaign launched



CONTAINMENT: Citrus and olive trees in Murcia are believed to be under threat from Xyella.

MURCIA'S Agriculture Ministry has begun efforts to target the spread of the Xylella disease in the region's trees, which has included meeting with farmers to demonstrate containment methods.

The purpose of the campaign is to improve prevention, detection and control of the bacteria, which causes trees' fruit to decay and their leaves to dry out, among other problems.

The programme follows the

uprooting of hundreds of trees in Spain and elsewhere following the outbreak and spread of the disease, known as evola in olive trees.

Francisco Gonzalez, the general director of agriculture, livestock, fisheries and aquaculture in Murcia, said the region was joining with others in Spain and Portugal to combat the spread of bacteria.

"If Xylella spreads through a certain area one of the key points for managing it is related to how the disease is transmitted between plants.

"This is being verified in Europe and from our experience in the USA and South America," he said.

The campaign is set to start this spring and last until autumn. It will reportedly see farming authorities in the region sample five citrus farms.

Citrus farms are an important part of Murcia's economy and cover more than 37.847 hectares of land.

Big cats rescued from 'filthy' circus

THE heartbreaking moment that two lions and a tiger were freed from squalid circus cages in Spain was captured on video recently.


The starving animals were covered in bruises and sores and living in wretched conditions with floors covered in excrement.

Their claws had been removed, some had broken teeth and one of the lions had chewed part of its own tail off due to stress

The emaciated cats were collected from the Circus Francia also known as Circus Paris - in Murcia by specialists from the APP Primadomus (APP) exotic animal rescue in Villena, Alicante. It comes after months of negotiations between officials from the circus, local authorities and animal rights groups. with lawyer Raquel Lopez from the DeAnimals law firm acting as mediator.

The circus becomes the third in Spain to offload its live animals, with a pony and a bull among others rehomed.

Pablo Delgado, a big cat expert from APP, said that the 'terrible conditions in which the animals, especially the lions, were kept is unfortunately typical in circus rescues.

"They were living in tiny cages, facilities without the legal requirements for a zoo, in the hands of people without the knowledge or proper means to take care of them.'

A video uploaded by his team shows the animals being sedated ahead of their journey to the centre to begin their reha-

Man held over bank hacks

A 40-YEAR-OLD accused of being part of a network that stole hundreds of millions of dollars from banks in Russia, the USA and elsewhere has been arrested.

The Ukrainian citizen was picked up by National Police in Alicante City following an investigation into the hacking group. Police allege he was involved in fraud, money laundering and organised crime.

Authorities said little was known about the scope of the network but they have not ruled out allowing the suspect to be extradited to face trial elsewhere.

Police, including officers from the FBI, Russia and Europol, raided the suspect's apartment in the Playa de San Juan area of Alicante and arrested him on March 6. They also seized several computer files during the search.

Officers reportedly found the suspect to be in possession of several million bitcoins, with one unit of the currency currently worth around €6,877.

Investigators accused the suspect of buying the digital currency with money stolen from cash machines around the world by using a 'Trojan' computer virus.

Trojan viruses are designed to appear to a computer as legitimate software and are used by hackers to gain access to systems by fooling their security.

Other members of the group would collect the money from the machines in exchange for a commission, according to reports.

Police have not disclosed any further details about the functioning of the group due to the investigation being ongoing.

The suspect appeared before the National Court in Madrid which has remanded him in custody. The investigation continues.



EU report unmasks free trade pirates

by Tom Woods

A REPORT from the EU's Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO) based in Alicante Province has warned of a link between free trade zones and the export of counterfeit products.

In collaboration with the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), officials believe that free trade zones are boosting the value of illegal exports by 5.9 per cent.

The worrying findings follow on from a joint study in 2016 by the EUIPO and OECD which estimated that the value of counterfeit products account for 2.5 per cent of world trade, with an annual turnover of €338 million.

In the European Union, such illegal goods make up 5 per cent of all imports, worth up to €85 million.

There are more than 3,500 free trade zones in the world, employing 66 million people and generating more than €365 million in rev-

These zones offer companies real benefits based on geographical location, specialised infrastructure, and lighter regulations.

However, due to reduced customs controls and the lax regulations, they also attract those looking to capitalise for criminal and illicit ends.

Using data from international customs seizures, the report reveals that the stronger the role that a free trade zone plays in a country's economy, the greater the value of the counterfeit products that the country exports.

Evidence suggests that trade routes from transit points in Albania, Egypt, Morocco and Ukraine are particularly involved in fake products.

Executive Director of EU-IPO, Antonio Campinos,

"This report takes the analysis of pirated products a step further and we hope that the findings will support governments and legislators in addressing the economic damage they cause around the world."

The Alicante-centred EU-IPO is a decentralised agency of the EU, responsible for managing the registration of EU trademarks (MUE) and Registered Community Designs (DMC) for the 28 member states.

EUIPO hosts the European Observatory on the Infringements of Intellectual Property Rights, and organises the DesignEuropa








Boom time

10m passengers in two months

NEWLY-RELEASED Spanish government data has shown that international airline passenger numbers to Spain have soared during the first two months of 2018.

Statistics show that 9.98 million international passengers have arrived in the country by plane, a 5.9 per cent increase on the same period last year. Low-cost airline passenger numbers have particularly taken off with 5.21 million

passengers arriving in Spain in January and February - up 12.7 per cent on 2017.

The low-cost companies took 52.2 per cent of the market.

In contrast, 'traditional' airlines carried 4.7 million passengers, down 0.6 per cent.

Among the low-cost airlines Ryanair, easyJet and Vueling continue to lead the field and between them carried 67.6 per cent of 'low cost' market and 35.6 per cent of the total mar-

The United Kingdom, with 1.5 million passengers (28.8 per cent of the total), was ahead of the pack despite a drop of 1.1 per cent in arrivals with the low-cost carriers.

Germany, with 13.3 per cent of the arrivals, showed an increase of 695,036 passengers (43.2 per cent more) and Italy with 683,997 low-cost flyers sent 13.2 per cent more.

Friends have paid tribute to him via Facebook, with Melia colleague Maja Jaroszewska writing:

"Words can't describe how heartbroken

we feel to have lost you so soon and so unexpected. You are forever in our hearts. We will remember you, doing your amazing dance moves and winning dance offs with strangers.

"Thank you for being in my life."

A Foreign Office official told UK media: "We are in touch with local police and are providing bereavement advice to his family, following the death of a British man in Mallorca.'

Holiday sickness fury

Scammers face £15,000 for fake claim

A COUPLE from Liverpool has been ordered to pay a holiday company's costs after submitting a fraudulent sickness claim following a 10-day all-inclusive holiday in Spain.

Chelsea Devine, 21, and Jamie Melling, 22, were seeking £2,500 compensation each after claiming that the food and drink at their Benidorm hotel on the Costa Blanca left them ill for weeks afterwards.

But the judge at Liverpool County Court heard that the pair posted photographs on social media showing them smiling and happy in their hotel room and swimming in the pool.

She ordered them to pay holiday operator Tui £15,000 in costs - a record amount for costs awarded against a fraudulent claim of holiday sickness.

Holiday operator Tui said, "It's disappointing we have had to go this far to defend our industry and hotel partners, as well as protect honest holidaymakers.

"The court has found they brought claims that are fundamentally dishonest and have been ordered to pay our costs.

"This goes to highlight the penalty you can face if you bring an exaggerated or fraudulent holiday sickness claim."

The doctor who backed the couple's case has been referred to the General Medical Council after it emerged he is married to a partner at the legal firm representing them.

The law firm has also been referred to the Solicitors Regulation Authority.

Travel association ABTA is calling on the government to bring in new measures to

tackle sickness claims ahead of the 2018 holiday season.

They claim figures from a YouGov survey of British adults reveal almost one in five people (19 per cent) have been contacted about making a compensation claim for holiday sickness.

The most common way people said they were approached was over the phone (14 per cent), followed by text (7 per cent) and email (7 per cent). Some people also reported being contacted on social media (3 per cent) and some were approached in person (2 per cent) including in airports or while on holiday.

ABTA's 'Stop Sickness Scams' campaign highlights that false claims are costing the travel industry tens of millions of pounds and ABTA is calling for the urgent closure of a loophole in the law, which enables claims management companies and legal firms to make more money in fees from sickness claims abroad, than they're able to from personal injuries in the UK.

They remind the public that making a false compensation claim for holiday sickness is an act of fraud and if prosecuted could result in a large fine, criminal record or jail term of up to three years.

Since 2013, there has been a 500 per cent rise in the number of compensation claims received by travel companies for holiday sickness - yet the number of sickness reports to hotels in resorts has remained the same.

The problem is only associated with UK holidaymakers - travel firms in other countries have not experienced an increase.

Fernando Valverde, the secretary of the guild, said those behind the site found out all the words in Fariña were in Don Ouixote in some form.

Those who made the site just had to

the same order as the book and displaying it so people could read it.

"It's a metaphor for the fact that in the digital era you can seize a book, but you cannot gag words," he said.

Bea Gondar brought the case to the court because the book alleges he was involved in the unloading and shipment of cocaine. It also alleged he took part in negotiations between the Columbian Cali cartel and local smug-

"It's all completely false," Bea Gondar said in an interview on the La Sexta television channel.

The former mayor was investigated and convicted of drug smuggling. His sentence was subsequently overturned by the Spanish Supreme Court after an appeal, which is stated in the newest

They are looking for a main sponsor to feature on all five charts, and receive prominence. Could you be that sponsor?





Destination Mars

■ VLADIMIR PUTIN has said Russia will launch a mission to Mars next year in an interview broadcast shortly before the March 18 presidential election. The President said in the discussion a landing near the planet's poles would be attempted with a view to conducting further research from there.

Raining gold

AROUND 172 bars of gold and other precious metals were left strewn across an airport runway after the door of a cargo plane opened during takeoff. An estimated 3.4 tonnes of gold, worth around 21.6 billion rubles (€300 million), fell from the AN-12 cargo plane.

Ryanair lands new airline

RYANAIR has agreed to buy a maiority stake in a new Austrian airline founded by former motor racing champion Niki Lauda.

Europe's largest budget carrier will buy an initial 24.9 per cent stake in Laudamotion, which recently regained control of airline Niki from insolvent former owner Air

This will rise to 75 per cent 'as soon as possible,' subject to European Union approval, the carriers said in a statement, with Ryanair set to pay a total of around €50 million.

It is the Irish low cost giant's first acquisition since it bought UK airline Buzz from KLM in 2003, closing it down a year later.

It has since tried to take over Aer Lingus and last year pulled out of an auction for Air Berlin last year amid claims that it was rigged in favour of German rival Lufthansa.

Lauda will become chairman of Laudamotion and oversee the company's rebuilding, while Ryanair will provide six crewed aircraft this summer to increase its fleet to 21

planes, with further expansion to 30 jets planned within three years.

Ryanair has reportedly beaten off competition from Lufthansa and British Airways parent IAG to secure the deal, which will see it launch a major push on the German and Austrian markets.

Ryanair CEO Michael O'Leary said in a statement: "This Laudamotion partnership is good news for Austrian and German consumers/ visitors who can now look forward to real competition, more choice and lower fares."

€18.8bn deal ends toll war

A POTENTIAL bidding war for Spain's biggest toll road operator has been averted.

It comes after Madrid-based construction firm ACS and Italian company Atlantia - which had been competing separately for months - agreed a joint takeover deal for the Abertis

Under the agreed terms, ACS's German arm Hochtief will buy Abertis for €18.18 billion.

But in the final holding, the Italians will own 50 per cent, ACS 30 per cent and Hochtief 20

Former owners, Catalan architect Norman Cinnamond and his sister Rosy, confirmed the sale with the price dropped from € 24 million after three vears on the market.

The island - which is almost three kilometres long and 800 metres wide - had been owned by the Cinnamond family since 1932.

It boasts a 13-bedroom house, chapel and watchtower, can be reached by foot from Formentera when the tide is low and is part of the protected Las Salinas Natural

€14.8bn fraud windfall

'TRIVIAL' DROP AS TAX DODGERS TACKLED

THE battle against fraud in Spain continues.

And the national Tax Agency has revealed that last year it raked in almost €14.8 billion - a year-on-year decrease of €91 million - in sanctions from cases relating to illegal renting of homes and other fi-

The total has plunged for the third consecutive year, after the bureau revealed that it made \in 14.9 billion in 2016 and \in 15.7 billion in 2015.

Agency director Santiago Menendez argued that the average income from fraud over the last three years beats that of the previous three by 3.5 per cent, as he said: "The results consolidate the upward trend in recent years... it is a trivial drop with no significant reason."

And the figures still far outstrip the €8 billion earned in 2008, when the Tax Agency employed 2,000 more people and the housing bubble having yet to burst - fuelled a significant 'underground economy.'

Fines for undeclared rental income shot up to €522 million in 2017, an increase of around 40.5 per cent on 2014, when the agency launched an annual campaign of sending inspectors to suspects'

Among 32,215 visits made by tax inspectors last year, 14,698 were related to non-payment of IVA, the Spanish equivalent to VAT in the

Menendez added that the use of new technology capable of processing big data has allowed investigators to acquire almost €333 million from cases including "aggressive tax planning, 'hidden' companies, buying powers that did not match what was declared and assets abroad."

He explained that thanks to Spain's tax amnesty (a disclosure facility introduced in 2012), plus revelations exposed in the Panama

And the result is that tax debt fell by the greatest amount yet recorded in a single financial year.

Pending collection, the outstanding amount plummeted by 7.6 per cent compared with 2016, with the total of €42.4 billion the lowest since 2010

The annual inventory of defaulters owing more than €1 million to the state, introduced by Treasury Minister Cristobal Montoro in 2015, also contributed heavily to debt reduction, with € 1.2 billion raised from taxpayers "afraid to appear on the list," according to

Abu Dhabi set to invite bids for Spanish oil and gas giant

THE United Arab Emirates is seeking to offload part of Spanish oil and gas multinational CEPSA.

It comes after the Mubadala Investment Company, Abu Dhabi's stateowned holding firm, bought out French oil giant Total's stake in 2011.

The move saw the investment vehicle seal 100 per cent control of Spain's second-largest petrol company, which was at the time valued at around €8 billion.

But reports suggest that it is now worth much more. leading Mubadala to invite bids for a partial stake from a 'strategic ally' or 'major investment fund.'

Cepsa has been on an upswing since the takeover, breaking new ground in exploration and production, with several 'mega projects' in Asia and the Mid-

UNION FURY OVER BELOW AVERAGE PAY Charity wage woe goes on

THE working conditions of charity workers in Spain are under scruti-

Non-governmental organisations (NGOs) employ around 645,000 across the country, but both central and regional governments slashed third sector budgets during the 2008 financial crisis.

The move saw many of Spain's 30,000 NGOs freeze or reduce salaries, and conditions have not improved in the 10 years since.

"There is a latent instability." an administrator for several NGOs told Spanish media. "It's a sector that has been damaged and which requires a certain element of volunteering and a huge dose of personal motivation, which is exploited when it comes to unstable contracts and unpaid overtime.

"One major conflict is that many organisations fight for human rights, including employment rights, and there's a perverse logic at work in which they compete to bring down costs to win contracts

that the government has outsourced to the detriment of salaries."

Around 34 per cent of NGO contracts are temporary, and employment reforms introduced by the Spanish government in 2012 mean that companies and not-for-profits are able to ignore national labour

agreements and bring down salaries while maintaining invest-

In Teruel, Aragon, a full-time cleaner employed by the Red Cross now earns €765 gross per month in the wake of a 2.5 per cent January increase following a long

freeze on wages, while in Alicante part-time telemarketing staff can earn as little as €500.

Jose Luis Pascual, Red Cross Spain's Human Resources director, said: "We're not inventing low salaries, it's a fact. Should that be changed? Possibly."

When quizzed if €800 per month is enough to live on, he hesitated before admitting: "It would be very hard to cover everything... I don't agree that we ignore employment rights. In many cases, our salaries are better than others in the sector."

Critics, including unions, have panned Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and the regional authorities after spending on social issues was cut by 23 per cent since 2016 despite the national economic upturn.

Pilar Marmol, from the UGT union, added: "Many NGOs don't behave like NGOs; they're all about business. And when there's an [outsourced] tender, they're like vultures. They go as low as they can."

Cashing in on crowdfunding

A SPANISH provincial council has become the first authority in the world to set up its own crowdfunding platform.

The innovative scheme allows residents of Biscay in the Basque Country to invest in start-up projects chosen by the governing

According to venture capital think tank, Seed Capital Bizkaia, the move will boost investor confidence and reduce risk.

The goal is to launch eight start-ups - cherrypicked from around 30 applicants - in the first year of the scheme, with the council hoping to attract some 350 investors after agreeing to plough €240,000 into the project itself.

Businesses must be headquartered in Biscay, of which Spain's 10th largest city Bilbao is capital.

MEPs condemn Trump olive tax

THE European Parliament has called on the United States to reverse President Trump's move to impose import duties of up to 20 per cent on Spanish olives.

The tariffs were introduced in January to protect producers in California after Washington said that growers in Spain benefit from subsidies allowing them to sell olives below fair

"The US has started a trade war and they have used us as scapegoats," said Gabriel Redondo, chairman of exporter Agro Sevilla, at the time.

And MEPs in Strasbourg have hit back at the levies, claiming that the EU agricultural grants follow World

"The European Parliament calls on the US authorities to withdraw their interim decision and re-establish a mutually constructive approach in this domain to the mutual benefit of producers and consumers on both continents," they said in a

Spain exported 32 million kilos of black olives worth €70 million to the US in 2016, but says the new tariffs will cost the sector € 350-700 million over the next decade.

Thumbs down for €4.9 billion Hammerson takeover bid

A € 4.9 BILLION bid for British shopping centre operator Hammerson sent the company's shares soaring by almost 27 per

French firm Kleppierre was behind the offer, which is being seen as an attempt to derail its competitor's €3.9 billion takeover of Intu Properties, which owns or has stakes in 17 shopping centres in the UK and three in Spain.

The deal is set to create the UK's biggest property group, worth an estimated €24

Klepierre said in a statement that it had offered 615p a share, but the bid was rejected by Hammerson chairman David Tyler within 24 hours. Tyler described the approach as "wholly inadequate and entirely

opportunistic," before advising shareholders to take no action.

He said in a statement that the board "sees absolutely no merit in Klépierre's proposal and has unanimously rejected it."

Klepierre is one of Europe's biggest players in the retail market, with more than 100 shopping centres in 16 countries.

The Hammerson takeover bid highlights the pressure currently gripping the sector, as more customers choose to shop online.

Hammerson owns or part-owns 37 shopping centres, including Birmingham's Bullring, and if the Insu deal goes ahead it will gain control of a €650 million scheme to create one of Spain's largest shopping complexes in Torremolinos on the Costa del

Terence Kennedy's listening life changed forever when he discovered the joy of podcasts.

IF you think silence is golden maybe give this week's column a miss. It's inspired by a Canadian lady who fills every unoccupied moment listening to podcasts, a hundred a week.

Mea not quite so culpa, I have to confess, and she's definitely the pod one out (sorry), but my own consumption does certainly max out at three or four a day.

My listening life changed radically when keeping my butterfly mind topped up during fallow periods suddenly meant I didn't have to put up with whatever dross was on the radio at the time, but instead a chosen programme I could actually control as my own DJ.

'Women's Hour' discussing hysterectomies might have been all well and good mid-morning when there was nothing else on, but podcasts meant I could now listen on demand to Melvyn Bragg discussing the finer points of three-toed newts or quantity

surveying. And I could hit the pause button so as not to miss a riveting second of it.

Initially we could tape radio programmes directly off-air onto cassettes. The techno breakthrough came with the iPod 17 years ago, then MP3 players and today there are two-thirds as many smartphones in the world as there are people.

Now four billion podcasts are downloaded each year and rising, with sensible users (unlike our Canadian lady or indeed me) spending an average of four hours a week listening to them.

In the western world, more people listen to podcasts than go to the movies. An American statistic John Lennon would have loved says there are more regular podcast listeners than Catholics.

pods straight off the web is the work of seconds to an MP3 player or increasingly now, a smartphone. And almost all will let you interrupt and pick up where you left off again at will, freeing you forever from the shackles of broadcast schedules.

There are hosts of apps for finding and playing podcasts. and for the latest pod experience. this year's 'next best thing' in tech, smart home assistants like Amazon's Echo and Google's Home can serve up unlimited podcasts on demand.

For the moment I'm stuck with downloading them straight off the web, as not all of us are (yet) blessed with a smart home assistant.

I was going to drop in a gag here about my wife fulfilling that role, but on reflection it could cost me

TYPE 'podcasts' into your browser and prepare to be

A good place to start is with the traditional broadcasters, who all now package their output into free podcasts for down-

The BBC is a great source (http://www.bbc.co.uk/podcasts), with simply hundreds free for the grabbing, all in the ubiquitous MP3 format which any player or phone can handle.

Other broadcasters like America's NPR (www.npr. org/podcasts/), or Australia's ABC (www.abc.net.au/radio/ podcasts/) have their own treasure-troves. Services like Apple's iTunes have pages and pages of them. If you 'subscribe' they will even be downloaded automatically to your player without human intervention

So all you have to do, as Shakespeare so famously said, is 'lend me your ears'. Perhaps adding headphones for domestic harmony.






I don't know what to make of BBC2's new show The Secret Helpers, BBC2 Wednesdays.

A letter from Cuba

AFTER a seven-hour transatlantic flight, your Canarian correspondent finds herself in Cuba. Were this the early 19th century, I'd have come on the weekly Canaries-Cuba sea route.

Incredibly, there were more boats to Cuba then than to mainland Spain. The Cuban sugar, tobacco and coffee industries, developed with African slave labour in the late 16th century, attracted massive Canarian emigration centuries later. Why stay on a feudal Canary Island as a Cacique's vassal when opportunities for making a living were within reach?

And Cuba, 6,000kms away, was within reach, as Venezuela was later when Cuba's attractions declined, because anything tossed into Canarian waters is 90 per cent sure to wash up in the Caribbean. The currents and winds take you there.

Canarian emigration to the Americas and the exportation, then re-importation of morphed versions of culture-particularly music- is why I'm here. After 30 years listening to what's popularly termed Salsa music, I'm investi-

gating its origins.

All Canarian fiestas feature this bounce between music from the Canaries and the Americas and Cuba's racial and cultural mix plays a key role in its creation.

If you've never been, well, go (unless you're a wuss). If you've been, you'll know Cuba is multi-faceted and often contradictory.

La Habana's a dirty, decrepit, port city full of ancient cars and crumbling

grandeur, with some of the best music you'll ever hear. One street, Calle Obispo, with all its bars and musicians, took me all day and alone merited the trip.

I left for Viñales, first stop on my metre-long bus itinerary print out. West of La Habana, it's rural, beautiful. Horses are transport. Riding the valley's a treat. Accommodation there, and everywhere, in 'casas particulares,' costs from €15 to €25. Eating

there disappoints less than eating out.

My see-it-all travel itinerary was typically masochistic. Cuba's a big island and I've bussed the 1,500km length of it, meeting nice, totally multiracial people, many with Canarian ancestors, hearing music everywhere.

I'm happily exhausted.

At Sancti Spiritus, bookseller Roberto Merino Martin - who has Canarian great grandparents - told me fascinating stories, surrounded by ancient books.

Later, in contrast, Brit reserve saved me from hysterics as 34 French people line-danced salsa behind their teacher in La Casa de La Trova (Cuban music holy of holies. Tourism strikes again).

Towards big, hot, noisy Santiago de Cuba, lush landscapes begin, the racial mix darkens and then... bang!

There's rubbish on the streets, a contaminated coastline, cheap street food, nice people, more percussion, heavy music and more hasslers. I escaped to a beach on Julio's moto-taxi. Refusing to leave me 'unprotected,' as his presence 'ensured' peace.

Some old European ladies seem flattered, it was a Cuban memory I'd happily ditch. Cubans are often beautiful and generally moneyless. Go figure.

Sixteenth century Baracoa the first town established by Spanish conquerors and my last stop. Here, my music quest ends, thanks to an invitation to see Grupo Folklorico Bararumba, whose brilliant dance/percussion narrative performance on Cuban musical evolution says it all.

The afternoon of Holy Wednesday, after the arrangement of the steps by the families, everything is transformed with its concentration around the Church, the reunion of friends and family with the phrase "there are more people than ever" and the Procession of The Passion of Christ that ends with the songs of the people to their "Sorrowful", so that at dawn give out to the Procession of the Transfer. Wednesday, 28 March.

We are on Good Friday and the "dianas" are awakened and the "Hugs" of the Nazarene arrive with the Virgin and the lunches ("cocas", "på torrat", beans, cod and garlic), after a rest, with great fervour, rigor and seriousness Witness or participate in the Procession of the Death of Christ, a whole concert of polyphony, eight choirs, after the different steps, four of them Benlliure. Friday, 30 March.

Procession of the Holy Burial of Christ for the night of Holy Saturday and blast of joy on Easter Sunday when the Virgin leaves her clothes in mourning and sounds the Hallelujah of G.F.Handel. Saturday, 31 March

The Golden Man of Malaga

PABLO PICASSO led Sotheby's London's Impressionist and Modern Art and Surrealist Art in February and last week the most popular Museum in London the Tate Modern opened Picasso's Golden Year exhibition which focused on his creations of 1932.

A year of two halves the first part dominated by his urgency to meet the deadline of his first major retrospective held in Paris in June 1932 at the Galeries George Petit.

The painting that crowned the Sotheby's sale Pablo Picasso's 'Femme au béret et à la robe quadrillée (Marie-Thérèse Walter)' achieved the second highest price for any work ever sold at auction in Europe - priced at €56.7m - as three bidders competed. This painting was created in 1937, the same year in whose final months saw his master work 'Guernica,' which happily may be seen by Spaniard and visitor alike at the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía in Madrid, regarded by most as the greatest anti-war statement in art.

In a decade of extraordinary significance many see echoes of the trajectory of that decade in the profuse and varied output of an

Picasso was an established artist, famous and wealthy. Tailored suits and chauffeur driven car attest to that as well as the Paris apartment and country chateau.

At a moment when some entertained the thought that Picasso was at his peak, perhaps even past it, he continued to search and discover. For an impoverished immigrant from Spain who would have blamed him for slowing and enjoying the fruits of his youth?

Also 1932 was the year that Picasso is considered to have reinvented himself. Here he can be seen to be exploring surrealist distortion, painting and sculpture. It also saw the start and development of his relationship with his muse Marie-Thérèse Walter, by 1935 his wife Olga Khokhlova had left him for the south of France.

The darkening clouds of war marked with the Spanish Civil War which began in 1935 and ended in 1939, with the rest of Europe engulfed in what came to be known as the Second World War months after its conclusion.

Picasso was a man of his times. As an artist his times cover much of the 20th century. The triumphs, anxieties and tragedies, the vast scope of his art continues to fascinate and attract. For a determined collector a fascination that very occasionally may be satisfied by an

Dairy: the good and the bad

You could also miss out on other essential nutrients such as calcium and vitamin D if you go dairy-free so eat lots of fatty fish, as well as plant-based milks, which are normally a good alternative source of the nutrients you need.







Mood food



GUT FEELING: Eating bread that's high in fibre could help boost your mood.

GUT health is fast becoming one of the biggest wellness trends of 2018, with new food products, diets and books being cultivated around the concept.

Looking after your gut basically means taking care of the ecosystem of funghi, veasts, bacteria and viruses which live in the intestinal tract.

Several reports claim that having a healthy gut helps to reduce chronic inflammation that can cause all manner of diseases, but could also have

a significant impact on our mood.

This is because the gut produces many hormones and transmitters that have an impact on the brain, such as serotonin which helps to regulate sleep, social behaviour and mood.

Blame it on the bubbly drink

THERE'S something about drinking a glass of Prosecco that can make you on top of the world.

Although you might have splashed a bit more on your drink of choice, there's something about bubbly alcoholic drinks that leave you feeling giddier than usual.

In fact, scientific research has confirmed that being 'Prosecco drunk' is a real thing.

An experiment which monitored a group of people who were all given the same Champagne to drink - but half were given it flat while the other half were given it still sparkling - found that the alcohol levels of those who were given the sparkling Champagne rose more quickly

than the alcohol levels of the group drink-

The bubbly Champagne drinkers had an average of 0.54 milligrams of alcohol per millilitre of blood after just five minutes, while the flat Champagne drinkers only had an average of 0.39 milligrams of alcohol.

This is believed to be because the bubbles found in sparkling alcoholic drinks help the stomach or intestine to absorb the alcohol more quickly into the bloodstream.

If you still want to drink Prosecco or Champagne but not become overly tipsy, try drinking from a shallow glass instead of a flute as the larger surface area allows the bubbles to disperse more quickly.

After having a fairly bleak period (when compared to his former popularity) during the 1990's, his album Supernatural released in 2000 saw Santana winning no less than nine



ish winemaker, brought several grape varieties back from the Bordeaux region where he trained to his Castile homeland, including Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, all of which are still used today together with Tempranillo and Malbec.

In the 20th century, Vega Sicilia - located in the Ribera del Duero DO in northern Spain earned a reputation as one of Spain's most notable wineries with its top bottles selling for an average of €300.

The name Vega Sicilia refers to the Catholic Saint Cecilia with no connection to the island

Many of Vega Sicilia's 250 acres are planted with old vines, some more than 100 years old, resulting in a low yield during harvest.

The wines are aged in barrel and bottle for many years and depending on vintage for decades before release.

For example, in 1991 the winery released the 1968 and 1982 vintages after 23 and nine

years ageing.

Vega Sicilia produces three cuvees:

Unico: This Gran Reserva is the signature wine released 10 - 15 years after vintage. Taken from some of the oldest vines it consists of Tempranillo (80 per cent) and Cabernet Sauvignon (20 per cent) and accounts for about a third of production.

Valbuena 5°: Aged for five years, it is composed mostly of Tempranillo, with Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon.

Vega Sicilia Unico Reserva Especial: A non-vintage blend of different Unicos, aged at least for 10 years; it can include grapes from vintages harvested more than 30 years apart and usually only available to private cus-

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Cyclists - know the law

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



IT is probably safe to say that all road users have witnessed a bicycle rider going through a red light or riding on the pavement, a practice that many find frustrating, but always one that raises the same question, are cyclists allowed to do such things?

The simple answer is NO.

In terms of law, once a bicycle is being ridden it is classed as a vehicle and therefore covered by the same rules and laws as a car, a truck, a bus, in fact any other vehicle on the road.

It is only when the rider dismounts and walks with the bicycle is it considered otherwise. In this instance, the situation means that the person has become a pedestrian.

That is the same reason why cyclists cannot ride across zebra crossings, because we wouldn't expect a truck to do that, and the rider must dismount before they do.

Listening to music using headphones or using a mobile phone when riding a bike are prohibited in the same way as they are for other vehicles. Consuming more than the prescribed limit of alcohol or using drugs is also not allowed, as a cyclist you are governed by the rules of the road. Just so you know what you are risking, let's have a look at some of the most common infractions.

Not having a bell on your bicycle - 80€ Faulty or no brakes - 80€

Carrying an extra person on the bicycle

Failing to stop at a traffic light - 200€ Failing to give way at a junction - 200€ Not having lights - 200€

Having too many lights - 200€

Failing to wear high visibility clothing between sunset and sunrise and in poor visibility

Riding under the influence of alcohol - 500€ There are many other laws and infractions commonly committed by cyclists, as well as other road users of course.

We will look at these in more detail in future editions, but for now, take note, you can indeed be fined on your bike and remember that one golden rule, when you are riding your bike, it is a vehicle and governed by the same rules and laws as every other vehicle.

Family caught in € 691 million raid

CUSTOMS officers have seized properties owned by President Assad's family worth €691 million, mainly located in Marbella and Paris.

The homes are believed to belong to the president's uncle, Rifaat Assad, and the haul represents a record year for French customs officials who have seized €862 million of criminal assets in 2017, up 477 per cent on the previous year.

Rifaat Assad's property empire includes 503 prop-

erties around Marbella, ranging from restaurants to parking spaces, with an estate valued of €50 million.

His whole portfolio in the city is estimated to be worth a staggering €600 million.

In France, police seized €91 million of property, including a 3,000 square metre mansion on the exclusive Avenue Foch in Paris and a 110-acre chateau just outside the capital.

The police operation has

been carried out by a Spanish-Franco taskforce, after Rifaat Assad, 80, was charged with laundering the proceeds of financial fraud and misusing public funds.

Prosecutors say his fortune derives from money plundered by the Syrian regime after his brother, Hafez (the president's father), came to power in 1971.

Rifaat Assad was a wellknown figure in Damascus but made enemies with his

brother after attempting to oust him in the 1980's, after which he fled to Europe.

Mr Assad denies any

wrongdoing and claims his wealth largely emanates from gifts bestowed by Saudi Arabian royalty.

In a statement last year,

he and his family said they had 'never benefited from financing that, in any way, wronged the Syrian state and its people.'



Ghost town comes alive again

SESENA, a town that came to symbolise the excesses of Spain's last real estate boom, has begun building again.

It was a decade ago that ghost-like buildings in the Castilian countryside became an emblem of out-ofcontrol speculation and of the housing crash.

However, Sesena, (34km south of Madrid), is making plans to build thousands of new homes after councillors approved the 'Quixote Park' project in late January.

Mayor Carlos Velazquez says proposals to combine homes with an industrial park on the site prove that

the town has learnt from the mistakes of the past.

In fact Sesena's change in fortunes is a sign of how soaring demand is causing Madrid's real estate and rental markets to heat up again.

Fernando Encinar, co-founder and head of research at Idealista said:

"There is as yet no bubble but there is a mini-boom. People will start to move out of the capital to the satellite cities."

As Spain's economic recovery stretches into its fifth year, property prices are rising strongly in the Madrid region, where they climbed 12 per cent in 2017.

DESIGNING the plantings in your garden takes a lot more skill than just what looks good

It is a good idea to also know which plants can help and support each other's characteristics and needs. Many plants provide attributes that can greatly benefit each other.

Something as simple as providing shade where a taller, more sun tolerant plant can shelter a softer, sun sensitive one is a way to use plants to benefit each other.

Trees are an obvious example of a good means of providing shade for a variety of plants that cannot tolerate the hot Mediterranean sun

In the vegetable garden corn can provide shade for beans, pumpkins, cucumbers, lettuce, Swiss chard, spinach, peas, potatoes and many other shorter heat intolerant plants, including flowers

There are also plants that are incompatible. Tomatoes will not grow well with corn. Sunloving plants or plants that need low nitrogen will not do well in a well prepared nitrogen-rich corn bed. Many culinary herbs fit into this category.

Companion planting can be

Finding the right friends for your plants

very detailed. If you want to find natural ways to improve your garden, it is important to at least understand the basics of it.

Pests can be repelled by adding flowers and herbs such as marigolds, thyme, sage, lavender, tansy, mint and many more. Some plants will attract beneficial insects, such as zinnias which attract ladybirds. Garlic and onions are good pest deterrents but they can stunt the growth of some legumes including beans and peas.

There are many guides on companion planting and there is a lot of variation in advice so it

is best to research ideas you like and just try it out to see if recommendations work for your plants in your environment. It can be a help to research plants beneficial to the specific problems you have with your plants and use those.

Combining plants known to

support each other and ones that are detrimental to each other is also very handy to know. Lavender growing under or around fruit trees susceptible to codling moth will give them some protection.

Growing flowers in vegetable gardens is becoming more popular as people learn of the benefits of different flowers to deter damaging pests and to attract beneficial ones.

Do not be too concerned that you cannot follow garden plans for companion planting exactly.

Plants may not be crucially affected and some advice is regional. It is just an additional skill for better gardening. You can still get enjoyment from learning for yourself what works well and what does not.

It may be more detrimental to plants to be dug up and removed to another place if you find established plants are not where they should be to get the benefit of companion planting.

The most important thing is that you can feel good about

Marching into spring

SPRING is on the horizon, so now is the perfect time to really start to get stuck into your gardening.

With the last of the winter weather (hopefully) out of the way, your garden is sure to really start sprouting in the next few weeks, so make sure you get on top of it before it gets on top of you.

Besides, the days will be getting longer, not to mention warmer, so why wouldn't you want to make the most of it? First things first, start by trimming any unruly hedges or bushes, giving your lawn a mow and removing any weeds. The sooner you get started on this, the less work you'll have to do later.

Now is also the best time to get planting your bulbs if you want to see your garden in full bloom come summer.

At the end of the month, you should make sure to lift and separate your winter perennials in order to get a better display next year.

Finally, lay some compost or manure around any bushes or fruit trees and mulch the earth around your plants, using wood chips or bark to help fertilise the soil.

You could also use any waste from your pruning to help boost your compost bins.



DOMESTICATION of dogs is a fairly recent event in the history of canines on earth. 'caging' or 'crating' their dog, feeling as if it is cruel and somehow hampering his freedom. This is not true. Just go to a friend's house who has a dog that has been properly crate (or cage) trained.

The dog will often seek out this refuge when he is tired, stressed, or just wants to be away from it all. Your friend probably feeds her dog in or near his 'den', has provided soft, comfortable bedding for his 'den', and has plenty of toys for him to play with or to chew nearby. What dog would not want to stay in a place with so many luxuri-

Many people leave a cage or crate available for their dog so he has his own place to go to. The door is always open and the pet comes and goes as he pleases.

To him it is not a cage, but rather an

indoor doghouse that he feels

Other advantages of cages or crates

- Safety for your dog and house. Having your young or untrained dog in a cage may protect your house from dog-related destruction while you are away or are unable to watch him.

> I know of a woman who forgot to put her 10-month-old giant breed puppy in his cage. She came home to papers ripped up and spread all over, and toilet paper strewn throughout the house.

> > A crate can prevent this

type of disaster from happening. It can also prevent the young, unsupervised animal from hurting himself by chewing

electric cords or becoming ill from something he ate during his escapade.



Rock and Roll-ing in style

THREE vintage supercars previously owned by rock and roll superstars

have gone under the hammer at auction for staggering fees

Billed by some as the 'rock stars cars' auction, the three cars formerly owned by Paul McCartney, Sir Rod Stewart and Pink Floyd's Nick Mason went up for auction as part of Bonhams' Goodwood Members' Meeting sale on Sunday, March 18.

Paul McCartney's limited edition 1967 Lamborghini 400 GT, one of just 247 ever built, belonged to McCartney during the Beatles' heyday and went on sale for a stunning €559,000 (£494.000).

According to reports, the former Beatle had the car specially converted to right hand drive in the late 1960's before eventually selling it on

Tim Schofield, head of the auction house's motor department, told British media: "There is certainly a market for celebrity owned vehicles. especially when the cars themselves are desirable marques and models such as this Lamborghini.

"Paul McCartney, he has had some fantastic cars in his time and this is no different.

"It was first registered to him in February 1968, the heyday of his time with The Beatles."

Also sold at the auction was Pink Floyd drummer Nick Mason's 1974 Ferrari Dino 246 GT Spider.



New lawnmower - a cut above the rest

JAPANESE giants Honda have revealed their latest model is set to hit a top speed.

In a remake of their Mean Mower, which claimed the title of world's fastest lawnmower in 2014, Honda are set to release the new impressive follow up model - the Mean Mower Mk2.

Honda's latest super powered ride-on grass cutter has the same engine as the brand new CBR1000RR Fireblade, a 1,000cc engine with roughly 189bhp.

And while it is yet to be officially tested, the Japanese manufacturing giants reportedly claim that the super-bike powered mower will top 134mph - which would make it faster than a 2017 Honda Civic hatchback.

The Mean Mower secured the world record for world's fastest lawnmower in Spain four years ago, when it reached 116.57 mph at the IDIADA proving ground close to Barcelona.

But Honda lost their title to the Norweigan Speed Factory Team just over a year later as they topped out 133mph on a modified Viking T6 lawnmower.

And now set the Japanese giants are set to challenge that figure and reclaim their title with the Mean Mower MK2 model, which they promise will be able to go beyond the current record of 133mph.

Honda have also said that Fast and Furious Live stunt driver, Jessica Hawkins, will drive the new model when it finally reaches testing; but a test date is yet to be set.

THE Land Rover Discovery is an iconic model, visually unmistakable, refined onroad and unrivalled off-road.

There are impressive rivals in its sector including the Audi A7, Volvo XC90 and Mercedes GLE, yet there is such mystique about the Discovery it is arguably in a class of its own

The exterior styling is cool and classy, the cabin has more wow-factor than any other in the sector, and when you start driving, it is surprising how quick and agile the car is, partly due to being around 480 kg lighter than previous models.

The diesel unit is impressively smooth and quiet, the eight-speed auto box seamless. The ride quality is refined, and while there is some body-roll on tight corners, the car still feels planted and assured. While permanent four-wheel drive is standard

you can, at the turn of a dial, tailor the response to suit mud. snow or even sand.

Most of the time, the Discovery will be on the tarmac but should the terrain get tough, it can certainly cope. I've driven one up a Scottish mountain in deep snow and it never faltered!

Discovery gets top marks for practicality - even the

Spain to take on world champions Germany

SPAIN face a tough double header in their penultimate round of friendly fixtures ahead of this summer's World Cup in Russia.

La Roja will head to current world champions Germany on Saturday, before hosting the Germans' final opponents in 2014, Argentina, at the Wanda Metropolitano in Madrid on Tuesday

Spain go into the matches in good spirits having not lost a match since the 2016 European Championships, but will be without front man Alvaro Morata after the Chelsea striker was left out by Julen Lopetegui.

The 25-year-old, who has struggled since his €85.7 million (£75 million) move from Real Madrid, got his first goal of 2018 in the 2-1 FA Cup quarter-final win over

Leicester on Sunday but has been replaced by rejuvenated former Chelsea man Diego Costa. There were also first time call-ups for Chelsea's Marcos Alonso, Valencia playmaker Dani Parejo and Villarreal's Rodri.

Speaking to English media, Lopetegui was adamant that his final selection for the World Cup was far from made, but was full of praise for the newcomers in his

He said: "There are players who are not on the list whose chances of going to the World Cup are in-

"We've now got two exciting matches against two great sides and after that everyone will have their chances. The fact players haven't been called is down to various things; form, injuries and also to see new players better."

"We felt it was the right time for them to come in and take a look at

"We like (Rodri) a lot. He's very young but he's ready. We've liked watching him a lot, the reports from his club and the under-21's are excellent and we thought it was a good time to see him closer."

Elsewhere, England will hope to secure two victories in their penultimate double header.

England boss Southgate's side will be without key man Harry Kane after he was ruled out until April, as they head to the Netherlands on Saturday ahead of hosting Italy at Wembley on Tuesday.

Southgate has handed a place in the squad to three uncapped players ahead of the fixtures, all looking to state their claim for a place on the plane to the World Cup.

Burnley duo Nick Pope and

James Tarkowski receive their first call-ups on the back of the club's good form this season, alongside Swansea centre-back Alfie Mawson. Bournemouth midfielder Lewis Cook has been called up for the second time after he was originally called up for the 0-0 draw with Brazil in November.

There are also recalls for Arsenal pair Jack Wilshere and Danny Welbeck, while West Brom's Jake Livermore also retains his place in spite of his club side's poor form

West Ham's Joe Hart also retains his place in the three lions' squad despite several high profile mistakes for the struggling Londoners this season, while high profile absentees include Chelsea captain Gary Cahill and Manchester United's Chris Smalling.

Other fixtures will see Argentina play Italy tomorrow (Friday) as well as Russia against Brazil and France take on Colombia before Portugal face the Netherlands on Monday and Germany host Brazil on Tuesday.

SPAIN missed out on automatic qualification to next year's Rugby World Cup in dubious circumstances as they were beaten 18-10 in Brussels amidst ugly scenes at the final whistle.

Los Leones looked on course to qualify for just their second ever World Cup and their first since 1999 ahead of the match, needing just a win over bottom side Belgium in their final qualifying match to leapfrog Romania into top spot.

But Spain were undone as Belgian fly-half Vincent Hart kicked six penalties, scoring all of his sides points in the process, in a game controversially overseen by Romanian referee Vlad Iordachescu and two Romanian assistants.

Tempers flared after the final whistle with several of the Spanish players confronting the referee, while others sarcastically applauded the official's performance as he had to be escorted from the field by security.

The result means that Romania qualified for the 2019 Rugby World Cup and extended their record of competing at every World Cup since its inception in 1987, while Spain must now beat Portugal in a playoff; before the winner faces a two-legged tie against Samoa to secure a place in Japan.

Captain, Jamie Navara, was quick to apologise for his side's actions after the final whistle but remained critical of the referee and his assistants.

He told Radio Marca: "I'm the captain and I would like to apologise for what happened with

The FER have since made a formal claim to both Rugby Europe and World Rugby for the game to be replayed, while Rugby Europe themselves have also released a statement regarding the

It reads: "Rugby Europe has always operated the highest standards of match official selection whatever the competitions. Our structures have provided a pathway for some of the world's top

"While we appreciate that this is a subject of high-emotion, it would be inappropriate to comment on a match official performance before the usual full review has been undertaken.

"This is a usual procedure and occurs for every

"(The) Rugby Europe selection committee is waiting for the assessment report of the supervisor for Belgium v Spain match officials. This committee will meet in Poznan next Friday on the occasion of the Rugby Europe U18 Championships.

"Its agenda will be modified and a large portion of the meeting will be devoted to the analysis of every stage of the Belgium v Spain game.

"Following this meeting, a statement will be released to Rugby Europe Board of Directors for dissemination."

And it has now been confirmed that World Rugby will investigate the circumstances, with the governing body stating that it will look at the 'context of events' around the result.

And the season's racing will officially begin at 7.10am on Sunday.

After Australia, the Formula One season heads to Bahrain on April 8 and then Shanghai the following week before taking a two week break ahead of the Azerbaijan GP in Baku on April 29.
