Pet shame fury

Stray animals 'to be killed after 10 days'

A Council decision to allow a private company to slaughter abandoned animals has sparked public outcry.

It comes after Marbella City Hall invited bidders for a contract to manage abandoned animals, which includes the option to put down those that are not claimed or adopted after 10 days if they are unable to be identified.

And the move sent social media into meltdown after animal lovers shared the document in their hundreds.

Local animal shelter Triple A - which takes in dogs, cats, ferrets, and Vietnamese pot-bellied pigs - was quick to condemn the proposal, publishing a statement on its Facebook page which demanded the council to 'reconsider whether to maintain the tender offer under the

stated conditions if certain aspects cannot be improved.'

Opposition political groups also slammed the scheme, leading conservative Popular Party mayor Angeles Muñoz to decide that the document would be with-

drawn after she appeared alongside Triple A chief Jan Weima for a photoshoot.

But two days later it remained online with companies encouraged to submit their offers.

An official from left-wing

coalition Izquierda Unida claimed that the public appearance with Triple A was nothing more than 'a smoke-screen,' with which the council 'tried to clean up its image,' as the social media backlash continued.

Stormtrooping

'Really bad behaviour'

Brit fined for spitting on cabin crew

A DRUNK British businesswoman who spat on a flight attendant after being refused alcohol during a flight to the Costa del Sol has been fined.

Beverley Chapman, 45, must pay £800 (€915) after pleading guilty to behaving in a threatening, abusive, insulting or disorderly manner on the British Airways flight.

The director of a multinational building firm claimed in court she was suffering from stress after splitting from her ex-girlfriend who later sued for a share of their €1.5 million home.

Ms Chapman, from Chingford in east London, tried to trip up a cabin crew member after spitting her drink over the stewardess when she was refused more alcohol for being too drunk, Crawley Magistrates Court heard.

She had been visiting her mother in Malaga and immedi-

ately began to cause trouble as the flight took off, repeatedly pressing the button to call cabin crew who were unable to leave their seats.

Prosecutor Melanie Wotton said: "They already thought she was intoxicated when she boarded and she continued ringing the bell and demanding more alcohol. This was refused because she was already so intoxicated.

"Ms Chapman was seated in the aisle and as cabin crew went up and down she put her leg out to try and trip them up.

"The pilot left the cockpit to speak to Ms Chapman and called ahead to Gatwick Airport to report that they needed assistance."

Lawyer Martin O'Rourke, defending, said: "She accepts her behaviour was unacceptable and wishes to apologise to the crew members and the court."

Magistrate Mr. David Whitehead described her behaviour as "really bad."

Child abuser finally caged

A BRITISH man who was living under a false name on the Costa del Sol has been jailed for almost 16 years.

It comes after Alan Hollis, 70, was last year held in Malaga after being granted bail and fleeing abroad twice.

He was wanted on suspicion of repeatedly abusing a four-year-old girl on Merseyside during the 1970's and initially arrested in Leeds in 1996.

Having been bailed to appear at Liverpool Magistrates' Court he escaped but was caught trying to board a flight to Florida in 2007.

But having been freed for a second time he fled to Spain using a fake passport.

He must now serve 15 years and nine months in prison after being extradited back to the UK.

Drug dealer to be freed

A MAN jailed for dealing drugs in Fuengirola will be turned loose by the Brotherhood of Our Father Jesus the Rich in Malaga's upcoming Holy Week celebrations. The 257-year-old annual tradition which sees a prisoner pardoned was last year delayed until July after the Spanish government knocked back a list of potential inmates to be freed.

Cabbies give lift

TAXI drivers in Malaga's port area have been hailed after they helped track down a Brazilian holidaymaker's missing wife. The Alzheimer's sufferer wandered off after the pair left their cruise ship for a tour of the city centre, and the cabbies shared her description with colleagues before searching on foot until she was found.

Taking the pizza

A PIZZA delivery driver and two others have been held in Fuengirola on suspicion of selling drugs alongside fast food. The trio would reportedly send cannabis to clients while the ring-leader was delivering takeaway food on his motorcycle, with more than four kilos seized after police raided his home.

Going for gold

BRITISH ambassador to Spain Simon Manley will next month be honoured with Malaga Province's gold medal for his role as 'a great promoter of relations between the UK and Malaga,' with others chosen for the award including Mijas-based Olympic snowboard medallist Regino Hernandez and local ham producer Federico Beltran.

'Eaten by rats'

FIREFIGHTERS who found the body of a man 'devoured by rodents and birds' in a Malaga City centre flat say that he could have been dead since February. The victim reportedly suffered from Diogenes syndrome, a senile disorder typified by extreme self-neglect and compulsive hoarding of rubbish and animals.

Spring break!

SPRING has sprung, but the winter chill lingers on.

Much of Spain has spent the week in the grip of a deep Siberian cold front that brought blizzards, strong winds and giant waves.

The north and centre of the country was badly affected by snow, with almost 200 stretches of road closed and schools shut down in Galicia, Cantabria, Asturias, Castilla y Leon, Castilla-La

Mancha and Cataluña.

Meanwhile a second storm battered southern Spain, with five-metre waves and gale-force winds lashing Andalucia and the Balearic Islands.

A motorist was killed in Jaen Province before a Guardia Civil officer lost his life after being swept away by flood waters while rescuing three people in Guillena, Sevilla.

The Arctic blast saw tempera-

tures plummet, with the mercury in some regions plunging to between 10-15°C below average for the time of year.

And the freezing snap came as the country said an official goodbye to winter on Tuesday, the first day of spring.

Falling on the vernal equinox, the date on which day and night both last for around 12 hours, it usually takes place on March 19, 20 or 21.

On the wing

It is one of Europe's greatest natural spectacles. And the annual spring migration of millions of birds from their wintering grounds in sub-Saharan Africa across the Strait of Gibraltar to breed in Europe is in full swing.

With just 14 kilometres separating the two continents at the Strait, the area serves up ideal conditions for huge numbers of large soaring species from storks to raptors including eagles, kites, and vultures.

This is because they are not strong flyers, and rely on thermals - the columns of rising air that form above the land as it warms in the sun - to travel.

But thermals do not form over water, meaning the birds have to use the narrowest hop possible, rising as high as possible in Morocco before gliding over to Spain.

Spread over several months, peak numbers are observed from March to May, and on a good day it is possible to see literally thousands of birds of prey, storks and smaller birds make the crossing.

Although some stay in Spain, many continue on

their epic journeys to northern Europe, Greenland or Russia, having already crossed the Sahara, the world's largest desert, with some racking up more than 5,000 kilometres.

But there is concern that the migration is in danger, with the numbers of birds returning to their breeding grounds plummeting in recent years, with some species in danger of disappearing completely.

Threats from hunting to illegal poisoning, power lines, wind farms and draining of wetlands have had a devastating effect on populations, which are thought to have halved to 2.1 billion since the 1950s.

Yet it is still a not-to-be-missed extravaganza for nature buffs.

There are a number of dedicated migration watchpoints along the coast between Gibraltar and the kite surfing mecca of Tarifa, Cadiz, and the website www.euroweeklynnews.com is a good source of information should you wish to take your seat for one of the greatest shows on earth.

School of hard drugs

A COUPLE are set to be jailed for employing their four children aged 11 to 17, one of who is disabled, as drug dealers, preparing and selling a range of mind-bending substances from their family home in Fuen-girola.

Flying high

SPAIN'S government has announced a raft of measures designed to combat rising drug crime rates in the Campo de Gibraltar.

Customs authorities will get more personnel and the local Guardia Civil will retain extra officers deployed to its Rapid Response Group, according to the Interior Ministry.

Spain's government is also set to increase

cooperation with Morocco to reduce drug running across the Strait of Gibraltar, with a ban on dinghies used as 'narco boats' currently being drawn up.

The announcement follows demands from locals to increase security, with an estimated 3,000 people in La Linea working for criminal groups.

Toothless perv held

A 22-YEAR-OLD sex pest has been fined €2,500 after groping three women in the space of 15 minutes on the Costa del Sol.

The sordid drama unfolded in Torremolinos town centre when the culprit first followed a 49-year-old woman into a block of flats before jumping on her and 'violently grab-

bing her buttocks' while she waited for the lift, according to a court statement.

She managed to escape and ran outside before locking herself in her car, telling police that her attacker 'just

sauntered off calmly.'

A few minutes later he approached his second victim, 46, on Calle Rio Aranda before 'grabbing her tightly by the genitals.'

A bus driver noticed the struggle and

stopped, allowing her to leap aboard, and as he drove off he saw the man 'drop his pants.'

It later emerged that he had earlier fondled the bottom of a 44-year-old Bulgarian woman who took refuge in a nearby bar.

He was identified by police after all three women described him as having no teeth.

NGOs must boost employees' rights

THE revelations about charity employees' wages in Spain are nothing short of a disgrace.

Full-time workers for giant non-profit organisations (NGOs) including the Red Cross, the country's biggest, can earn less than €800 per month gross, while managers bring home €3,500 plus.

The third sector rakes in €14 billion annually, representing 1.5 per cent of Spain's gross domestic product.

So why can it not afford to pay its staff a decent wage?

NGOs are by definition supposed to balance investments against revenue, but the behaviour of some suggests they are becoming ever more corporate.

And in a sector which aims to tug at the heart strings as it appeals for donations, there is an irony in the fact that many of its employees are victims of the same human rights issues they are battling to overturn elsewhere.

One anonymous staff member told Spanish media: "One major conflict is that many organisations fight for human rights, including employment rights, and there's a perverse logic at work in which they compete to bring down costs to win contracts that the government has outsourced to the detriment of salaries."

This smacks of a worryingly institutionalised corporate approach by charity bosses in Spain, and suggests that NGOs may to an extent perpetuate the problems they were set up to solve.

Expatriate stab shock

Irishman 'stable' after brutal attacking

POLICE are probing the violent stabbing of an Irish expatriate on the Costa del Sol.

The unnamed victim, 37, has been moved from intensive care and is 'stable' after being admitted to hospital with a severe head injury and several stab wounds, according to medics.

He was attacked in the basement of his home in the Torremuelle neighbourhood of Benalmadena and was found by his wife 'badly wounded and with a trail of blood behind him.'

She and a friend drove him to the nearby Xanit hospital before she was interviewed by detectives.

He was later transferred to the Carlos Haya hospital in Malaga City.

Police said in a statement

that his partner did not see or hear anything, although neighbours reported seeing a white van pulling away in the wake of the brutal raid.

Investigators initially thought that the attack was related to a robbery but are 'investigating all options' as the hunt for the culprit goes on.

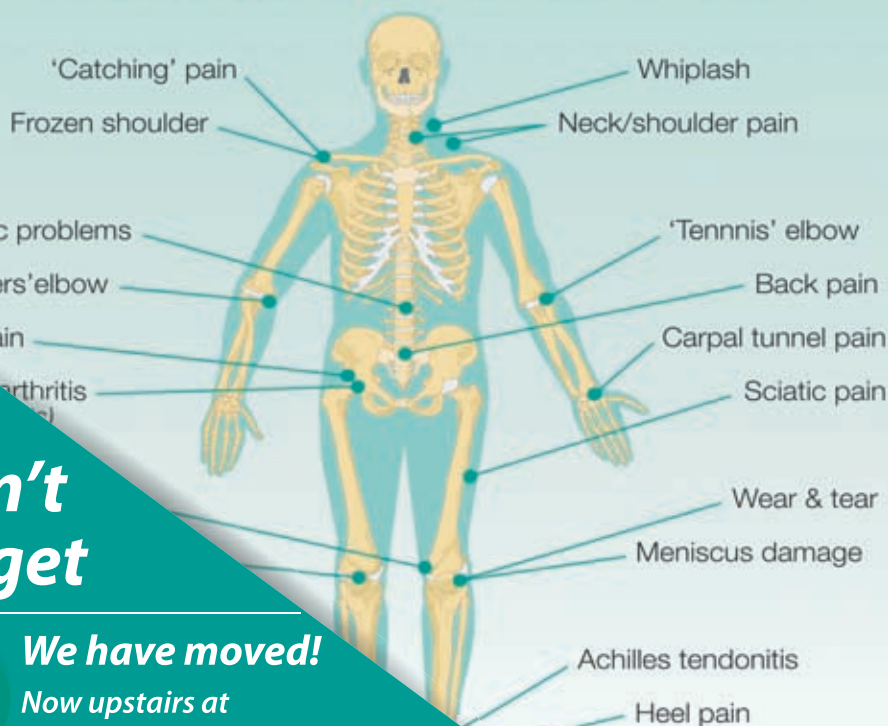

Drug mule op

Jailed trafficker cleared for bail

A DRUG mule who was caught at a British airport with an estimated €68,750 worth of drugs has been given bail to attend a cancer operation in Spain.

Alfredo Farina, who has reportedly lived in Malaga for the past 10 years, was found with an estimated €68,750 worth of cannabis in a suitcase

He pleaded guilty at Edinburgh's Sheriff Court to being

in possession of the drug on January 29 this year, but has been given clearance to undergo an operation in Malaga later this year.

Despite Fiscal Depute Kim Schofield saying that it was accepted that Farina had acted as a drugs mule, his defence solicitor, Iain Smith, said that his client had been diagnosed with a brain tumour and possible prostate cancer.

He also claimed that Farina was set to go under the knife

on May 5 in Malaga, with a procedure already arranged and asked for the sheriff to allow him to return to Spain for the operation.

As a result of his plea, Sheriff Crowe has deferred the sentence until August 20, granting Farina bail but remanding him in custody for deportation.

The Sheriff told Farina that if he did not return to them it was 'easy to obtain' an arrest warrant and he would have him brought back to Scotland.

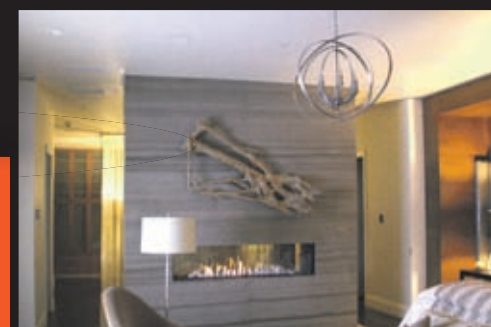

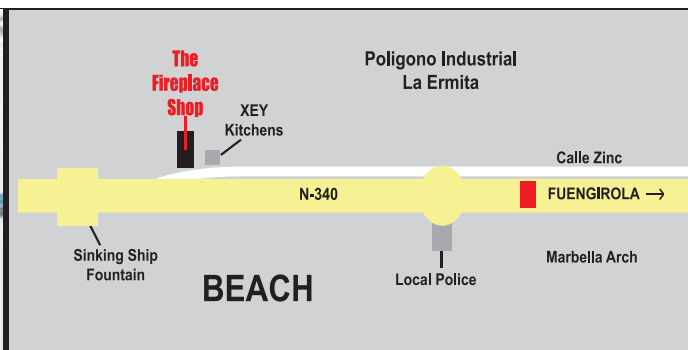

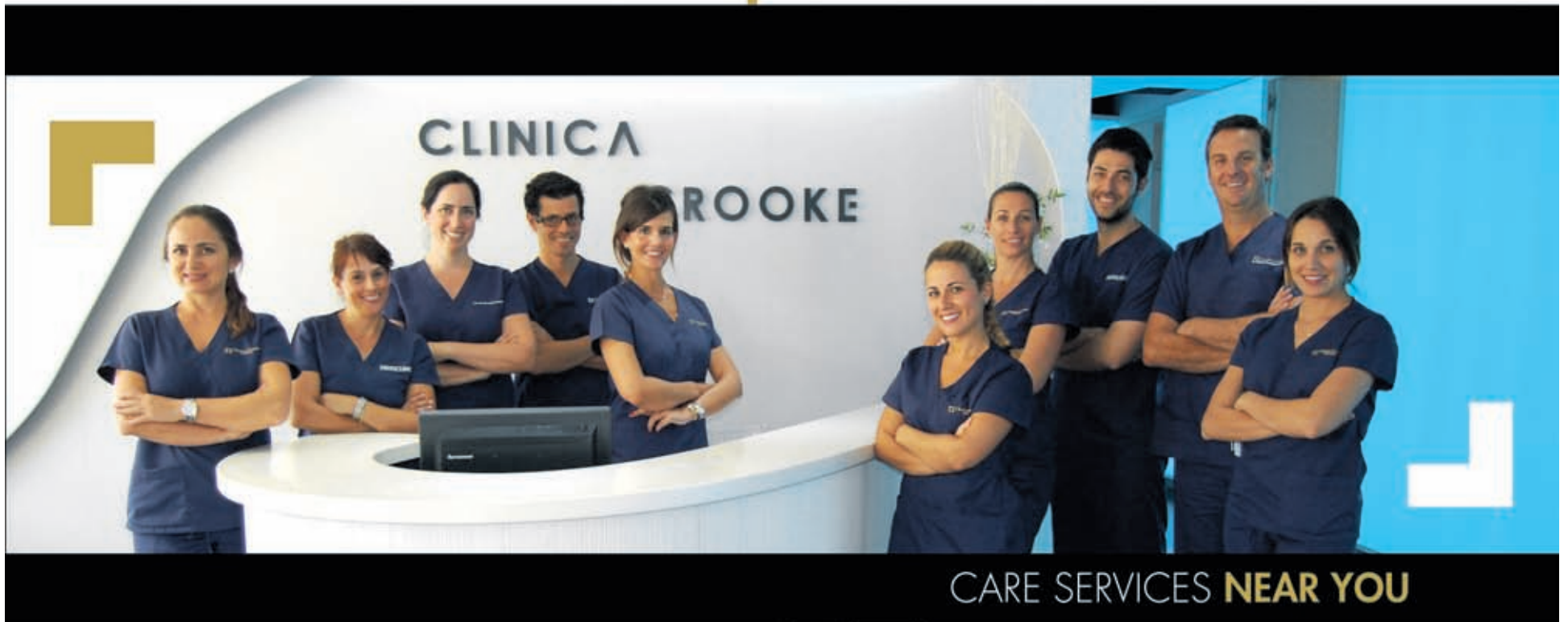

PLANS to build a marina for multi-million Euro superyachts in Malaga City are gathering pace.

Council officials have revealed that they hope to start the bidding process for building contracts 'within a month.'

The city hopes to tap into the lucrative Mediterranean superyacht circuit by constructing a state-of-the-art marina for up to 40 vessels measuring a maximum of 100 metres long and 20 wide.

Superyachts docking in Malaga currently have to use

the same moorings as visiting cruise ships.

Contractors have been warned that the new facilities must not interfere with the existing Melilla ferry or Palmeral marina, where well-to-do holidaymakers moor their cruisers and smaller yachts.

More than fare

PRIMERA AIR, a low-cost leisure airline, is launching new flights from Manchester in the UK to Malaga's Costa del Sol airport.

The new winter 2018 flights will operate four times a week on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from October with fares starting from €35 one-way.

Primera Air's Chief Commercial Officer, Anastasija Visnakova, said: "Malaga is our strongest destination and with more than 1,000 flights last year it was also our most demanded destination.

"We see that Malaga is also very popular for UK travellers, so we believe our Manchester route will give British travellers improved flight options."

It will be the first time Primera Air will operate from Manchester airport after the airline launched flights from London Stansted and Birmingham earlier this year.

The Latvia and Denmark-based carrier currently serves 97 destinations in 23 countries and the European fleet operates Boeing 737-700 and 737-800 aircraft.

A MANHUNT has been launched after a drug trafficker beat a hasty retreat from a police checkpoint.

MARIANO RAJOY, the Spanish Prime Minister, has visited Marbella for a ceremony to boost Partido Popular (PP) members preparing to run in the upcoming municipal elections.

The conservative leader of the ruling PP addressed pensions and the economy in a

speech at the event, among other issues. He also praised Angeles Muñoz, the mayor of Mar-

bella standing for re-election.

Speaking in the city's Conference Centre to a crowd of

around 1,500, Rajoy said retirement payments would be secure in future if the government's policies were continued, at the meeting last Saturday.

"If not we will return to the old ways and to what happened to us in recent years. This country cannot afford to step backwards," he said.

He claimed around three million jobs and billions of euros were lost under the previous

left-leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE) government.

"That's why we entered the biggest crisis Spain has experienced in many years. Under the PP this will not happen," he said.

The Prime Minister's visit comes as Jose Bernal, the former mayor of Marbella and the PSOE's Secretary General for the area, said the PP had little to offer the city.

"Mr Rajoy always comes to Marbella as President of the PP. He has never come here as the head of the government," he said.

Bernal also demanded Marbella's council increase the number of police in the area during Holy Week and that a train link between Marbella and Malaga be built. He also said the A-7 motorway should be extended to Puerto Banus.

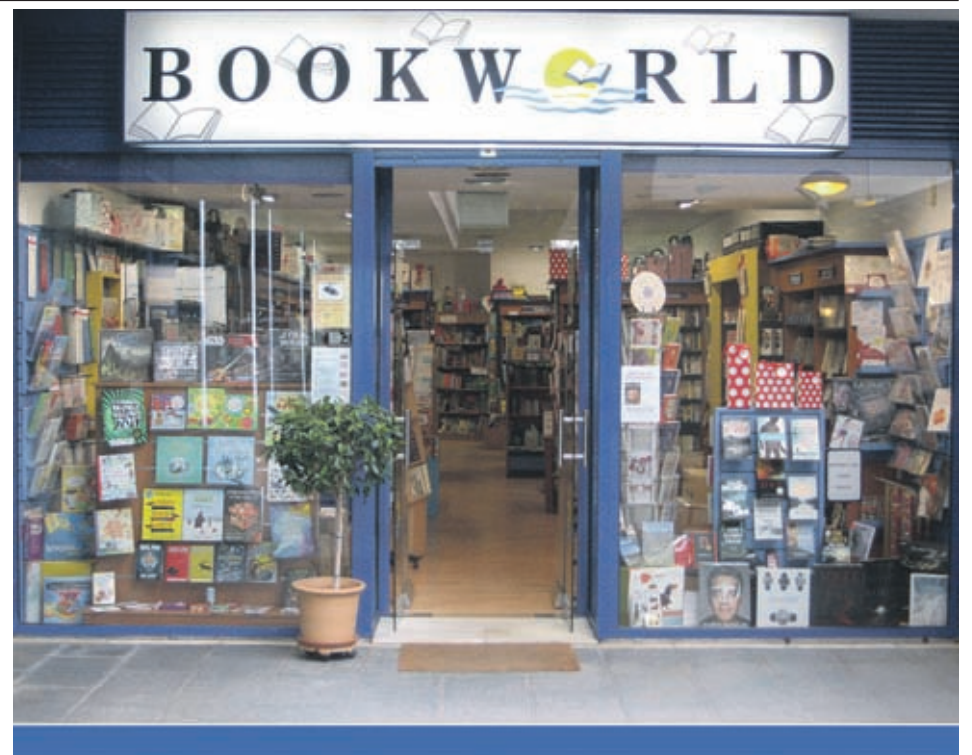

Dr Joseph Garcia, Gibraltar's deputy chief minister, said the clause in the draft le-

gal text that required Spain to approve the territory's status before a final deal was illegal.

"We've taken advice from

the most senior UK lawyers and our advice is that the clause is illegal. Our position is that if Spain exercises a veto under that clause, we will challenge it in court, whatever that may do to the whole of Brexit," he said.

Clause 24 is said to grant Spain an effective veto over Gibraltar's status in the transitional period that is set to follow Britain's withdrawal from the EU.

Garcia said Gibraltar's government may reconsider the rights of EU nationals who live and work on the rock, according to media reports.

"Our view is that we are

then no longer obliged to allow or provide the citizen's rights that are provided in the withdrawal or in the transition because it doesn't apply to us.

"It isn't something we

want to do but it's something that is an option," he said.

Some 2,000 EU nationals live in Gibraltar and around 13,000 people cross the border to work there from Spain every day.

Safe drilling gang snared

NATIONAL POLICE in Malaga have arrested seven Spanish men who allegedly

formed a criminal gang dedicated to stealing the contents of safes.

An investigation reportedly began in September last year after a number of tobacconists and other retail premises were robbed across Andalusia, with several high-end vehicles also stolen.

The robberies all employed the same 'butron'

method, where the thieves drill holes into the buildings in order to loot them.

The robberies attributed to the group included four robberies in establishments, nine vehicle thefts and a violent robbery, all of which took place across the provinces of Malaga, Sevilla and Huelva.

Boom time

10m passengers in two months

NEWLY-RELEASED Spanish government data has shown that international airline passenger numbers to Spain have soared during the first two months of 2018.

Statistics show that 9.98 million international passengers have arrived in the country by plane, a 5.9 per cent increase on the same period last year. Low-cost airline passenger numbers have particularly taken off with 5.21 million

passengers arriving in Spain in January and February - up 12.7 per cent on 2017.

The low-cost companies took 52.2 per cent of the market.

In contrast, 'traditional' airlines carried 4.7 million passengers, down 0.6 per cent.

Among the low-cost airlines Ryanair, easyJet and Vueling continue to lead the field and between them carried 67.6 per cent of 'low cost' market and

35.6 per cent of the total market.

The United Kingdom, with 1.5 million passengers (28.8 per cent of the total), was ahead of the pack despite a drop of 1.1 per cent in arrivals with the low-cost carriers.

Germany, with 13.3 per cent of the arrivals, showed an increase of 695,036 passengers (43.2 per cent more) and Italy with 683,997 low-cost flyers sent 13.2 per cent more.

Holiday sickness fury

Scammers face £15,000 for fake claim

A COUPLE from Liverpool has been ordered to pay a holiday company's costs after submitting a fraudulent sickness claim following a 10-day all-inclusive holiday in Spain.

Chelsea Devine, 21, and Jamie Melling, 22, were seeking £2,500 compensation each after claiming that the food and drink at their Benidorm hotel on the Costa Blanca left them ill for weeks afterwards.

But the judge at Liverpool County Court heard that the pair posted photographs on social media showing them smiling and happy in their hotel room and swimming in the pool.

She ordered them to pay holiday operator Tui £15,000 in costs - a record amount for costs awarded against a fraudulent claim of holiday sickness.

Holiday operator Tui said, "It's disappointing we have had to go this far to defend our industry and hotel partners, as well as protect honest holidaymakers.

"The court has found they brought claims that are fundamentally dishonest and have been ordered to pay our costs.

"This goes to highlight the penalty you can face if you bring an exaggerated or fraudulent holiday sickness claim."

The doctor who backed the couple's case has been referred to the General Medical Council after it emerged he is married to a partner at the

legal firm representing them.

The law firm has also been referred to the Solicitors Regulation Authority.

Travel association ABTA is calling on the government to bring in new measures to tackle

sickness claims ahead of the 2018 holiday season.

They claim figures from a YouGov survey of British adults reveal almost one in five people (19 per cent) have been contacted about mak-

ing a compensation claim for holiday sickness.

The most common way people said they were approached was over the phone (14 per cent), followed by text (7 per cent) and email (7 per cent). Some people also reported being contacted on social media (3 per cent) and some were approached in person (2 per cent) including in airports or while on holiday.

ABTA's 'Stop Sickness Scams' campaign highlights that false claims are costing the travel industry tens of millions of pounds and ABTA is calling for the urgent closure of a loophole in the law, which enables claims management companies and legal firms to make more money in fees from sickness claims abroad, than they're able to from personal injuries in the UK.

They remind the public that making a false compensation claim for holiday sickness is an act of fraud and if prosecuted could result in a large fine, criminal record or jail term of up to three years.

Since 2013, there has been a 500 per cent rise in the number of compensation claims received by travel companies for holiday sickness - yet the number of sickness reports to hotels in resorts has remained the same.

The problem is only associated with UK holidaymakers - travel firms in other countries have not experienced an increase.

Balcony death horror

Brit uni student killed 'after St Patrick's Day party'

THE young British man who fell to his death from a Palma de Mallorca balcony has been named.

James Walton, 23, was on a placement year from Sheffield Hallam University and was killed after a St Patrick's Day party with friends.

Doctors say the language student died due to fatal head injuries after plummeting from a fourth floor balcony onto the pavement below.

Originally from Ealing in London, he had been in Mallorca since last September to work as a global loyalty intern at Melia Hotels International.

The placement was part of his Bachelor's degree in Languages with International Business, of which he was in his third year.

Detectives currently believe he lost his balance after a heavy drinking session with workmates and friends from the UK.

A post mortem examination took place yesterday.

James' body was found lying on Calle Aragon in Palma City centre by a pedestrian early on Sunday morning.

Medics pronounced him dead at the scene after attempts to revive him failed.

His friends reportedly had no idea that

he had fallen until police knocked on the door of their flat.

Investigators are not currently treating the incident as suspicious, and an official confirmed: "At this point in time everything is pointing towards it being accidental."

Friends have paid tribute to him via Facebook, with Melia colleague Maja Jaroszevska writing:

"Words can't describe how heartbroken

we feel to have lost you so soon and so unexpected. You are forever in our hearts. We will remember you, doing your amazing dance moves and winning dance offs with strangers.

"Thank you for being in my life."

A Foreign Office official told UK media: "We are in touch with local police and are providing bereavement advice to his family, following the death of a British man in Mallorca."

Rescue drama

A MOTHER and her three-year-old daughter have been seriously injured after their vehicle left the road and plunged three metres down an embankment.

No other vehicle was involved in the accident on the Cas Ripolls road, in the municipality of Sant Joan

on the holiday island of Ibiza.

The young child was trapped by her legs and had to be sedated while firefighters cut her free. She

was taken to hospital but, given the nature of her serious injuries, a helicopter transfer to another specialist unit is planned.

Her mother fractured her

pelvis in the accident which took place last Sunday evening.

A nine-month-old baby travelling in the car was uninjured.



Resolving double majority issues

IN every community of owners each property is allocated a quota. This is a percentage or a numerical coefficient that represents each property's portion of ownership in relationship to the community as a whole. The total of the coefficients must always add up to 100 per cent.

The quotas are used to calculate each owner's proportional payment of the community's expenses. However when all owners do not have to contribute to a particular expense, the coefficients have to be adjusted.

For example, only the owners who use the community car park are responsible for payment of the maintenance. Five of the owners concerned have commercial units and normally

a quota of 10 per cent and a further five with smaller parking spaces have a quota of 5 per cent, this will only come to 75 per cent. In order to share the costs properly, the quotas will need to be adjusted by increasing the quotas for the five commercial units to 12.5 per cent and the smaller parking spaces to 6.25 per cent but the adjustment will not affect their voting coefficients, they remain the same.

With regards to voting, for all proposals to be passed what is known as a 'double majority' is required. That is, a majority of owners who - according to their quotas - own (collectively) a majority of the property. Every owner only has one vote regardless of the number of properties they own, if it's more than one, the coefficient value of their vote will correspond to the sum of the quotas for their properties

This double majority rule is of great value when many properties, often within a new community, are still for sale and still owned by the devel-

oper. Without the double majority rule the developer could easily act without regard to the interests of the other owners.

The so called Law of Horizontal Property prevents this by insisting that the vote must be passed by a 'double majority' a majority of owners, owning a majority of the property.

However if there is an impasse and this double majority is not reached, then either party can approach the courts and have the court decide whether to pass a proposal based on the vote by; the majority of owners or by the majority of ownership.

The court has to be approached within a specific time frame, basically one month from the time of the community meeting and the court having made its decision, will award costs.

To be clear, all the votes in a community meeting require a double majority. The Law of Horizontal Property rule 17:7 only allows the courts to intervene when an agreement has not been reached by the major-

ity of owners but has been reached by the majority of ownership or vice-versa, but not when a proposal has been rejected or approved by both a double majority of owners and also majority of ownership. There has to be an impasse.

The court's decision or 'judgement of equity' is not necessarily based on any legal ruling and in fact may be based more on a matter of justice or correctness.

Many courts will even consider it compulsory for a community to hold another meeting and try to resolve the issue that way and only allowing the matter to be brought to court if still a 'double majority' cannot be reached.

Until the court decides, the community must continue as it was prior to the proposal at the original community meeting. The court will then also decide who pays the cost involved.

Park shooting

A 24-YEAR-OLD man linked to the Loyal to Familia crime gang died after being shot in Valby Park in Copenhagen, but police have declined to comment on whether the incident was connected to any possible connection.

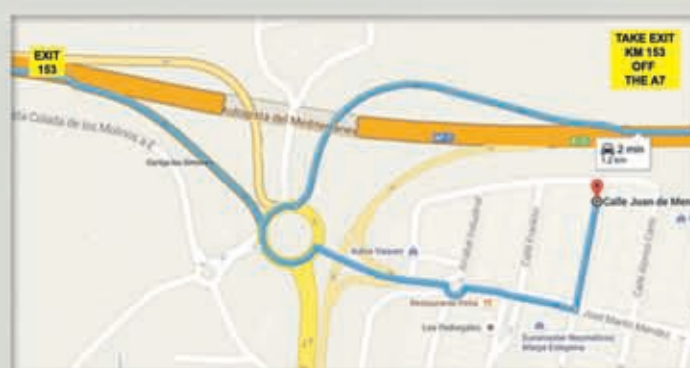

An offer they could refuse

A SPANISH restaurant chain is unable to trademark its name after European judges ruled it could 'shock and offend' people.

It comes after Italy launched a complaint after Spanish chain La Mafia, which runs 42 Italian eateries, applied to trademark the name La Mafia Se Sienta a la Mesa (The Mafia take a Seat at the Table).

But the European Court of Justice said that the Godfather-style branding is not compatible with 'fundamental EU values.'

Ryanair lands new airline

RYANAIR has agreed to buy a majority stake in a new Austrian airline founded by former motor racing champion Niki Lauda.

Europe's largest budget carrier will buy an initial 24.9 per cent stake in Laudamotion, which recently regained control of airline Niki from insolvent former owner Air Berlin.

This will rise to 75 per cent 'as soon as possible,' subject to European Union approval, the carriers said in a statement, with Ryanair set to pay a total of around €50 million.

It is the Irish low cost giant's first acquisition since it bought UK airline Buzz from KLM in 2003, closing it down a year later.

It has since tried to take over Aer Lingus and last year pulled out of an auction for Air Berlin last year amid claims that it was rigged in favour of German rival Lufthansa.

Lauda will become chairman of Laudamotion and oversee the company's rebuilding, while Ryanair will provide six crewed aircraft this summer to increase its fleet to 21

planes, with further expansion to 30 jets planned within three years.

Ryanair has reportedly beaten off competition from Lufthansa and British Airways parent IAG to secure the deal, which will see it launch a major push on the German and Austrian markets.

Ryanair CEO Michael O'Leary said in a statement: "This Laudamotion partnership is good news for Austrian and German consumers/visitors who can now look forward to real competition, more choice and lower fares."

€18.8bn deal ends toll war

A POTENTIAL bidding war for Spain's biggest toll road operator has been averted.

It comes after Madrid-based construction firm ACS and Italian company Atlantia - which had been competing separately for months - agreed a joint takeover deal for the Abertis group.

Under the agreed terms, ACS's German arm Hochtief will buy Abertis for €18.18 billion.

But in the final holding, the Italians will own 50 per cent, ACS 30 per cent and Hochtief 20 per cent.

Protected island sold at discount

A BALEARIC island between Ibiza and Formentera has been sold to a private bidder for €18 million.

An unnamed family from Luxembourg has bagged 137-hectare S'Espalmador after attempts to sell it to Formentera Council failed.

Former owners, Catalan architect Norman Cinnamon and his sister Rosy, confirmed the sale with the price dropped from €24 million after three

years on the market.

The island - which is almost three kilometres long and 800 metres wide - had been owned by the Cinnamon family since 1932.

It boasts a 13-bedroom house, chapel and watchtower, can be reached by foot from Formentera when the tide is low and is part of the protected Las Salinas Natural Park.

In summer it is a popular mooring spot for yachts, and many people head ashore for a mud bath.

Dress to impress

SPANISH clothing giant Inditex, which owns Zara among other brands, has revealed that net profit soared to €3.37 billion in 2017, placing the group ahead of long-term Swedish rival H&M, which posted returns of €1.6 billion.

Samba style

SPANISH energy firm gas Natural Fenosa will sink €95 million into two solar energy projects in Minas Gerais, Brazil, after snapping them up from rival Canadian Solar, with the plants set to become operational before the end of the year.

Anti-social

SPAIN'S data protection agency, AEPD, has slapped Facebook and WhatsApp with €300,000 fines for processing and sharing users' personal data without their consent, with the former currently appealing an earlier €1.2 million sanction for the same offence.

Ikos invests in luxury

INNOVATIVE Greek luxury hotel chain Ikos is to sink €150 million into its first Spanish project.

The company has snapped up the Costa del Sol Princess Hotel in Estepona, Malaga, which will be transformed into its latest 'infinite lifestyle' venture.

The resort will include 400 rooms, eight restaurants, upmarket sports facilities, a theatre, indoor

and outdoor swimming pools, a spa and 70,000 square metres of gardens, Ikos said in a statement.

It will become the brand's fifth hotel and first in Spain, and is set to open in 2020.

Ikos has created a buzz in the industry after redefining the all-inclusive boutique concept, and two of its Greek hotels were ranked in the world's top three in 2017.

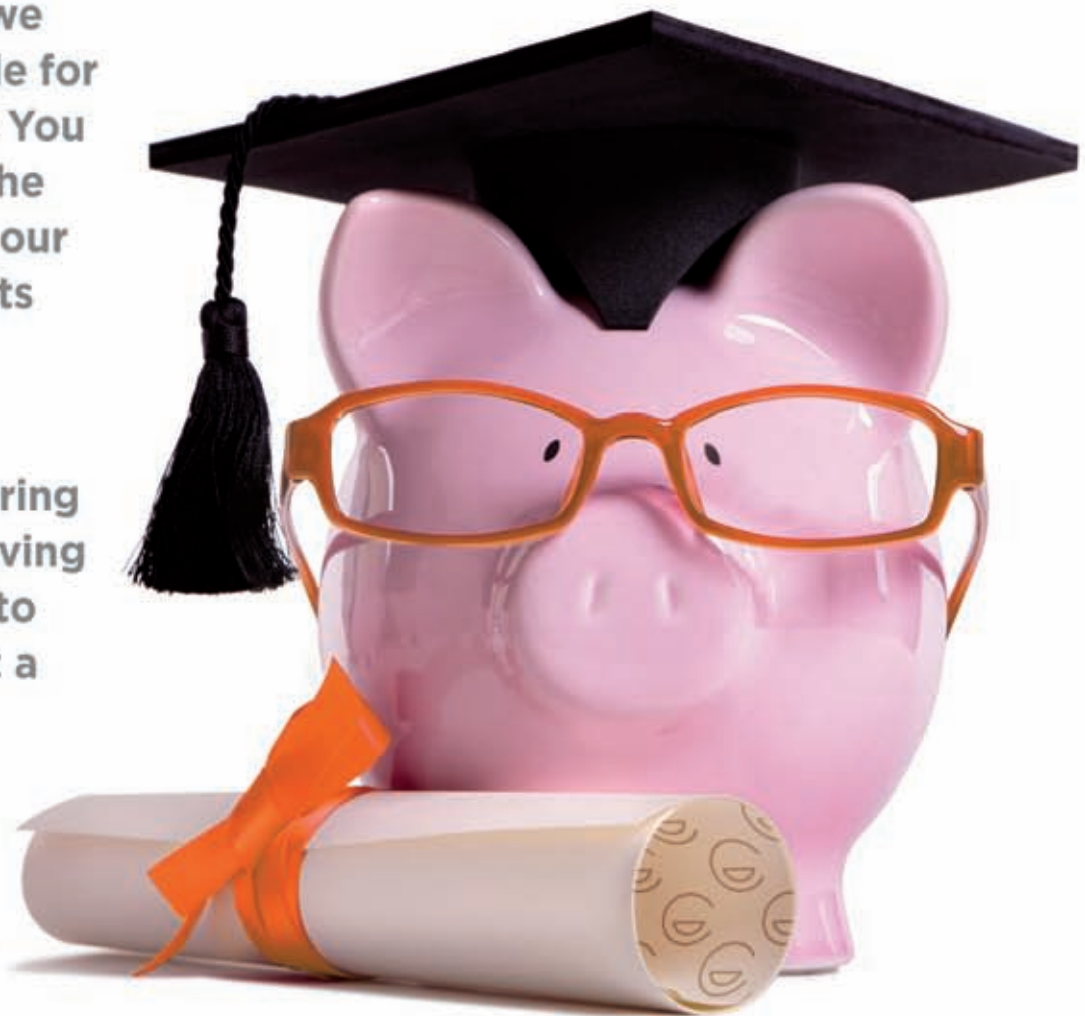

€14.8bn fraud windfall

'TRIVIAL' DROP AS TAX DODGERS TACKLED

THE battle against fraud in Spain continues.

And the national Tax Agency has revealed that last year it raked in almost €14.8 billion - a year-on-year decrease of €91 million - in sanctions from cases relating to illegal renting of homes and other financial crimes.

The total has plunged for the third consecutive year, after the bureau revealed that it made €14.9 billion in 2016 and €15.7 billion in 2015.

Agency director Santiago Menendez argued that the average income from fraud over the last three years beats that of the previous three by 3.5 per cent, as he said: "The results consolidate the upward trend in recent years... it is a trivial drop with no significant reason."

And the figures still far outstrip the €8 billion earned in 2008, when the Tax Agency employed 2,000 more people and the housing bubble - having yet to burst - fuelled a significant 'underground economy.'

Fines for undeclared rental income shot up to €522 million in 2017, an increase of around 40.5 per cent on 2014, when the agency launched an annual campaign of sending inspectors to suspects' homes.

Among 32,215 visits made by tax inspectors last year, 14,698 were related to non-payment of IVA, the Spanish equivalent to VAT in the UK.

Menendez added that the use of new technology capable of processing big data has allowed investigators to acquire almost €333 million from cases including "aggressive tax planning, 'hidden' companies, buying powers that did not match what was declared and assets abroad."

He explained that thanks to Spain's tax amnesty (a disclosure facility introduced in 2012), plus revelations exposed in the Panama

Papers and other legal documents, that his agency has new data available.

And the result is that tax debt fell by the greatest amount yet recorded in a single financial year.

Pending collection, the outstanding amount plummeted by 7.6 per cent compared with 2016, with the total of €42.4 billion the lowest since 2010.

The annual inventory of defaulters owing more than €1 million to the state, introduced by Treasury Minister Cristobal Montoro in 2015, also contributed heavily to debt reduction, with €1.2 billion raised from taxpayers "afraid to appear on the list," according to Menendez.

Abu Dhabi set to invite bids for Spanish oil and gas giant

THE United Arab Emirates is seeking to offload part of Spanish oil and gas multi-national CEPSA.

It comes after the Mubadala Investment Company, Abu Dhabi's state-owned holding firm, bought out French oil giant Total's stake in 2011.

The move saw the investment vehicle seal 100 per cent control of Spain's second-largest petrol company, which was at the time valued at around €8 billion.

But reports suggest that it is now worth much more, leading Mubadala to invite bids for a partial stake from a 'strategic ally' or 'major investment fund.'

Cepsa has been on an upswing since the takeover, breaking new ground in exploration and production, with several 'mega projects' in Asia and the Middle East.

UNION FURY OVER BELOW AVERAGE PAY

Charity wage woe goes on

THE working conditions of charity workers in Spain are under scrutiny.

Non-governmental organisations (NGOs) employ around 645,000 across the country, but both central and regional governments slashed third sector budgets during the 2008 financial crisis.

The move saw many of Spain's 30,000 NGOs freeze or reduce salaries, and conditions have not improved in the 10 years since.

"There is a latent instability," an administrator for several NGOs told Spanish media. "It's a sector that has been damaged and which requires a certain element of volunteering and a huge dose of personal motivation, which is exploited when it comes to unstable contracts and unpaid overtime.

"One major conflict is that many organisations fight for human rights, including employment rights, and there's a perverse logic at work in which they compete to bring down costs to win contracts

that the government has outsourced to the detriment of salaries."

Around 34 per cent of NGO contracts are temporary, and employment reforms introduced by the Spanish government in 2012 mean that companies and not-for-profits are able to ignore national labour

agreements and bring down salaries while maintaining investment.

In Teruel, Aragon, a full-time cleaner employed by the Red Cross now earns €765 gross per month in the wake of a 2.5 per cent January increase following a long

freeze on wages, while in Alicante part-time telemarketing staff can earn as little as €500.

Jose Luis Pascual, Red Cross Spain's Human Resources director, said: "We're not inventing low salaries, it's a fact. Should that be changed? Possibly."

When quizzed if €800 per month is enough to live on, he hesitated before admitting: "It would be very hard to cover everything... I don't agree that we ignore employment rights. In many cases, our salaries are better than others in the sector."

Critics, including unions, have panned Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy and the regional authorities after spending on social issues was cut by 23 per cent since 2016 despite the national economic upturn.

Pilar Marmol, from the UGT union, added: "Many NGOs don't behave like NGOs; they're all about business. And when there's an [outsourced] tender, they're like vultures. They go as low as they can."

Cashing in on crowdfunding

A SPANISH provincial council has become the first authority in the world to set up its own crowdfunding platform.

The innovative scheme allows residents of Biscay in the Basque Country to invest in start-up projects chosen by the governing body.

According to venture capital think tank, Seed Capital Bizkaia, the move will boost investor confidence and reduce risk.

The goal is to launch eight start-ups - cherry-picked from around 30 applicants - in the first year of the scheme, with the council hoping to attract some 350 investors after agreeing to plough €240,000 into the project itself.

Businesses must be headquartered in Biscay, of which Spain's 10th largest city Bilbao is capital.

MEPs condemn Trump olive tax

THE European Parliament has called on the United States to reverse President Trump's move to impose import duties of up to 20 per cent on Spanish olives.

The tariffs were introduced in January to protect producers in California after Washington said that growers in Spain benefit from subsidies allowing them to sell olives below fair value.

"The US has started a trade war and they have used us as scapegoats," said Gabriel Re-

dondo, chairman of exporter Agro Sevilla, at the time.

And MEPs in Strasbourg have hit back at the levies, claiming that the EU agricultural grants follow World

Trade Organisation rules.

"The European Parliament calls on the US authorities to withdraw their interim decision and re-establish a mutually constructive approach in this domain to the mutual benefit of producers and consumers on both continents," they said in a statement.

Spain exported 32 million kilos of black olives worth €70 million to the US in 2016, but says the new tariffs will cost the sector €350-700 million over the next decade.



Thumbs down for €4.9 billion Hammerson takeover bid

A €4.9 BILLION bid for British shopping centre operator Hammerson sent the company's shares soaring by almost 27 per cent.

French firm Klepierre was behind the offer, which is being seen as an attempt to derail its competitor's €3.9 billion takeover of Intu Properties, which owns or has stakes in 17 shopping centres in the UK and three in Spain.

The deal is set to create the UK's biggest property group, worth an estimated €24 billion.

Klepierre said in a statement that it had offered 615p a share, but the bid was rejected by Hammerson chairman David Tyler within 24 hours. Tyler described the approach as "wholly inadequate and entirely

opportunistic," before advising shareholders to take no action.

He said in a statement that the board "sees absolutely no merit in Klépierre's proposal and has unanimously rejected it."

Klepierre is one of Europe's biggest players in the retail market, with more than 100 shopping centres in 16 countries.

The Hammerson takeover bid highlights the pressure currently gripping the sector, as more customers choose to shop online.

Hammerson owns or part-owns 37 shopping centres, including Birmingham's Bullring, and if the Insu deal goes ahead it will gain control of a €650 million scheme to create one of Spain's largest shopping complexes in Torremolinos on the Costa del Sol.

TECH FOR THE TIMID



All you need is pods

Terence Kennedy's listening life changed forever when he discovered the joy of podcasts.

IF you think silence is golden maybe give this week's column a miss. It's inspired by a Canadian lady who fills every unoccupied moment listening to podcasts, a hundred a week.

Mea not quite so culpa, I have to confess, and she's definitely the pod one out (sorry), but my own consumption does certainly max out at three or four a day.

My listening life changed radically when keeping my butterfly mind topped up during fallow periods suddenly meant I didn't have to put up with whatever dross was on the radio at the time, but instead a chosen programme I could actually control as my own DJ.

'Women's Hour' discussing hysterectomies might have been all well and good mid-morning when there was nothing else on, but podcasts meant I could now listen on demand to Melvyn Bragg discussing the finer points of three-toed newts or quantity

surveying. And I could hit the pause button so as not to miss a riveting second of it.

Initially we could tape radio programmes directly off-air onto cassettes. The tech breakthrough came with the iPod 17 years ago, then MP3 players and today there are two-thirds as many smartphones in the world as there are people.

Now four billion podcasts are downloaded each year and rising, with sensible users (unlike our Canadian lady or indeed me) spending an average of four hours a week listening to them.

In the western world, more people listen to podcasts than go to the movies. An American statistician John Lennon would have loved says there are more regular podcast listeners than Catholics.

Where original adopters were typically under 25, now the fastest growth is among the so-called 'silver surfers', those of us somewhat closer to our sell-by dates.

Downloading (mostly free)

pods straight off the web is the work of seconds to an MP3 player or increasingly now, a smartphone. And almost all will let you interrupt and pick up where you left off again at will, freeing you forever from the shackles of broadcast schedules.

There are hosts of apps for finding and playing podcasts. and for the latest pod experience, this year's 'next best thing' in tech, smart home assistants like Amazon's Echo and Google's Home can serve up unlimited podcasts on demand.

For the moment I'm stuck with downloading them straight off the web, as not all of us are (yet) blessed with a smart home assistant.

I was going to drop in a gag here about my wife fulfilling that role, but on reflection it could cost me my dinner.

Taking pod luck

TYPE 'podcasts' into your browser and prepare to be swamped.

A good place to start is with the traditional broadcasters, who all now package their output into free podcasts for downloading.

The BBC is a great source (<http://www.bbc.co.uk/podcasts>), with simply hundreds free for the grabbing, all in the ubiquitous MP3 format which any player or phone can handle.

Other broadcasters like America's NPR (www.npr.org/podcasts/), or Australia's ABC (www.abc.net.au/radio/podcasts/) have their own treasure-troves. Services like Apple's iTunes have pages and pages of them. If you 'subscribe' they will even be downloaded automatically to your player without human intervention.

So all you have to do, as Shakespeare so famously said, is 'lend me your ears'. Perhaps adding headphones for domestic harmony.

The Golden Man of Malaga

PABLO PICASSO led Sotheby's London's Impressionist and Modern Art and Surrealist Art in February and last week the most popular Museum in London the Tate Modern opened Picasso's Golden Year exhibition which focused on his creations of 1932.

A year of two halves the first part dominated by his urgency to meet the deadline of his first major retrospective held in Paris in June 1932 at the Galeries George Petit.

The painting that crowned the Sotheby's sale Pablo Picasso's 'Femme au béret et à la robe quadrillée (Marie-Thérèse Walter)' achieved the second highest price for any work ever sold at auction in Europe - priced at €56.7m - as three bidders competed. This painting was created in 1937, the same year in whose final months saw his master work 'Guernica,' which happily may be seen by Spaniard and visitor alike at the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofia in Madrid, regarded by most as the greatest anti-war statement in art.

In a decade of extraordinary significance many see echoes of the trajectory of that decade in the profuse and varied output of an artist who never seemed to stand still. By 1932

Picasso was an established artist, famous and wealthy. Tailored suits and chauffeur driven car attest to that as well as the Paris apartment and country chateau.

At a moment when some entertained the thought that Picasso was at his peak, perhaps even past it, he continued to search and discover. For an impoverished immigrant from Spain who would have blamed him for slowing and enjoying the fruits of his youth?

Also 1932 was the year that Picasso is considered to have reinvented himself. Here he can be seen to be exploring surrealist distortion, painting and sculpture. It also saw the start and development of his relationship with his muse Marie-Thérèse Walter, by 1935 his wife Olga Khokhlova had left him for the south of France.

The darkening clouds of war marked with the Spanish Civil War which began in 1936 and ended in 1939, with the rest of Europe engulfed in what came to be known as the Second World War months after its conclusion.

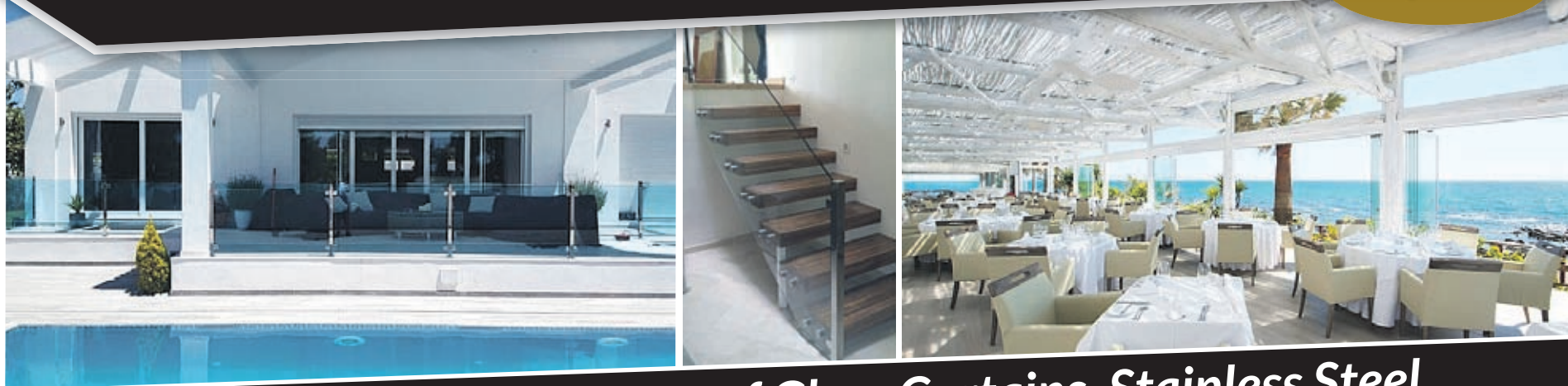
Picasso was a man of his times. As an artist his times cover much of the 20th century. The triumphs, anxieties and tragedies, the vast scope of his art continues to fascinate and attract. For a determined collector a fascination that very occasionally may be satisfied by an acquisition.

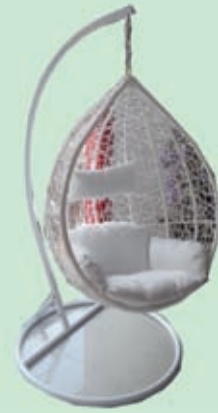

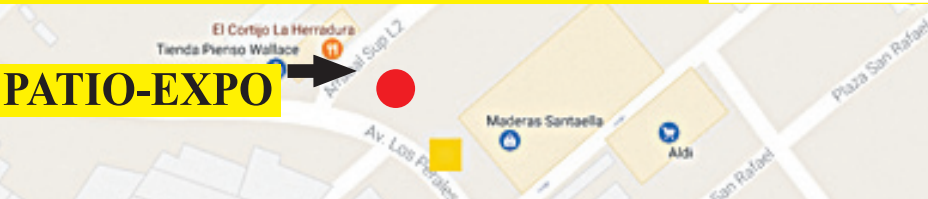

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Cyclists - know the law

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



PEDAL POWER: The rules of the road still apply.

IT is probably safe to say that all road users have witnessed a bicycle rider going through a red light or riding on the pavement, a practice that many find frustrating, but always one that raises the same question, are cyclists allowed to do such things?

The simple answer is NO.

In terms of law, once a bicycle is being ridden it is classed as a vehicle and therefore covered by the same rules and laws as a car, a truck, a bus, in fact any other vehicle on the road.

It is only when the rider dismounts and walks with the bicycle is it considered otherwise. In this instance, the situation means that the person has become a pedestrian.

That is the same reason why cyclists cannot ride across zebra crossings, because we wouldn't expect a truck to do that, and the rider must dismount before they do.

Listening to music using headphones or using a mobile phone when riding a bike are prohibited in the same way as they are for other vehicles. Consuming more than the prescribed limit of alcohol or using drugs is also not al-

lowed, as a cyclist you are governed by the rules of the road. Just so you know what you are risking, let's have a look at some of the most common infractions.

- Not having a bell on your bicycle - 80€
 - Faulty or no brakes - 80€
 - Carrying an extra person on the bicycle - 80€
 - Failing to stop at a traffic light - 200€
 - Failing to give way at a junction - 200€
 - Not having lights - 200€
 - Having too many lights - 200€
 - Failing to wear high visibility clothing between sunset and sunrise and in poor visibility - 200€
 - Riding under the influence of alcohol - 500€
- There are many other laws and infractions commonly committed by cyclists, as well as other road users of course.

We will look at these in more detail in future editions, but for now, take note, you can indeed be fined on your bike and remember that one golden rule, when you are riding your bike, it is a vehicle and governed by the same rules and laws as every other vehicle.

Can he fly his national flag?

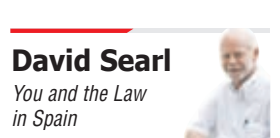
Q. I live on a multinational housing estate where people are proud of their heritage and country and fly their respective national flags from their balconies or outside their houses. I have been told that this is not

Dairy: the good and the bad

WHILE it isn't wise to give up entire food groups unless you are advised to by your doctor - like when you have an allergy, for example - it is becoming increasingly popular to cut dairy completely out of diets.

However, dairy also contains vitamin B2 and people with a deficiency of this vitamin can suffer from migraines as a side effect, so make sure you eat lots of spinach, mushrooms and almonds which can contribute to this.

You could also miss out on other essential nutrients such as calcium and vitamin D if you go dairy-free so eat lots of fatty fish, as well as plant-based milks, which are normally a good alternative source of the nutrients you need.

alcohol and nicotine can favour bone loss.

If you ask yourself how you can promote bone formation then here are a few advices. Make sure your body does not acidify. Consuming sufficient calcium, vitamin D and trace elements as well as following a healthy and balanced diet is very important.

In order to generate a balanced calcium intake it is recommendable to eat or drink dairy products and green vegetables. In order to strengthen our bones and enhance the efficiency of the consumed calcium we need vitamin D which can be found in avocados, eggs, fish and sunlight. Pineapple, leafy vegetables and nuts contain the trace element manganese, which supports bone formation.

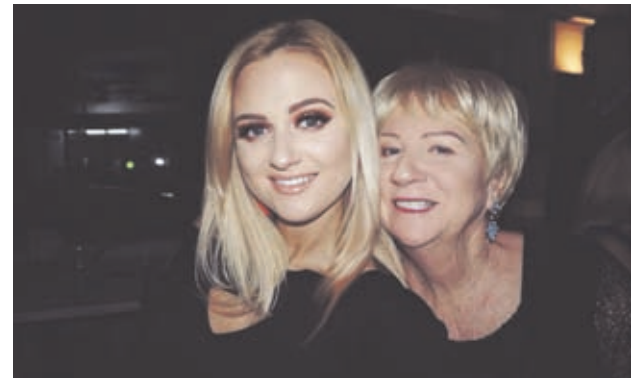

Gibraltar International Song Festival features Rosario

THE ninth Gibraltar International Song Festival's (GISF) finals will be held in the Gibraltar Tercentenary Sports Hall on Saturday June 2 starting at 8.30pm.

The organisers are delighted that Spanish singing sensation Rosario has agreed to be the special guest performer with tickets costing from €35 to €65 for VIP seats.

This two-time Latin Grammy Award Winner is the daughter of the legendary Lola Flores (who has had a street in Puerto Banus named after her) and the sister of both fellow singer Lolita Flores and singer-songwriter Antonio Flores.

With 12 albums to her name and guest appearances with some of Spain's most successful artists, the appearance of this popular singer is something of a coup for the organisers and tickets are likely to sell out quickly.

BODEGAS VEGA SICILIA is a Spanish winery founded in 1864 by Don Eloy Lecanda y Chaves and owned since 1982 by the Alvarez family.

Don Eloy, a Spanish winemaker, brought several grape varieties back from the Bordeaux region where he trained to his Castile homeland, including Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, all of which are still used today together with Tempranillo and Malbec.

In the 20th century, Vega Sicilia - located in the Ribera del Duero DO in northern Spain - earned a reputation as one of Spain's most notable wineries with its top bottles selling for an average of €300.

The name Vega Sicilia refers to the Catholic Saint Cecilia with no connection to the island of Sicily.

Many of Vega Sicilia's 250 acres are planted with old vines, some more than 100 years old, resulting in a low yield during harvest.

The wines are aged in barrel and bottle for many years and depending on vintage for decades before release. For example, in 1991 the winery released the 1968 and 1982 vintages after 23 and nine years ageing. Vega Si-

cialia produces three cuvees:

Unico: This Gran Reserva is the signature wine released 10 - 15 years after vintage. Taken from some of the oldest vines it consists of Tempranillo (80 per cent) and Cabernet Sauvignon (20 per cent) and accounts for about a third of production.

Valbuena 5°: Aged for five years, it is composed mostly of Tempranillo, with Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon.

Vega Sicilia Unico Reserva Especial: A non-vintage blend of different Unicos, aged at least for 10 years; it can include grapes from vintages harvested more than 30 years apart and usually only available to private customers.

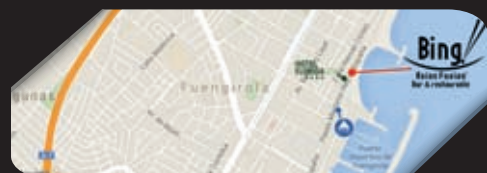

DESIGNING the plantings in your garden takes a lot more skill than just what looks good on paper.

It is a good idea to also know which plants can help and support each other's characteristics and needs. Many plants provide attributes that can greatly benefit each other.

Something as simple as providing shade where a taller, more sun tolerant plant can shelter a softer, sun sensitive one is a way to use plants to benefit each other.

Trees are an obvious example of a good means of providing shade for a variety of plants that cannot tolerate the hot Mediterranean sun.

In the vegetable garden corn can provide shade for beans, pumpkins, cucumbers, lettuce, Swiss chard, spinach, peas, potatoes and many other shorter heat intolerant plants, including flowers.

There are also plants that are incompatible. Tomatoes will not grow well with corn. Sun-loving plants or plants that need low nitrogen will not do well in a well prepared nitrogen-rich corn bed. Many culinary herbs fit into this category.

Companion planting can be

Companion planting

Finding the right friends for your plants

very detailed. If you want to find natural ways to improve your garden, it is important to at least understand the basics of it.

Pests can be repelled by adding flowers and herbs such as marigolds, thyme, sage, lavender, tansy, mint and many more. Some plants will attract

beneficial insects, such as zinnias which attract ladybirds. Garlic and onions are good pest deterrents but they can stunt the growth of some legumes including beans and peas.

There are many guides on companion planting and there is a lot of variation in advice so it

is best to research ideas you like and just try it out to see if recommendations work for your plants in your environment. It can be a help to research plants beneficial to the specific problems you have with your plants and use those.

Combining plants known to

support each other and ones that are detrimental to each other is also very handy to know. Lavender growing under or around fruit trees susceptible to codling moth will give them some protection.

Growing flowers in vegetable gardens is becoming more popular as people learn of the benefits of different flowers to deter damaging pests and to attract beneficial ones.

Do not be too concerned that you cannot follow garden plans for companion planting exactly.

Plants may not be crucially affected and some advice is regional. It is just an additional skill for better gardening. You can still get enjoyment from learning for yourself what works well and what does not.

It may be more detrimental to plants to be dug up and removed to another place if you find established plants are not where they should be to get the benefit of companion planting.

The most important thing is that you can feel good about gardening.

Marching into spring

SPRING is on the horizon, so now is the perfect time to really start to get stuck into your gardening.

With the last of the winter weather (hopefully) out of the way, your garden is sure to really start sprouting in the next few weeks, so make sure you get on top of it before it gets on top of you.

Besides, the days will be getting longer, not to mention warmer, so why wouldn't you want to make the most of it?

First things first, start by trimming any unruly hedges or bushes, giving your lawn a mow and removing any weeds. The sooner you get started on this, the less work you'll have to do later.

Now is also the best time to get planting your bulbs if



you want to see your garden in full bloom come summer.

At the end of the month, you should make sure to lift and separate your winter perennials in order to get a better display next year.

Finally, lay some compost or manure around any bushes or fruit trees and mulch the earth around your plants, using wood chips or bark to help fertilise the soil.

You could also use any waste from your pruning to help boost your compost bins.

Denning is a natural instinct

DOMESTICATION of dogs is a fairly recent event in the history of canines on earth. Although wild canines have been around for millions of years, they have only spent a few thousand of those as our pets. As a result, they still retain some of their 'wild' instincts, and one of those is the instinct to 'den.'

Canines have a definite instinct to hide out in dens. If they do not have one available, they will 'make their own.' We frequently see our dogs under desks or the dining room table, if they can fit. When a dog digs a hole in your garden one reason might be the instinct to make a den.

What this behaviour is all about is a canine's natural desire to have a place he can call his own.

Many people dislike the idea of

'caging' or 'crating' their dog, feeling as if it is cruel and somehow hampering his freedom. This is not true. Just go to a friend's house who has a dog that has been properly crate (or cage) trained.

The dog will often seek out this refuge when he is tired, stressed, or just wants to be away from it all. Your friend probably feeds her dog in or near his 'den', has provided soft, comfortable bedding for his 'den', and has plenty of toys for him to play with or to chew nearby. What dog would not want to stay in a place with so many luxurious amenities?



Many people leave a cage or crate available for their dog so he has his own place to go to. The door is always open and the pet comes and goes as he pleases.

To him it is not a cage, but rather an

indoor doghouse that he feels secure in.

Other advantages of cages or crates include:

- Safety for your dog and house.
- Having your young or untrained dog in

a cage may protect your house from dog-related destruction while you are away or are unable to watch him.

I know of a woman who forgot to put her 10-month-old giant breed puppy in his cage. She came home to papers ripped up and spread all over, and toilet paper strewn throughout the house.

A crate can prevent this type of disaster from happening. It can also prevent the young, unsupervised animal from hurting himself by chewing electric cords or becoming ill from something he ate during his escapade.

- When travelling with your pet, a crate in your car can protect both your pet and the driver from being disturbed. Whether you choose a plastic crate or a wire cage, you will be doing both you and your pet a favour when you get him his own 'den.'

Walk this way

OWNING a dog can work wonders for your health, much more so than most other pets.

A new survey by Harringtons pet food discovered that dog owners walk their four-legged friends more than 1,000 miles on average each year and play 2,080 rounds of fetch.

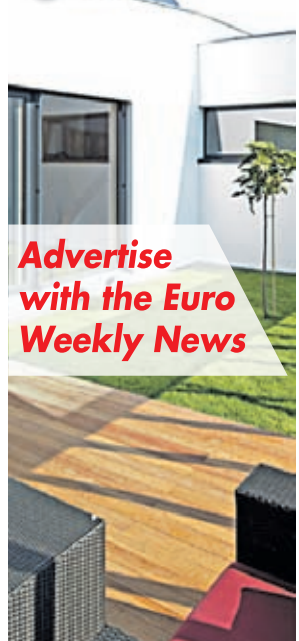

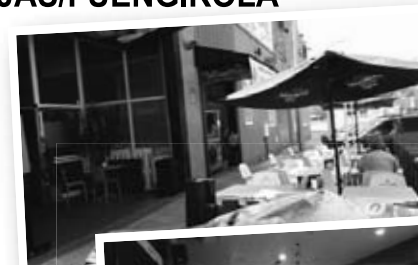

SPV returns to Le Mans Cup action

COSTA DEL SOL-based racing team SPV racing has announced their return to the Michelin Le Mans Cup in 2018.

Entering at least one Ligier LMP3, the team is set to field an experienced line up for the Le Mans Cup, consisting of Malaga-based driver Alvaro Fontes alongside Andy Cummings from Birmingham.

SPV Racing CEO, Raul Garcia, said: "We are very happy to have Alvaro and Andy as drivers in the Michelin Le Mans Cup.

They proved last year that they were very fast with pole position at Red Bull Ring and fifth in the Road to Le Mans qualifying, both are experienced drivers that work very well together and with the team.

"For the Road to Le Mans Races at Le Mans Andy Cummings will be joined by Bradley Ellis who is one of the UK's leading GT and sports car racers crowned British GT Champion in 2007 and runner up in the FIA GT3 Championship 2008."

Ahead of the season start at Circuit Paul Ricard on April 14, SPV Racing began testing on March 6 at the Algarve International Circuit outside Portimao Portugal.

The Algarve circuit is known as a demanding circuit with both high and low speed corners, but mostly it is known for the large elevation changes.

The Portimao circuit will also host the final round in the Michelin Le Mans Cup on October 27.

Lars GV Lindberg, Team Manager for SPV Racing, also claimed that the team may step up to the LMP2 towards the end of season.

He said: "It is great to be back with a strong entry in the Michelin Le Mans Cup. We have a fast car, good team and a strong driver line up. We hope to be able to enter a second LMP 3 car before the season starts and possibly to take the step up to LMP 2 toward the end of the season for one or two races."

The news comes after the Spanish/Swedish team received its Tesla ahead of their involve-

ment in the brand new Electric GT.

The Tesla S P100DL will become the world's first FIA approved Tesla race car which is expected to do 0-100km/h in just 2.1 seconds.

It has now been taken to Campos racing in Barcelona where the team will begin racing at the Formula 1 track on April 23, before undertaking a number of media events on April 30.

And driver, Alvaro Fontes admits he is looking forward to an 'interesting season.'

He said: "For me, it will be an interesting season

combining the testing of the Tesla P100DL for the Electric Production Car Series and driving in the Michelin Le Mans Cup. I look forward to working with the team and sharing the wheel with Andy Cummings."

Spain to take on world champions Germany

SPAIN face a tough double header in their penultimate round of friendly fixtures ahead of this summer's World Cup in Russia.

La Roja will head to current world champions Germany on Saturday, before hosting the Germans' final opponents in 2014, Argentina, at the Wanda Metropolitano in Madrid on Tuesday.

Spain go into the matches in good spirits having not lost a match since the 2016 European Championships, but will be without front man Alvaro Morata after the Chelsea striker was left out by Julen Lopetegui.

The 25-year-old, who has struggled since his €85.7 million (£75 million) move from Real Madrid, got his first goal of 2018 in the 2-1 FA Cup quarter-final win over

Leicester on Sunday but has been replaced by rejuvenated former Chelsea man Diego Costa. There were also first time call-ups for Chelsea's Marcos Alonso, Valencia playmaker Dani Parejo and Villarreal's Rodri.

Speaking to English media, Lopetegui was adamant that his final selection for the World Cup was far from made, but was full of praise for the newcomers in his side.

He said: "There are players who are not on the list whose chances of going to the World Cup are intact.

"We've now got two exciting matches against two great sides and after that everyone will have their chances. The fact players haven't been called is down to various things; form, injuries and also to see new players better."

"We felt it was the right time for them to come in and take a look at them.

"We like (Rodri) a lot. He's very young but he's ready. We've liked watching him a lot, the reports from his club and the under-21's are excellent and we thought it was a good time to see him closer."

Elsewhere, England will hope to secure two victories in their penultimate double header.

England boss Southgate's side will be without key man Harry Kane after he was ruled out until April, as they head to the Netherlands on Saturday ahead of hosting Italy at Wembley on Tuesday.

Southgate has handed a place in the squad to three uncapped players ahead of the fixtures, all looking to state their claim for a place on the plane to the World Cup.

Burnley duo Nick Pope and

James Tarkowski receive their first call-ups on the back of the club's good form this season, alongside Swansea centre-back Alfie Mawson. Bournemouth midfielder Lewis Cook has been called up for the second time after he was originally called up for the 0-0 draw with Brazil in November.

There are also recalls for Arsenal pair Jack Wilshere and Danny Welbeck, while West Brom's Jake Livermore also retains his place in spite of his club side's poor form this season.

West Ham's Joe Hart also retains his place in the three lions' squad despite several high profile mistakes for the struggling Londoners this season, while high profile absentees include Chelsea captain Gary Cahill and Manchester United's Chris Smalling.

Other fixtures will see Argentina play Italy tomorrow (Friday) as well as Russia against Brazil and France take on Colombia before Portugal face the Netherlands on Monday and Germany host Brazil on Tuesday.

SPAIN missed out on automatic qualification to next year's Rugby World Cup in dubious circumstances as they were beaten 18-10 in Brussels amidst ugly scenes at the final whistle.

Los Leones looked on course to qualify for just their second ever World Cup and their first since 1999 ahead of the match, needing just a win over bottom side Belgium in their final qualifying match to leapfrog Romania into top spot.

But Spain were undone as Belgian fly-half Vincent Hart kicked six penalties, scoring all of his sides points in the process, in a game controversially overseen by Romanian referee Vlad Iordachescu and two Romanian assistants.

Tempers flared after the final whistle with several of the Spanish players confronting the referee, while others sarcastically applauded the official's performance as he had to be escorted from the field by security.

The result means that Romania qualified for the 2019 Rugby World Cup and extended their record of competing at every World Cup since its inception in 1987, while Spain must now beat Portugal in a playoff; before the winner faces a two-legged tie against Samoa to secure a place in Japan.

Captain, Jamie Navara, was quick to apologise for his side's actions after the final whistle but remained critical of the referee and his assistants.

He told Radio Marca: "I'm the captain and I would like to apologise for what happened with the referee.

"The image at the end of the game does not represent the sport nor the values of this team. It must be understood however, we've lost part

of our dream."

While Spanish coach, Santiago Santos, also seemed incensed with the way the match was officiated.

"We weren't allowed to play," he told the media.

"The referee kept stopping the game at every moment. Our game was stopped continuously, the

Belgians benefited from many more decisions.

"The difference between penalties against us and for us was huge. When we were trying to come back in the game the play kept on being interrupted."

Reports suggest that the Spanish Rugby Federation (FER) made an official request for the officials to be changed on February 19 given the po-

tential outcome of the fixture.

The appointment was made by Rugby Europe, whose president is former Romanian player Octavian Morariu, as opposed to the governing body World Rugby.

The FER have since made a formal claim to both Rugby Europe and World Rugby for the game to be replayed, while Rugby Europe themselves have also released a statement regarding the match.

It reads: "Rugby Europe has always operated the highest standards of match official selection whatever the competitions. Our structures have provided a pathway for some of the world's top officials.

"While we appreciate that this is a subject of high-emotion, it would be inappropriate to comment on a match official performance before the usual full review has been undertaken.

"This is a usual procedure and occurs for every match.

"(The) Rugby Europe selection committee is waiting for the assessment report of the supervisor for Belgium v Spain match officials. This committee will meet in Poznan next Friday on the occasion of the Rugby Europe U18 Championships.

"Its agenda will be modified and a large portion of the meeting will be devoted to the analysis of every stage of the Belgium v Spain game.

"Following this meeting, a statement will be released to Rugby Europe Board of Directors for dissemination."

And it has now been confirmed that World Rugby will investigate the circumstances, with the governing body stating that it will look at the 'context of events' around the result.

BARCELONA captain Andres Iniesta has revealed that he is considering a move to China.

The four-time Champions League winner returned to the starting line-up for Barcelona from a hamstring injury in their 3-0 Champions League win over Chelsea.

He has won a staggering 30 trophies during his time with the Catalan club including eight league titles, seven Spanish Super Cups, four Champions Leagues, five Copas del Rey, three European Super Cups and three Club World Cups

But the 33-year-old, who is on course to win a ninth La Liga title this season, admits he may make the move in the summer.

"Before April 30 I have to make the decision whether I'm still in Barcelona or I'm going to China. I have to assess what is best for me and for the club," he said.

"It is a decision that I will communicate to the club first and then you will find out. I will make a decision before April 30.

"It will be the most honest for me and for the club."

The Spaniard, who won the World Cup with Spain in 2010 alongside two European Championships in 2008 and 2012, has spent his entire career at Barcelona and has a 'lifetime contract' at the club

Despite this, Barca boss Ernesto Valverde has admitted he is unsure whether Iniesta will remain at the club beyond the end of the season.

"I don't know (what he will do), it's a very personal decision, he has to decide," Valverde told the media after

his side's Champions League victory.

"He has his reasons and will decide what's best for him. I'm not thinking of a Barcelona without Andres Iniesta because right now we have a Barcelona with Andres Iniesta."

Trophy swings into Marbella!

THE first ever ATP Casino Admiral Trophy will be hosted at Marbella's Puente Romano Tennis Club from Saturday until March 31.

The trophy, which is included in the ATP Challenger Tour circuit, will coincide with the start of the clay court season and will act as preparation for players ahead of the French Open at Roland Garros.

And it has now been announced that several high profile players will take part in the inaugural trophy.

Dustin Brown, who famously defeated Rafael Nadal at Wimbledon in 2015, will take part alongside five-time ATP doubles title winner Simone Bolelli, former world number eight Jurgen Melzer and 17-year-old Felix Auger-Aliassime, the first player born in the 21st century to win an ATP match, among many others.

Tournament ambassador, Adrian Menendez, admitted he was very happy with the quality of players attending the tournament.

He said: "This is our first year and the players list is really incredible.

"We can now say that it is not necessary to go the Masters 1,000 in Madrid or to the Masters 500 in Barcelona to enjoy tennis, we have the best here."

Formula One season begins in Australia

THE Formula One season officially kicks off this weekend, getting underway with the Australian Grand Prix on Sunday.

All eyes will be on last year's champion Lewis Hamilton and his battle with Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel, who will both be attempting to win their fifth titles respectively.

Mercedes will also be looking to pick up their fifth consecutive constructors' title this season but the infamous fifth title may be the hardest of all, with several competitors set to rival them for the championship.

Alongside Ferrari, who will be desperate to reclaim the title, Red Bull finished the year hot on Mercedes' heels; and young Red Bull driver Max Verstappen is also tipped for a good year this season.

Verstappen, 20, is one of nine drivers this year under the age of 25 in this year's championship and is an outsider for the title after a strong performance in 2017.

The young Belgian-Dutch driver showed glimpses of what may be to come in 2018 last season with wins in Malaysia and Mexico, and he will certainly be in contention, along with last year's Abu Dhabi champion, Valtteri Bottas and Verstappen's Red Bull teammate, Daniel Ricciardo, whose future still remains seemingly up in the air.

The Australian is out of contract at the end of the season and there is currently no news of him being close to agreeing a new deal, unlike youngster Max Verstappen who signed an extension with the team

until 2020 last year.

If Red Bull hit the ground running, we may see a change of heart from the 28-year-old but a reported 2019 move to Mercedes continues to seem the likeliest alternative at the moment.

Spaniard Fernando Alonso and McLaren will be positive heading into the season after posting the third fastest time in testing, despite five breakdowns, while the Australian GP will also see the return of Alfa Romeo, who teamed up with Sauber ahead of the 2018 season.

This weekend's race in Australia will also be an F1 first as it will be the first ever season opener to feature two four-time world champions.

Action gets underway from 2am tomorrow (Friday) with P1 followed by P2, ahead of Saturday's qualifying, which begins at 7am.

And the season's racing will officially begin at 7.10am on Sunday.

After Australia, the Formula One season heads to Bahrain on April 8 and then Shanghai the following week, before taking a two-week break ahead of the Azerbaijan GP in Baku on April 29.
