Water ban fears ease

THE Junta de Andalucia regional government has eased watering restrictions following heavy rainfall.

Irrigators will now be allowed to water crops more freely, but still 25 per cent less than normal

The Junta told farmers they can use 11 cubic hectometres of water before September 30 after the La Viñuela reservoir almost doubled its water levels during March, gaining 30 cubic hectometres.

A further meeting will take place in mid-May to discuss allowing irrigators further water once it is clear how much water has been stored over the rainy season.

In February, farmers were told they would have to reduce their watering by 60 per cent, a move which was welcomed by irrigators.

The Junta de Andalucia explained subtropical fruit farmers would be offered just 10 hectometres of water for irrigating throughout the year compared to the 23 hectometres normally used.

Alexander Clavero, a spokesman for Plataforma de Aguas de la Axarquia, praised the policy which saw Viñuela's water levels maintained at their current level rather than decreasing as before.

Clavero told one publication the 60 per cent reduction was more effective than the day-long watering bans in place last year as "the next day people consumed more."

Weather chaos

Wind and snow wreak havoc

Extreme weather conditions have wreaked havoc on some of Axarquia's roads.

Strong gusts of wind felled trees in some areas, while others experienced snowfall and heavy rain. Weather conditions are expected to improve over the coming week, however, with temperatures reaching a maximum of 20 degrees over the Easter weekend.

During this week's dramatic weather, one large pine fell across the A7207 Torrox-Competa road, forcing motorists to edge along the mountain's edge to pass by.

Branches and debris also littered the roads until workers were able to cone off and later remove the tree.

Some residents also reported falling roof tiles, landslides, metal rods buckling under the force

of the wind and even walls collapsing. In Canillas de Albaida, Alfarnate and Alfarnateio. others reported snowfall, with some settling on the countryside.

Jorge Martin, the may-

or of Canillas de Albaida, explained the snow had not caused any problems in the town and did not pose a risk to motorists as it had not settled on the main road. The snow fell for just over one hour while the outside temperature measured nine degrees.

Overnight temperatures in several mountain towns, including Competa and Archez, fell to around minus one.

Arsonist arrested

A MAN has been detained for allegedly setting light to the car of a politician's mother.

The accused, known only as BAR, is also being investigated for attempting to burn an EMMSA cleaning vehi-

Ezequiel Carnero, the politician whose mother's car was destroyed in the blaze, congratulated the police on arresting the suspect. He explained, "The problem was related to an EMM-SA issue," adding, "I was in the middle of a conflict with this company after denouncing irregular practices by workers who did not meet their schedules."

The incidents took place last November when Carnero's mother's car was burnt out around 1am, following claims he had been threatened. The politician said, "I feel harassed and persecuted, and the worst of all is my mother and sister are afraid even to open the windows of the house."

Carnero said the fire started outside the house which he shares with his mother and sister, explaining, "We had not moved it all day and the fire started on a wheel, it's very suspicious," he

The Local Police and firefighters attended the scene, extinguishing the flames. The car could not be saved, however, and was almost completely destroyed except for its rear wheels

Rank holiday

Sewage spills into sea over Easter

STORMY weather has broken an underwater sewage pipe off Neria's coast.

Raw human waste was spotted floating off the beach as Spain celebrates Holy Week, with thousands of holidaymakers flocking to the town.

Speaking exclusively to the Euro Weekly News, Greg Caldecott, who has lived in Spain for the last two years after leaving his native Liverpool, said: "There was a grey slick heading towards Torrox and on close inspection I could see that it contained raw sewage, I can't believe the pipe is leaking again after they 'fixed' it last vear."

The council said it has informed company Aguas de Narixa which will carry out repairs after a piece of pipe broke off at around 200 metres out to sea.

The pipeline was repaired last March in a € 100,000 project after a leak caused a 'geyser' of sewage to form off the beaches. Witnesses said the raw sewage was visible from popular attrac-

tion the Balcon de Europa.

Almost half the municipality's sewage is pumped through the underwater pipeline untreated before it is let out to see at around 1,000 metres off shore.

The council says this distance is far enough for the current to take the waste out to sea. However, when the pipeline leaks waste it is expelled far nearer to the coast and is instead brought in by the motion of the waves.

Tummy bug sparks fury

AROUND 30 students have become ill with food poisoning from a school trip.

Rincon de la Victoria Council says it is now considering filing a complaint against a Sevilla restaurant after pupils at IES Bezmiliana fell ill after an excur-

The school trip to a theatre festival ended in disaster after students, teachers and parents came down with vomiting and diarrhoea after dining in a restaurant in Santiponce, Sevilla.

The victims fell ill as they made their way home from the trip before the majority were then forced to visit health centres the next day. None of the group required hospital attention, however.

The school trip had seen

a group travel by bus from Rincon de la Victoria to the Roman ruins in Sevilla, where they took part in a classical theatre festival alongside several other schools from Andalucia.

Doctors say they believe the source of the alleged food poisoning could be the meat served in the Meson El Olivo restaurant in Santiponce.

Another school group from Cordoba are also said to have become ill after eating at the same venue.

Antonio Jose Martin. councillor for Education and Culture, explained, "we coordinated with the health services and Local Police to tell all the participants of the trip to go to the emergency room even if they did not have very serious symptoms."

Health demand

A POLITICAL PARTY is demanding further health services in Rincon de la Victoria. Ciudadanos have said the town needs dentistry, ultrasound and radiology services to serve its residents. The current health setup is only designed to cater for 45,000 people.

Troubled water

POLITICIANS are criticising Nerja Council over alleged delays in building bridges over the rios Chillar and Seco. The Partido Popular and Ciudadanos have said the project is in "paralysis" and complained nothing has been done since the beginning of 2015. Ciudadanos said the delay was "incomprehensible."

Safety first

RINCON DE LA VICTORIA Council is reorganising traffic in Torre de la Benagalbon to improve road safety. The council is introducing new traffic signalling on Calle Osario as well as installing wooden planters along Avenida de la Candelaria to make it safer for pedestrians to walk along the street.

Outdoor theatre

A PROJECT to build a 500-seat outdoor auditorium in Rincon de la Victoria will cost €350,000. The building will offer space for larger shows as the town's other venues can only offer space for between 110 and 180 people. The site will be located in the Parque Julian Huerta area.



THE biggest religious festival of the year is underway across Spain.

Elaborate processions continue to take place today (Thursday), tomorrow and Sunday as Holy Week (Semana Santa) draws to a close.

Organised by brotherhoods known as cofradias, the spectacular events see members known as nazarenos parade through towns and cities dressed in the capirote. a conical hood traditionally used to cover the faces of penitents.

And while the more traditional, sombre processions take place in cities including Zamora in Castilla-La Mancha, where the celebration dates back to 1179, it is in Andalucia where glamour and a holiday atmosphere are to the

The most jaw-dropping festivities take place in regional capital Sevilla and Malaga on the Costa del Sol, attracting hundreds of thousands of spectators and serving up some stunning images.

The biggest draw in Sevilla is this evening's La Madruga, which runs during the night on Maundy Thursday and continues into the early hours of Good Friday.

In Malaga the cofradias carry huge, heavy tronos (thrones, known elsewhere as pasos) depicting scenes from the Passion of Christ or the Sorrows of Virgin Mary on their shoulders.

SPAIN could finally be ready to exorcise the ghosts of its bloodiest internal conflict.

This Saturday marks 79 years since the end of the Spanish Civil War.

And a new museum in Teruel, Aragon, is set to become the first in the country dedicated to telling the story of the three-year battle.

The war began when General Francisco Franco's troops launched a brutal nationalist military uprising against the democratically elected Republican government of president Manuel Azaña on July 17, 1936.

By 1937 the nationalists had captured much of northern Spain, while Madrid was under siege.

In 1938 and 1939 they advanced on Cataluña, cutting off Barcelona from the capital and sealing Franco's victory on April 1, 1939.

But the conflict was distorted in the four decades until his death in 1975, as the dictator attempted to airbrush the Republicans from Spain's history books, and the issue has on the whole been neglected by governments since. A recent survey revealed that 69 per cent of 14-to 17-year-olds in Spain received 'little to no' information about the civil war in school history classes. War memorials that appeared across Spain in the wake of the war named only the Nationalist dead, while the relatives of thousands of missing Republicans were told to 'say nothing and forget' as Franco brainwashed a nation. It is only in the last decade that a generational shift has been sparked, after the controversial Law of Historical Memory was in 2007 passed by socialist prime minister Jose Zapatero.

The decree formally condemned the Franco regime and honoured victims on both sides.

And it has culminated in a move that would previously have been unthinkable, as the city of Teruel, which was bombed by both sides in a famous battle, seeks the green light to begin work on the country's first official civil war museum.

Should it go ahead, it could mark an important step in Spain coming to terms with its fascist past.

Brexit link triggers democracy doubt

THE Vote Leave revelations bring into question the very democratic foundations of the UK.

Pro-Brexit whistleblower Shahmir Sanni, former treasurer of campaign organisation BeLeave, claimed that his supposedly independent operation was used to funnel €712,000 to a digital services firm on behalf of the official Vote Leave campaign.

He also said Vote Leave and BeLeave shared office space and the campaign fronted by Conservative MPs Boris Johnson and Michael Gove advised the latter how it should spend money.

If proven, Sanni's claims could mean the Vote Leave campaign violated election rules, according to reports, first by making an unofficial donation and second by working alongside another campaign organisation with which it did not share a

And the situation has arguably been worsened in the wake of evidence given to the Commons culture committee by former Cambridge Analytica employee Christopher Wylie.

He told MPs: "I think it is completely reasonable to say there could have been a different outcome of the referendum had there not been, in my view, cheating."

When considered together, the allegations raise serious concerns about the Brexit result, and more importantly, whether Britain's democracy remains intact.

And that should trigger alarm bells in leavers and remainers alike.

Full steam ahead

THE Junta de Andalucia has said it wants Malaga's new hospital to be built at "maximum speed."

Marina Alvarez, Minister for Health, said the Junta will support the plan and hopes the new building will be located at the back of the Materno Hospital "if technically possible."

Previously, a former health minister, Jose Luis Garcia de Arboleya, said Malaga could not cope without another hospital. He explained a group of experts had compiled a 300page report considering the impact of building an 800bed hospital on the land behind the Materno Infantil.



Under the proposals the

current Carlos Haya Hospital would become a 400or 500-bed hospital for patients with chronic conditions. In turn, the Hospital Civico would become a research and training hospital. Around 300 people helped create the document, with sources saying, "We are confident that what we have proposed will go forward."

Call for calm

THE mayor of Velez-Malaga has asked for calm over the future of the town's housing company.

Emvipsa, which is under municipal control, is thought to be in a precarious financial situation but Mayor Antonio

Moreno Ferrer has assured the council it is "not endangered."

Moreno Ferrer has said the company will be handed €4.2 million in parcels of land to help balance its books and save its 750 employees.

Last year Mayor Ferrer came under scrutiny after it was alleged he created a job for his own son as a health and safety worker. The investigation began after a spokesman for the Partido Popular (PP), Francisco Delgado Bonilla, claimed the son of the company's former manager, Jose Luis Sanchez Tore, was employed, "without

procedure, to the point that he was first hired and then afterwards the technician role was created?

The PP allege the job was a 'prize' after Sanchez Tore helped broker a deal between political parties PSOE and Grupo Independiente Pro Municipio de Torre del Mar (GIPMTM), allowing Antonio Moreno Ferrer to become mayor.

The actual hiring took place while Ferrer was still president of Emvipsa. The PP claimed the hiring was "an arbitrary decision," and twice wrote to Emvipsa asking for the contract to be voided.

Two to go

VELEZ-MALAGA'S landmark commercial park only has two free spaces.

The Tecnoalimentario Park is welcoming offers from interested companies after one of its remaining spaces was taken by Malaga company Perymuz.

The business, which sells food and drinks to hotels, bought two plots measuring 3,000 square metres for €468,000. Antonio Moreno Ferrer, mayor of Velez-Malaga, explained the park was, "becoming an example of the industrialisation of the agri-food sector and a space for innovation and business development." He added an aeronautical company was interested in taking one of the last remaining plots.

In October last year the Junta de Andalucia offered €240 million in aid to help businesses in Velez-Malaga, including those planning on settling in the Tecnoalimentario Park.

Mayor Ferrer said two grants would be given, one for research, development and innovation and the other for digital transformation and job creation.

The funds will be managed by the Andalucia Agency for Innovation and Development and will be accessed until 2020.







€27.5m budget approved

SEVERAL projects in Nerja can go ahead after the council finally approved its 2018 budget.

Almost €5 million will go towards investments in street and beach cleaning, equipment for the Local Police and sports facilities following the move.

The budget, which had been rejected by opposition parties in February, finally passed following the abstention of the opposing Partido Popular (PP) and Ciudadanos. Failure to approve a budget in 2017 left politicians unable to move forward with several planned projects.

Last week a spokesperson for Ciudadanos expressed optimism the bill would pass this time, explaining, "There have been changes since the last draft." The PP, were not as hopeful however, saying they had 'detected a series of errors' in the draft budget.

In February it was revealed the coalition team faced resistance from opposing parties over the €27.5 million document.

A similar situation last year saw Nerja's 2016 budget carry over into 2017 after politicians failed to agree a new bill. Commenting on the council's 2018 draft budget one councillor Lola Sanchez criticised the coalition for "demanding approval in a hurry in just five days without the analysis such an important document requires," Councillor Sanchez capitulated this week, however, supporting the bill and allowing it to pass.

Trial suspended

A CASE against a mayor has been suspended following an argument over the court's legitimacy.

The trial against Abdeslam Lucena, mayor of Benamocarra, will be delayed until it can be decided whether its court is qualified to handle the case.

Lucena faces a seven year and nine month ban from holding office after being accused of two crimes against civic rights. Prosecuting lawvers claim his crimes hold a maximum sentence of 10 years' suspension and therefore should be tried in a crim-

The mayor's own defence lawyer has also claimed the trial should be halted on the grounds his client's fundamental rights have been vio-

The accused faces trial for 'repeatedly and without cause' withholding municipal information requested by two councillors in 2011. The prosecutor claims Lucena had 'full

Tax hike

VELEZ-MALAGA Council has been forced to withdraw tax breaks for its residents.

The Junta de Andalucia regional government has given the council 30 days to stop granting property tax (IBI) aid to families in the municipality.


Juan Carlos Marquez, councillor for Finance, explained the council has no intention of complying with the ban, however, saying the aid has been in force for the past 10 years. He complained, "We do not understand how the council was not required to overturn the grant before when the same laws were in force as they are now."

Last year Velez-Malaga Council claimed the tax relief would assist around 26,200 families, with aid capped at €500 per home and €1,500 for multiple properties.

Juan Carlos Marquez confirmed, "the council made a particular effort to fit this aid into our budget," adding, "we have set aside €4.3 million for assistance in 2017, including helping those who were previously ineligible, and we are prepared to consider increasing this amount to deal with demand if nec-

Anyone renting or owning a home in the Velez-Malaga area that missed paying their tax in any year between 2012 and 2016 was previously eligible. Renters were required to provide a rental agreement or some other proof of living at the premises.

Spain lodges FB complaint

SPAIN has accused embattled social network Facebook of abusing the data of 21 million users. It comes as the Cambridge Analytica scandal continues to engulf the American firm, with the Brexit campaign and senior UK politicians including Boris Johnson and Michael Gove now implicated.

And the Spanish Agency for Data Protection has accused the online giant of illegally collecting data on political ideologies, religious beliefs, gender and personal tastes of millions of accounts in Spain.

Handshake boosts budget

SPANISH Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy could finally get his 2018 budget

Negotiations have been frozen for weeks with opposition groups unwilling to sign off the conservative minority government's proposals.

But Albert Rivera, leader of centreleft Cuidadanos - Spain's fourth-largest political party - has revealed that he has reached an agreement to support the budget after Rajoy 'yielded' to some of his demands.

These include an increase of 2 per cent on minimum state pensions, a

salary boost for young workers, an extra week of paternity leave for new fathers, €1,000 per year grants for the education of children aged 0 to three years, income tax reductions for those earning less than €17,000 per year, and the dismissal of Senator Pilar Barreiro, who is under investigation for fraud, forgery and em-

"The government knows how to count seats and without our support this [budget] could not happen," Rivera told Spanish media.

Rajoy must now appeal to other par-

ties to get the budget approved, since he remains seven seats short of a majority vote despite Cuidadanos' support.

He is expected to appeal to Basque nationalist party PNV, but its leaders have repeatedly said they will not negotiate the budget while the controversial Article 155, invoked by Rajoy to impose direct rule over Cataluña last October, remains active.

A PNV official said: "The latest events in Cataluña and Spain have left us very concerned, and talking about budgets seems a little frivolous... let them find support from other groups."

Exec rakes in €20m salary

REAL MADRID boss Florentino Perez' number two has become the highest-paid executive in Spain. Marcelino Fernandez Verdes, CEO of civil engineering firm ACS and president of German subsidiary Hochtief, last year earned € 20.46 million to top the national ranking by more than €4 million.

The businessman is lined up to assume presidency of ACS when Perez eventually steps aside, with the latter's pension fund currently amounting to a jaw-dropping €41 million, according to reports in Spanish media.

Rise in audiences boosts gig profits

SPAIN'S live music industry is booming.

A new report by the country's Asociacion de Promotores Musicales (APM) shows that ticket sales increased by 20.6 per cent to €296.2 million in 2017.

"Spain's consolidation as an unavoidable destination for the big tours by international artists... especially in large venues selling out thousands of tickets, like the Rolling Stones and U2, as well as a new market comprised of Latin stars like Ricky Martin, Maluma, Luis Fonsi and Morat, were reasons for a fourth-year increase in live music profits," says the study.

Ricky Martin was the biggest draw, with 115,806 people drawn to his One World tour, while more than 91,000 saw November Rain hitmakers Gun N' Roses and Colombian reggaeton star Maluma attracted almost 71.000.

Dram good performance

BOTTOMS UP AS WHISKY SALES SKYROCKET

SPANIARDS' favourite tipple is whisky, a report says.

According to the latest data from the Spanish Federation of Spirit Drinks (FEBE), 214 million litres of spirits were sold across the country in 2016.

The boozy blowout produced revenues of almost \in 7.6 billion - \in 1 billion more than UK drinkers spent over the same period - and provided 330,000 jobs while swelling the public treasury's coffers with €1.3 billion obtained via indirect taxes.

And consumers chose whisky as their go-to imbibe, as year-on-year sales grew by almost 2 per cent for a 27 per cent market share.

Trendy rival gin was the second-most popular spirit, accounting for 22 per cent of the market as sales increased by 9.9 per cent.

But rum sales dropped by 2.3 per cent, leaving the Caribbean classic a distant third in the market with a 16 per cent share.

Less popular still were liqueurs (13 per cent), brandy (9), anisette (7), vodka (5) and tequila (1).

A FEBE official confirmed that figures for 2017 are currently being analysed but are not expected to differ wildly from 2016, meaning 'whisky will be the most-consumed beverage, followed by gin and

Scotch whiskies topped the national brand ranking, accounting for 73 per cent of sales, with Johnnie Walker, Ballantine's, J&B, Chivas, Grant's and William Lawson's among the most popular.

The gin market was more evenly-spread, with 47 per cent of boozers opting for Spanish brands and 53 per cent preferring international products, with Malaga's Larios 12 the best-selling overall.

Rum sales were dominated by dark varieties, which accounted for

86 per cent of the market, while the most popular brands included Bacardi and Havana Club from Cuba, plus Barcelo and Brugal from the Dominican Republic.

But Vicente Montecinos, director of market research group NPD, believes that vodka will be the next big thing in Spain.

"Vodka is a growing market," he told Spanish media. "Spirits move slowly with fashions and trendy brands including Smirnoff, Absolut, Grey Goose and Zubrowka are becoming more popular.

"The Spanish vodka Basmmon, made from potatoes, has won international awards and is another that is on the rise."

Gross domestic product record as Aragon tops regional charts

THE Spanish economy continues to grow.

And new data from the National Statistics Institute has revealed that gross domestic product (GDP) last year rose most in Aragon among the country's autonomous com-

The northern region saw its GDP increase by 3.6 per cent in 2017, with Asturias (3.5 per cent) and Madrid (3.4 per cent) completing the top three.

These figures eclipse the European average of 2.4 per cent, with only Castilla y Leon (1.9 per cent), and La Rioja (1.8), plus the African enclaves of Ceuta and Melilla falling to beat the bench-

GDP per capita smashed records in 2017 with Madrid (€33,809) topping the rankings, followed by the Basque Country (€33,088) and Navarra (€30,809).

EQUITY FUNDS 'ARE LIKE MIGRATING BIRDS' €10bn deal world's biggest

IT was the biggest real estate deal of 2017.

The €10 billion agreement which saw American asset management firm Blackstone snap up the property portfolio owned by failed Spanish bank Banco Popular leads the worldwide ranking for sales involving a single asset or portfolio.

It came after rival banking group Santander acquired Banco Popular for a token €1 last June, and involved forming a company of which Blackstone bought a controlling 51 per cent stake.

The remaining 49 per cent remains with Santander as part of its Banco popular rescue package.

It leaves Blackstone, which also picked up the housing portfolio of Catalunya Caixa - now part of BBVA - among others, as one of the largest real estate owners in Spain.

And the huge deal was followed a few months later by American private equity firm Cerberus Capital Management successfully bid-

ding €5.5 billion for 80 per cent of BBVA's property portfolio.

"It is striking how some of the opportunistic private equity funds move in flocks like migratory birds," says Borja Sierra, international executive vice-president of real estate consultancy firm Savills Aguirre Newman.

"One minute they are calm in a pond in Africa and then they start flying and travel 4,500 kilometres

to an island in the middle of the ocean to breed.

"This happened in Spain from

"One of the birds usually starts the flight and takes the lead, marking the direction of travel, and in this case it is Blackstone.

"They have consistently been pioneers and trend markers for their competitors, and as big investors they don't get involved in small operations."

Compiled by New York-based real estate number-crunchers Real Capital Analytics, the list shows that five of the 10 most expensive deals not involving a company takeover last year took place in China, with two in the UK.

The latter pair of sales included the € 5.1 billion acquisition of shares in a portfolio of hospitals and nursing homes by Chinese insurer Taikang, and a €2.1 billion stake in the Bluewater shopping centre in Kent purchased by Royal London Mutual Insurance Society.

€500m energy deal confirmed

AMERICAN multinational banking giant JP Morgan has become Spain's biggest investor in solar energy.

The financial services firm has revealed it is to snap up a €500 million controlling stake in a 660 megawatt solar project in southern Spain and Portugal via its investment vehicle Sonnedix.

The scheme includes a number of plants in Andalucia, Extremadura and Murcia, which will generate 495 megawatts, with the remaining 165 megawatts produced by Portuguese facilities.

Together, the project will generate enough electrical energy to power 400,000 homes per year, with Barcelona-based supplier Audax signing a 20-year deal in what is reckoned to be the biggest long-term solar power contract ever agreed in Spain.

Spain remains on debt row

TARGET BEATEN BUT DEFICIT STILL EXCESSIVE

SPANISH Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy has revealed that the country met its European Union (EU) debt target for the first time last year.

The leader tweeted: 'Spain achieves: we have in 2017 reduced the public deficit to 3.07 per cent (4.3 per cent in 2016). A fundamental fact to continue growing, create employment and guarantee our public services." It is the smallest difference between public spending and revenue that Spain has registered since the financial crisis broke out a decade ago, and just beats the 2017 target of 3.1 per cent set by the EU.

The final figure of 3.07 per cent is equivalent to an overspend of €35.7 million, a Treasury official confirmed.

It sees Spain continue to claw its way out of a financial black hole triggered by the international banking crisis of 2008, which was later deepened after the country's housing bubble burst in 2009.

The twin collapse saw public debt soar to 11 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP) after it climbed by more than €100 million in the

But the economy has recently spluttered into life, growing by around 3 per cent per year since 2015 and slowly reducing debt in the wake of sweeping cuts and tax increases which in 2012 totalled €65 billion of austerity measures.

The government has been working to a model designed by Finance Minister Cristobal Montoro which has been dubbed the 'Montoro adjustment,' whereby a small increase in public spending is permitted provided the total is lower than the nominal growth in GDP (with inflation).

Spain will however remain in the EU's Excessive Debt Procedure (EDP), a corrective process for countries with a public deficit of more than 3 per cent, for at least another year.

It could soon be the only one of the EU's 28 member states with an open procedure after the UK, Greece, Portugal and Croatia last year exited the process, with France expected to follow.

EU officials reportedly believe that Rajoy's government has intentionally maintained the EDP because if Spain was to reduce debt below 3 per cent new limits would be imposed, including a €7 billion 'structural adjustment' that would force Madrid into further cuts or tax hikes. The 2018 deficit target for Spain is 2.3 per cent, but there is a widespread consensus in Brussels that the country will again fail to meet it and will instead try to remain at least a 10th above 3 per cent in order to avoid the new adjustment, with regional

Blue passport fury as British firm snubbed

UK HOME SECRETARY Amber Rudd signed off a €560 million blue passport deal without knowing who had won the contract, it has been claimed.

The controversial deal will see post-Brexit British passports produced by Gemalto, a European company listed on the Dutch and French stock exchanges.

And according to the Home Office, the process was a blind tender, meaning ministers had no clue which firm submitted each bid.

IIK-based De La Rue and French company Oberthur also competed for the contract, with the final result sparking a major backlash, with critics calling the decision a 'humiliating symbol' of the post-Brexit UK.

But the Home Office said the deal will save taxpavers €137 million over five years.

Social security fraud savaged

THE Spanish labour inspectorate has slammed a 'huge' social security fraud.

It comes after the Social Security department revealed that an estimated 300,000 'false' self-employed people in Spain receive more than 75 per cent of their income from a single client.

An official from the labour inspectorate told the Congress that the majority are forced to register as self-employed 'so that the company that pays them does not have to pay social security.'

But the practice may now be living on borrowed time after Fermin Yebenes Salices, president of the Labour Inspectors' Union, appeared before a government subcommittee to discuss reforms to self-employed labour laws in order to crack down on the problem.

INHERITANCE TAX SHAKE-UP ANNOUNCED Non-EU loophole slams shut

SPAIN'S highest court has ruled the Spanish practice that charges non-residents of Spain a higher rate of inheritance tax to be discriminatory and therefore unlaw-

According to reports, this has now left the window open for those who have paid the higher rate to file claims for refunds.

In a landmark case, the Spanish Supreme Court has ruled that the practice is no longer acceptable even if the non residents of Spain live in a third country that isn't part of the European Union.

As a result, non-European Economic Area (EEA) citizens that have paid Spanish inheritance tax in the last four years are expected to now be able to apply for a re-

According to Madrid-based tax partner of Cuatrecasas law firm, Antonio Barba, said the judgement will have a 'huge impact on Spain's current inheritance and gift tax rules by not only forcing Span-

ish authorities to amend the current legislation but "opens the door for taxpayers to claim refunds of all taxes paid under the discriminative rules in the past four years, the standard term of the statute of limitations for taxes."

He told International Investment: "We estimate several hundred non-EU taxpayers to be entitled to apply for a refund of inheritance tax-

> es paid [by them] to Spain during the last four years.

"Just think that many provinces of Spain, [such as] Baleares and Andalucia, where foreign investments in real estate are huge.

"Most of the investors are EU residents - who are not affected by this last judgement, as the law was amended to give them tax breaks two years ago. But there are still quite a few investments from the US, Latin America, China, etc."

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Checking your details at the roadside

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

AS they go about their duties patrolling the roads of Spain, the Guardia Civil traffic police have a whole range of tools in their arsenal to both help those in need, and of course deal with those drivers who break the law

One piece of kit carried by all of the officers, often stored in the panniers of their motorbikes, or inside their patrol cars, is their Personal Digital Assistant, or PDA.

The device is linked via Bluetooth to a thermal printer, and so able to issue fines on the spot, and pools its data with the central office of the DGT traffic depart-

The PDA can be used to check driver and vehicle details, such as if you are actually qualified to drive, if you've been banned, if you own the vehicle you are driving, and details about that vehicle and its insurance.

The whole process of checking the information is almost instantaneous, but it can take a lot longer if the information provided by the driver is either inaccurate, or unknown.

One particular problem facing foreign drivers is when they are not registered as residents in Spain, or have not transferred their licence to a Spanish one.

For those who have, you are likely to be sent on your way a lot quicker than those with no registered details, as a single check of a driver's NIE number links all of the relevant driver and vehicle details together, so

the officers can almost instantly find the information they are looking to confirm.

However, when the information is not linked, such as for drivers who haven't swapped to a Spanish licence, then the process takes a lot longer to complete, and your journey is likely to be increasingly delayed as a result.

Converting your UK licence to a Spanish version is a relatively easy process. 

Hair is made up of a chain of proteins so having a deficiency will directly impact your hair.


Therefore, it is important to supplement your diet with alternative sources of protein such as pulses, and speak to a nutritionist if you need more advice.



An unnatural fizz



VINHO VERDE is not a 'green' wine nor a grape, but a region (DOC) for its produc-

It may be red, white or rose, and translates as 'young wine' usually consumed three to six months after harvest. Vinho Verde in northern Portugal the nation's largest wine region - has produced wine for more than 2.000 years, and is now responsible for approximately 85 million litres each year, of which 86 per cent is white.

Made from local grape varieties Loureiro, Arinto, Trajadura, Avesso, and Azal, the whites are lemon - or strawcoloured with 8.5 to 11 per cent alcohol. The most successful is Alvarinho, which displays tropical aromas, an

overall lemony character, high acidity and alcohol levels, and Loureiro which is more floral.

White Vinho Verde are light and fresh and known for vibrant fruit, natural acidity and low alcohol which makes them ideal for pairing with seafood, salads and Asian cuisine, or served as an aperitif.

The reds made mostly from Vinhão, Borraçal and Amaral grapes have an inky texture, are low in alcohol, have sour flavours and are seldom exported. The roses are fresh and fruity, and usually from Espadeiro and Padeiro grapes.

Many of the Vinho Verde wines have a light fizz, originally a natural by-product of fermentation in the bottle, but nowadays a result of added carbon dioxide mainly for enmasse export as better labels do not have any bubbles.

The Vinho Verde image as a young wine has led importers pressing producers to deliver wines freshly bottled, thereby preventing the development of high quality single-varietal labels. Popularity of Vinho Verde has surged in the last decade with consumers discovering it as one of the most affordable and versatile wines on the market, with prices from around €5.





THE recent wet weather this winter is enough to keep even the most enthusiastic gardener out of the garden.

Waterlogged soil is best not walked on if it is for growing plants. The compaction of saturated soil is very damaging, as

Growing the Sun Parasol or Mandevilla

fects of compression last and cause clods of soil in summer that are difficult for plant roots to penetrate. This doesn't mean no gardening, indoor gardening is always a possibility.

Tropical species are a very popular form of plant for indoor gardening. They give a different range of plants that cannot be grown in the outdoor Mediterranean garden.

If you grow tropical plants in pots they can grace the terrace or balcony in summer and be retired to the indoors in winter, or they can be a permanent indoor feature in a bright, warm area of the home.

A favourite, which is hardy and fast-growing in the right conditions, is the impressive glossy-leaved trumpet flowered Mandevilla, also called the Sun or Summer Parasol.

It originates from tropical Central America where it is a climbing plant. It was named after British explorer and diplomat Henry Mandevilla who first botanically identified it.

A Mandevilla needs plenty of sunlight or it will not flower profusely. It is very cold-tender so must be kept in a warm place above 10°C throughout winter. They will thrive in a

large container with a good soil mixture and will grow over a metre a year in good conditions and up to seven metres in length on maturity.

Peach Mandevilla.

It will need a trellis or structure to grow up or along to give it support, unless you keep it very well pruned in autumn when flowers are less frequent. Pruning is also recommended to encourage multiple stems to spread growth by creating more branching to have a more intensive flower display.

Prolific flowering can be fur-

ther promoted by pinching off the spent flowers and as flowers form mostly on the current years growth, the pruning is done in a way to encourage this new growth.

If you are moving the container from outdoors for winter hibernation and protection from the cold, you can submerge the container in water for at least a few minutes to flush out any ants or other insects which you don't want in-

Wash the upper part of the

plant also and allow the plant to dry and drain well after soaking before moving inside.

In winter, when temperatures drop, it is best to reduce watering so the soil mix is just moist as excess water amplifies the cold effect around the roots.

Low light intensity in winter usually stops it flowering. This can be true in summer if indoors without sufficient light. The leaves may drop in winter if exposed to cold. If this happens reduce water to just moist.

TRAINING dogs does not give the end product; dog's natural instinct plays a vital

Man first domesticated dogs because he had so many instincts which could be useful.

When we think that man has used the dog for many thousands of years for his own benefit, it is very difficult to understand why so few owners and trainers can differentiate between instinct and intelligence.

Instinct is an urge from within which makes a dog act in certain ways and has no connection with intelli-

A dog's first instinct is to survive. When he is born the pup squirms about until he finds a teat and then sucks it. No intelligence or learning

by any association plays a part in this process. The maternal instinct tells the female to clean up the foetal membrane etc and stir the puppy into action by licking

The female is not taught this, she has not seen another female do this. Most instincts provide pleasure to the dog and because the dog associates the action with pleasure the instinct grows stronger with usage.

In my opinion instinct is something which is either there or not there. Instinct can be strengthened, weakened or diverted, it cannot be put there and it cannot be taken away, it might lie dormant, but once developed it can never be weakened again. I always explain this when people want their dog to be trained for man work, once aggression is raised in this manner it cannot be re-

A dog with an obsession for chasing balls can be controlled by training and by providing other outlets for his energy, the same way if a young dog is diverted the first time he chases a car he may give up the idea, but if he is allowed to chase cars the hunting instinct becomes stronger, and in no time it will be very difficult, even impossible, to cure the habit.

Instinct covers survival, maternal, hunting, guarding pack and self-preservation.

Self-preservation makes dogs furtive and afraid of the unfamiliar, this is no use to man. This nervousness in the domestic dog is, in my opinion, one of the common causes of problems in present-day dogs.

This instinct of selfpreservation has been weakened by simply breeding from bold dogs rather than nervous ones, but has never been entirely removed.






