THE SUN AND WIND?

Mayor backs prison plans

RAMON FERNANDEZ PACHECO, the mayor of Almeria City, has met with petitioners at the council's headquarters who gathered signatures in support of expanding so-called permanent prison sentences.

Fernandez Pacheco was joined by fellow members of the conservative Partido Popular (PP) who supported efforts to add more crimes to the list of those which qualify for the penalty.

The mayor said he supported the push to expand the sentencing powers. He said the penalty would be used against people who showed they could not be rehabilitated and were likely to commit further crimes on release.

Revisable permanent prison sentences give courts powers to put people found guilty of the most serious crimes in prison indefinitely, or until they are deemed fit for release

Those in favour of the sentences argue they are needed to deter serious crimes and that such penalties exist elsewhere in Europe.

Opponents of the sentence claim it does away with attempts to rehabilitate criminals and that it would see some spend the rest of their lives behind bars.

Recent efforts to expand the sentences were unsuccessful after Spain's parliament voted against PP proposals. Debate became more charged in the wake Ana Quezada's murder of Gabriel

Murder probe

Expat held over suspected killing

A Lithuanian man has been remanded in custody on suspicion of murdering his partner in the British expatriate hotspot of Al-

Known only as MP, the alleged murderer faces up to 15 years in prison for murder charges.

The 48-year-old victim reported him to police in 2016, but he was later acquitted in court, according to the provincial Women's Institute.

A post mortem examination revealed that Maria del Carmen died of blood loss but the method of murder remains unclear.

Medics pronounced the woman dead after the suspect, 38. himself called an ambulance. finding her body in the toilet of the couple's Calle Longo home.

According to reports there were numerous altercations between the couple along the years, as well as several restraining orders put forward, but blocked by the victim who refused to stand against the accused in court.

The latest alleged case of domestic violence has sparked outrage, with several demon-

Desperate appeal

A FAMILY in Almeria has demanded the Andalucian Health Service help with their two sons, six and nine, who are suffering from an unknown developmental disease, and are now too old to be treated by the Early Infancy Treatment Programme.

Manhole fall

Council to pay compensation

ALMERIA Council will have to pay compensation for a man who became trapped after falling through a faulty manhole cover.

Witnesses reported seeing a man fall 'up to his waist' down a hole in the street, who had to be rescued and transferred to hospital.

When the victim took the incident to the courts, the council argued the manhole cover - which slipped off when he stood on it - belonged to a private company and therefore the issue should have been taken up with them. The Andalucian Claims Consulate (CAA) ruled however that 'the accident occurred on a public walkway' and therefore 'the responsibility for its maintenance lies with the council' as permits and licences are needed to carry out works on public grounds.

€48.42m windfall

THE Junta's Ministry of Finance has transferred € 12.1 million to the towns and cities of Almeria Province, as part of the first tranche of its regional funding commit-

Throughout 2018, the province is expected to receive €48.42 million in unconditional investment, distributed over four payments.

The funding allows local authorities to establish their spending priorities in exercising their autonomous powers.

In terms of the total endowment for Andalucia in 2018, €480 million has been ringfenced despite the fiscal consolidation of the central government.

In addition, the budget of Almeria Council for this

year has grown 7.8 per cent according to the Municipal Cooperation Plan, representing a total of €1.1 mil-

This sum is mainly intended for the development of employment plans and community social services.

All local authorities in the province receive the funds in four quarterly instalments, and the distribution is made on a formulaic basis.

The formula is calculated according to population, geographical dispersion, urbanisation and fiscal capaci-



Tomato sales

ALMERIA Province exported more tomatoes than the entire country of Morocco, according to the latest data from the United Nations. The province sent 537.6 million kilograms overseas compared to Morocco's 524.9 in 2016, with Almeria's exports accounting for almost 60 per cent of Spain's total.



IT is Europe's second largest congregation of greater flamingos, and the only inland site where they breed.

And the courtship dance of 40,000 of the majestic birds is underway at Laguna Fuente de Piedra, one of the largest natural lakes in the Iberian Peninsula.

Measuring 6.5 kilometres long by 2.5 kilometres wide, the lagoon is set for a bumper year after drying up completely in 2017.

Recent rains have filled the shal-

low basin, serving up ideal conditions for the flamingos, which are attracted by teeming brine shrimp in the salty water.

The tiny crustaceans give the birds' feathers their pink hue, with those of youngsters plain grey.

Their courtship ritual sees many separate colonies form, with groups of 15 to 50 males at their centre.

They perform an elaborate dancing display with exaggerated neck stretching, head stretching and preening, plus group moves in which they march and turn as one.

And once the chicks hatch they are raised in a 'creche' watched over by many adults.

The dance of the flamingos can be seen throughout April both at Fuente de Piedra and other sites along Spain's Mediterranean coast, including Doñana National Park, Mar Menor in Murcia, Santa Pola in Alicante, and the Ebro Delta in Cataluña.

Fair enough

IT was voted number one in travel guide Lonely Planet's top 10 cities to visit in 2018.

And as the dust settles on Andalucian capital Sevilla's world famous Holy Week celebrations, the city is already gearing up for another of its internationally renowned events.

The week-long Feria d'Abril (April Fair) traditionally takes place a fortnight after the end of Easter, and this begins on Sunday April 15.

Women rock flamboyant, glamorous flamenco dresses, while men slip on their best attire and parade on horseback throughout the vibrant festivities, which feature plenty of eating, drinking and dancing the time-honoured Sevillana.

Dating back to 1847, the event was started as a livestock fair by two councillors from northern Spain, the Basque Jose Maria Ybarra and Catalan Narcisco Bonaplata.

Their idea was approved by Queen Isabella II who ruled Spain from 1833 until 1868 - and the first fair took place at the Prado de San Sebastian on the outskirts of the city centre.

But just a year later the fair began to mutate, as the first three casetas, traditional wooden buildings

housing bars and eateries still used today, sprang

They belonged to the French Duke and Duchess of Montpensier, the city council and Sevilla casino, and their introduction eventually saw the event become an enormous celebration which today brings together more than 1,000 casetas and tens of thousands of people on a new site in the Los Remedios neighbourhood.

The casetas mostly belong to important local families, clubs, trade associations, political parties or groups of friends. They function as informal restaurants during the day but from around 9pm to 6am are filled with crowds of dancing revellers drinking sherry, beer and wine.

There is also a giant amusement park for fami-

But the daily proceedings begin with a parade of carriages and horse riders carrying leading citizens to the La Real Maestranza bullring for the controversial daily bullfights.



Red faces over blue passports

THERE seemed to be an incredible irony surrounding the decision to move back to blue passports to show that Britain was recapturing its true independence from Europe.

Firstly it appears that in actual fact the move to a red passport was only a strong recommendation from the European Union and had Britain decided that it wanted to keep the colour blue (or some argue black), then it could have done so.

The real controversy has raised its head with the fact production of these new passports has been put out to tender in accordance with EU rules which meant effectively any qualified printer in any member states could bid to undertake the work.

Almost predictably, the bid from British printer De La Rue which currently holds the contract - was rejected as being too expensive and it appeared that the job would be given to a printer based in France and Holland.

Quelle horreur, this symbol of Britishness would for the first time be printed outside of Britain at a time when the country wanted to be seen as standing strong and outside of European

It is suggested that the winning bid was £120 million (€137 million) cheaper than De La Rue, but the company has managed to win a respite of a further two weeks in order to allow them to challenge the decision, based on the fact that they believe that their product will be better and more secure.

Elderly woman theft

A WOMAN who allegedly stole thousands of euros in cash and jewellery from an 86year-old she was caring for has been arrested by National Police.

The 32-year-old stands accused of theft and fraud. Police claimed she took advantage of having the woman's trust to take around €86,000 from two of the elderly woman's bank accounts and jewellery valued at €6,000 since 2015.

Officers began their investigation about two weeks ago after receiving a complaint from the 86-year-old.

She claimed several payments from her life savings account had

been declined since October 2017 due to a lack of funds.


The alleged victim told police money had last been taken from the account on February 26. She also said several chains, medals, a pair of earrings, a bracelet and a gold watch were taken from her home.

Officers searched pawn shops and other stores and reportedly found receipts stating the woman's jewellery had been traded in at three of them.

Police claimed receipts found at the stores confirmed the accused as being behind the crimes. Officers then arrested the woman.



Jailed for irrigation embezzlement

A LEADING member of an irrigation community found guilty of embezzling more than $\leq 164,000$ from the group has been handed a twoyear prison sentence.

The former secretary of the Fuente Cela association, located in Tijola, was sentenced by Almeria's Provincial Court at a hearing on Tuesday.

The defendant will also be required to pay a fine of ≤ 160.000 at a rate of ≤ 1.000 a month from May, according to reports.

The defendant's lawyers said they would request the prison sentence be suspended, according to reports.

The court heard the defendant had access to the community's accounts as part of his responsibilities as secretary from 2011 to 2013.

He also functioned occasionally as a treasurer for the group during that time which

gave him powers over the group's funds.

Prosecutors requested a three-year six months prison sentence for the defendant on the grounds that he had sought to obtain an 'illicit

benefit' from his role

He was able to make at least €164,000 during his time in the post by incorporating the group's funds into his accounts, prosecutors

Junta hails magnificent melons

THE Junta de Andalucia has started a 'no cuts in green' campaign with the aim of promoting the marketing of melon and watermelon.

A similar initiative on the subject was launched more than two decades ago in collaboration with Hortyfruta and the fruit and vegetable sector of Almeria.

Cultivation of the two fruits has increased by 90 hectares over the past year, and Almeria was the first

province to export watermelon (the second for mel-

Agriculture delegate Jose Manuel Ortiz said:

"The recovery of the national and international market share of Almeria's watermelon, that had been lost, has been achieved thanks to the development of excellent produce that consumers appreciate."

Over the past year, the Agriculture Department has carried out 65 inspections across 15 companies, in which 1,500 tons of these crops were assessed.

"The objective of the campaign is to raise awareness among farmers about the importance of the fruit meeting consumers' tastes, getting the level of maturity and flavour just right to ensure that marketing can be based on the quality of the product," added Mr Or-

A city on the rise

ALMERIA has increased its number of tourists by almost 40 per cent in the last five years.

According to a hotel occupancy survey released by the Junta de Andalucia, the province experienced a record number of visitors and overnight stays last year.

Based on the provisional figures from the survey that were gathered by the National Institute of Statistics, Almeria received a total of 1.4 million tourists in 2017, representing a 2.5 per cent increase on the previous year.

In terms of Andalucian provinces, only Sevilla has maintained a similar expansion in visitor numbers to Almeria, while Malaga tops the overall standings in exceeding five million visitors.

The data shows that foreign tourists are playing an increasingly important role in Almeria, although Spaniards still make up 75 per cent of the total.

Moreover, while the average stay of Spaniards in Almeria is 3.4 days, for foreign visitors it amounts to 5.4 days.

Report requested on Palomares cleanup

SPAIN'S national court has asked the Nuclear Safety Council (CSN) to submit a report on the status of radioactivity in Palomares.

The request comes after Ecologists in Action, an environmental group, filed a lawsuit at the court claiming targets and deadlines for the cleanup of the area had not been met.

The report, which received approval to begin in July 2015, aims to establish whether around half of the land contaminated by radioactive waste has been removed.

The goal on removing the amount of land, specifically 50,000 cubic metres, was agreed as part of the CSN's Palomares Rehabilitation Plan in May 2010. The Plan also set a deadline for the removal from the town near Cuevas del Almanzora, according to reports.

Ecologists in Action claimed regulators modified the plan in 2015. The amount of land marked for removal was reduced to 28,000 cubic metres after negotiations with the United States which caused the problem of waste to

go unresolved, the group added.

The state lawyer, in response to the national court's request, said there was no unacceptable level of exposure to the population from the waste.

The basic principle of protection was guaranteed and all regulations have been complied with, the lawyer added.

"The level of intervention set by the CSN for Palomares has been maintained over time. There have been no changes in the level as the claimant sustains.

"What has changed since 2015 is the activity concentration values due to the means have been available to consider more realistic solutions," the lawyer said.

The state bar, also responding to the case brought before the court, said it was 'impossible' to set a deadline for the 2010 plan because it was preliminary in nature.

Help from the US remains of 'primary importance' because Spain has no facilities to store the waste collected over the long term, the bar added.

The expropriation of land and fencing off of areas in Palomares helps to guarantee that the current dose of radioactivity is not exceeded, the bar said. The current radiological impact is not deemed significant, it added.

The cleanup of radioactive waste in Palomares dates back to 1966 when an US warplane crashed in midair while refuelling, dropping its payload of four nuclear bombs on Almeria.

The bombs did not go off. However, they spewed radioactive waste across the Palomares area on impact, with much of it still there.

Job figures have spring in their step

THE number of registered unemployed in Andalucia fell by 6,541 people in March, according to the National Institute of Employment (INEM).

This represents a drop of 0.78 per cent over the previous month, and Andalucia remains below one million for its overall unemployment figure, which totals 837,426.

At the national level, data from the Ministry of Employment and Social Security shows that in March those out of work fell by 47,697 on the previous month.

The outlook has been boosted by the services sector, which usually gets its momentum during the Holy Week celebrations.

Almeria Province has reported 547 fewer unemployed over the same period, a drop of 0.93 per cent.

Although the services sector saw those out of work fall by 12,208, construction and agriculture experienced rises of 2,547 and 1,619 respectively.

Of the Andalucian unemployment total, 480,034 were women, and 357,392 were men.

Coast guards rescue hundreds off the coast

SPAIN'S Salvamento Maritimo rescued 231 people, including three young children, from a total of six boats in the Alboran Sea

The operation began after coast guards were notified that a vessel had left Charrana, Morocco, according to a Ministry of Development spokesper-

The SAR Mastelero vessel was despatched along with a Sesemar 305 plan to locate the boat. It was found carrying 59 people, including eight women and three young children.

The Mestelero then found another boat carrying a further 32 men and two women shortly afterwards.

The coast guard aircraft and a Helimer 207 helicopter later found three more boats carrying 38, 34 and 32 people.

A sixth boat with 34 men

on board was found around 25 nautical miles southeast of Motril, Granada. They were transferred to the town's port after being taken off the boat.

Passengers from five of the boats were reportedly in good health when they were picked up and transferred to the migrant reception centre in Almeria City's port. Red Cross workers were on hand to provide food, water, blankets and clothing.

All those travelling on the boats were migrants from sub-Saharan Africa, according to reports.


lighting of the English Pier.

Almeria port will shoulder most of the financing, and a small contribution will come from the Culture Department.

The architect Ramon de Torres was commissioned to update the project he drew up in 2009 for the Junta de Andalucia.

Great ball of fire

Space debris spotted over Murcia

by Joe Gerrard

A TRAIL of flames in the sky seen by astronomers was caused by a rock from an asteroid, the Astronomical Complex La Hita in Toledo said.

The phenomenon was reportedly visible from Murcia, as well as Almeria and Granada, at around 6.17am on Mon-

It was recorded by monitors operated by the University of

Huelva and astronomical observatories in Calar Alto, Almeria, La Sagra and the Sierra Nevada, both in Granada and Sevilla.

Professor Jose Maria Madiedo, of the university, analysed data from the sighting which suggested the fireball had been caused by the debris' entry into the Earth's atmosphere.

Astronomers believe the rock was travelling at around 83,000 kilometres per hour when it passed over southern

It was sighted first over Granada before crossing into the skies above first Almeria and then Murcia, where it was about 29 kilometres high.

The monitoring was undertaken by the SMART project which aims to track the skies to record the impact of rocks from space on the Earth's atmosphere.

Almeria set for €60 million in investment

SPAIN'S government has estimated around €60 million will be invested in Almeria this year if the General State Budget is passed.



Easter death shock

One killed and 20 injured in bull run

A MAN has been fatally gored at an Easter bull-running festival in southern Spain and a further 20 people hurt, one seriously.

The well-known local man, in his 50's, was gored in the lungs by a 510-kilo bull named Trampero, in the first run of the bulls at the festival in Arcos de la Frontera in Andalucia

Despite being rushed to hospital in Jerez the man died from his injuries.

A shocking video of the incident that drew screams from horrified onlookers has been widely circulated on Twitter.

Another man was reported seriously in-

jured in the second bull run when his stomach was pierced. He was treated at the field hospital before being transferred to Villamartin.

More than 20 minor injuries were reported during the afternoon.

Over 120 safety and security personnel took part in the festival including Guardia Civil officers, Local Police, Civil Protection volunteers and paramedics.

In a statement, the mayor, Isidoro Gambin, expressed his 'support and affection' towards the family and close friends of the deceased.



Spanish firm wins UK deal

A SPANISH construction firm has landed a € 161 million contract to build a motorway in the

Madrid-based Sacyr beat off the competition to bag a 60 per cent slice of the €250 million scheme for the 26-kilometre A6 motorway between Dungiven and Durmahoe Dualling in Northern Ireland.

The stretch is part of the North Western Transport Corridor connecting Belfast and Londonderry, and the remaining 40 per cent of the project will be carried out by local Willis Bros.

Summer cheer for TV fans

SOME of the UK's biggest television broadcasters have relaxed their online regulations.

Britons in Spain and mainland Europe are now able to access pay-TV subscriptions, including Premier League football, without breaking the rules due to a new European Union digital single market decree.

Firms including Sky, ITV, Netflix and Amazon have been forced to open up their online TV services Now TV, ITV Hub+ and Prime Instant Video to users on the continent since Monday.

Prior to the move subscribers were unable to legally access their accounts and were forced to miss their favourite shows or rely on illegal streams.

"The new portability rules for online content is great news for TV lovers everywhere," said Gidon Katz, managing director of Sky's Now TV service. "Holidays are all about unwinding and it is clear TV is a big part about how Brits relax, so it's great news that you can swap your sofa for a sunbed and your

cuppa for a cocktail and never have to worry about missing your favourite TV on holiday again."

Free TV service providers are not adopting the new measure, howev-

The BBC says that its iPlayer registration system is not secure enough to stop non-licence fee payers accessing content, while ITV and Channel 4 currently rake in around €1.1 billion per year selling shows to European broadcasters, meaning they are unlikely to ever follow the recommendation.

Airlines' €4m payout insult

MORE than 10,000 British travellers are being denied compensation from airlines totalling €4.6 million.

TUI, formerly known as Thompson, owes the most, with 5,000 passengers awaiting claims totalling €2.7 million, with budget carrier easyJet failing to reimburse more than 3,000 holidaymakers € 1.7 million.

Travellers are entitled to compensation if their flight is more than three hours late, but law firm Bott and Co said that TUI in particular "displays ignorance" by disobeying court rulings.

State expenditure is to climb by 3 per cent to €327.9 billion, of which €246.28 billion will be set aside for pensions, payments to regional governments and unemployment bene-

State income from taxes will soar by 6 per cent to more than €210 billion, the wage ceiling for income tax exemption has been boosted by €2,000 to €14,000 per annum, and there will be rebates for those earn-

The sale includes the group's Destination Management division, which comprises the global brands Destination Services, Intercruises

TUI sold Hotelbeds for €1.2 billion in 2016. but CEO Fritz Joussen said that it had proven impossible to split the company at the time, and that the purchase represents good value for

He added that the aim is to sell additional 'indestination' activities to holidaymakers between them booking and leaving on their trips.

"That's a period where we can virtually exclusively offer these customers such services,' the executive said.

Monetary policies driving the majors

EURO


EUR/GBP: Down from £0.89 to £0.87 EUR/USD: Up from \$1.21 to \$1.24

The outlook of the European Central Bank (ECB) has been a major source of movement for the euro in recent weeks amid discussions over when the bank would seek to begin raising interest rates.

While the ECB's March policy meeting saw the bank remove the easing bias from its policy statement, the news that the ECB would be winding up its stimulus programme was undermined by a dovish outlook from President Mario Draghi.

The euro also found its advance limited in March as more modest Eurozone economic data was seen as further evidence that growth in the bloc may have begun to level out in 2018.

Looking ahead, the ECB's path towards tightening monetary policy is likely to remain in the spotlight for EUR investors over the coming

month, with the euro possibly spiking if the bank strikes a more bullish tone in April's policy meeting.

GBP/EUR: Up from \in 1.12 to \in 1.14 GBP/USD: Up from \$1.37 to \$1.41

Speculation of an upcoming rate hike from the Bank of England (BoE) was the main contributing factor to the pound's advance in March, which saw GBP climb to its highest levels of 2018.

Some impressive UK wage growth figures saw most investors lock in a May rate hike from the BoE, limiting the impact of hawkish comments from policymakers in the wake of the BoE's March policy meeting.

Sentiment was also lifted by some positive progress in Brexit negotiations as the UK and EU were able to come to an agreement over a transition period.

Brexit developments are likely to continue dictating the direction of the pound over the next month, with market sentiment likely to dip again unless some positive progress is made towards a post-Brexit trade deal with the EU.

US Dollar

USD/GBP: Down from £0.72 to £0.70 USD/EUR: Down from €0.81 to €0.80

The Federal Reserve voted to raise interest rates again in March, with anticipation of the hike lending some underlying strength to the US dollar throughout the month, although a more cautious outlook from the Fed saw USD tumble in the immediate wake of the decision.

The US dollar has also faced considerable pressure in recent weeks as Donald Trump shocked markets by announcing blanket tariffs on steel, triggering concerns about the possibility of a US-led trade war.

The potential for further US political or trade uncertainty is likely to keep USD on its toes over the coming weeks, with any further shake up in the White House likely to reflect negatively on the US dollar.

'HOLY GRAIL OF SHIPWRECKS' ROW GOES ON €14bn treasure hunters


THE Colombian government has sparked outrage after pledging to spend millions in public funds to raise a treasure-filled Spanish warship from the depths.

The galleon San Jose was found by an American search team in 1981 after lying at the bottom of the sea for more than 300 years.

The 60-gun Spanish navy vessel was transporting a six-year haul of gold, silver, and precious jewels back to Spain from the Americas in 1708, when it was attacked by the British Roval Navv.

But the ship was blown up after a battle broke out, with almost 600 Spanish sailors drowning as it sank in the Caribbean Sea near the Colombian port of Cartagena.

According to estimates, the booty on board is now worth €8-14 billion, and president Juan Manuel Santos last week revealed plans for a € 57.5 million splurge

to recover the precious cargo.

He said that some of the cash will be spent on building a laboratory and museum for preserving archaeological and cultural remains.

However there is an ongoing dispute between Spain, US-based salvage company Sea Search Armada (SSA), which found the wreck, and Colombia over who should claim the

Madrid has always claimed that

the boat flew the state flag, was crewed by Spaniards and that the site is a Spanish war grave, a tactic it has successfully used to reclaim sunken warships in the past.

The SSA agreed to share details of the galleon's location with Colombia in 1984 on the understanding it would receive a 35 per cent cut of the

But the Colombian parliament failed to honour the deal, passing a law entitling SSA to a 5 per cent 'finder's fee' taxed at 45 per cent.

SSA sued, sparking an 18-year legal battle which ended in 2007, when the Colombian Supreme Court ruled that SSA should receive 50 per cent of the hoard.

In 2015, President Santos claimed that a Colombian team had located the wreck in a different location to that reported by SSA and reasserted ownership of the ship.

He appears set to push on with plans to raise the San Jose as the decades-long quarrel rumbles on.

Built on deep foundations

A SPANISH banking foundation has been named the third-largest organisation of its kind in the world.

The Foundation of the Valencia-based La Caixa group is worth €24 billion, according to the Coordenadas Institute of Governance and Applied Economics.

The organisation - which manages social welfare body Obra Social - is beaten only by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, which has assets valued at €32.8 billion, and the UK-based Wellcome Trust, worth an estimated € 26.3 billion

La Caixa also ranks third globally in terms of annual investment, having spent more than €500 million on philanthropic projects for the 10th consecutive year in

The Gates Foundation last vear laid out €3.4 billion and Wellcome Trust €1.4 billion.

High street battle goes on

SUPERMARKET TAKES AIM AT ONLINE GIANTS

FRENCH supermarket giant Carrefour is to massively expand the number of products available to Spanish internet shoppers.

The retailer's offshoot Carrefour Spain wants to increase its range of goods by launching a digital marketplace open to third party suppliers.

And the move will see the firm's catalogue skyrocket from its current 100,000 items to more than two million.

It comes after the chain successfully opened online marketplaces in France and Poland, with a Belgian version in the pipeline.

Rafael Sanchez-Sendarrubias, director of ecommerce for Carrefour Spain, said: "We consider that it is a disruptive and quite interesting idea

"The biggest advantage of a marketplace is the speed: to be able to have a wide offer in a very short time

"A marketplace is a magical place that can bring together the interests of customers and sellers."

One intriguing aspect of the marketplace platform is the 'click and collect' service, allowing customers to pick up their goods from a local hypermarket or smaller outlet.

High tech digital terminals will also be installed in the firm's shops so customers can make online purchases if they are unable to find what they need in store.

As internet market leader Amazon proved after installing collection lockers in American supermarkets, introductions like these can increase footfall

Carrefour's online offering is already established in Spain, attracting 87 million visits, 35 million unique users and around 320 million page views per year, according to figures from the National

Institute of Statistics.

Carrefour says that third party suppliers will be able to list their products on the marketplace free of charge and with no fixed time limit, and will also consider selling popular products in its stores.

Business-owners can simply upload their products to the platform and wait for the orders to come in via email from the marketplace

They must then pack and send out the orders, before being paid by Carrefour, which will snap up an unconfirmed cut of each sale.

The move marks an increasing trend by brick and mortar retailers to increase their range by hosting third party suppliers online as they struggle to compete with Amazon and eBay.

Power supplier scoops €770m mega contract

SPANISH multinational electricity firm Iberdrola has bagged a €770 million contract to link the United States and Canada.

The Bilbao-based company beat off competition from 45 rivals to win the 20-year agreement.

It will see a new 230-kilometre high voltage line built, which when complete will send electricity generated from 'clean' wind and water sources from Canada to Maine, New England.

The scheme is expected to generate 3,700 jobs and become operational in 2020 according to Iberdrola president Ignacio Sanchez Galan.

He added: "The awarding of this contract reaffirms our commitment to clean energy and long-term infrastructure projects... while also increasing our presence in the US, a key market for future investment."

The project is expected to supply 1.5m customers while reducing carbon dioxide emissions by the equivalent of 296,000 cars.

Albeit a belated welcome, because while the rest of us have been getting on with life the universe and everything, Intel, HP, Asus, Gigabyte and scores of Asian innovators have been jumping on the Mini PC bandwagon. Indeed, the device I am now wooing is already in its sixth generation.

As fewer consumers buy traditional desktops, and with laptops dominating the new computer market, compress-

ing laptop miniaturisation into a hybrid desktop version was inevitable.

Inside these compact cubes is a tightly-packed circuit board, a processor with or without an almost silent fan depending on its power, one or two RAM (memory) sticks, and either your own SSD (solid state hard-drive) or an onboard one, depending on the model and price range.

Mini, or cube, or 'NUC' computers (Next Unit of Computing, a truly awful name Intel probably went with because no-one dared to contradict the boss) free your desk of the clutter of a monster machine. They can even be

bolted to the back of the monitor, out of sight and reach.

Less than a € 100 buys you a basic Chinese mini (just add a keyboard, monitor or mouse), all the way up to several hundreds for one which could calculate Pi to several squintillion decimal places, make coffee and play an infinite number of cat videos.

They come ready-made, or as socalled 'barebones' systems where you choose and install your own memory, storage media and operating system.

They're also bought as fancy home theatre media centres, to power instore marketing displays, and as the ideal solution for workers who 'hotdesk' between workplaces, just unplug the cube and pop it in your briefcase.

Mini magic

HARD to believe you can buy a complete Mini PC for just €89 in a growing market for these tiny won-

But beware: for that you only get an 'Atom' processor (slow), 2 GB of memory (barely adequate for Windows 10) and 32 GB of onboard storage (which will soon fill up).

Amazingly it does include a legitimate copy of Windows 10, whose licence alone would probably cost you that.

Far better to pony up for something better. This new love of my life has a quadcore processor, 8 GB of RAM and 240 GB of storage, and gave me change from ≤ 300 .

Now you must excuse me while I pursue my latest affair. I wonder if it prefers flowers, chocolates or a bottle of Rioja?



Spanish Queen's peerless blue diamond at Noble Jewels sale

AFTER the Wars of Spanish Succession were concluded more than 300 years ago; at Parma in Italy, Princess Elisabeth Farnese married Philip V of Spain.

While the intrigues of Europe swirled, a spectacular wedding gift was making its way from the Philippines to Madrid. Spain had issued instructions to the Governors of its colonies throughout its overseas empire that suitable wedding gifts were to be sent to

A year later in August 1715 a fleet assembled and sailed from the island of Cuba. The Golden Fleet - 12 ships carrying a fortune in gold bullion and a casket of enormous emeralds - set sail for Europe and Spain. Unfortunately 10 days later a hurricane scattered and destroyed most of the fleet off the coast of

One vessel survived and escaped and she

was carrying a pear-shaped blue diamond sent by the Governor of the Philippine Islands, a gift to the new Spanish Queen.

Blue diamonds were viewed as the ultimate royal gift, blue was identified as the colour of royalty - blue blood - and like the famous Hope and Wittelsbach diamonds the Farnese Blue was found in the Golconda mines of India, which was the sole source of

diamonds until the discoveries in Brazil in the 1720's.

As Elizabeth and Philip's descendants married into Europe's royal dynasties, Elizabeth Farnese passed the diamond to her favourite son Philip Duke of Parma (1720-1765), continuing down the line passing through four of Europe's dynasties.

(1882-1940) Arch Duchess of Austria, the wife of Elias Bourbon, Duke of Parma (1880-1959) created a detailed inventory of the family jewels such that a record exists charting the fascinating history of these jewels. Among them the Farnese Blue.

Each May in Geneva ever since, the famed sale of the Jewels of the Duchess of Windsor, Sotheby's auction house has held the Royal and Nobel Jewels sale, this year titled 'Magnificent Jewels and Noble Jewels.'

The fascination of pedigreed 'Nobel Jewels' and their desirability remains strong. Dr Philip Herzog von Württemberg, chairman of Sotheby's Europe said: "With its incredible pedigree, the Farnese Blue ranks among the most historic diamonds in the world. From the first minute I saw the stone, I could not resist its magic and as such it is a huge privilege to have been entrusted with its sale."

The peerless Farnese Blue a 6.16 carat pear-shaped blue diamond has an estimate of € 2.99 to € 4.28 million. But the story is priceless.

As it seems to me they enquire about little else; our past fantastic history or our local customs and giants of the ancient times that brought us to such a successful present day

fruition. Then again, I don't get out as much any more and need to be more in contact with the villagers who meet these invaders and peer at their enquiries first hand.

Speaking momentarily on behalf of the foreign contingent our upmost achievement was the immediate integration of insisting the local Spanish ioin us in our festivities and games.

They in turn invited us to their

mantanzas, weddings, funerals and table hopping. (Rarely does a Spaniard eat alone without knowing who else is in the room and how and why they might be related to him). It is still considered a polite custom here but I wouldn't dare using it back in old Blimey, i.e. talking to the person at the next table without being first introduced.

As the waves of time have rolled by I worry that we are losing some of those important ties with each other. Most certainly the 'legal bulldozing' of nearby houses (who had fulfilled all the legal requirements of the time) is still causing major consternation.

Ten years of the prior dilemma wore them down to taking a settlement. But the same situation continues elsewhere. Red flags are going up back on the British Isles suggesting once again that the sunny refuge of Spain isn't possibly all that it is

I can assure you this next round of battles won't be conducted on such a dignified confrontation as the prior's allowed. Generations of good work will be undone as will the mutual convivial living that has long been established.

Views of a **Grumpy Old Man**

I WAS having a chat with a friend of mine and we were discussing bank charges here and I was moaning about charges that appear now and again. It's nothing monstrous but just like, in my case, I hadn't spent enough on my debit card over three months so they 'fined' me.

My friend then proceeded to tell me a horror story and asked my advice. I'm now going to tell you and I hope someone out there can let me know if this is common practice. I can't tell you the name of the bank but here's the story.

He was selling his house to buy a flat - all very simple, no mortgages involved, just straightforward payments in and out. He paid a deposit on the flat of €19,500 and the bank charged him €78 for that which is 0.4 per cent.

He then paid \in 379,637.82 into to the bank, a bank he has, by the way, been with for 17 years. They charged him €759.35 for paying the money IN to his own account. They then charged another €300 for him to pay €217,646.38 for his new place then another €150 for paying €37k to his lawyer. So, all in all, for making three payments and paying some money in they charged him just under €1,288. Why? What we don't understand is the charge for paying the money in to your own account - it's horrendous. The charge for the bank transfers are also too high but I appreciate there must be some charge.

When my friend queried these charges the bank refunded €300 but said 'you should have discussed it beforehand.' I think it's a liberty. Has anyone else come across this? He was told, off the record, because interest rates are so low, the banks are instructed to get money off customers any way they can which sounds like when I used to work the markets years ago.

This then brought me on to the subject of cancelling stuff here. Some time ago I got a reminder that my house insurance was due next month - with the same bank as it happens. So I looked around to make sure I was getting the best deal and guess what - I wasn't. We decided to cancel and go with a new company.

The bank then informed us that we can't do that as we have to give three months' notice to cancel the policy! What a joke! When I asked why all I got was the usual 'it's in the terms and conditions, page 105, sub section 96, blah blah.' Anyway we cancelled it and told them to sue us if they want to. We were even told we could get blacklisted. Nothing ever happened and we are now with a new company.

New speed radars approved for use

WE answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.

THE DGT has taken delivery of around 60 new portable speed detecting units, Velolaser, which have undergone extensive testing around the country. These devices have now been approved for use and can enter service protecting the country's roads.

The Director General of Traffic, Gregorio Serrano, announced the certification just in time for one of the most intense road planning periods, the Easter holiday.

Small enough to fit in the panniers of a motorcycle, the units can be set up in seconds, either on a tripod, a vehicle mount, or on roadside features such as crash barriers. It should be noted. despite many speculative reports to the contrary, these devices are not mounted on the motorbikes but are carried to locations where they are set up on tripods or similar mounts.

The device manufacturers say that the units obtain the best results in sensitive urban areas (zone 30, schools, parks, children's areas, etc), and thanks to their versatility they can work using vehicles available at any time, in any area,

including those places otherwise inaccessible. and, most importantly, in a minimum time.

The simple, ingenious and innovative solution provides a new way to control speed in a wide variety of situations, on both urban and interurban roads. The devices can monitor vehicles at speeds of up to 250 kilometres per hour, covering two lanes, monitoring both directions of travel, and can distinguish between different types of vehicles, knowing the difference between a car and a lorry, for example.

The units can connect over 3G or 4G telephony, or via WiFi, providing simultaneous monitoring of several devices at the same time, recording information on internal or external

As well as monitoring speed, the devices are clever enough to calculate safety distances, and can operate both day and at night.

They are designed and manufactured in Spain, and come in a range of colours, although the units delivered to the DGT carry the distinctive colours and labelling of the Guardia Civil.

Was the election legal?

We have just had our Community AGM. When it came time to elect a president, two committee members put themselves forward. Neither was formally proposed and seconded. Is this a necessary step

for the AGM? The successful candidate is a local builder and is currently tendering for work in the community. Is there 'conflict of interest' in Spain? If so, what is the solution?

S H (Costa Blanca)

The short answer is that you have a number of irregularities here, but nothing that invalidates the election of the president. It is not necessary for a candidate for president to be nominated in advance, although this would be the proper proce-



Yes, the concept of 'conflict of interest' exists in Spain, and it certainly seems to exist in your example. However, if the majority of the community voters accept the situation and elect the builder as president, there is no legal reason to challenge the vote. If it later comes to light that the builder-president awards himself the contract and charges twice the going rate, then you would have a case.

SHERRY, an anglicisation of the Spanish Jerez, is a fortified wine from white grapes grown near Jerez de la Frontera in Andalucia.

After fermentation the wines are fortified with grape spirit to increase the final alcohol content. Wines suitable for ageing as Fino and Manzanilla are fortified until they reach a total alcohol content of 15.5 per cent. As they age in barrel, the wines develop natural yeast known as flor that helps protect them from excessive oxidation.

Wines chosen to undergo ageing as Oloroso are fortified to reach an alcohol content of at least 17. They do not develop flor and oxidise slightly as they age, giving

them a darker colour.

Because fortification takes place after fermentation, most Sherries are initially dry, with any sweetness added later.

Jerez has been a centre of viniculture since Phoenician times in 1100 BC, with the Moors - after conquering the region - introducing distillation and producing brandy and fortified wine.

During the Moorish period, the town was called Sherish, from which both Sherry and Jerez are derived.

By the end of the 16th century, sherry had a reputation

as the world's finest wine and both Christopher Columbus and Ferdinand Magellan took it on voyages to the New

Because sherry was heavily exported to the UK many of the Jerez cellars were founded by British families.

Wines from different years are aged and blended before bottling, so sherry bottles do not usually carry a specific vintage year.

Sherry is traditionally drunk from a copita or catavino, a special tulip-shaped

'NOT ENOUGH': The Tajo-Segura transfer supplies water for about 23,000

Water transfer insufficient'

SPAIN'S Agriculture Minister has been sent proposals for water transfers for approval, with the Almanzora region set for 30 per cent of its usual

Isabel Garcia Tejerina will have to sign off the plans for the Tajo-Segura transfer which have been drawn up to run until June.

A total of 60 hectometres cubed (60 billion litres) will be shipped throughout the southeast of Spain in 20 Hm3 per month instalments under the plans.

Almanzora is set to receive less than half a cubic hectometre (425,000 cubic metres) of that total. It will be the only region in Almeria entitled to a share of the transfer, according to reports.

Almeria's Water Board said the amount allocated to the area under the plans was not enough to meet demand.

The amount would not help the region get out of its structural drought situation, with more than 23,000 hectares of land relying on the Tajo-Segura transfer.

The transfer typically supplies Almeria with 10 Hm3 for supply and 15 for irrigation. These flows have been cut back in recent years due to







Albox council session 'violated Spain's constitution'



VIOLATION: The court declared the Albox council meeting 'null and void.'

MAGISTRATES at the second Contentious-Administrative Court of Almeria have declared a meeting held by Albox Council 'null and void' for reportedly violating the Spanish Constitution.

The court ruled the meeting, held on June 29, 2017, went against rules governing opposition parties' access to information laid out in Article 23 of the docu-

The Partido Popular (PP) opposition was found to have been denied access to information during a meeting where a rise in bar and restaurant rates was approved.

The rates were trebled following the meeting.

They will now return to their previous level with proposals for the increases requiring a further vote.

The rates covered the occupation of public roads, which affects venues with

The PP claimed they were not given the chance to study documents related to the plans.

It was not available during the meeting,

which is a direct violation of Article 46.2 b) of Law 7/1985, which regulates councils.

PP councillors had opposed the plans from the outset, claiming several establishments had removed their terraces after the new rates were applied.

"This rise is a frontal attack on the economic activity of Albox and it strangles catering establishments, as well as jobs in the area," the party said in a statement.

"The viability of many businesses may affected. They have to choose between reducing the occupation space or increasing prices," the statement

When I started university I couldn't cook, but one night 39 years ago I decided to impress a new girlfriend (who hated cooking) by doing something I had never done before; cook a meal from basic ingredients. She must have been impressed, a year later we were engaged! I have cooked for her and our family ever since.

Recipe of the week: Spaghetti Bolognese

Eat Well to Live Well



1 tablespoon olive oil

1 medium onion, chopped

30 grams bacon, chopped

200 grams beef, minced

2 whole garlic cloves (add more if you want to), chopped

250 millilitres red wine

1/2 teaspoon celery salt

2 teaspoons dried mixed Italian herbs

2 whole bay leaves, whole

1 tin chopped tomatoes

1 tablespoon tomato paste

1 whole beef stock cube, crumbled

125 grams mushrooms, sliced

Black peppercorns (ground), to taste

1 litre water, boiling

2 teaspoons salt

180 grams dried spaghetti

2 teaspoons olive oil

60 grams parmesan cheese, grated

Servings: 2

Preparation Time: 15 minutes Start to finish: 1 hour 30 minutes

In a suitably sized saucepan gently sauté the onion and bacon in olive oil, add garlic and continue to sauté continually stirring until the garlic has taken on a golden hue. Add the

minced beef and stir until browned. 2/3 hob heat is the hottest required for the sauce, any higher and it will burn.

Add the red wine and simmer until the smell of alcohol has disappeared and it has reduced by about 1/2.

Add the herbs, tinned tomatoes, tomato paste and the beef stock cube continually stirring, turn the heat to 1/3 for 45 minutes. If the pan has a lid, just leave it on, if not occasionally top up with water. The sauce needs to have a similar consistency to a bowl of old fashioned rice pudding.

Add mushrooms and stir, bring back to a

light simmer for 10 minutes. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Discard the bay leaves.

At the same time, add a teaspoon of salt and two teaspoons of olive oil to a pan of boiling water on the highest hob setting, add spaghetti.

Cook until it is slightly al dente with a slight resistance when biting, drain in a colander. The Bolognese sauce should be ready at the

Serve on a pre-warmed plate with freshly grated parmesan cheese.

Serving Ideas: Slices of garlic bread. Suggested Wine: A full bodied Red, Italian or Spanish.

Elche: a city of variety

ELCHE - and its predecessor, La Alcudia, was settled by the Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans, Byzantines, Goths and Moors. So it is safe to say that the city has some history.


But the city offers far more than museums - in fact, part of its appeal is its variety.

The coastal location provides it the obligatory beach attraction but there are cultural options aplenty for those looking for a more sophisticated experience.

Perhaps the most notable is the Basilica of Santa Maria - an impressive, Arabic-looking structure well worth a visit. Another must for architecture is the Torre de la Calahorra.

If greenery is your thing then the Palm Grove of Elche should be right up your garden path, having been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2000.

Twinned with six towns -

including Toulouse in France - Elche is within striking distance of Alicante, for those who want the allure of one of Spain's largest cities. But Elche should be easily big

enough for all travel needs and boasts a number of top restaurants and hotels.

The local football team, Elche CF, were in the top tier of Spanish football until last

year, but could make a return to La Liga in the coming seasons - giving football fans the chance to see giants like Real Madrid or Barcelona in quaint surroundings.

Alicante's underrated tourist base

TORREVIEJA is not the destination at the top of many travellers' lists in Spain.

However, the city makes for an ideal base from which to see a number of quaint, charming villages and popular beach spots.

The waterfront promenade, lined with palm trees and Spaniards out for a stroll, comes alive in the evenings. Buskers and merchandise sellers add spirit to a number of endearing bench-based monuments, while the lively restaurants culture adds to the homely feel.

The real draw, though, is the sea view - particularly at sunset - and the ice cream vendors who serve all manner of flavours, from the exotic to the traditional.

Another tourist favourite is the Go-karting iust outside of town.

Though the city is not particularly authentic - or much different to other tourist-filled seaside towns - what is impressive is the number of nearby locations that you can day trip to.

With relatively cheap accommodation on offer, tourists can see the delights of countless local beaches. Try the quiet Lomas de Cabo-Roig or Punta Prima, wave-filled Guardamar, or popular sand and sun-filled La Zenia.



 - ◆ A water plant garden around a pond.
 - ◆ A desert garden with plants planted

through sand or stone chippings layed over black plastic.

- ◆ A lily garden glowing with masses of lilies during late spring
- A greenhouse and potting shed garden for those who like to grow from seeds and cuttings.
- A herb garden which can be interesting and relaxing all year round as well as yielding continuous harvests of culinary and medicinal herbs.
- ◆ A vineyard with grapes growing on the walls and over arches or even covered walk-
- A citrus garden perfumed by the flowers of a perpetual flowering and fruiting
- A wild garden of natural herbs, shrubs and trees allowed to grow fairly wild like a miniature L'Arbarda garden, as can be visited near Pedreguer in the Alicante region.

No one can be involved at a senior level with animals until they have many years' experience. I mean experience, not simply had a few dogs, cats etc. One must have worked with them in a very diverse and involved way beforehand. There is a young man opening up near me. He has minutes of experience and is running a workshop on how to

train your dog using motivation, he seems to think [believe] he has invented this concept.

How do you start? Talk to your vet who will be aware of the trainers in the area. In fact many vets now run schools at their premises like Pointer Clinic East. Take a look at as many schools as you are able to but do not take your pet.

Explain to the 'instructor' that you're thinking of having lessons. Now you can see what goes on, shouting and rough handling is out. It is also an idea to have a chat with those attending with their dogs to see if they have advanced in training and behaviour. Look before you book as you would with your children.



ROAD TEST by Nick Fletcher

THE Mitsubishi Eclipse Cross is a new small SUV offering smart styling, cabin versatility and the reassurance of a five-year warran-

The sector is highly competitive - rivals include the Peugeot 3008 and SEAT Ateca - but Mitsubishi has a strong reputation for reliability which is a big pluspoint, as is the striking look of the Eclipse Cross in an image-sensitive marketplace.

Priced from €24,277 (£21,275), this newcomer offers several trim levels and either two-wheel drive or four-wheel drive depending on model. All variants are powered by a 1.5-litre turbocharged petrol engine, mated to six-speed manual or all-new eight-speed CVT automatic transmission.

Standard kit includes Smartphone connection compatible with Apple CarPlay and Android Auto, touch-pad controller, rear view camera, DAB radio. climate control, LED daytime running lights, and allov wheels.

Safety features include lane departure warning and forward collision mitigation, which uses radar technology to detect collision risk

Eclipse Cross looks and feels a good package for the money, and its interior space makes it very family-

friendly.

The rear seats slide for variable load/occupant versatility and they do fold flat.

The cabin has an upmarket look, the controls are well-placed and the seating

is very comfortable. My only negative is that the tailgate screen has a central bar which though hardly impeding vision, is mildly dis-

My test model was a flag-

ship version adding extra kit including leather upholstery and panoramic sunroof. With manual gearbox and front wheel drive, this model costs €28,504 (£24,975).

The 1.5 litre 161 hp turbo-

petrol engine is smooth and eager, with a top speed of 204 kph (127 mph) and a 0-60 kph time of 10.3 seconds. Fuel economy is 15.2 kpl (42.8 mpg), with emissions at 151 g/km.

Ride quality is excellent

and the Eclipse Cross proves composed on cornering and the steering has good feedback. The car looks good, drives well and should give the Mitsubishi brand a real boost.





La Liga Preview

Real host Atletico in Madrid derby

REAL MADRID host rivals Atletico in the Madrid derby on Sunday, with both sides looking to strengthen their positions in this year's top four.

Atletico moved to within nine points of leaders Barcelona after a 1-0 victory against Deportivo on Saturday, with Kevin Gameiro's goal enough to separate Atletico and the struggling side.

They travel to a Real side who themselves come into the game off the back of some good form, having won all of their La Liga games in March and got themselves up to third in La Liga.

A win for Real will see them move to within just a point of their Madrid rivals, but a win for Atletico would see them move five points clear and all but guarantee Champions League football for

Elsewhere, Barcelona will look to continue their unbeaten run in La Liga against Leganes after they extended it even further in dramatic fashion during a 2-2 draw with Sevilla last weekend.

The Champions-elect looked to be heading for their first La Liga defeat since 2017 after goals from Franco Vasquez had hosts Sevilla 2-0 up with just five minutes to go.

But it was not meant to be for Sevilla as Barcelona scored two in the final two minutes of the game through Luis Suarez and Lionel Messi to ensure their record run continued.

Barcelona can now make it 38 games unbeaten in La Liga as they host Leganes on Saturday almost a year to the day since they last suffered defeat in the league; a 2-0 loss to Malaga on April 8,

Tomorrow (Friday), Malaga travel to Deportivo in a battle at the bottom of the league, having registered their first win of 2018 last time out against sixth placed Villarreal.

Chory Castro's penalty was enough to give the Malaga boss his

first win since taking over the side in January and register Los Boquerones' fourth win of the season, but was not enough to take them off the bottom of the table.

Clarence Seedorf's Deportivo La Coruña find themselves in a similar position, struggling to survive and have picked up just one win in their last 16 La Liga matches

Elsewhere, Sevilla will look to get back into the Europa league spots against Celta Vigo after being leapfrogged by Real Betis, who went into sixth following their win against Getafe.

The Champions League quarter-finalists have slipped out of the top six having picked up just one point from their last three

In the weekend's other fixtures, Real Betis host Eibar on Saturday, Sunday sees Levante play Las Palmas before Real Sociedad take on Girona and Villarreal face Athletic Bilbao on Monday

Premier League preview

Derby day could see Citizens crowned

MANCHESTER CITY can officially wrap up the Premier League title with six games to spare if they beat bitter rivals Manchester United at the Etihad on Saturday.

Pep Guardiola's side moved to within just one win of the title after a 3-1 victory over Everton on Saturday as they became just the third Premier League side to beat all other teams in a single Premier League season.

First half goals from Lerov Sane. Gabriel Jesus and Raheem Sterling were enough to blow away the Mersevsiders on the day, despite a 63rd minute consolation from Yannick Bolasie.

The result means just a win against United at the Etihad on Saturday will be enough for City to wrap up their third title in the past seven years and the earliest title ever to be won in Premier League history.

Elsewhere, Liverpool will look to overtake Manchester United into second place as they host Everton at Anfield in the Merseyside derby.

The Reds come into the game in scintillating form having lost just one of their last eight games as they continued their good run of results with 2-1 win over Crystal Palace.

Having fallen behind to an early Luka Milivojevic penalty, Sadio Mane equalised early in the second half be-

fore Mo Salah's 29th Premier League goal of the season secured the result for Liverpool.

On Sunday, Chelsea face West Ham in a London derby looking to bounce back from their heavy defeat to top four rivals Tottenham last weekend.

The Blues are all but assured not to finish in this season's top four after the damaging 3-1 defeat to spurs as Dele Alli scored a brace and Christian Eriksen's stunner were enough to condemn Chelsea to their ninth defeat of the sea-

The result leaves them eight points behind Spurs in the table with just seven games left to play in the race for the top four.

Tottenham themselves head to Stoke on Saturday looking to consolidate their position in fourth, while their opponents are desperate for points in the fight against relegaton.

Stoke are in real danger of relegation from the Premier League this season and currently sit in 18th place, eight points away from safety following last week's heavy defeat to Arsenal.

Elsewhere, West Brom play Swansea City at the Hawthorns and will be desperate for a result after they slumped to a record eighth successive league defeat at the hands of Burnley on Satur-

In the weekend's other fixtures, Watford play Burnley, Bournemouth host Crystal Palace, Brighton face Huddersfield Town, Leicester City are against Newcastle and Arsenal take on Southampton on Sunday.

GOVERNING body Rugby Europe has again delayed a decision on the outcome of the Spain vs Belgium World Cup Qualifying match.

The Spanish Rugby Federation (FER) has asked Rugby Europe to look into their final qualifier after they lost 18-10 to Belgium which meant Romania qualified for next year's World Cup instead of Spain.

The FER had requested that the officials be changed prior to the match, due to the potential conflict of interest, and have now asked for the game to be replayed on account of 19 decisions they feel were unfair against them.

A Rugby Europe referees' selection committee had an initial meeting in Poznan following the match. which included the Spanish Rugby Federation President, Alfonso Feiioo, before a conference call between the Rugby Europe Board of directors was set to take place on Thursday last week.

It had been thought that a decision would be imminent following the conference call, but that call has now been rescheduled due to the need to 'gather, clarify and share all the additional information" before making an accurate decision.

Garcia going for Masters

SERGIO GARCIA returns to Augusta National this weekend looking to become just the fourth man to win back-to-back Masters' titles.

The Spaniard enjoyed a fantastic season last year, winning three times on the European Tour including his maiden major win, becoming just the third Spaniard behind Seve Ballesteros and Jose Maria Olazabal to win the coveted Masters green jacket.

He was subsequently named European Tour Golfer of the Year in December but despite his amazing season last year, Garcia's name doesn't appear

among the favourites to take the title this time around.

Dustin Johnson, Rory McIlroy, Justin Thomas, Jordan Speith and a resurgent Tiger Woods head the list of favourites for Augusta, but ahead of this week's competition, which begins today (Thursday), Garcia has admitted that it doesn't bother him where he is placed going into the tournament.

He told Sporting Life: "That doesn't really matter to me because at the end of the day I know what I'm capable of and I know how I'm playing.

"Obviously I feel like my game is in good shape. I'm really happy with all my new equipment. I've had a couple of good weeks so I'm excited to go back there and defend my title as well as I can be and as well as I

"If I'm looked at as a favourite or not it doesn't really matter, because it depends on myself and what I do and on what I believe."

Garcia heads into the competition on the back of marrying his long term partner last year, while the couple also welcomed their first daughter.

They decided to name her Azealea after the flowers which $b\;l\;o\;o\;m$ around the Augusta Na-

tional course and on his return to the Masters' famous course earlier this week, the 38-year-old told USA Today: "It is so special.

"The drive down Magnolia Lane, it's a different feeling, a special feeling. To have Azalea come and see where the idea of her name came from is unbelievable. It's an amazing combi-

"I've had a great career and an amazing life, and now it's even better. Winning the Masters, marrying my best friend, an amazing woman like Angela, seeing beautiful Azalea every day. We can't wait to see what the future holds

Return of the Raf

RAFAEL NADAL is set to return from a longstanding hip injury next week after he was named in Spain's Davis Cup squad.

The 31-year-old has not played since he was forced to withdraw from the Australian Open quarter-final against Marin Cilic in January due to a hip injury.

He had looked to return at last month's ATP 500 Acapulco in Mexico but withdrew at the last minute due to a recurrence of the same injury.

And if he does feature, he is set to return to action as World Number 1 after Roger Federer's shock secondround loss to Thanasi Kokkinakis at the Miami Open.

Speaking to the Spanish Federation website, Spain's Davis Cup Captain Sergi Bruguera said: "Rafa is getting better and training more. There is still a week and a half for the games to start and there is time."

Fellow Spaniards Roberto Bautista Agut, Pablo Carreno Busta, Feliciano Lopez and David Ferrer make up the rest of the team that take on Germany in Valencia between April 6 and 8.

The winner will then take on either France or Italy in the semi-finals, while Croatia face Kazakhstan and United States play Belgium in the other quarter-finals.
