Apocalypse wow

Saharan dust brings eerie glow



OUT OF THIS WORLD: Saharan sands over the Bay of Almeria turned skies reddish-brown.

ALMERIA transformed into a Martian landscape after winds from Cadiz lifted Saharan sands and dumped them on the province.

The sandy skies were a 'calm, dark, brownish' but don't affect health, according to the State Meteorological Agency (AEMET) official José María Sánchez.

This week's dry storms are a common atmospheric phenomenon which bring lightening because of "violent vertical movements." but little rain, said Sanchez.

"The main problem is that it's dirty," he added.

The Plaza de la Catedral's white marble floor made the storm's orange aftermath more striking, according to Spanish media.

Town cleaners had to hose it down in time for the Almeria Book Fair, starting the following day.

Two neighbours chatting as they walked down the paseo (promenade) de Almeria said: "Thank goodness that I did not put the washing machine on," Spanish media reports.

It was an isolated depression over the Gulf of Cadiz which whipped up winds strong enough to carry the sands to southern Almeria.

The rainstorms - even if they were only minor brought the dust down from the skies and onto the streets and cars. Sanchez

To shell and back

Shock decision

Judge 'freezes' expat murder plot probe

EXCLUSIVE

THE family of missing mum-of-one Lisa Brown have spoken of their shock after a Spanish judge shelved his probe against the prime suspect in the

Javier Garcia Ramila made the sensational decision just a week after Simon Corner, 35, was held at London's Heathrow Airport on a European Arrest War-

Speaking exclusively to the Euro Weekly News, Lisa's stunned sister Helen Iordan said: "We are still shocked that this decision has been made after all the hard work but it's not over by any means.

"We speechless when we heard

"We don't take anything for granted but we didn't expect this.

Helen added, "This is a set-back but won't stop us, the investigation will still be continuing to find the

"We're thinking positively... we have to or we would have given up long ago."

The judge reportedly made the move after state prosecutors requested that the two-and-a-half investigation be 'frozen.'

At the Court of Investigation in San Roque, Cadiz, he said in a 10-page written ruling: "This court has serious doubts Simon Corner is the person responsible for the crimes of homicide or unlawful detention being in-

"That is because of the testimony of the witness who says she saw Lisa Brown driving her Ford Focus near her home on the morning of November 6, 2015 [two days after police believe she was killed], and because there was no mater-

ial evidence he actively participated in Lisa's disappearance has been obtained despite multiple inquiries against Simon over the past two and a half years."

He added that he was legally obliged to take into account a "lack of concrete proof" and that the enquiry was "at a point of no return," although it can be reopened if fresh evidence comes to light.

Corner - who has never been formally charged - has now been freed from a London jail where he had been held since his arrest after stepping off a flight from South America

He was expected to be extradited on charges of conspiracy to murder before facing trial in Spain after going on the run for a second time.

Originally from Alexandria, Dumbartonshire, Scottish expatriate Lisa vanished from her Costa del Sol home in Guadiaro on November 4, 2015.

The alarm was raised when she failed to collect son Marco, then aged eight, from school.

Lisa worked in Gibraltar and detectives have said a 'violent episode' appeared to have taken place, but her body has never been found.

Five other Britons who have been guizzed on suspicion of obstructing justice over the alleged incident have also had their bail conditions lifted.

Liverpool-born yacht dealer Corner was held in Denmark in May 2016 on a European Arrest Warrant and extradited to Spain after fleeing the country in the wake of Lisa going missing.

He was released from an Algeciras prison on bail in April 2017 but he broke the terms of his agreement by failing to present himself at a Costa del Sol police station last month.

Lisa's family last month flew to Cadiz and offered a £100.000 reward in an appeal for new information at a press conference attended by Britain's ambassador to Spain Simon Manley.

Worker hurt



The company behind the project will reportedly be allowed to build on two of the four plots there over the next 36 months.

It shows Jose Victor Salazar Balza, 28, on fire during violent clashes between Venezuelan protesters and riot police in May 2017, amid protests against the Venezuelan president, Nicolas Maduro.

Taken in capital city Caracas by local photographer Ronaldo Schemidt, 47, the shot was described by judges as 'instantly'

emotional and symbolising the idea of the country 'burning.'

The dramatic scene came after a motorcycle petrol tank exploded.

And the snapper explained how he acted on instinct as he said: "I felt the explosion behind me and I felt the heat, and at that moment I turned around, already shooting, but without seeing what was going

Competition organisers said that Salazar survived the incident with first and second-degree burns.

The humanitarian crisis sparked by President Maduro's authoritarian 'Bolivarian Revolution' in Venezuela has triggered a surge in asylum-seekers fleeing the South American country. Spain received more than 4,300 applications from January to July last year, up from 596 in the whole of 2015.

Winning images from the 61st annual staging of the prestigious contest were chosen from 73,044 images taken by 4.548 photographers from 125 countries.

Petal power



BLOOMIN' LOVELY: The festival is an underrated aem.

THERE is no better way to celebrate the arrival of early summer than with a visit to Cor-

And preparations are in full swing as the historic city once again gears up to show its true colours during its dazzling patios festival.

The annual event features stunning flower displays as the doors swing open on more than 200 private patios - or courtyards - in a colourful contest backed by the council for almost 100 years, during which green-fingered residents battle to put on the most show-stop-

A typical feature of Cordoban homes, the courtyards tend to be the central feature around which each house is built, and normally have a fountain or well in the middle to collect rainwater.

This is a Roman design aimed at easing the oven-like summer temperatures typical of inland Andalucia, and was later adapted by Moorish conquerors who added features including a direct entrance from the street and

vast arrays of flowers planted in beds or pots to bring freshness.

The latter tradition has been continued ever since, with fabulous floral displays offering flashes of colour alongside stone mosaics, water features, antique furniture and ceramic decorations, mixed with the fragrant aromas of orange blossom, jasmine, and countless other flowers.

And in typical local style, the contest is soundtracked by enthusiastic live performances from renowned flamenco artists and other musicians throughout the city, while local wine and tapas are consumed en masse.

There are a number of different parts of the city to visit, each with a unique look and feel. with a map available at http://patios.cordoba. es/en/patios.

Entrance to the courtyards is generally free, but there is often a collection box for tips by the door. This year's extravaganza takes place from May 1-13, with visiting hours 11am-2pm and 6pm-10pm.






Stabbing sentence

A 35-YEAR-OLD on trial for attempted murder over the alleged stabbing of a man following an argument has pleaded guilty and accepted a three and a half year prison sentence.

The court in Almeria ordered the defendant to pay €13,820 in compensation to the 66-year-old. It also ruled the 35-year-old must not go within 300 metres of the victim.

The court heard the defendant was arguing with the man in the Cal de San Pedro area of the Cabo de Gata natural park in the early hours of the morning. He then pulled a knife out and stabbed him in the abdomen area.

The 35-year-old then fled before emergency services arrived and evacuated him in a maritime rescue helicopter and took him to Torrecardenas Hospital. The helicopter was needed due to the stabbing taking place in a remote area.

The 66-year-old was taken to hospital where he remained for 45 days. He was unable to live a normal life for more than three months after being stabbed.

Officers arrested the defendant after he was found to be hiding in the area, police said.

Father arrested over 'stabbing son'

A FATHER who allegedly stabbed his son to death has been sent to prison, by the Andalucia's high court (TS-

The suspect, of Romanian nationality, called emergency services to tell them he had killed his nine-year-

The father stabbed the boy after he had 'hurt his mother,' according to sources at the Andalucia high court.

By the time ambulance services arrived they were unable to save the child's

When Guardia Civil arrived at the house, on Calle del Mar in Balerma near El Ejido, the suspect handed himself in.

Emergency services then took the victim's mother and 12-year-old brother who was suffering from anxiety attacks to the El Ejido's Western hospital.

The events happened in the early afternoon of last Friday - when the suspect was at home with his two sons - while the mother was out working in a green-

In addition to the murder charge, the man is accused of abusing his partner and crimes against the moral identity of his other son.

Even though the victim was a child, the court is demanding the case be treated as gender violence.

This marks the fourth case of its kind, so far this year, according to Spanish media reports.



Expat stab horror

Brit convicted for brutal attack

A BRITISH man could be sentenced to 13 years in a Spanish prison after being found guilty of a horror stabbing on the Costa Blan-

Benjamin Da Costa, 30 was convicted of killing former army medic Scott Waring in the wake of a trial in Elche.

Prosecutors told a jury of

nine people the dad-of-one, 40, died soon after being attacked with a 'glass or pint jug' following an argument with Da Costa.

Expatriate Simon Williams, landlord of the Hub Sports Bar in Villamartin Plaza, Orihuela Costa, has also been found guilty of trying to cover up the attack.



'Defined contribution' or 'money purchase' pensions

Members of these schemes, such as personal and Self-Invested Personal Pensions (SIPPs), can usually do the following from age

- Take the whole fund as cash -25% will be tax-free in the UK.
- Make cash withdrawals when you want - a quarter is usually free of UK tax each time.
- Take regular income through 'flexible drawdown', leaving the remainder invested.

Transfers to a QROPS based in the EU or EEA (European Economic Area) - including Gibraltar – are currently tax-free. However, a 25% UK charge applies

on transfers to QROPS outside the EU/EEA (unless you are resident in the same jurisdiction). Some speculate that the UK may start taxing Britons transferring within the EU/EEA post-Brexit.

Consider acting now, but take personalised, professional advice to establish if transferring is suitable for you and navigate the complex 'Defined benefit' or 'final salary'

Here, your employer promises a proportion of your salary for the whole of retirement.

While you cannot usually withdraw cash, you can transfer benefits to a defined contribution scheme or QROPS. Traditionally, this has been considered less attractive than drawing a guaranteed pension for life. However, today some providers are offering 'transfer values' of up to 40 times the annual benefits due at retirement. A generous one-off sum could potentially provide a retirement income that exceeds the original annual payment, but it is crucial to fully understand the consequences before giving up a lifetime income.

Whatever type of pension you have, there are other issues to consider.

Taxation

While 25% of cash withdrawals can be taken tax-free in the UK, they are usually taxable in Spain for Spanish residents.

Income from most UK pensions is taxable only in Spain, but UK government pension income including teachers', local authority, army, police and civil service pensions - remains taxable in the UK only.

Most expatriates with Spanish residency will therefore escape UK taxes on pension income, but are subject to Spanish income tax rates. However, in certain circumstances – for example, with lifetime annuities it may be possible to receive up to 92% tax-free in Spain.

Making your money last

Having the freedom to withdraw or transfer your pension does not mean that you should. If you do take your benefits as cash, make sure you have a reliable plan to fund your long-term financial future.

Beware also of pension scams and unregulated companies offering

pension services, as they provide no recourse if things go wrong. Generally, if an investment sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

Make sure your adviser is regulated through the UK Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and has cross-border experience to understand the tax implications in both the UK and Spain. They should evaluate your objectives, circumstances and risk appetite to find the most suitable solution for you.

While you should take the time to get it right, keep the Brexit countdown in mind. With some of today's freedoms likely to change post-Brexit, now is the time to review how to secure a prosperous retirement in

Paedo freed by UK judge

A CONVICTED British paedophile who went on the run to Spain will not be jailed after a judge ruled that he has 'resolved his

Alan Grundy, 59, was given a 14-month suspended sentence at Bradford Crown Court after pleading guilty to three charges of creating offensive images and videos and one of failing to notify police of a change in

The case comes in the wake of his recent arrest and extradition to the UK on a European Arrest Warrant. He reportedly fled after 87 indecent images and two videos featuring children were found on his computer almost three years ago.


In 2012 Grundy, of no fixed address, was found guilty of 21 offences of making images of a paedophilic nature.

He was told at the time that he must register any changes of name or address with

But he vanished after being held and refused to comment when investigators seized a computer from a Bradford property where he had been living on June 26, 2015.

Prosecutor Paul Nicholson told the court that when police returned to the residence "his mother said he had not lived at the address since he had been arrested.

"It turned out that he had taken himself abroad and gone to Spain."

Lawyer Tom Rushbrooke, defending, argued that Grundy had been suffering from depression and had turned to alcohol at the time of his first arrest. "While he was in Spain he had no access to computers at all,"

The court also heard that he 'slipped the net' of a rehabilitation programme for sex offenders which he was told to attend when sentenced to a community order in

Judge Jonathan Durham Hall OC described the latest images as "disgraceful material," but added: "The running away to Spain, on the one hand was reprehensible, but on the other hand, it seems you have used that time to resolve many issues."

Grundy has been ordered to complete 250 hours of voluntary work and attend the rehabilitation programme, and has been handed seven-year sexual offenders and notification orders, local media confirmed.

'There's no way'

A FRIEND of an expatriate man being hunted by Spanish police claims a Costa del Sol horror accident has been misreported

According to Spanish media, the Briton leapt to safety seconds before the car he was driving plunged 30 metres off the A-45 dual carriageway, rolling several times before landing on its side in the Guadalmedina River

He managed to walk to a

hostel in the nearby village of Casabermeja and was driven to Carlos Haya Hospital in Malaga City with minor bruising, but allegedly failed to tell medics that a 42-year-old man from Riogordo, Axarquia, was still inside the vehicle.

The Spaniard was freed five hours later after a passing motorist spotted the wreckage, with rescue workers later describing his condition as 'critical.'

But by that time the unnamed driver had already discharged himself.

And a mutual acquaintance, who wishes to remain anonymous, exclusively told the *Euro Weekly News* that the two men are "the best of friends," and "there's no way that 'he' would have abandoned Ricarda."

The source pointed out other inaccuracies in the story before admitting: "I have talked to him.

"He says he can't remember anything and just woke up in hospital asking what happened.

"He's a really good guy and is trying to decide what to do."



Brit fugitive caged

A BRITISH drug dealer who fled to Alicante has been sentenced to spend 12 years in prison, almost four years after he received the initial sentence.

Scott Woods, aged 29, received a 12-year sentence in June 2014 after failing to attend his sentencing having been found guilty of two charges of conspiring to supply a Class A drug.

Woods, had initially been arrested in October and November 2012 along with five other men after an investigation by Dorset Police's Major Crime Investigation team unveiled a comprehensive conspiracy to supply Class A drugs across the country.

Almost four years after his initial trial, Woods was picked up in Alicante last month and was extradited back to the UK after a European Arrest Warrant was executed.

Appearing at Bournemouth Crown Court on Friday, April

Suicide shock

12-year-old boy found hanged

A 12-YEAR-OLD Moroccan boy who was found hanged at his Murcia home may have been the victim of a macabre online game, investigators have confirmed.

The news comes after detectives probing the case concluded that the boy was popular at school and not a victim of bully-

They now believe he could have become embroiled in the notorious 'blue whale' suicide game after several parents said that classmates at his school had mentioned it.

One mother told Spanish media: "Yesterday his friends were crying, and they said the blue whale game was to blame."

The child - whose name has not been revealed for legal reasons - was found by members of his family at their duplex flat in the town of La Union after he failed to respond to calls for din-

ner. Medics managed to resuscitate him three times but he later died at the Santa Lucia hospital in Cartagena.

A post mortem examination has been performed, and his family reportedly wish to take his body to Morocco once it is returned to them.

La Union mayor Pedro Lopez

said that the entire community was "in shock" over the death.

The blue whale game has been linked to the deaths of hundreds of children as cases continue to be reported from around the

Players supposedly report to an administrator, who assigns a series of increasingly gruesome

tasks over a period of 50 days, typically involving self-harm or watching horror videos at unusual hours

Photographic or video evidence must be provided to the curator as each task is completed, with the sleep-deprived, psychologically-depressed player eventually encouraged to commit suicide to 'win' the game.

In Spain, incidents have been reported in Cataluña and the Basque Country, with the youngest victim allegedly just 12-years-old, although there have been no deaths reported.

Those responsible are said to be using advanced psychological profiling tools to target vulnera-

However, while police and schools in a number of countries have issued warnings to parents, cyber-bullying experts and factchecking websites say that the existence of the game remains



"I recently went on Home-Away to search for a villa to stay at in Ibiza after our wedding. I inquired about a place and received a message from the owner, saying because I was booking so far in advance he could give us a discount and asked me to email his private email to sort his calendar.

"I then emailed him asking about the discount and minutes later I received a reservation request from what I believed to be HomeAway.

"The email looked legitimate and my app said the same as my other emails from this website at the head of their emails. It gave me a bank account to transfer the balance to in order to complete the booking request.

"The payment was sent and happy days we had a fabulous villa booked for our honeymoon with our friends! I kept in contact with the owner who was very helpful and communicated well.

"Once the payment had left the bank two days later I emailed to see if he'd received it and he no longer replied.

"The next day I received an email from HomeAway saying they believed a listing to be fake and that if we had made any bookings to get in touch.

"I called them straight away and they said it states somewhere on their website that no payments should be made outside their website, however my fake email looked like their website so I didn't think anything of it.

"So please be aware of the big websites having fake listings, never personally email anyone and never ever bank transfer money online, even if the place is amazing and only offers bank transfer, choose somewhere else.

"We now have to try and replace that money to pay for our wedding because I was stupid."

HomeAway confirmed that to avoid problems all payments should be made via its website.





Dirty cash fear sparks inquest

THE Spanish High Court has revealed that it is probing the country's third-largest lender Caixabank.

A written ruling said that employees and directors at 10 branches of the Valencia-based institution are suspected of helping criminals to transfer € 99 million of dirty money to China and Hong Kong between 2013 and 2015.

It added that the cash was moved under an agreement with the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China, already under investigation for alleged recycling of dirty money in Madrid.

EC chief backs Brexit veto

A SPANISH construction firm has been accused of holding Australian city Sydney to ransom over a \leq 1.25 billion light rail project.

It comes as New South Wales (NSW) Transport Minister Andrew Constance revealed that the disastrous scheme, scheduled to open in March 2019, is now running a year behind schedule.

And he blames Madrid-based subcontractor Acciona, which he claims is deliberately delaying work as it remains locked in a €750,000 legal battle with the NSW state government.

"We will ensure as best as possible

that they ramp up their activity - they are on a 'go slow,' anyone walking the city can quite clearly see," Mr Constance said.

"They have construction zones where there is no workforce on the ground doing the work."

Acciona has filed a Supreme Court lawsuit against Transport for NSW, which it argues has behaved in a 'misleading and deceptive' way, claiming it entered into the contract under a 'false premise.'

The fiasco has brought traffic on one

of the east coast city's busiest thoroughfares to a standstill, and NSW Labor deputy leader Michael Daley said the government must share responsibility.

"They are going slow in this project because things are seriously wrong and they have been wrong from day one," he said.

But Mr Constance disagreed, as he replied: "ALTRAC [the consortium responsible for the bungled project] and Acciona need to meet the requirements of the contract, and the NSW government will not be held to ransom."

No pipe dream for gas guzzler

DOUBTS have been raised about the economic viability of a giant gas pipeline project between France and Spain.

The €3 billion Midi-Cataluña (Midcat) project has been backed by the European Commission and Spanish EU Climate Commissioner Miguel Arias Canete, with French gas grid Tenega and Spanish counterpart Enagas keen to invest.

But an independent analysis of Midcat's first phase concluded that it is unlikely to be cost effective, with critics having long questioned the need for it.

Amazon primed in redundancy battle

E-COMMERCE giant Amazon has been slammed for firing more than 100 employees who were striking for improved working conditions.

The firm claims that the decision not to renew temporary contracts was due to a lack of consumer demand, but the CGT labour union accused the company of victimising staff at its biggest Spanish warehouse in San Fernando de Henares,

The workers have been organising strike days since March in protest at proposed new employment terms, which are set to see salaries for existing staff frozen indefinitely and sick leave payments slashed.

Spain's largest online retailer usually gives notice when contracts are not renewed, but those laid off told Spanish media that they were informed by email the same day their existing agreements expired.

Juan Franco of La Linea de la Concepcion, which borders the Rock, has invited firms to set up offices in his town so they can continue to serve EU clients after Britain leaves the bloc in March next year.

And he has indicated that the council is willing to take unusual measures to do so.

"If necessary we could adapt the convention centre to host the companies temporarily," said Franco in a telephone interview.

Brits' €462,000 court battle

BANKS DESCRIBED AS 'IRREGULAR AND DISHONEST'

THE Swiss branch of a Danish bank must pay a British expatriate couple €462,000 in compensation after a Malaga court found evidence of wrongdoing in a mortgage loan

A judge presiding over the case concluded that Sydbank - which opened an office in Fuengirola on the Costa del Sol - and Danish mortgage lender Nykredit were not authorised to operate in Spain, referring to them as "clandestine

And a court ruling described the firms' behaviour after convincing the victims to remortgage their home to avoid Spanish inheritance tax as "irregular and dishonest."

It also accused two witnesses testifying on behalf of Nykredit of being "extremely unreliable, when not openly untruthful."

The document continued: "The Malaga Appeal Court has reversed an unjust Court of First Instance ruling and granted relief to two British pensioners, victims of the 'Spanish Equity Release Package' (SERP),

peddled by Nykredit Realkredit A/S "and Sydbank (Schweiz) AG and sold by Offshore Money Managers."

The decision reportedly comes two days before the unnamed pair's home was due to be auctioned after

they received a notice of foreclosure.

Sydbank and Nykredit are the same two companies implicated in the case of British expatriates Barry and Maria Gill, who still live in their Costa del Sol home despite it being

In 2006 they were advised to take out a 90 per cent interest-only mortgage on their property - which they owned in full - by a local financial adviser, slashing their inheritance tax liability from 20 to 2 per cent of its

And they were told to borrow the cash from Nykredit and deposit the €891,699 total with Sydbank.

But the sum began to plummet and in 2012 the Gills learned that Sydbank had shut its Swiss branch and paid the remaining €294,228 of their money to Nykredit without their consent.

"We later learned that Sydbank decided to close their Swiss branch because of the threats of legal action they were receiving against them and Nykredit from similar cases of fraud such as our own," Barry told Danish

It left the Gills with an outstanding mortgage of €600,000 on a property they had owned entirely six years earlier, and which Nykredit reportedly sold in 2017.

Venezuela and Spain agree to strengthen ties

SPAIN and Venezuela have announced that they are to 'normalise relations' and restore their respective ambassadors.

It follows a diplomatic spat which erupted in the wake of European Union (EU) sanctions against the troubled South American country.

The row saw President Nicolas Maduro withdraw his envoy to Madrid over what he called "repeated meddling" in his nation's internal affairs.

His comments came after the EU and United States penalised Venezuelan officials for alleged abuses against opposition protests.

The country has been under fire for creating a Constituent National Assembly in 2017, a supreme power that critics say is akin to a dictatorship.

Maduro has repeatedly slammed Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy during live television broadcasts, accusing Spain and other European governments of working together to destabilise

Of course it's a city, strong distinctive architecture, beautiful views of Lake Geneva and mountains, compact not sprawling, with a fast running river dissecting 'downtown'. airplane or car. Where though to stay when you arrive? There are many really good first class hotels in Geneva, how could there not be when it regularly hosts heads of state and is frequently the cockpit of diplomatic tussles.

On the shore of the river Rhone and overlooking the Jet is the Hotel des Bergues. First opened on May Day 1834 the hotel was the

largest in Switzerland at the time. More recently a Four Seasons group hotel, the Hotel des Bergues, was extensively and fabulously refurbished and reopened in 2005 to great acclaim.

The public rooms, shops and restaurants on the ground floor have attracted the wealthiest of travellers and people of business for more than 180 years. The hotel itself accommodated them ought to have a first class spa and of course the Hotel Des Bergues does. A WHILE ago my bank account was hacked. Why anyone would bother given that my balance is often lower than my IQ beats me, but that's the way the galleta crumbles these days.

What's more surprising is that they only wanted, and took, the equivalent of two euros.

Turns out it was a fishing expedition. According to my friendly banker (yes, there are still a few around even if they're right up there on the mosthated list with us journalists), they were testing the waters to see whether (a) they could do it and (b) they could get away with it.

We nipped that incident together, only to find another odd transaction on my statement a few months later: a hundred euros changed into dollars. Then, presumably when the bank noticed 'their' mistaken transaction, it was changed back to euros. Job done, discrepancy solved, no need for any alarm bells.

Except that there was. What most users might easily forget is the difference between the buying and selling rates for foreign currency. My hundred smackers ended up back in my ac-

count as just 97, and the hackers in Prague (apparently) had done this to thousands of accounts, a nice little

Ditto the supremely clever scam right back at the beginning of computerised banking, when an insider took just one cent from every account in his nationwide bank, correctly assuming no-one would bother. But the bank had several million customers. so you do the maths. Or math if

Online banking has been one of the finer innovations of our digital age used prudently. UK banks say they managed to catch more than 60 per cent of fraud attempts last year, but the equivalent of €800 million still found its way to the bad guys.

When my Inbox isn't telling me I've won a lottery I didn't enter, or that Nigeria's finance minister really needs my help to move several million, I regularly get emails purporting to be from my bank (and others) asking me to update my personal details, and providing a handy link to do so.

Don't. By all means check and update your information. But do it by going to your tried and trusted online banking site in the usual way, not by clicking an email link which may be a 'spoof', taking you straight to a site which may look like your bank's but isn't, and possible penury.

Oh and by the way: if you get an email from your bank saying some payments are outstanding - it's not a compliment.

PIN money

THE good news for online bankophobes is that you're more likely to be defrauded through your plastic card than with internet banking (80 per cent vs 18 per cent last year).

Although fraud losses still run into millions, online banking crime is actually trending downwards, largely thanks to increased vigilance by both banks and customers.

One golden rule is never to give your PIN code to anyone. Not even bank staff.

Nor indeed to family members.

When a teenager blew some € 11,000 on his dad's card last year, the bank refused compensation because the PIN was in dad's desk.

In the interests of family harmony the son is apparently paying it back - at €10 a month. For 90

Property market recovery goes on

HE Spanish property market is officially booming. It comes after Spanish real estate analysis and consultancy firm Tinsa revealed that the sector continued to grow throughout the first quarter of 2018, as prices shot up by an average of 3.8 per cent, according to year-on-year data.

But the cost of property increased by much more in a number of hotspots, with capital Madrid (17 per cent) and Palma de Mallorca (14.8 per cent) leading the charge.

Prices rose in virtually all provincial capitals across the country, but the Tinsa index shows that strong demand has dictated that larger markets are developing fastest.

Figures recently published by real estate website Idealista back up the report, after asking prices rose by 2.2 per cent over the first three months of the year, ending March at an average €1,621 per sauare metre.

HOMEOWNER SURGE: Sales of both new builds and pre-owned properties are on

Madrid again topped the ranking of autonomous communities, with each square metre costing an average €2,159, followed by the Balearic Islands (€2,068), with Extremadura (€768) cheapest.

Spanish estate agents have confirmed that sales of new homes are returning to pre-financial crisis rates.

A report by luxury homes specialist Lucas Fox shows that transactions in Madrid and Barcelona have reached their highest peak since before the property crash sparked by the collapse of international banks. New builds accounted for 50 per cent of sales in the two cities, while Lucas Fox itself says that they accounted for 39

per cent of its own deals.

The average price of homes sold by the firm in 2017 climbed to €830,000 from €730,000 in 2016, a 14 per cent year-on-year gain.

International buyers accounted for 66 per cent of the company's sales, with 10 per cent from the UK, 8 per cent from the United States up 5 per cent from 2016 - while buyers from Scandinavia, the Middle East and Asia were also wellrepresented.

"Falling unemployment, low interest rates and a strong economy have all contributed to the growth in the Spanish property market," said Lucas Fox head of operations Rod Jamieson.

"Official figures now indicate that the market has recovered from the crash of 2008 with transactions reaching pre-crisis levels in some areas.

"Overall prices, however, remain below the levels of 2007, offering attractive opportunities for investors across the whole of Spain," he added.

MANSION owned by the legendary Chicago gangster Al Capone has hit the market for €12.2 mil-

The sprawling Miami Beach property underwent extensive restoration in 2015, and is the place where Capone planned the infamous 1929 St Valentine's Day Massacre.

Located on the exclusive and gated Palm Island, the 30,000 square-foot waterfront home is also where the Mafia boss died after seeing out his days as a reclusive dementia sufferer.

Capone bought the Colonial-style whitewashed compound in 1928 for €32,500, six

details were restored to their former glory in the renovation work, including French doors, hardwood floors, open archways and multi-pane windows.

The mansion enjoys a private beach, 100 feet of waterfront on Biscayne Bay, and has views of adjacent Hibiscus Island.

A picturesque 30foot by 60-foot swimming pool sits just off the cabana which Capone bragged was the biggest in Miami.

America's most famous mobster was only 29 when he bought the property after a stint at Alcatraz, and used it to relax and hold lavish parties.

On one occasion he was reportedly cavorting so loudly that retail magnate J C Penney asked him to 'keep it down' so that the visiting president Herbert Hoover could get some rest.

Capone also spent €40,000 fortifying the grounds, adding a guardhouse at the entrance, searchlights and a seven-foot high surrounding wall.

The gangster died in his bedroom in the house in 1947 at the age of just 48, after battling both syphilis and dementia.





Franco's summer retreat under siege

ANSION that served as the summer residence of 20th century dictator Francisco Franco is now the subject of a legal battle.

The provincial authority of A Coruña in north-western Spain has decided to take action to argue that the late leader's heirs have no right to benefit from 'plunder.'

Franco's grandchildren put the impressive Pazo de Meiras palace up for sale last month, which has prompted a strong reaction from politicians and public alike.

Nestor Rego, one of around 25 Galicians who invaded the property in protest last year, said: "It's a scandal that this property continues to be controlled by the dictator's family." A similar view is held by Goretti Sanmartin, deputy president of the A



PROBLEMATIC PALACE: A legal judgement will decide the fate of the property.

Coruña authority, who would like to see a 'consensus between all political forces and all levels of government' to open the palace and grounds up to the public. She has presented a report which questions the way in which Franco acquired the property during the Spanish civil war of the 1930's. Some claim that leaders of both A Coruña Council and the business community obliged local people to hand over a

portion of their income for the purchase and expansion of the estate.

The palace's grounds were expanded from 5.7 acres to the pristine 16acre site currently being advertised by real estate company Mikeli under a price tag of €8 million.

An overall figure on how much the state spent on the property, which became the Franco family's summer residence for 36 years, is difficult to estab-



HILE the country may have voted to leave the European Union, Brits show no sign of giving up on

Wandering cabin sees stars


PETITE mobile hotel has e e n launched in Arctic Finland, which can be fixed onto a sled behind a snowmobile in pursuit of the Northern Lights.

A crucial feature of the novel abode is the transparent roof, so guests can view the stunning Northern Lights while lying down.

Nine-year sales high

SPAIN'S National Institute of Statistics (INE) has published provisional residential property sales figures for 2017 that reveal a nine-year high in the number of transactions made last year.

This makes 2017 the most positive year for Spain's property market since 2008, which was the year in which the post-boom crash arrived, sending the real estate industry into a tailspin which has taken years to rectify.

Since 2013, the signs have been strong that the Spanish property market was steadily finding its feet, but this data is the first time that pre-crash conditions have been recorded.

Across all 17 autonomous regions of the country, property sales figures were higher than the year previously, and the nationwide 14.6 per cent increase on 2016 sales pushed the total figure to 464,423 homes sold last year.

This is in positively stark contrast to the 312,000 homes bought and sold in Spain in 2012, which marked the bottoming-out of sales activity during the deepest depth of the recession.

Figures for 2017 ended on a high too, with the official number of 32,211 transactions recorded in December last year, an encouraging 9.2 per cent increase on the same month in 2016, almost double the notary data published this week, which estimated a 4.5 per cent increase in sales for December.

RESTAURANT chains on the UK High Street have recently been facing a combination of a squeeze on incomes, rising costs and falling demand. Prezzo, Byron and Jamie's Italian have all shut restaurants. It's just market correction. Anyone can see there's massive oversupply, and most of those in trouble don't offer a good product so aren't sufficiently robust when the going gets tough.

This means that the market works the way Adam Smith taught us. Those restaurants which can't get bums on seats will fail, and their customers will move on to those of their competitors offering more appeal and better value.

In a restaurant there are two words never to get excited about. First, its 'Concept' (explained by hipster waiters who breathlessly tell you the salad leaves were foraged from the central reservation of the M1, or the salmon hand-smoked in a skip under Brixton

BOOZE WARNING: Drinking too much alcohol can cause many health problems.

NEW research shows that you might be drinking too much after all, even if you're keeping within the recommended limits

for safe alcohol consumption.

Regularly drinking more than 100g of alcohol a week five or six medium glasses of

wine or pints of beer - has been linked to shorter life expectancy, according to research published recently.

On average, each unit of alcohol consumed over the 100g threshold, will slice about 15 minutes off your life, about the same as a cigarette. And drinking between 200g to 350g per week will lower your life expectancy by one to two years. If you drink more than 350g per week you can expect to say goodbye to this world by up to five years earlier.

The research concludes that recommended daily limits for alcohol consumption should be lowered to save lives. Limits in Spain are about 50 per cent higher than in Britain, where the threshold for safe drinking was recently lowered to 112g.

Good news for the ladies, though, is that the research found no evidence supporting a lower alcohol limit for women than for men.

Battle of the bulge

UK government figures show that men in the UK are officially the fattest men in western Europe.

Some 27 per cent of the British population is now obese, putting the UK as the sixth highest in a league table of the 34 Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) nations.

The average male Brit now tips the scales at 84kg. Only Americans and - perhaps surprisingly - Australians are heavier. In fact, obesity rates in the UK are up 92 per cent since the early 1990's, according to the OECD, who also predict that 40 per cent of people in Britain will be obese by 2030.

The figures also confirm that men in the UK are heavier than their Spanish counterparts, who actually weigh the least in western Europe at 74.8kg. In Spain, which is famed for its healthy Mediterranean diet, only 17 per cent of the population are obese.

DIET DAMAGE: British men are the most overweight in Western Europe.






A perfect sausage casserole

Eat Well to Live Well by Andrew Harding

HERE on the Costa del Sol the rain has stopped and the sky is blue again, I hope

the same is true for my readers in other

The evenings are still a bit chilly, so here is a recipe that can probably be cooked for the next two or three weeks before it is time to break out and clean the barbecue ready for late spring and the summer.



1 tablespoon olive oil

6 whole sausage links

1 small red onion, peeled and diced

6 whole garlic cloves, peeled and

1 cup red wine

1 can tomatoes, chopped

1 whole stock cube, ground

1 teaspoon English mustard

1 tablespoon dried oregano 3 whole bay leaves, bruised

1/2 can cannellini beans, drained



PERFECT MATCH: Sausage casserole and roast potatoes.

1 teaspoon black peppercorns, ground 1 tablespoon parmesan cheese, grated 3 whole mushroom caps, sliced

Saute sausages with onion and olive oil until onion caramelised and sausages browned, add garlic saute until golden, add red wine and reduce by one third, add rest of ingredients except for parmesan and mushrooms and simmer for 45 minutes.

Add parmesan and mushrooms, cook for a further 10 minutes.

Serve with Yorkshire puddings (see last week's recipe), roast potatoes and your favourite, steamed green vegetable.

Roast potatoes (serves 2)

1 large potato

1 tablespoon olive oil

1 pinch salt

Preheat oven to 220 Celsius (conventional), or 200 Celsius (fan).

Peel and cube potatoes into rough sizes

Place potatoes in a microwaveable container and microwave on full power (850 watts) for six minutes, at the same time place a roasting tin containing the olive oil in the oven.

When the microwave has pinged, pour the potatoes and any water into a colander and shake to put a texture on to the outside of the potato.

Place in the oven and cook for about an hour or until the potatoes are a golden brown, shaking occasionally so the sides resting on the base of the tin change several times during cooking.

Sprinkle with salt

Hint: Choose whichever sausages are your favourite; this recipe works with them all. Tip: Keep an eye on the roasting potatoes, in my experience all ovens are different and internal temperatures and fan speed can vary substantially.



'I thought they were going to kill me' Brothers' cousin testifies in court

THE cousin of the two men accused of killing their uncle in Albox has told a court 'I thought that they were going to kill me.

Juan Andres and Pedro TG, aged 33 and 23 respectively, face charges of murder, attempted murder and illegal possession of weapons after they allegedly killed their uncle on February 24, 2016.

The pair are alleged to have become involved in a 'struggle' with their uncle, believed to be over an inheritance disagreement. which saw Juan TG shoot his uncle point blank in the

Their cousin, son of the two defendants' late uncle. was reportedly able to break up an initial confrontation between his father and the brother but has now said that he 'did not have time to stop the shooting.'



According to Spanish media, the man told the court: "He shot my father after pointing (the gun) at him while Pedro GT (the other defendant) said 'come, come, throw him' and pointed at me with his fingers on the trigger.

"I heard a click, I saw that the bullet did not come out and I jumped on brothers have appeared at Almeria's provincial court.

DELICIOUS fresh salad and herb ingredients can be easily grown in such a small space in very little time using wooden pallets.

Pallets can be used as containers, often with very little modification, filled with soil and planted with your favourite small plants. The result is readily available salad plants, herbs or other plants of your choosing.

If space is an issue, pallets can be stood vertically to create a multi-storey garden with rows of plants held by the pallet's wooden slats. Horizontally the pallets make a good row divider and keep the plants cleaner as they rest on the wood rather than soil.

Either way they make growing your plants much easier as they hold the soil, insulate the soil temperature, and give easy access to care for and harvest the produce.

If you are lucky you may find some pallets at factories or other places which frequently get deliveries on them. Some are starting to re-

alise their value and may wish

to charge something for them

but many still give them away.

It is still far easier to have the ready-made frame at a fraction of the cost and work it takes to make them from new timber.

The best pallets are heat treated ones. Chemically treated pallets may last longer but may have residues that can be

harmful. Fortunately most are not treated as they are often for one use only, which makes a great benefit to the environment if you can find creative ways to reutilise them.

For vertical gardens you will need to put a liner of shade cloth, a sack that fits inside the pallet or even some extra wood from another pallet to keep the soil stable inwhen watering. You can paint and decorate them if you are really keen or just leave them with the natural wood.

Horizontally laid pallets are easiest but take up more space. If you are placing them on a balcony or terrace with a hard surface it is best to make sure that run-off from watering will not cause any issues. A simple waterproof material under the pallet, with the edges pinned up onto the pallet frame, can act as an effective water trav.

I have seen many gardens with plenty of space using pallets just for their convenience to suppress weeds, protect the plants and add character to the garden. It works wonderfully when filled with compost and enriched soil. The pallets help to reduce evaporation and so less watering is needed.

There are so many types of lettuce and Asian green vegetables available these days that you can make interesting arrangements of the plants or the more traditional rows of different varieties can be guided by the pallet lines.

Parsley, thyme and various other herbs will also do well in pallets. Grouping them together makes it easy to gather the herbs when needed in the



THE world's very first off-road electric supercar, the MISS-R, has been sighted while out testing in an off-road setting.

MOTORING FACT

Taiwanese giants XING Mobility are responsible for making the MISS-R supercar, which was revealed at the AutoTronics show in Taipei earlier this month, and the car has been mooted as potentially becoming the fastest production car in the world.

It has also been claimed that the impressive supercar, which boasts a staggering 1.341bhp, can accelerate from 0-100km/h in just 1.8 seconds, thanks to the car's unique system.

The supercar has four 350V motors, which the company are marketing as the first of its kind and are able to tackle a range of harsh terrains

Another of the supercar's features is a one megawatt battery pack, which alongside the motors has led the company to claim the car will be able to reach 0-190km/h in just 5.1 sec-

Alongside the MISS-R, XING Mobility are also reportedly currently working with both commercial and industrial vehicle makers in the hope of applying the technology created for the off-road supercar in other vehicles including buses, special-purpose boats, ride-sharing scooters and even construction equip-

XING Mobility co-founder and CTO, Azizi Tucker, told the company's website: "The commercial vehicle market is primed for a conversion to electric drivetrains due to functional needs, increasing emissions requirements and public noise reduction.

"However, this market is currently extremely under-served with many electric vehicle technology manufacturers focusing only on passenger vehicles."



ROAD TEST

SEAT'S Ibiza supermini has attracted a loyal following in recent years and the latest version, lower, wider and with a longer wheelbase and sharper styling, is certain to boost sales of this increasingly cool and sporty

SEAT Ibiza Xcellence

Running on a new lightweight platform also shared with some of its VW-Audi stablemates. Ibiza now has more of a grown-up feel, is more spacious, better equipped and with charismatic styling which makes rivals look rather dull.

Ibiza prices start at € 15,838 (£13,665) and there are several trim levels including a tasty and more sporty FR version. Available only in five-door form, Ibiza comes with petrol and diesel options, with the 1.0 litre three-cylinder 94 hp petrol unit a popular choice.

This engine - the one fitted in my Xcellence flagship test model - has a 0-100kph time of 10.6 seconds, with a top speed of 182kph (113mph) and impressive fuel

economy - 21.2kpl (60.1mpg). Emissions are low at 106g/km.

The Xcellence model, priced at €20,063 (£17,310), has plenty of kit including keyless entry and start, four different driving modes, cruise control, parking sensors and rear-view camera, touchscreen infotainment, satnav with voice recognition and connectivity including Mirror Link, Apple Car Play and Android Auto, plus a wireless phone charger.

On the move, the lower, wider Ibiza handles exceptionally well, with minimal body roll and lots of grip. Ride quality is slightly firm but still comable. The turbo-petrol engine is responsive and at speed, pleasingly quiet for a three-cylinder unit.

Occupant space in the Ibiza is very good, accommodating four adults with ease and five at a squeeze. The box-shaped boot holds a substantial 355 litres and the rear seats fold down. though not fully flat.

This is the fifth generation of the Ibiza, with 5.4 million sold in over 30 years and sales currently at record levels in the UK and across Europe.

That upward trend is set to continue as the latest Ibiza has outstanding credentials in a hot-

ly-contested su-



They will look to make the most of West Ham's struggles this season, who fell to their 15th loss of the season in the 4-1 defeat at Arsenal last weekend.

On Saturday, West Brom can be officially relegated from the Premier League if they fail to beat Newcastle.

The Baggies have put on spirited performances in recent weeks, following up their 1-0 victory against Manchester United two weeks ago with a courageous 2-2 draw against Liverpool on Saturday, having come back from 2-0 down.

Spanish players banned after referee row

Spain subsequently lodged a formal complaint to Rugby Europe, after the result ensured Romania a spot at next year's World Cup, with governing body World Rugby later expressing it was 'deeply concerned' by the matter.

But Rugby Europe has now announced varying lengths of bans given to five

players involved in the after match row, who include Guillaume and Sebastien Rouet, Pierre Barthere, Lucas Guillaume and Mathieu Belie.

The Rouet brothers Guillaume and Sebastian, who both play at scrum-half, received the longest bans for physical and verbal abuse of a match official, 36 and 43 weeks respectively, while

and number 10 Belie all received 14 week bans for threatening actions/words at a match official.

A statement released on the governing body's website read: 'After considering the charges against each player and the Spanish Rugby Federation (FER), the Committee heard the arguments and evidences of all parties.

'These sanctions are applicable immediately for all players' rugby activities (clubs and national teams).

'Players have the right of appeal within seven days of receipt of the written decision. The misconduct complaint against the Spanish Rugby Union was suspended and a further hearing date

Record breaker

Nadal claims third consecutive Monte Carlo Masters

RAFAEL NADAL claimed his 11th Monte Carlo Masters title as he beat Japan's Kei Nishikori in straight sets.

It took the 31-year-old just 94 minutes to dispatch the World Number 36 Kei Nishikori in straight sets, 6-3, 6-2 as Nadal raced to his third consecutive title in Monte Carlo and a record 31st Masters 1000 title.

The victory, which saw him pick up his 36th straight set victory on clay, will also mean that Nadal will remain as World Number One ahead of Roger

Following his victory, the Spaniard told the media: "It's always special for me to be back here, having this trophy. It's one of the most important events of the year for me."

Nadal, who returned from an injured hip in the Davis Cup earlier this month, found himself under some early pressure from the former world number four as Nishikori broke the Spaniard's serve to go 2-1 ahead in the first.

But the pressure soon subsided as Nadal immediately broke back and then raced clear to take the first set, before quickly breaking in the second to take a 2-1 lead.

And the Spaniard ultimately proved too much for the Japanese star, who only returned from a long injury lay-off in January, as he soon broke again to claim victory and the perfect preparation for next month's French
