'Drugs ring' bust

ALMOST 30 people accused of being members of a group which trafficked drugs into Mallorca and spanned towns across the island have been arrested.

Around 400 officers, many from mainland Spain, were involved in the operation which involved raids in La Soledad, Son Banya, Son Gotleu and several parts of Part Forana.

Police carried out almost 60 visits to homes and other properties as part of Operation Ludar, reportedly one of the biggest anti-drugs trafficking cases in recent years.

Guardia Civil officers seized more than €150,000 in cash and drugs in various quantities during the raids.

A total of 12 of the suspects appeared in court in Palma last Friday morning.

They arrived there in Guardia Civil buses accompanied by a heavy security presence to take initial questions from the sitting magis-

FRIENDS of Maxwell, the Scottish woman who plummeted from a balcony while holidaying on the Costa Blanca, have spoken of their horror at finding her body lying by their hotel swimming pool.

Last weekend marked one year since the 27-year-old newlywed from Livingston tragically fell from the 10th floor of the Apartmentos Pavma complex Benidorm.

The bank worker had been visiting Spain for pal Carolynn Burke's hen-do with 19 other friends, and four of them plus her aunt returned to the resort as their search for answers continues.

Carolynn, 29, said: "My mum was banging on my door at 10.30am and then she burst into the room with a man shouting 'someone's missing, someone's missing - there's been an accident.

"Lesley-Anne got up and ran to the window and looked. When she came back she said, 'it's Kirsty.'

"We just sat in a room for

hours in silence crying.

"I don't think any of us will ever be the same

Lesley-Anne Watson, 28, added: "I looked and she was just lying there - I was shaking and freezing.'

The women gave a press conference in Benidorm before putting up posters and distributing fliers in the hope that new witnesses will come forward.



she had tucked Kirsty into bed: "I took her shoes off and asked her if she wanted her pyjamas on but she was being silly and said no. I said 'Goodnight, love you' and tucked her in like a wee

Lesley-Anne added: "There's not a day it doesn't go through your head, 'what if we stayed somewhere different? What if we came on a different

She described the aftermath as "hell" and recalled how she had to break the

tragic news to Kirsty's husband Adam, 28, who she had married just seven months earlier.

"Adam phoned and he said he'd had a strange call and he thought it was a prank. I had to tell him it wasn't and I remember him breaking down.

"It was horrific ... I replay that conversation in my head every day."

Kirsty's clothes were controversially destroyed without proper DNA testing in the wake of the incident.

Private detective David Swindle, an ex-police officer, is now probing the case on behalf of her parents Brian and Denise and husband Adam after Spanish detectives were unable to track down any witnesses and their Spanish lawver resigned citing "a difference of opinion over optimum legal strategy."

Britain death

AN 18-year-old Mallorcan man was killed after being hit by a van in Chichester, UK, at around 1am last Monday. Joan James RS, whose father is British, is believed to have been run over by the vehicle on the town's ring road before being taken to hospital and dying hours later.

Man held

A TWENTY-FIVE-YEAR-OLD man accused of forcing his ex-partner into becoming a prostitute has been arrested by National Police in Palma. The Bulgarian suspect is believed to have convinced the alleged victim to follow him to Spain from that country before threatening and assaulting her until she agreed to sex work.

Wall climbing

A WOMAN attracted interest from onlookers in Palma after she was spotted climbing the walls of Palma. The barefooted tourist began scaling the protected monument at around 3.30pm last Saturday, and was reportedly able to cover the area from near Sagrera to the Sa Feixina park in around 15 minutes.



HORSEPLAY: The Feria de Jerez is a traditional marvel.

IT'S among the most quintessentially Spanish festivals still celebrated today.

And the annual Feria de Jerez, also known as the Feria del Caballo (horse fair), is just around the corner

Taking place in world sherry capital Jerez de la Frontera, the week-long celebration is the most important in the province of Cadiz, Andalucia, and has been designated a celebration of international interest by the Spanish government.

Less of a tourist-trap than regional capital Sevilla's enormous Feria de Abril, it features the time-honoured casetas - temporary bars and restaurants which transform into lively nightspots packed with revellers after dark - plus a rancous family fairground with a range of attractions, both typical features of ferias in southern Spain.

Unlike in Sevilla the casetas are open to the public, allowing visitors to quaff local sherry and sample the area's superlative cuisine while guitarists march to a flamenco beat marked by the pounding rhythm of stamping feet and clapping hands

But a large portion of the leafy Gonzalez Hontoria Park, where festivities are centred, is also given over to the finest pure bred horses of Jerez in a nod to the origins of the event as a commercial livestock fair originating more than 500 vears ago.

The Royal Andalucian School of Equestrian Art is located in the city, and the area's horsebreeding heritage comes to the fore during the feria, with dressage, rising competitions and polo matches.

But the undoubted highlight is the daily parade of horse-drawn carriages, dubbed enganches in

Lavishly decorated English, Hungarian, Russian and Spanish-style carriages are paraded around the park and city streets, ending in the carousel, when they wheel and turn together in choreographed circles.

It is a striking, unforgettable spectacle soundtracked by the cracking of whips and hundreds of jingling bells.



Brit' hotel balcony plunge

A HOLIDAYMAKER believed to be British has plummeted from a third-floor hotel balcony in Magaluf and is reportedly in a 'serious' condition.

The victim - who Spanish media say is 25 years old and had been drinking - fell while partying in the early hours at a well-known Mallorca hotel with a group of friends who tried to save

Medics and police administered emergency treatment before taking him to the Son Espases University Hospital. He is now in a serious condition suffering from head and other injuries.

A receptionist at the hotel refused to comment

these sorts of things." It comes after Scottish teenager Natalie Cormack fell to her death from a Magaluf balcony last Friday.

The 19-year-old plunged from the seventh floor while trying to gain access to her apartment from an adjacent balcony, the Guardia Civil reported.

She was locked out after leaving her house keys at work.

The ambulance crew were called to the scene but couldn't save her.

The teenager was working as a bar waitress in the party hotspot popular with British revellers.

Earlier this month she posted on Facebook saying she was having the time of her life.

THE Balearic Island's Port Authority dispatched emergency services to the waters off its coast after a cruise ship began spilling oil into the sea yester-

Salvamento Maritimo coastguard boats and those from 112 emergency services were attempting to contain the spill from the TUI-run Marella Dream.

The leak is believed to have come

from the vessel's fuel tank and began at around 10am, according to reports.

Port Authority sources quoted in Spanish media said there were problems with the ship's ballasting system, a tank which is filled with water to aid

This is believed to have led to the

leak but authorities were waiting on more information from the ship's crew to confirm the theory, they added.

Emergency services began cleaning the spill shortly after they had contained it around the ship's stern, the back of the vessel.

The Port Authority will pass on in-

formation received from the ship to Spain's Maritime Authority, which is set to decide if penalties should be handed down for the spill.

The Marella Dream was built in 1986. It is 243 metres long and it arrived in Palma's port yesterday from

And in a second video, apparently shot on a bystander's mobile phone, the curvy South American passengers are seen standing on the pavement in shock as people try to help Sanders out of the badlydamaged Rolls Royce Dawn Coupe.

Witnesses said the women were gyrating to music and taking selfies prior to the incident, and added that the trio fled on foot before police arrived to breathalyse him after the supercar 'narrowly missed' around 20 people dining on a terrace.

The pricey motor, which has the personalised licence plate 'JODY,' has been impounded by authorities after being abandoned.

Maria Mamen, owner of the damaged shop, said she recognised Sanders since he regularly bought cigarettes there, adding that he had already called to apologise.



Sanders is known to flaunt his wealthy lifestyle on social media, with his Facebook page picturing him in sports cars and on yachts as he quaffs Champagne with beautiful women.

He is believed to divide his time between a €1.4 million mansion in Henley-in-Arden, Warwickshire, and a luxury villa in Bendinat, close to the crash scene.

His other cars include a €300,000 Lamborghini Aventador, a € 170,000 Audi RS8 and a €115,000 Range Rover, according to reports.

He has removed his Facebook page and did not respond to a comment request.

Brit holiday death

Tourist dies after alleged attack

THE partner of a British holidaymaker who died after an alleged assault in Mallorca has spoken of her shock at his death.

It comes after Aaron Henderson from Coleraine, Northern Ireland, reportedly passed away in hospital after an attack in Magaluf left him with serious head injuries.

He is said to have been on a family holiday with partner Danielle Baxter and their two young children.

In a Facebook post Ms Baxter wrote: "I love you Aaron 'Hendy' Henderson always and forever... uve [sic] made me the happiest I've ever been in my entire life.

"Life is cruel. Love and miss you always. My babes xxxxxxxx."

Local DUP Councillor Trevor Clarke told Belfast Live: "It's very sad news and has come as a shock to the local community. The young man was from a very wellknown family here in the town, who have a wholesale

"I don't know the family personally but I'd like to extend my sincere sympathies to them at this terrible time, I understand he has a young family as well and a partner so my thoughts are with them all."

Family business Paul Henderson Wholesales and Megastore announced on Facebook that it would remain closed until further notice.

"To all our valued customers, the store will be closed until further notice.

"We appreciate your patience and understanding and ask that you respect the family's privacy at this time."

The British Foreign and Commonwealth Office said in a statement:

"We are supporting the family of a British national following his death in Majorca."

Several evacuated in fire

FIREFIGHTERS were called out to an apartment building in Calvia after a blaze broke out which spread across three of its floors.

A total of 36 people were evacuated from the site and nine of them, including two Local Police officers, are believed to have suffered from smoke inhalation. Two elderly people also reportedly suffered anxiety attacks.

Emergency services arrived at 16 Passeig d' Illetes in the Cas Catala area after the fire started at around 5.45am on Saturday.

Initial findings suggest the blaze was sparked by a fridge in a flat on the third floor. The flames then spread throughout the five-storey building, leaving one apartment completely gutted.

The third floor was left with extensive damage and the fourth and fifth floors were also affected. A total of 24 apartments were declared unsafe to live in as a result of the fire and due to traces of toxic gas and soot left on the walls.

Four families made up of six adults and two children have since been housed in nearby hotels by Calvia's council.

Technicians later came to assess the damage and Guardia Civil officers have begun investigating the cause of the fire, which was declared extinguished at around 11am.

A VIDEO has emerged online which appears to show a man playing the guitar while behind the wheel on a Mallorcan motorway.

Police have been tracing the motorist after the footage was published online by a Mallorcan local news website.

Rocky road

IN the UK, pay was up by 2.8% and unemployment fell to 4.2%. The headline inflation figure came in at 2.5%, below the 2.7% that investors had been expecting. Unusually snowy weather caused retail sales volumes to drop by 1.2% compared with the month before. Sales for the quarter dropped by 0.5% compared with the final three months of 2017 - the biggest fall since Q1 2017.

The CBI survey found optimism fading from 13 to -4. The CBI's Distributive Trades Survey came in at -2%, compared to expectations of 16% growth. High street sales were flat in the year to April and consumer confidence fell from a 10month high according to the GfK index.

The results raise doubts about how far the Bank of England will raise interest rates this year, which could hurt the value of the pound.

In Europe, inflation readings came in from Spain (1.2%) and Germany (1.6%) and there was a slight widening of the Euroland trade surplus to €21bn in February. Mario Draghi released the April statement from the ECB and it was more of the same, which didn't help the euro.

The ECB's official monetary policy statement and actual policy settings remained unchanged, while ECB President Mario Draghi shrugged-off growth momentum fears but ultimately gave traders little reason to bid the euro higher.

The focus was on the broader themes of regional growth and convergence with more normal levels of inflation in the medium-term - at or just below the ECB's target of 2.0%.

The US dollar's recent rally appears to be a combination of excessively short positions and the expectation of higher US interest rates.

The higher public deficit and inflation implied by tax cuts and increased spending has driven 10-year bond yields to a

four-year high of 3% and that, in turn, has sucked in buyers of bonds and the dollar.

The Bank of Canada released its monetary policy statement; the market had apparently been expecting a more hawkish tone from the BoC and this impacted the loonie. Stephen Poloz, the governor of the Bank of Canada made an appearance at the Senate Standing Committee on Banking, Trade and Commerce. In his

speech, he highlighted that the economy was 'finally positive' after a long adjustment to a sharp fall in oil prices, but he added there was still softness in several areas of the country.

Poloz also told the Senate's banking committee that while interest rates would go up from their current low levels, moving too quickly could create a financial stability risk.

The Reserve Bank of Australia held its cash rate target at 1.5% at its April meeting. The bank last cut rates in August

The Australian inflation data came in a tick short of expectations at 1.9% while the Reserve Bank of Australia's 'trimmed mean', at the very same level, was a tick above forecast.

The NZ dollar is having a difficult time; technical factors continue to weigh against it and there appears to be nothing on the horizon to reverse that trend.



Sex assault verdict outcry

Politicians pledge change as protests erupt across Spain

A NAVARRA court's acquittal of five men accused of raping an 18-year-old woman during Pamplona's San Fermin festival has led to calls to reform Spain's sexual assault laws.

The court's verdict, which found the men guilty of sexually assaulting the victim, sparked protests in cities throughout Spain.

Hundreds of people took

to the streets in Palma and other towns and cities across the country after feminist groups mobilised supporters on social media.

The protests come as Rafael Catala, Spain's Justice Minister, said the government in Madrid would present proposals to reform the country's Penal Code "within weeks" following the verdict.

Protestors rallied around the slogan: 'I do believe

you.' They chanted: 'It's not abuse, it's rape!' and carried signs which read: 'Enough of the patriarchal justice system' and 'Spain is not a country for women.' Demonstrators were joined by local politicians in protests which took place across Spain. Those gathering in Madrid waved signs and chanted slogans outside the Justice Ministry building, according to reports.

Rallies were also organ-

ised beyond Spain including in the British cities of London and Manchester, as well as in Berlin, Brussels, Lisbon and Paris

Rafael Catala said in the wake of the outcry changes being drawn up by the government in Madrid would ensure the law was 'always' on the side of the victim.

"Society has changed a lot in the 23 years since current sexual assault laws were introduced. The commitment to respect people and our intransigence against violence, especially concerning

gender, is among those changes," he said.

The members of the selfstyled 'La Manada' (wolf pack) group were handed nine year prison sentences each. They have also been ordered to pay €50,000 in compensation and are prevented from contacting the victim for 15 years.

The court head they had led the woman back to the basement of a block of flats where they assaulted her and filmed it on their mobile phones.

The victim's family said

the court's penalty, for sexual assault rather than rape because no force was found to have been used, was 'insufficient '

The men were given the right to appeal against the ruling. Both the prosecution and the defence have said they would lodge appeals with the court.

A national petition on the Change.org site calling for the disqualification of the magistrates who handed down the verdict has been signed by more than 1,316,750 people.

Leftist anti-Putin rally gets go ahead

Approval for the Left Front's protest comes as an anti-Putin rally request from opposition leader Alexei Navalny was rejected due to clashes with Victory Day rehearsals. Alternative arrangements were being sought.

Guards 'beat' prisoners

■ AUTHORITIES are investigating a Siberian prison after footage emerged which appeared to show two unidentified officers beating detainees. The 14-minute YouTube video reportedly features prisoners being lined up before being punched by guards in the shower room while Richard Wagner's Ride of The Valkyries is played. The footage suggests the beatings were due to disputes over a

Libel bill becomes law

■ PRESIDENT Vladimir Putin has signed off legislation giving authorities powers to shut down

websites suspected of defaming public figures. The Internet Libel Bill grants courts the power to order websites be blocked which discredit the 'honour, dignity or business reputation' of a Russian citizen.

Attack fakery 'proof'

■ STATE-RUN television channels have used stills reportedly from a Syrian director's 2016 film shoot as evidence claims of a chemical attack by government forces in the country are false. A Channel One news anchor said Western politicians and media were ignoring "proof" the attacks in Douma were staged. Russia and Syria deny claims the Assad regime was behind the strike.

'No revolt' in Armenia

A KREMLIN spokesperson has said civil unrest in Armenia does not amount to a Ukraine-style revolution. Dmitry Peskov's comments come as the Russia ally's Prime Minister Serzh Sargsyan resigned following two weeks of protests. Peskov added Moscow was satisfied the situation currently appeared stable.


History uncovered

€7 EU visa fee announced

BRITISH holidaymakers could have to pay a €7 fee to travel to the European Union (EU) in the wake of Brexit.

Plans drawn up by EU ambassadors and signed off this week reveal that visas will remain valid for three years once issued, or until the passport used to register expires.

Travellers will be required to provide personal information and details about their recent movements to enter the bloc, as well as answer questions regarding criminal records.

The proposed scheme forms part of the EU's European Travel Information

and Authorisation System - designed to track down criminals and slash illegal immigration - and will apply to people visiting all 26 Schengen-zone nations from countries that do not currently require a visa.

And Britain is expected to be included unless the government is able to secure an exemption, which they will hope to do during the ongoing Brexit

Should they fail to do so, Britons would have to apply for the document online with background checks performed prior to approval under a system similar to the ESTA procedure currently employed by the United States.

UK Prime Minister Theresa May has not yet said how the government plans to manage EU nationals travelling to

It comes as ministers have reportedly been left furious after the EU said the UK's role in the €10.3 billion Galileo satellite-navigation system would be downgraded post-Brexit.


The UK has spent € 1.4 billion on the project, and is now considering plans to launch its own rival.

The European Central Bank (ECB) was once again a key driver in euro movement over the last few weeks as markets sought to learn more about the bank's plans to wind down its stimulus programme.

This saw the euro move lower against most of its peers as the ECB voted to leave monetary policy unaltered again in April.

Some disappointing inflation figures also weighed on the single currency this month, as they signalled the ECB's current path is unlikely to change for some time to come.

The focus for EUR investors over the coming month is likely to be an expected dip in the Eurozone's first quarter GDP and whether the latest economic data points to a further moderation in growth during the second quarter.

GBP/EUR: Up from \in 1.13 to \in 1.14 GBP/USD: Down from \$1.41 to \$1.39

The pound skyrocketed at the start of April as it was buoyed by expectations that the Bank of England (BoE) was gearing up to raise interest rates in May.

However, Sterling was brought crashing back

down to earth in the second half of the month as it appeared this speculation may have been a lit-

Investors fled the pound in droves as some weaker-than-expected inflation figures and BoE Governor Mark Carney's comments that he was 'conscious of other meetings later in the year' caused many analysts to revise their

Looking ahead, next month's BoE meeting is likely to be a flash point for GBP, with the bank's decision on whether to raise interest rates likely to dictate the underlying strength of the pound over the coming months.

USD/GBP: Up from £0.70 to £0.71 USD/EUR: Down from €0.80 to €0.82

The US dollar was seen in a negative light at the start of this month, with many investors shunning USD as Donald Trump traded barbs with Moscow over an alleged chemical weapons attack in Syria.

The US dollar didn't stay down for long however, with the US currency enjoying a major resurgence towards the end of April as rising inflation helped to bolster expectations of a more aggressive path of monetary tightening from the Federal Reserve.

This, in turn, helped US treasury yields break past 3 per cent and prompted investors to flock

There is potential for the US dollar to continue to push higher in May should the Fed chose to strike a more bullish tone in its upcoming policy meeting.

Who predicted predictive text?

The future ain't what it used to be, says Terence Kennedy



AN IBM chairman uttered the IT industry's most hopeless prediction ever in the 1940's: 'I think there is a world market for maybe five computers.' Oops.

Movie mogul Darryl Zanuck thought television was a passing fad. An InfoWorld columnist believed the internet would fizzle out by 1996, a Microsoft executive said Apple was as good as dead in 1997, and Bill Gates insisted we would solve spam by

Prediction is notoriously difficult, especially if it's about the future. I can't even predict what socks I'm going to wear.

We may not be jet-packing to work (yet), nor commuting to other planets as so many 20th century pundits thought we would by

now. But an old tech article re-**POCKET PITA: Predicting the** smartphone.

cently went viral given the uncanny prescience of its predictions.

American science fiction writer David Gerrold actually foresaw smartphones, exactly how they would work, and even how annoying we'd eventually find

In a 1999 interview he forecast that his phone would be merged with 'a pocket organiser, a beeper, a calculator, a digital camera, a pocket tape recorder, a music player and a colour television, all fitting in a box smaller than a deck of cards.'

He went on to predict how it would connect wirelessly and function as a desktop system connecting to full-sized screens, with speech recognition, email, finding restaurants and booking hotels.

Like Douglas Adams' fictional Babelfish, Gerrold's future wonder could actually translate the world's languages. With one pioneering exception today's smartphone doesn't connect to a keyboard and monitor and hey-presto it's a desktop computer as he predicted, but give it a few years.

Remember that Gerrold's visionary view was delivered a full eight years before the iPhone launched the smartphone era engulfing us today. And yes, he saw its downsides too.

'I would call this device a Personal Information Telecommunications Agent, or Pita for short,' he said. 'The acronym can also stand for Pain In The Ass, which it's equally likely to be, because having all that connectivity is going to destroy what's left of everyone's privacy.'

No, really?

While Gerrold could reveal the future without either a crystalball nor his palm being crossed with silver, it's astonishing just how many people at the very top of the industry show less prescience than a haddock.

The one I particularly like is the one I call 'Five Seedy Bread.' It's really tasty and I'm sure many of you have seen it or even buy it. The only problem is it's round so what happens is you get four to six decent size slices out of the fat bit in the middle, for your sandwiches, and then you get smaller sandwiches.

PROPERTY sales in Spain last year reached their highest level since the global financial crash of 2008.

The total number topped 465,000, representing a 15 per cent increase on 2016 in what appears to be a positive outlook for the Spanish economy.

Unlike GDP figures which are vulnerable to regular revisions, housing data acts as a leading indicator.

Between 1996 and 2007, house prices rose by 197 per cent, but the ensuing period of 2007 to 2015 saw prices fall by nearly 42 per cent.

Prior to the financial crisis. investment in Spain's housing sector amounted to around 7.5 per cent of GDP, and the construction industry was a key source of employment.

In fact, the performance of the nation's housing market is even more impressive when compared with neighbouring countries.



PREMIUM PRICE: Spain's housing market is going strong.

Between October and December 2017, Spain's house prices were 7 per cent higher than those of the same period in 2016. Over the same three months, house prices actually contracted by 0.3 per cent in Italy, and were negligible in France, Cyprus and Malta.

Moreover, the fact that the European Central Bank (ECB) has kept interest rates low has reduced the cost of mortgages, while Spain's unemployment figures are at a nine-year low.

An increasing number of mortgages are now based on fixed rates, making them less

vulnerable to a shift in ECB monetary policy.

While demand is forecast to be highest in Madrid and along the coastline, every one of Spain's autonomous regions is expected to see the value of their housing markets increase

There's still time to start growing summer vegetables

Spain's best known expatriate gardening author

DICK HANDSCOMBE



ALTHOUGH for many expatriate gardeners April in Spain has been a mix of unseasonal hot and cold, and dry and wet spells, many have now enjoyed a couple of months of healthy young spring vegetables, especially those for salads. Now with rain likely in early May to dampen soils it is not too late to start off more in containers, raised beds, the open garden and even on apartment terraces.

If you have never done so there are good reasons for doing it.

Firstly it is difficult to buy a wide range of freshly harvested ecologically grown vegeta-

Secondly few commercial growers grow the tastiest varieties and harvest when still succulent. They need to go for size to maximise their

Thirdly many Spanish vegetables are grown in an unnatural microclimate under plastic in Almeria which in some areas stretch across what would have been a beach. They are mostly grown in artificial compost mixes with heavy watering of chemical feeds and sprays.

When we first saw this 21st century coastal landscape our reaction was 'Let's start to grow

all our own vegetables and On our kitchen terrace. experiment to make it possi-

ble for all' . Why don't you do likewise? You don't have to have much space

As illustrated one can grow an amazing mix of vegetables with just three large tree tubs on the terrace outside the kitchen, or a collection of window boxes, a wooden trough, a growing table and an assortment of pots on a three-metre square terrace of an apartment. In both cases vegetables could be harvested 24 hours a day for 12 months of the year with careful phases

> of planting new plantlets or sowing seeds.

> The thing is to never leave any soil bare.

> Fruit and vegetables often need more space to spread but the area required for their roots and plantlets is not great.

You can buy young plantlets at this time of year or sow seeds for pumpkins, squash and courgettes

Child attacks



WHEN a child is badly mauled by a dog, it is nearly always the dog that is blamed, but I never blame the dog. I blame owners, the parents, the breeders, the public and the vets. Why?

I blame the owners because they should never allow children to be left unsupervised with their dog. The owner will defend the dog with remarks such as 'He didn't mean it' or 'He's not dangerous' or 'He has never done anything like that before' or 'He is wonderful with our children.' But this is no excuse.

The dog should have been confined, trained and castrated. Male dogs that are not castrated are more like-

ly to escape seeking a partner and roam the streets. If approached they can be dangerous. And all large dogs should be muzzled.

I blame the parents because they should teach children to respect dogs and not antagonise them by pinching them, pulling their ears and tail and poking them in the eyes. And they should never be allowed to play with dogs without supervision.

Any large breeds like the Rottweiller, German Shepherd and Doberman are not suitable for homes where there are children.

The dog may be wonderful with the owner's children because they are part of the family pack. But the children of visitors can be regarded as intruders and if the children start playing rough with the dog, it can attack I blame the breeders because they as professionals are under an obligation to meet the highest possible standards. Sadly, some of them know little about canine behaviour. They carry out no tests to ensure the bitch and the mate are genetically sound.

Not surprisingly, the advice about rearing they give to the buyer, who usually takes their word as gospel, is unsound.

I blame members of the public because they should be better educated. So many still believe a dog should not be trained until six months old and so many do not even bother to attend training classes.

They could eventually be the owner of an aggressive, dangerous and uncontrollable dog.

I blame the vets because they should see when own-

ers bring their dogs to be treated whether or not the dogs are trained or out of control.

They should be directing these dogs and owners to local training clubs.

If I was involved in an investigation into the mauling or death of a child, I would want to know the name of

the vet and why he did not recommend the dog to be trained.

They should be advocating the early neutering of dogs if they are not to be used for breeding by a responsible breeder.

There must be thousands of attacks by dogs on children around the world every

day. In Australia alone, 100 dog attacks occur on average daily, mostly on children

If only those responsible owners, parents, the public, breeders and vets - took their share of the blame and acted accordingly, many of these attacks could be avoided.

Eight-legged friends

Here are some of the advantages and disadvantages to consider before keeping an eight-legged friend. On the positive side, spiders are clean, quiet animals which require little space.

They are also cheap to keep, much more than a traditional pet. Spiders can offer hours of entertainment and can serve as a valuable learning tool for a child.

However, most concerning of all is that most spider species are poisonous to a certain extent. As with poisonous snakes, the severity of a spider bite depends on the potency and amount of the venom, where the wou- nd occurs and how your body reacts to the venom.

And something sure to cause sleepless nights for any arachnophobic in the house is that many species of spider are expert climbers and can escape through small cracks.

It is essential, therefore, to

keep the spider enclosure properly sealed, whilst still allowing fresh air to enter. If you do decide to keep a spider you may grow to love your new pet.

However, don't grow too attached. Most spiders don't tend

to relate well with humans and want little or no social interaction. They also have a much shorter life compared to traditional pets, so pop their eight clogs earlier than you might want.

Two incredible new Superyachts

IT has been a busy few months for workers at Dutch Shipyard Oceanco who have been involved in delivering one innovative new sailing yacht and in developing a unique new motor powered Superyacht.

The 106.7-metre threemasted sailing yacht Black Pearl is unlike any yacht the world has ever seen. This unique and complex vessel is the realisation of a discerning owner's vision and is the result of an elaborate and successful collaboration on the part of an international group of designers, engineers, naval architects, builders, and project managers.

Dykstra Naval Architects designed Black Pearl's three 70-metre (230ft) DynaRig carbon masts and sailing system. The sail area is subdivided into smaller lesser-loaded sails and they can be set or furled by pushing a button with all 2,900 square metres of sails being set in just seven minutes.

Tuhura, Oceanco's latest project, conceived in collaboration with the Lobanov De-

sign studio, BMT Nigel Gee and interior designer Achille Salvagni, was unveiled at the Dubai International Boat Show earlier this year.

Its design harkens back to the style of early canoes; dugouts and other vessels used hundreds of years ago by indigenous people all over the

The Polynesians, in particular, famously made long voyage explorations across thousands of miles of open Pacific Ocean in their outrigger ca-

In fact, the actual name. Tuhura is derived from the Maori verb meaning: to discover, bring to light, unearth, open up, explore, and investi-

The pure simplicity of the canoe form leads to a naturally efficient hull with low overall resistance, good seakeeping and excellent manoeuvrability.

However integrating a modern propulsion system in the canoe form presents a challenge and the team opted for a hybrid Azipod® CRP (contra-rotating) propulsion system from ABB.

Innovation and cutting-edge technology is evident throughout the design. The hull has been conceived with multiple horizontal windows, utilising an advanced glass technology that consists of a series of dots, allowing the view from within to be completely transparent, while from the exterior, the windows appear the same colour as the hull, disguising their appearance.

BMW unveil all-electric SUV

BMW has revealed its brand new concept all-electric SUV, the BMW iX3, which is set to directly rival new models released by Tesla, Audi and Jaguar.

The iX3, which was unveiled at the Beijing Motor Show, is set to be the brand's first all-electric vehicle and could hit showrooms as soon as 2020.

BMW have said that the iX3, closely based on the popular X3, will be capable of producing 249 miles of range on a single charge, while the 70kWh battery can be recharged in just 30 minutes on a fast charger.

The iX3 has very similar characteristics to the X3, with its instantly definable trademark front grille. but also contains new features such

as blue accents to highlight the electric power.

Its electric motor will produce 266bhp, but BMW claim they may increase that to an impressive 532bhp if it chooses to choose an all-wheel drive option.

BMW's first all-electric SUV is expected to directly rival electric model concepts released by competing car brands in recent months including the Jaguar I-Pace, the Tesla Model X and the Audi e-tron, which is set to be released later this

Mercedes is also expected to release their electric ECQ in 2019.

The German car giants have also promised an all-electric 5 series, expected to have close to 400 miles of range, which will follow in 2021.

THE Mercedes-Benz A-Class has been a strong contender in the premium hatchback sector in recent years, and the all-new version is likely to further boost that success, offering sleeker styling and new benchmarks for quality and specification.

New A-Class is initially available in three trims: SE, Sport and AMG Line and with a choice of three engines, all with a seven-

The entry-level SE features twin seven-inch displays including a central touchscreen with voice activation, alloy wheels, airconditioning, DAB radio, leather and fabric upholstery, Active Lane Keeping Assist, Speed Limit Assist and keyless entry and start.

The A180d uses a 116 hp 1.5-litre diesel engine, the

hp 1.4-litre turbo-petrol engine, and a 2.0-litre petrol engine is also available.

The new model is almost unrecognisable from its predecessor, with a more aerodynamic profile and running on a new platform which delivers a more comfortable ride and sharper handling.

With light steering and

stable cornering, the car has a sportier feel and the auto gearbox is responsive and precise. On the motorway, new A-Class is impressively quiet and com-

My featured car, an A200 with 1.4-litre petrol engine has a quick 0-100 kph time of eight seconds, top speed of 223 kph (139 mph) and returns 18.2 kpl (51.4 mpg), with emissions of 123 g/km. In mid-range Sport trim it costs $\leq 31,137 \text{ (£27,280)},$ with added kit including LED headlights, larger alloy wheels and automatic climate control.


