It's a fair cop

UK's 'most-wanted' fugitive accepts fate

ONE of Britain's most wanted fugitives will not fight extradition after being held in Spain, it has been confirmed.

It comes after former Stephen Lawrence murder suspect Jamie Acourt was arrested as he ate lunch following a workout at Metropolitan Sagrada Familia Gym in Barcelona.

Reports suggest he tried to impersonate an Italian tourist but was unable to fool armed undercover officers who had spent days posing as fitness fanatics while keeping tabs on the 41-year-old from Eltham in South East London.

Acourt went on the run three years ago amid allegations that he was involved in a €4.5 million UK cannabis smuggling ring. Scotland Yard said in a statement he had been remanded in custody by Spanish police on a European Arrest Warrant at the close of an operation involving the UK's National

Crime Agency (NCA).

Dramatic images released in the wake of the swoop show the handcuffed suspect in a Barcelona police station.

And a court appearance in Madrid has reportedly been cancelled after the Spanish High Court heard via video link that he will accept his extradi-

national Operations for the NCA, said: "Acourt thought he could evade capture but as a result of an intelligence-led operation his days on the run have ended

"We were able to direct the Spanish authorities to his location in Barcelona

"Our ability to share information and work at speed with our international partners ensures there is no safe haven for fugitives. We will never stop pursuing these individuals."

A Crimestoppers appeal to find Acourt was launched in October 2016, when he was described as one of Britain's Top 10 fugitives.

It is believed he regularly returned to the UK using a false passport to raise money for his life on the run.

A Met Police statement said: "Spanish authorities arrested Jamie Acourt, 41, in Barcelona on a European Arrest Warrant (EAW) on behalf of the Metro-

politan Police Service.

"The EAW was issued as part of the Met's efforts to trace Acourt in relation to an investigation into the unlawful supply of controlled substances.

"This relates to an investigation launched in 2016 by detectives from the Serious and Organised Crime Command.

"Extradition proceedings now await."

Acourt's arrest follows recent reports that he had been spotted living a party lifestyle in glamorous Costa del Sol resort Marbella

He was alongside his brother Neil named among the five prime suspects in the Stephen Lawrence murder enquiry, but was not convicted and has always maintained his innocence.

Stephen was aged 18 when he died on April 22, 1993 after a racially motivated attack at a London bus stop.

Gary Dobson, now 42, and David Norris, 41, were found guilty of his murder and handed life prison sentences in 2012

Acourt is the 81st of 96 British fugitives to be traced by Operation Captura, a joint scheme between the NCA, Crimestoppers and Spanish au-



Boozy Brits to be fined

Extra police officers have also been drafted in for the summer party season, and they have been told to make themselves more visible by organising early morning beach front patrols.

-vear riddle

A MOVING new documentary film has revealed why four small villages in rural Valencia were targeted by Nazi bombers.

In May 1938, three Junkers 87-A divebombers, dubbed stukas by Nazi Germany's Condor Legion, dropped their payloads on the hamlets of Benassal, Albocasser, Ares del Maestre and Vilar de Cane in Castellon Province.

Many buildings were reduced to rubble and 38 people died.

"It was the first plane I saw in my life. It was like a great bird, but different," remembers Obdulia Mir in Experimento Stuka (Stuka Experiment), which this week opened at the Docs Valencia international documentary festival.

Entirely lacking strategic or military value to the Germans, locals for decades believed that the attacks were ordered by Republicans fighting for General Francisco Franco in the Spanish Civil War, which ended a year later.

Others blamed Franco's troops themselves, since some of the villages briefly fell within Re-

"My father heard that the Reds [Republicans] had destroyed the village and the church," added Angel Beltran, the son of a Republican militant. But 80 years later, modern-day residents have finally learned the truth.

University physics professor Oscar Vives, who was born in Benassal, travelled to Freiburg in Germany to study local archives after finding a clue in a Spanish Civil War book.

A short passage revealed that the Condor Legion used the Spanish villages as a testing ground for Second World War operations, and in the German archive Vives found a folder containing 66 photographs of the attacks.

The images show Nazi soldiers driving to the bomb sites and studying the devastation before returning to an airbase in La Senia, Tarragona, and drinking beer together on the beach.

The film reveals the Nazis were testing whether their dive-bombers were able to transport and drop 500-kilo bombs, double the standard weight.

Rafa Moles, who directed the documentary alongside Pepe Andreu, says that the raids were among the world's first "surgical military strikes."

The film is a follow-up to the pair's Five Days to Dance, an award-winning documentary about a school dance performance.

Ambulance blunder

Brit assault victim found in roadside ditch

ALICANTE COLLEGE OF NURSING has claimed that two ambulance crew members who tested positive for drugs after 'losing' a British attack victim on the way to hospital were not paramedics.

The institution released a statement in the wake of the pair being held by police in which it said it wanted to 'make clear' that the men were 'emergency health technicians,' and that no nursing professionals had been involved in the shocking incident

It comes after the unnamed victim was found lying unconscious in a ditch a few hundred metres from La Villajoyosa Regional Hospital.

He had allegedly suffered serious injuries during a brawl between four Britons in central Benidorm with National Police officers calling for an ambulance after attending the scene.

But when they called the hospital several hours later in order to write their report, they were told that no-one in emergencies knew anything about the man, and it transpired that he never arrived.

According to Spanish media, the ambulance workers had returned to their depot, and when contacted by investigators said that the victim 'woke up in the middle of the journey' and started to attack one of them.

And when the driver stopped the vehicle and opened the back door the injured party 'es-

Police launched a search for the Briton, and called the ambulance back out when they found him, at which point they noticed that the two crew members were behaving strangely.

A Guardia Civil traffic patrol was drafted in and local media confirmed they tested positive for cocaine, cannabis and alcohol before being held and charged with failing to assist a person in danger.

The Valencian Health Department has requested a full report of the incident, while sources reportedly told local media that the two men had been suspended without pay but could soon return to work.

Rosa Louis Cereceda, manager of the directorate of the local health department, claimed no knowledge of the incident when quizzed, pointing out that the ambulance service is subcontracted to a private compa-

The ASV Transport Sanitario Ayuda Group, the temporary union for the firm providing the service, did not respond to a comment request.

A BRITISH expatriate who lives on the Costa Blanca has been jailed for stalking his exwife.

Philip Carter, 40, sent his former spouse threatening emails and used social media to call her names, spread lies about her, and harass her family.

The Benidorm resident even attached a tracking device to her car during the terrifying four-month ordeal, Exeter Crown Court heard.

Mum-of-one Caroline Perkins, a teacher from Torbay in Devon, became so frightened she took to sleeping with a knife under her pillow and lost weight, the prosecution said.

Carter was due to stand trial after he denied stalking but pleaded guilty on the first morning and was handed a nine-month prison sentence plus a 10-year restraining order

Judge Simon Carr said: "I

hope all you feel is shame. This was abusive, threatening and very frightening."

Nigel Wraith, prosecuting, said the accused and victim had been married for three years before they divorced in November 2016, and that they have a young daughter together.

But when Carter travelled back to the UK in April the following year he found that his former flame had moved on and started to make financial demands.

"He embarked upon a campaign issuing extremely unpleasant and abusive threats to her, her family and friends and properties," Mr Wraith added.

"The campaign of threaten-

ing behaviour was very serious and caused her to be fearful and live her life differently to how she would choose to have harassing her."

A raft of abusive messages penned by Carter were read aloud in court, including one addressed to the headteacher of St Cuthbert Mayne School in Torquay accusing her of mixing with drug dealers.

In November 2017 she moved in with a friend but he 'had by now placed a tracker on her motor vehicle.'

A statement by the victim revealed that she felt like she was in hiding, took a series of different routes home after work, was unable to sleep and became depressed and jumpy.

"I can't see any end to Philip's actions. He's unstoppable, he'll stop at nothing. I feel he's still controlling everything I do on a daily basis. I worry at cars parked outside. I pull over to let other cars past. I feel I'll never be free of Philip and I'm always watching my back," it said.

Barry White, mitigating, said that the accused now wished to get on with his life

and would return to Spain.

"He has no desire for ongoing contact with her," he added.

And Carter, originally from Gayton-Le-Marsh in Lin-

colnshire, was freed having already served five months of his sentence.

Holiday death probe

Witness claims Brit was 'kicked in head'

By Matt Ford

MALLORCAN police are probing the death of a British man in Mallorca.

Aaron Henderson, from Coleraine, Northern Ireland, was on holiday with his partner and children when he was allegedly assaulted on Magaluf's Punta Ballena party

The dad-of-two, 30, was found lying on the corner of Calle Martin Ros Garcia in critical condition after suffering a severe head injury in the early hours of the morning, and investigators initially believed he had fallen.

But a witness, described as 'foreign' in local media, has since come forward to claim that he saw three men beating Aaron. According to reports, he was pushed to the ground before being kicked in the head, and later died of his iniuries in capital Palma's Son Espases Hospital after medics failed to revive him. The precise cause of his death has not yet been confirmed.

Detectives say they are now scouring CCTV footage recorded on the night of his death while quizzing hotel customers and staff as they try to trace his attackers.

It is believed he decided to

continue partying after partner Daniella Baxter returned to their accommodation.

She paid an emotional tribute to him on social media as she wrote: "I love you Aaron Hendy Henderson always and forever, you've made me the happiest I've ever been in my entire life.

"Life is cruel... Love and miss you always... My babes xxxxxxxxx.

Tributes have also been flooding in to the Facebook page of his family business Paul Henderson Wholesale, which has attracted more than 400 messages of condo-



They were responding to claims by popular Spanish actor, Ricardo Gomez that he and some friends were thrown out of a bar 'just for being Spanish.

Shortly afterwards, a Spanish woman complained on social media that she could not get served in a British-owned pub for the same reason.

Business-owners as well as Benidorm Town Hall and the pubs, bars and discos association, Ociobal rejected the existence of exclusion or discrimination.

Karen Cowles, president of the Benidorm British Businesses Association (BBBA), said she was surprised by this type of behaviour as she had seen no evidence of segregation in all her years in Benidorm.

But BBBA, Benidorm Town Hall and Ociobal all agreed that problems could arise from communication problems on both sides.

"If you live or work here it's essential to speak basic Spanish and it's true that some Britons never get to know the local language," Cowles said.

To prevent misunderstandings and encourage interaction, the BBBA intends to offer free Spanish lessons so that expatriates can get by in business situations or at the health centre.

Municipal sources insisted that there was no place for discrimination or inequality in Benidorm and Ociobal roundly denied that the resort had

Cop poisoner jailed

A JEALOUS Guardia Civil officer from the Costa Blanca has been jailed for 22 years after trying to murder a female colleague and her family.

The convicted Spaniard - who cannot be named for legal reasons - was found guilty of spiking the victim's food with rat poison and an insecticide, and robbing personal effects including lingerie and a sex toy.

Valencia's Superior Court heard that he attempted to poison the woman, her husband and three-year-old son 'on several occasions,' sneaking into her property on the barracks where he also lived after making a copy of her house keys which he stole from the caretaker's office.

He recorded his thoughts on a Word document recovered from his computer during a raid on his home.

Extracts from the file read in court included: "She seems to be incredibly happy and I can't stand it, she doesn't let me sleep at night.

"Envy corrodes and chokes me."

And he even admitted his intention to harm the family as he wrote: "The time

has come to see if I really have the courage to do this, I have planned it so many times in my head but one thing is to think about it and another is to dare to do it.

"I think I'm too cowardly, but if I don't do it I think I'll burst."

The victim first became suspicious when a USB pen drive containing images of her in sexually compromising positions went missing.

Other belongings, including expired

identity cards, passports and car keys later vanished while the family were out, sparking an official probe.

And when detectives swooped on the culprit's home they unearthed the lost items plus a small bottle containing one of the toxic chemicals detected in their food.

Having been convicted by Alicante's Provincial Court, he had appealed on the grounds that he had laced the food with 'very small doses without risk to the family.'

But prosecutors argued that he had concocted 'a murderous plan,' and that since he is not a toxicology expert 'he was unable to tell whether the doses were harmless or not,' reminding the court that one of the victims was a child and another [the husband] undergoing cancer treatment.

The judge ruled that he was guilty 'without a doubt,' in the wake of the hearing, an official statement said.



Region's roads are death-traps for cyclists



ALICANTE ROADS: Inviting, but dangerous for cyclists.

ELEVEN of the 44 cyclists killed in road accidents in Spain last year lost their lives on Valencian Community

According to the General Directorate of Traffic (GDT) there were 3,856 accidents involving cyclists between January and October in 2017 with 44 fatalities, compared with 30 during the same period the previous year.

Only Andalucia with 858 cycling accidents had more than the Valencian Community where there were 755, despite the differences between the two regions regarding size, road networks and populations.

Alicante and Castellon each had four victims, more than any other province in Spain while Valencia had three.

The three Valencia Province deaths occurred in the same accident in May 2017 when five Javea cyclists were mown down early one Sunday morning on the N-332 in Oliva.

The national parliament in Madrid is currently processing a proposal by the Partido Popular to modify the Penal Code which, if passed, will impose stiffer sentences of up to nine years for drivers found guilty of injuring or killing a cyclist in a road accident.



Existing trees, including the plane trees planted more than 40 years ago, will be respected and more will be added, especially in the Plaza Triangular which will be transformed into an 'urban wood,' Benidorm's mayor Toni Perez said.

It is essential to work

quickly, he explained, and it is hoped that the interruptions and upheaval will affect only one Easter week and summer season. This will also help to minimise the inevitable financial losses for the Avenida del Mediterraneo's businesses.

For the work to go ahead, the contract will be awarded in September and work should begin in October. If all goes according to plan the first phase should be completed within 11 months, Perez said.

One way to save on fuel

PARAGLIDER Ruben Carbonell recently flew 70 kilometres from Bocairent to Denia.

"I took off from the Sant Jaume peak in Sierra de Mariola," explained the experienced 28-year-old who belongs to the Santa Pola paragliding club.

"I planned to land somewhere on the coast although I didn't know exactly where it would be."

That day the wind took him 70 kilometres to Denia, not an unusual distance for a paraglider as the Spanish record stands at 288 kilometres. What was less usual, Ruben said afterwards, was where he landed.

He came down in Bosc de Denia, adjoining the Cami dels Lladres, which despite being located on the outskirts of the town is still relatively built-up.

Denia is not a recognised paragliding zone and some members of the public advised the Local Police.

"I did not put anyone at risk, I must make that clear," the paraglider told an interviewer.

He chose his landing spot very

carefully, he said, as there are so many villas and urbanisations in the area that it would be easy to end up on private land.

"I looked for waste land, steering clear of private property and started to descend when I saw a good place to land," he contin-

While he was waiting for a friend to pick him up, a Local Police patrol arrived and Ruben showed them his licence and insurance papers.

"I explained that flying is legal so long as altitude regulations are respected, and they were very understanding," he said.

Not exactly model behaviour

TWO men were arrested in Novelda and a third is under investigation for robbery and posing as Guardia Civil officers.

Drunk let off

Irish pair cleared of robbery rap

A CANARY ISLANDS judge has cleared two 26-year-old Irish revellers of theft after ruling they broke into a holiday flat by mistake because they were too drunk.

Two Spanish women who had rented the accommodation in the popular resort of Playa del Ingles, Gran Canaria, claimed they had lost €280 in cash and a pair of sunglasses after finding one of the men asleep on their bed and the other on the sofa.


But a local court in San Bartolome de Tirajana heard there was 'no evidence' to suggest the unnamed pair - who were staying in the same complex stole the items, concluding that they mistook the flat for their own after a night partying.

An official statement said that the holidaymakers "had been drinking a lot and do not

remember how they accessed the apartment... in fact they thought they were in their own room."

A police report confirmed they were 'extremely intoxicated,' and that it took officers '20 minutes' to wake them up.

The ruling added that the door to the property had not been forced and that the accused only had €22 in their pockets when they were arrest-

TAX RETURN IN SPAIN

Who needs to lodge a Spanish tax return – and when ?

If you are resident in Spain for 183 days or more, you are considered a Spanish Tax resident.

You therefore are required to submit an annual Spanish resident tax return: "Declaración de la Renta", as long as you comply with certain levels of income.


Some people however have more complex personal situations and they spend their time between a few countries or / and have property or business interests in other countries. In these cases there are International Double Taxation Treaties stating where the person subject to the tax should declare their income for tax purposes.

What is the minimum income to be liable for income tax?

If you have one source of income, not taxed at source, and you earn over 12.000 euros in pensions, you are obliged to file a tax return. However, that does not mean that you will end up paying taxes since it depends on your personal circumstances, allowances and deductions.

What happens if I file my tax return late?

- If there is no tax payable but you are obliged, there will be a fine of around 100 euros for filing a late tax declaration.



- If there is tax payable there is a charge to be paid. This is generally a percentage of the amount owed; it also depends on how late the tax declaration is submitted.

Are there any tax deductions for living in Spain?

Yes, some of the main deductions are:

- A personal tax-free allowance.
- Married couples allowance for joint declarations.

- Employment allowance.
- Child tax allowance.
- Deductions for private pension plans.
- Taxation regime for income from annuity pensions.

REMEMBER to submit your tax return in Spain before the end of June 2018 for the period relating to January 1st – December 31st 2017

Among other issues, one of the most important concepts to have emerged in recent years, is that of transparency, the development of which has seen the Spanish Supreme Court playing a key role.

Transparency is understood primarily as a concept that has to do with the need for contractual clauses to be clear and easy to understand and this is sometimes described as formal transparency.

Therefore you as a consumer when contracting with a bank, insurer, car salesman, plumber, etc, can demand that the clauses of

ent, which from a formal point of view means that they must be clear, understandable and do not refer to other (obscured) texts.

Also what is referred to as substantive transparency is also required, that is, that not only the clauses of the contract must be clear, but that the consumer must understand the legal, economic and other consequences of the terms.

For example, the Spanish Supreme Court has declared in most cases brought over the mortgage floor clauses, that although they contain a transparent clause from the formal point of view and its wording is clear, it is not transparent from a substantive

point of view, because the consumer cannot fully understand or anticipate what it actually may mean (financially, economically, etc) in the future due to the possible fluctuation of interest rates, etc.

In reality, what we should understand as a society, and as was stated by the Supreme Court Magistrate Mr Javier Orduña at a recent conference at the University of Alicante which I attended, is that in order to understand that outside of theoretical concepts, either formal or substantial, transparency is an essential value

It must be understood as a legal principle, in such a way that it is necessary to demand that contracts are

transparent so that people can understand the consequences of what they sign.

Transparency in practice is understood as a principle with legal value that should inform the regulations for consumers and users.

It has very important consequences in the current legal system and in the future, because you as a consumer can ask to have declared null and void any clauses of any contract, if the possible consequences of it were not clear and transparent at the time of signing.

Galley freeze-dried for posterity

THE Catalonia Underwater Archaeology Centre (CASC) is restoring the wooden remains of the sunken Roman galley off Villaiovosa.

The centre, one of the most important of its kind in Spain, took an active part in the Bou Ferrer explorations last summer, providing its research vessel the Thetis as well as its team of experts.

The galley, named after the

two divers who discovered it in 1999, sank one-kilometre off the Villajovosa coast in the First Century AD with a cargo of amphorae and lead ingots bound for Rome.

The CASC has offered to carry out the complex treatment needed to preserve the galley's wooden remains and since then has been in close contact with Villajovosa's archaeological museum, Vilamuseu.

Permission to move the wood has been obtained from Valencia's regional government and the remains, which are 2,000 years old, were taken to Gerona by Vilamuseu's restorer, Maria Jose Velazquez, who stayed on to learn more about the specialised treatment.

The experts are now identifying the state of conservation of the wood, after which it will be freeze-dried to preserve it.

Andres is now visiting local high schools, giving talks on the importance of road safety and the consequences of driving after taking drugs and drinking.

He is also collaborating with the Red Cross's Road Safety Education programme.

"It's also hard to see that a year later cyclists are still getting run over. I survived and I'm going to fight to do everything possible to prevent further accidents."



Touching message from the past

COINCIDING with the liberation of Mauthausen in May 1945, Javea pays homage on Saturday to two local men who died there.

Bertomeu Cardona Espasa was interned in April 1941 when he was 22, two years after leaving Spain following Franco's victory over the Republicans in 1939.

He fled to France where he was taken prisoner by the Nazis in April 1941, a fate shared by Batiste Bas

Like the four Republicans from Denia and five from Pego - together with thousands of other Spaniards -Franco had declared them stateless and after first enduring the horror of the French refugee camps they were sent to Nazi death camps.

Batiste who entered Mauthausen in January 1941 died there in November that year, aged 29.

Bertomeu also died that

November and only one of his letters ever reached his parents.

Referring to many others he had sent, he writes: "I don't know if they don't arrive or get lost but if you receive this, answer it so that I can hear about you."

He assured his mother and father that he was in good health but goes on to say: "I don't know what will become of us, but we have a feeling that we shall be all right."

A family life dedicated to restoring value in La Marina's traditional gastronomy

FROM their first family restaurant, Casa Federico, in 1980, the Cervera family have led the gastronomic field in La Marina. They now have eight highly successful traditional restaurants in Denia including a unique gastronomic show house located in central Denia (El Condado).

The plan, which comes into force once it is published in the Generalitat's Official Bulletin, ring-fences 7,000 hectares of Valencian Community land of immense environmental, territorial and scenic value while protecting it from speculation.

Approximately 3,000 hectares of this land is located in Alicante Province, but the same regulations apply to the provinces of Valencia and Castellon.

The protected land comes under two categories, the first of which protects a 500metre strip of rustic land, not zoned for building, measured from the water's edge.

Construction is restricted to activities.

infrastructures and non-residential installations whose nature require them to be located near the shore. Existing buildings may be renovated on this first 500-metre strip if they are intended for public use, cultural activities or accommodation.

Category 2 land covers the next 500-metre strip and can be used for boutique hotels with 'a rural atmosphere' that cater for a few guests and occupy a limited area.

Campsites certified as sustainable, together with public facilities and other amenities that guarantee the ecological and functional continuity of local ecosystems will also be permitted.

PATIVEL has the backing of the region's universities, but not developers and it is opposed by many town halls who fear the plan will truncate their plans for future

The Generalitat meanwhile insists that PATIVEL leaves sufficient room on the coast 'to satisfy municipalities in the short and medium term' the department of Land Structure maintained.





Online strikes step up ahead of World Cup

■ ONLINE attacks aimed at Russia and people heading to the country for the World Cup are becoming more frequent and sophisticated, crime analysts have said. Scams including spam emails about winning tickets to the event and fake websites offering cheap flights and hotels have sprung up and popular websites have been infected with viruses.

Demonstrators fined

■PROTESTORS in St Petersburg have been arrested and fined for waving non-Russian flags and some were jailed following May Day rallies. Vadim Charushev was reportedly fined 11,000 rubles (€ 143) after allegedly being caught with a British flag and was charged for violating public assembly laws and resisting arrest.

Syria crash deaths

TWO Russian pilots were killed after a military plane crashed off the coast of Syria in what is reportedly believed to have been an accident. The

Sukhoi Su-30SM fighter jet plunged into the sea shortly after taking off from Russia's Khmeimim air base where planes regularly fly from to target troops fighting Syrian government forces.

'Statue vandal' caught

■A MAN who allegedly toppled a sculpture of Russia's ruble currency in the town of Syktyvkar has reportedly confessed less than a week after the incident, according to local police. The glass and metal statue of the Russian Cyrillic letter R was found shattered on the ground shortly after the incident last month.

Haircuts for veterans

■ MOSCOW authorities arranged for Second World War veterans arriving in the city for the Victory Day celebrations to receive free haircuts. Barbers were also on hand to provide free home services for the former soldiers, Moscow region consumer official Vladimir Posazhennikov said

'Monstration' march

■ SEVERAL people took to the streets of Moscow for Monstration marches recently for a light-hearted take on protesting. An estimated 100 to 150 people turned out, with demonstrators bearing signs which read: 'We Ban Bans,' 'Piece, Work, Nonsense' and 'The Future Ripens in a Corner.' The idea behind the protests is to spoof traditional demonstrations by carrying signs which make little or no sense.

LONG-HAUL budget airline Norwegian Air Shuttle (NAS) says it has unanimously rejected two takeover offers from the owner of British Air-

International Airlines Group (IAG), which owns 4.6 per cent of Norwegian, is reportedly aiming to increase its share of the market amid fears of competition from low-cost rivals.

But the NAS board said in a statement that it had rejected IAG's 'conditional proposals' because they 'undervalued NAS and its prospects.'

The rapidly-expanding carrier

added that the board 'would remain fully committed to delivering on its stated strategy.

Shares in the airline plummeted by up to 10 per cent in the wake of the failed bid before a slight recovery.

IAG last month announced that it had acquired a minor stake in NAS 'intended to establish a position from which to initiate discussion, including the possibility of a full offer for the

But in an analyst presentation the company confirmed it had failed to strike a full takeover deal as it said: "IAG confirms that it has had contact with the Norwegian board regarding a possible offer, without reaching an

"IAG is currently considering its options in relation to Norwegian."

The company - which also owns Spanish flag-carrier Iberia - also revealed a jump in operating profits in the first quarter of 2018, with underlying earnings before exceptional items up to €280 million compared to €160 million over the same period last year.

Economy cheer as hike goes on

THE General Council of Economists has revised its growth forecasts for Spain.

According to the national body, gross domestic product is expected to rise by 2.6 per cent in 2018 and 2.4 per cent in

The figure represents an increase of one 10th compared to earlier predictions.

It comes after the country's economy expanded by 0.7 per cent from January to March.

And it is expected to shoot up by a further 0.7 per cent over the next three months.

New scheme just the ticket

EUROPEAN AIRLINES TO AXE CREDIT CARD CHARGES

THE global airline industry is set to wage war against credit card firms.

Working with German financial services company Deutsche Bank, carriers aim to save billions of Euros in transaction fees using a new electronic real-time payment system for webbased ticket sales.

The scheme, which does not yet have a brand name, is earmarked to be trialled in Germany before being rolled out across Europe by the end of 2018. Spaniard Javier Orejas, senior banking manager for the International Air Transport Association (IATA) in Europe, the Middle East, Africa and the Americas, said: "We are developing an industry-wide payment solution that is an alternative to credit cards."

According to IATA, credit card payment processing costs the industry up to €6.7 billion per year, with credit card companies including Visa and Mastercard charging between 1 and 3 per cent for each transaction.

But the new system will employ a fixed rate which will be "a matter of cents," Orejas added.

It has been made possible by a new

European Union ruling that forces banks to hand third parties access to customer data and trigger payments.

Customers will enter their bank account details before Deutsche checks their balance in real time, collecting

the fees and transferring the money to the relevant airline once it sees that sufficient funds are available.

"Most banks view this in a defensive manner and only reluctantly open their data," said Shahrokh Moinian,

Deutsche. "For us, it's an opportunity for change. We have asked ourselves: why can't we behave like a tech company?

But introducing new payments systems can be tricky, because companies will only buy into schemes that their clients are willing to use, and vice ver-

IATA and Deutsche believe that convincing Europe's biggest airlines to adopt the system will see them break through this barrier.

"We are currently in talks with large carriers," Orejas told the Financial Times, noting that there is "a lot of appetite among airlines."

Meanwhile, travellers will be lured in with offers of flight discounts or extra loyalty miles.

Germany's largest carrier Lufthansa said in a statement that it is in favour of modern payment initiatives, adding: "We believe that competition in payment and distribution systems is a basic factor for decreasing cost while improving customer experi-

Tourists splash record amount in first quarter

MORE than 13.7 foreign tourists spent almost €14.4 million in Spain during the first quarter of 2018, according to the National Institute of Statistics.

The record figures represent increases of 6 and 7.7 per cent on the same period in 2017, respectively.

In March alone more than 5.4 million holidaymakers flocked to the country as visitor numbers soared by 9.6 per cent compared to last year.

The average tourist stayed for 7.5 days and spent €1,064, with Britons (2.8 million), Germans (1.85 million) and French (1.69 million) travellers topping the rankings in terms of num-

And the destinations raking in the most cash were the Canary Islands (€4.5 million), Cataluña (€3.1 million) and Andalucia (€2.2 million).

Take back (digital) control

The week after next, Terence Kennedy will insist that Facebook deletes his digital indiscretions





SOON the world's digital overlords will apparently hold 40 zettabytes of information on us.

No I don't know what that means either, but when a colleague recently asked Facebook for all the information it held on him, he got nearly a gigabyte back.

That's the equivalent of 200 copies of the Bible in plain text, if you're interested. Or not, if you're an atheist.

Most alarming of all was that it listed every call he had ever made and every message he had ever sent. The good news is that this changes in a fortnight. At least it does for we Europeans, thanks to the acronym of the moment: GDPR

From May 25 the General Data Protection Regulation means that organisations may no longer treat us unilaterally as just so much advertising fodder, to be milked of every possible bit of personal information for

their nefarious or even non-nefarious purposes. If they do, it's goodbye €20 million or more in fines.

The likes of Facebook, Amazon, Google or that popular anatomical research site Pornhub may not harvest our personal data without asking us, may not hit us with 40 screens of terms and conditions we cannot understand as an excuse, may not refuse to tell us what they know about us,

and must delete it if we insist. I cer-

If they get hacked they have to 'fess up' within 72 hours.

Not only may they merely store our details for a 'reasonable' time, but we will have the hitherto denied 'right to be forgotten' if we want to opt-out of any part of our brave new digital world.

It's not just our direct personal data

which is affected. Anything which could be identified directly back to us may not be collected without our explicit consent. That includes the 'IP address' which pinpoints your specific computer or phone even if you think you operate online anonymous-

The good news for non-Europeans is also that the GDPR will reverberate far beyond the old world's borders. Any company has to comply when doing business with Europe (here's lookin' at you Facebook and Google).

So: The Empire Fights Back? Will it all make a difference where online privacy has devalued more than a Zimbabwean dollar?

A recent survey revealed that 32 per cent of the respondents intend to ask at least one organisation exactly what information it holds on them.

I will certainly be asking Google to delete details of all those searches I did back then on performance-enhancing substances undetectable by local Scrabble clubs. Purely for scientific purposes, you understand.

Trackdown

WE'VE all seen those ads which mysteriously track us right across the internet - irritatingly offering to sell us the very item we just bought.

But it's not just GCHQ, the NSA or even the former KGB who'd like to track us physically too. Soon we might pass the supermarket and our phone might entreat us to buy today's special on biodegradable crum-

The GDPR doesn't (yet) tackle the thorny issue of surveillance, but it's coming. Proposed legislation hopes to take the next step: banning surveillance unless you agree.

Would anyone, other than 'helicopter' parents obsessing where their children are 24/7? Or a nurse keeping tabs on someone like my granddad, whose 105th birthday we celebrated this week? (Though sadly he died at 62).



Do they need a tax adviser?

My partner and I have lived in Spain for seven years. We have lifetime residency and NIE. We live on our pensions and do not pay tax in the UK, as we do not earn enough.

Some people tell us we must register for tax in Spain and some tell us we don't have to. A website tells us that if we earn less than €22,000 per year, we do not have to register in Spain. We are now confused.

I have recently begun earning from buying shares in properties with a Spanish company, and so I agree I must now register. Can you please clear up the mat-

YES you must declare for Spanish tax. Here is a simple rule: if you reside officially in Spain, your worldwide income is subject to Spanish tax.



You and the Law in Spain

In your case, you want to find a Spanish tax consultant who speaks English so you can understand. Ask your friends. The limit of \in 22,000 applies only when the income received has been subject to Spanish withholding tax during the year. Clearly, this does not apply to a UK pension.

Of course they won't because you can't cover those opening hours with one shift. For us living here in Spain we are spoilt - we can shop from 10am till 10pm.

Sure we have some stores that still take a siesta but you don't half miss the longer hours when you are in the UK. Plus, here we still have thriving high streets with a great selection of independent retailers.

OK stand up Jet2 and take a bow. I used them for the first time this trip and they are head and shoulders above Ryanair. Their staff were so helpful and it's the little things like having a pocket on the back of the seat to put a paper and more legroom - give them a try.

No, a woman presumably has to put up resistance and allow herself to be beaten to a pulp before she can hope for justice in this country. And as more than one person has pointed out. this isn't a case of 'No means no' because only 'Yes' ever means yes.

Pain in the leg(s): The pinched nerve


In practice, the most common complaint is low back pain. This is often accompanied with radiating pain in one or both legs. This radiating pain is caused by an irritation of or damage to the nerve. This occurs when there is long-term pressure on the nerve, such as in a herniated disc, or when a vertebrae is pushing against the spinal nerve.

The affected nerve has often been trapped for a long time and the symptoms such as pain, tingling, numbness and weakness are caused by the interference of signals between the brain and the corresponding body part, which does not come through like it should.

The nerve cannot do its work properly. It is like a wire where its casing is damaged and a short-circuit occurs. People typically complain about pain in the legs during walking, pins and needles when sitting, and pain radiating from the buttock to the knee and even all the way down to the feet.

This problem can only be solved by getting rid of the cause of the impingement, so the cause of the pressure on the nerve needs to be addressed.

The nerve can be trapped in different



areas; in the spine, the pelvis and buttock. It is essential to determine the actual site of entrapment. Too often bulges / hernias of intervertebral discs in the spine are blamed for this kind of symptoms and the wrong method of treatment is started. Often the cause lies just outside the spine, such as a compressed sciatic nerve in the pelvis. This gives nerve impingement and

radiates in the leg to the knee with pain in the buttock. The disorder is often incorrectly diagnosed as a hernia.

We note that in practice people have such complaints for too long, sometimes years, before the correct diagnosis is made. They are told to live with the problem and have tried 'everything' to solve the problem, which very often just means lots of

X-rays and scans, medication and maybe some massage. Our clinic is specialised in diagnosing and treating these complaints.

Through chiropractic techniques such as manipulation, mobilisation, muscle techniques and changes made in posture, the pressure on the nerve can be removed. The nerve is damaged, after crushing, and will recover after removal of the cause of the pressure.

This is a slow process and means that after removing the cause of the radiating problems, it takes some time before the nerve will regain its full function and will not reproduce symptoms. This process can be accelerated by taking a vitamin B complex. There is no other form of therapy that will be able to get the pressure of a trapped nerve.

Thai red curry paste can be bought in most of the supermarkets in Spain, Mercadona have a good one for

My jar of Thai basil was bought in the UK and frozen, but Italian basil is a perfectly good alternative, or coriander can be used if the taste of basil is not to your liking.

Ginger and chilli are optional and add heat to the curry, the former to a much lesser extent than the latter.

Thai Red Chicken Curry serves

- 400 grams chicken breasts, cubed
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 4 whole garlic clove, skinned and chopped
 - 1 whole onion, chopped
 - 1 Packet Thai Red Curry Paste
- 1 cube of ginger chopped (op-

- 1 (or more) sliced and seeded red or green chillis
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 can of coconut milk
- 1 chicken stock cube, crumbled
- 2 tablespoons fish sauce
- 1 whole aubergine, cubed
- 1 whole red bell pepper, sliced
- 2 teaspoons chopped Thai basil

Fry the chicken, onion and garlic until chicken sealed and garlic and onion have become transparent.

Add the Thai red curry paste and fry for two more minutes.

Add all remaining ingredients, except for the basil and simmer until chicken cooked through and aubergine and red pepper are soft. add the basil and serve with boiled rice or noodles.

Tip: Choose chillis wisely, some are extremely spicy and contact lens wearers should get someone else to chop them otherwise bedtime will be a very painful experience! Wearing rubber gloves to chop them is always a good idea. Hand washing will not remove all the traces of the capsaicinoids that give the chillis their heat.

Tip: If as a family or couple, one or more like a hot curry and others don't, use green chillis that are not too finely chopped so they can be easily identified in contrast to the red pepper and removed from individual plates.

Tip: Any vegetable oil can be used but not olive oil. Ideally choose peanut or coconut, but rapeseed or sunflower also work well in this dish. Tip: A cheap cut of beef can be used instead of chicken, it would need cooking slowly for about three to four hours (a slow cooker would be ideal) just add the aubergine and red pepper when the beef is tender. Prawns or fish can also be used and added just before serving so they are not overcooked. Use beef or fish stock instead of the chicken.



Rental revolution hits the Continent

A RECENT report from the Resolution Foundation has suggested that up to a third of young people in the UK face living in private rented accommodation all their lives

The think tank said that 'generation rent' needs more help, with more affordable homes and better protection.

At this point it may be worth taking a look at other European countries to see how they compare:

Spain

Spain has historically had a high rate of home ownership, reaching 80 per cent in 2008 before the financial bubble burst and the building boom ended.

The figure has slipped to 78 per cent but is likely to decline further with unemployment remaining high and mortgages diffi-

As a result, demand for rentals has risen, boosting Airbnb and other platforms, while pushing up prices.

According to online real estate agency Idealista, rents in Barcelona have risen 55 per cent since 2012, and 23 per cent in Madrid over the same period.

Rental contracts tend to be for one or three years, after which they may be terminated, or renewed and the rent renegotiat-

Increasingly landlords in tourist areas are demanding excessive rents to force tenants out, so that they can turn apartments into lucrative holiday rentals.

Eviction also continues to be a serious problem, with lenders reluctant to negoti-

French tenants benefit from much stricter rules on landlords, with rents on unfurnished dwellings only allowed to be increased by an index, called the IRL.

The rise was close to zero for much of 2016 and 2017, with an increase of 0.51 per cent permitted for this year.

Those renting an unfurnished property as their main residence are given a minimum three-year tenancy with an automatic right of renewal after three years.

If the landlord wants the tenant to leave. they must warn them six months in advance, (tenants only have to give three

Landlords must also give the tenant a first right of refusal if they wish to sell, while evictions are forbidden in the winter months.

Germany

Only 46 per cent of Germans own their own homes, the lowest figure in Europe.

However, culturally there is nothing like the drive to want to own as there is in other European countries, with many downsizing once the children leave and wage-related pensions covering monthly payments.

Wartime bombing destroyed about 20 per cent of residential areas in towns and cities, and many refugees arrived in the country who had lost everything.

Banks do not help by demanding deposits that are a fifth of the purchase price, while estate agent fees and stamp duty charges do little to help those dreaming of their own home.



Gardeners get going - it's spring

GRAEME TYRRELL

THE spring growth is a great opportunity to gain a wonderful garden.

It is a very busy time for gardeners with the warmer temperatures and longer days creating an explosion of growth which needs to be managed to make the most of the season. To get them off to a quick start, it is the perfect time to plant your summer annual flowers and vegetables.

Established plants will also start growing rapidly now and the new growth will make them look wonderfully healthier than usual.

Of course weeds and excess growth of even your favourite plant will need attention to keep the garden in the way you prefer it. Fortunately it is so good to be able to get out into the garden, with the beautiful spring sunshine making it one of the best times of the year for the avid gardener.

Annual summer flowers can provide a beautiful display. Many favourite annuals from northern European regions require a lot of water to do well though. I usually plant a small number of summer annuals in planter boxes with trays to catch any excess water from being lost and use a good potting mix that retains water well.

The Mediterranean climate with long, dry, hot

summers is not ideal for large plantings of cooler climate summer annuals in the garden. If you have a balcony or terrace with planter pots or window boxes, annuals can be a really good way to brighten them up.

If you are planting a vegetable garden, make sure that you enrich the soil with plenty of moisture-holding compost to reduce watering needs in summer. After planting your tomatoes, capsicum, summer squash and other summer varieties ensure that you mulch the garden with coarse compost, straw or any other suitable material which will reduce evaporation and keep soil temperatures cooler.

Keeping the soil temperature lower is important in summer as plant growth will slow when

the roots get too hot. Insulating with mulch keeps soil temperatures closer to spring conditions so growth will continue to thrive for longer.

There is the inevitable weed growth which always seem to grow faster than anything else in spring. It is a good idea to learn more about these spontaneous plants as many do have attractive flowers. If the garden is not a formal design, many weeds can be left to flower and then be removed.

Even in my vegetable garden I allow certain plants normally classed as weeds, such as poppies and borage, to add colour to the garden with no extra work.

Many people are also finding that there are many weeds which are actually edible and even the flowers can be added to salads and in cooking. Many of these wild plants were actually a normal part of the diet before explorers centuries ago brought back vegetable varieties from around the world to replace the native food sources of the Mediterranean.

The shrubs and perennials which are normally planted in autumn (so they establish their roots over winter) start to grow with the warmer spring weather. It is a good idea to lightly trim the ones that you want to grow thick and bushy now while growth is active and before the sun becomes too intense for pruning.



Hot under the collar

WITH rising temperatures, you might feel the heat is on to finally install a central air conditioning system. However, if your budget is already stretched, there are other less expensive options to keep you cool under the collar at home.

The three most popular

ble units, window units and traditional

Portable or window units can be cheap and easy to install. Both systems allow you to cool a specific room, rather than waste energy and money cooling your entire home.

The benefit of a portable unit is that it can be moved easily from room to room. This is different to a window unit which is fixed to a window, or through the wall. Of the two, portable units are more expensive to buy and tend to use a lot more energy. Whereas window units are extremely energy efficient and don't take up any valuable floor space.

However, if you want to keep expenses to a minimum, the traditional air fan is always a trusted option. Installation is easy - you simply plug it in - and it can be moved from room to room with

Of course, do bear in mind that most air fans don't actually 'cool' the air. They simply circulate air around you, giving the sensation that you are being cooled off.

These fans might provide some much-needed instant relief from the heat, but if your budget can stretch that far, opt for a portable or window unit to keep your home comfortable over the months ahead.

MOST people treat their dog like a baby and often problems will occur when a real baby is brought home. You must plan for the new baby's arrival.

Acquaint the dog with a friend's children. Let them feed it some of its favourite treats. Stay calm and keep the dog on a lead. If at this stage the dog is showing any signs of aggression, then professional help is needed.

If the dog is used to sleeping in a bedroom, place the dog bed outside the room in its basket or on its blanket. If necessary, put the dog on a lead and restrict it to an area.

Consider walking around with a stuffed doll. Even talk to it in a baby voice as if it is a real baby. When changing the baby's nappy - both the real one and the toy one - always put your dog in the Sit-Stay command.

Let it sniff and watch, for this is the time to accustom it to baby sounds and praise it for being good. Use different phrases and voices for the dog and the baby.

Bringing the baby home



HEALTHY BOUNDARIES: You must train your dog around the new baby.

For safety reasons and hygiene, dogs must not be allowed on the furniture near the new baby. Start the new house rules by taking the dog by the collar and lead and taking it to its bed. Move the bed around the home to every room (except bedrooms) in the house. The dog must learn to stay where it is put.

Start getting a little more removed from the dog in three 20minute intervals. First, go into another room for 20 minutes. Close the door behind you so that it cannot follow you. Then come out for 20 minutes before returning for another 20 minutes. Stop all tugof-war games, wrestling and all games involving chasing.

Babies have to be fed several times a day so, to prevent jealousy. give the dog four very small meals a day... the same amount split into

Toys are a big headache. You don't want a dropped toy to be licked. No more shoes, socks, slippers, and plastic or stuffed toys for the dog. Now is the time to take away all its toys from the floor. Train it to play with one at a time. Paint the others with a mouthwash which dogs do not like. If your dog goes for it, pick up the toy and shout at the toy. Very soon the dog

will keep away from anything smelling of mouthwash.

Babies like to grab and pull but dogs don't like it at all. Start getting the dog used to this treatment by gently pulling it and grabbing its tail and then, within three seconds, hug it and give plenty of

When the baby is born, ask a maternity home nurse for some bed sheets from the baby's nursery. Have these put in the new nursery at home and around the area of the home where the baby will be nursed. Let the dog sniff around the house at the new smells and praise it.

Plan your homecoming and let the dog welcome the baby by sniffing while on a lead.

Keep the lead trailing on the floor for the first week so that it can be used to correct all mouthing and jumping. Praise when the dog does not jump or mouth.

Your dog should now accept the new house rules and the new arrival.





SKODA'S Yeti compact SUV was a big seller and its replacement, the larger Koraq, is set for even greater success with enhanced space and versatility giving it wider appeal.

The SUV sector is jammed with alluring models and while some of them have per-

haps a more sporty feel than the Koraq, they do not have its overall blend of driving comfort and refinement and its day-to-day family practicality.

Offering more striking and classy styling than the Yeti, with more of an off-roader look, most Karoq models will be 2WD - a 4WD system is available only with the 2.0-

perfectly functional, with an excellent layout of dials and switchgear.

Tesla's electric storm

AMERICAN electric car builder Tesla posted a record loss of almost €593 million in the first quarter of 2018, the firm has revealed.

But boss Elon Musk insists the company will become profitable before the end of the year.

It comes as the brand's loss from January to March more than doubled from €275 million over the same period in 2017.

Tesla generated €2.8 billion in revenue, a 26

per cent year-on-year rise, although it failed to meet its production targets for its Model 3.

It produced 2,270 of the cars per week in April, 230 below its aim of 2,500, having originally planned to ship out 5,000 vehicles per week by the end of last year.

But it has hit problems, and has stopped work in its California factory on several occasions as it bids to rectify 'production bottlenecks.'

Musk emailed staff to reveal that Tesla was 'ready' to become profitable if the 5,000 weekly target was reached by the end of June, alongside a reduction in capital expenditure.

Shares in the company reportedly plummeted by 5 per cent in the wake of the results being announced, wiping more than € 1.6 billion off its value

During a press call, Musk was asked how

many customers had paid for extras on their Model 3s, a sign of how much profit Tesla is making on each vehicle, to which he responded: "These questions are so dry. They're killing me."

And when quizzed about capital expenditure he said: "Boring, bonehead questions are not




