Gold rush

by Joe Gerrard

BETWEEN 8,000 and 10,000 archaeological pieces have been seized by the Guardia Civil, who said the haul was the most significant uncovered in Murcia to date.

Officers made an inspection of a villa in the Agriducle urbanisation, near the University of Murcia, after discovering evidence for the existence of the previously unknown artefacts.

They reportedly belonged to a farming entrepreneur living in the region whose hobby was undertaking private digs in Murcia, Castilla-La Mancha, Andalucia and Alicante from the 1960's onwards.

Miriam Guardiola, the Murcian authorities' culture spokesperson, said the find was a "historic" one.

"It is one of the most important operations of recent decades," she said.

Operation Idolillo, as the probe was known, saw police seize more than €1 million-worth of archaeological items, according to estimates from authorities.

Luis Enrique de Miquel Santed, the director of the Archaeological Museum of Murcia, said the pieces would give historians a better understanding of the region's history.

It's a fair cop UK's 'most-wanted' fugitive accepts fate

ONE of Britain's most wanted fugitives will not fight extradition after being held in Spain, it has been confirmed.

It comes after former Stephen Lawrence murder suspect Jamie Acourt was arrested as he ate lunch following a workout at Metropolitan Sagrada Familia Gym in Barcelona.

Reports suggest he tried to impersonate an Italian tourist but was unable to fool armed undercover officers who had spent days posing as fitness fanatics while keeping tabs on the 41-year-old from Eltham in South Fast London

Acourt went on the run three years ago amid allegations that he was involved in a €4.5 million UK cannabis smuggling ring. Scotland Yard said in a statement he had been remanded in custody by Spanish police on a European Arrest Warrant at the close of an operation involving the UK's National Crime Agency (NCA).

Dramatic images released in the wake of the swoop show the handcuffed suspect in a Barcelona police station.

And a court appearance in Madrid has reportedly been cancelled after the Spanish High Court heard via video link that

he will accept his extradition.

Ian Cruxton, Head of International Operations for the NCA, said: "Acourt thought he could evade capture but as a result of an intelligence-led operation his days on the run have ended.

"We were able to direct the Spanish authorities to his location in Barcelona.

"Our ability to share information and work at speed with our international partners ensures there is no safe haven for fugitives. We will never stop pursuing these individuals."

A Crimestoppers appeal to find Acourt was launched in October 2016, when he was described as one of Britain's Top 10 fugitives.

It is believed he regularly returned to the UK using a false passport to raise money for his life on the run.

A Met Police statement said: "Spanish authorities arrested Jamie Acourt 41 in Barcelona

on a European Arrest Warrant (EAW) on behalf of the Metropolitan Police Service.

"The EAW was issued as part of the Met's efforts to trace Acourt in relation to an investigation into the unlawful supply of controlled substances.

"This relates to an investigation launched in 2016 by detectives from the Serious and Organised Crime Command.

"Extradition proceedings now await."

Acourt's arrest follows recent reports that he had been spotted living a party lifestyle in glamorous Costa del Sol resort Mar-

He was alongside his brother Neil named among the five prime suspects in the Stephen Lawrence murder enquiry, but was not convicted and has always maintained his innocence.

Stephen was aged 18 when he died on April 22, 1993 after a racially motivated attack at a London bus stop.

Gary Dobson, now 42, and David Norris, 41, were found guilty of his murder and handed life prison sentences in 2012.

Acourt is the 81st of 96 British fugitives to be traced by Operation Captura, a joint scheme between the NCA. Crimestoppers and Spanish au-

Employment up

APRIL unemployment is 3.34 per cent lower in Murcia compared to the month of March, according to state employment service (SEPE) data. There are now 104,976 unemployed people in the province, 3,622 fewer than in the preceding month. The worst hit are those over 45 years old, with 19,858 of males in this category without work.

'Robber' held

A 22-YEAR-OLD accused of being responsible for a spate of burglaries in Alicante has been arrested by the Guardia Civil and remanded in custody. A 67-year-old has also reportedly been placed under investigation for handling goods allegedly stolen in Santa Pola from houses and businesses before being sold on.

Foreign bucks

MURCIA'S foreign tourist spending increased by 23 per cent - to € 187.5 million - in this year's first quarter, compared to the same period in 2017, according to government data. A major factor behind the inflated figure is Easter week falling in March and not April, local media reports.

Raiders of the lost artefacts

"A temporary exhibition could be organised and permanent exhibitions enriched with all the material seized," he said

Officers began their investigation after discovering evidence pieces existed that had not been catalogued by museums or heritage authorities during a separate probe.

Police found the suspect had lived in the Agridulce urbanisation but that he had already passed away. Relatives of the man contacted police to register his house after he died and informed them of the pieces, meaning they will not be prosecuted.

Cultural heritage laws require people who own or acquire archaeological artefacts to register them with authorities.

Investigators said the items came from a variety of areas of ancient life. Household goods, weapons, coins, tools and jewellery were among the finds which came from the prehistoric, ancient Iberian, Roman and Visigothic eras, among others.

Guardia Civil officers presenting the find said more than 200 small idols which would have been placed as offerings in Iberian and Roman religious ceremonies were included in the haul. Each one is valued at between €2.500 and € 3.000

Francisco Bernabe, the Spanish government's delegate in Murcia, joined officers and officials for a presentation of the finds. He said police had done a "magnificent" job in finding the collection

0-year riddle

A MOVING new documentary film has revealed why four small villages in rural Valencia were targeted by Nazi bombers.

In May 1938, three Junkers 87-A divebombers, dubbed stukas by Nazi Germany's Condor Legion, dropped their payloads on the hamlets of Benassal, Albocasser, Ares del Maestre and Vilar de Cane in Castellon Province.

Many buildings were reduced to rubble and 38 people died.

"It was the first plane I saw in my life. It was like a great bird, but different," remembers Obdulia Mir in Experimento Stuka (Stuka Experiment), which this week opened at the Docs Valencia international documentary festival.

Entirely lacking strategic or military value to the Germans, locals for decades believed that the attacks were ordered by Republicans fighting for General Francisco Franco in the Spanish Civil War, which ended a year later.

Others blamed Franco's troops themselves, since some of the villages briefly fell within Re-

"My father heard that the Reds [Republicans] had destroyed the village and the church," added Angel Beltran, the son of a Republican militant. But 80 years later, modern-day residents have finally learned the truth.

University physics professor Oscar Vives, who was born in Benassal, travelled to Freiburg in Germany to study local archives after finding a clue in a Spanish Civil War book.

A short passage revealed that the Condor Legion used the Spanish villages as a testing ground for Second World War operations, and in the German archive Vives found a folder containing 66 photographs of the attacks.

The images show Nazi soldiers driving to the bomb sites and studying the devastation before returning to an airbase in La Senia, Tarragona, and drinking beer together on the beach.

The film reveals the Nazis were testing whether their dive-bombers were able to transport and drop 500-kilo bombs, double the standard weight.

Rafa Moles, who directed the documentary alongside Pepe Andreu, says that the raids were among the world's first "surgical military strikes."

The film is a follow-up to the pair's Five Days to Dance, an award-winning documentary about a school dance performance.



FOUR British expatriates face fines of up to €300,000 after being caught trying to leap from a 33-floor skyscraper on the Costa Blanca.

The unnamed thrill-seekers were reportedly surprised by police as they prepared to launch themselves off the 120-metre Torre Levante building on the Benidorm seafront with parachutes strapped to their backs.

Their arrests follow a brief probe after investigators were tipped off about a series of internet videos filmed by the BASE jumping quartet.


An official revealed that the daredevils are suspected of performing several illegal jumps in the area, before confirming that their parachutes, helmets and other equipment have been seized.

TAX RETURN IN SPAIN

Who needs to lodge a Spanish tax return – and when ?

If you are resident in Spain for 183 days or more, you are considered a Spanish Tax resident

You therefore are required to submit an annual Spanish resident tax return: "Declaración de la Renta", as long as you comply with certain levels of income.


Some people however have more complex personal situations and they spend their time between a few countries or / and have property or business interests in other countries. In these cases there are International Double Taxation Treaties stating where the person subject to the tax should declare their income for tax purposes.

What is the minimum income to be liable for income tax?

If you have one source of income, not taxed at source, and you earn over 12.000 euros in pensions, you are obliged to file a tax return. However, that does not mean that you will end up paying taxes since it depends on your personal circumstances, allowances and deductions.

What happens if I file my tax return late?

- If there is no tax payable but you are obliged, there will be a fine of around 100 euros for filing a late tax declaration.
- If there is tax payable there is a charge to be paid. This is generally a percentage of



the amount owed; it also depends on how late the tax declaration is submitted.

Are there any tax deductions for living in Spain?

Yes, some of the main deductions are:

- A personal tax-free allowance.
- Married couples allowance for joint declarations.
- Employment allowance.
- Child tax allowance.
- Deductions for private pension plans.

- Taxation regime for income from annuity pensions.

REMEMBER to submit your tax return in Spain before the end of June 2018 for the period relating to January 1st – December 31st 2017

Holiday death probe

Witness claims Brit was 'kicked in head'

By Matt Ford

MALLORCAN police are probing the death of a British man in Mallorca.

Aaron Henderson, from Coleraine, Northern Ireland, was on holiday with his partner and children when he was allegedly assaulted on Magaluf's Punta Ballena party strip.

The dad-of-two, 30, was found lying on the corner of Calle Martin Ros Garcia in critical condition after suffering a severe head injury in the early

hours of the morning, and investigators initially believed he

But a witness, described as 'foreign' in local media, has since come forward to claim that he saw three men beating Aaron. According to reports, he was pushed to the ground before being kicked in the head, and later died of his injuries in capital Palma's Son Espases Hospital after medics failed to revive him. The precise cause

of his death has not yet been confirmed.

Detectives say they are now scouring CCTV footage recorded on the night of his death while quizzing hotel customers and staff as they try to trace his attackers

It is believed he decided to continue partying after partner Daniella Baxter returned to their accommodation.

She paid an emotional tribute to him on social media as she

Stalker nightmare

Brit expat jailed after 'abusive campaign'

A BRITISH expatriate who lives on the Costa Blanca has been jailed for stalking

Philip Carter, 40, sent his former spouse threatening emails and used social media to call her names, spread lies about her, and harass her family.

The Benidorm resident even attached a tracking device to her car during the terrifying four-month ordeal, Exeter Crown Court heard.

Mum-of-one Caroline Perkins, a teacher from Torbay in Devon, became so frightened she took to sleeping with a knife under her pillow and lost weight, the prosecution said

Carter was due to stand trial after he denied stalking but pleaded guilty on the first morning and was handed a ninemonth prison sentence plus a 10-year restraining order.

Judge Simon Carr said: "I hope all you feel is shame. This was abusive, threatening and very frightening."

Nigel Wraith, prosecuting, said the accused and victim had been married for three years before they divorced in No-

vember 2016, and that they have a young daughter together.

But when Carter travelled back to the UK in April the following year he found that his former flame had moved on and started to make financial demands.

"He embarked upon a campaign issuing extremely unpleasant and abusive threats to her, her family and friends and properties," Mr Wraith added.

"The campaign of threatening behaviour was very serious and caused her to be fearful and live her life differently to how she would choose to have done if he wasn't harassing her."

A raft of abusive messages penned by Carter were read aloud in court, including one addressed to the headteacher of

St Cuthbert Mayne School in Torquay accusing her of mixing with drug deal-

In November 2017 she moved in with a friend but he 'had by now placed a tracker on her motor vehicle.'

A statement by the victim revealed that she felt like she was in hiding, took a series of different routes home after work, was unable to sleep and became depressed and jumpy.

"I can't see any end to Philip's actions. He's unstoppable, he'll stop at nothing. I feel he's still controlling everything I do on a daily basis. I worry at cars parked outside. I pull over to let other cars past. I feel I'll never be free of Philip and I'm always watching my back," it said.

Barry White, mitigating, said that the accused now wished to get on with his life and would return to Spain

"He has no desire for ongoing contact with her," he added.

And Carter, originally from Gayton-Le-Marsh in Lincolnshire, was freed having already served five months of his

The institution released a statement in the wake of the pair being held by police in which it said it wanted to 'make clear' that the men were 'emergency health technicians,' and that no nursing professionals had been involved in the shocking incident.

It comes after the unnamed victim was found lying unconscious in a ditch a few hundred metres from La Villajoyosa Regional Hospital.

He had allegedly suffered serious injuries during a brawl between four Britons in central Benidorm, with National Police officers calling for an ambulance after attending the scene.

But when they called the hospital several hours later in order to write their report, they were told that no-one in

emergencies knew anything about the man, and it transpired that he never arrived.

According to Spanish media the ambulance workers had returned to their depot, and when contacted by investigators said that the victim 'woke up in the middle of the journey' and started to attack one of them.

And when the driver stopped the vehicle and opened the back door the injured party 'escaped.'

Police launched a search for the Briton, and called the ambulance back out when they found him, at which point they noticed that the two crew members were behaving strangely.

A Guardia Civil traffic patrol was drafted in and local media confirmed they tested positive for cocaine, cannabis and alcohol before being held and charged with failing to as-

sist a person in danger.

The Valencian Health Department has requested a full report of the incident, while sources reportedly told local media that the two men had been suspended without pay but could soon return to work.

Rosa Louis Cereceda, manager of the directorate of the local health department,

claimed no knowledge of the incident when quizzed, pointing out that the ambulance service is subcontracted to a private company.

The ASV Transport Sanitario Ayuda Group, the temporary union for the firm providing the service, did not respond to a comment re-

Cop poisoner jailed

A JEALOUS Guardia Civil officer from the Costa Blanca has been jailed for 22 years after trying to murder a female colleague and her family.

The convicted Spaniard - who cannot be named for legal reasons - was found guilty of spiking the victim's food with rat poison and an insecticide, and robbing personal effects including lingerie and a sex toy.

Valencia's Superior Court heard that he attempted to poison the woman, her husband and three-year-old son 'on several occasions,' sneaking into her property on the barracks where he also lived after making a copy of her house keys which he stole from the caretaker's of-

He recorded his thoughts on a Word document recovered from his computer during a raid on his home.

Extracts from the file read in court included: "She seems to be incredibly happy and I can't stand it, she doesn't let me sleep at night.

"Envy corrodes and chokes me."

And he even admitted his intention to harm the family as he wrote: "The time

has come to see if I really have the courage to do this, I have planned it so many times in my head but one thing is to think about it and another is to dare to

"I think I'm too cowardly, but if I don't do it I think I'll burst."

The victim first became suspicious when a USB pen drive containing images of her in sexually compromising positions went missing.

Other belongings, including expired

identity cards, passports and car keys later vanished while the family were out, sparking an official probe.

And when detectives swooped on the culprit's home they unearthed the lost items plus a small bottle containing one of the toxic chemicals detected in their food.

Having been convicted by Alicante's Provincial Court, he had appealed on the grounds that he had laced the food with 'very small doses without risk to the family.'

But prosecutors argued that he had concocted 'a murderous plan,' and that since he is not a toxicology expert 'he was unable to tell whether the doses were harmless or not,' reminding the court that one of the victims was a child and another [the husband] undergoing cancer treatment.

The judge ruled that he was guilty 'without a doubt,' in the wake of the hearing, an official statement said.



Heritage concerns over market

A BODY working with the United Nations has said plans for the new Central Market of Elche are 'incompatible' with the nearby Arabic baths' World Heritage Status.

Carlos Gonzalez, the Partido Socialista (PSOE) mayor of Elche, said ICOMOS had stated none of the planned works for the market complied with World Heritage Status requirements.

"The report is overwhelming and leaves little room for doubt and seriously compromises the viability of the Central Market project," Gonzalez said.

ICOMOS, or the International Council on Monuments or Sites, works with the UN's culture body UNESCO which awards World Heritage status to places of cultural or historical interest.

ICOMOS's report has been passed on to members of Elche's council, including those from opposition par-

A spokesperson for the conservative Partido Popular on the council said the PSOE did not want the Central Market project to go ahead "from the beginning.

"Everything has been prepared by the PSPV-PSOE (the Valencian

branch of the PSOE) and Compromis.

"They sent wrong or misleading information to ICOMOS and they did not show the agency alternative options," the spokesperson said.

Juan Antonio Sempere, the deputy spokesperson for Ciudadanos on the council, said the report was "brief and incomplete.

"It makes a subject assessment, taking into account certain platforms while other reports from the contracted company and political groups are missing," he said.

Mayor Gonzales met with the President of ICOMOS España yesterday (Wednesday) to discuss plans for the market going forward.

The body's report recommended adapting existing plans to make them comply with World Heritage requirements or negotiating with Aparcisa, the company building the market, to find a similar solution.

Child rape charge acquittal

A 35-YEAR-OLD has been found not guilty by an Alicante court on charges of raping an underage boy.

The court ordered the defendant to pay €5,000 in compensation to the alleged victim for moral damages and violating his right to sexual freedom.

The court also ruled there was no evidence violence had been used during the assault. The use of violence is one of the factors used to determine whether sexual assaults are classed as rape in Spanish law.

The defendant maintained his innocence throughout the trial. claiming he thought the 14year-old was over the age of consent

The court heard the two made contact on a WhatsApp group for homosexual relationships. The alleged victim claimed he was threatened by the defendant to perform sex acts on him, but the court dismissed the claims.

Drunk let off

Irish pair cleared of robbery rap

A CANARY ISLANDS judge has cleared two 26-year-old Irish revellers of theft after ruling they broke into a holiday flat by mistake because they were too drunk.

Two Spanish women who had rented the accommodation in the popular resort of Playa del Ingles, Gran Canaria, claimed they had lost €280 in cash and a pair of sunglasses after finding one of the men asleep on their bed and the other on the sofa.

But a local court in San Bartolome de Tirajana heard there was 'no evidence' to suggest the unnamed pair - who were staying in the same complex stole the items, concluding that they mistook the flat for their own after a night partying.

An official statement said that the holidaymakers "had been drinking a lot and do not remember how they accessed the apartment... in fact they thought they were in their own room.'

A police report confirmed they were 'extremely intoxicated,' and that it took officers '20 minutes' to wake them up.

The ruling added that the door to the property had not been forced and that the accused only had €22 in their pockets when they were arrest-

Rapist fire woman freed

A WOMAN in prison sentenced for torching a man convicted of raping her 13-yearold daughter has left prison in Alicante.

Maria del Carmen Garcia was serving a three-and-a-half year sentence and was set to be released this August before a judge ruled in favour of cutting her jail time short.

The court heard during her trail that she approached Antonio Cosme while he was on day release from prison in June 2005. Del Carmen doused him with petrol, set him on fire and he died in hospital days

She entered prison in 2014 after two unsuccessful pardon appeals.

Olive oil smeared

MORE than half of all of Murcia's olive oil has fallen short of labelling standards, according to consumer standards head, Francisco Abril.

Some brands had been selling virgin standard oil with extra virgin labels, according to Abril, the director general of the office for trade, consumption and simplification.

In addition, other oils had been mixed together with olive oil, the 2017 consumption report released last Thursday revealed.

The office - in charge of inspecting a range of products has informed the implicated companies.

And legal proceedings are under way in order to issue fines to some olive oil produc-

In some oil mills, the health ministry has taken charge and seized shipments to stop the liquid gold reaching consumers.

The move was not related to health risks, but instead ensured the product reached consumers with the highest guarantees, Abril said.

Olive oil wasn't the only product under the microscope of consumer regulators.

A total of 369,670 products were inspected as a part of 29 campaigns in 2017.

The other main culprits were bicycle manufacturers. Only 25 per cent of bicycles met regulations, mainly because technical specifications labels were missing.

Manufacturers had priori-

tised getting their products onto shelves over upholding consumer law, Abril said.

Despite these two major exceptions, 80 per cent of products examined did indeed meet regulations, Abril

Looking forward, the director general signalled his objective to inspect over half a million products by the end of 2018.

He will also start to prioritise inspections of online products given growth in internet shopping.

Corruption topples PP ex-mayor

MIGUEL ZARAGOZA - who was Santa Pola's mayor for 12 years and is accused of corruption - has resigned as town councillor and provincial minister for social welfare.

The Partido Popular (PP) minister who was town mayor from 2003 to 2015 said he couldn't continue letting his colleagues 'suffer attacks' because of his legal affairs, in a press release.

Economic crime unit agents (UDEF) arrested the ex-mayor along with his sister and her husband - ex-councillor Jorge Perello - in February. They are suspected of fraud, bribery and the perversion of justice.

Police claim Zaragoza failed to collect some €100,000 in rental fees a private clinic owed the town council between 2006 and 2016.

In return for the favour, the Gran Alacant clinic contracted the ex-mayor's sister. Pilar Zaragoza.

They paid her a two-year salary despite her never turning up to work and covered her absence with public funds, according to the police investigation.

The embattled ex-mayor is also facing perversion of justice charges.

He is accused of allowing an illegal nightclub to blast out music on a municipal beach.

Zaragoza denied ever having committed 'by action or omission, any act which could be reproached legally or ethically,' during his 12 years as Santa Pola mayor, in a statement.

Zaragoza's grip on Santa Pola power slipped after three terms in the May 2015 elections.

The town of 31,000 residents is now under the control of a leftist coalition headed up by the Partido Socialista

The news comes as Zaragoza's brother - Jose Miguel Zaragoza - and ex-head of Local Police in the same town is also being investigated.

He is suspected of fraudulently buying police uniforms. The act allegedly took place while his brother served as

Both brothers are set to stand before judges later this month.







Senators pass Gibraltar motion

A MOTION addressing Spain's position on Gibraltar as the territory prepares to depart with Britain from the European Union has been passed by a body of the Spanish Senate.

The Foreign Affairs Commission's motion addressed issues such as crossborder workers and Spain's position on the British enclave's sovereignty.

Its purpose was to set out a consensus position on the government in Madrid's attitude to Gibraltar going forward, a Partido Popular (PP) spokesperson from the Commission said.

Carlos Aragones Mendiguchia added the statement backed co-existence and the rule of law in relation to the territo-

He said Brexit gave Spain "unprecedented negotiating leverage" in relation to Gibraltar, with the motion also highlighting Spain's ambitions for a say over its governance.

The motion called on the Spanish government to reach a "bilateral understanding" with Britain over the territory in line with previous agreements.

It cited proposals for joint rule over Gibraltar which were put to a referendum and rejected with 98.5 per cent of votes cast against the plans in 2002.



MOTION PASSED: The motion called for the joint management of Gibraltar's airport among other positions.

It referenced proposals for shared sovereignty tabled by Spain at the United Nations in 2016 which were also dismissed by Gibraltar authorities.

The motion called for 'joint management of the airport situation on the isthmus, above all the entrance into the Schengen area of said airport.'

The Schengen agreement covers the free movement of EU citizens within

the bloc. Britain is not signed up to that free movement area.

The Foreign Affairs Commission's document also called on Spanish authorities to reach an agreement which favoured Spanish interests and those of people living in the Campo de Gibraltar.

Many of those living in the Campo cross the border regularly to the territory to work or visit relatives and friends.

Animal ban struck down

A VALENCIA regional court has ruled measures passed by Orihuela Council to ban the use of wild animals in circuses, bullfights and other similar events cannot go ahead.

The Superior Court of Justice of the Valencian Community ruled in favour of a bullfighting group which appealed against the passage of the rules.

It dismisses an earlier ruling from the Provincial Court last year on the measures after judges there dismissed the appeal.

The Superior Court found Orihuela Council had no legal power to impose a blanket ban on events featuring animals.

The authority will also have to pay €3,000 in court costs. Both parties were given 30 days to lodge appeals.

'Historic' fraud case in court

INVESTIGATORS probing what they claimed was the largest VAT fraud in Spanish history have presented their case against the suspects to a court in Elche.

Around 20 people were arrested in connection with the alleged tax fraud, with three leading members accused of being involved remanded in custody. Mohan Chatlani and Annand Chatlani, both Indian citizens, were also arrested in their homes as part of Operation Dreams. Prosecutors have requested the Elche judge pass on the case to the National Court, claiming the alleged fraud

took place in many provinces across Spain. The prosecution claimed the Elche-based suspects defrauded the Spanish treasury and multinational companies on VAT invoices for transactions.

LAST year more than one in five Brits holidayed abroad without any, or inadequate, travel insurance, according to travel agents' trade body AB-

And of those who did take out cover more than a quarter of them risked invalidating their policies for failing to declare pre-existing medical conditions or by taking part in activities that were not covered.

The most common reason people gave for not buying travel insurance was that people felt it wasn't needed and their European Health Insurance Card would provide sufficient cover. But the EHIC scheme only provides access to state medical care and does not in-

EU funding floated for Mar Menor

EUROPEAN UNION officials are considering making funding and assistance available to help with the recovery of the Mar Menor lagoon, the bloc's environment director said.

Daniel Calleja, who met with officials from Murcia's regional authorities. said the European Commission (EC) was willing to collaborate with local authorities on the issue.

He added the EC, which helps decide the EU's policy direction, had prioritised environmental work in its budget for this year.

"The European Union wants to be a part of the solution," he said.

Calleja undertook the visit with Murcia President Fernando Lopez Miras and Javier Celdran, the region's environment spokesperson.

Lopez Miras said condi-

tions at the lagoon were improving thanks to measures taken by authorities in Murcia. He added authorities wanted to work faster but couldn't due to regulations.

Menor's physical and natural environment to 'suffer.'

"With the beginning of the expansion of tourism in the 1960's the Mar Menor has seen its surface, perimeter and depth reduced due to debris, spills, drainages and other processes," the group said.

Drug smuggling suspects tried

TWO defendants who stand accused of smuggling almost 300 kilograms of cocaine into Spain by sea could each face 11 years in prison if found guilty at hearings in Alicante.

Prosecutors have lodged their request for the sentences with the Court in Alicante which began hearing the case last week. The two men deny the charges. The prosecution told the court the defen-

dants were arrested after one was caught in the Bay of Cadiz on a sailboat carrying 298 kilos of cocaine bound for Spain.

The other defendant was arrested in Valencia. Prosecutors claim he was set to take control of the drugs once they made it off the boat.

Lawyers acting for the defence were seeking an acquittal for the two men who deny involvement.

Ah-reet rock?

Lancs stone used in Barca church

A QUARRY in Lancashire is supplying Barcelona's La Sagrada Familia with stone to

help complete the building.

Brinscall quarry in Withnell, near Chorley, was selected alongside other sites across the world to ship the stone to the basilica.

The sandstone needed by builders for the church was previously quarried at Montjuic near Barcelona until reserves there were exhausted.

Stone was being sourced from demolished buildings

until Brinscall and others were chosen to help with supplies, according to the quarry's owners Armstrongs.

Armstrongs said the ongoing project was one which all of Chorley and the north west of England could be proud of.

"Without doubt this is the most historic and prestigious job any quarry in the UK is currently undertaking," the company said in a statement.

Armstrongs added sandstone from the Brinscall quarry was being used for the Nativity and Passion facades on either side of the front of the church.

La Sagrada Familia was designed by Catalan architect Antoni Gaudi, who began working on the project in 1883. He became Architect Director the following year.

The church was between 15 and 25 per cent complete when Gaudi died in 1926. Work to finish it has continued with interruptions ever

Building work on the main features is set to finish in 2026, the 100-year anniversary of Gaudi's death.

Decorative parts of the building are due for completion by 2032.

POLICE have tracked down a woman who sparked a social media meltdown after posting video footage of her spin-drying a cat on-

The unnamed 19-year-old from Villarrubia de los Ojos in Ciudad Real has been held by police after the animal died during the ordeal.

During the shocking clip. she is heard to say "looks

like people were right about cats having seven lives," before adding detergent and switching to a wash cycle.

And after the video - entitled Gatolavadora (cat washing machine) - appeared online, she uploaded a picture of the animal taken prior to the incident captioned: "The cat is now dead... yes the bad luck

More than 300,000 people signed a petition on the Change.org website as they lobbied the Ministry of Justice to charge the culprit.

Animal rights political group PACMA also voiced its outrage as it called for 'the maximum penalty for animal cruelty,' including an 18-month jail sentence and a three-year ban from keeping pets.





Puigdemont back in running

Lawmakers pass measures to restore former leader

FORMER Cataluña President Carles Puigdemont could return

to the post after regional parlia mentarians backed rule changes which would allow him to be sworn in remotely.

Supporters of the ousted leader said they aimed to return him to power by Monday. Eduard Pujol, a spokesperson for Puigdemont's Junts Per Cataluña party, added they did not want fresh regional elections as a result.

The new measures were passed by Cataluña's legislature by a margin of 70 for and 64 against last Friday. They stated Puigdemont would not have to appear in person to be sworn into office.

Ines Arrimadas, the leader of the pro-unionist Ciudadanos party, said Puigdemont's time had passed and that power should not be in the hands of those who want to 'break Spain.'

"The 'Puigdemont Law' is tailor-made for a fugitive escaping from justice and it is a challenge to democratic rules that will not get him anywhere," she said.

The government in Madrid

plans to fight the passage of the new rules in the Constitutional Court, with the Council of Ministers approving appeal efforts


Previous attempts to return Puigdemont to the presidency were scuppered by Spain's Constitutional Court. It ruled he would have to be present in the region's Parliament to be legally sworn in.

Puigdemont remains in Germany on bail in connection with an extradition request from Spain after being charged over last year's independence referendum and declaration.

The former president would likely face trail for sedition, rebellion and corruption if he returned to Spain. A court turned

down the request to extradite Puigdemont back to the country on rebellion charges on the grounds there was no equivalent offence in German law.

He could still be sent back to Spain on lesser charges of corruption, with the government in Madrid claiming funds were misused to hold the referen-

Fresh migrant crisis

Hundreds rescued by coastguard

A TOTAL of 476 people bound for Spain have been rescued by the country's coastguards in the Mediterranean during a surge in crossings triggered by favourable weather conditions.

Three were taken to hospital with hypothermia, chest pains and a suspected fractured ankle, according to Red Cross sources quoted in Spanish media.

Those three were from around 111 migrants, made up of 103 men and eight women, of the total of 308 picked up on Friday.

Two were taken to Malaga while another was airlifted by helicopter to Almeria 'sick and semi-unconscious,' according to re-

Maritime Rescue patrols located and rescued the 476 men, women and children from a total of 15 vessels on Friday and Saturday. Calm weather in the Strait of Gibraltar was reportedly a factor in the number of crossings made.

Antonio Sanz Cabello, the government's delegate in Malaga, said on Twitter a total of 308 migrants had arrived on the Andalucian coast in eight boats by the end of Fri-

In a later post he thanked coastguards for their 'professionalism and delivery' during the operations.

In a separate development a further 105 migrants were reportedly rescued by Proactiva Open Arms, a refugee NGO, in the sea near Libya during their own operation. The group reportedly found the migrants in a boat without an engine.

Most of the migrants picked up over the weekend are believed to be from sub-Saharan Africa. A total of 22,429 people have arrived on the coasts of Europe since the start of this year and 615 have died making the journey, according to United Nations esti-





Online strikes step up ahead of World Cup

ONLINE attacks aimed at Russia and people heading to the country for the World Cup are becoming more frequent and sophisticated, crime analysts have said. Scams including spam emails about winning tickets to the event and fake websites offering cheap flights and hotels have sprung up and popular websites have been infected with viruses.

Demonstrators fined

PROTESTORS in St Petersburg have been arrested and fined for waving non-Russian flags and some were jailed following May Day rallies. Vadim Charushev was reportedly fined 11,000 rubles (€143) after allegedly being caught with a British flag and was charged for violating public assembly laws and resisting arrest.

Syria crash deaths

TWO Russian pilots were killed after a military plane crashed off the coast of Syria in what is reportedly believed to have been an accident. The

Sukhoi Su-30SM fighter jet plunged into the sea shortly after taking off from Russia's Khmeimim air base where planes regularly fly from to target troops fighting Syrian government forces.

'Statue vandal' caught

A MAN who allegedly toppled a sculpture of Russia's ruble currency in the town of Syktyvkar has reportedly confessed less than a week after the incident, according to local police. The glass and metal statue of the Russian Cyrillic letter R was found shattered on the ground shortly after the incident last month.

Haircuts for veterans

Norwegian rejects IAG bids

LONG-HAUL budget airline Norwegian Air Shuttle (NAS) says it has unanimously rejected two takeover offers from the owner of British Air-

International Airlines Group (IAG), which owns 4.6 per cent of Norwegian, is reportedly aiming to increase its share of the market amid fears of competition from low-cost rivals.

But the NAS board said in a statement that it had rejected IAG's 'conditional proposals' because they 'undervalued NAS and its prospects.'

The rapidly-expanding carrier

added that the board 'would remain fully committed to delivering on its stated strategy.

Shares in the airline plummeted by up to 10 per cent in the wake of the failed bid before a slight recovery.

IAG last month announced that it had acquired a minor stake in NAS 'intended to establish a position from which to initiate discussion, including the possibility of a full offer for the

But in an analyst presentation the company confirmed it had failed to strike a full takeover deal as it said: "IAG confirms that it has had contact with the Norwegian board regarding a possible offer, without reaching an

"IAG is currently considering its options in relation to Norwegian."

The company - which also owns Spanish flag-carrier Iberia - also revealed a jump in operating profits in the first quarter of 2018, with underlying earnings before exceptional items up to €280 million compared to €160 million over the same period last year.

Economy cheer as hike goes on

THE General Council of Economists has revised its growth forecasts for Spain.

According to the national body, gross domestic product is expected to rise by 2.6 per cent in 2018 and 2.4 per cent in

The figure represents an increase of one 10th compared to earlier predictions.

It comes after the country's economy expanded by 0.7 per cent from January to March.

And it is expected to shoot up by a further 0.7 per cent over the next three months.

New scheme just the ticket

EUROPEAN AIRLINES TO AXE CREDIT CARD CHARGES

THE global airline industry is set to wage war against credit card firms.

Working with German financial services company Deutsche Bank, carriers aim to save billions of Euros in transaction fees using a new electronic real-time payment system for webbased ticket sales.

The scheme, which does not yet have a brand name, is earmarked to be trialled in Germany before being rolled out across Europe by the end of 2018. Spaniard Javier Orejas, senior banking manager for the International Air Transport Association (IATA) in Europe, the Middle East, Africa and the Americas, said: "We are developing an industry-wide payment solution that is an alternative to credit cards."

According to IATA, credit card payment processing costs the industry up to €6.7 billion per year, with credit card companies including Visa and Mastercard charging between 1 and 3 per cent for each transaction.

But the new system will employ a fixed rate which will be "a matter of cents," Orejas added.

It has been made possible by a new

European Union ruling that forces banks to hand third parties access to customer data and trigger payments.

Customers will enter their bank account details before Deutsche checks their balance in real time, collecting

the fees and transferring the money to the relevant airline once it sees that sufficient funds are available.

"Most banks view this in a defensive manner and only reluctantly open their data," said Shahrokh Moinian,

Deutsche. "For us, it's an opportunity for change. We have asked ourselves: why can't we behave like a tech company?

But introducing new payments systems can be tricky, because companies will only buy into schemes that their clients are willing to use, and vice ver-

IATA and Deutsche believe that convincing Europe's biggest airlines to adopt the system will see them break through this barrier.

"We are currently in talks with large carriers," Orejas told the Financial Times, noting that there is "a lot of appetite among airlines."

Meanwhile, travellers will be lured in with offers of flight discounts or extra loyalty miles.

Germany's largest carrier Lufthansa said in a statement that it is in favour of modern payment initiatives, adding: "We believe that competition in payment and distribution systems is a basic factor for decreasing cost while improving customer experi-

Tourists splash record amount in first quarter

MORE than 13.7 foreign tourists spent almost €14.4 million in Spain during the first quarter of 2018, according to the National Institute of Statistics.

The record figures represent increases of 6 and 7.7 per cent on the same period in 2017, respectively.

In March alone more than 5.4 million holidaymakers flocked to the country as visitor numbers soared by 9.6 per cent compared to last year.

The average tourist stayed for 7.5 days and spent €1,064, with Britons (2.8 million), Germans (1.85 million) and French (1.69 million) travellers topping the rankings in terms of num-

And the destinations raking in the most cash were the Canary Islands (€4.5 million), Cataluña (€3.1 million) and Andalucia (€2.2 million).

Do they need a tax adviser?

My partner and I have lived in Spain for seven years. We have lifetime residency and NIE. We live on our pensions and do not pay tax in the UK, as we do not earn enough.

Some people tell us we must register for tax in Spain and some tell us we don't have to. A website tells us that if we earn less than €22,000 per year, we do not have to register in Spain. We are now confused.

I have recently begun earning from buying shares in properties with a Spanish company, and so I agree I must now register. Can you please clear up the mat-

N K (Costa Blanca)

YES you must declare for Spanish tax. Here is a simple rule: if you reside officially in Spain, your worldwide income is subject to Spanish tax.





In your case, you want to find a Spanish tax consultant who speaks English so you can understand. Ask your friends. The limit of \in 22,000 applies only when the income received has been subject to Spanish withholding tax during the year. Clearly, this does not apply to a UK pension.

I'VE been reading lately that shopping online is killing high street, bricks and mortar, shopping. This in my opinion is due to many reasons. Of course, the biggest one is the convenience - you don't have to get off your backside; you just click a couple of buttons.

Another is the massive shopping centres like Westfield. I've just got back from a few days in the UK and the thing is the high streets just haven't moved with the times. I was staying in Borehamwood. It has a nice high street but most of the shops are eateries you can buy every type of food you want.

There is an abundance of nail places and estate agents but no 'shop' shops. At the back of the high street there is a mini shopping park where there are some of the big name stores but they are all closed up by 6pm.

Why? I remember when I had my first shop, we opened at 9.30am and closed at 5.30pm and had half-day closing on a Thursday. Remember those days?

This was 1980 and I had just opened my first video rental shop. After the first few weeks I realised that this couldn't work because the only customers I was getting were people who didn't work those hours or local workers who nipped in during their lunch break, so I changed my hours to be open 10am-7pm and no half-days and I opened

Business boomed, even though I had to fight the council tooth and nail not to be fined. Back to Borehamwood - I wanted to buy a pair of shoes. I got to the shop at 6.02pm and everything was locked up and gone. I'm sure if everyone opened later they would have a better chance of survival.

Of course they won't because you can't cover those opening hours with one shift. For us living here in Spain we are spoilt - we can shop from 10am till 10pm.

Sure we have some stores that still take a siesta but you don't half miss the longer hours when you are in the UK. Plus, here we still have thriving high streets with a great selection of independent retailers.

OK stand up Jet2 and take a bow. I used them for the first time this trip and they are head and shoulders above Ryanair. Their staff were so helpful and it's the little things like having a pocket on the back of the seat to put a paper and more legroom - give them a try.

So there you go I was temporarily happy this week.

Take back (digital) control

The week after next, Terence Kennedy will insist that Facebook deletes his digital indiscretions





SOON the world's digital overlords will apparently hold 40 zettabytes of information on us.

No I don't know what that means either, but when a colleague recently asked Facebook for all the information it held on him, he got nearly a gigabyte back.

That's the equivalent of 200 copies of the Bible in plain text, if you're interested. Or not, if you're an atheist.

Most alarming of all was that it listed every call he had ever made and every message he had ever sent. The good news is that this changes in a fortnight. At least it does for we Europeans, thanks to the acronym of the moment: GDPR.

From May 25 the General Data Protection Regulation means that organisations may no longer treat us unilaterally as just so much advertising fodder, to be milked of every possible bit of personal information for

their nefarious or even non-nefarious purposes. If they do, it's goodbye €20 million or more in fines.

The likes of Facebook, Amazon, Google or that popular anatomical research site Pornhub may not harvest our personal data without asking us, may not hit us with 40 screens of terms and conditions we cannot understand as an excuse, may not refuse to tell us what they know about us,

and must delete it if we insist. I certainly do.

If they get hacked they have to 'fess up' within 72 hours.

Not only may they merely store our details for a 'reasonable' time, but we will have the hitherto denied 'right to be forgotten' if we want to opt-out of any part of our brave new digital world.

It's not just our direct personal data

which is affected. Anything which could be identified directly back to us may not be collected without our explicit consent. That includes the 'IP address' which pinpoints your specific computer or phone even if you think you operate online anonymous-

The good news for non-Europeans is also that the GDPR will reverberate far beyond the old world's borders. Any company has to comply when doing business with Europe (here's lookin' at you Facebook and Google).

So: The Empire Fights Back? Will it all make a difference where online privacy has devalued more than a Zimbabwean dollar?

A recent survey revealed that 32 per cent of the respondents intend to ask at least one organisation exactly what information it holds on them.

I will certainly be asking Google to delete details of all those searches I did back then on performance-enhancing substances undetectable by local Scrabble clubs. Purely for scientific purposes, you understand.

Trackdown

WE'VE all seen those ads which mysteriously track us right across the internet - irritatingly offering to sell us the very item we just bought.

But it's not just GCHQ, the NSA or even the former KGB who'd like to track us physically too. Soon we might pass the supermarket and our phone might entreat us to buy today's special on biodegradable crum-

The GDPR doesn't (yet) tackle the thorny issue of surveillance, but it's coming. Proposed legislation hopes to take the next step: banning surveillance unless you agree.

Would anyone, other than 'helicopter' parents obsessing where their children are 24/7? Or a nurse keeping tabs on someone like my granddad, whose 105th birthday we celebrated this week? (Though sadly he died at 62).

Choosing the rig

for in your next running shoe. You should be able to slide your feet in and out of your shoe without too much difficulty, so make sure the heel fits snugly, but isn't too tight. Nor should the shoe's upper feel tight, if it does then you need one with more space.

Within the forefront of the shoe, your foot should be able to move from side-to-side. If the shoe is too narrow, you'll feel pressure against the base of your little toe.

Remember, that as you run and build up a sweat your feet will swell. So make sure there's a thumb's width of space between your longest toe (not always the big toe) and the front end of the shoe. Be sure that your toes can wriggle freely about.

It's really important that the shoe feels right. So if you can, walk around the shop and get a feel for your new pair. Remember that any irritation you notice in the shop will be amplified once you hit the road. So take the time to be sure before you take the leap of buying your new pair.







Thai red curry paste can be bought in most of the supermarkets in Spain, Mercadona have a good one for

My jar of Thai basil was bought in the UK and frozen, but Italian basil is a perfectly good alternative, or coriander can be used if the taste of basil is not to your liking.

Ginger and chilli are optional and add heat to the curry, the former to a much lesser extent than the latter.


- 400 grams chicken breasts, cubed
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 4 whole garlic clove, skinned and
- 1 whole onion, chopped
- 1 Packet Thai Red Curry Paste
- 1 cube of ginger chopped (op-

- 1 (or more) sliced and seeded red or green chillis
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 can of coconut milk
- 1 chicken stock cube, crumbled
- 2 tablespoons fish sauce
- 1 whole aubergine, cubed
- 1 whole red bell pepper, sliced
- 2 teaspoons chopped Thai basil

Fry the chicken, onion and garlic until chicken sealed and garlic and onion have become transparent.

Add the Thai red curry paste and fry for two more minutes.

Add all remaining ingredients, except for the basil and simmer until chicken cooked through and aubergine and red pepper are soft, add the basil and serve with boiled rice or noodles.

Tip: Choose chillis wisely, some are extremely spicy and contact lens wearers should get someone else to chop them otherwise bedtime will be a very painful experience! Tip: Any vegetable oil can be used but not olive oil. Ideally choose peanut or coconut, but rapeseed or sunflower also work well in this dish.

Tip: A cheap cut of beef can be used instead of chicken, it would need cooking slowly for about three to four hours (a slow cooker would be ideal) just add the aubergine and red pepper when the beef is tender. Prawns or fish can also be used and added just before serving so they are not overcooked. Use beef or fish stock instead of the chicken.

One major change will be the instruction that those on the red carpet will not be permitted to take selfies and if they





Rental revolution hits the Continent

A RECENT report from the Resolution Foundation has suggested that up to a third of young people in the UK face living in private rented accommodation all their lives.

The think tank said that 'generation rent' needs more help, with more affordable homes and better protection.

At this point it may be worth taking a look at other European countries to see how they compare:

Spain

Spain has historically had a high rate of home ownership, reaching 80 per cent in 2008 before the financial bubble burst and the building boom ended.

The figure has slipped to 78 per cent but is likely to decline further with unemployment remaining high and mortgages difficult to obtain.

As a result, demand for rentals has risen, boosting Airbnb and other platforms, while pushing up prices.

According to online real estate agency Idealista, rents in



Barcelona have risen 55 per cent since 2012, and 23 per cent in Madrid over the same period.

Rental contracts tend to be for one or three years, after which they may be terminated, or renewed and the rent renegotiated.

Increasingly landlords in tourist areas are demanding excessive rents to force tenants out, so that they can turn apartments into lucrative holiday rentals.

Eviction also continues to be a serious problem, with lenders reluctant to negotiate terms.

France

French tenants benefit from

much stricter rules on landlords, with rents on unfurnished dwellings only allowed to be increased by an index, called the IRL

The rise was close to zero for much of 2016 and 2017, with an increase of 0.51 per cent permitted for this year.

Those renting an unfurnished property as their main residence are given a minimum three-year tenancy with an automatic right of renewal after three years.

If the landlord wants the tenant to leave, they must warn them six months in advance, (tenants only have to give three months' notice).

Landlords must also give the tenant a first right of refusal if they wish to sell, while evictions are forbidden in the winter months.

Germany

Only 46 per cent of Germans own their own homes, the lowest figure in Europe.

However, culturally there is nothing like the drive to want to own as there is in other European countries, with many downsizing once the children leave and wage-related pensions covering monthly payments.

Wartime bombing destroyed about 20 per cent of residential areas in towns and cities, and many refugees arrived in the country who had lost everything.

Banks do not help by demanding deposits that are a fifth of the purchase price, while estate agent fees and stamp duty charges do little to help those dreaming of their own home.

Sunny Spain is best for British

NEW figures from the Office for National Statistics reveal that Spain is still the number one choice for British retirees in Europe.

The data confirms Spain as their 'most desirable location,' with Brits drawn in by sun, sea, leisure activities and tasty Mediterranean cuisine.

Three-quarters of a million British citizens live on the continent, and 37 per cent of them have made Spain their home, making it comfortably the most popular destination.

While two thirds of Brits living in the EU fall between the ages of 15 and 64, Spain is well-known for attracting an older demographic with some 41 per cent of British expats aged 65 and above

Swimming and golf are believed to be the favourite activities for those living in warmer nations, which will come as no surprise.

Moreover, a recent study carried out by the University of California indicated that the elderly who regularly walk longer distances suffer 50 per cent less cognitive impairment than those who are less active.

Sales and Marketing Director of Taylor Wimpey España, Marc Pritchard, said:

"The Mediterranean climate and diet are well suited to those looking for a healthy lifestyle, while the medical system here is also superb.

Gardeners get going - it's spring

GRAEME TYRRELL

THE spring growth is a great opportunity to gain a wonderful garden.

It is a very busy time for gardeners with the warmer temperatures and longer days creating an explosion of growth which needs to be managed to make the most of the season. To get them off to a quick start, it is the perfect time to plant your summer annual flowers and vegeta-

Established plants will also start growing rapidly now and the new growth will make them look wonderfully healthier than usual.

Of course weeds and excess growth of even your favourite plant will need attention to keep the garden in the way you prefer it. Fortunately it is so good to be able to get out into the garden, with the beautiful spring sunshine making it one of the best times of the year for the avid

Annual summer flowers can provide a beautiful display. Many favourite annuals from northern European regions require a lot of water to do well though. I usually plant a small number of summer annuals in planter boxes with trays to catch any excess water from being lost and use a good potting mix that retains water well.

The Mediterranean climate with long, dry, hot

summers is not ideal for large plantings of cooler climate summer annuals in the garden. If you have a balcony or terrace with planter pots or window boxes, annuals can be a really good way to brighten them up.

If you are planting a vegetable garden, make sure that you enrich the soil with plenty of moisture-holding compost to reduce watering needs in summer. After planting your tomatoes, capsicum, summer squash and other summer varieties ensure that you mulch the garden with coarse compost, straw or any other suitable material which will reduce evaporation and keep soil temperatures cooler.

Keeping the soil temperature lower is important in summer as plant growth will slow when

the roots get too hot. Insulating with mulch keeps soil temperatures closer to spring conditions so growth will continue to thrive for longer.

There is the inevitable weed growth which always seem to grow faster than anything else in spring. It is a good idea to learn more about these spontaneous plants as many do have attractive flowers. If the garden is not a formal design, many weeds can be left to flower and then be re-

Even in my vegetable garden I allow certain plants normally classed as weeds, such as poppies and borage, to add colour to the garden with no

Many people are also finding that there are many weeds which are actually edible and even the flowers can be added to salads and in cooking. Many of these wild plants were actually a normal part of the diet before explorers centuries ago brought back vegetable varieties from around the world to replace the native food sources of the

The shrubs and perennials which are normally planted in autumn (so they establish their roots over winter) start to grow with the warmer spring weather. It is a good idea to lightly trim the ones that you want to grow thick and bushy now while growth is active and before the sun becomes too intense for pruning.

Hot under the collar

WITH rising temperatures, you might feel the heat is on to finally install a central air conditioning system. However, if your budget is already stretched, there are other less expensive options to keep you cool under the collar at home.

The three most popular are porta- ble units, window units and traditional fans.

Portable or window units can be cheap and easy to install. Both systems allow you to cool a specific room,

The benefit of a portable unit is that it can be moved easily from room to room. This is different to a window unit which is fixed to a window, or through the wall. Of the two, portable units are more expensive to buy and tend to use a lot more energy. Whereas window units are extremely energy efficient and don't take up any valuable floor space.

However, if you want to keep expenses to a minimum, the traditional air fan he moved from room to room with ease.

Bringing the baby home

MOST people treat their dog like a baby and often problems will occur when a real baby is brought home. You must plan for the new baby's arrival.

Acquaint the dog with a friend's children. Let them feed it some of its favourite treats. Stay calm and keep the dog on a lead. If at this stage the dog is showing any signs of aggression, then professional help is needed.

If the dog is used to sleeping in a bedroom, place the dog bed outside the room in its basket or on its blanket. If necessary, put the dog on a lead and restrict it to an area.

Consider walking around with a stuffed doll. Even talk to it in a baby voice as if it is a real baby. When changing the baby's nappy - both the real one and the toy one - always put your dog in the Sit-Stay com-

Let it sniff and watch, for

baby sounds and praise it for being good. Use different phrases and voices for the dog

For safety reasons and hygiene, dogs must not be allowed on the furniture near the new baby. Start the new house rules by taking the dog by the collar and lead and taking it to its bed. Move the bed around the home to every room (except bedrooms) in the house. The dog must learn to stay where it is put.





Chelsea themselves will host Huddersfield Town on Wednesday, before travelling to Newcastle for their season finale on Sunday.

Newcastle slipped to a third successive defeat at Watford on Saturday, with the Hornets securing Premier League survival in a 2-1 win thanks to first-half goals from Roberto Pereyra and Andre Gray.

He was reportedly taken to Salford Royal Hospital with a police escort after falling ill at his Cheshire home over the weekend.

Manchester United said in a statement: "Sir Alex Ferguson has undergone emergency surgery today for a brain haemorrhage. The procedure has gone very well but he needs a period of intensive care to optimise his recovery. His family request privacy in this matter."

The legendary Scot won 49 trophies as a manager, including 13 Premier League titles, five FA Cups and two Champions Leagues.

He retired from club football in 2013.

United themselves can take much confidence from absorb-

ing Tottenham's blistering pace and pressing in the semi-final, fighting back from a goal down to claim victory.

Chelsea are back in the final after losing to Arsenal a year ago, and winning the FA Cup might not be enough to convince either Conte or Chelsea

owner Roman Abramovich that their two-year partnership should be extended.

Meanwhile Jose Mournho has claimed that his critics will 'kill' him if his team fail to lift the trophy.

However, victory over Chelsea would yield the fourth trophy of Mourinho's two-year reign as United manager, following last season's Europa League, League Cup and Community Shield successes.
