A YOUNG Scotsman remains trapped on the Costa del Sol eight months after he was held on drug charges he describes as "ludicrous."

Computer engineer Robbie Miller, 24, was arrested on drug charges after a cannabis farm was discovered at the property where he was renting a room in La Linea de la Concepcion, Cadiz.

But he had only moved into the flat four days earlier and the plants were already mature, making it impossible that he grew them.

He was released on bail but had his passport seized while he waits for a judge to study his case, which he fears could take a year. And a detailed dossier of evidence, seen by the Euro Weekly News, appears to validate his story.

His mum - who is on benefits in Hamilton, South Lanarkshire - is sending money allowing him to rent a small flat in Malaga, but he is otherwise penniless and unable to get a job or return home.

A dejected Robbie said: "I'm at my wits' end. It's ludicrous to think I could have grown a load of plants that were 2m high when police came round.

"I had only moved in four days earlier and my passport will show I arrived in Spain 15 days before I was arrested.

"No one has properly considered the case. No judge or iury could ever find me guilty."

### Migrant mayhem

A GRANADA deputy has called on the government in Madrid to explain what she claimed were plans to use an old military base in Motril as a migrant reception centre.

Ana Terron, of the leftist Podemos party, said Motril's council had called on the Ministry of the Interior to halt conversion works due to no licence being granted for them.

The base was due to come under the control of local authorities after military activity was wound up there in 2008. It was designated for educational use under the General Urban Plan for Motril.

Terron has asked for clarification on who owns the facilities and if Madrid knew the site was earmarked for Motril's use. She added there were concerns over how migrants housed there would be

LOCAL POLICE have been searching for a driver who is still at large after he allegedly ran over a two-year-old girl in Algarrobo.

Officers said they had managed to identify the vehicle believed to have been driven by the suspect on Tuesday. The registration plate indicated it belonged to someone in Torre del Mar.

The search for the suspect is connected with an alleged hit at run which took place at a petrol station in Algarrobo last Saturday.

The two-year-old girl was reportedly on Avenida de Karat with her grandfather next to the petrol station and near her family

The driver reportedly ran over her and fled without helping. The girl was taken to Axarquia's Regional Hospital and discharged on Monday and her parents later filed complaints with Local Police and the Guardia Civil

Security camera footage was used to identify the car's model and registration number. Investigators ruled out the suspect being from Algarrobo as no car with its description was owned there.

A BRITISH man on the run for armed robbery and known to have at least 75 false identities has been held on the Costa del Sol.

The still-unnamed suspect was detained in glamorous Marbella on a European Arrest Warrant after being stopped by a Spanish National Police patrol just after

And when he handed over his fake identification it became clear he was being hunted by UK investigators after being accused of raiding a series of armoured vehicles using illegal weapons and ex-

He was cuffed and charged with presenting false documents on the spot but reportedly offered the officers € 500 to let him go, resulting in an additional bribery

A judge in Madrid ruled via video link that he be remanded in custody ahead of extradition proceedings.

It comes after one of Britain's most-wanted criminals - 41-yearold Stephen Lawrence murder suspect Jamie Acourt - was last week held in Barcelona on drug trafficking charges

A false passport bearing the name Simon Alfonzo was reportedly seized after he tried to pass himself off as an Italian tourist, but he is not challenging his extradition to the UK

He became the 81st fugitive to be caught by Operation Captura, a joint venture between Spanish police, the National Crime Agency (NCA) and Crimestoppers, with the crackdown forcing

criminals to go to extreme measure to avoid investigators.

NCA head of international operations Steve Revnolds told UK media: "Areas like the Costa Blanca and the Costa del Sol are the most popular with British holidaymakers and most of our fugitives. "It's been known for people to have plastic surgery after faces have been splashed all over the papers and television."

Others believed to be still at large in Spain include Glaswegian Jonathon Kelly, 36, who vanished four years ago after failing a drug test while on parole for a string of brutal assaults.

Serial fraudster Mark Acklom, 44, is wanted for allegedly fleecing a divorcee out of almost €1 million after romancing her while posing as an MI6 agent.

Twenty-seven-year-old Dominic McInally from Liverpool is wanted on drugs charges, while Londoner Shane O'Brien, 28, is accused of a 2015 murder.

And Sarah Panitzke, 42, from Yorkshire was among the masterminds convicted over a € 1.1 billion VAT fraud.

#### **Paraglider** fall death

A PARAGLIDER has died after hitting the sea and being dragged away by currents at the La Herradura beach in Almuñecar, Granada. The Guardia Civil are now investigating the death, with emergency services having confirmed the glider passed away after being pulled from the water at midday on Thursday.

#### **Boat rescue**

A TOTAL of 91 people, including nine women and one child, were picked up by coast guards from two boats and arrived in Motril's port in good health. Salvamento Maritimo personnel, including an aircraft, were despatched to the boats in the Alboran Sea as one was reportedly about to sink.

#### Flooding row

A COUNCILLOR in Torrox has claimed the Partido Socialista in Torrox wasted funding earmarked for a warehouse storing archival documents which has reportedly flooded several times. Maria Angeles Ruiz, of the conservative Partido Popular, said the €155,000 could have saved documents which were now lost due to contact with sewage.

#### Holiday plans


OSCAR MEDINA, Torrox's mayor and the tourism councillor have presented the town's 2018 plan to attract visitors to the municipality. The proposals are made to fit within the framework of the International tourism fair (FITUR) which will be held in Madrid early next year, according to reports.

#### Jobless down

THE Popular Party's Torrox secretary general Fernando Nieto has valued the town's 'positive' employment results after a 2.67 per cent fall in unemployment was registered compared to February last year. Nieto highlighted Malaga for being the third best performer in Spain for boosting employment opportunities, local media reports.

#### Bird plea

A LEFTIST political coalition is reportedly calling for the river Velez wetlands to be classified as a 'natural park,' something the SEO-BirdLife charity has been demanding for years. ### 'I'm at my wit's end'

The British Consulate offered to provide temporary travel documents when Robbie appealed for help, but warned he could be jailed if his bail conditions changed if they got involved.

Robbie arrived in Spain, with his boarding passes verifying he travelled on October 5.

He headed to La Linea in the

hope of finding work in Gibraltar, and Facebook screen grabs show he contacted a British biker by the name of Simon of St Peter Pendragon on October 15.

He moved into a room in the landlord's flat on October 16, before police raided the property four days later, seizing cannabis plants weighing 7kg and jailing

Additional screenshots confirm that Mr Pendragon even offered to visit police and protest the Scot's innocence in the wake of his arrest, although it is unclear if

Of the British Consulate's assistance, he added: "They said they can't intervene in the legal iurisdiction of Spain but they will seek to get my passport back.

"They sent me a waiver that says the bail conditions could change, which covers their back if I get remanded in custody prior

Mum Alison told Scottish media: "The charges against Robbie are a joke."

THE world is gearing up to watch Prince Harry and Meghan Markle tie the knot this Saturday.

And as preparations continue, a couple have been crowned Europe's best royal lookalikes after beating more than 3,000 entrants.

Briton Rhys Whittock and Spaniard Inmaculada Serrano, both 34, were named the most convincing doppelgangers after stunning judges with their resemblance to the lovebirds.

The pair were also evaluated on royal waves, wedding proposals and bouquet throws before riding in an open-top horse-drawn carriage outside Buckingham Palace.

Property developer Rhys said: "My family and friends have often said I looked like the young Prince, but I certainly didn't think I'd be crowned the winner."

His partner Inmaculada, a teacher from Sevilla, added: "To be compared to the brideto-be is a real honour and I'm flattered that I have been voted as the best double for one of the most famous women in the world."

Organised by low-cost airline easyJet, the

winners received a year's worth of free flights. And the runners-up were also from the UK and Spain, with Danni Burnett and Carlos Lamothe picking up second place.

The final round of judging - led by Duncan Larcombe, author of Prince Harry: Inside the Story, lookalike expert Susan Scott and professional Prince William double Simon Watkinson - saw the chosen couples jet into London from around Europe.

Some of the wackier entrants included a ginger kitten, a pygmy goat and a dog.

Around 600 guests are expected to attend the official ceremony at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, with another 2,640 invited to the grounds. But Meghan's dad Thomas Markle, 73, may not walk his daughter down the aisle after recently suffering a heart attack.

It comes after UK media revealed he had staged paparazzi photos for cash.



ALMUÑECAR'S council has approved €65,000 in funding to remodel and improve the town's Archaeological Museum, according to the authority's tourism spokesperson.

### Off the rails



VELEZ-MALAGA'S council has been seeking an agreement with the Junta de Andalucia to partly fund the town's tram network after six years of no service.

The region's government would cover around 40 per cent of the costs under the deal if it is approved.

Velez-Malaga's mayor, as well as the council's transport spokesperson, said the authority's board had approved a motion calling for an urgent meeting with Andalucia's ministry of development regarding the plans. The cost of the network was estimated to be around €40 million.

News of the deal comes as the authority was previously investigated over its spending on the inactive trams by a public spending watchdog

Five alleged irregularities were

probed and three remained up for further investigation following a council appeal.

Velez-Malaga transport spokesperson Marcelino Mendez-Trelles said issues surrounding the trams had become political.

"There are many possibilities for our tramway system to work again soon. The €40 millionworth of investment will once again be put to use.

"We must recognise the good work of the city council technicians who have informed the court about all and each of the required aspects for the network," he said.

Mendez-Trelles added the court of accounts investigation showed there had been no technical or economic issues with the running of the network.

# Driven mad

Thieves targeting rental cars

HOLIDAYMAKERS have been warned of a rental car scam in Spain.

Drivers on the AP-7 motorway are reportedly being targeted by thieves who flag them down after claiming to have spotted a flat tyre.

They are signalled to pull over before having their belongings stolen while distracted.

American tourist Kelly Roland said: "We were driving back from Cadeques to Barcelona when a mid-size BMW [with a few guys in it] pulled up next to us on the motorway."

She explained that a man in the front passenger seat was pointing at her front tyre and pointing to a service station ahead.

After she stopped her friend got out to look and the man came over 'speaking loudly in broken English' before Kelly herself joined them.

"[Later] I realised he had been talking loud so we didn't hear the doors opening and closing."

She added that one of the man's friends had sneaked over and removed their bags while they were dis-

And when she reported

the incident to police she was told they had seen the ploy "one, two, maybe 3,000 times before.'

Other criminals are less subtle and simply break the windows of rental cars before making off with whatever they can lay their hands on.

Police recommend removing rental stickers or signage from cars, regardless of whether the companies themselves approve. They also recommend that all valuables should be kept out of sight, locking bags and other items in the boot if leaving the vehicle unattended.

#### Cab cut

CAB fares are set to fall after the regional government approved a new set of prices for Rincon de la Victoria.

The vehicles will now have to carry taximeters too, local centre-right Popular Party councillor, Sergio Diaz said.

Changes come after an Andalucia government study made it possible for authorities to cut the number one tariff, which applies between 6am and 10pm.

This price drop was possible due to an increase in the tariff two, night time fare which runs from 10pm to 6am, as well as new prices for the nights of Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

Miguel Martin, president of the area's taxi association said: "We are also working on increasing the amount of taxi stops in the municipali-

"There hasn't been a change in taxicab fares for five years," Martin added.

"The best we can do is try to reinstate

the 41 positions currently open with permanently contracted workers by taking legal action," Arrabal said.

A total 51 legal cases have been forwarded by disgruntled ex-employees and 22 of them were successful in court.

And 17 employees have been reinstated in their public posts so far.

The remaining five have been compensated, according to a group of politicians from three left-leaning parties.

Among those to retake their positions were local development agents, social workers, municipal car park security guards and dance and music school teach-

Further public posts will be opened up until 2021 to consolidate those which have already been retaken.

### €2bn mega deal well-connected

FRENCH investment firm Antin Infrastructure Partners has revealed it is to fork out €2 billion for Spanish fibre optic wholesale operator Ufinet.

Formerly owned by natural gas and electricity supplier Gas Natural Fenosa, the telecommunications company was in 2014 bought by London-based global private equity firm Cinven Partners for €510 million.

Operating mostly in Spain and Latin America, Ufinet posted sales of €81 million in 2017, with the deal reportedly set to be wrapped up by July.

### Party over for Club 18-30?

CLUB 18-30 - the brand notorious for cheap holidays packed with sun, sex and alcohol - could soon be heading for the departure lounge.

The news comes amid fears that millennials increasingly opt for 'ego travel,' after a report revealed that half of 18 to 25-year-old sunseekers now take posting selfies on social media into account when booking trips.

And high street tour operator Thomas Cook, which has owned the brand since 1998, says it is "exploring options," including a possible sale.

It wants to concentrate on its new

Cook's Club offering, which launched last month.

Featuring its own-brand hotels with big-name poolside DJs and upmarket cocktails, creative director Remo Masala believes the offering will serve up "urban cool" for "the Instagram generation."

At its peak, Club 18-30 jetted around 100,000 people per year to party resorts including Magaluf, Kavos and Ayia Napa.

Founded in the 1960s, its first destination was Lloret de Mar on the Costa

Brava, and its racy image saw it become a tabloid staple during the 1990s and 2000s, when one advertising slogan read: 'It's not all sex, sex, sex. There's a bit of sun and sea as well.'

The young sunseekers' drunken antics even spawned the infamous ITV series Club Reps.

Thomas Cook said in a statement: "We remain committed to Club 18-30 for summer 2018.

"However, we are exploring options for the future of the brand, which could include the possibility of a sale"

### Golden opening sparks new rush

A CANADIAN gold and copperproducing firm is to reopen a Spanish mine.

Nuria Menendez, managing director of Orovalle, Toronto-based Orvana Minerals' Spanish subsidiary said that the company is planning to start work at the Carles gold mine in Salas, Asturias, after a favourable exploratory survey.

The site is situated in the Rio Narcea gold belt, a historic deposit first discovered by the Romans 2,000 years ago, previously mined between 1997 and 2006 with over 1,000,000 ounces of the precious mineral extracted.

upcoming Hollywood films including Solo: A Star Wars Story, The Rhythm Section, Wonder Woman 2 and the upcoming Terminator reboot have all been shot entirely or partially in Spain.

"There's a constant flow of international shoots, and it's increasingly difficult to find experienced Spanish crew for foreign productions," added Barcelona-based Nostromo Pictures founder Adrian Guerra.

EAT your heart out Somalia: Spain has more pirates than you've had hot


We learned courtesy of this fine newspaper a few weeks back that piracy (of the digital variety) dropped by a worthy 6 per cent in Spain last year - but that some €22 billion worth of content still managed to, um, fall off the back of the internet, through four billion illegal downloads. Ouch.

Perish the thought that this column should ever encourage lawbreaking, but it seems clear to pretty much everyone except those actually in the 'content' industries, that illegal downloading is a war which may never be won.

It might if there was at least a price incentive to buy the real thing. Many find it hard to be persuaded that piracy is a crime when, say, publishers insist on charging exactly the same for a physical book or magazine containing lots of (expensive) raw materials, as for its associated ebook, only made of (free) digital bits and bytes.

### The share pleasure of it

Music and movie streaming services are at least starting to make inroads into piracy. Like the movie industry, music companies took the serious mis-step of encumbering their digital versions with all sorts of complicated and irritating copyright protection which consumers absolutely hated, and by-passed, almost inevitably driving many into the hands of file-sharers.

Neither did prosecuting random teenagers in their bedrooms sharing modern versions of the old mixtapes do much to generate sympathy for the industry - own goals of the highest idiocy.

Is 'peer-to-peer filesharing,' or 'torrenting,' actually legal? Surprisingly, it is. Use it for legitimate purposes like public domain downloads. internet archive material, music or

games shared freely by their producers, and the boys in blue will not come a-knocking. Only copyrighted material crosses the line.

The technical wizardry behind torrents is digi-magic which passeth human understanding:

A dozen or a thousand people have the file you want on their own computers and agree to share it.

Your torrent software takes a tiny bit of the file from one, a tiny bit from another ad infinitum all at the same time, and at the end cleverly reassembles the jigsaw puzzle back into the complete file on your computer. Halfway across the world, others then take tiny bits of it from your

Just be sure to stay within the law. Even if, as Shakespeare said, the law can sometimes be an ass, as in the Boston student fined a breathtaking \$675,000 a while back for illegally downloading 30 songs. By Aerosmith for heaven's sake. I would have paid him to take my

#### Do the right thing

SEARCH for 'legal torrents' or similar if you'd like to give peer-to-peer filesharing a whirl.

Then all you need is the software, mostly free. Popular torrent 'clients' include BitTorrent, Vuze, uTorrent, my own favourite Deluge for its simplicity, Transmission (for Macs), BitComet or BitLord.

You also need reasonable broadband. No one wants your bit of the shared file if it takes next week to get it.

It's also bad form to grab and go; once your file is in, leave your computer online to share the love.

And remember the legal fine print: if you would normally have to pay for it, if it's copyrighted, if it has monetary value to anyone out there - Go directly to Jail, do not pass 'Go' and do not collect 200.

#### Is he exempt from CGT?

You wrote: 'If you are Tax Resident for three years and over 65 years of age, you can be free of Capital Gains when you sell your principal residence in Spain.'

I am 72 years old and I sold my house 18 months ago, after owning it for 16 years. When I put my tax returns in to my solicitor, I was told that, unless I bought another property, I would have to pay Capital Gains on the profit.

My Capital Gains tax came to more than €5,000, which I paid. I showed your article to my solicitors and they said that I couldn't get my money back because this was only applicable now, and not on old sales. Is this true? Surely there must be some way of getting my money back.

DM (Costa Blanca)

First let us be sure that you are 'tax resident' in Spain. Can you show your Spanish income tax declarations for the



past three years? If so, you can claim back your Capital Gains tax paid by mistake for up to four years.


pared for its conference in June, the party admits that the time is not ripe for independence.

THE childhood best friend of Beatles guitarist George Harrison and leading member of the band's team has spoken to Euro Weekly News about his time in music.

Tony Bramwell, 72, was speaking ahead of planned appearances on the Costa del Sol as a special celebrity guest in the Festival of Legends tomorrow and on Saturday.

He said in an exclusive interview with Euro Weekly News ahead of the shows he was looking forward to visiting Spain.

"I do these Beatles tribute shows all over the world. I was in Spain at the end of last year for Chris King's (of the Festival of Legends) concerts in December," he said.

"Me and George went to the Canary Islands on holiday together in

1963. The Beatles did a few small tours in Spain around 1965 and I went to Sevilla in 1967 to make a film about the city's feria for their film company."

Bramwell was with The Beatles from their early days gigging in Liverpool. He began his career with

them working on promotional videos for I Feel Fine, Help!, Day Tripper and others before heading up the band's Apple Films company

"I have been very lucky," he said. "George was my best friend when we were kids. I still go on the road with Paul occasionally and I sat him last week, he's doing well," he said.

Bramwell went on to work with a number of other artists after The Beatles split up in 1970. He joined Roxy Music on a tour to Barcelona.

"Bryan Ferry got taken seriously ill. He was stuck in an ambulance on the way back to England so we had five days in Barcelona just enjoying ourselves," he said.

Tony Bramwell will be at the Estepona Auditorium Felipe VI from 9pm Friday and the Benalmadena Municipal Auditorium from 8pm. Tickets are €15 from the box office available at 609 488 572

Eat Well to Live Well by Andrew Harding

SINCE we are in Spain I thought it was time I shared some Spanish tapas recipes with you.

The definition of tapas is: 'small Spanish savoury dishes, typically served with drinks at a bar.' Cooking tapas is very labour intensive and is more suited to places where food can be cooked in bulk and served in a large number of small portions. This would normally preclude tapas at home for a dinner party or a family meal, but it can be done, here's how: Delicatessen bought alioli, gazpacho, bread, chorizo, Iberian ham, canned anchovies, olives and Manchego cheese can be served with wine while the following are cooking:

- Spanish omelette (tortilla Española)
- 500 grams potatoes, peeled and cubed 1 whole onion, peeled and sliced
- 6 eggs, beaten
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- salt and black pepper, ground
- 1. Microwave potatoes for 12 minutes until soft. Roast at 200 Celsius fan oven (220 Celsius non-fan oven) for 30 minutes with 1/2 the olive oil until golden. Allow to cool.

### Spanish tapas

- 2. Fry onions in pan with rest of oil until golden, then add eggs and seasoning.
- 3. Keep flipping omelette until cooked through, then serve in slices.

This next recipe also needs potatoes, so they can be cooked at the same time.

- Spicy potatoes (patatas bravas) Serves 8
- 1 kg of potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 small onion, grated
- 3 whole garlic clove, peeled and crushed
- 2 tablespoons sherry
- 1 can tomatoes
- 2 teaspoons dried chilli flakes
- 1 teaspoon grated orange zest
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 tablespoon fresh parsley chopped
- 1 whole bay leaf
- 1. Peel and microwave potatoes for 12 minutes.

2. Then roast in the oven using same settings as for the tortilla, with ½ the olive oil. Place to one side

SPICY: **Patatas** bravas.

- 3. Use the rest of the oil to gently fry the onion and garlic until transparent.
- 4. Add the remaining ingredients and bring to simmer.
  - 5. Remove bay leaf and blend.
- 6. Pour over potatoes and serve.
- Garlic Chicken (pollo al ajillo) Serves 8

black peppercorns ground, to taste

- 2 tablespoons paprika
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1.5 Kg chicken breast, no skin, no bone and cubed
- 100 ml olive oil
- 10 garlic cloves, peeled and sliced
- 2 bay leaves
- 2 cups sherry
- 1. Put salt, pepper, paprika and flour in a large plastic bag, add chicken and shake until coated, place in fridge for 30

Add oil to pan, fry chicken until browned, add garlic, fry for 2 minutes, add bay leaves and sherry, put in oven proof lidded dish and place in 200 Celsius fan-oven (220 Celsius non-fan oven) and cook for 20

minutes, then serve.

### Look across the water for property

ON the doorstep of Europe, only 14km across the Strait of Gibraltar from Spain, Morocco attracts the highest number of international tourists of any African nation.

The city is modernising at pace and flights from Britain to the bohemian city of Marrakesh are full again (there are 93 flights a week, up from 52 in 2012).

Shiny shopping malls are emerging, roads have been refurbished, and the fringes of the charmingly chaotic souk are beginning to be gentrified with boutiques.

International tourism to Morocco rose 10 per cent year on year in 2017 to €12.9 million, and the country gets the most foreign direct investment in Africa.

Hotels expanding their influence in Morocco include the Four Seasons, Fairmont, the Hilton, the Marriott, and Banyan Tree.

The first Oberoi hotel is arriving in Marrakesh this year, and an 80-room Ritz-Carlton will be opening its doors in the city in 2019.

The city also houses 13 of Morocco's 44 golf courses and is pitching itself as an affordable golfing alternative to Spain and Portugal.

For those who want to be in the heart of ancient Marrakesh, it is a good time to buy a riad property.

There was a fire-sale of properties after the global downturn, as many French owners sold up, so it is a buy-

Vukile entered the Spanish retail property market in July 2017 when it acquired 11 Spanish retail parks for €193 million via Castellana.

It then went on to purchase another two retail parks in December last year for €70 million.

Laurence Rapp, the Chief Executive of Vukile, said "We entered the Spanish market less than a year ago and have made swift progress in growing an investment of scale and

### Caring for the lemon tree for its fragrant scent

**GRAEME TYRRELL** 

ONE of the greatest assets to any garden in the Mediterranean is the lemon tree.

The climate allows them to flourish with little care. They are emblematic of the Mediterranean garden, as traditionally, most gardens would have a lemon tree. The secret to their success is: if you care for the soil around them they will thrive with minimal watering.

I love to walk around the garden just to smell the lemon and other citrus blossoms of mid-spring. My two lemon trees still have an abundance of lemons in spring, even though we pick them regularly and have given so many away to visitors, but they are also in full flower making it a pleasure to spend time seeking out the best lemons still

One lemon tree is next to a window of the house so opening the windows allows the natural perfume to permeate the house. The other larger one is by the vegetable garden as a feature with the fruit ripening on the tree for more than six months. making them easy to pick

The strong evergreen leaves add an intensity of lush greenery to a garden area that contrasts wonderfully with the

They can even be grown in pots and containers on balconies and terraces with a good potting mix, frequent pruning and regular watering. Dwarf varieties are available that help to grow them when space is limited. The lemon tree needs regular soil moisture to thrive so to minimise the need for watering, good soil preparation is necessary.

Existing trees which need a lot of watering can have the amount required greatly reduced by applying a generous layer of mulch on the soil under the tree from the trunk to the outer extremes

of the leaf canopy.

A good compost and straw mixture works wonders as it provides nutrients and bulk.

Some compost which provides nitrogen will greatly assist to keep the tree bright green and flourishing, although in containers it should be used sparingly but regularly to not gain too much

If planting a new tree in a garden make sure that a lot of compost is added to the soil and mixed into the existing soil before planting. The area prepared with compost can be as large as two metres in diameter to allow for the tree's

A large prepared area will allow the roots to spread out faster into the soil

The roots of a new tree that has been grown in a pot should be spread out so they are not tangled before plant-

Give them a good watering after planting and apply an organic mulch to at least a metre

out from the new tree to conserve water and maintain soil temperatures cooler in summer and warmer in winter.



Pricing details are yet to be confirmed, but expect it to cost in the region of €40,000.
