## Benidorm death probe

## Family blow as judge rules out meeting

A SPANISH judge probing the case of Kirsty Maxwell, the Scottish woman who plummeted from a hotel balcony while holidaying on the Costa Blanca, has refused to meet with her family.

It comes as her grieving relatives and ex-police officer. David Swindle, a private detective working on their behalf, asked for a meeting with Ana Isabel Garcia-Galbis.

But the official said she would be unable to comply with their request in order to remain impartial.

The 27-year-old newlywed from Livingston, who was in Benidorm for a hen-do, tragically fell from the 10th floor of the Apartmentos Payma complex in Benidorm last April.

It is believed the bank worker plunged from a room on the floor above her own which was occupied by five British

bodybuilders from Nottingham, who remain under investigation.

A written statement from the judge said: "It is not appropriate for investigation of the facts and the impartiality of the investigating judge to hold a private meeting with one of the parties [involved in the case] and their investigators."

She continued that the family should "provide any evidence or information they deem appropriate to clarify the facts "

Spanish detectives have so far been unable to track down any witnesses and are said to be working on the assumption that Kirsty slipped and fell, with a lack of new clues meaning the case could soon be closed.

The five suspects were quizzed by Spanish investigators before returning to the UK, while her clothes were controversially destroyed without proper DNA testing.

Her family are convinced her death was not an accident, and in March Scottish National Party MP Hannah Bardell raised the case in the House of Commons.

And at the beginning of

April it emerged that Kirsty may have been mistaken for another woman who has not yet been traced

A website (www.kirsty maxwell.com) with messages from her family and details about the case was launched to mark a year passingsince she died, after her friends visited Benidorm in a new appeal for witnesses.

#### **Prison staff** demonstrate

RIOT police were called out to the Villena prison in Alicante Province after workers at the facility cut access to it during a protest. Unions called the demonstration to rally against what they claimed was a lack of staff at the site, as well as low pay and inmates attacking.

#### Crash injury

A WOMAN who was reportedly hit by a car in Benidorm has been taken to Marina Baixa Hospital in Villajoyosa. The 22-year-old arrived there with multiple trauma from the crash on the CV-70 road in the city which took place at around 9.30am on Monday, according to emergency services.

#### **School claims**

STUDENTS at a school in Villajoyosa took to social media to complain about a Religious Education teacher who allegedly told a class homosexuality was 'unnatural.' Education authorities said they would investigate if comments broke Article 510 of the Penal Code, punishable by up to four years in prison.

#### Murder trial

A DEFENDANT up in court on charges of allegedly murdering and decapitating one of his mother's ex-partners in Alicante is set to hear the jury's verdict next week. Three other people also stand accused of attempting to cover up the killing of the 47year-old Bulgarian man in April

#### **Tourist stats**

THE number of holidaymakers staying in Benidorm rose by around 2 per cent during the first three months of this year, according to authorities. Tourist spending grew by around 0.3 per cent, with statistics also showing a night's stay in the city cost around €7 less than the national average of €47.40.

#### Man held

A 29-YEAR-OLD man who allegedly attempted to kill his partner while holding her in the cellar of his home in Alicante City has been arrested by National Police. Officers were called to the house on Avenida Alfonso X el Sabio, with the woman taken to the city's General Hospital with wounds to her arm.

## A quiet night inn

BENIDORM now has around 1,000 hotel rooms designated as 'adult-only,' about 5 per cent of the total number of spots in the city according to data from one such venue.

Don Pancho, a recently renovated hotel in the city, said it had stopped selling rooms to under 14's and stag and hen parties to offer tourists 'tranquillity' while on holiday.

Director of the hotel Juan Jose Gil said the decision was in response to demand from its customers.

'We aim to create an island of peace in the heart of Benidorm without children or groups that alter the atmosphere that most of our clients want," he said.

## Brit held

FOUR people, including one from Britain, have been arrested by the National Police in connection with cocaine seized from a bar in Benidorm.

Officers raided the venue while employees and customers were inside last Friday. They then searched it and police said they found 64 doses of cocaine made ready for sale, 400 erectile dysfunction pills, mobile phones and around €6,000 in cash.

The three men and one woman arrested were aged between 32 and 51 years old and came from Britain, the Czech Republic, the Netherlands and

## Heir's the story

IT was a groundbreaking and modern Royal Wedding with nods to the new Duchess of Sussex' mixed race heritage.

But while much has been made of American actress Meghan Markle tying the knot with Prince Harry, the ancestry of his own forefathers is itself far from quintessentially British.

And perhaps the most surprising example has its roots in southern Spain.

Abu al-Qasim Muhammad ibn Abbad was the first independent Muslim ruler of Sevilla in the Al-Andalus region - which covered most of the Iberian Peninsula - until his death in 1042.

The bloodline of Zaida, a princess often said to be his grandson's daughter but most

likely an outsider who gained access to the family's inner circle by marriage, reached England after she later became engaged to Alfonso VI, king of Leon-Castile.

Their descendant Isabel Perez of Castile was in the 14th century sent to Britain to marry Edmund Duke of York. son of King Edward III

And their grandson, Richard Duke of York, led the rebellion against King Henry VI which became the War of the Roses, before his second son Edward ascended to the throne in 1461.

The lineage has recently created UK tabloid headlines backed by respected sources, including Burke's Peerage, which suggest that current monarch Queen Elizabeth II is related to the Prophet Muhammad himself, and by extension other figures the supreme leader of Iran, Ayatollah

But historians now argue that this is not the case given unanswered questions surrounding Zaida's origins and even her name, which is now thought to have come from the Arabic sayyida, the title by

## 'Waste of time and money'

## Poison prison sentence

A FORMER Guardia Civil officer found guilty of attempting to murder three people by poisoning them has been handed a 22-year prison sentence by a Valencia court.

The court heard Francisco GJ, from Villajoyosa, had targeted a woman he was 'obsessed' with, her husband and the man's three-year-old son.

The defendant broke into their home several times from the beginning of 2016 and put chemicals in their meals. He also left behind underwear, a sex toy and intimate pictures of the

He poured insecticide and pesticide into cooked rice the family was about to eat on one occasion in June 2016. Prosecutors said he did so with the intention of killing them.

Investigators probing the man said they also found a letter in which he wrote about his feelings towards the woman.

"Envy corrodes me and it drowns me, if I do not do it, I think I'll burst," the letter said.

### 'Influencers' sought out

BENIDORM'S tourism board has hired 37 social media 'influencers' to help boost the city's appeal to a wider spectrum of holidaymakers.

Visit Benidorm reportedly spent more than €38,000 on the advertising campaign, which saw social media users post almost 900 Benidorm-themed statuses which resulted in around 3.9 million follow-up visits.

Leire Bilbao, a manager at Visit Benidorm, said such online drives allowed tourism promoters to reach specific groups of people.

He added they needed to complement traditional advertising campaigns in order to deliver.

## Expat fugitive held

Alleged fraudster tracked down

A BRITISH mum-of-three suspected of conning holidaymakers by advertising fake holiday rentals on the Costa del Sol has been held in northern Spain.

Paula Louise Neale, 44, who bragged of being a Bollywood actress in an online reality show, allegedly made thousands of Euros from the scam.

She is believed to have placed the bogus lets on Facebook under a series of aliases before taking money from her victims via Paypal.

The London-born expatriate vanished from her home in Calahonda near Marbella last

At the time of her arrest in Burgos she was getting into a hire car reported missing from Malaga which was carrying stolen French licence plates, before falsely identifying herself using a fake British pass-

Investigators launched a covert surveillance operation after spotting that a rental firm sticker did not match the vehicle's brand

The original number plates were found in the boot, police said in a statement.

She is thought to have fled to Cataluña and France where she claimed to be a hairdresser and offered 'blow dries and eyebrow tidying.

Neale has reportedly been bailed on account of her young children in the wake of an initial court hearing.

The Guardia Civil said it had "arrested a 44-year-old British national in Spain whose initials are PLN as part of Operation Neale."

### Elderly beach death

A 78-YEAR-OLD has died on a beach in Benidorm after suffering what is believed to have been a heart attack.

The man, from Zaragoza, was pulled from the sea after onlookers reportedly saw him in the water appearing to be drowning shortly before 12.45pm last Monday.

Emergency services said their personnel were called to treat the 78-vear-old but attempts to revive him on the shore were unsuccessful.

"There was no response and the man died on the beach." medics said.

### Breaking Bad group broken up

MONTHS of investigations led the Guardia Civil to the Marina Alta and Spain's biggest synthetic drugs' fac-

Four Spanish men and two Belgians have now been arrested following a swoop on Lliber and Teulada, Moraira and Benissa proper-

The Guardia Civil seized 432 kilos of Ecstasy, 337 kilos of amphetamines and 527 of PMK, a principal in-

gredient of Ecstasy. They found 1.7 tons of other precursors and 5.2 tons of substances used for crystal meth.

The laboratory produced a daily five kilos - an annual 1.8 tons - of crystal meth and the total haul was worth more than €100 million. Guardia Civil sources said.

The operation was triggered during an investigation into a Levante-based drugs network that distributed drugs, principally heroin, throughout Spain.

Investigators discovered that a member of this group contacted a potential supplier of crystal meth that would enable them to widen their offer. The deal was never made but it led the Guardia Civil to the Marina Alta where, after months of surveillance, they located the laboratory and distribution centres in Lliber, Teulada

Described by the Guardia Civil as a garage-bunker, this was a few metres from the isolated home of one of the principal members of the group and was accessed via a door disguised as shelving in a tool shed.

Owing to the dangerous and unstable substances stored in the laboratory, this had to be dismantled by experts from the Drugs Unit attached to the EUROPOL law enforcement agency.

## Painkiller could he a killer

AS reported recently in the Euro Weekly News a Spanish translator found that many Britons react unfavourably to

Last December Cristina Garcia del Campo was alarmed to meet so many people suffering from the generalised and sometimes fatal infection known as sepsis.

"It wasn't normal," said Del Campo who has lived and worked in Javea for 15 years, often translating for Marina Alta residents attending local health centres and hospitals.

She began to suspect that British and Scandinavian patients reacted adversely to some medication and discovered that the commonly prescribed painkiller metamizole - Nolotil, Algi-Mabo and Metalgial - is banned in the

The translator passed on her suspicions about their serious side effects on Britons and Northern Europeans to Denia hospital as well as the Ministry of Health's pharmaceuticals watch section, Farmacovigilancia.

Denia hospital is now analysing 100,000 cases where metamizole has been prescribed in the past five years, Del

She has also written to Spain's 53 Colleges of Pharmacists and contacted other Spanish hospitals regarding metamizole.

"In the Hospital Costa del Sol in Marbella they told me they have detected the first cases and notified Farmacovigiliancia. I believe all doctors, pharmacists and dentists should know what's happening," Del Campo de-

## ISIN – the 12 digits that could make or break your retirement plans...

As part of my current series of articles on portfolio management I wanted to offer my readers a window into one of the first things I do when a client asks me to review their existing portfolio.

An ISIN (International Securities Identification Number) is a code consisting of 12 numbers and letters, that identifies each individual investment you hold in your portfolio. When you receive a valuation, these codes should be clearly visible.

This combination of characters can tell me pretty much everything I need to know about your current financial advisor. Are they competent, are they working for your benefit or their own? Are you in expertly run, robust funds with long track records or simply a fund that has paid your financial advisor to recommend it?

It's relatively simple to check

an ISIN for yourself, but that doesn't mean you'll have the experience or knowledge to know exactly what to look for. Here's something you can do at home – simply pick one of the ISINs below and copy it into google and look for the result from

'www.trustnet.com' – these will be on the first 1 or 2 pages (the 00 are zeros):

GB00B41YBW71 GB00B86NX655 GB00BLDYK618 GB00B83RDY83

The above are simply examples of some of the funds our clients hold and are not to be seen as a recommendation to invest.

Once you're in Trustnet, I'd advise you click on the 'PDF Factsheet' tab. This will give you a simple overview of the

fund where you can see information about its performance, the annual cost, any entry fees etc. If you have your own portfolio, you can check your own ISINs this way. Analysing funds isn't simple, but what you can do with an ISIN is at least get some initial information. Things to look out for:

- Does the ISIN start with GB? If it doesn't, this means your fund is an 'offshore' fund which means it isn't under the regulation of the FCA, and also has the potential to contain hidden charges, unnecessary entry fees etc.
- Is the annual charge more than 1% or is there an entry charge? It's very unusual for high quality funds to charge more than 1%, many charge substantially less. An entry charge is almost unheard of. Be aware if you're paying high annual fees or an entry charge

on a fund. It's highly likely this overcharging is funding hidden payments to your advisor.

• Is the fund performing well against the benchmarks shown on the chart? If your advisor has specifically chosen that fund to benefit you, you'd expect it to be outperforming the benchmarks.

There's so much more to analysing funds than the simple steps above, but what they can do is help you identify if there's any potential concerns, so you can have them looked at by an expert. Despite it being a regulatory requirement, many advisors in Spain fail to provide a fact-sheet for each and every investment fund you have in your portfolio. This should clearly show fees, risk level, investment approach, and how the fund is regulated. If you don't have these documents, it is a genuine cause for concern.

## Prank sparks blaze

### 'Drunk' Brits held over €200,000 hotel fire

by Matt Ford

FOUR 'drunk' British holidaymakers have been held in connection with a major hotel fire in Magaluf.

The dramatic incident saw tourists running for their lives after flames ripped through two rooms at the BH Mallorca hotel.

Seven people trapped on balconies were rescued by fire- fighters using ladders as thick black smoke billowed from the building.

In video footage others can be heard screaming "Get out" as glass breaks in the back-

Investigators believe the revellers sparked the blaze after a prank with an aerosol and a lighter, with more than €200,000-worth of damages estimated to have been caused after more than 100 guests were evacuated from two floors.

Initial reports suggest that five unnamed individuals, two women and three men were in the room, and four of them were trying to play a practical joke on the other who had fallen asleep on the bed, but only succeeded in setting fire to the mattress.

No-one was seriously injured but several people, including three police officers, were treated for smoke inhalation

Detectives continue to probe the circumstances surrounding the fire, which was extinguished after an hour, a

It remains unclear whether the unnamed suspects - believed to be aged around 20 have been remanded in custody or appeared in front of a judge and released on bail.

British guest Hazel Bromley, from Chorley in Lancashire, tweeted: 'Literally in shock that this happened at our hotel # bhmallorca.'

The building on Avenida de las Palmeras is owned by Grupo Cursach, of which the owner and nightlife kingpin Tolo Cursach is currently being investigated for alleged bribery, extortion, threats, tax fraud, money laundering, homicide, and possession of illegal weapons, among other charges.

The hotel is popular with young sunseekers and made headlines in 2016 when a video clip of three Britons being beaten by security guards emerged online.

SPAIN's Interior Minister has announced a ramping up of security in the country's holiday hotspots in response to a Europol recommendation.

Juan Ignacio Zoido said there would be more officers on duty this year but did not give specifics to avoid 'giving clues to criminals,' during a press conference discussing this vear's tourism security plan.

More police will be on the streets from July 1 to August 31 in locations popular with holidaymakers including Murcia, Andalucia, Madrid, Valencia, Asturias, Cantabria, Galicia and Cataluña.

And extra numbers will be employed until the end of September in the Balearic Islands because revellers flock there until later

The interior minister said 82 million foreigners visited Spain last year, making it the second most popular international destination after France.

And he highlighted their con-

"Tourism provides work for 16.5 per cent of the nation's workers and either directly or indirectly, makes up 16 per cent of national income," he confirmed.

In addition to making visitors 'feel' safer, the plan will

strengthen controls throughout Spain's roads, ports and airports, and public gatherings including shows and festivals.

The measures also fit within the anti-terrorism framework. The attack alert level is still high after last summer's Las Ramblas attack which left 13 dead in Barcelona.

THAT Denia's port is too shallow for oceangoing ships could be a blessing in disguise.



Dad-of-two Michael Taylor, 28, was last year approached by a group of African women before being stabbed in the leg and knocked unconscious.

He woke up in hospital with eight stitches to find that his mobile phone and €200 in cash were missing.

He said at the time: "Ten African women came out from behind some trees

"They were trying to get me to pay for sex.

"When I refused one of them stuck a knife in my thigh. They were stronger than men and remorseless. It was terrifying."

A volunteer from charity Street Angels, a Christian organisation set up to help people in trouble on nights out, three years ago told told the Belfast Telegraph: "There are a lot of muggings that go on in Magaluf, but it's usually African women who prey on drunk

"There can be quite a lot of them and they just loiter around waiting for boys on their own and then they link arms with them and pretend they are helping them back to their hotel or whatever before mugging them."



#### **OUESTION:** Dear lawver

We have been given a dog. We live in a house that is not fenced. We would like to know if we would have any liability in the event that our dog ran away from our property and causes an accident of any kind?

ANSWER:

Thank you for your inquiry.

The answer to your question

You as owner of the dog (or any other animal) are responsible for all kinds of damage that your animal causes.

The liability of animal owners for all damages caused by them, is expressly regulated in the Spanish civil code (Cc), in its article 1905, which reads:

The possessor of an animal, or the one who uses it, is liable for the damages it causes, even if it escapes or gets lost. This liability will cease only in the event that the damage arises from a force maieure situation or from the fault of the person who suf-

This type of responsibility is included in the chapter of the civil code concerning the obligations arising from negligence, although the liability in these cases, does not require proof of the negligence of the animal owner.

fered it.

It is understood that a diligent animal owner can try to avoid the chance of the animal causing any damage, either because it was in a secure place (fenced), was on a muzzle when it goes out for a walk, etc.

Whenever an animal causes damage however, its owner will be liable, even if he has not been negligent.

There are many cases in which dogs and other pet owners can be held responsible for damages caused by their animals, such as:

Accidents caused on roads.

Legal liability for

dog owners in Spain

What happens in case of a bite or a road accident?

Damage caused by animals to other people's property or assets.

Bites to other animals. Bites to people.

According to the article 1905, there are several elements of the liability of the owners of the animals, which must be taken into account:

- That they will be responsible even when their dog or animal has been lost or run away, that is, if a dog is lost and bites someone, even if the owner cannot prevent it, he will be responsi-
- In addition, the owner of the animal will always be responsible, except in two specific case exceptions:
- In cases of force majeure, which is defined as an unpredictable extraordinary event, and which it would not have been

possible to avoid even applying the greatest diligence. But the truth is that it is very difficult to plead cases of force majeure, in attacks or damage caused by an-

• The other exception is when the act was caused by the fault of the person who suffered the damages. This exception is more usual, for example, when someone approaches a place where there is a sign stating dangerous dog, but for example, they touch the dog through the fence and

## Leaders' jobs row Madrid to continue direct rule

CATALUÑA'S new president has written to the government in Madrid asking them to clarify a decision to block the appointment of proindependence politicians to his administration.

The government said Quim Torra's cabinet nominations, which included two officials who are currently in custody awaiting trial for their part in last year's independence push, were a 'provocation.'

Jordi Turull and Josep Rull were remanded in custody earlier this year. The appointments of Toni Comin and Lluis Puig, who remain abroad and wanted by Spanish authorities for their part in Cataluña's bid for secession last vear, was also blocked.

Torra said he had the authority to appoint officials to his cabinet and government and that he hoped the government would recognise that. He has reportedly asked Spanish prime minister, Mariano Rajoy for dialogue on the is-

Rajoy said he hoped Catalan authorities would form a government that would obey the law. He added he wanted its officials to help return the region to normality after it was

Spain's government has blocked the publication of the appointments in the Official Gazette of the local government of Cataluña. The appointments must be published in the Gazette to become official.

The government said another decree, which was signed by Torra and outlined areas of responsibility for his new government, did not raise 'viability problems' and that it has been

Madrid added it would continue to

maintain Article 155 in the region, the legal mechanism used to run the region from the Spanish capital.

The governing conservative Partido Popular (PP) has been backed by the two opposition unionist parties the left leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE) and the centrist Ciudadanos in the move.

Separately, Torra and Catalan parliament leader, Roger Torrent visited pro-independence politicians currently being held in Estremera prison in Madrid on Monday and those in Soto de Real on Tuesday.

### PP corruption probe goes on

EDUARDO ZAPLANA, the former President of the Generalitat of Valencia. Spanish Labour Minister and mayor of Benidorm, has been held by the Guardia Civil.

Officers arrested the exconservative Partido Popular politician at his home on Carrer de Pascual i Genis in Valencia City.

He was detained on bribery and money laundering charges, according to sources close to the probe reported.

Police seized several documents connected with Zaplana's time as Valencia President between 1995 and 2002 from his home, and investigators also took similar paperwork from Valencia's Economy Ministry. Five further arrests were also made.

Linares was assigned the task of attaching informative stickers informing users in two languages that these buovs. which can be used by boats up to 12





# A family life dedicated to restoring value in La Marina's traditional gastronomy

FROM their first family restaurant, Casa Federico, in 1980, the Cervera family have led the gastronomic field in La Marina. They now have eight highly successful traditional restaurants in Denia including a unique gastronomic show house located in central Denia (El Condado).



## Child porn sting

AN international child pornography ring which shared content on a secret chatroom has been shut down and 17 have been arrested across Spain.

Police detected content of an extreme sexual nature, including bestiality and zoophilia. alongside almost 20,000 child pornography

The abusive material was exchanged over an anonymous and encrypted chatroom which often made use of the so-called 'deep web.'

Users were only able to access the groups if invited and as soon as the chat was closed, the images would vanish, police said.

National Police led the two-year long operation which ended with the arrests of 17 people Zamora, Caceres, Pontevedra, Barcelona, Vizcava, Sevilla, Jaen, Lugo, Alicante, Madrid, La Rioja and Palma de Mallorca.

Officers' close cooperation with international internet services providers and police from several countries was said to be vital to the investigation's success.





## Blaze closes motorway

A FIREFIGHTER suffered minor burns while extinguishing a fire in Catral, near the AP-7 toll road.

The fire began for still unknown reasons in a palm grove between Calle El Molina and Calle Cruz and the column of smoke was visible from kilometres away.

With the flames rising to a great height and smoke impairing visibility, the Guardia Civil closed the AP-7 to traffic as the fire approached, with kilometre-long tailbacks building up as drivers already on the motorway were obliged to stop.

Fire engines from Crevillent, Elche and Almoradi fought the blaze for almost two hours, assisted by a firefighting helicopter. One of the firemen had to be attended by doctors for burns to his face, but the provincial Fire Brigades Consortium later confirmed that he had suffered only minor injuries.

ALCOY City Hall is now responsible for supplying the vulture colony in Sierra Mariola with food.



# Generosity not forgotten

Two Norwegian residents unveiled a commemorative plaque paid for by an anonymous donor and Vilamuseu's director Antonio Espinosa showed those present the hospital's last cheque for 15,000 pesetas which was never cashed.





# First drivers cross Crimea strait bridge

■ PRESIDENT Vladimir Putin inaugurated a new bridge linking Russia with the annexed Crimean peninsula by driving a truck across it. Motorists including pro-Kremlin biker gangs also took to the 19-kilometre-long Kerch Strait Bridge, with around 21,000 drivers reportedly crossing it on its first day in use. The United States and Ukraine condemned the opening.

### New raft of sanctions

■ UNITED STATES President Donald Trump has instructed the State Department to draw up new sanctions on Russian officials over alleged arms control violations. The measures come as US lawmakers passed a bill last year accusing Moscow of fielding missiles banned by the 1987 Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty. Russia denied the claims.

RUSSIA'S Foreign Minister has said his country is concerned about clashes between Palestinian protestors and Israeli security forces on the Gaza border. Sergei Lavrov added Moscow was opposed to 'extremists' using civilians to front demonstrations which escalated following the opening of the United States' embassy in Jerusalem, according to Russian media

## **Bowing out**

A UKRANIAN official said military-trained dolphins captured by Russia during its invasion of the Crimean peninsula died 'patriotically' while in captivity. Russia Duma deputy Dmitry Belik later claimed all the dolphins captured during military operation either died naturally or were sold on to businesses.
















# Spanish exports plummet

THE export of Spanish goods to the UK has ground to a halt after five consecutive years of growth.

A report by the Bank of Spain claims that sales plummeted by 6 per cent last year, with uncertainty over Brexit blamed as the value of the pound plunged.

And exports to the European Union rose by 8 per cent during the same period, suggesting that the UK's looming withdrawal from the bloc is negatively affecting Spain's foreign trade.

Data from the Office of the State

Secretary of Commerce shows that 7 per cent of all Spanish exporting companies trade with the UK, and their growth dropped by 0.8 per cent

"This drop has been higher than what we have seen for other destinations," the bank's study said.

But while 85 per cent of firms doing business in Britain are classed as small-to-medium-sized, the vast majority of sales are made by large companies which are "on average bigger, more productive and more geographi-

cally diversified than those which export to the main countries within the monetary union," therefore limiting the potential Brexit effect.

The UK is Spain's fifth-biggest trading partner, accounting for 7 per cent of all exports and 4 per cent of

But while Britain's gross domestic product increased by 0.6 per cent last year, the European Commission has forecast that growth will slow down due to low rates of savings and salaries remaining below the inflation

# Repsol pledge to walk on sunshine

SPANISH oil firm Repsol is refocusing its strategy towards renewable energies.

President Antonio Brufau announced during a general meeting of shareholders that the multinational is ready to join the fight against climate change.

"The group is analysing alternatives to fight the increase in global temperature, betting on an effective strategy with the lowest possible cost for citizens," the company said in a statement.

Other energy providers to recently express similar commitments include Shell, Total and Eni.

# WINE MAKERS STRIVE TO POP CORK ON CAVA SALES

PRODUCERS of cava, Spain's sparkling wine, are planning to boost its image to improve disappointing sales.

"The problem with cava is perception, not quality," says Josep Puig, CEO of Sumarroca winery in Cataluña, where 95 per cent of the country's fizz is made.

It comes after the UK sparkling wine market grew by 37 per cent between 2012 and 2016, but in the latter year it bought only two million cases of cava compared to seven million of Italian rival prosecco.

And a survey of Brits revealed that 64 per cent chose Champagne, 22 per cent prosecco and only 14 per cent cava when it came to quali-

Winemakers believe that the tendency for large cava houses to sell their product cheap is the issue, and some have now broken away, calling their drink 'classic penedes.'

Josep Maria Albet i Noya is among them and stopped producing cava four years ago, when he says you could pick up a bottle in the su-

permarket for less than €1.

"Cava's image doesn't allow us to earn any money. It's OK for the big producers but it's impossible for the smaller wineries to compete at such low prices," he told the BBC.

"You can't earn anything with that, when your margins are so

small you have to squeeze everybody. Your product will reflect this in low quality - I don't think that's the way forward," he added.

In April six other producers formed a second splinter group and are calling their sparkling wine cor-

Albert Puig is a cava expert from the wine-producing Penedes region near Barcelona, and he said: "If you do good things you can have the high price - but if you compete on quantity then you're lost."

Pere Bonet from Freixenet, the biggest cava house, agreed as he added: "For the brands, the low cost is dead... our objective now is to have a better image."

To do so, the company has introduced a new premium category called cava de paraje calificado, for which strict guidelines include the use of vines at least 10 years old from a specific vineyard, at least three years of ageing and restrictions on grape yields.

# TV bosses face likely legal rap amid ad claims

A SPANISH government watchdog is probing the country's two biggest television net-

The Comision Nacional de los Mercados y la Competencia (CNMC), an agency investigating unfair business practices, has revealed it has launched an enquiry into alleged anti-competitive advertising deals signed by Mediaset and Atresmedia.

Media and advertising agencies claim they were forced to invest in the pair's less popular products in order to advertise on their mainstream channels which include Telecinco, Antena 3 and La Sexta.

But such quotas and joint commercialisation of advertising packages are illegal since they restrict free competition, according to reports.

The two companies control around 83 per cent of the television advertising market in Spain, according to the latest CNMC figures.

# Politicians in the dock canda

From faking qualifications to taking backhanders, Spain's government officials have been caught up in countless political scandals in recent years. David Noon takes a look at the dishonourable deeds of the past and present that have caught politicians in their tracks

HE brown envelope is as synonymous with Spanish politicians as the beach is to the Costa del Sol.

Be it for housing projects, policy proposals or tax dodging purposes, Spain's government (local and national) just can't seem to keep itself out of trouble.

The latest scandal to rear its ugly head has seen Madrid regional premier Cristina Cifuentes dragged through the mud for faking qualifications.

Cifuentes - alongside congressman and deputy secretary of communication for the PP Pablo Casado - were disgraced after national newspaper El Diario revealed that the pair had obtained faked Masters degrees in order to progress their political careers.

The fall from grace for Cifuentes could not have been more dramatic.

A thriving politician within the PP party, Cifuentes' 30-year political career had seen her tipped as the favourite to succeed Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy when he decides to step away from the hot seat.

In the space of three decades, Cifuentes rose through the ranks from regional deputy, to government delegate, to premier of Madrid.

Now, however, Cifuentes' career will be remembered as nothing more than a scandal, and a disgrace, after she fraudulently obtained a master's degree from Madrid's King Juan Carlos University in 2012.

Clinging on to her position for weeks following the El Diario article, Cifuentes refused to budge and was left defiantly - and undignifiedly - spitting in the face of what appeared to be defeat when many were calling for her head.

Unwilling to accept she'd been caught out - like so many politicians before her - Cifuentes held onto her political seat for as long as she possibly could.

However, an old video leaked to OK Diario (heavily linked with the PP), proved to be the final straw.

In the video, dating back to 2011, Cifuentes was seen shoplifting from

her local supermarket, and that proved enough for the Madrileno to finally admit defeat.

Pocketing a jar of face cream from her local Eroski, the only thing left on Cifuentes mug at the end of this saga: egg.


But the actions of Cifuentes are not the only cause for concern.

As the saying goes 'the fish rots

from the head' and Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's silence throughout the whole scandal speaks volumes

Of course, the PP leader has faced - and continues to face - his fair share of political scandal. It remains to be seen how the country's leader will emerge from the

ongoing Gurtel



peers did not. The parade of support and acclaim from PP senior officials for Cifuentes at the party's recent convention in Sevilla - just hours before her resignation - demonstrates a new low for the country's ruling elite.

Likewise, the complicity of university professors to falsify the documents then openly lie to defend Cifuentes demonstrates that the stain of corruption runs throughout Spanish institutions - even those which

> are supposed to hold the government to account.

> > And finally, the way in which Cifuentes was disposed of wreaks of underhand tactics.

Conveniently dredging up and leaking an incriminating video from 2011, implies that Spain's political parties are sitting on all kinds of dirt, waiting to air it as a political missle when it suits their agenda to do so.

Madrid's branch of the PP is now perhaps only rivalled by its colleagues in Valencia as the most rotten and corrupt in the country.

For while Valencia continues to be hit by the kickbacks-for-contracts

Rap sheet THE list of political scandals currently making their way through the legal system is as long

Here are just some of the most compelling cases currently ongoing:

ERE

The ERE investigation has put the PSOE Junta de Andalucia under the microscope. Accused of corrupt practices and embezzlement of funds between 2001 and 2010, the accused include former Junta presidents Manuel Chaves and Jose Antonio Grinan. As many as 20 former officials including six ex-ministers are caught up in the scandal that is currently making its way through the court system.

### **Brugal**

Some 12 years after the Brugal investigation got underway and its main defendants are finally in the dock. Deliberations started in February into alleged bribes to public officials worth millions of euros over waste contracts. in Orihuela, Alicante.

Millionaire businessman Angel Fenoll is facing 37 years in prison for his role in the scandal, while former PP mayors Jose Manuel Medina and Monica Lorente are staring at 12 years jail terms if found guilty.

### Gurtel

The Gurtel case has the potential to bring the PP toppling down from the top. Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy has already appeared as a witness in the kickbacks-for-contracts case, and in doing so he became the first sitting PM to appear in Spanish court.

Centred around businessman Francisco Correa, the Gurtel case looks at alleged bribes worth € 350 million to party officials between 1999 and 2006 in exchange for public contracts. In total 37 politicians and business people face prosecution with everyone pointing the finger at someone else in a bid to drag the whole system down with them. Cursach

One of Spain's most high-profile scandals, the Cursach case saw Mallorca's nightclub owner Bartolome 'Tolo' Cursach sentenced to 33 years for 16 charges relating to bribing, threatening and coercing public officials. However, Tolo's sentencing is far from the end of this saga with a number of public

officials allegedly paid off to turn a blind eve to dubious goings-on at a number of his 30 nightclubs, including alleged illegal prostitution. A number of the public officials themselves were paid off in the form of free attendance to illegal sex parties at the nightclubs making the Cursach case one of Spain's seediest scandals.





# A right, royal, ruckus

WHILE Spain's politicians are held to account for their bent practices, the country's monarchy hasn't been behaving much better.

In a case that was anything but regal, Princess Cristina found herself in the dock on charges of tax evasion, fraud and bribery.

The King's sister was acquitted and spared an eight-year jail term, however her husband Inaki Urdangarin was given a six-vear sentence for his role in the infamous Noos scan-

The first royal to face prosecution since the monarchy was reinstated in 1975, Cristina was forced to pay €265,000 in 'civic responsibilities' for benefiting from the crimes of her husband and his associates.

The royal couple were among 18 defendants tried on a whopping 89 charges ranging from money laundering to trafficking of influences

Former Olympic handball star Urdangarin was in fact found guilty of using his position within the royal echelons to win inflated contracts to host sporting events before siphoning off the proceeds to fund a lavish lifestyle.

In total Urdangarin and his former business partner in

crime Diego Torres were found guilty of embezzling a cool €6 million in public money.

And while Cristina was acquitted her reputation has been knocked

from pillar to post. During the trial itself she responded 'I don't know' 188 times and added 'I don't remember' a further 55 times (make what you will of that).

The royal family itself was rocked during the course of the six-year investigation. The royal cause was done no favours when King Juan Carlos came up against a public backlash for partaking in an expensive hunting trip to Botswana in the middle of Spain's financial crisis.

Juan Carlos paid the price and abdicated the throne and despite being found innocent in court, Cristina has too faced the consequences of her misjudgement.

Absent during King Felipe's ascension to the throne, Cristina has subsequently been stripped off her royal duties as the new King attempts to repair the damage caused by his father and sister.

If this were Denmark, we would say there was something very rotten indeed.

at the door of Madrid's local government branch.

The most notable case of political wrongdoing in Madrid's PP branch is the Púnica case - a bid-rigging scheme that involved at least €250 million in public contracts.

That scandal led to the imprisonment of Madrid's regional premier Ignacio González and the former PP secretary general Francisco Grana-

The disgracing of Cifuentes is unfortunate but not unsurprising.

The denials and attempts to hide the mess under the carpet is in keeping with a political landscape that cheats and then buries its head in the sand when it is caught out.

The institutional acceptance and support for this form of political behaviour adds a whole new level of corruption that must be stamped

Cifuentes' demise comes at a crucial time for the PP which is emblazoned in political scandal from top to bottom and risks losing its 23year grip on the country when the regional elections get underway

Change must come from the top and if this latest scandal is not enough to change the minds and actions of Spain's politicians then lit-

Yet with each new scandal, the loss of respect for the country's policymakers will one day be too much



# **Corruption charter**

SPAIN claimed the 41st position on the latest instalment of the Corruption Perception Index (CPI).

The recognised authority on global corruption, the CPI total Spain's corruption cost to the public coffers at €203 billion.

With a score of 58 (0 being highly corruptible and 100 being squeaky clean), Spain's is tied with Brunei and Costa Rica when it comes to corruption levels.

It is in fact the worst-ever outcome for Spain who has fallen from being the 20th

most corrupt-free national to the 41st in the space of two decades.

Denmark and New Zealand both scored 90 to top the list, followed closely by Finland and Sweden, which scored 89 and 88 respectively.

At the other end of the scale Somalia claimed the unwanted title of the world's most corrupt nation for the 10th year in a row, with a score of just 10.

Meanwhile, the UK came in as the eighth least corrupt country in the world.

- 4. Secure payment methods available using only accredited or reputable online payment
- 5. Verified the properties are real and offered by the owner or authorised agent.
- **6.** An online review system that only allows real guests to post reviews.

### Red flags

You should be extra cautious booking accommodation if:

- 1. The price offer is too good to be true, or there is an urgency in booking immediately.
- 2. The website is relatively new.
- 3. The website does not have 'https' security level.
- **4.** You cannot speak to a company employee, only communicate by email.
- 5. No business address is provided.
- 6. The owner/agent wants to communicate, confirm booking and/or take payment via email instead of within the secure communication platform.
- 7. Payment requested by bank transfer or Western Union or similar.



London wouldn't come in for so much stick, eh? Wrong! Trafalgar Square's 'too noisy' and Leicester Square's 'hell on a stick. Bars rammed full of tourists and the square full of kids trying to nick

What about the prestigious British Museum? Well, for one reviewer it's 'coma inducing.' For another: 'We really tried to like the exhibits but it was just so utterly

And Scotland? Forget it! Ben Nevis is 'too steep and too high' and Loch Ness ('just a regular lake') is hardly worth the

# Is CGT plusvalia?

You wrote in the May 3-9 issue that if one is over 65 and tax resident in Spain for three years, one will not be obliged to pay Capital Gains Tax (plusvalia). This is misleading as everyone, regardless of age, must pay the municipal plusvalia tax to the town hall where your property is located. It is the main government plusvalia that one avoids after the age of 65. I am over 65 and I sold my main residence in Benalmadena last year and I was obliged to pay nearly  $\in$  10,000 to the town hall. I feel the article is confusing.

• Capital Gains Tax, charged on the profit

from the sale. This is a national Tax Agency tax.

• The 'plusvalia' is a municipal tax based on the rateable value (IBI) of the property and the time that has passed since it last changed hands.

It is indeed confusing. In your question you combine the two. Don't do that. They are similar but not the same. CGT is national and plusvalia is municipal.


THE world's smallest cellphone is barely bigger than a matchbox. It's exactly what most older folks don't need.

# A right royal treat is out there





WHETHER or not Cataluña needs independence splits the region down the middle. But, apart from secessionist politicians who forget that they were elected to run the region, Cataluña does need a government.

And to form a government it first needed a regional president and now five months after the inconclusive December elections, it's got one in the pudgily amorphous shape - he's no looker - of Ouim Torra.

It took five tries. A long-distance virtual reality investiture for noshow self-exiled former president Carles Puigdemont was reluctantly called off.

Jordi Sanchez tried twice but was another no-show too as he was still remanded for rebellion and sedition.

The secessionists fared no better with Jordi Turull who failed to get enough votes on the first round and was remanded, again for rebellion and sedition, before the second.

So Ouim Torra, former president of Omnium Cultural, is what had to be scraped from the bottom of the barrel.

# Fifth time unlucky

Virulently anti-Spanish, violently pro-independence and very much Puigdemont's man, he promised to 'construct a republic under Carles Puigdemont.

And for the 50 per cent of Catalans who do not support independence, Torra makes Article 155 and no president the better option.

### **Sticks and stones**

CATALUÑA's latest regional president, stand-in for Carles Puigdemont who continues reigning from Brussels, Berlin or wherever he happens to be at any particular moment so long as it isn't Cataluña or Spain, has apologised for all the nasty things he once said about the Spanish.

These include tweets written some years ago and now deleted which claimed that Cataluña has

been occupied by the Spanish since 1714 and that the Spanish, who know only how to plunder, are undemocratic, dirty, dishonest and

Torra's apology was expedient but redundant. The fact that he intends to restore the breakaway laws passed last September and declare the republic as soon as Puigdemont gives him the nod is tacit confirmation that he meant every word of the

# Puppet on a string

IT is no secret that Carles Puigdemont has handpicked Quim Torra to do his bidding and that the former president expects to call the shots.

Puigdemont has even asked Torra not to use his old office in Sant Jaume Palace, accentuating the temporary nature of the new president's

At least that's how Puigdemont sees it, although he should cast his mind back to January 2016.

That was when CiU, still headed by Artur Mas, failed to obtain an overall majority in the early election called in September 2015. They needed the support of the anti-system CUP party which refused to play ball unless Mas, whom they regarded as unacceptable as well as corrupt,

Mas reluctantly complied, naming Puigdemont, then mayor of Girona. as his successor. He assumed that Puigdemont would be easily influenced and that he could continue as president in all but name.

- 1. First make the Salsa Verde. Put all the ingredients into a food processor and blend until liquidised. Spoon into a bowl and set aside.
- 2. Brush the tuna steaks on both sides with a little olive oil and season. Heat a ridged cast iron griddle (or a heavy base frying pan) over a high heat. Drizzle a little oil on to it, add the tuna steaks and sear for 1-2 minutes on the first side. Turn them over and cook for a further two minutes. This will leave the middle of the steaks almost raw; cook for longer if you
- 3. Place the tuna steaks on four warmed plates and spoon some of the salsa on to each steak. Toss the salad leaves and tomatoes with a little olive oil, salt and pepper and pile them alongside the tuna.

Put all the ingredients into a food processor and blend until well mixed together. Spoon into a bowl and set aside.



McGregor's neighbours will include Danish former goalkeeper Thomas Sorensen, Spurs' up and coming midfielder Harry Winks, and Kiwi ex-golf champion Michael

Villas in the development are fully attuned to modern living, combining the latest smart technology with a lift, a wine cellar, outdoor fire pits, home spa and swimming pool.

The properties open out onto the La Resina Golf Course, which is in the heart of the Golden Triangle, between Estepona and the luxurious port of Puerto Banus.

An automation system in the house controls lighting, air conditioning and entertainment systems, and McGregor is likely to make use of the option to have a customised gym fitted.

Last month, McGregor was caught on camera throwing a trolley at a bus full of MMA fighters, smashing one of its windows and injuring one of them in the process.

# Leftist leader's €600,000 pad

THE leader of a far-left political party has come under fire after it emerged he bought a €600,000 home despite criticising other politicians for buying similarly-priced properties.

Pablo Iglesias, leader of the Podemos party and a representative for Madrid in Spain's Parliament, will move into the 250 square-metre home with his partner and colleague Irene Montero.

The couple reportedly took out a €540,000 mortgage between them. They will pay back €270,000 each over the next 30 years in around €1,600 a month

The home sits on a 2,000 square-metre plot and features a swimming pool. It is in Galapagar, a town northwest of Madrid which was reportedly chosen because it is near a school known for its alternative learning methods.

Iglesias and Montero announced they were expected twins on March 31. The couple also have three dogs and said they

wanted a family home with a garden.

The purchase has caused controversy due to Iglesias' comments criticising former economy minister Luis de Guindos for buying a €600,000 penthouse in August 2012.

Podemos sources said the cases could not be compared because Guindos bought the home as an investment.

A video from 2015 of Iglesias criticising politicians who 'isolate' themselves in their homes has also resurfaced on-

Montero wrote on Facebook that their salaries as public servants had enabled them to buy the house.

"We know that many Spanish families cannot afford a mortgage like this and that is why we understand it is so important to defend decent wages for everyone," she said.

# Capital joins backlash against tourist rentals

SPAIN'S growing list of cities that are cracking down on Air bnb-style holiday rentals can now add Madrid to the group.

New legislation in the capital wants to place strict new rules on home rentals- especially in the city's historic centre-in a bid to tackle mass tourism.

As in many parts of the country, locals in Madrid feel they are being priced out of rental accommodation due to short holiday lets that travellers are booking through websites and apps.

However, new rules could ban 95 per cent of the listings from the city, with the central government's Minister for Sustainable Urban Planning calling for a move towards 'responsible tourism.

Plans also include preserving the residential use of buildings, and changing permanent tourist lets to temporary ones.

An annual 90-day limit has been proposed for tourist flats,

with selected entire apartment blocks being prevented from being exclusively tourist orien-

In Madrid's central zone, holiday rentals on Airbnb and other websites will require a specific street entrance for tourists, and a separate one for permanent residents of the building.


A spokesman for Airbnb said in a statement:

"Home sharing on Airbnb is helping local families across Madrid afford their homes and

rising living costs, while boosting the local economy.

"It is part of the solution to local housing concerns in the city, and is helping to put tourism euros in the pockets of local families, not just wealthy hotel groups."

The plans for Madrid have come hot on the heels of Valencia's own proposed restrictions on Airbnb, while last month Palma de Mallorca also announced it would impose an outright ban on holiday rentals.



# Now is a good time to get a mortgage



NOWADAYS funding is really cheap in Spain, so borrowing money now is a very interesting proposition.

If we take into consideration that the Euribor (Euro Interbank Offered Rate) has been in negative since February 2016 this trend is likely to continue during this year.

It is possible to get an 80 per cent advance of the asking price of the property, which means that you need to have 20 per cent of the price of the property available plus the expenses generated during the purchase.

Depending on whether it is a new construction or a second-hand property and the autonomous community where the purchase is carried out, this may vary between 10 per cent and 12 per cent of the agreed price.

The client has to decide between fixed-rate mortgages or variable-rate mortgages. In Spain, 62 per cent of all mortgages are variable-rate and it depends on the needs of each client whether it would be better to opt for a fixed-rate or variable-rate

As a rule of thumb, it is generally better to take fixed-rate if the buyer needs a mortgage for the long term and variable-rate if the client needs a mortgage for just the next 10 years.

Listed below is some of the documentation required to apply for a mortgage loan in Spain:

- Personal identification (Passport and NIE).
- Proof of income (salaried worker: three last salary slips, income statement (last P60) and letter from the employer.

In the case of self-employed worker:

- Accountant's letter, income statement of self-employed workers for the past two years and annual accounts for the past two years.
  - Proof of other source of income.
  - Credit report.
  - Bank statements for the last three months.

# Cheering up your garden space with marigolds

GARDENS make a great ambience to feel relaxed.

The greenery alone is enough to put you at greater ease but there is also the scent, colours, fascinating forms and structures of flowers or the useful production of plants for the kitchen and potpourri that can be very rewarding.

It is always great to enhance the garden with at least a few special flowers that will add something more to a garden. This year I have chosen marigolds to brighten up my vegetable garden.

Some friends eagerly helped me to plant out rows of tomatoes, capsicum, various types of colourful specialty lettuce, onions interplanted to deter some pests, aubergines, beets, beans, various herbs throughout and many more vegetables.

It looked fantastic to see all the plants I had grow from

seed finally in the soil surrounded by various other plants from the local nurseries. The nice neat rows were all weed free from tilling the soil and with the unseasonal quantity of rain in the warm May weather everything is thriving.

The one thing missing was enough colour. I had planted some mystic roses to help keep the tomatoes healthier but they were not in flower yet. It needed something more.

That is when I saw the marigolds at a Sunday market stall. Perfect. I bought only half a dozen and took them home.

Next morning I took them to the vege garden and just put one in each of the centre rows. The effect was stunning as the marigold in flower contrasted so brightly with the rest of the

garden. They caught the eye even just approaching the garden. Just these few plants brought the vege garden to a new height of attraction.

They are very easy to grow and flower over most of summer. Being in the vegetable garden with its enriched soil and regular watering meant that there was little additional work to grow them. They are also attributed to be beneficial in repelling many garden pests including soil-born nematodes, slugs and some flying

range of colours from bright yellows to golden bronze and coppery colours. I chose three different shades to add variety as all are attractive. There are also a few different varieties.

The African marigold is the taller one I used in the vege garden as they will grow up tall with the tomatoes and capsicum and the flowers are generally larger and brighter whilst the French marigold is shorter and perfect for borders and containers such as window boxes. They are prolific

at flowering if given plenty of nutrients other than too much nitrogen. Nitrogen will give good growth but fewer flowers.

There is also the signet marigold that has a simpler flower and is often used in rockeries as it is very hardy. Some people use the flowers from this to add to salads and as decoration on food plates as it is edible.

What ever way you chose to grow marigolds you can be sure that they will brighten up your growing space.

# Clicker training

collar and lead, even though most pet dog owners do not have the strength and skill required for proper control.

However, there is another

form of dog training based on the system used by Karen Pryor, pioneer marine mammal trainer who developed the 'Clicker' for dolphins and whales. The training of dolphins is based on positive reinforcement - a reward for doing what is required, usually a bucket of fish.

Pryor's experiences planted seeds in the minds of many dog trainers and behaviourists. They figured out if marine mammal trainers can control 600-pound sea lions without shouting and force, then why couldn't they adopt a similar technique for dog training?

Marine mammal trainers use whistles and clickers because before they can even say the word 'Good' the mammal has disappeared under the water or jumped 30 feet into the air. As soon as a mammal reaches the highest part of a jump, it knows that unless it hears a click it will get no fish.

The mammal has learnt that if it obeys a command, it hears a click and gets a food reward. No click, no reward.

I believe the more we talk to our pets in training the less they understand. It is important to try and shorten praise words to one word like 'Good' rather than 'Now that's a clever boy'.

With a clicker, there are no words Good behaviour is rewarded with a click, then a treat. If any dog knows you have a treat it will sit. When it does so, click and treat. When

the dog is getting up, say 'Up', click and treat.

If the dog lies down, just as it does so, say 'Down', then click and treat. When the dog comes to you, then say 'Come', then click and treat.

You will be amazed at how quickly the dog will understand simple one-word commands that are followed by the click and treat. Remember the dog only gets the click after it has carried out the command.

The American behaviourists Karen Pryor and Gary Wilkes have popularised this method with dog trainers using a small box clicker as a bridge. The click is always followed by a reward. The reward can be anything the dog desires although it is usually food, a treat or toy.

The clicker is only a training tool. Once a behaviour has been thoroughly learned and randomly rewarded, the clicker is no longer required.

When you are sure the dog will do what you want, start giving the cue as the dog does it. Stop rewarding the dog if what you require is done without a cue so that it only happens when you ask for it.





BMW has revealed that its X8 SUV is likely to be its most pricey model when it is launched around 2020.

It is reportedly being designed to rival the Range Rover and upcoming Audi Q8, and when kitted out with extras could tussle with the Bentley Bentayga, Lamborghini Urus and Rolls-Royce Cullinan.

The German carmaker's head of development, Klaus Fröhlich, confirmed that the firm's most expensive model was under consideration.

"The sector is growing fast, so there will be opportunity," he said. "It is early to talk about the X8, but one of the first decisions I made when I worked on product strategy was to take the X5 and make the X6.

"Everyone said it was not necessary, but it worked. Now we have the X2, X4 and X6. They are emotional and sporty

derivatives that work for us.

"There is room for X8 - especially in markets like China - but there are no decisions yet. Each car must have a distinct character, and these are the sort of areas that take time to evaluate"

Talks are reportedly centred on whether the new model should be a coupe version of the X7, which is set to go on sale later this year, or a longwheelbase version.

It is likely to have the option of four or five seats in two rows, rather than the X7's seven seats across three configuration, with emphasis on luxurious rear-seat travel, since many owners will be chauffeur-driven.

The sales focus is likely to be China, Russia and the Middle East, meaning a V-12 engined version powered by the 592bhp, 590lb ft, 6.6-litre unit found in the 7 Series is strongly possible.





V8 with customised racing pistons, eight-port fuel injection and a high performance camshaft driven by a five-speed manual gearbox with a limited slip differential.

The builders have also added power steering and disc brakes for a more modern handling experi-

Inside, the car has period dials modified with LED lights, carbon-fibre dashboard and console finished with Nappa leather and a touchscreen satnav with Apple CarPlay.

A pair of Recaro buckets seats and a custom Mota-Lita steering wheel add a racy feel, while features from the modern Mustang range include (lazy) traction control, a line-lock burnout feature, and air conditioning.

Sutton says this car was commissioned by a private buyer last year, and each model takes around 10 months to complete with a cost from €215,000 - €340,000 depending on spec.




