Flying high

Teen qualifies as pilot

A TEENAGER from Malaga has gained a licence to fly light aircraft shortly before turning 18.

Expatriate Edouard de Hennin, who arrived in Spain aged two after his family moved from Belgium, successfully completed his pilot training at Axarquia's Real Aeroclub de Malaga late last month.

He told Spanish media he had decided he wanted to train to become a pilot after first taking off from the airfield for a one-off flight shortly after turning 16.

"What I felt during that flight was very particular, it marked me. Now I can see that flying is the perfect definition of freedom, it is impressive," he said.

Hennin had to pass exams on navigation, meteorology, communication,

and other subjects before he earned his wings. He also had to complete some 45 hours of flight time and

spent a total of 53 hours airborne.

Hennin has recently been accepted into the Europe Flight Training School in Jerez and he is also due to go to Ireland to study aeronautical engineering.

Oldest nun dies

THE oldest nun in Spain, who witnessed the start of the Spanish Civil War and lived in Japan during the Second World War, has died shortly before her 111st birthday.

Victoria de la Cruz Garcia, from Malaga, died of a cardiac arrest in the early hours of last Monday. She was born in 1907 on Calle de Don Juan Diaz in Malaga and grew up in the city, according to local church authorities. She became a nun as a young woman.

Cruz Garcia travelled to Japan shortly after the Spanish Civil War broke out in 1936 and lived there for several years.

She arrived in the country by boat after travelling for around two months. Cruz Garcia travelled with a community of nuns from Tokyo to the mountainous Karuizawa area after the Second World War began in 1939.

Jose Maria de la Cruz, one of the nun's nephews, said he had seen photographs of her and other members of her convent with snow 'up to their knees' whilst there.

Victoria de la Cruz Garcia and other nuns in the convent worked with women and helped to start schools. She died in Kitami in the Japanese capital at the religious residential home where she lived.

Ruff justice

A DOG must spend six months per year with each of her two owners following a court ruling.

The joint custody case is the first of its kind in Malaga Province and the fourth ever in Spain.

The court ruled Tara, a Pomeranian cross, will split her time between Madrid and Antequera - an hour inland from Malaga -

after the couple who had owned her for a decade went their separate ways.

It comes after the plaintiff left his former partner four years ago, leaving her to care for Tara alone after he returned to his hometown of the Spanish capital.

He later claimed that he was her sole owner, triggering the court case.

Cash seized

GUARDIA CIVIL officers have seized two suitcases filled with a total of around €705,000 in cash due to leave Malaga airport for Turkey.

Police found the bags as they were going through luggage x-ray systems, according to a statement from authorities.

The Guardia Civil have since identified a German national as the suspected owner of the cases. Officers are currently probing whether the passenger will have to answer to charges of breaking money laundering laws due to the German national allegedly not declaring the cash.

A BRITISH gangster who went on the run through Spain has taunted investigators by shooting a video guide showing how to flee the country.

Convicted drug dealer Sam Walker, 35, who has racked up more than 100 crimes, is wanted after skipping a court appearance for driving without a licence.

His rap list includes jail terms for offences ranging from possession of counterfeit cash to threatening police officers, while he once hit the headlines over alleged threats to Chelsea footballer Ross Barkley.

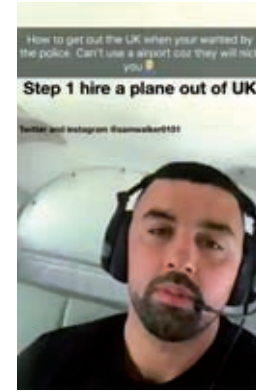
He was previously a member of a mob selling heroin and crack cocaine in his native Liverpool.

And he has now reached Sierra Leone in West Africa after clocking up more than 7,000 kilometres on his epic escape from justice.

He posted a clip shortly after arriving to capital Freetown, where he claims to have met the country's Vice President Mohammed Juldeh Jalloh, in which he said: "Better luck trying to catch me when I

go out of the country next time, Merseyside Police."

A police official later pointed out that he is in fact wanted by detectives in Cheshire.

The footage is titled 'How to get out of UK when your [sic] wanted by police. Can't use an airport coz they will nick you.'

It shows Walker flying to Belgium in a private plane before taking a 'little 14-hour boat trip' to Morocco, between which he is believed to have flown to Portugal and

hitch-hiked through southern Spain.

He then embarks on a three-day drive across the Sahara Desert, Mauritania and Senegal before taking another boat to Freetown from Guinea.

Walker claims to be in Sierra Leone, where his grandfather was born, to help distribute charity donations sent from the UK.

He insisted: "I was in a Catch-22. I had to fulfil my promise to the people in the

slums, knowing full well that when am caught I will get the maximum sentence of four months in jail plus two months for missing my court date.

"But to me the people were more important. The court date could wait. Sometimes in life you have to do the wrong thing in the eyes of the law in order to do the right thing."

He also claims to have spent thousands on installing fresh water pipes in the city's slums after seeing "men, women and children dying."

He added: "I have not just woke up and changed overnight. I am still the same person and still do what I do.

"I know when I come back to the UK I will be arrested at the airport and put straight in jail.

"I can deal with that knowing that I have fulfilled my promise to the people in the slums by giving them a container full of toys, clothes and food and given them fresh, clean water so no man, woman or child ever has to risk their lives by drinking dirty sewage water again."

Police rescue fall victim

LOCAL POLICE rescued a man who fell in his house and spent 48 hours lying semi-conscious on the floor. A resident raised the alarm with police officers who gave the victim vital medical attention saving his life after fire-fighters broke into the property to gain access to the trapped 58-year-old, emergency sources report.

Attack claims

MALAGA prosecutors are requesting a 19-year-old man be jailed for five years for allegedly attacking his mum during an argument about a mobile phone. The representative of the public ministry alleges the aggressor pushed and grabbed his mother, holding a match to her hair, causing her 'fear and distress.'

Mugging probe

THREE people have been arrested on suspicion of violently robbing an elderly woman in Torrox last month. Two of the alleged aggressors are accused of threatening the woman with a knife, before Guardia Civil officers arrived at the scene and wrote down the victim's account which was vital to identify the suspects, media reports.

Officer injured

A LOCAL POLICE officer has been injured when saving a resident suffering from Diogenes or 'squalor' syndrome in Velez-Malaga, municipal sources report. The officer inhaled smoke when rescuing the man from a fire which started in his own home at around midnight, causing some 60 people to abandon their homes.


Urgent repairs

THE vice secretary of Malaga's Popular Party, Natacha Rivas, demanded the regional government carry out 'urgent repairs' to the A-7204 motorway which links the Colemanar, Riogordo and Periana municipalities with alta (upper) Axarquia. It is one of the "most deteriorated and least conserved in the entire province," she added.

Robbers jailed

A GRANADA courtroom has jailed four perpetrators of a violent house theft in a Puerta de la Torre property in which they reportedly tied their victims' hands up and threatened to cut off their fingers if they refused to tell them where the money was kept. The gang members faked being Guardia Civil officers to access the dwelling.

Adios, PM!

SOCIALIST leader Pedro Sanchez is Spain's new Prime Minister after Mariano Rajoy was kicked out of office. It comes in the wake of a landmark no-confidence vote after Rajoy's conservative People's Party was found guilty of accepting kickbacks in exchange for lucrative public contracts. Madrid's highest criminal court convicted 29 officials over their involvement in the scandal, with former treasurer Luis Barcenas jailed for 33 years and fined €44 million. And the fallout - which saw the credibility of Rajoy's own testimony in the enquiry disputed - proved one scandal too far for the leader once dubbed the great survivor of Spanish politics. He had been in office since 2011 and weathered a string of corruption probes, but was unable to withstand political anger after opposition parties united to seal his fate. After the vote, Rajoy, 63, approached 46-year-old Sanchez in the parliamentary chamber and shook the incoming leader's hand. "It has been an honour to be the prime minister of Spain," he earlier told MPs. "It has been an honour to leave a better Spain than the one I found. I hope that my successor will be able to say the same when his time comes." See page 9.

Nose 'bitten off'

NATIONAL POLICE have arrested a street vendor on the Coast del Sol for allegedly biting off a part of another man's nose.

It is the second incident involving a part of someone's face being bitten off this year.

A 40-year-old was arrested in Velez-Malaga in January for biting off a chunk of a neighbour's ear in a Torre del Mar bar.

In the most recent event, a pair of

Senegalese street vendors were reportedly arguing when one of them bit off a chunk of his compatriot's nose.

The victim was hospitalised and needed surgery for his injury.

A call to the 091 number alerted police who went to the scene on the King of Spain's maritime promenade in Fuengirola.

They found the injured man and after several inquiries were able to track down the alleged nose-biter.

Geese robber probe

LOCAL POLICE are investigating videos and images circulating on the web showing people trying to steal geese from a lake.

The images show several youngsters entering the lake in Velez-Malaga's Maria Zambrano park trying to catch geese chicks.

The waterfowl recently hatched in the area surrounding the lake.

Workers from environmental authorities are disappointed with the incidents in which at least one

chick was stolen.

"We have given instructions for a greater police presence in the area," environmental sources said.

"There are unscrupulous people around who have nothing better to do than steal animals," they added.

The town hall has invested in several works of late in Axarquia capital's main green lung.

They include new sports facilities and a pond water filtering system, costing €200,000.

Carved in stone

A BRITISH expatriate artist has been commissioned to create a memorial to remember heroes of Spain's civil war.

At least 45 men from across the world were killed when their ship, the Ciudad de Barcelona, was torpedoed by a submarine off the Catalan coast.

They were among 300 International Brigadistas on their way to join the Republican fight against General Franco's fascist Nationalist army.

More than 120 of the soldiers were pulled from the sea by fishermen from the nearby town of Malgra de Mar, but many sank with the vessel.

Witnesses said that they sang left-wing anthem The Internationale as they went down, while at least 23 others were later killed in the war.

"It was late afternoon," Welsh survivor Alun Menai Williams, who wrote the book 'From the Rhondda to the Ebro,' told UK media. "I was leaning on the ship's rail taking in my first view of Spain and its shoreline, some one and a half miles in the distance, when there came one hell of an almighty bang. "The ship shook, tried to get airborne, before settling down at a crazy angle."

American Jack Freeman added: "It was a pretty

dirty business... some fellows were killed while they were asleep, some were trapped below decks."

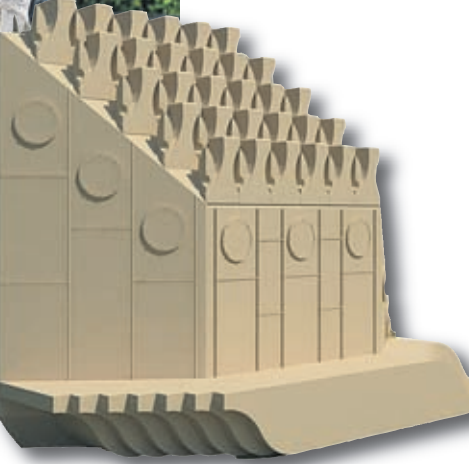
General Franco banned talk of the attack in its aftermath, but Robert Macdonald, originally from Rugby, Warwickshire, has decided to sculpt a monument in their honour.

The Barcelona-based stonemason is carving Solidarity Park from locally-sourced limestone, which when complete will include 60 half-metre tall figures representing the brigadistas set atop an abstract ship and stone map of the world.

Macdonald says the figures symbolise "the unity of the struggle of the Brigadiers, but each will have individual carved features thus expressing the diversity of us all."

He hopes the project - a collaboration with students, historians, local people and the families and friends of the fallen - will encourage people to consider the treatment of foreigners, immigrants and refugees.

More than €13,500 of the €20,000 estimated cost has already been raised by crowdfunding, with the final work to be displayed in a Malgrat de Mar park.

‘Blas’ from the past

A HISTORICAL novel which covers the maritime adventures of a legendary Spanish admiral injured in the battle of Velez-Malaga is set to hit bookstores in June.

Luis Molla's book sheds new light on the fascinating life and character of Blas de Lezo, a crippled, one-armed, one-eyed Spanish admiral who led Spain to victory in the decisive Battle of Cartagena de Indias in 1741.

The defeat of the British in present-day Colombia allegedly opened the way for Spain to colonise swathes of central and South America.

The heroic leader was injured in the Velez-Malaga naval battle in defence of the Santa Catalina Castle, in Tolon and during the siege of Barcelona in 1714.

The read allows those interested in history a peak into the life and times of one of Spain's most colourful colonial characters.

Political crisis might not yet be over for Sanchez

SPAIN has a new Prime Minister, but for Pedro Sanchez the real battle might only just be underway.

The socialist is tasked with forming a government that represents the country he now leads rather than just the party he stands for. And with 84 seats in a 350-strong parliament, the task does not appear enviable.

So who are the real victims?

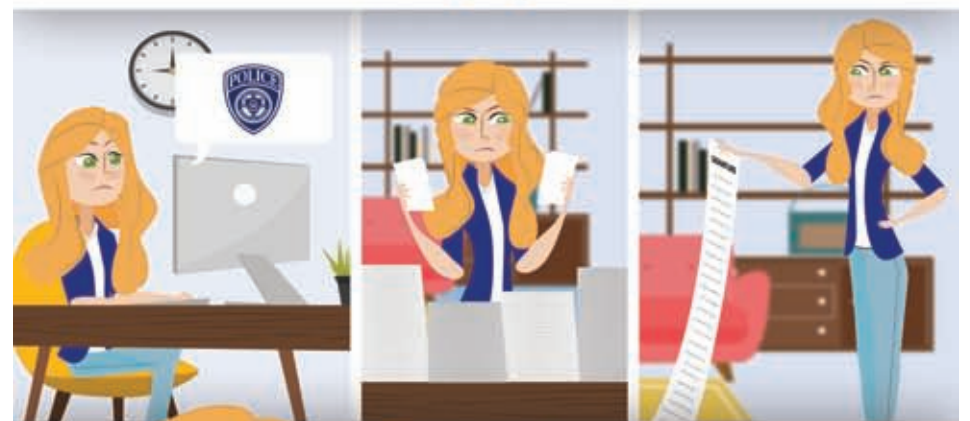

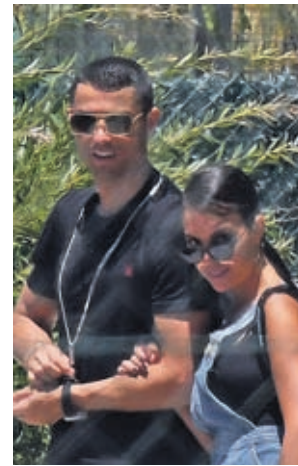


Ron the money

Taking no bull

THOUSANDS protested against celebrations involving bulls in Madrid last week after shocking footage of a suffering animal emerged online. But what do holidaymakers and residents think about Spain's controversial tradition?

Andy Maddocks, 54, from Bournemouth

"Civilised people shouldn't kill things for fun. It's just cruel, the animal suffers. It should be banned."

Shaun Cahill, 84, lives in Spain, returns to Dublin every six weeks to 'cut the lawn'

"Yes, it needs to be banned. It is a blood-thirsty sport, the Spanish people have moved on. Let's not forget the Spanish have the best football in the world to get their hit. In bull-fighting people take their anger out on nature, instead of on other humans in a competitive setting. "People need aggression. That is why we have Gaelic football in Ireland. On the whole, the Spanish are huge animal lovers. Everyone's got a dog here!"

Domingo Ramirez Mora, 62, from Malaga

"It should not be banned! Bull-fighting is an art and a national celebration. To those who think it is cruel, I would say there is a lot of cruelty in the world which goes unspoken. So why focus it all on bull-fighting? And for me, it isn't cruel anyway."

Eric and Jenny Ankers, both 67, on holiday from Cornwall with grandchildren

"It is not something I can support. What gets me is that the bull-fighters play with the animal. It's not nice. At least in the famous Pamplona bull-running festival the creatures get their own back! It is a rich man's hobby anyway, it is not cheap to keep the bulls. They are brought up on big farms with dedicated cowboy-type trainers." Wife Jenny said: "It is their heritage - it is up to them! But I do think the Spanish are coming around to the modern way of thinking."

Jean Simpson, 74, on holiday from Edinburgh

It should be banned, 100 per cent! I went to a bull-fight in Torremolinos once, because of the tradition. The animal is kept in the dark before being released into the ring

where it is blinded by the sunlight and stabbed to death by men who then call themselves brave! The bull has no chance. But how to stop it? Change takes so long to happen in this world! And don't get me started on the Pamplona bull runs. You wouldn't jump in the sea and play with the sharks, would you? So why do it with bulls? Just ridiculous."

John, 84, Jean's husband

"The women only go because they fancy the brave and handsome 'toreros.' They are quite brave though! Those bulls like killing humans, otherwise there would be no spectacle and it would be a total disaster! I prefer the way it's done in Portugal really. The bull's horns are wrapped up, a group of men jump on it, count to 10, jump off and run for their lives, much fairer!"

Prime Minister Pedro

PEDRO SANCHEZ, the leader of the left-leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE), succeeded in unseating Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy to take the top job in Spanish politics for himself last week.

The PSOE submitted a no confidence motion against the government in the wake of the Gürtel kickbacks-for-contracts scandal. It passed in Parliament with 180 votes for and 169 opposed.

That left Rajoy ousted and Sanchez installed as Prime Minister.

Sanchez was born in Madrid in 1972. His political career began on Madrid City Council before being elected to Parliament in 2009 and he became PSOE leader in 2013.

He was ousted from the leadership in October 2016 before returning to the post

just over a year ago.

Sanchez faces a number of challenges as he gets his feet under the table in the Prime Minister's residence of La Moncloa.

The first is the PSOE's position in the Cortes Generales, Spain's Parliament. The party has 84 seats in the 350-seat

lower house and 62 Senators in the 266-strong upper chamber.

He will have to rely on support from the far left Podemos party and small regionalist parties to get legislation passed until an election is held.

Cataluña's push for greater powers looks set to continue which could pose further issues. Sanchez was a vocal opponent of the region's independence drive.

He will now have to sit across the table from the region's President Quim Torra, who may take advantage of the PSOE's fragile position in Parliament to extract pledges for greater Catalan self-rule.

Next week Euro Weekly News will feature a beginner's guide to Spanish politics which will tell you all you need to know about the state of play following Sanchez's appointment.

Brits charged over prostitution protests

FIVE British expatriates have been held on suspicion of hate crimes in the wake of vigilante protests against African prostitutes in Magaluf.

It comes after a group of around 20 Nigerian women filed official complaints with Local Police in Magaluf, claiming they had been physically assaulted and verbally abused while being filmed without their consent.

Those arrested, who have not been named but include a bar manager from Darlington, have reportedly been told they face a court hearing after being fingerprinted at a Guardia Civil station.

They are believed to be members of a social media group set up to curb the 'threat' of the sex workers, who they believe are responsible for muggings and violent attacks on drunk

revellers in the party resort.

One pal said: "The outcome with the police wasn't good. Our friends are being charged with hate crimes and are awaiting court. We have to rethink this again and change our tactics."

The prostitutes are thought to be brought to Spain from Africa by a sex trafficking

ring, and local businesses, including many owned by Britons, blame them for a drop in trade.

The latest drama follows a string of incidents which have seen holidaymakers join protests against the women and clashes with Spanish taxi drivers chanting 'No prostitutes on the streets.'

UK firm's €1.9bn package deal set

BRITAIN'S biggest cardboard box maker has swooped on a Spanish rival.

It comes after DS Smith revealed it plans to fork out €1.9 billion to snap up fast-growing Europac.

The takeover will see the London-based firm - which each year produces millions of tonnes of packaging for clients including Amazon, Asos and Next - expand into Spain, Portugal and France.

Its business has boomed with the rise in online shopping and it was promoted to the FTSE 100 last December.

PP threatens budget chaos

SPAIN'S ousted People's Party (PP) has threatened to use its Senate majority to disrupt the new government's budget.

PP parliamentary spokesperson Rafael Hernando said his party now wishes to "improve" its own long-delayed budget that was only passed a few weeks ago following months of negotiations.

He suggested this could include reigning in some of the promised €500 million infrastructure investment for the Basque region that enabled his party to pass the budget with support from the

Basque PNV party.

The PP has an absolute majority in the Senate and although it cannot nullify the budget, it can send revisions back to the lower house for revoting.

And the move threatens to destabilise the new Socialist PSOE-led government, which currently has just 84 politicians in the 350-seat parliament.

Socialist lawmaker Jose Luis Abalos said any move to renegotiate the budget would be an "unifying [act of] vengeance" by the PP following last week's no-confidence vote which saw

former Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy kicked out of office.

But Hernando said his party's relationship with one-time ally the Basque PNV has changed after its MPs voted with the Socialists to remove the PP from power.

"At this moment, we do not have a link with the PNV because it has broken the trust," he confirmed.

PNV official Aitor Esteban added that the move could offer the PP "satisfaction for five minutes," but would "be very bad political business that would mean punishing the Basque society."

Usual suspects not so budget

THERE is no British or Irish representative in this year's top 10 cheapest budget airlines.

The most cost-effective operator was Malaysia's Air Asia, with a rate of €0.06 per kilometre travelled, with the top five completed by, in order, Air India Express, Indonesia AirAsia, Iceland's Primera Air and India's Indigo.

Irish low-cost specialist Ryanair placed seventh most affordable on the list, which was compiled from economy-class flight prices returned in search results from transport search engine Rome2rio.

It comes after a recorded telephone call between an irate customer and an employee went viral on social media.

The shopper rang to complain that the firm was selling themed World Cup shirts for all competing nations except Spain in the troubled northern region.

And in the audio clip, the shop worker is heard to respond

that no Spanish version would be sold locally "to avoid a fracas," sparking outrage online with calls to boycott the brand.

Hours later, an official said in a statement that the decision, made due to "the political situation" had been reversed, and that Spain shirts would be available "as soon as our logistic services permit."

He added: "We recognise that the idea was wrong and has been interpreted as a lack of respect for the Spanish national team, for which we apologise."

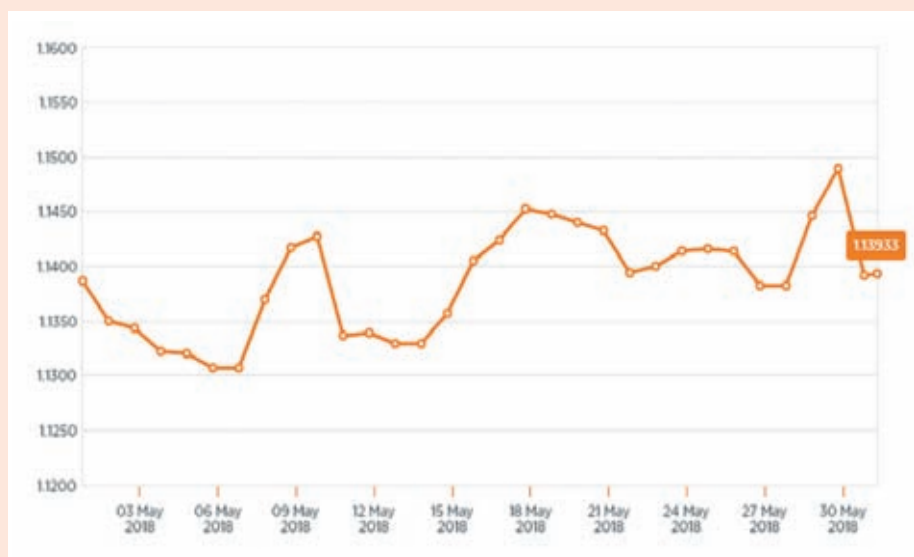
EUR/GBP: Fluctuating, but unmoved at £0.87
EUR/USD: Down from \$1.20 to \$1.15

The euro (EUR) posted a mixed performance in May, encumbered by ongoing political uncertainty in Italy and Spain, and enduring concerns that the European Central Bank (ECB) will extend their bond-buying programme beyond September this year.

As May draws to a close, however, there has been some good news in the form of a Q2 recovery in German data.

This includes the unemployment rate falling from 5.3% to 5.2% in May and retail sales rising from the -0.4% contraction in March, to grow by 2.3% in April (month-on-month).

Looking ahead, investors will be keeping a close eye on Eurozone data - particularly the looming inflation print - but given the current dovish outlook of the ECB it seems unlikely that the euro will find much purchase.

Pound

GBP/EUR: Up from € 1.13 to € 1.14
GBP/USD: Down from \$1.37 to \$1.32

The pound struggled to make much headway in May, limited in the early weeks by easing consumer price inflation and the ongoing burden of Brexit negotiation stagnation.

On a brighter note, the UK's labour market

continued to jump from strength to strength, with unemployment sliding to a surprising 4.2% low in the three months to March, whilst retail sales also recovered from 1.3% to 1.5%.

Whether this will be enough to push the Bank of England (BoE) towards acting in a more hawkish fashion with regards to policy remains to be seen, but many analysts are hopeful that the

Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) will raise interest rates by 25bp in August.

As we move through June investors will be desperately looking for any signs of progress in Brexit negotiations, particularly with the EU summit scheduled for the end of the month.

If progress is made then we could see the pound make a comeback.

US Dollar

USD/GBP: Up from £0.72 to £0.75
USD/EUR: Up from €0.82 to €0.86

The US dollar stormed ahead in May, driven by ongoing expectations for monetary tightening by the US Federal Reserve, as well as the robust performance of the US labour market and improving trade relations with China.

A marked rise in US inflation towards the start of the month was good news for USD bulls, with the Fed expected to continue on their gradual path of monetary tightening this year and next.

Beyond this, China has agreed to compromise on various aspects of trade, including agreeing to buy more US goods and services and even plans to address the questionable usage of foreign intellectual property rights.

The outlook remains positive, though any signs of cooling relations between China and the US could send investors to safer shores.

Smartphone stupidity

CAN it be true that the jostling passenger who stole my phone on the packed 916 bus in Rome last month really was a Catholic priest?

Though it's unlikely to have been my priestly neighbour, I would have felt less humiliated if my phone had indeed transitioned that smoothly from my zipped pocket into the folds of a cassock as we both headed for the Vatican and redemption.

Almost half of all thefts reported now are smartphones, routed virtually anywhere in the world within days by well-oiled syndicates.

If you're insured you're in for a challenging round of musical chairs at a Local Police station to file the required report. Harbour no illusions: they almost certainly won't look for it.

But replacing the actual device is not the main issue.

Indeed it's an opportunity to buy a shiny new gadget even if it does mean living on bread and

Nor is it mainly about one thing many people forget: that if you don't block a lost phone immediately, the bad guys have a nasty little wheeze of using it to call premium numbers back in Desolatistan at €20+ a minute on your account, ka-ching.

Nope, it's all the confidential stuff we keep on our phones these days which hurts. Banking apps, online shopping apps, vulnerable information of every hue and cry and all those access codes.

Tackle the damage limitation and you quickly learn just how many websites simply aren't

geared up for your scenario. 'Register a new phone to your account? No problem, for security reasons first send us confirmation from your old one.' Ummm...

And of course there are lessons to be learned. If only I had set up the wonderful 'find my phone' facility which both Apple and Android devices offer - before it got stolen. If only I had kept a separate note of all my online banking and other confidential information so that I would know who to call and what to say in the event of.

If only...

But look on the bright side. A third of the users in a recent US study said they would pay a thousand dollars to get their phone back. I'm not one of those people.

I would have loved to see the look of disgust when my thief realised he'd stolen a six-year old dinosaur of a phone. Heck, given time to first extract my information, I'd actually have paid him to take it.

Steal away

AS the FBI keeps discovering, current phone security erects a daunting fortress wall around your device. If you enable it.

Border disorder: The Irish border

THE Bank of England's chief economist says it's possible to detect the mood of a country from the music it's listening to on Spotify. What should we be listening to at the moment, then? Billie Holiday singing Gloomy Sunday, aka the Hungarian Suicide song?

The ongoing Irish border problem, that I wrote about here recently, doesn't help. In psychobabble terms, I know what this relates to: fear of missing my imminent crime novel publishing deadline. Do they pay wealth tax?

Q. My wife and I reside in the UK and have had a holiday home in Spain for 14 years. Our income is taxed in the UK. We pay the Suma Property Tax, the supposed Property Rental Tax, and the Waste Collection Tax. Our friends say we should also pay Wealth Tax on the property, as they all do. We have never received a request to pay the tax. Should we pay Wealth Tax or not?

A. You are liable for Spanish Wealth Tax on any capital assets, such as a home, which you own in

Spain. If you pay your Spanish taxes through Suma, you live in the Valencian Autonomous Region. Suma is their tax collection agency. In Valencia, the first €600,000 of value is exempt from Wealth Tax.

Until 2015 this exemption did not apply to non-residents and that is why your friends had to pay it from the first euro of valuation.

Now the exemption applies to non-residents.

If you and your wife are co-owners of a house valued at less than 1.2 million euros, you have no tax to pay.

MARIANO RAJOY and the Partido Popular are on the skids, but Spain's president is in denial and unblushingly proclaimed that Eduardo Zaplana's €10 millions' worth of kick-backs on government contracts was an 'isolated case.'

That was a few hours before the Gurtel sentences were announced: 51 years and 11 months for businessman Francisco Correa, the German version of whose name gave the case its name.

Thirty-three years and four months for Luis Barcenas, the former Partido Popular treasurer who oversaw the illegal funding of the party and hived off millions for himself.

And so on down the list of PP politicians who were on the make and on the take.

Then came the triple whammy when the National High Court said that the PP's Caja B - a black money cashbox - and its parallel bookkeeping had existed since 1989 at least.

The party, aware that it is holed not only beneath the waterline but above it too, maintains that this hap-

They do things differently

pened in the past and has nothing to do with the present-day party.

"The past is a foreign country, they do things differently there," it's said, and that's what Rajoy and his government are trying to tell us now. But Spain is still the same country and nothing is done differently.

Return of the boomerang

MARIANO RAJOY'S disastrous inaction over the Catalan problem and his insistence on dealing with it as a judicial, not a political, issue has ricocheted.

Carles Puigdemont, the self-exiled former president of Cataluña is safe and sound in Berlin because the German courts take a different view of what constitutes rebellion and sedition. Spain might eventually get him for misappropriation of public funds - money is a judicial common denominator everywhere - but even that's not certain.

And all along, once the PP's illegal funding and the dirty Gurtel

washing were displayed for all to see, Rajoy insisted that the courts would see that justice was done. And they have.

Unfortunately for the Partido Popular, the party was not exonerated but accused of institutional corruption and some big political names are in jail or on the point of going there.

Rajoy's go-to solution has done him no favours and his insistence on leaving the judiciary to do his dirty work means his boomerang keeps coming back with calamitous results.

Diversions tactics

WHEN everyone in Spain was appalled after the Gurtel corruption case broke and the then-king's son-in-law was found siphoning off the taxpayer's money, they were less aware of what was simmering in Cataluña.

Once Cataluña grabbed everybody's attention they stopped looking at corruption.

More recently the public lifted its hands in righteous horror on learning that Pablo Iglesias and Irene Montero have bought a €670,000 villa on a €540,000 mortgage.

Meanwhile they temporarily forgot about Cataluña, corruption and the Galapagar house and concentrated on Pedro Sanchez's censure motion against Mariano Rajoy, but only briefly.

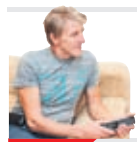
In politics there's no hiding place for long and soon it's time to come under public scrutiny once more - like a merry-go-round but less fun than La Ronde. Instead it's a case of what goes around, comes around.

Ideal for a dinner party

**FIDDLY BUT WORTH IT: Chicken Milanese.**

THIS week my recipe is Chicken Milanese. It is a little fiddly to make but well worth the effort and is ideal for a dinner party as all the preparation can be carried out beforehand, leaving time to entertain your guests. Personally, I like this dish served with broccoli steamed in the microwave and pasta spirals, but roasted gnocchi will also work well.

Chicken Milanese

Serves 6

6 whole chicken breasts, no skin, no bone flattened
3 tablespoons plain white flour,
3 whole eggs, beaten
3 teaspoons garlic puree
300g bread crumbs
6 tablespoons olive oil

For the sauce

3 cans tomatoes, coarsely chopped
2 tablespoons olive oil

6 whole garlic cloves, skinned & chopped

1 large red pepper seeded and chopped

1 bunch of fresh basil

1 teaspoon of celery salt

2 chicken stock cubes crumbled

To finish

Juice from two whole lemons

200g buffalo mozzarella cheese

Salt and pepper, to taste

1) Cut the gristly bits off the chicken and flatten. Pre-heat fan oven to 200°C, or in a conventional oven at 220°C.

2) Take three shallow bowls, put the flour in the first, the beaten egg in the second add the garlic puree and stir un-

til completely mixed, add the breadcrumbs to the third bowl.

3) Dredge the chicken breasts in the flour until they are fully coated, then likewise in the egg and finally in the breadcrumbs.

4) Put the olive oil into a baking tin or dish and make sure the chicken breasts are completely coated in the olive oil.

5) Bake for 20-30 minutes until they are completely cooked.

6) Make the sauce, by frying the garlic in olive oil until it is transparent on a medium heat.

7) Add the chopped tomatoes, red pepper, basil, celery salt, and chicken stock.

8) Blend and heat through in a saucepan, add the lemon juice and put to one side.

9) Slice the buffalo mozzarella and place on top of the cooked chicken breasts, put back in the oven and allow the cheese to melt.

10) Place the chicken breasts on plates with the sauce to one side and serve.

Tip: Use kitchen scissors for trimming chicken, it is a lot easier than using a knife and less hazardous.

Tip: Flatten the chicken breasts with an empty or unopened bottle of wine to avoid the risk of contaminating a wooden rolling pin with salmonella bacteria. Likewise use polythene chopping

boards.

Tip: To make sure chicken (or pork) is properly cooked, tap it with the back of a metal spoon, if the resulting sound is soft, the meat will be, if it sounds like tapping wood it is cooked through.

Hint: Place as many of the breasts as possible in each bowl to

Ground covers

MIMICKING nature's valuable lessons to protect the garden ecology.

If you look at the way nature grows her gardens, you will see that all good soil zones have a complete coverage of the soil with plants. Any area of good soil that has sunlight and some moisture will have plants growing with a complete ground cover. It is natural that the soil is completely covered with plants, plant debris or stones.

In ornamental and vegetable gardens we often design the garden to have big gaps between the plants we are trying to grow that has just bare soil in between. This is quite contrary to nature's way.

Bare spaces give a satisfaction of us being in control of the garden to do just what we want but it also means that we have a lot of weeding or cultivating to do to keep the soil bare as nature struggles to protect the soil

with new plant cover or weeds, which is what we usually call unwanted plants.

With the long, hot Mediterranean summer, the consequence of the unnaturally bare soil exposed directly to the sun is overheating of the soil that destroys, at the surface, the living organisms that maintain a living soil.

This overheating in summer and extreme cold exposure in winter on bare soil results in depletion of nutrients. Nitrogen evaporates in high temperatures and the lack of microbial activity to decompose any organic material in the soil will mean little nutrient renewal through natural processes.

The short term result can be improved nutrient release as the organic microorganisms die, but long term the soil will become just a mineral soil with little organic content. The soil will be-

come less fertile and unable to grow most plants that need high organic content. Mediterranean soils are normally low in organic content because of the hot summers.

This can be overcome with the addition of organic fertiliser, but if you want to reduce your workload in the garden you can adopt ground covers to make gardening easier. Ground cover can be a mulch of organic materials such as compost, straw, leaves, chipped wood or even inorganic stones laid on the surface of the soil to protect it.

An even better way however is to design the garden to incorporate ground cover plants that will grow and spread out over the soil to protect it and naturally supply additional plant debris to the soil.

A well chosen ground cover will spread out over the soil to insulate, suppress

many weeds, preserve moisture and add more life and colour to a garden. In small gardens that will fill up every inch or centimetre of the garden around their taller companions.

A tree can be highlighted by being surrounded by a flowering or lush green ground cover. Shrub bed bushes can be tied in wonderfully with a well selected ground cover planting.

There are so many different plants that can be used as ground cover. Any trailing or spreading plant that does not grow upright but tends to grow horizontally can be used. Creeping or spreading succulents make excellent ground covers where watering is kept to a minimum.

It is best to use ground covers with similar watering and soil needs to their companions in the garden. This is how nature makes her gardens.

Saying goodbye

YOUR relationship with your dog is special. You are responsible for its care and welfare. Eventually there comes a most difficult life or death decision for the welfare of the animal and for you and your family.

The decision is a personal one but it need not be a solitary one. Your vet and your family and friends can assist and support you. Consider not only what is best for your dog, but also what is best for you and your family. Quality of life is important for pets and people alike.

If your dog can no longer enjoy the things which once gave it pleasure, or if there is more pain than quality in its life, if your dog is terminally ill or critically injured, or if the financial or emotional cost of treatment is beyond your means, euthanasia may be the only option.

It also might be necessary if a dog has become vicious, dangerous, or unmanageable, but remember some undesirable and abnormal behaviour can

be changed with a qualified behaviourist.

Economic and emotional problems together with changes in lifestyle may also force an owner to consider euthanasia of a dog. Obviously it is better to find another solution or an alternative home for these pets.

Your vet understands attachment to pets and can examine and evaluate your dog's condition, estimate your

dog's chances for recovery, discuss potential disabilities and long-term problems, explain the medical options and possible outcomes. But he cannot make the euthanasia decision for you.

It is very important that you fully understand your dog's condition. If there is any part of the diagnosis or the implications for your dog's future that you don't understand, ask to have it explained again. Rarely will the situa-

tion require an immediate decision. Usually, there will be time to review the facts.

Eventually you may wish to discuss the disposal of your dog's body with your family and vet. You have several options and your vet can provide information about burial, cremation or other alternatives.

Discuss with the family what the vet has said. Long-term medical care could be a burden, either emotionally or financially. Encourage family members to express their thoughts and feelings. Even if you have reached a decision, family members, especially children, should have their feelings considered.

Children have special relationships with their pets. Excluding or protecting children from this decision-making process, because they are thought to be too young to understand, may only complicate their grieving. Children respect straightforward, truthful, and simple answers. If they are prepared

adequately, they are usually able to accept a dog's death.

Euthanasia is almost always accomplished by injection of a death-inducing drug. Your vet may administer a tranquilliser first to relax your dog. Following the death-inducing injection, your dog will immediately go into a quiet and irreversible deep unconsciousness. Death will come quickly and painlessly.

The act of saying goodbye is an important step in managing the natural and healthy feelings of grief, sorrow, and sense of loss. Your dog is an important part of your life and it is natural to feel you are losing a friend.

Once the decision for euthanasia has been made, you and other family members may want to say goodbye to your dog. A last evening with your dog at home or a visit to the dog at the hospital may be appropriate. Family members who want to be alone with the animal should be allowed to do so. Farewells are always difficult.

Most new cars that are produced would not usually make any real noise, so the sound they make is artificially generated through speakers.

A 1965 JAGUAR E-type raced by Sir Stirling Moss is shortly to be auctioned, and is expected to sell for between €125,000 and €150,000.

Although Moss started his career as a Jaguar works driver, with successes in XK120s and C-types, he never competed in an E-type during its heyday.

The car being auctioned started life as a standard E-type Roadster and was converted to a road-legal racer by marque specialist Jeremy Broad in the 1980's.

It was loaned to Sir Stirling Moss in 1991 to compete in the Manx Mountain Challenge, in the process becoming the first E-type that Moss drove competitively.

Auction House H&H Classics, which is selling the

car at RAC Woodcote Park near Epsom, Surrey, says the car features many original components, including an aluminium bonnet fabricated by Abbey Panels.

It also has a 4.2 litre version of the classic Jaguar XK straight-six engine, which powered the Coventry cars from 1949 to 1992, driving through a five-speed Getrag gearbox.

The car was later raced by Le Mans and touring car legend Win Percy, who qualified third in the special 40th anniversary race for E-types at Donington Park in 2001.

Among the 54 other lots in the H&H sale is a modern recreation of the famed 1973 BMW CSL touring car racer, nicknamed the Batmobile due to its outrageous wings and bulbous bodywork.

as tech companies and car manufacturers experiment with autonomous vehicles.

However, he insisted that their introduction will eventually lead to much safer streets in the future.

Discussing the future of transport on BBC Radio 4, he said:

"Unfortunately there will be crashes. People are going to get hurt and there will be some lives lost."

Despite this, he added that businesses and regulators, "should really be focused on the potential for zero deaths on our roadways."

The technology industry is locked in a debate surrounding the ethics of releasing autonomous systems 'into the wild' after investments from Google, Uber, Tesla and car-makers significantly accelerated its development.

Dr Rosekind now serves as head of safety innovation at driverless car start-up Zoox, and his comments mark a rare admission from an official acknowledging the price to pay for safer roads in future.

Hamilton could quit F1 in 2020

LEWIS HAMILTON could sensationally quit Formula 1 in 2020, according to commentator and former F1 driver, David Coulthard.

Hamilton's current contract expires at the end of the year but soon he is expected to pen a lucrative two-year extension.

That would take him to the end of the 2020 season, which will align with when Liberty Media are planning to make vast changes to the sport in a bid to make it more competitive.

"I think it's got to be on his mind," Coulthard said on BBC Radio 2's Graham Norton Show on Saturday.

"I think he'll go to 2020 which is the end

of the current Concorde agreement, but beyond that there is every likelihood he will be releasing his first album."

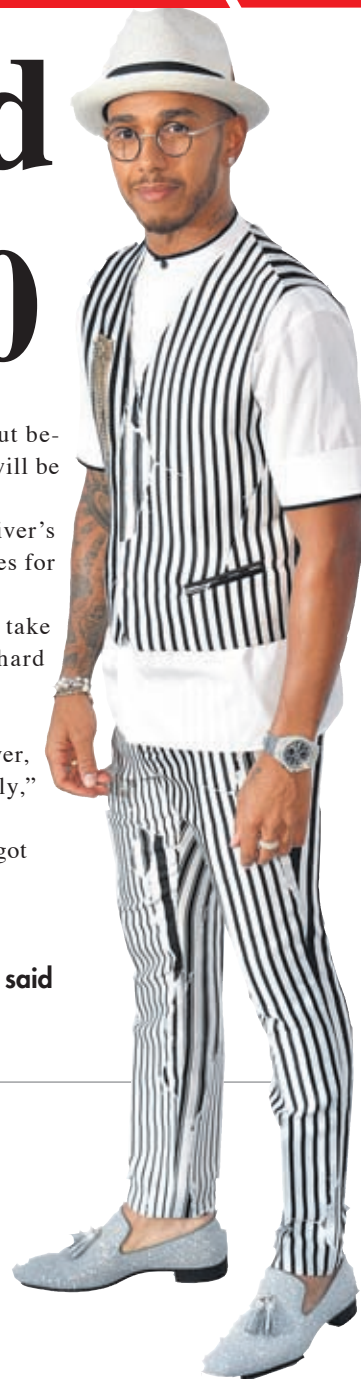
Hamilton is currently leading the Driver's Championship this season as he searches for his fifth world title.

Asked who he felt may be in line to take Hamilton's place at Mercedes, Coulthard suggested reigning GP3 champion George Russell.

"He's with Mercedes as a reserve driver, so he wouldn't be known internationally," Coulthard said.

"But he's certainly someone that has got skills, talent and potential."

Moments later though, he signalled what many had suspected: that he would be leaving the Ducati team at the end of the season.

Marc Marquez crashed before finishing 16th in Tuscany, though he remains comfortably clear of the standings after five races.

The Spaniard had been bidding for his fourth straight win this season but fell off his Honda on the fifth lap.

Rossi moves up into second in the standings, 23 points behind Marquez, with Yamaha team-mate Maverick Vinales in third.
