Expat arrest

A BRITISH gangster who went on the run through Spain has taunted investigators by shooting a video guide showing how to flee the country.

Convicted drug dealer Sam Walker, 35, who has racked up more than 100 crimes, is wanted after skipping a court appearance for driving without a licence.

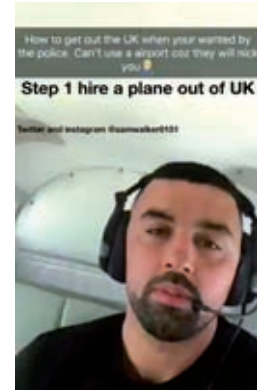
His rap list includes jail terms for offences ranging from possession of counterfeit cash to threatening police officers, while he once hit the headlines over alleged threats to Chelsea footballer Ross Barkley.

He was previously a member of a mob selling heroin and crack cocaine in his native Liverpool.

And he has now reached Sierra Leone in West Africa after clocking up more than 7,000 kilometres on his epic escape from justice.

He posted a clip shortly after arriving to capital Freetown, where he claims to have met the country's Vice President Mohammed Juldeh Jalloh, in which he said: "Better luck trying to catch me when I

go out of the country next time, Merseyside Police."

A police official later pointed out that he is in fact wanted by detectives in Cheshire.

The footage is titled 'How to get out of UK when your [sic] wanted by police. Can't use an airport coz they will nick you.'

It shows Walker flying to Belgium in a private plane before taking a 'little 14-hour boat trip' to Morocco, between which he is believed to have flown to Portugal and

hitch-hiked through southern Spain.

He then embarks on a three-day drive across the Sahara Desert, Mauritania and Senegal before taking another boat to Freetown from Guinea.

Walker claims to be in Sierra Leone, where his grandfather was born, to help distribute charity donations sent from the UK.

He insisted: "I was in a Catch-22. I had to fulfil my promise to the people in the

slums, knowing full well that when am caught I will get the maximum sentence of four months in jail plus two months for missing my court date.

"But to me the people were more important. The court date could wait. Sometimes in life you have to do the wrong thing in the eyes of the law in order to do the right thing."

He also claims to have spent thousands on installing fresh water pipes in the city's slums after seeing "men, women and children dying."

He added: "I have not just woke up and changed overnight. I am still the same person and still do what I do.

"I know when I come back to the UK I will be arrested at the airport and put straight in jail.

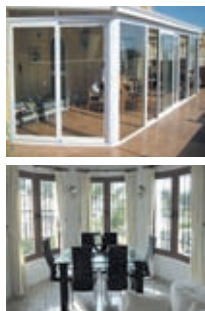
"I can deal with that knowing that I have fulfilled my promise to the people in the slums by giving them a container full of toys, clothes and food and given them fresh, clean water so no man, woman or child ever has to risk their lives by drinking dirty sewage water again."

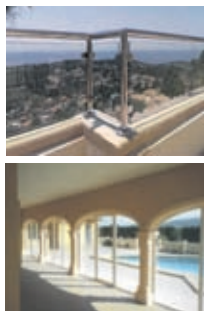

Reporter to the rescue

A TELEVISION journalist reporting on heavy rainfall in the Valencia Region has helped to free three people trapped in a car during a live broadcast. Footage from Antena 3 showed Rafa Cano speaking to the camera before grabbing a rope to help emergency services pull the vehicle out of floodwater.

Taxi talk

BENIDORM'S council has changed its taxi licensing system to require drivers to speak Spanish, Valencian and English. Authorities have said drivers will have to complete a 20-question multiple choice test in order to get their taxi permits, with the exam featuring sections on linguistic skills.

Drugs busts

THREE people from Benidorm have been arrested in connection with a series of police drug raids in the Murcia region last week. Officers claimed they seized around two kilos of cocaine and 150 marijuana plants in searches on Calle Duque, Calle Pisos Rojos and the Arsenal area of the town.

Four held

POLICE have arrested four people in connection with the sale of clocked vehicles in Villena following an eight-month-long investigation. Guardia Civil officers seized 11 vehicles as part of the probe with the detainees suspected of altering distance figures to sell the cars for a higher price to at least 12 people.

Death probe

A 31-YEAR-OLD woman has been remanded in custody by a court in Elda in connection with an investigation into the death of the eight-year-old son of her partner. The suspect, named as Alejandra GP, was arrested and questioned following a police raid on her home on Calle Juan Carlos I.

Car drills

SECONDARY school students in La Nucia have taken part in a council-backed training day which included learning what to do if a car overturns. Theoretical and practical classes also featured on the day which aimed to teach those involved about the consequences of driving accidents and how to cope with them.

Adios, PM!

OUSTED: Former Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy in Spanish parliament.

SOCIALIST leader Pedro Sanchez is Spain's new Prime Minister after Mariano Rajoy was kicked out of office.

It comes in the wake of a landmark no-confidence vote after Rajoy's conservative People's Party was found guilty of accepting kickbacks in exchange for lucrative public contracts.

Madrid's highest criminal court convicted 29 officials over their involvement in the scandal, with former treasurer Luis Barcenas jailed for 33 years and fined €44 million.

And the fallout - which saw the credibility of Rajoy's own testimony in the enquiry disputed - proved one scandal too far for the leader once dubbed the great survivor of Spanish politics.

He had been in office since 2011 and weathered a string of corruption probes, but was unable to withstand political anger after opposition parties united to seal his fate.

After the vote, Rajoy, 63, approached 46-year-old Sanchez in the parliamentary chamber and shook the incoming leader's hand.

"It has been an honour to be the prime minister of Spain," he earlier told MPs. "It has been an honour to leave a better Spain than the one I found. I hope that my successor will be able to say the same when his time comes."

Sex abuse appeal fails

A MAN sentenced to 12 years in prison for sexually abusing his elderly disabled mother-in-law has failed in his appeal against the penalty.

The defendant was handed the sentence by an Alicante Court but lodged an appeal with the Valencia region's Superior Court of Justice. He claimed evidence used against him in the trial was obtained by violating his human rights. The Valencia Court ruled that due to the man having confessed to the

crime during the trial in Alicante.

The Alicante Court heard during the original trial that the man had sexually abused the 83-year-old woman while he was caring for her in their home. The woman suffered from restricted movement and depended on help from others.

The man filmed the abuse and stored it on his computer. The footage was later discovered by his wife which led to his arrest.

Teacher suspended

A RELIGIOUS EDUCATION teacher who allegedly provided students with homophobic study material has been removed from his post following student complaints.

The Valencia Region's Ministry of Education suspended the staff member from Marcos Zaragoza secondary school in La Villajoyosa after pictures of the documents were posted by pupils online. The school told Spanish media the probe was ongoing.

The document posted by students appears to begin by claiming that homosexuality 'contradicts' God's plan for men and women.

'The condition may in some cases be blameworthy, but homosexual acts must always be avoided since they involve a serious moral disorder,' it goes on to state.

Judith Viudes, a psychologist connected with the case, said the teacher may have broken Article 510 of the Spanish Penal code so could be a criminal offence.

Carved in stone

A BRITISH expatriate artist has been commissioned to create a memorial to remember heroes of Spain's civil war.

At least 45 men from across the world were killed when their ship, the Ciudad de Barcelona, was torpedoed by a submarine off the Catalan coast.

They were among 300 International Brigadistas on their way to join the Republican fight against General Franco's fascist Nationalist army.

More than 120 of the soldiers were pulled from the sea by fishermen from the nearby town of Malgrat de Mar, but many sank with the vessel.

Witnesses said that they sang left-wing anthem The Internationale as they went down, while at least 23 others were later killed in the war.

"It was late afternoon," Welsh survivor Alun Menai Williams, who wrote the book 'From the Rhondda to the Ebro,' told UK media. "I was leaning on the ship's rail taking in my first view of Spain and its shoreline, some one and a half miles in the distance, when there came one hell of an almighty bang. "The ship shook, tried to get airborne, before settling down at a crazy angle."

American Jack Freeman added: "It was a pretty

dirty business... some fellows were killed while they were asleep, some were trapped below decks."

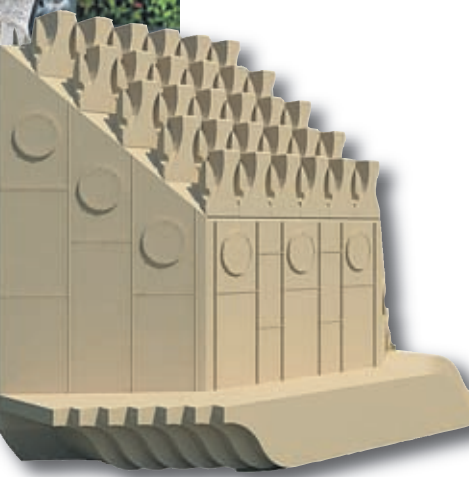
General Franco banned talk of the attack in its aftermath, but Robert Macdonald, originally from Rugby, Warwickshire, has decided to sculpt a monument in their honour.

The Barcelona-based stonemason is carving Solidarity Park from locally-sourced limestone, which when complete will include 60 half-metre tall figures representing the brigadistas set atop an abstract ship and stone map of the world.

Macdonald says the figures symbolise "the unity of the struggle of the Brigadiers, but each will have individual carved features thus expressing the diversity of us all."

He hopes the project - a collaboration with students, historians, local people and the families and friends of the fallen - will encourage people to consider the treatment of foreigners, immigrants and refugees.

More than €13,500 of the €20,000 estimated cost has already been raised by crowdfunding, with the final work to be displayed in a Malgrat de Mar park.

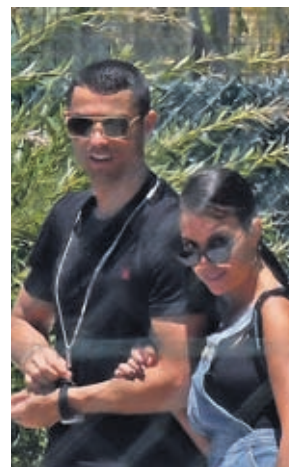

Share of the dog

A SMALL dog must spend six months per year with each of her two owners after a ground-breaking Costa del Sol legal battle.

The joint custody case is the first of its kind in Malaga Province and just the fourth ever in Spain.

And the ruling will see Tara, a Pomeranian cross, split her time between Madrid and Antequera - an hour inland from Malaga - after the couple that had owned her for a decade went their separate ways.

It comes after the plaintiff left his former partner four years ago, leaving her to care for Tara alone after he returned to his hometown from the Spanish capital.

But he was unable to live without his beloved pet and submitted a claim that he was her sole owner, triggering a court case.

And after a judge rejected the demand he filed for joint

custody of the pooch, which has now been formalised by Malaga's provincial authorities.

The judge said in a statement that the defendant 'has maintained a passionate emotional relationship with her pet for more than seven years, and this merits judicial protection.'

Alejandra Leon, the plaintiff's legal representative and an expert in animal law, called the sentence "transcendental."

She added: "It only confirms the ongoing reform of animals' legal status in Spain, with them no longer considered objects but living creatures with feelings.

"Their welfare should always be the priority in such cases."

Tara will be brought to Malaga for the first six months in the wake of the case, since the plaintiff has 'been deprived of contact' since 2015.

Saved app a mountain

Brit pensioner rescued after horror plunge

A BRITISH climber has been rescued after plummeting more than 10 metres down a Spanish mountain in pitch darkness.

The unnamed 69-year-old was found clinging to a tiny ledge with rib and foot injuries after using a mobile phone app to contact his family in the UK.

They immediately contacted the British Consulate who raised the alarm.

A Guardia Civil mountain rescue team located him in the Las Minas del Rabico area of the Picos de Europa mountain range in Castilla y Leon using the coordinates he provided.

Rescuers said he suffered the fall after getting lost during a solo trek when thick fog descended.

They used ropes and a

ladder to pull him to safety before setting up a small rescue tent where he was able to recover strength and warmth with food and water.

At first light he was winched to a helicopter in a risky manoeuvre before being flown to the Pandrerruda pass where an air ambulance was waiting to

transfer him to hospital.

A Guardia Civil official said: "He was found at 2am, lying on a shelf in a very precarious position and with the real possibility of falling into the void below."

"The mountaineer, who was doing the route alone, became disoriented by the fog and took another route that goes up to the Torre del Llaz.

"He slipped and fell about 10 metres down the sheer slopes and landed on the ledge."

AN Irish tourist has died after reportedly falling from an apartment courtyard wall in Magaluf.

Thomas Owen Hughes, 20, was just one day into his Mallorca holiday when he was found by a local resident.

Police believe he fell whilst trying to gain access to the complex from the equivalent height of a seventh-floor apartment.

Death plunge

The Eden Roc resident raised the alarm after spotting his body at around 11am but paramedics were unable to revive him. Investigators believe he fell at night, but due to the secluded area he was in no-one noticed

until hours later.

It is not yet clear why Thomas was at the apartment complex, as he was staying at a nearby hotel.

Plane ridiculous

A BRITISH couple were unable to fly to their Spanish holiday home using a €115 Ryanair voucher because it was in the name of 'Mum Dad.'

Kathryn and Richard Bolton, from Banbury, Oxfordshire, were told they could not use the voucher, bought for them by son Nick, 34, because the 'names did not match' those on their passports.

But when insurance worker Karen, 60, called the budget airline to resolve the problem, she was told that the correct names should be 'Dear Mum Dad.'

She told UK media: "The whole thing has been a ludicrous farce. It would be laughable if it wasn't so annoying."

The voucher was bought as a Christmas present from Nick, wife Amy and their two dogs Brian and Ernie.

He wrote 'Dear Mum Dad' in the space for the recipients' names, and Kathryn and Richard, 59, tried to redeem it in April for a planned trip to their Costa Brava holiday flat near Girona.

Karen continued: "When I

tried to buy them with the voucher it said 'passenger name doesn't match'. My husband thought I was being silly, so he tried it and it still wasn't working.

"So we rang Ryanair, at 13p per minute, and finally a man said, 'The name doesn't match.' I asked what the 'correct' name was, and he said, 'Dear Mum Dad.' I said that's a salutation, not a name."

The low-cost carrier eventually relented and said they will

reissue the voucher.

Karen added: "To say it's taken the shine off things is an understatement. They had our voucher information online and would have known straight away we were genuine customers, but they put us through all this rigmarole."

A Ryanair official said: "The name on the voucher must match the name on the passport as per our terms and conditions.

"As a gesture of goodwill we

have contacted the customer directly to resolve the issue."

It comes as the Irish operator sparked outrage at London's Stansted Airport this weekend, with hundreds of passengers up in arms over lengthy check-in queues.

Some feared missing their flights after branding the situation 'an utter shambles,' while the airport said cancellations due to bad weather earlier in the week had triggered a bottleneck.

Man held over rape of Brit tourist

A ROMANIAN expatriate has been held in Mallorca on suspicion of sexually assaulting a British holidaymaker.

It comes after the unnamed man, who works in a Magaluf bar, was identified following DNA tests performed on the victim's clothing.

The woman, believed to be in her late 20s, filed a complaint with UK police after returning from a trip to the party resort last year.

She claimed she was partying with a friend on the Punta Ballena strip when the pair became

separated, before she was approached by the accused, who invited her for a drink.

Later in the evening, he took her to a hotel room and alleged-

ly raped her. The case was reported to Interpol, who informed local investigators in Calvia.

The suspect has been remanded in custody pending trial.

Tree disease pledge

EU officials have said they are committed to stopping the spread of a virus which has infected trees in the Costa Blanca.

A delegation from the European Commission visited areas that have been struck by Xylella last week. The EU representatives went to the Marina Baixa, Marina Alta and El Comtat areas of the region. They were joined by Spanish officials from the Agriculture department of the Valencia Generalitat including Roger Llanes, director of Agriculture and Livestock for the region.

Llanes said the EU's delegates wanted to prevent the spread of the disease to areas not already hit by it.

"They warned the only way is to eradicate it and that we must do this quickly," he said.

Xylella Fastidiosa is known to leave trees without water which dries out their leaves, stunts their growth and lowers their fruit yield.

There are concerns if Xylella is able to spread it could impact harvests and local economies as a result.

Horror accident kills soldiers

MILITARY investigators are probing the deaths of two Spanish soldiers in the Canary Islands.

At least two other servicemen are believed to have been hurt after a BMR armoured personnel carrier

overturned during an exercise at a firing range near the town of Pajara, Fuerteventura.

General Venancio Aguado of the Canarias XVI Brigade named the victims as corporal Jose Luis Leon Socorro and private Eynar Esau Mina Lozano in a statement issued by the Spanish Ministry of Defence.

The injured men were reportedly transferred to the island's Puerto de Rosario Hospital in the wake of the accident, which happened during a two-week field training exercise involving 600 troops and a hundred vehicles.

It comes after the brigade, which has extensive combat experience in Iraq and Afghanistan, returned from a six-month tour of Lebanon supporting United Nations forces.

Joint swoop

€4.6m cannabis stash seized

SEVEN men have been held after a €4.6 million cannabis haul was unearthed in a container shipped to the UK from Spain.

Border Force officers discovered the 400kg stash in the wake of a joint probe with the National Crime Agency (NCA).

The drugs were hidden in crates of lettuces aboard the Wec Vermeer vessel, which had docked at the Port of Liverpool five days ahead of the raid.

A covert surveillance operation was launched, with investigators tracking the container after it was loaded onto an articulated lorry and driven to an industrial unit in Lytham St Annes, Lancashire.

Officers swooped to arrest the driver and two others who were unloading the vehicle, before three suspects

were held in nearby Kirkham and a fourth individual was detained in the Trafford Park area of Greater Manchester.

Greg McKenna, Head of NCA Investigations for the north of England, said in a statement: "This is a significant disruption of an organised crime network that has stopped the proceeds of crime funding further criminality that would damage

communities and exploit the vulnerable.

"We take importations such as this very seriously, and these arrests show that we will detect criminal activity and arrest those responsible."

All seven suspects have been released on bail after being quizzed by detectives on suspicion of conspiring to import class B drugs.

Gunfire heard

GUNSHOTS have been heard in Granada City up to three times and in three separate places over the weekend, according to media reports of local witnesses.

The first shot was reportedly fired in the Caseria del Cerro area of the city late on Friday and in the early hours of Saturday.

A gun was fired in the air in the Almanjayar area while police were deployed to Calle Juan de Salcedo after further reports of gunfire on Sunday.

The first of the three inci-

dents is believed to have begun late on Friday evening in what was reportedly a shootout between rival gangs.

Police seized a total of five weapons after arriving in the Caseria del Cerro area on Saturday, with two of those reportedly replicas. Five people were arrested in connection with the gunfire.

The second shot was heard in the Almanjayar area of the city at around 5.15pm on Sunday. Emergency services said police went to Calle Molino Nuevo where someone had fired a shot

at a gate but found no damage or injuries had been caused.

At least seven police vehicles were dispatched to Calle Juan de Salcedo at around 6.00pm, with the street cordoned off according to witnesses.

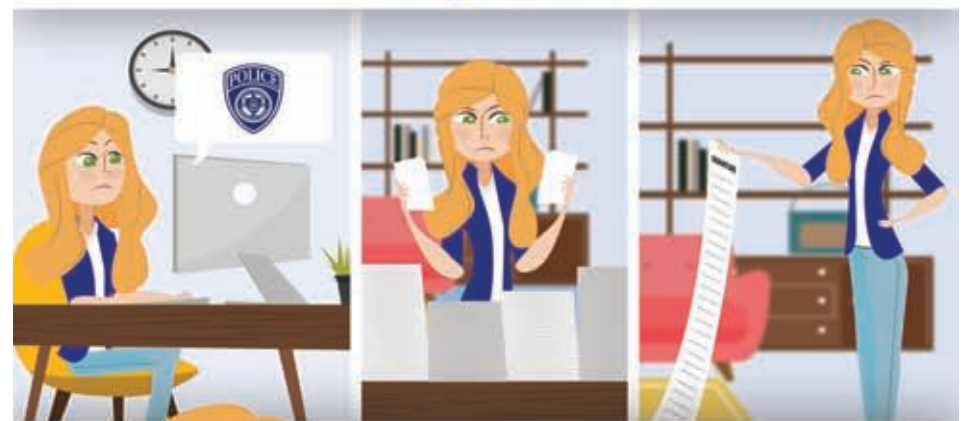
Bullet holes were reportedly found in a house in the area, with the number of arrested made not specified by emergency services.

They are believed to be members of a social media group set up to curb the 'threat' of the sex workers, who they believe are responsible for muggings and violent attacks on drunk

revellers in the party resort.

One pal said: "The outcome with the police wasn't good. Our friends are being charged with hate crimes and are awaiting court. We have to rethink this again and change our tactics."

The prostitutes are thought to be brought to Spain from Africa by a sex trafficking

ring, and local businesses, including many owned by Britons, blame them for a drop in trade.

The latest drama follows a string of incidents which have seen holidaymakers join protests against the women and clashes with Spanish taxi drivers chanting 'No prostitutes on the streets.'

Fluke angling mishap

A YOUNG woman fishing off the Albir cliffs was airlifted to hospital with a fishhook embedded in her mouth.

The 20-year-old and a friend were fishing for squid, using a special potera sinker. This is surrounded by sharp multiple hooks and as she lifted the line from the water the hook flew up and hit her in the mouth.

Owing to the inaccessible

cliffs where the two young women were fishing, the Emergency Services mobilised a Fire Brigade helicopter which had to lower a paramedic and a rescuer to the injured girl.

Once stabilised she was winched up to the helicopter which returned to Benidorm fire station's helipad where an ambulance was waiting to take her to Villajoyosa hospital.

Hit by train

A CAR driver has been left unharmed after a train crashed into his vehicle on a level crossing in Villena.

Emergency services said no other injuries were caused as a result of the accident which took place on the Alicante to Al-becete stretch of line on Sunday.

The driver of the black Honda reportedly said he did not see the train coming before it hit the front of his car on the crossing.

The train, which was carrying some 65 passengers at the time of the accident, was kept in Villena station after the crash.

Hero wolfdogs raise the alarm

LUA and Llop, two Czechoslovakian wolf dogs saved their owner's life after fire broke out in her Lliber warehouse.

Known for their faithful character and loyalty to their owner the dogs woke Dominique at 5am when fire spread from a wooden shed adjoining her antiques and second-hand furniture business located in the warehouse.

Dominique sleeps in an apartment above the premises and once the blaze entered the warehouse through an open window Lua started to bark.

"I thought she had been disturbed by noise outside and I told her to be quiet and tried to get back to sleep," Dominique said later.

"Llop seized my arm in his mouth and started to tug so I got up, thinking he wanted to go outside," she continued. "Then I saw the flames that were already

inside the store. He saved my life, I'm certain of it."

Dominique ran to get a fire extinguisher and the window where she had been standing exploded, narrowly escaping injury.

Meanwhile, neighbours who saw the blaze advised the Emergency Services and firefighters from the Denia fire station prevented the fire from en-

tering the shop, although her home was badly damaged.

Dominique still does not know how the fire started as she turns off the downstairs mains every night before she goes to bed and there is no electricity in the shed where the fire started.

"But if it weren't for Lua and Llop, I don't know what would have happened."

Biter jailed

A 33-YEAR-OLD will go to prison for one year for assaulting his ex-partner by biting her in the face after she refused to kiss him.

Refusing his appeal, Alicante's Provincial Court upheld the sentence given by a Benidorm criminal court who convicted the man of causing aggravated injuries.

The court heard the man had approached the woman in a square in Benidorm in November 2015. He was at that time subject to a legal order preventing him from contacting her.

The defendant is to pay some €400 in compensation to the victim.

Older buildings' earthquake risk

AN Alicante University (UA) research team warned that dozens of high-rise Costa Blanca buildings might not withstand an earthquake.

Reinforced concrete tower blocks of 15 or more storeys constructed in the 60's and early 70's were built prior to earthquake regulations, explained Professor Salvador Ivorra.

The professor, who heads the university's department of Simulation, Modelling and Structure Testing (GRESMES) explained that many early buildings were constructed with bad materials and have been subjected to wind and the sea air for the last 40 or 50 years.

"These buildings are not going to collapse, but they need technical inspections," Professor Chorro said.

The GRESMES team recently published the results of their findings in the Engineering

Failure Analysis magazine, concluding that the deterioration of older high-rise buildings is generalised on the Mediterranean coast but particularly in Alicante Province.

The earliest buildings made less provision for wind erosion, the GRESMES investigators found, and without taking possible seismic activity into account.

This changed in the 70's when by law all Alicante

Province buildings had to be earthquake-proof.

In line with current regulations, reinforced concrete buildings are designed to have a useful life of 50 years, after which problems are likely to occur, Ivorra said.

They would not collapse, he added, but how long they lasted would depend on the aggressive elements to which they were exposed and all should be inspected, he added.

Plane disgusting

Smelly passenger sparks diversion

A FLIGHT packed with holidaymakers on their way to Spain was forced to make an emergency landing due to the 'unbearable' stench of an 'unwashed' man.

The passenger's body odour was so vile that the Transavia service from Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport to Gran Canaria was diverted to Faro on Portugal's Algarve.

Cabin crew reportedly tried to make the traveller sit in the

toilet before the captain decided to cut the journey short so that he could be taken off the Boeing 737 aircraft.

The foul smell caused some sun-seekers to vomit while others fainted, with Belgian traveller Piet van Haut describing the reek as "unbearable."

He added: "It was like he hadn't washed himself for several weeks."

"Several passengers got sick and had to puke."

A picture snapped by one of those aboard the plane shows

ground staff escorting the stinking individual onto a waiting bus.

A Transavia official said: "The aeroplane diverted because of medical reasons, but it is indeed right that he smelled quite a bit."

It remains unclear why he stank, or what medical condition he was suffering from.

In February, a Transavia jet from Dubai to Amsterdam was re-routed because a passenger repeatedly broke wind, sparking a mid-air brawl.

RYANAIR has announced an increase in the fee for carrying two cabin bags on some flights just months after the airline introduced the charge.

The company's baggage policy allows everybody to travel with 'two-free carry-on bags.'

But the heaviest of the two bags has to be checked into the hold, unless passengers pay a priority boarding fee.

A €5.70 charge for priority boarding was introduced in January, but it has now increased to €6.85 for selected trips, according to Which? consumers' association.

And it rises again to €7.99 if passengers reserve the priority booking during online check-in instead of when booking.

A Ryanair spokesperson said: "Like all businesses, our optional fees can change unlike our fares, which keep coming down."

He did not say which transfers would be affected by increased luggage fees.

Airline CEO Michael O'Leary said checking in cab-

in bags at the gate is causing 'handling issues' on charters.

The problem is worst during bank holiday weekends and summer peak periods with up to 120 free-of-charge bags being handled at gates, he added.

Ryanair's new bag policy could reportedly be costing €50 million each year. And

O'Leary said he may have to rethink it if the number of bags being checked-in at gates continues to rise.

The airline makes €5.7 million per day from additional charges and €2 billion each year from 'ancillary revenues' coming from additional extras like priority boarding and seat reservations.

Tribute to London Bridge 'Skateboard Hero'

THE father of Ignacio Echeverria, the 'skateboard hero' stabbed to death by terrorists during the London bridge attacks last year, has paid tribute to his son a year on.

"He did what he had to do. I wouldn't expect less from him," Joaquin Echeverria, Ignacio's father, said.

"I want it to be known that he always wanted to be good," he added.

The terrorists were stabbing a woman when Echeverria, from Madrid, intervened armed with just his skateboard.

"And the next thing Ignacio was then being struck by the three terrorists," Echeverria's father said.

The Spaniard - who was an anti-money laundering expert at HSBC bank - had said he would intervene in the event of a terrorist attack during a family conversation just a few months prior to the June 3 attacks, his father told.

The Spanish government posthumously awarded him the Great Cross of the order of Civil Merit for 'extraordinary services.'

Spain's king Felipe VI also honoured his

bravery in a speech given in UK parliament during a state visit last year.

A commemoration to those who died during the attacks was held at Southward Needle on London Bridge last Sunday marking one year since the attack.

Prime Minister Teresa May attended alongside Labour party leader, Jeremy Corbyn, London Metropolitan police chief, Cressida Dick and mayor of London, Sadiq Khan. "The many stories of courage demonstrated that night will always stay with me, such as Ignacio Echeverria, who died after

confronting the terrorists with the only thing he had, his skateboard," the Prime Minister said. Islamic State-inspired terrorists ploughed down pedestrians on London bridge in a van before crashing it on the south bank of the River Thames.

They ran to nearby Borough market storming pubs and restaurants and stabbing whoever they could find before Metropolitan police shot them dead.

A total of 48 people were injured in the attacks and eight people were killed which in addition to Echeverria include, Canadian

PEDRO SANCHEZ, Spain's president since June 1, scaled the Peñon de Ifach in December 2014.

He climbed the 332-metre limestone outcrop with the television presenter and mountaineer Jesus Calleja and the feat appeared in the first programme of Planeta Calleja's second series.

In the preceding months Sanchez had appeared on political programmes but was also seen on more frivolous daytime chat shows.

Once Sanchez reached the top of the Peñon in 2014, he sent a message to the rival Podemos party, telling them to "change the bad vibes and anger for proposals and something positive."

That was in 2014 but support from Podemos was decisive in helping Sanchez to oust Mariano Rajoy.

-Births of children and / or changes in marital status.

Piranha seeks forever home

TORREVIEJA'S municipal animal shelter has been crowded out by the sudden arrival of 26 animals.

Animal Protection councillor Carmen Morate explained that Torreveja's Guardia Civil seized the animals while dismantling a 30-strong drugs ring.

They encountered 19 dogs, a ferret, a piranha fish and three horses, together with another six dogs belonging to the same owners found wandering near an El Limonar property.

Despite the unexpected arrival of so many animals, Morate thanked the Guardia Civil, the judge in charge of the investigation and the public prosecutor for trusting her department to rehome the animals.

They are now seeking homes for 13 greyhounds, 10 greyhound puppies - currently being fostered as they are only a month old - a Rottweiler, a Podenco hunting dog, as well as other animals including a piranha named Federico who was present while Morate spoke to the Press.

The municipal shelter, which usually houses an average of 35 animals must now take charge of another 26.

"We need to stress the need for volunteers prepared to foster or adopt one of these animals," the councillor said, explaining that the only requirement was an authorisation from the judge in charge of the case.

'Men in black' were a fabrication

THE partner of an Elda man whose eight-year-old foster son died during an apparent break-in was charged with his murder.

Last August the 31-year-old woman named Alejandra, then four months pregnant, claimed that two men dressed in black and wearing motorcycle helmets pounced on her and her partner's foster son, Dominique as she left her home in central Elda.

They forced her back inside the apartment where she was tied up and hooded before being beaten and sexually assaulted. Before fainting she had been aware of flashes as though her assailants were taking photographs, she told police afterwards.

Although Alejandra is deaf she can lip-read and on regaining consciousness, unseen by her captors, she made two video calls to her mother.

Meanwhile, after the at-

tackers had gone, leaving the apartment door open, an alarmed neighbour called the 112 emergency services.

A half-naked Dominique was sprawled on the floor but despite traces of vomit and blood there were no signs of violence. Pathologists later established that the boy, who was epileptic and mildly autistic, died of asphyxiation.

He visited his father frequently but normally lived with his permanent foster mother who was holidaying at the time.

Neither of the attackers were seen on CCTV footage of the area and no witnesses recalled seeing them.

Police doubted Alejandra's story from the outset after a gynaecological examination that night ruled out the alleged sexual assault. Investigators have not yet found a specific motive for the killing, but suspect it was driven by jealousy.

Path to power

THE PSOE's no confidence motion came in the wake of the Gurtel kickback-for-contracts scandal.

Spanish lawmakers debated the motion last Thursday and Friday, with the vote taken at 11am on the latter day.

Rajoy said Sanchez's motion was an attempt to get into power without having to contest an election.

"Mr Sanchez is concerned because he is not doing any better in the polls, and he has realised that he will never reach government through elections," he said.

Sanchez came next and called on Rajoy to leave office voluntarily rather than face the no confidence vote.

"The time has come, there is no middle-of-the-road way to raise the quality of our democracy, which is now being questioned," he said.

The speeches were followed by efforts from the PSOE to

Prime Minister Pedro

PEDRO SANCHEZ, the leader of the left-leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE), succeeded in unseating Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy to take the top job in Spanish politics for himself last week. The 46-year-old former economics professor faced a number of issues from day one, including his party not having a parliamentary majority and the ongoing situation in Cataluña.

win over smaller, regionalist parties to support the motion, accomplished by Thursday evening.

The motion passed on Friday morning with 180 votes in favour, 169 against and one abstention. That left Rajoy ousted and Sanchez installed as Prime Minister.

Pedro's progress

SPAIN'S new prime minister was born in Madrid in 1972. He played in an under-21's basketball team before going on to get several degrees covering business and economics.

Sanchez speaks fluent English and French as well as Spanish. He served as the chief of staff to the UN high representative in Bosnia during the

war in the former Yugoslavia.

His political career began on Madrid City Council before being elected to Parliament in

2009.

He lost his seat in 2011 but returned in 2013 and was elected the leader of the PSOE the

following year.

He was ousted from the leadership in October 2016 after Spanish voters returned a hung parliament in 2015 before returning to the post just over a year ago.

He does not currently have a seat in the Congress of Deputies but that will not prevent him from becoming Prime Minister. Candidates for the job need only be Spanish and over 18.

On the agenda

THE head of Spain's government faces a number of challenges as he gets his feet under the table in the prime minister's residence of La Moncloa.

The first is the PSOE's position in the Cortes Generales,

Spain's Parliament. The party has 84 seats in the 350-seat lower house and 62 senators in the 266-strong upper chamber.

Sanchez said last week he would go to the polls to get a mandate from Spanish voters. He will have to rely on support from the far left Podemos party and small regionalist parties in the meantime to get legislation passed.

Cataluña's push for greater powers looks set to continue which could pose further issues for the prime minister.

Sanchez was a vocal opponent of Cataluña's push for independence and recently branded Torra the 'Le Pen of Spanish politics' in a reference to the nationalist French politician.

He will now have to sit across the table from Torra who may well take advantage of the PSOE's fragile position in parliament to extract pledges for greater Catalan self-rule.

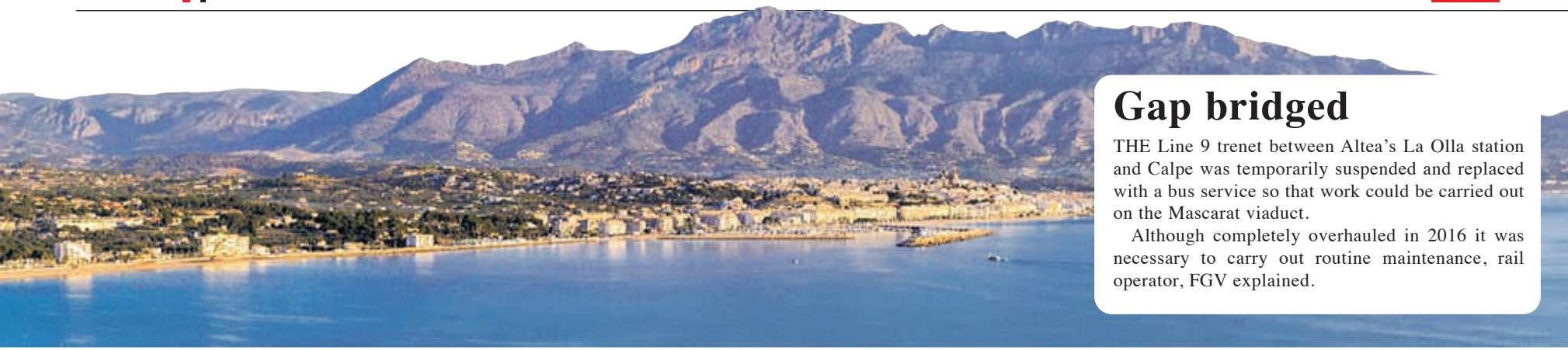

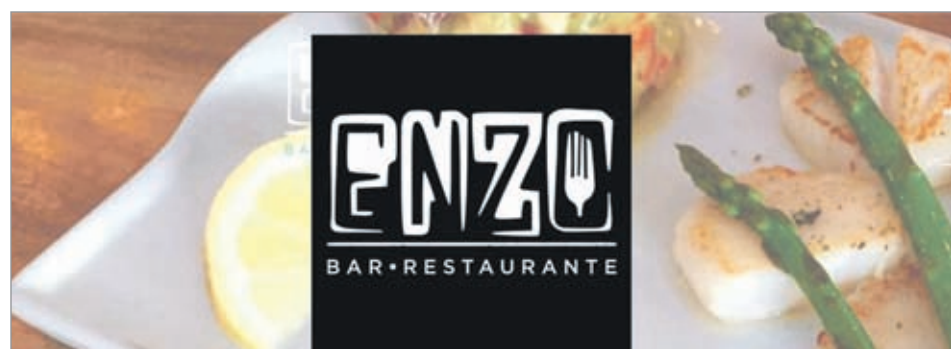

Water company makes a profit

AMJASA, Javea's municipal water company finished 2017 with profits of €956,000.

As in previous years, this will be reinvested in improvements to the supply network, which provided 6.957 million cubic metres of water for 27,156 households in 2017.

Although the publicly-owned company has 15 pumping installations, three wells and administrative offices, Amjasa also succeeded in reducing its

carbon dioxide emissions.

These were the same as a family home, said Amjasa's manager Jose Luis Henarejos who explained that the company was committed to sustainable energy policies and buying electricity from renewable sources.

Amjasa already has two electric vehicles but the next step is replacing its existing fleet with electric or hybrid models, completing the changeover that began two years ago.

Competing for beach bars

A JAVEA business-owner paid €85,000 to run the beach bar on Javea's Primer Muntanyar beach for the next four years.

Bidding for each of the chiringuitos started at €15,000 apart from the Benissero bar which had a starting price of €18,000 as this included the concession for sunbeds and beach umbrellas. This went for €70,000.

The Primer Muntanyar concession was the most coveted as this is beside the Parador and closest to the Arenal beach.

The three remaining chiringuitos went for between €28,000 and €52,000. All the contracts must first be approved by the town hall.

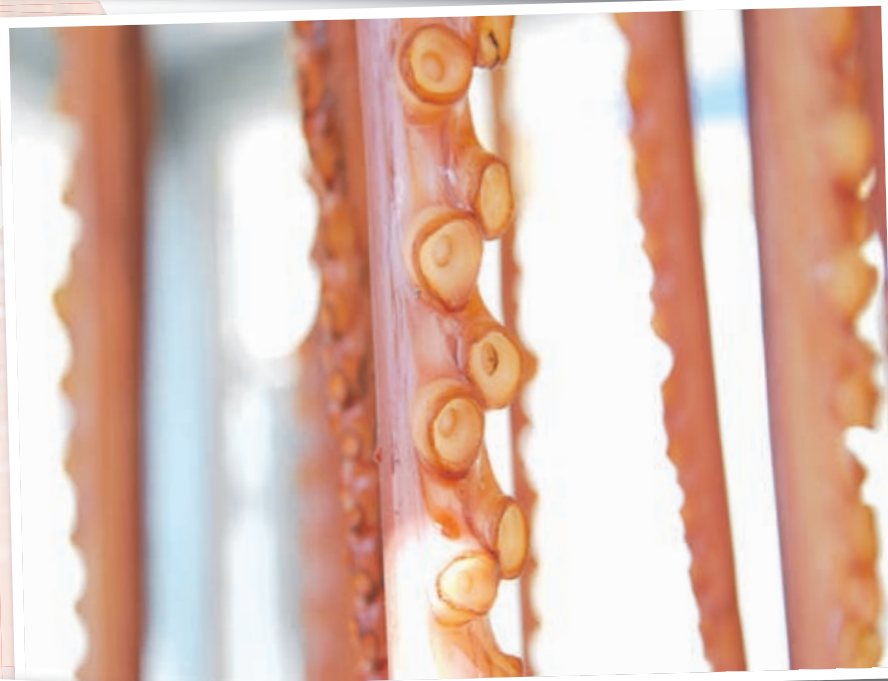

UNFORTUNATELY, there are many people affected by the mortgage floor or 'suelo' clauses who were contacted by their banks and asked to attend their offices to sign agreements without advice from an expert lawyer. According to the banks, these agreements aim to improve the conditions of clients' mortgage loans.

Unfortunately, what most of these agreements did was to reduce the floor or minimum interest clause, or even agree a fixed interest rate, resulting in a waiver of legal actions for the client and consumers in relation to the floor clauses and typically meaning the bank saves thousands of Euros.

Until recently it was understood by most courts that these agreements were a novation, ie, the replacement of an obligation by mutual agreement, or modification of the floor clauses and were null, since the mortgage floor clauses have been declared null and void when they affect

consumers. But they are not transparent, so it was understood, explained in a very basic way, that the modification of an absolute null clause is also null and void.

Based on these criteria, the courts had been declaring these private agreements signed with the banks for the modification of the floor clauses null, allowing those affected to claim for the interest overcharged to them.

But, the Supreme Court has in April 2018 surprised us with sentence 205/2018. In the ruling, it pointed out that in a case study, despite the parties of Novation or Modification being named, the agreement was in fact a transaction or agreement between the parties, bank and consumer affected by the floor clause in which both freely made concessions (the bank lowered the minimum interest or floor clause, and the consumer agreed not to pursue legal actions) in order to avoid a court proceeding.

The Supreme Court therefore decreed these transactional agreements are perfectly valid legally, and the consumer cannot now claim for the floor clause having previously waived legal action.

But we cannot agree with this decision of the Supreme Court, because anyone who knows how the banks have behaved in relation to these agreements knows they are not the outcome of an open negotiation and the banks did not inform the clients about the implications of their consent not to pursue legal action. We understand that these agreements are null and void, and we are sure that the ECJ will declare it because:

- The agreements offered by banks to their customers affected by the floor clauses were not negotiated, but drafted and imposed by the banks.

- The agreements ask clients to waive legal actions relating to the floor clause, but did not explain or

quantify the financial amount they were giving up. How can the Supreme Court rule a consumer understands the economic implication of a waiver when the bank did not advise the precise amount overcharged for the floor clause?

We conclude the agreements imposed by the banks should be considered null, because they are in reality a modification of a floor clause that is null and void. In addition, must also be considered null because they are not transparent. The banks did not explain the economic value of the waiver, and they were not negotiated.

If you have or had a loan with a floor clause, do not sign anything with your bank without the agreement offered by the bank being reviewed by an expert.

Lavrov meets Kim in North Korea

RUSSIA'S Foreign Minister has travelled to the North Korean capital Pyongyang to meet with the country's leader Kim Jong Un. Sergei Lavrov told senior officials Russia supported its earlier joint declaration with the South on denuclearising the peninsula and invited the country's dictator to a future meeting in Moscow.

Crash closes airline

AN airline's fleet has been grounded in an ongoing probe into a plane crash which killed everyone on board. Saratov Airlines Flight 703 fell from the sky minutes after taking off from Domodedovo Airport near Moscow in February, with Russia's Transport Ministry revoking the company's operating licence last week.

from a data scandal. Senators in the State Duma issued the call for Mark Zuckerberg to visit, with the company also yet to comply with rules requiring tech firms to store Russian citizens' data.

Art vandal hearing

A 37-YEAR-OLD man has appeared before a Moscow court on charges of attacking a painting of Ivan the Terrible and his son at a museum in the Russian capital. Ilya Podorin, who could go to prison for up to six years if found guilty, told the court he struck the canvas with a pole because it 'distorts' historical fact.

World Cup forecast

AN international credit ratings agency has said it expects there to be 'little' long term effects from the World Cup which starts this month. Moody's said any boost from increased visitors to Russia was likely to be short lived, with authorities having spent billions on preparations.

Birthday bash

ELEPHANTS, tightrope walkers, biker gangs, marching bands and fireworks have all featured in St Petersburg as the city marked its 315th anniversary last week. Russia's second city, which was founded by Tsar Peter the Great in 1703, held parades down the Nevsky Prospekt thoroughfare in which a variety of marchers took part. Rasul Abakarov also tightrope walked 40 metres across the Neva River.

UK firm's €1.9bn package deal set

BRITAIN'S biggest cardboard box maker has swooped on a Spanish rival.

It comes after DS Smith revealed it plans to fork out €1.9 billion to snap up fast-growing Europac.

The takeover will see the London-based firm - which each year produces millions of tonnes of packaging for clients including Amazon, Asos and Next - expand into Spain, Portugal and France.

Its business has boomed with the rise in online shopping and it was promoted to the FTSE 100 last December.

PP threatens budget chaos

SPAIN'S ousted People's Party (PP) has threatened to use its Senate majority to disrupt the new government's budget.

PP parliamentary spokesperson Rafael Hernando said his party now wishes to "improve" its own long-delayed budget that was only passed a few weeks ago following months of negotiations.

He suggested this could include reigning in some of the promised €500 million infrastructure investment for the Basque region that enabled his party to pass the budget with support from the

Basque PNV party.

The PP has an absolute majority in the Senate and although it cannot nullify the budget, it can send revisions back to the lower house for revoting.

And the move threatens to destabilise the new Socialist PSOE-led government, which currently has just 84 politicians in the 350-seat parliament.

Socialist lawmaker Jose Luis Abalos said any move to renegotiate the budget would be an "unifying [act of] vengeance" by the PP following last week's no-confidence vote which saw

former Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy kicked out of office.

But Hernando said his party's relationship with one-time ally the Basque PNV has changed after its MPs voted with the Socialists to remove the PP from power.

"At this moment, we do not have a link with the PNV because it has broken the trust," he confirmed.

PNV official Aitor Esteban added that the move could offer the PP "satisfaction for five minutes," but would "be very bad political business that would mean punishing the Basque society."

Usual suspects not so budget

THERE is no British or Irish representative in this year's top 10 cheapest budget airlines.

The most cost-effective operator was Malaysia's Air Asia, with a rate of €0.06 per kilometre travelled, with the top five completed by, in order, Air India Express, Indonesia AirAsia, Iceland's Primera Air and India's Indigo.

Irish low-cost specialist Ryanair placed seventh most affordable on the list, which was compiled from economy-class flight prices returned in search results from transport search engine Rome2rio.

WALLET-FRIENDLY Irish clothing chain Primark is again selling t-shirts emblazoned with the Spanish flag in Cataluña.

It comes after a recorded telephone call between an irate customer and an employee went viral on social media.

The shopper rang to complain that the firm was selling themed World Cup shirts for all competing nations except Spain in the troubled northern region.

And in the audio clip, the shop worker is heard to respond

that no Spanish version would be sold locally "to avoid a fracas," sparking outrage online with calls to boycott the brand.

Hours later, an official said in a statement that the decision, made due to "the political situation" had been reversed, and that Spain shirts would be available "as soon as our logistic services permit."

He added: "We recognise that the idea was wrong and has been interpreted as a lack of respect for the Spanish national team, for which we apologise."

The figures represent year-on-year increases of 2.3 and 4.6 per cent, respectively, according to data from the National Statistics Institute.

And while British holidaymakers retained top spot in the ranking, with 4.3 million sun-seekers

flocking to tourist hot spots from January to April, the total dropped by 1.6 per cent compared with 2017.

The most popular destination for foreigners was the Canary Islands, with 4.8 million visitors, followed by Cataluña with 4.7 million and Andalusia with 2.9 million, while the average break lasted 6.8 days.

Euro

EUR/GBP: Fluctuating, but unmoved at £0.87
EUR/USD: Down from \$1.20 to \$1.15

The euro (EUR) posted a mixed performance in May, encumbered by ongoing political uncertainty in Italy and Spain, and enduring concerns that the European Central Bank (ECB) will extend their bond-buying programme beyond September this year.

As May draws to a close, however, there has been some good news in the form of a Q2 recovery in German data.

This includes the unemployment rate falling from 5.3% to 5.2% in May and retail sales rising from the -0.4% contraction in March, to grow by 2.3% in April (month-on-month).

Looking ahead, investors will be keeping a close eye on Eurozone data - particularly the looming inflation print - but given the current dovish outlook of the ECB it seems unlikely that the euro will find much purchase.

Pound

GBP/EUR: Up from €1.13 to €1.14
GBP/USD: Down from \$1.37 to \$1.32

The pound struggled to make much headway in May, limited in the early weeks by easing consumer price inflation and the ongoing burden of Brexit negotiation stagnation.

On a brighter note, the UK's labour market

continued to jump from strength to strength, with unemployment sliding to a surprising 4.2% low in the three months to March, whilst retail sales also recovered from 1.3% to 1.5%.

Whether this will be enough to push the Bank of England (BoE) towards acting in a more hawkish fashion with regards to policy remains to be seen, but many analysts are hopeful that the

Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) will raise interest rates by 25bp in August.

As we move through June investors will be desperately looking for any signs of progress in Brexit negotiations, particularly with the EU summit scheduled for the end of the month.

If progress is made then we could see the pound make a comeback.

US Dollar

USD/GBP: Up from £0.72 to £0.75
USD/EUR: Up from €0.82 to €0.86

The US dollar stormed ahead in May, driven by ongoing expectations for monetary tightening by the US Federal Reserve, as well as the robust performance of the US labour market and improving trade relations with China.

A marked rise in US inflation towards the start of the month was good news for USD bulls, with the Fed expected to continue on their gradual path of monetary tightening this year and next.

Beyond this, China has agreed to compromise on various aspects of trade, including agreeing to buy more US goods and services and even plans to address the questionable usage of foreign intellectual property rights.

The outlook remains positive, though any signs of cooling relations between China and the US could send investors to safer shores.

MARIANO RAJOY and the Partido Popular were on the skids, but Spain's president was in denial and unblushingly proclaimed that Eduardo Zaplana's €10 millions' worth of kickbacks on government contracts was an 'isolated case.'

That was a few hours before the Gurtel sentences were announced: 51 years and 11 months for businessman Francisco Correa, the German version of whose name gave the case its name.

Thirty-three years and four months for Luis Barcenas, the former Partido Popular treasurer who oversaw the illegal funding of the party and hived off millions for himself.

And so on down the list of PP politicians who were on the make and on the take.

Then came the triple whammy when the National High Court said that the PP's Caja B - a black money cashbox - and its parallel bookkeeping had existed since 1989 at least.

The party, aware that it was holed not only beneath the waterline but above it too, maintained that this

They do things differently

happened in the past and has nothing to do with the present-day party.

"The past is a foreign country, they do things differently there," it's said, and that's what Rajoy and his government tried to tell us. But Spain is still the same country and nothing is done differently.

Return of the boomerang

MARIANO RAJOY'S disastrous inaction over the Catalan problem and his insistence on dealing with it as a judicial, not a political, issue inevitably ricocheted.

Carles Puigdemont, the self-exiled former president of Cataluña is safe and sound in Berlin because the German courts take a different view of what constitutes rebellion and sedition. Spain might eventually get him for misappropriation of public funds - money is a judicial common denominator everywhere - but even that's not certain.

And all along, once the PP's illegal funding and the dirty Gurtel

washing were displayed for all to see, Rajoy insisted that the courts would see that justice was done. And they have.

Unfortunately for the Partido Popular, the party was not exonerated but accused of institutional corruption and some big political names are in jail or on the point of going there.

Rajoy's go-to solution did him no favours and his insistence on leaving the judiciary to do his dirty work meant his boomerang came back with calamitous results.

Diversions tactics

WHEN everyone in Spain was appalled after the Gurtel corruption case broke and the then-king's son-in-law was found siphoning off the taxpayer's money, they were less aware of what was simmering in Cataluña.

Once Cataluña grabbed everybody's attention they stopped looking at corruption.



PROBLEMS AHOY: Mariano Rajoy's past might come back to haunt him.

More recently the public lifted its hands in righteous horror on learning that Pablo Iglesias and Irene Montero have bought a €670,000 villa on a €540,000 mortgage.

Meanwhile they temporarily forgot about Cataluña, corruption and the Galapagar house and concentrated on Pedro Sanchez's censure motion against Mariano Rajoy and its bombshell result.

In politics there's no hiding place for long and soon it's time to come under public scrutiny once more - like a merry-go-round but less fun than La Ronde. Instead it's a case of what goes around, comes around.

Namesakes

IT'S hard to keep up with the names involved in the Catalan situation. There's a High Court judge called Lamela and a Supreme Court judge named Larena. The Speaker of the Catalan parliament answers to Torrent and the regional president's surname is Torra while secessionist MPs Turull and Rull are currently remanded. What's in a name? Potential confusion.

Border disorder: The Irish border

THE Bank of England's chief economist says it's possible to detect the mood of a country from the music it's listening to on Spotify. What should we be listening to at the moment, then? Billie Holiday singing Gloomy Sunday, aka the Hungarian Suicide song?

The ongoing Irish border problem, that I wrote about here recently, doesn't help. Long story short, the UK doesn't want a trade deal that aligns the UK and the EU both for customs and single market rules, but neither does it want any infrastructure along the Irish border. This is a contradictory position which the UK still hasn't been able to resolve. Basically, there are only three possible solutions. 1) The UK remains in the single market and enters into a customs union with the EU. 2) The transition period is extended indefinitely. 3) There's no withdrawal agreement, no transition period and no trade deal.

The City seems to be betting on BINO (Brexit In Name Only). Only problem is, there's no 'half-in, half-out' option. As long as the UK doesn't fully accept free movement we're no longer eligible for membership of the single market.

The same goes for the customs union: there's no half-way house. We're fully in or fully out. Since the government wants the freedom not to apply the common external tariff, we'd be fully out.

At the moment I'd put my money on a fudge around option 2. However, things still remain uncertain - many feel the EU's acting like a playground bully and it's time we stood up to it. And the trouble with fudge is that it's only sweet on first tasting. What lasts is the stickiness on the fingers and the cloying heaviness in the digestion. Incidentally, I have a recurrent childlike nightmare about missing my bus home from school. In psychobabble terms, I know what this relates to: fear of missing my imminent crime novel publishing deadline. I wonder if Theresa May also suffers from nightmares about missing a deadline (or two)?

LEGALLY SPEAKING

Do they pay wealth tax?

Q. My wife and I reside in the UK and have had a holiday home in Spain for 14 years. Our income is taxed in the UK. We pay the Suma Property Tax, the supposed Property Rental Tax, and the Waste Collection Tax. Our friends say we should also pay Wealth Tax on the property, as they all do. We have never received a request to pay the tax. Should we pay Wealth Tax or not?

TJC (Costa Blanca)

A. You are liable for Spanish Wealth Tax on any capital assets, such as a home, which you own in Spain. If you pay your Spanish taxes through Suma, you live in the Valencian Autonomous Region. Suma is their tax collection agency. In Valencia, the first €600,000 of value is exempt from Wealth Tax.

Until 2015 this exemption did not apply to non-residents and that is why your friends had to pay it from the first euro of valuation.

Now the exemption applies to non-residents.

If you and your wife are co-owners of a house valued at less than 1.2 million euros, you have no tax to pay.

available to be inspected your claim will likely be rejected.

In the event that they were stolen, if you cannot prove that you owned them in the first instance again the claim may be denied.

PERHAPS a great surprise and disappointment to many, but tight swimming trunks have just been voted as the UK's 'most hated clothing.'

Often simply referred to as Speedos or budgie smugglers, these wardrobe must-haves are essentially a pair of tightly-fitted swimming trunks.

They were originally designed in the 1960s to reduce drag and give extra support and comfort to competitive swimmers. And they have continued to be proudly worn by strapping athletes around the world for decades.

However, it seems the average Brit is not quite so ready to fit the mould and would rather prefer to leave a little something to the imagination.

In the recent YouGov survey, almost seven out of 10 Brits said they disliked the trunks, with more women than men against them, at 74 per cent.

Yet, these opinions aren't held across the whole of Europe. In Spain, Speedos continue to be hugely popular and in France it's even obligatory for men to wear the tight trunks in most public pools.

Feelers are out!

SUCH news might not even bat an eyelid in Asia, but news has emerged that you might actually have been eating insects your whole life.

It appears that one of the most widely used food colourings used to create pink, orange, purple and red is actually made from squashed bugs.

The insects are called cochineal, are native to Latin America, and they live on cacti.

They are mostly farmed in Peru where millions are processed every year to produce the colouring. According to the Peruvian Embassy to the UK, the country has a 95 per cent share of the international market.

These days, carmine is added to an endless number of food items including juices, ice creams, yoghurts and sweets. In fact, many UK products such as Mr Kipling cakes and Bachelor soups use carmine.

However, given the increasing number of people who are choosing to go vegan or be ethical consumers, companies are having to respond and adapt to evolving consumer habits. One such company is Starbucks which has stopped using carmine.

Yet, if you want to make the choice to avoid these insects in your diet, it might prove more difficult than you imagine. The word 'carmine' isn't listed on

food products, instead you'll have to search for 'natural red four,' 'crimson lake' or just E120.

And if you really want to save this little critters, you'll also have to be more selective on what eye shadow and lipstick you chose, as many cosmetic products also use these squashed bugs for colouring.

Keeping healthy

IF you're in Spain on holiday, or perhaps heading away, then you might be wondering what precautions you can take to avoid an upset stomach.

The nasties that can cause such trouble are hiding in contaminated food such as raw or undercooked meat, eggs, fresh produce, dairy products, and water.

Because of this, it's generally advised not to drink tap water. Remember too that the sauces available with your food in certain restaurants may have been watered down using tap water.

Ensure everything you eat is hot and has been cooked at the right temperature. This will ensure that there is no bacteria present. Try to avoid salads or food that has been sitting outside and also try to avoid uncooked seafood as this is a common culprit in many developed countries, including Spain.

Look around and take note of where the



locals eat. You can rest assured that a business that constantly attracts the locals has food which is worth returning for.

And before you eat, always wash your hands with hot water and soap.

This is another effective way of preventing sickness on holiday.

If you eat fruit, avoid eating the skin of the fruit. It's best to eat fruit which has a peelable skin, such as bananas.

If you do get food poisoning, you will know. The main symptoms of food poisoning are diarrhoea and vomiting, which may be accompanied by fevers and shivers. In addition to this, food poisoning can cause you to have stomach ache, fatigue, headaches and muscle aches.

If you experience any of these, drink as much (non-alcoholic!) fluid as possible.

YOUR body clock may have synchronised with the eating habits in Spain, but scientists are now questioning if late evening meals are actually stopping us from shedding those extra pounds.

Instead, recommendations might be made that we should be shifting our mealtimes to earlier in the day.

Scientists researching this connection between eating and our body clocks are trying to establish the eating times which are

more beneficial for us and our health. The connection between the two has become known as 'chrono-nutrition.' This research will also look at how our internal rhythms are affected by our eating habits.

It is understood that in each 24-hour cycle our body has optimum times when we should be doing things, in-

cluding eating. And so far the research suggests that the late meal enjoyed by virtually everyone in Spain is, metabolically speaking, not the right thing to do.

Although it isn't entirely understood why, results indicate that our bodies don't process food in the evening as well as they do in the morning. Fully understand-

ing this link could have big implications in allowing us to tackle the obesity problem in both the UK and Spain, among many other countries. In fact, perhaps the full English breakfast first thing in the morning is actually much better for you than a platter of Spanish tapas followed by paella last thing at night!

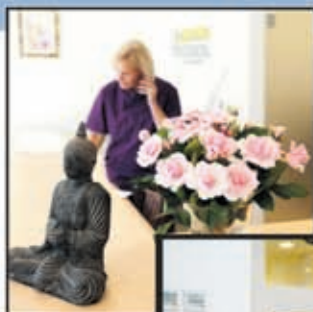
Out of sync

**Eat Well
to Live Well**

THIS week my recipe is Chicken Milanese. It is a little fiddly to make but well worth the effort and is ideal for a dinner party as all the preparation can be carried out beforehand, leaving time to entertain your guests. Personally, I like this dish served with broccoli steamed in the microwave and pasta spirals, but roasted gnocchi will also work well.

Chicken Milanese

Serves 6

6 whole chicken breasts, no skin, no bone flattened

3 tablespoons plain white flour,

3 whole eggs, beaten

3 teaspoons garlic puree

300g bread crumbs

6 tablespoons olive oil

For the sauce

3 cans tomatoes, coarsely chopped

2 tablespoons olive oil

Ideal for a dinner party**FIDDLY BUT WORTH IT: Chicken Milanese.**

6 whole garlic cloves, skinned & chopped

1 large red pepper seeded and chopped

1 bunch of fresh basil

1 teaspoon of celery salt

2 chicken stock cubes crumbled

To finish

Juice from two whole lemons

200g buffalo mozzarella cheese

Salt and pepper, to taste

1) Cut the gristly bits off the chicken and flatten. Pre-heat fan oven to 200°C, or in a conventional oven at 220°C.

2) Take three shallow bowls, put the flour

in the first, the beaten egg in the second add the garlic puree and stir until completely mixed, add the breadcrumbs to the third bowl.

3) Dredge the chicken breasts in the flour until they are fully coated, then likewise in the egg and finally in the breadcrumbs.

4) Put the olive oil into a baking tin or dish and make sure the chicken breasts are completely coated in the olive oil.

5) Bake for 20-30 minutes until they are completely cooked.

6) Make the sauce, by frying the garlic in olive oil until it is transparent on a medium heat.

7) Add the chopped tomatoes, red pepper, basil, celery salt, and chicken stock.

8) Blend and heat through in a saucepan, add the lemon juice and put to one side.

9) Slice the buffalo mozzarella and place on top of the cooked chicken breasts, put back in the oven and allow the cheese to melt.

10) Place the chicken breasts on plates with the sauce to one side and serve.

Tip: Use kitchen scissors for trimming chicken, it is a lot easier than using a knife and less hazardous.

Tip: Flatten the chicken breasts with an empty or unopened bottle of wine to avoid the risk of contaminating a wooden rolling pin with salmonella bacteria. Likewise use polythene chopping boards.

Tip: To make sure chicken (or pork) is properly cooked, tap it with the back of a metal spoon, if the resulting sound is soft, the meat will be, if it sounds like tapping wood it is cooked through.

Hint: Place as many of the breasts as possible in each bowl to coat them rather than multi-coating each breast one at a time.

Investors turn to student digs

REAL ESTATE investors are turning to Spain's burgeoning student accommodation sector in these demand-heavy times.

Spain has seen a dramatic increase in the number of people going to university, and given a marked rise in the population of the demographic, the development of purpose-built accommodation is booming.

So far however, the number of developments has not been enough to cover the shortfall, with students (as many as 380,000) unable to secure a place at a student residence.

Although some accommodation is owned directly by universities or operated by religious orders, the vast majority is in the hands of private companies.

Nick Wride, Head of Living and Alternatives at Jones Lang La Salle, said:

"In mature student housing markets like the UK and Germany, returns are being squeezed, whereas Spain offers very good student-to-bed ratios and attractive yields."

According to Wride, investing in student accommodation requires more work than traditional property sectors, "but with returns being squeezed elsewhere, it is well worth developing an understanding of the maintenance and service provisions that are included in student housing leases."

Up until 18 months ago the focus was on Madrid and Barcelona, but investors are now looking towards under-supplied regional cities such as Valencia, Granada, Malaga, Pamplona and Salamanca.

Rents in these cities tend to be lower than in Madrid and Barcelona, but it is easier for investors to find development space at a reasonable price.

A WINEMAKER husband and his actress wife have turned a centuries-old water mill into a luxury five-bedroom mansion.

Max Hernandez, a former entrepreneur, and his wife, retired screen star Silvia Hernandez, were motivated by a desire to be near Madrid but not part of the bustle.

The couple have turned the mill, which used to grind grain, into a 6,200 square foot mansion with nearly seven lush acres, with a pool, custom greenhouse, garden and a private forest.

An additional guesthouse, fashioned out of a wood shed, has a bedroom, bathroom and even a gym.

Now that Max and Silvia's son, Oliver is 18 and going to university in the UK, the estate is now on the market for a cool €4.5 million.

Clearly such high-end suburban living is hard to come by in Madrid, and affluent homeowners generally choose between old-fashioned apartment living in the heart of the city, and new villas on the outskirts in gated communities.

When the couple bought the former mill in 1999 for €400,000, the previous owner had already converted it into a single family home, but it looked nothing like its current grandiose splendour.

They purchased more land surround-

ing the property and spent a further €1.3 million on gutting the house, adding new heating, windows, floors and an outdoor pool.

"We only kept the walls and the roof," said Max, who completed the home in the spring of 2001.

They also have an eclectic taste in

vintage furniture, ranging from Belgian art deco to South African art deco to Spanish mid-century modern.

In keeping with their successful exploits so far, the couple plan to construct a 12,000 square foot mansion in the foothills of Valencia, out of a derelict multi-family farmhouse.

Meet three unique Spanish hideouts

THE BBC's The World's Most Extraordinary Homes recently took viewers to Spain to visit three stunning properties.

Rural House was built for a Michelin-starred chef and is a collection of 11 specially crafted steel boxes made to look like agricultural containers and cleverly hidden by a man-made ridge.

The unusual structure of the property, nestled in the foothills of the Pyrenees in Olot, Spain, recently won architect, Rafael Aranda the prestigious Pritzker Architect Prize.

The kitchen and dining room are in one section,

with a very minimalist open plan living room in the next. Inside, steelwork runs throughout as part of the interior decor, with belongings and utility rooms hidden behind steel doors that are flush with the walls.

Chef, Fina Puigdevall wanted somewhere to retreat to that was literally hidden away from the busy hub of the city centre of Olot.

Hemeroscopium House is on the outskirts of Madrid, surrounded by traditional suburban properties which make its striking concrete girders stand out even more.

Owner and architect, Anton Garcia Abril spent an entire year calculating the positioning of each element, creating an upward spiral of concrete and steel beams that support each other, and are held in place by a 20-ton piece of granite as a counterweight.

The eye is immediately drawn to the structure, but other striking elements are woven in too, like a swimming pool on the ground floor and a courtyard perfect for barbecues.

Solo House 2 is a holiday home built in north-west Spain, an area that has barely

been touched by tourism.

The concept of the circular structure was realised via an arts project, which gave architects a plot of land and free reign over what was built on the site.

Assigned a plot on a hilltop plateau, the architects built a 45m diameter circular design to make the most of the panoramic views.

The walls of glass help the building dissolve into the landscape, and they all slide, to encourage the huge expanse of surrounding nature to become part of the house itself.

MIMICKING nature's valuable lessons to protect the garden ecology.

If you look at the way nature grows her gardens, you will see that all good soil zones have a complete coverage of the soil with plants. Any area of good soil that has sunlight and some moisture will have plants growing with a complete ground cover. It is natural that the soil is completely covered with plants, plant debris or stones.

In ornamental and vegetable gardens we often design the garden to have big gaps between the plants we are trying to grow that has just bare soil in between. This is quite contrary to nature's way.

Bare spaces give a satisfaction of us being in control of the garden to do just what we want but it also means that we have a lot of weeding or cultivating to do to keep the soil bare as nature struggles to protect the soil with new plant cover or weeds, which is what we usually call unwanted plants.

With the long, hot Mediterranean summer, the consequence of the unnaturally bare soil exposed directly to the sun is overheating of

the soil that destroys, at the surface, the living organisms that maintain a living soil.

This overheating in summer and extreme cold exposure in winter on bare soil results in depletion of nutrients. Nitrogen evaporates in high temperatures and the lack of microbial activity to decompose any organic material in the soil will mean little nutrient renewal

through natural processes.

The short term result can be improved nutrient release as the organic microorganisms die, but long term the soil will become just a mineral soil with little organic content. The soil will become less fertile and unable to grow most plants that need high organic content. Mediterranean soils are normally low in organic content be-

cause of the hot summers.

This can be overcome with the addition of organic fertiliser, but if you want to reduce your workload in the garden you can adopt ground covers to make gardening easier. Ground cover can be a mulch of organic materials such as compost, straw, leaves, chipped wood or even inorganic stones laid on the surface of the soil to protect it.

An even better way however is to design the garden to incorporate ground cover plants that will grow and spread out over the soil to protect it and naturally supply additional plant debris to the soil.

A well chosen ground cover will spread out over the soil to insulate, suppress many weeds, preserve moisture and add more life and colour to a garden. In small gardens that will fill up every inch or centimetre of the garden around their taller companions.

A tree can be highlighted by being surrounded by a flowering or lush green ground cover. Shrub bed bushes can be tied in wonderfully with a well selected ground cover planting.

There are so many different plants that can be used as ground cover. Any trailing or spreading plant that does not grow upright but tends to grow horizontally can be used. Creeping or spreading succulents make excellent ground covers where watering is kept to a minimum.

It is best to use ground covers with similar watering and soil needs to their companions in the garden. This is how nature makes her gardens.

Buckingham Palace gardens

TODAY, war pensioners and service personnel will have the privileged opportunity to enjoy the gardens at Buckingham Palace as they celebrate their 'Not Forgotten Association Garden Party.'

This annual event brings together more than 2,000 beneficiaries who will be able to take some inspiration, and perhaps even a naughty cutting, from the flowers and plants that fill the royal gardens.

The royal garden itself is a 40-acre walled oasis and the largest private garden in the city of London. The central feature is a three-acre lake, but attendees will also be able to marvel at the 156-metre long herbaceous border, the wisteria-clad summerhouse, the rose garden, and a 4.5-metre high waterloo vase carved from a single piece of marble weighing an estimated 20 tons.

Although the queen has admitted that she's not an expert gardener, she has said

that plants, trees and flowers have been a source of pleasure for her throughout her life. Some of her favourite flowers can be found throughout the gardens.

In particular, the queen has revealed that her favourite flower is the primrose, and she is also partially fond of wildflowers.

If you'd like to enjoy the royal gardens then you can do so. Access to the gardens is included in the Buckingham Palace tours.

Avoiding spores indoors

AS the interior of your home begins to warm up, you may think it harmless to simply dry your clothes indoors.

However, leaving them to dry indoors might contribute to breathing problems, particularly in asthma sufferers.

In fact, research has shown that wet clothes draped over drying frames can raise the moisture level inside your home by up to 30 per cent.

And this moisture can encourage the release of mould and fungal spores, which are often invisible to the naked eye.

If you're not sensitive to mould, your body might not show any reaction. However, you might cough or sneeze if you have asthma, and your symptoms can become worse.

People most likely to react to these spores include those with existing skin problems or with weakened immune systems, such as the elderly. In worse case scenarios, these spores can actually cause lung infections.

The best way to avoid any of these issues is to take your clothes out onto the terrace or garden to dry. If you must dry your clothes indoors but don't have a balcony, or your balcony is enclosed, then always make sure to leave the windows open.

If you use a tumble dryer, be sure the ventilator tube directs the air outside of your home. Also, get in to the habit of regularly checking your air conditioning filters to make sure they are clean and dry.

YOUR relationship with your dog is special. You are responsible for its care and welfare. Eventually there comes a most difficult life or death decision for the welfare of the animal and for you and your family.

The decision is a personal one but it need not be a solitary one. Your vet and your family and friends can assist and support you. Consider not only what is best for your dog, but also what is best for you and your family. Quality of life is important for pets and people alike.

If your dog can no longer enjoy the things which once gave it pleasure, or if there is more pain than quality in its life, if your dog is terminally ill or critically injured, or if the financial or emotional cost of treatment is beyond your means, euthanasia may be the only option. It also might be necessary if a dog has become vicious, dangerous, or unmanageable, but remember some undesirable and abnormal behaviour can be changed with a qualified behaviourist.

problems together with changes in lifestyle may also force an owner to consider euthanasia of a dog. Obviously it is better to find another solution or an alternative home for these pets.

Your vet understands attachment to pets and can examine and evaluate your dog's condition, estimate your dog's chances for recovery, discuss potential disabilities and long-term problems, explain the medical options and possible outcomes. But he cannot make the euthanasia decision for you.

It is very important that you fully understand your dog's condition. If there is any part of the diagnosis or the implications for your dog's future that you don't understand, ask to have it explained again. Rarely will the situation require an immediate decision. Usually, there will be time to review the facts.

Eventually you may wish to discuss the disposal of your dog's body with your family

and vet. You have several options and your vet can provide information about burial, cremation or other alternatives.

Discuss with the family what the vet has said. Long-term medical care could be a burden, either emotionally or financially. Encourage family members to express their thoughts and feelings. Even if you have reached a decision, family members, especially children, should have their feelings considered.

Children have special relationships with their pets. Excluding or protecting children from this decision-making process, because they are thought to be too young to understand, may only complicate their grieving. Children respect straightforward, truthful, and simple answers. If they are prepared adequately, they are usually able to accept a dog's death.

Euthanasia is almost always

accomplished by injection of a death-inducing drug. Your vet may administer a tranquilliser first to relax your dog. Following the death-inducing injection, your dog will immediately go into a quiet and irreversible deep unconsciousness. Death will come quickly and painlessly. The act of saying goodbye is an important step in managing the natural and healthy feelings of grief, sorrow, and sense of loss. Your dog is an important part of your life and it is natural to feel you are losing a friend.

Once the decision for euthanasia has been made, you and other family members may want to say goodbye to your dog. A last evening with your dog at home or a visit to the dog at the hospital may be appropriate. Family members who want to be alone with the animal should be allowed to do so. Farewells are always difficult.

After your dog has died, it is

natural and normal to feel grief and sorrow. The grieving process includes accepting the reality of your loss, accepting

that the loss and accompanying feelings are painful, and adjusting to your new life that no longer includes your dog.

A 1965 JAGUAR E-type raced by Sir Stirling Moss is shortly to be auctioned, and is expected to sell for between €125,000 and €150,000.

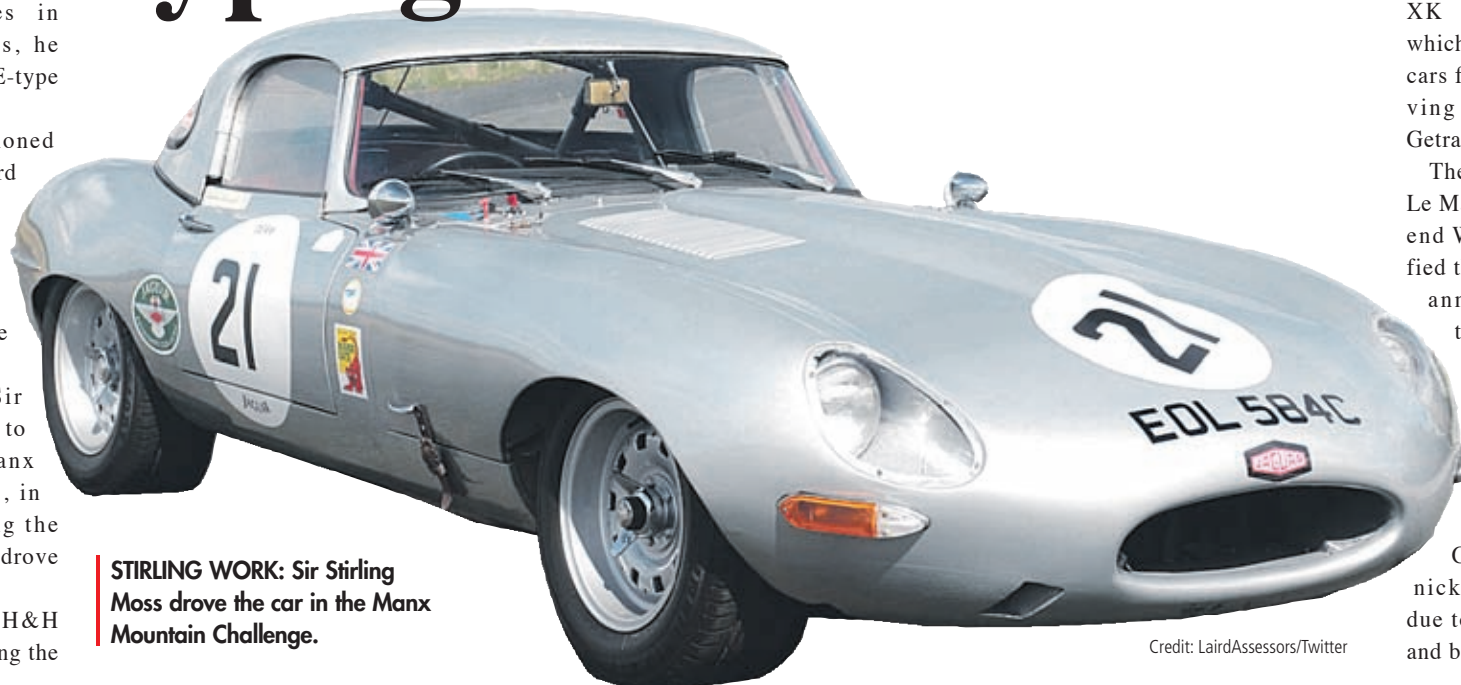
Although Moss started his career as a Jaguar works driver, with successes in XK120s and C-types, he never competed in an E-type during its heyday.

The car being auctioned started life as a standard E-type Roadster and was converted to a road-legal racer by marque specialist Jeremy Broad in the 1980's.

It was loaned to Sir Stirling Moss in 1991 to compete in the Manx Mountain Challenge, in the process becoming the first E-type that Moss drove competitively.

Auction House H&H Classics, which is selling the

car at RAC Woodcote Park near Epsom, Surrey, says the car features many original components, including an aluminium bonnet fabricated by Abbey Panels.

It also has a 4.2 litre version of the classic Jaguar XK straight-six engine, which powered the Coventry cars from 1949 to 1992, driving through a five-speed Getrag gearbox.

The car was later raced by Le Mans and touring car legend Win Percy, who qualified third in the special 40th anniversary race for E-types at Donington Park in 2001.

Among the 54 other lots in the H&H sale is a modern recreation of the famed 1973 BMW CSL touring car racer, nicknamed the Batmobile due to its outrageous wings and bulbous bodywork.

Driverless cars will kill says official

A FORMER highways agency chief who served under Barack Obama has said it is inevitable that driverless cars will kill people as they appear on the road.

Dr Mark Rosekind, the former US highway traffic safety administrator warned that 'there will be some lives lost' as tech companies and car manufacturers experiment with autonomous vehicles.

However, he insisted that their introduction will eventually lead to much safer streets in the future.

Discussing the future of transport on BBC Radio 4, he said:

"Unfortunately there will be crashes. People are going to get hurt and there will be some lives lost."

Despite this, he added that businesses and regulators, "should really be focused on the potential for zero deaths on our roadways."

The technology industry is locked in a debate surrounding the ethics of releasing autonomous systems 'into the wild' after investments from Google, Uber, Tesla and car-

makers significantly accelerated its development.

Dr Rosekind now serves as head of safety innovation at driverless car start-up Zoox, and his comments mark a rare admission from an official acknowledging the price to pay for safer roads in future.

ROAD TEST

by Nick Fletcher

THE Mazda MX-5 RF is a head-turning version of its soft-top stable-mate, offering a powered hardtop instead of the usual fabric roof and providing better security and more refinement.

The RF certainly attracts attention with its supercar-style buttress rear fins and most people who asked me about it thought it cost far more than it actually does!

Mazda designers deserve much praise for such arresting styling - and unusually, the folding roof doesn't reduce the available boot space which at 130 litres was small anyway.

Other than the hardtop feature, the RF is essentially the same as the standard MX-5, which in almost 30 years of production has become the two-seater sports car icon.

The RF is priced from €25,643 (£22,496) in 131 hp 1.5 litre form though the version I tested had the 2.0 litre 158 hp engine and in entry-level SEL Nav trim is priced at €27,126 (£23,795). Top speed is 215 kph (134 mph),

the 0-100 kph time a crisp 7.4 seconds. Fuel consumption is 14.4 kpl (40.9 mpg) and emissions 161 g/km.

SE L Nav models come with climate and cruise control, power windows, remote central locking, alloys wheels, LED headlamps, an 18cm (seven-inch) screen and connected infotainment system and sat-nav.

The wrap-around cabin is a

cosy fit, with minimal stowage space - no door pockets, no glove-box, just a small lockable compartment behind the seats. But none of this matters much as the car attracts carefree buyers who will fling a small hold-all into the boot and zoom off for a fun weekend in the countryside or on the coast.

Mazda has upgraded the cabin materials and together

with the new styling, the RF has more kudos and a more up-market appearance.

Underway, it is quick and nimble and with the roof closed, more quiet and refined. Handling is assured, ride quality decent by sports car standards. Overall the RF provides fun driving with an engaging panache which some of its more expensive rivals may find hard to match.

Hyundai says buy buy buy

DRIVERS could soon be able to buy a coffee or order their dinner while on the road.

Korean manufacturer Hyundai, is working on new connected car technology that will allow motorists to pay for a range of services straight from their vehicle.

Developed in partnership with software company Xevo, the technology is being designed to simplify daily purchases for drivers to make.

Current connected software in some luxury motors already allows the driver to track down contact details of restaurants or hotels, but Hyundai's new developments promise to add some-

thing extra.

The technology will allegedly store the driver's card details within the on-board computer, allowing purchases to be made online.

However, it is still in its early stages and the software will need to take into account security risks and driving laws.

The system would need to be voice activated to avoid potential distracted driving charges if users were to operate it on the road.

It will also need to develop data protection methods to keep the owner's payment details secure.

Hyundai's north American arm is currently in

charge of the project, but it could well be replicated in the UK, if successful.

Manish Mehrotra, Director of Connected Operations at Hyundai Motor America, said:

"Once our owners experience placing a to-go order using their vehicle's touchscreen and seamlessly routing to the location, we know they're going to love it."

"Offering easy-to-use payment options as part of navigation will simplify the driving experience and maximise time spent with eyes on the road."

Hamilton could quit F1 in 2020

LEWIS HAMILTON could sensationally quit Formula 1 in 2020, according to commentator and former F1 driver, David Coulthard.

Hamilton's current contract expires at the end of the year but soon he is expected to pen a lucrative two-year extension.

That would take him to the end of the 2020 season, which will align with when Liberty Media are planning to make vast changes to the sport in a bid to make it more competitive.

Coulthard thinks Hamilton, who would be 35 years old then, could call time on his racing career to focus on releasing his first music album.

"I think it's got to be on his mind," Coulthard said on BBC Radio 2's Graham Norton Show on Saturday.

"I think he'll go to 2020

which is the end of the current Concorde agreement, but beyond that there is every likelihood he will be releasing his first album."

Hamilton is currently leading the Driver's Championship this season as he searches for his fifth world title.

Asked who he felt may be in line to take Hamilton's place at Mercedes, Coulthard suggested reigning GP3 champion George Russell.

"He's with Mercedes as a reserve driver, so he wouldn't be known internationally," Coulthard said.

"But he's certainly someone that has got skills, talent and potential."

Lorenzo rides high in Italy

SPAIN'S Jorge Lorenzo claimed his first win for Ducati at the Italian Grand Prix as championship leader Marc Marquez crashed out at the Mugello circuit.

Three-time champion Lorenzo has struggled since leaving Yamaha in 2016 but beat teammate Andrea Dovizioso into second.

Seven-time world champion Valentino Rossi became the first rider to reach 5,000 points in MotoGP with third.

"I said that winning at Mugello with Ducati was a dream for me," said Lorenzo, who has retired from two races this season.

"It's one of the most special wins of my entire career."

Moments later though, he signalled what many had suspected: that he would be leaving the Ducati team at the end of the season.

Marc Marquez crashed before finishing 16th in Tuscany, though he remains comfortably clear of the standings

after five races.

The Spaniard had been bidding for his fourth straight win this season but fell off his Honda on the fifth lap.

Rossi moves up into second in the standings, 23 points behind Marquez, with Yamaha team-mate Maverick Vinales in third.

Fury to go on Seferi

He compared boxing with marriage, in that you fall in and out of love and have to work at it.

"But I have spiced it back up again, bought her some sexy lingerie and we are back at it, better than ever."
