Free passes announced

THE new Spanish government has revealed plans to remove charges from more than 500 kilometres of toll roads across the country, including the AP-7 between Alicante and Tarragona, and the AP-4 from Sevilla to Cadiz.

Tears flow

THE country remains in shock after four women were killed by their partners in Granada, Menorca, Barcelona and Pontevedra (Galicia) in the space of 48 hours over the weekend, sparking a new debate over domestic violence in Spain.

TWO men including a Charlton Athletic footballer accused of sexually assaulting a British holidaymaker in Ibiza could be forced to stay on the island for weeks.

A lawyer acting for forward Reeco Hackett-Fairchild is reportedly trying to change his bail conditions after a Spanish judge ordered him to hand over his passport.

But if the appeal fails he and fellow suspect Olusola Odejayi, 26, could face a month-long court battle as they fight to clear their names.

Hackett-Fairchild's team mate Karlan Ahearne-Grant, 20, who was also held in the wake of the allegations, is being probed for a privacy offence but has been allowed to return to the UK.

The three were last week arrested after a 19-year-old girl's parents told police she had been attacked in a Cala de Bou hotel near San Antonio while on a family break.

They are believed to have partied at the Ocean Beach club before meeting the unnamed teen and a female friend at a bar, inviting them back to their hotel.

events as "credible and coherent," and said there exist "reasonable doubts" that a rape had taken place.

She said in a written ruling justifying her decision to grant bail: "Although the victim's statement has credibility and was made when she was very upset, the report by the forensic doctor does not show any type of injury or even bruising on her thighs and genital area when the victim has stated she was a virgin."

Ahearne-Grant's phone has been sent to Madrid as police try to recover deleted videos that could prove crucial to the enquiry, and the striker must visit the Spanish Embassy in London twice per month as part of his bail conditions.

Hackett-Fairchild has made 12 appearances for Charlton, scoring twice, while Ahearne-Grant has played for the League One club 69 times, netting seven times.

A Charlton Athletic official told UK media: "The club have been made aware and are looking into this matter. Due to the ongoing investigation we will not be commenting any further at this stage."

one of the men - later identified as Odejayi - then forced himself on the young woman while Hackett-Fairchild held her down and Ahearne-Grant filmed the scene on a mobile phone.

But it later emerged that the 'victim' engaged in a sex act with the player before the alleged attack, after she confessed to "kisses and sexual things" when quizzed in court.

Asked to specify what had occurred by Jaime Campaner, defending, she replied: "Oral sex."

She then said she failed to confirm it in her initial police statement due to nerves, while the men have insisted that what occurred was consensual.

The admission came after judge Carmen Robles Zamora earlier described their version of

Store hours to extend

SHOPS in areas popular with tourists in the Valencia region are set to be able to open on Sundays and holidays as of this Sunday until January 13 next year. Regional authority officials said the plans were in response to requests from shoppers and added around 1,000 jobs could be created as a result.

Fakes seized

POLICE officers have uncovered more than 7,300 counterfeit clothes, footwear and accessories in raids on shops and market stalls in Benidorm and Altea. National Police and Guardia Civil officers claimed they seized goods worth the equivalent in lost revenue of €120,000 in Benidorm and €140,000 in Altea, with 10 people held.

Drugs raid

TEN people aged between 34 and 58 have been arrested in connection with the alleged purchasing of medicine from pharmacies with false prescriptions as part of a wider drugs ring. Guardia Civil officers based in the San Juan area of Alicante said they launched the investigation following the attempted purchases in Muchamiel.

Road death

A 21-YEAR-OLD man has died and two people were injured after their car left the road and crashed into a wall in Tavernas de la Valldigna. Traffic authorities said the accident took place at around 1.55am last Saturday with the reasons for the crash which involved five people unclear.

Scam warning

RESIDENTS have been warned of a new mobile telephone scam. Phone owners are urged to beware of the fraudulent number 662 991 273, which appears to be connected to the provider Vodafone, but is a con number which will call back repeatedly. Upon answering, threatening messages are issued or there is silence, therefore it is highly advisable to block the number.

Man held

A 56-YEAR-OLD has been arrested in connection with the death of a 31-year-old man in Benifaio. The alleged victim died in hospital five days after the incident and the suspect has been charged with murder and remanded in custody by The Court of Instruction in Carlet following his arrest south of the town.

Defenceless

MIGRANTS rescued from the Mediterranean Sea and turned away by Italy and Malta have been granted 45 days' special permission to stay in Spain.

It comes after humanitarian ship Aquarius and two other vessels docked in Valencia with 630 people, including 123 unaccompanied children and seven pregnant women, aboard.

Spain's new socialist Prime Minister, Pedro Sanchez, had earlier stepped in to help, insisting his country had a duty to help prevent "a humanitarian catastrophe."

The migrants, who come from 26 countries, had spent eight days at sea after being picked up from overcrowded rubber dinghies off the coast of Libya.

"The weather was very bad unfortunately, and the sea was

rough," said Sophie Beau of aid organisation SOS Mediterranee. "So people are in a bad state... and they are really relieved to come onto safe land at the moment."

Red Cross official Pedro Redon said that the migrants received food and hygiene kits, psychological help and medical assistance, while French President Emmanuel Macron has pledged his government will help Spain deal with them.

The Aquarius sparked a diplomatic row after Italy and Malta argued that the boat fell under the other's jurisdiction.

Valencia mayor Joan Ribo described Italy's decision to turn the boat away as "inhuman," before Spain's Maritime Rescue said it had saved an additional 1,290 people over the weekend alone.

Abuse sentence

A COURT in Alicante has sentenced a man found guilty of sexually abusing the then 11-year-old daughter of his former partner to 14 years and three months in prison.

The court heard the defendant, named as Pedro HS, carried out the assaults over four months.

Prosecutors claimed the man began abusing her in January 2012 at the family's home in Villena. He kissed her and touched her genitals.

Assaults then took place every two or three days against the girl's will, with the defendant holding her down by force and stripping her naked.

The girl told a schoolteacher in November 2014 when she was 14 years old. The teacher then informed her mother who reported the defendant to the police.

The court ruled the man cannot contact the girl or her family for 17 years and that he must compensate the victim with €10,000.

Night of fire

IT'S among the year's most anticipated events. And as the summer solstice approaches, Spain is gearing up to celebrate La Noche de San Juan (St John's Eve).

The annual midsummer party on the shortest night of the year sees Spaniards honour the birth date of San Juan - John the Baptist in English - and many parts of the country have their own traditions based heavily on the purifying and cleansing elements of fire and water.

In coastal regions revellers tend to head for the beach, constructing hogueras, or bonfires, around which they eat, drink and dance before typically having a midnight ocean dip.

Effigies representing Judas Escariot might also be thrown into the flames, while in some areas party-goes make wishes known as juras before leaping through the fire three times and heading for the sea to cleanse their sins for the year ahead.

In Cataluña, the Valencian Community and the Balearics, Saint John is known as Sant Joan and these areas are particularly well-known for

their fireworks displays and special foods like the Coca de Sant Joan cake.

Catalans tend to celebrate with correfoc (fire-running) displays and the building of human pyramids dubbed castellers, while in Alicante elaborate figures are burned before the flames are extinguished by firefighters who then soak on-lookers in a ritual known as the Banyà.

And in Ciutadella, Menorca, the party lasts for a week and sees the island's horses dancing and marching through the crowds who later engage in mock battles using hazelnut shells as weapons.

Lanjaron in Granada sees the celebrations descend into a giant water fight, and in Puerto de la Cruz, Tenerife, goat herders bring their animals to the fishing village's beach before dunking them in the sea.

A custom particular to San Pedro Manrique, Castilla y Leon, sees men walking barefoot over hot coals while carrying a woman on their backs.

It is a truly magical night and not to be missed.

Stag do tragedy

THE family of a British holidaymaker killed on a Benidorm stag will be able to repatriate his body after an on-line campaign.

It remains unclear how dad-of-two Lee Okrasa, from Wisewood in Sheffield, died but the appeal soared beyond its £5,000 target within 24 hours of being set up after it emerged he did not have travel insurance.

Family friend Scarlett Cooper, who set up the campaign, wrote: "Sadly today Lee Okrasa passed away in Benidorm leaving behind his family and friends.

"Lee was an amazing, genuine guy who was loved by many.

Unfortunately Lee had no insurance meaning the cost to get him back is £5,000!

"We need to get him back to his family as soon as possible, please help as anything will help."

Lee's partner Lindsay spoke of her loss on Facebook, writing: "Words cannot describe how utterly devastated we are. I am numb with pain, sorrow, guilt, loss and every other emotion I can't put into words. It doesn't seem real and I can't accept it.

"Please don't take your loved ones for granted and give them an extra special

squeeze tonight.'

Tributes poured in from friends, as Lindsay Keeley

Shaw added: 'I have no words. Lee will be sadly missed.'

Fire brigade braced

FIREFIGHTERS and other emergency services personnel have held meetings on preventing and tackling forest blazes in Petrer during the summer.

Local Police officers, Red Cross workers, environmental volunteers and Alicante Provincial Council officials discussed sharing resources and arranging a monitoring regime going forward.

Silvia Rodriguez, the local authority's environment spokesperson, said vigilance had to be maintained to prevent fires.

She added it was also important to keep watch over areas where lots of people lived.

Local Police and rural rangers are set to undertake daily patrols of areas at risk of fires and to inspect them in the wake of the meeting.

Authorities said it was important to keep rural roads clear in order to allow emergency services vehicles to travel to blazes should they break out.

They reportedly hope to deal with outbreaks quickly before they spread.

And Molly Sisson wrote: 'What a lovely, genuine man... He will be sadly missed.'

Laura Diaz Ward posted: 'I'm absolutely gutted. Lee was amazing he will definitely be missed.'

A Foreign and Commonwealth Office official said: "We are providing assistance to the family of a British man who died on June 17 in Benidorm."

Both finished off their looks with baseball caps and trendy sunglasses as they took a stroll along the water's edge with daughters Lia and Capri, aged five and three.

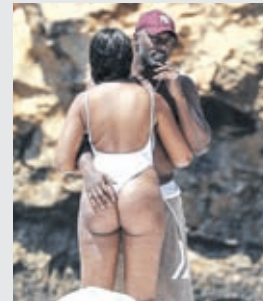
She's a real peach

Holiday threat

Strikes could spark chaos this week

SPANISH air controllers could plunge Britons' holiday plans into chaos after threatening to strike this week.

The disgruntled employees plan industrial action in holiday hotspots including Barcelona, Palma de Mallorca, Ibiza and Menorca.

And one official said that some of those involved could even walk out of their jobs if they continue to be ignored by national air navigation manager ENAIRE and the new Spanish government.

The employees are demanding a different timetable amid complaints they are forced to work seven days out of every eight, with a combination of morning and night shifts meaning they rarely see their families, or they are exhausted when they do.

They also claim that the conditions could cause accidents if staff become overtired.

Representative Raul Torabuella told *The Sun*: "Our conditions are far from be-

ing normal."

"I can assure you that our working situation is the worst in the whole of Europe.

"We would not anticipate too many flights being cancelled but there could be huge delays because there will be staff shortages."

Around 2.8 million British holidaymakers visited the Balearic Islands last year, with July, the most popular month, likely to be worst-hit by the strikes should they go ahead.

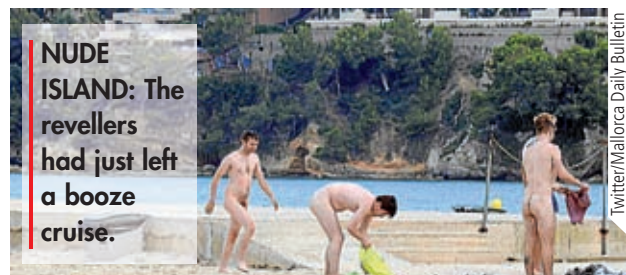

Preparing for Brexit and residency in Spain

The Brexit transition period agreed in March gives British expatriates and those wishing to move to Spain more time to prepare. This was welcome news, but the clock is still ticking to get ready in time, particularly where paperwork is involved.

The key issue for many people is residence - If you are already living here, will there be any problems with you staying after Brexit? If you are still arranging your move to Spain, how can you secure residence in time?

The UK and EU27 have committed to maintain existing residency rights for Britons and EU nationals who are "lawfully residing" within either area before the withdrawal date and they can continue "to live, work or study as they currently do under the same conditions as under Union law".

Although the official Brexit date is 29th March 2019, the transition period effectively 'pauses' Brexit until 31st December 2020 to

enable citizens and businesses to prepare for the changes.

If you are settled in Spain before the end of 2020, you should keep the right to stay there for as long as you remain resident. But what does lawful residency mean in practice? How close can you get to demonstrating that in time?

Although December 2020 may seem some way away, it is advisable to start the process as soon as possible rather than risk being caught in an administrative

queue of others trying to do the same thing as the deadline approaches.

Beyond Brexit, we do not yet know how acquiring residency, visas and permits will work, but can expect this to be less straightforward than today.

As a foreigner living in Spain, there are a number of things you should do anyway to register here, regardless of Brexit.

All EU/EEA nationals staying in Spain more than three months should have the residence certificate *Certificado de Registro de Ciudadano de la Unión* (also known as *Certificado de Registro Comunitario*).

If you spend more than 183 days here you are also obliged to register with your local municipal registry (*Padrón Municipal*).

Residents (and Spanish property owners) should have the *NIE* fiscal identification number.

Of course, if you meet any of the criteria to be tax resident, you

also should have formally registered with the Spanish tax office and submitted annual income tax and wealth tax (if applicable) returns.

Longer-term residents of Spain can take further steps. If you can demonstrate continuous legal residence in Spain for at least five years you can apply for permanent residency. If you can do this for 10 years, Spanish nationality is an option - but you would have to renounce your UK nationality first.

There may be other steps you can take to help demonstrate your Spanish residence before the Brexit.

Take personalised advice to establish what steps you may still need to take to formalise your residency in Spain. Talk to a financial adviser early on for guidance on how your affairs should be structured to avoid unintended consequences. They can review your tax and estate

planning, pensions and investments to help you set them up in the best way for your life in Spain, pre and post Brexit.

Brexit and pension transfers. A window of opportunity?

Last year the UK began to impose a 25% tax on transfers to overseas pension schemes, including QROPS. This currently excludes individuals and QROPS where both are resident in a European Economic Area (including Gibraltar) country, but who knows what will happen after Brexit? If you wish to move your pension overseas, it may be better to do so now, under known rules, rather than wait and see what happens. Pension transfers can take months, so don't risk leaving it too late.

Gun attack

AN ex-drug lord who orchestrated a Breaking Bad-style drugs plot from his luxury Alicante villa has been shot outside a Greater Manchester school in what detectives say was a targeted attack.

Neil Strong, 36, is said to be in a serious condition after being wounded in the 'upper body' on Harris Drive in Unsworth, Bury. Investigators were alerted to the attempted hit after residents reported hearing gun shots near a local primary school.

Mr Strong is believed to have driven himself to Fairfield General Hospital, Bury, in a grey van before officers arrived at the scene.

The vehicle reportedly had one punctured tyre and what appeared to be a gunshot hole in the passenger door when it arrived to the hospital car park, where it was later cordoned off by police.

Chief Inspector Phil Spurgeon, of Greater Manchester

Police's Bury Borough, said: "Our investigation remains in its early stages but I can confirm that from the information we have we are treating this as a targeted attack, and there is not believed to be any wider threat to the community."

Mr Strong was in 2014 jailed with three others as the leader of a gang setting up a drugs factory in a detached house in nearby Radcliffe.

His associates Damian Vose, 38, from Radcliffe, was handed a 32-month jail term while Paul Cuthbert, 45, from Bury, and Daniel Pinder, 33, from Manchester, each received 30-month sentences.

The cartel was caught red-handed in the wake of a National Crime Agency (NCA) covert surveillance operation while plotting to make €1.8 million-worth of amphetamines.

They bought barrels of chemicals to produce the drugs and the property was raided when Mr Strong flew in from Spain to oversee the process.

He tried to escape after vaulting a fence, but was caught after a foot chase.

Evidence seized included presses and a vacuum-packing machine, while more presses were unearthed at stables belonging to Mr Strong in Prestwich, before raw chemicals were found at his Alicante villa.

Properties and a yacht he owned were also taken possession of during the swoops.

A serious crime prevention order was issued in his name following his release from prison in a bid to restrict his

movement and place limits on the number of mobile phones and other devices he was allowed to own.

He must also advise the authorities ahead of any trip abroad and is banned from carrying more than £3,000 in cash.

An appeal to lift the order was turned down in January 2017, while in 2016 a Land Rover was blown up on the same street where he was shot last Monday.

Brit critical after plunge

A 22-YEAR-OLD British holidaymaker is believed to be in critical condition after plummeting nine metres from an Ibiza apartment.

The incident took place at the Pino Verde complex

in Sant Antoni, and the victim is being treated at the Nuestra Señora de Rosario private clinic in Ibiza town, medics said.

Initial reports suggest the unnamed young man fell down a stairwell.

Beach horror plunge

Brit holidaymaker seriously hurt

A BRITISH holidaymaker is fighting for his life after a horror plunge from a Mallorca sea wall.

John Anderson, from Lerwick, Shetland, suffered severe head injuries and hypothermia was setting in when he was taken to capital Palma's Son Espases Hospital, leaving him in a "very serious" condition, medics said.

The 58-year-old Scot is believed to have lost his balance after staying on the high structure to smoke a cigarette when his wife Ellen, 59, and friends returned to their accommodation after a night out.

He was found on rocks next to El Toro beach near Santa Ponsa, Calvia the next morning after lying injured for around seven hours.

Investigators said the incident is not being treated as suspicious with evidence pointing to an accident.

Mr Anderson is a shore superintendent with Lerwick Port Authority and his daughter Eilidh, 27, is also on holiday with her parents.

A hospital source said:

"The British tourist remains in intensive care and his condition is very serious."

A Foreign and Commonwealth Office official added: "Foreign Office staff are assisting a British man following his hospitalisation in Palma and are in contact with his family and the Spanish authorities."

Several hurt

MULTIPLE people, including two children, were left injured after a van and car crashed into each other at the entrance to the Finestrat shopping centre.

Emergency services were called out to the roundabout on the centre's access road following the accident at around 9.30am last Thursday. The reason for the crash remains unknown, according

to reports.

The two injured children were taken to the Hospital Clinica in Benidorm following the accident and emergency services said their injuries were not serious.

The driver of the van was also hurt.

Emergency services closed one of the lanes at the roundabout following the crash, causing some delays.

One British passenger was held by police after the boat docked in Cannes, France, while another vomited into the swimming pool and others were seen slumped in corridors after passing out.

Thirty-seven-year-old Alicia Morris, who was aboard the cruise, said: "It was like a floating episode of Geordie Shore with drugs and escorts and a police raid or two."

"The show was being filmed all the time on the boat, with cameras everywhere."

A man who abandoned ship in Ibiza said: "I will never ever again go on such a trashy trip. The crowd was very Geordie Shore. Utter rip off."

"I know of drug dealers making an absolute killing and running out as the demand was so high. We left after three days as it was a joke."

Those involved in the show have not been accused of anything illegal.

Channel 4 said in a statement: "We cannot comment on the behaviour of other passengers."

Anchored Cruises failed to respond to a comment request.

THIS is the hair-raising moment that an eight-foot shark terrified sun-seekers on a Spanish beach.

The appearance of the giant predator sparked panic as tourists screamed "it's coming" while lifeguards hoisted red flags to stop people swimming at Arenal d'en Castell in Es Mercadal, Menorca.

Believed to be a blue shark, the fish stayed in the area for several hours before returning to deeper water.

Bathers were not allowed to enter the water for the rest of the afternoon.

In the video footage, one beachgoer is heard to say in English: "It's coming. Oh my God, I think it's dead."

A woman then replies "No, it's not dead," as others shriek in the background, before adding: "Every time we go to the beach something happens."

Dozens of those gathered at the shoreline of the sandy strip - half an

hour from island capital Mahon and popular with British holidaymakers - recorded the animal on their mobile phones.

Town mayor Francesa Ametller said it had not behaved aggressively and said the decision to clear the water was only a precaution.

The blue shark rarely bites humans, but does occasionally approach Mediterranean shores.

An individual was last summer pulled onto a beach in Mallorca after sending hundreds of horrified bathers running out of the sea, while in May this year a sighting in Fuengirola triggered pandemonium and a police hunt on the Costa del Sol.

Man dies in road rage stabbing

A 31-YEAR-OLD from Villajoyosa died five days after he was stabbed in a road rage incident.

Accompanied by his girlfriend he was heading for Ali-

cante on the A-7 when he overtook another car near Picassent. The other driver took exception and after a series of sudden bursts of speed and swerves, he wound down his window and

shouted, "Stop at the petrol station! Stop at the petrol station!"

Daniel stopped at a filling station outside Benifaio (Valencia), arriving first and CCTV cameras show the other driver stopping shortly afterwards.

Walking towards his victim, he stopped a few centimetres away and as both men argued, tried to stab Daniel but missed.

The second time the knife pierced his victim's left side, reaching his heart, and the attacker turned and fled in his car.

Daniel returned to his own

vehicle unaware that he was wounded until he saw blood on his t-shirt. "Cari, they've stabbed me!" he exclaimed to his girlfriend before losing consciousness.

He was taken in a Local Police patrol car to the health centre in Benifaio and from there to La Fe hospital in Valencia City, where he died five days later.

His attacker, who had an extensive police record and served several prison terms, was arrested 90 minutes after the stabbing and is now remanded in custody.

QROPS used to offer several benefits over UK based pensions as a transfer option if you lived abroad, but recent changes in legislation have equalised the benefits of transferring to a UK based pension, rather than a QROPS. In addition, HMRC have introduced new legislation that could lead to a potential tax charge of 25% for new QROPS applications received

32 years for kingpin

A BRITISH drugs kingpin who built a €1.4 million Costa del Sol mansion has been jailed for 32 years.

James Mulvey 'lived like a ghost' for seven years after he fled the UK over his role in a €77 million smuggling ring.

The 42-year-old from Solihull in the West Midlands used fake names and remained on the move, checking into hotels and paying in cash, sometimes via third parties.

He also used mobile phones dubbed 'burners,' which he quickly dumped to avoid being traced.

Birmingham Crown Court heard how the haulage boss lived a lavish lifestyle, raking in up to €85,000 per week and constructing a villa in Marbella with

indoor and outdoor swimming pools plus a cinema.

The father-of-five drove luxury cars including Land Rovers and Mercedes and wore Rolex

watches while living in five-star hotels, also living in Brazil, Portugal and the Netherlands.

At one point he was overheard bragging to a girlfriend: "Listen,

no one can control me baby, even me dad and mum will tell ya I'm f***ing nuts."

But the 'untouchable' crime lord was eventually tracked down after a covert surveillance operation saw armed police raid his hideout in Lithuania last year.

He was cuffed in his underpants at gunpoint and extradited to the UK, and has now been convicted of four conspiracy charges after acting as the 'linchpin' of the international plot.

Prosecutors added that Mulvey developed a €1,100 per week cocaine habit and set up

bogus haulage businesses to import 'industrial scale' quantities of drugs from Europe to Britain and Ireland in 2006 and 2007.

He fled to Spain when 22kg of cocaine and 392kg of cannabis hidden in metal rollers and worth an estimated €45 million was intercepted in Belgium 11 years ago.

But his children continued to attend private schools in Worcestershire and Somerset.

Judge Mark Wall QC said a probe had revealed 14 previous trips connected to his cabal, during which it is believed that up to

5.5 tonnes of cannabis and 300kg of cocaine entered the UK.

He later transported the narcotics in mini Harley Davidson motorcycles and inflatable sea scooters.

Addressing Mulvey he said: "I treat it as a representative load for the purposes of estimating the total quantity of drugs traded as a result of this conspiracy.

"On the evidence presented to me at trial I conclude that the wholesale value of these drugs would have been in the region of at least £17m wholesale and £42m retail for the cocaine, and £60m retail for the cannabis."

The accused smiled at family members as the verdict was read out, as the judge continued: "You were involved in the large-scale importation of these drugs into this country from continental Europe and its onward transportation to Ireland where doubtless it was to be sold at a great profit.

"You gave evidence that you yourself have taken cocaine for many years.

"You would have been acutely aware of the misery and ruined lives that this drug brings in its wake."

The National Crime Agency (NCA) said in a statement released in the wake of Mulvey's arrest that he was traced despite changing his mobile phone on a daily basis and using unregistered SIM cards.

Investigators also obtained recordings of him speaking about the murder of his Irish cousin Gerard 'Hatchet' Kavanagh, who in 2014 was shot dead on the Costa Del Sol.

In one he was heard to say: "When we first started there was four bosses, me, Glasses, him [Kavanagh], who's just got shot dead, and another kid."

He also spoke of how he feared assassination, saying: "The life I lead, you never know what can happen. I do what I do, people try to kill me."

After the 10-week trial, NCA regional head Andy Quinn said: "Mr Mulvey would classify him-

Something nasty in Monte Pego

FOR many years there have been periodic spills of discoloured and foul-smelling wastewater at the Monte Pego sewage plant.

These have been ignored or downplayed, the Asociacion de Vecinos de la Montaña de Pego (AVMP) residents' association recently told the *Euro Weekly News*.

The latest leak started last December, spilling millions of litres of presumably toxic wastewater into the environment. This is flowing towards nearby waterways and could eventually reach the Pego-Oliva marsh which is a national park and nature reserve.

The growing concerns of Monte Pego residents and repeated requests for a thorough investigation from the AVMP finally led to a comprehensive analysis of the spills at the end of March.

Samples were taken from four locations at the Monte Pego wastewater disposal system, with the understanding that the results would be made available to the AVMP.

"In fact the lab results were presented to us by Pego Town Hall officials but without reference values," said the AVMP president Bernd Miller. "Obviously, without comparison data the results are meaningless and we sincerely hope this omission is not an attempt to withhold undesirable news."

Meanwhile the AVMP obtained separate evaluations of the results from two independent profession-

al sources who confirmed that all the analysed substances were up to 10 times over European Commission limits.

Examination of solid material reflected a significant content of faecal particles, they added.

"All these results point towards environmental pollution of major proportions requiring immediate action from the local and regional governments," Bernd Miller said.

Parents Tony and Sandra made the decision to switch off machines keeping him alive after sisters Tara and Or-la travelled to the island to say goodbye.

Sandra later posted on Facebook: 'Our lives will never be the same, the support we have received as a family has been amazing and is a true reflection of what a wonderful young man Jack

turned out to be.

'Jack ticked the donor box on his learner licence and it is a comfort knowing people are alive today as a result of Jack's tragic accident.

'Thanks to everyone for all the kind words and wishes. Your support is really appreciated at this sad time.

'Our hearts are broken.'

Jack had been working as an apprentice at an electrical firm and his manager Frank McGovern called him a 'love-

ly young fella,' adding that his workmates were 'very broken up.'

Francis Sheehan, Secretary of Askeaton AFC, described Jack as a 'key player' in their youth football sides.

"Our thoughts and prayers are with him and his parents, and his sisters," he added.

And one local added: "It is just heartbreaking for the whole community."

Police in Mallorca continue to probe the accident.

Spy claims probed

INVESTIGATORS in Belgium are set to probe claims that Spain may have used agents and GPS technology to track former President of Cataluña Carles Puigdemont.

Comite R, Belgium's intelligence services watchdog, has set the investigation in motion at the request of right-wing Parliament member Peter Buysrogge according to the country's media.

"I want to know whether an intervention of the Spanish intelligence or security services has taken place on our territory," Buysrogge said.

He added he also wanted the probe to establish whether or not any spying took place with the knowledge of his country's intelligence authorities.

Buysrogge is a member of the separatist Flemish Alliance (N-VA) party. He has previously expressed sympathy with Puigdemont's efforts to lead Catalan out of Spain which culminated in last year's independence referendum and declaration.

Puigdemont fled to Belgium after Spanish authorities charged him with rebellion and corruption over the referendum. He is currently in Germany awaiting a court decision on whether to allow his extradition.

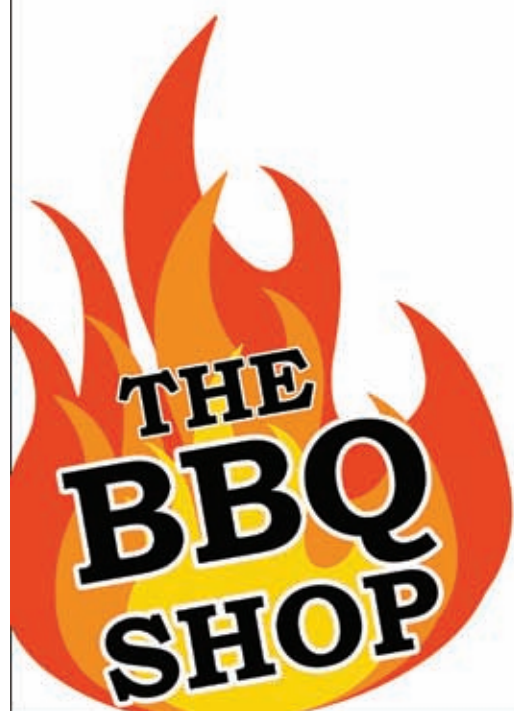
Orange alert until the end of summer

Deadly cocktail

Brit died of alcohol poisoning

A BRITISH holidaymaker died from alcohol poisoning after a Canary Islands pub crawl.

NHS pharmacy worker Paula Bishop, 37, was found dead in her hotel room after she accidentally drank too much wine and beer on the first day of her break with husband of 11 years Stuart, an enquiry heard.

The couple from Ince-in-Makerfield, near Wigan in

Greater Manchester, headed out for the pub crawl in Fuerteventura soon after their arrival.

Mrs Bishop drank 'a few small beers,' two small glasses of wine and four Irish coffees - around 15 units of alcohol equivalent to seven pints of lager - and died from heart failure triggered by the 'acute alcohol toxicity.'

Mr Bishop told the court in Bolton that he had no recollection of her being excessively drunk or unsteady on her feet

as she went to bed on October 20 last year.

They had booked the trip a month after returning from Cuba and arrived to their accommodation in Spain around 11.15am.

Mr Bishop said in a statement: "For the remainder of the day, afternoon and evening she was fine, she had a sleep in the afternoon, had something to eat at tea time and was sending pictures to family on her phone and was in touch with loved ones.

"This was a perfect start to what we anticipated would be a perfect holiday. She had a few small beers, two small glasses of wine, and three or four Irish coffees - between 10-15 units.

"We went to bed between 10 and 11 and crashed out. I was tired and hadn't had a sleep in the day time. My last memory of Paula was going back to the room - nothing out

of the ordinary.

"She had poured a couple of glasses of orange juice which is something she would usually do if she was preparing to go to bed. But I woke up sometime after midnight and found Paula lying on the floor propped up against a chest of drawers. I touched her belly and it was cold and then tried to find a pulse. Her legs had changed colour.

"I ran down to the reception area straight away and brought up a night time security guard who then alerted paramedics.

"When I first looked at her, I thought straight away that she had passed away and my automatic reaction was to get help. I shook her and tried to speak to her but got nothing. Paramedics attended and tried resuscitation but she could not be saved.

"Her death came as an enormous shock - she was a wonderful person who was full of

life and will be greatly missed by her friends and family."

A Spanish toxicologist said that Mrs Bishop had four grammes of alcohol per litre of blood in her system, while Dr Naveen Sharmaat from Whiston Hospital in Liverpool said the level was "fatally toxic."

Recording a verdict of alcohol related death, coroner Tim Brennan added: "Death has arisen because of a single acute overdose of alcohol on a single day on holiday rather than over a long period of time



- and I make clear there is no history of alcohol abuse."

He added: "The real tragedy here is that it may well have been that both she and perhaps her husband and partner in life did not appreciate the amount of alcohol taken.

"This is the tragedy of this particular case."

Holiday mayhem

Face off sparks running street brawl

A MASS brawl broke out outside a Mallorca bar after two holidaymakers squared up to one another.

The shocking incident took place in Cala Ratjada after two young tourists started shouting in each other's faces as a crowd of onlookers gathers round.

In video footage shot on a mobile phone one of the men, wearing a white t-shirt, is seen to hit the other in the head, leaving him reeling and clutching his ear.

The move sparks a free-for-all between two rival groups which spreads down the street, with several of those involved chasing the man who threw the first punch before laying into him.

A security guard shouting "hey, hey" chases some of the combatants away but smaller groups are seen launching kicks and punches near a row of shops.

The guard then manages to break one of the fights up as the clip ends.

Police said in a statement that there have been no arrests and no reported injuries.

It comes after Facebook group Mallorquins Fins Els Ous de Saturación (Mallorcans Fed Up With Saturation), set up to protest against the behav-

our of tourists on the island, posted a video showing a beach in capital Palma strewn with rubbish, drinkers and sleeping revellers.

And days earlier a video emerged showing four holidaymakers believed to be British bathing naked at a Cala Ratjada public fountain in broad daylight.

Raising the bar

BUDGET airline Ryanair has called for tighter restrictions on airport alcohol sales, including a booze ban before 10am.

It comes after a flight from Dublin to Ibiza was forced to land in Paris when three members of a 'drunk' party of 20 became disruptive and were led off the plane by French police at Beauvais airport.

The captain apologised to other passengers, which he said included children, after the groups' rowdy behaviour sparked a two-hour 40-minute delay, and added that the culprits had been drinking at Dublin airport.

Ryanair official Ryan Kiely said afterwards: "We will not tolerate unruly or disruptive behaviour at any time and the safety and comfort of our customers, crew and aircraft is our number one priority.

"This is now a matter for local police."

He added: "the incident is exactly why we are calling for significant changes to prohibit

the sale of alcohol at airports, such as a two-drink limit per passenger and no alcohol sales before 10am.

"It is incumbent on the airports to introduce these preventative measures to curb excessive drinking and the problems it creates, rather than allowing passengers to drink to excess before their flights."

The airline added: "It's completely unfair that airports can profit from the unlimited sale of alcohol to passengers and leave the airlines to deal with the safety consequences."

The Irish carrier is now reportedly warning travellers at the start of flights they could be fined more than €2,000 if they drink alcohol bought in duty free on board.

Low-cost rival easyJet has also joined the calls to ban duty free alcohol from flights, after three women believed to be erotic dancers earlier this year triggered a mid-air punch-up after downing vodka.

Brit biker dies

A BRITISH biker has been killed after a head-on smash in northern Spain.

The victim was reportedly on holiday with a friend when he was involved in the accident in Tineo, Asturias.

Named by the initials AJF, he is believed to have been 40 years old and died instantly in the crash on the TI-6 road.

He was travelling behind his companion, who was also riding a motorcycle, when he

crossed into the oncoming lane.

A family car with two adults and three children was travelling in the opposite direction and ploughed into the bike, sending the rider several metres into the air.

No-one else was harmed, and a woman who had been sat in the passenger seat later said: "He was totally on our side of the road, by the time we saw him he was already on top of us and he didn't change direction."

The second motorcyclist arrived back at the scene minutes later to look for the victim.

Bringing the harvest in

RUINED windmills are a visual reminder that the Marina Alta was once a wheat-growing area.

So too is the local saying Al juny la falc al puny (June, scythe in the hand) referring to the month when the year's harvest was brought in.

The Assoiacio del Mercat del Riurau is recovering the forgotten tradition and last autumn sowed wheat that has now been harvested, organising a fiesta in the RiuRau once used for processing and drying the local grapes for raisins.

Association members threshed and winnowed part of the harvested wheat, showing onlookers the Assolacambres, Rojal and Farto varieties that were once grown in the Marina Alta.

The association grew and harvested a small, experimental amount of wheat in 2017 and hopes to increase production each year with the ultimate aim of producing its own flour.

In order to do this they will first need a mill, but once this has been acquired the associa-

tion will be able to provide a service for the local farmers who still grow cereal.

Wheat growing will also find a use for the abandoned agricultural land in the area which, ironically is good fertile soil that could still be put to good use, the association said.

Better watch out!

VILLAJYOUSA hosted a course on dealing with foreign-registered vehicles organised by the SIPOL union, which represents Local Police officers.

The course was attended by members of forces from all over Spain, including Madrid, San Vicente, Torrevieja, Elche, Santa Pola and Guardamar.

Amongst other things, the three days of talks showed officers how to identify different registration plates so that they will automatically know how many months a vehicle may legally stay in Spain.

"Hosting a course like this for officers from so many different parts of the country demonstrates their commitment to continue their training while bringing it up-to-date," said Villajoyosa's public safety councillor Jaime Ramos.

There's many a slip on Ifach

THE Fire Consortium airlifted a 66-year-old German woman to safety after she slipped and sprained her ankle on Ifach.

Holidaying with her family, she and her daughters were climbing the 332-metre high limestone outcrop when the accident happened but nobody had a mobile.

As their mother was unable to walk any further, her daughters returned to the Centro de Naturaleza who contacted Calpe's Local Police.

Finally, given the inaccessibility of the terrain, it was decided to send a helicopter which flew the injured woman to the Benidorm fire station where a waiting ambulance transferred her to Villajoyosa hospital.

No shortage of advisers

CALPE'S mayor Cesar Sanchez has engaged another two personal advisers, bringing the total to six.

The first appointment was for 'an adviser to the municipal government' working 37.5 hours a week for a pre-tax annual salary of €32,377.

The second adviser who previously worked at the town hall on a SERVEF employment programme works the same number of hours but earns €29,449 a year, pre-tax.

Both are on temporary contracts.

Sanchez is also president of Alicante's Provincial Council, the Diputacion, and political commentators said that he is already preparing for next year's municipal and

regional elections.

They pointed out that the town hall spent €59,925 on personal advisers last year, but with the two new additions will now spend €190,826.

As this year's town hall budget allocated €220,825 for personal advisers, there is a possibility that a seventh adviser could be engaged at a future date, municipal sources said.

The Socialist opposition party criticised the 'mystery' surrounding the appointments.

"There is very little information about the work they will be doing and their usefulness to the municipality," a spokesman commented.

Wartime sub sinking explained

DURING the Second World War, two RAF aircraft based in Gibraltar sank a Nazi submarine nine nautical miles (16.6 kilometres) off Ifach.

Thirty-six of the U-77's crew died, two disappeared and nine were picked up by a local fishing boat.

Television director Fernando Navarrete has investigated the incident for the last 10 years, twice travelling to Germany to interview survivors and now believes he has enough material for an ambitious documentary reconstructing the U-Boat's last 24 hours.

He has pledged to make the story as real as possible and hopes to clarify unanswered questions in the programme which should air at the end of this year.

The Ministry of Defence has cooperated with the

project and a Spanish navy ship controlled maritime traffic to ensure the safety of the divers as they filmed new footage of the submarine.

The incident fascinated Calpe residents at the time and later, giving rise to rumours that the U-Boat was

loaded with gold ingots that belonged to Rommel or even Hitler.

The sinking was hushed up by the Franco regime at the time although a meeting was arranged in 2004 when some of the survivors were able to meet their rescuers once more.

Drugs swoop on local homes

THE Guardia Civil impounded an undisclosed quantity of drugs after searching several different premises in Calpe and Moraira.

Officers found drugs in two homes in Calpe's Calle Limoneros and Calle Maestro Serrano as well as a Smokers' Club.

They also entered an apartment on a Moraira urbanisation but the operation remains open and sources close to the case revealed that the latest raids could be connected to earlier operations.

These included closing down two drug-dealing points in Benissa and Denia and the discovery of 400 marijuana plants in Pego.

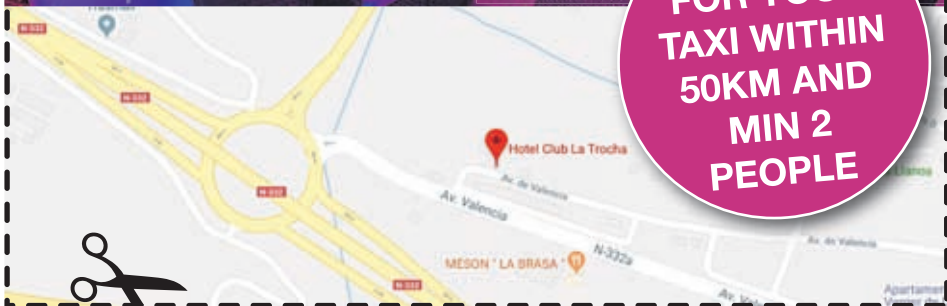

The couple live in Novelda and the town hall has told them that if they want to busk in Elda they must be registered on the town Padron. They must also take out third party insurance, register with Social Security as self-employed and make performing rights payments for the 120 songs in Isabel's repertoire.

Both Isabel and Igor are out of work and their un-

employment pay dried up some time ago. They make between €5 and €15 a day busking and although they have paid for an insurance policy they cannot meet the monthly self-employed quota or music royalties.

Petrer is the only market where they can still perform but the couple, who are both nearly 60 are adamant that they hope to carry on.

Strikes a blow

Ryanair boss predicts 'bad summer'

RYANAIR'S Michael O'Leary has called for "urgent" actions against French air traffic control strikes that could cause chaos this summer.

The low-cost airline's CEO says thousands of flights will be disrupted, especially during the peak months of July and August, unless the staffing crisis is addressed.

O'Leary said "yet again this weekend, French ATC will strike on Saturday and Sunday leading to hundreds of flights being cancelled, disrupting the holiday plans of thousands of passengers."

"Many of these flights don't even touch France, yet they will be disruptive because French ATC requires airlines to cancel overflights while they protect French domestic routes."



PLANE AND SIMPLE: O'Leary said strikes will cause chaos for millions of passengers.

"Europe's airlines are also suffering thousands of ATC delays/cancellations because of staff shortages especially in German and UK ATC providers."

"Europe's ATC providers are approaching the point of meltdown with hundreds of flights being cancelled daily, simply because they don't have enough staff to deal with them."

Ryanair had to cancel 1,000 flights last month, as opposed to just 43 that it cancelled in May 2017.

The airline claims more than 117,000 flights were delayed in May and June, with 61 per cent due to the French air traffic control strikes.

They have been striking over pay freezes and changes to sick pay.

Preparing
for fire and
flood

PINAR DE GARAITA IX employment workshop pupils have cleared 35,000 square metres of La Nucia land and gullies since April.

The work is doubly important as clearing the gullies reduces the risk of forest fire in the summer and flooding when the autumn rains arrive.

The workshop pupils have cleared and cleaned still-dry watercourses, roadside verges and open spaces. They also removed vegetation and dead trees from La Nucia's urbanisations, the zone adjoining the sports complex and rural areas on the outskirts of town.

They took away 10,000 pieces of rubbish including unwanted furniture and household appliances that

were taken to the Ecopark. Vegetation, prunings and dead trees were shredded and have been returned to areas at risk of erosion.

The Pinar de Garaita employment workshop, which is giving 10 pupils a year's training in forestry and another 10 in gardening, began last December and has a budget of €560,740.

"The pupils have been carrying out a very important fire-prevention assignment," said La Nucia's mayor Bernabe Cano, who congratulated them on their work. "They have also removed household items that some people unfortunately continue to dump, despite a free door-to-door collection service."

Contesting and challenging a Spanish language will signed by a foreign non-Spanish speaker that was not translated

DEAR Lawyer,

Shortly before his death my father changed his Spanish will, making a new one whereby he left his entire estate to the person who looked after him. We are of the opinion that my father did not intend for this to be done and that he may have been forced into creating the new will.

My father did not speak Spanish so is it possible to contest the Spanish will if it is written only in Spanish and if nobody translated it? Thanks for your help.

Dear Reader,

Thank you for your inquiry.

In principle we must say that if the will which you refer to that was signed in Spain, if made before a Spanish public notary, by a foreigner (expatriate), in this case, your father, the Spanish law establishes some requirements that must be taken into account, regarding the language of the document, and the need of the notary to make sure that the testator understands the document that he is signing and its content.

Thus with regards to the language of the testament, article 684 of the Spanish Civil Code says:

“When the testator presents his will in a language that the Notary does not know, the presence of an interpreter, chosen by him, will be required, so that there will be a full translation of the testamentary disposition to the official language used by the Notary in the place of execution. The instrument will be written in both languages indicating which has been used by the testator.”

Similarly, the notarial regulation, in its article 150 states:

“In the case of foreigners who do not understand the Spanish language, the Notary will sanction the public instrument provided that he/she knows the language of the foreigner, and

confirms in the document that he or she has verbally translated its content and that it is faithfully reflected in the public instrument.

“The document may also be produced in a double column in both languages, if so requested by the foreign grantor.

“When one or any of the grantors do not have sufficient knowledge of the language in which the public instrument was worded, and the Notary cannot communicate its content, the intervention of an interpreter will be required, who will be a person designated for that purpose by the grantor who does not know the language, ...”

In light of the above, we can say that it seems that Article 684 of the Civil Code, requires in the case of Wills, that the Will should be drafted in double column, in the Spanish language and in the language used by the testator.

On the other hand, article 150 of the notarial regulation, which is not specific to wills, but deals

with notarial instruments (documents) in general, indicates that if the notary speaks the language of the grantor he / she will be able to translate it verbally, but it must be stated on the document that the verbal translation has been made by the notary. It also contemplates the possibility of producing the document in a double column (two languages), or the use of a translator or interpreter.

If in the case that you indicate, your father did not speak Spanish, and there is no evidence in the will that the notary had translated it into the testator’s language, there does not appear to be evidence of the use of an interpreter or translator and it is not written in a double column, we understand that you can challenge and contest the validity of the will, as it does not comply with the aforementioned legislation.

Freed politician's jail revamp claim

■ A RUSSIAN opposition leader recently freed from prison has claimed Moscow jails have been refurbished to house foreign World Cup fans arrested for rowdy behaviour. Alexei Navalny said in a social media post footballs were being handed out and goalposts placed in yards for inmates. Navalny was jailed following an anti-Putin rally.

Record claim denial

■ INTERIOR MINISTRY officials have denied claims that the records of inmates held in Soviet-era prison camps were being destroyed following allegations authorities had secretly been ordered to. The ministry added the identity cards were instead being digitised to ensure their permanent storage.

Crime reporting claims

■ POLICE in Russia have been instructed to share positive news and to avoid posting crime reports during the World Cup, the country's media has claimed. Reports alleged no daily crime reports have been posted online since June 6 in an effort to stifle negative news coverage. Official spokespeople reportedly confirmed the blackout but denied it was in connection with the World Cup.

Officials reappointed

■ PRESIDENT Vladimir Putin has issued decrees filling top government spots with previous appointees. Vladislav Surkov, known as the Kremlin's 'gray cardinal,' was reappointed as a presidential aide despite rumours he faced being ousted. Putin said he reappointed the officials because he needed experienced staff to carry out his agenda.

Military posting vow

■ MOSCOW has said it will retaliate against Norwegian plans to allow the United States to station twice as many Marines in its territory. Oslo said some 700 Marines from the US would arrive in the country in 2019, with Russia's embassy in the Norwegian capital claiming the posting could trigger an arms race.

Splashing out

■ THE sacking of a Russian teacher for posing in a swimsuit for a picture posted online has sparked a social media campaign which has seen school staff post similar photos. Viktoria Popova, 26, was dismissed from her post as a history teacher at a middle school in Siberia after the picture surfaced online. Fellow teachers have hit back, posing in swimwear with the hashtag: TeachersAreHumansToo.

New PM makes pension pledge

SPAIN'S new government has agreed a preliminary deal to raise retirement pensions in line with inflation.

The move suggests a less restrictive approach to spending following years of austerity measures by the country's conservative People's Party, which was ousted after six years in government in the wake of corruption allegations.

Pensions have since 2014 risen by a below-inflation annual rate of 0.25 per cent. But Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez's socialist PSOE party tweeted: "Now the right must allow that all pensions rise with inflation, also in times of crisis."

UK religious channel fined

SPAIN'S National Commission of Markets and Competition (CNMC) has fined a British Christian broadcaster €6,000 for 'homophobic' remarks made on a breakfast show.

The comments on Revelation TV's discussion show Rmornings "could be considered as threatening to the dignity of the homosexual and transgender group, although there was no manifest incitation to hate against these groups by the channel that owns the programme," said the written ruling.

But channel director Gordon Pettie

by *Matt Ford*

said an appeal had been lodged in the wake of the verdict, which followed complaints sent to the CNMC over the words of a British evangelical pastor on the subject of transgender children.

He said on the show: "We are going to create a political party or join a party to change this madness. "We are going to have to do this, because if we don't, we will have Sodom and Gomorrah at our doorsteps, where they are going to tell you: we want to get hold of those men in there and we

want to sleep with them and there's nothing you can do about it.

"I have girls for you... no, we want those guys."

Revelation TV has a history of sparking outrage over its views on homosexuality and has previously been reported to UK regulator Ofcom.

The 24-hour low-budget channel was started by husband-and-wife duo Howard and Lesley Conder in 2003, and is now mostly produced at a converted underground car park in Cala de Mijas on the Costa del Sol.

Great call as O2 comes to Spain

TELECOMMUNICATIONS provider Telefonica is to offer low-cost phone and internet plans in Spain via its O2 brand.

Already used as the multinational's flagship brand in the UK and Germany, O2's new services will include a €20 per month mobile phone-only option plus fibre-optic internet for €45 per month, but no TV option.

The Spanish firm added that the O2 services will soon be activated in 'beta' mode, with a full mass-market launch earmarked for September.

Telefonica will continue to operate its Movistar and Tuenti internet and mobile brands.

Footy star hit with €18.8m fraud fine**PAYBACK TIME: Cristiano Ronaldo.**

REAL MADRID and Portugal footballing superstar Cristiano Ronaldo has agreed to pay the Spanish tax authorities €18.8 million after being slapped with a two-year suspended jail term.

It comes after the forward admitted four counts of tax fraud, picking up six-month prison sentences for each.

The total he must now fork out includes fines and interest after prosecutors reduced the amount he was accused of de-

frauding from €14.7 to €5.7 million.

He was in 2016 exposed by information supplied by the website Football Leaks to German news magazine *Der Spiegel* which was shared with members of the European Investigative Collaborations journalism network, including the UK's *Sunday Times* and Spanish daily newspaper *El Mundo*.

And having initially denied the charges he has now agreed the huge settlement.

BARCELONA-BASED fashion and fragrance group Puig has bought a majority stake in Belgian brand Dries Van Noten without disclosing details of the deal, adding to a portfolio that includes Prada, Paco Rabanne and Nina Ricci fragrances.

MOROCCAN state-owned phosphate company OCP has revealed plans to acquire a 20 per cent stake of Fertinagro, Spain's largest fertiliser manufacturer, aiming to take advantage of the firm's 'technical know-how, specialty products and ability to respond to farmers' specific needs.'

Power trip

SPANISH energy giant Gas Natural Fenosa has renewed a deal to extract natural gas from North African nation Algeria for another 12 years, with the overall contract now worth €30 billion, the company said in a statement.

US olive tariffs slammed

THE European Commission has blasted United States tariffs on Spanish olives.

An official said in a statement: The decision by the United States Department of Commerce to impose unreasonably high and prohibitive duties anti-subsidy and anti-dumping duties on Spanish olives is simply unacceptable.

"This is a protectionist measure targeting a high-quality and successful EU product popular

with US consumers."

The move follows an investigation that found olives from Spain were being sold below their fair value and boosted by subsidies.

The import duties have not yet been confirmed but are set to be approved by the US International Trade Commission in July, at which point the commission would reportedly consider further action.

As the sun beat down on my back and beads of sweat rolled from beneath my racing green helmet and into my eyes, I was close to packing in my trip along one of Spain's most iconic Vias Verdes.

Having not passed another soul for at least an hour, the early summer sun was starting to send my mind spinning.

But as the burn in my thighs became almost unbearable I picked my head up from the handlebars and was instantly reminded why I had ditched four wheels for two.

With the sun dipping behind the mountains along Cadiz's Via Verde de la Sierra, the sky lit up in a fantastic pink and the sunflower fields either side of the disused rail track gently swayed with me in the breeze.

For while there was more than one moment when I would rather have been comfortably sat on one of Spain's high-speed trains, taking in the country's disused rail network on bike - or foot - is a far more rewarding experience.

For the uninitiated, the Via Verdes are a series of disused train lines which have been converted into hiking and cycling paths.

In total, 2,700km of disused rail tracks cut through Spain's countryside like Moses parting the Red Sea (I confess I have only conquered one route and it was only 36km, although I did go to one end and then back again).

At points it feels unnatural that a train track ever ran through such verdant and beautiful scenery - it

definitely beats the view of suburban gardens that used to greet my London commute.

And, in fact, many of the routes never did see trains trundle the tracks in the first place.

Constructed during the Civil War, many thousands of kilometres of track were laid and the stations erected, but in many cases the trains were just a pipe dream that never came to roost.

For the routes that were once in use, this year marks 25 years since the trains stopped rolling over their tracks after they fell into disrepair and were forgotten about.

Most of the old lines have now lost their rails, however old rail sign posts and signals occasionally point to the pathways' forgotten pasts.

In total there are 123 routes of varying length and difficulty. While most are flat - requiring no technical skill or bulging leg muscles - some are lengthy and thus are more

Beginning of the line

A TRAIN never travelled on the Jerez-Almargen railway line in Malaga.

However the pet project of dictator Miguel Primo de Rivera sparked off the Vias Verdes movement.

Spanning 36 kilometres with 30 tunnels cutting through the rocky Andalusian terrain, the Jerez-Almargen route kicked off a revolution.

It is the oldest greenway in Spain and currently plays host to around 300,000 tourists every year.

Organisers of the scheme have said that without the publicity around the abandoned route, the concept of Vias Verdes may have never been born.

"The line was surrounded in controversy," Via Verde de la Sierra Foundation manager María Jiménez says. "There had never even been a train there. It is now a greenway and the people of the area are now proud of it."

So while a train may have never plundered the tracks, Spain's proud greenway network may never have come to fruition if it wasn't for the Jerez-Almargen rail route.

suited to hard core walkers or cyclists.

Mopeds, cars and any other form of motorised vehicle are banned from the paths, making it safe and secure for families to venture out for a gentle meander.

Along the way, guest houses, restaurants and cafes offer respite for those in need of some much-deserved R&R.

In total 98 old railway stations have been restored as rural hotels, restaurants, cafés, rent-a-bike points, office information and small museums.

But where today stands a buzzing community of outdoor thrillseekers and rural tourists, once stood abandonment and utter desolation: the decaying remains of formerly romanticised railway lines that tore across the country were an ugly stain dripped across Spain's rural countryside.

Extreme makeovers

AS well as taking in the breathtaking scenery and the sheer overwhelming vastness of Spain's outback, the Via Verde routes also contain a catalogue of architectural triumphs.

In total 98 former stations have been given a face lift and turned into everything from cafes and restaurants to cycle pick up points and even hotels.

Just two decades ago many of these buildings were left destitute and strewn across Spain's countryside, yet today they have been transformed to their former glory and are among the country's more charming and quirky spots.

Here are four of the best examples:

However, in 1993 the Fundación Ferrocarriles Españoles (FFE) presented its Inventory of Disused Railway Lines in Gijón.

The report compared Spain's unused railway lines and compared it to its European neighbours in France, Belgium and the UK.

It concluded that nowhere else on the continent had so many unused routes carving their way through the country, waiting to be used.

Spain literally had thousands of kilometres of ready-made cycling, pedestrian and horseback routes lying in wait. It was an opportunity that could not be missed, and thankfully it wasn't.

A quarter of a century later, Spain has culti-

vated more than 2,700km of lost tracks, reviving 123 cycling and walking routes.

And it has given the country an added tourist attraction away from the coastal areas fuelling an economic revival in some of the country's more secluded towns and villages.

In a report examining the Economic Impact of Cycle Tourism in Europe, it highlighted that 42 per cent of European travellers seek adventure tourism. And Spain's towns and cities have benefited from the Vias Verdes, with cycle-mad locals and tourists taking their bikes and hiking boots around the country in search of tranquility.

As Irish expat and cycling enthusiast David Murray explains "nothing beats the Spanish countryside.

"I want to complete the entire Via Verde network by the time I'm 40," Murray tells me at a cafe along the Cadiz route. "I'm 36 now and I have done around 1,000 kilometres of the routes so far.

"Hopefully they won't build too many more before I get to 40."

He added: "I love coming out on these routes on my bike. I take the children out on the one near our home and every time I visit a different part of Spain I make sure I check out the nearest Via Verde.

2,700 kilometres of unused track converted

"It is a great idea but I think more could be done to publicise the routes. They are usually full of locals, but I think there is a massive potential to attract even more tourists than they currently do.

"I had never heard of the routes before I had moved here."

In Cadiz, along the Via Verde de la Sierra, some 40 jobs have been directly created along the route.

It is a similar story along the 123 spanning from Girona to Costa Brava and across Andalusia.

And that is just why the Vias Verdes scheme continues to thrive and continues to receive public support.

In total more than €177 million has been invested into the scheme from central and local government.

In total, some 5,000 kilometres of abandoned railway lines remain untapped and are being eyed up by the organisers of the scheme.

So while the Vias Verdes organisers may be celebrating its silver anniversary the future of Spain's greenways most certainly looks golden.

Cycling the Via Verde de la Sierra

MOST people start the trip in the village of Olvera and cycle to Puerto Serano and then back up again.

Bikes can be rented from Sesca which is situated at the start of the route. Children's seats and separate carts are also available, for those taking the kids out and prices tend to very reasonable.

It is worth bearing the terrain in mind before you set off. If starting and returning to Olvera, your return journey will be uphill, so expect the thighs to burn on your return.

There are no mega hills or mountains to conquer, but the gradient is steady and more importantly long... so may pose a problem for younger or less-experienced cyclists.

There are options for shorter distances along the route. It is possible to start in Coripe and pick up the route there.

All in all, it is a fantastic route and there are various options to conquer it on your own, with a partner or with the entire family.

Must he close his air vent?

Q. I had air conditioning installed and the contractors made an aperture in the building wall. A grille covers the aperture and the wall was repainted with the paint colour of our terrace as opposed to the main building colour. Apparently our next-door neighbour complained at last year's AGM. Now I am informed that, unless I make good the aperture to the façade, the Community will have me denounced.

I am also told that I could have contested the complaint within three months of receiving notification of the minutes of the AGM. In addition, I have not been able to categorically establish that the law in Spain states that an opening cannot be made in the facade of an apartment building.

A. By opening the wall for your air conditioning vent, you have altered the exterior appearance of the building.

This is prohibited by Article 7, Paragraph 1, of the Ley de Propiedad Horizontal, Spain's law that regulates Communities of Property Owners. Properly, you should have requested permission from the Community, voted at the AGM, along with a works permit from your town hall. Perhaps you still can.

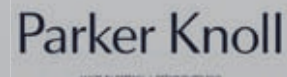

to the Spanish political scene

IT'S an old Spanish formula to proclaim 'My house is your house' on inviting a stranger into your home.

Nobody expects to be taken up on that but that's what Pedro Sanchez said and did after Italy and Malta refused to allow the Aquarius rescue ship to land at any of their ports.

The ship has 629 African migrants aboard that nobody wants.

"It is our obligation to avoid a humanitarian catastrophe and offer a safe port for these people," Sanchez said, giving permission for the boat to dock in Valencia. Cynical observers outside Spain suggested that Sanchez made the offer so that he could earn brownie points with Brussels. Others said it was to keep in with Podemos.

Or it could just be that the Spanish don't have a big problem with immigrants. Many, now pensioners, had to emigrate themselves either for political reasons or to earn enough money to send back home in the pre-tourism, pre-boom days.

Or it could just be that once in a while 'My house is yours' is meant to be taken literally.

Familiar faces

JOSE MARIA AZNAR, the former Partido Popular who named Mariano Rajoy as his successor offered to re-direct the party following his protégé's downfall as he was sucked under by the quicksands of corruption.

Is Aznar the right person to do this? The guest list for his daughter's wedding in 2002 included Luis Barcenas, Francisco Correa, Pablo Crespo 'El Bigotes,' Rodrigo Rato, Jesus Sepulveda and Eduardo Zaplana. Rogues' gallery, anyone?

A hairy issue

QUIM TORRA is Cataluña's regional president, although he was only brought in to act as a proxy for his self-exiled predecessor, Carles Puigdemont.

Pedro Sanchez's government made his hair stand on end, he complained once the names were announced, which is hardly surprising as the foreign minister is Josep Borrell, a Catalan who is firmly and vociferously opposed to independence.

And Meritxell Batet, another Catalan who is Minister for Territorial Policies - in other words, Cataluña - is no separatist either.

But Sanchez has already said that although there is no easy solution to the Cataluña problem, he's willing to talk and at least reach consensus on social and economic issues unrelated to independence.

There could even be an attempt to restore the clauses in the 2006 Catalan Estatut that were emasculated

by the Partido Popular in 2000.

Torra and Sanchez have now spoken. Torra and Miquel Iceta, leader of the PSC - the PSOE's Catalan version - have now met.

Torra's hair might not yet be back in place, but he'll be spared the scalping he would have received from former president Mariano Rajoy.

Work experience

PODEMOS supremo Pablo Iglesias criticised Pedro Sanchez for choosing ministers likely to appeal to the Partido Popular and Ciudadanos. Hardly a fair judgement but Iglesias was piqued because he was not invited to join the government.

His nose is out of joint because between them Sanchez's Cabinet have nous and experience culled from years in office in Europe as well as in Spain's national, regional and local governments.

Despite their individual qualities and impressive academic records, the same can't be said of Podemos politicians, especially its higher echelons. Unless you rule out Venezuela, of course.

Chromium, SlimJet...

Now late and unlamented, Internet Explorer spawned Microsoft Edge currently bundled with Windows 10. Originally barely fit-for-purpose, it is getting better.

So what should you download and use for the best-possible internet experience in 2018? Google's Chrome has by far today's highest usage (57 per cent).

One great new incentive is the automatic ad-blocker included

since February as a result of public pressure and the millions of us installing those third-party ad blockers which deprive websites of their revenue.

The new Chrome's promise is to weed out the web's most annoying ads, full-page ads, ads with autoplaying sound and video and flashing ads. Apple's Safari browser has followed suit. Opera is built on the Chrome 'engine' so will ultimately also comply, and

the domino effect continues down the line as the empire fights back and may the force be with them.

Yet since Edward Snowden and now the Cambridge Analytica scandal, many of us are wary of revealing more of our browsing habits to the digital giants like Google and Apple.

Of course we all know (don't we?) that there's a button under the History icon in our browsers which lets us delete our recent history. But the bad news is that even this won't zap the overall record held of every single site you've ever visited, ever, back at Google's HQ.

For that you need DuckDuckGo - not a new KFC special, but a browser for the dark side. Funded by independent donations, it has now notched up some 16 billion private searches, none of them tracked.

Remember it the next time you hit the porn sites from your family computer - for medical research purposes only, naturally.

Web-wary

INCOGNITO is an interesting new response to our growing concerns about being tracked online, and most browsers now offer an 'Incognito Mode.' But it's still not a foolproof way to stay anonymous.

A VPN can help - a Virtual Private Network, connected to so-called proxy servers to protect your identity and your data. Available to anyone for a modest fee, it's still not a magic bullet for guaranteeing our privacy, but it can help by encrypting our data, bypassing (some) official censorship systems and more.

VPNs are also popular among Britpats here for fooling location-restricted services like the BBC's iPlayer into unlocking UK-only content.

At the end of the day however, there's only one way to stay truly anonymous these digital days. It's called pen and paper.

Pesky pollen

THIS is the time of year when people can really suffer from the symptoms of hay fever.

As grass, plants and trees release pollen into the air which is blown about in the wind and easily inhaled by humans and pets.

With one in five Brits thought to suffer from hay fever you aren't alone, but there are some things you can do to reduce the symptoms.

Of course, you'll know if you're affected. Your eyes will become watery and itchy, you'll begin to sneeze and your nose will run. These symptoms will often be combined with headaches and tiredness.

In addition to taking some antihistamine tablets, here are a few other tips. Try to avoid being outside in the early morning and the late evening. In the morning pollen gets lifted and carried up into the air, descending again in the evening. These times can be particularly troublesome on warm, humid and windy days.

And in Spain, night time can be particularly worse. With the higher temperatures here, the pollen often doesn't descend until long after sunset, meaning sufferers can really struggle if they've left their windows open.

Pollen can also stick to your hair and clothing, so be sure to change your clothes and shower as soon as you're through the door.

The NHS offers some additional advice. They suggest to wear wrap-around sunglasses and to put Vaseline around your nostrils to trap the pollen.

However, the bad news is that they also recommend avoiding beer, wine and spirits as these contain histamine, the chemical that sets off allergy symptoms in the body.

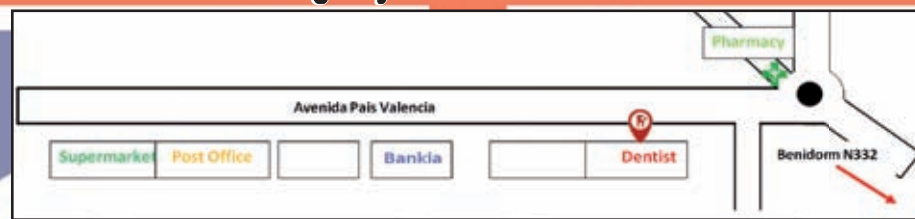

Advice for Brits abroad



BE PREPARED: Check the rules in your country of destination before you depart.

THE British Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) has advised holidaymakers to check the rules on taking medicines abroad to avoid breaking the law.

Apparently some commonly-prescribed medications in the UK are 'controlled drugs' in certain countries. These include medicines such as Diazepam, Tramadol and codeine.

In Japan, for example, some cold remedies are banned while some sleeping pills need a licence in Singapore. And in Qatar, over-the-counter medicines such as cold and cough remedies must be accompanied by a prescription.

If you fail to comply with the law you risk being arrested, fined or imprisoned in many countries, Greece and the UAE.

With nearly half the UK population on prescribed medication this could mean that around 21 million people could be put in a difficult situation. The FCO recommends travellers check their website's travel advice pages. If you're unsure, they recommend contacting the embassy, high commission or consulate in the UK of the country you're travelling to for further advice.

They suggest that when travelling you always carry medicines in their correctly labelled container in your hand luggage.

And if you are prescribed to take controlled substances or injection medications, always carry a note from the prescribing doctor. Finally, don't forget to take out an appropriate level of travel health insurance which includes cover for any pre-existing illnesses.



JOYFUL: Research advises drinking white wine to avoid negative emotions.

Bottoms up!

RECENT research in Spain has revealed that women have more discerning palates and are better at telling the differences between wines.

It also found that compared to men, women were more likely to describe themselves as feeling 'joyful' when drinking white wine.

A total of 208 volunteers took part in a blind tasting of six different wines,

two whites, one rose, and three reds. The volunteers were then asked about the quality of the wine and the feelings it evoked.

The research was led by Dr Carolina Chaya from the Technical University of Madrid. Speaking of the research, she said: "Emotions like good, happy, joyful, mild and pleasant were positively associated with attributes such as fruity

and floral, and more negative emotions like aggressive and guilty were associated with attributes related to red wine."

The report in the journal Food Quality and Preference also found that the young feel less guilty about drinking than older tipplers. And that older drinkers tend to drink to remember whilst younger drinkers to forget.

Research retracted

A LANDMARK paper from 2013 that uncovered the benefits of a Mediterranean diet on the heart has just been retracted by a prestigious medical journal.

The study carried out by the *New England Journal of Medicine* was found to contain errors.

Apparently, the study did not remove flawed Spanish data which on later analysis showed the claim to be weaker than initially suggested.

The original study claimed that eating a Mediterranean diet supplemented with olive oil or nuts slashed the risk of heart attack or stroke by 30 per cent.

However, after being retracted the revised paper claims that there is simply a correlation between this particular diet and benefits for the heart.

The study was retracted due to concerns that participants who took part in the initial research weren't of a similar height, weight and age. Without this correlation, the results of any trial could be compromised.

Professor Naveed Sattar, from Glasgow University which initially carried out the research said: "This is a highly unusual step and I am

sure that the NEJM took this decision very seriously."

In fact, after the reanalysis, little changed in terms of

the overall results of the Spanish research of nearly 7,500 people. And even though the findings have

been retracted, he stated that it was "reassuring" to see the results remained broadly similar. So it would seem

that this research was flawed, but the benefits of the Mediterranean diet are still self-evident.

What a turn off

YOU may be addicted to staring at your screen for hours upon end. But a new study has shown that high-levels of screen time are associated with a higher risk of 'all-cause mortality' as well as a higher risk of both heart disease and cancer.

The research carried out by the University of Glasgow looked at the amount of time 390,089 volunteers spent staring at a TV or computer screen during their free time.

They found a link between high levels of screen time and poor health. In fact, being stuck to the screen outside of work is a symbol of a sedentary life-style associated with a higher risk of mortality and cardiovascular disease.

The findings were independent of BMI, diet, smoking, physical activity and other major factors such as socio-economic status. Dr Carlos Celis, who authored the study, said: "the findings suggest people with the lowest levels of strength, fitness and physical activity could potentially gain the greatest benefit from health promotion interventions."

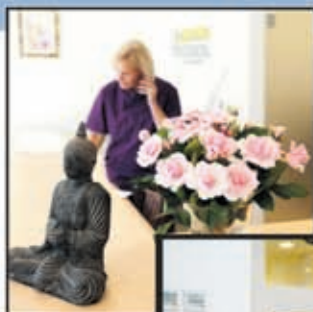

A COUPLE of weeks ago I suggested that you dear reader might usefully turn out your attics and lofts.

The reason, the discovery of a Chinese Imperial vase discovered by chance in an attic in France and brought to auctioneers Sotheby's in Paris was to come to auction.

Well dear reader it has come to auction and it has sold. The initial estimate at auction for the vase was €430,000 and expectations were very positive, with the excitement among collectors such that 'fire-works' were expected in the auction room when Lot 1 came up for sale.

The vase - the only example of its kind - was produced by the Jingdezhen workshops for the courts of the 18th

century Qianlong Emperor, an example of the famille-rose porcelains is extremely rare and when they do appear on the market generate extreme competition between collectors.

Earlier this year a famille-rose porcelain bowl sold for almost €25 million so expectations were high. And on June 12 following a fierce 20-minute bidding battle the unique vase sold for €16.2 million.

Meanwhile back in the modern world Porsche, the German sports car manufacturer, continues to gear up in readiness for its 70th anniversary, but has taken time away to announce the series production of its first purely electric sports car. The Mission E concept car has now been given its official name the 'Taycan,' which roughly translate as 'lively young horse.'

A reference to the imagery at the heart of the Porsche crest which has featured a leaping horse since 1952.

Chairman Oliver Blume commented: "Our new electric sports car is strong and dependable... it's a vehicle that can consistently cover long distances and that epitomises freedom."

For a sports car fast starts are an essential offer and the numbers indicated are 3.5 seconds to 100km/h and just 12 seconds to 200 km/h with a currently planned range of 500km.

With a doubling in planned investment to reach €6 billion by 2022, the Taycan development programme, as well as derivatives and variants, is expected to account for €500 million with a further €1 billion earmarked for electrification and hybridisation of the existing product range as the company products transition into the era of future mobility.

Demand for electric sports cars are expected to be as great if not more so than for Imperial vases!

**Eat Well

HERE is the second of my barbecue recipes using chicken, the combination of ingredients sounds strange, but it is easy to prepare however not so easy to cook properly.

Food poisoning from pork and chicken at a barbecue is relatively common. If I am eating barbecued food (including my own) I always cut chicken, pork and their products in half at the thickest point to ensure they are cooked through.

Barbecued chicken

Serves 4

750 grams of chicken breast, no skin, no bone

Marinade

150 ml tomato ketchup
100 ml white horseradish sauce
2 tablespoons of olive oil
2 cloves of garlic, finely chopped
1 teaspoon dried thyme
1 teaspoon black peppercorns finely ground

Hint: Serve with salad and a dressing cold cooked pasta with a little drizzle of Extra Virgin Olive Oil mixed with freshly squeezed lemon juice.

Tip: If you use a charcoal BBQ stir the coals first to make sure there

Cube (2cm) or slice the chicken breasts (1cm thick). (I will be detailing two different ways of barbecuing) and place in a bowl.

Make the marinade by mixing all the ingredients together and pour into the bowl containing the chicken and thoroughly mix until completely coated.

Cover and place in the fridge for at least two hours, or overnight.

Using a brush or kitchen roll, coat the grill in any cooking oil to prevent sticking.

Light the barbecue.

If you prefer chicken cubes thread them on to a metal skewer, allowing a gap of about an inch in between each cube. The rationale behind this is so that all sides get cooked and the metal skewer conducts heat well, so will also cook from the inside out, as well as the BBQ cooking from outside in!

The sliced chicken can be placed straight on the grill, both are rotated, the sliced chicken twice or more, the cubed chicken, four times or more.

are no bits of firelighters or BBQ starter fluid left, or the food will taste of paraffin!

Tip: There should be no yellow flames and very little smoke when you start barbecuing, the coals should be glowing with a layer of white ash.

SPAIN'S Barcelo Group has failed to become Spain's largest hotel corporation as it is outbid by a Thai-based conglomerate to purchase NH group.

The Minor International group has reportedly made a successful bid to buy 25.2 per cent of Spain's NH hotel group for €619 million from HNA group, a Chinese corporation.

Minor is a Thai-based global conglomerate with stakes in restaurants, hospitality and lifestyle brand distribution.

And to secure its major purchase Minor had to outdo stiff competition not only from Barcelo but also from Elliott Management and Apollo Global Management.

Barcelo made a €3 billion bid for the NH group in January which was turned down. Spain's largest hotel group would have been born from the merger with 478 properties and a combined total of 89,000 rooms.

Spanish law dictates any party which owns more than 30 per cent of a company must launch a takeover bid.

And Minor hotels already had a 9.5 per cent stake in NH hotel group, explaining its ability to take

executive control of the company.

"We are embarking on a new era, driving investment strategy to further cement our footprint in the European hospitality industry," said Dillip Rajakarier, CEO of Minor Hotels.

"Minor can also support the NH Hotel Group with its food and bev-

erage expertise where appropriate to enhance customer experience and maximise revenue potentials," he added.

The Asian hotel giant - which has five subsidiary brands, including Anantara, Avani and Tivoli - is expected to complete its purchase in September 2018.

‘Picasso pool’ pad sold

THE ‘El Martinete’ mansion in Marbella, once belonging to the prolific Spanish dancer Antonio Ruiz Soler, has been sold.

The property was sold through Concierge Auctions for €14 million, but the final purchase price is unknown as the sale is still listed as ‘pending.’

It is one of Marbella’s last remaining mansions from the 60’s boom-time era led by pioneering developer Alfonso Hohenlohe, the man behind the glitzy Marbella Club.

He starred in more than 40 musicals by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Studios.

The ex-owner’s colourful and well-connected past gives the property a cultural and historical appeal which is difficult to rival, not to mention several unique selling points.

Perhaps the most desired of those is an artistic message at

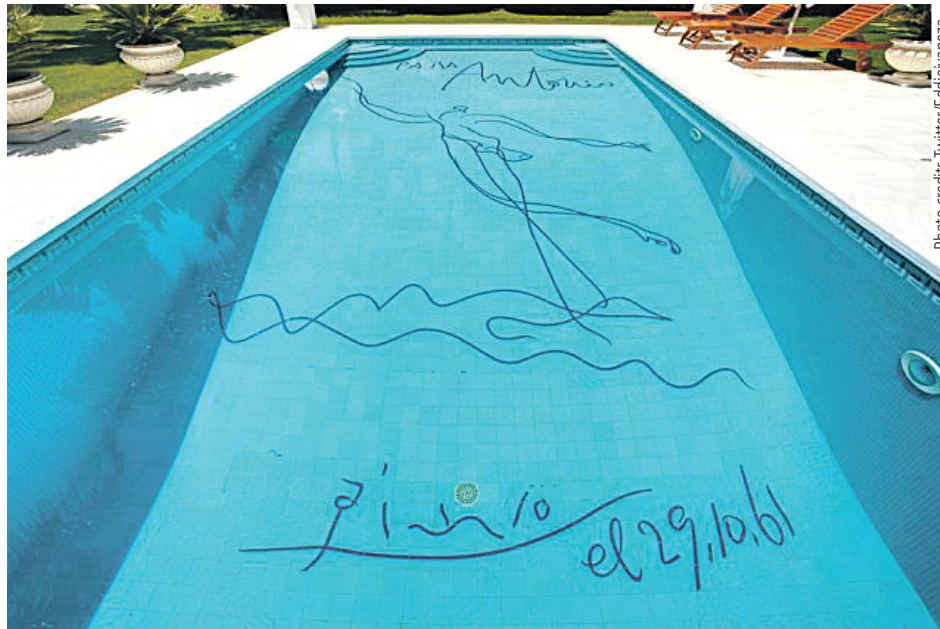

the bottom of the pool. This is dedicated to ‘Antonio’ by none other than eminent artist and friend of the dancer, Pablo Picasso.

With nine rooms, nine bathrooms, 1,904 square metres of floor space and 4,017 metres of land running alongside the Costa del Sol’s capital, the property is worthy of the

swishest tycoon.

The house was implicated in the 2017 Paradise Papers scandal which leaked many cases of fiscal dodging. It was uncovered that a number of companies registered in tax havens had bought Spanish properties, a number of which were in Marbella and along the Costa del Sol.

Saved by the bell

THE final hope for many dilapidated cultural buildings, the World Monuments Fund (WMF), has picked a small community in Spain to receive part of this year’s €1 million annual repair fund.

The medieval buildings are set in a rural community in the Tebaida Leonesa valley in Leon which.

The stunning architecture of both buildings is at risk of falling victim to the years if nothing is done to preserve them, according to architectural experts.

Increased tourism and development in the area is the main incentive to restore the original wall paintings from a 10th century church on the site.

This year, the WMF is also supporting projects in France, China, Italy, Japan, England, Zimbabwe and Mexico.

The non-profit organisation has been running for more than 50 years with the support of American Express, a financial institution.

It aims to restore some of the world’s most important endangered monuments in order to educate, inspire and tell their stories for future generations.

So far, WMF has driven 363 projects in 100 countries and placed more than 500 locations on its World Monuments Watch list, compiled annually.

IT'S important to keep your windows clean and really let those rays of sun light up your home. But apart from the fact that branded window cleaners can sometimes cost a small fortune, many people are hesitant about using chemicals indoors. Particularly if you have animals or children who might be touching - or licking - surfaces in your home.

One popular option is to make your own natural window cleaner. Believe it or not, these home-made products can be every bit as effective, or even better, than bought products. And since they are non-toxic you can be sure that they are safe.

Making these cleaners is very easy too. To be sure you don't have any residual chemicals from the contents of the container previously, either buy a new plastic container or use something like an empty glass apple cider vinegar bottle with a spray top attached. Simply add two tablespoons of vinegar to two cups of water. To this, add 10 drops of essential oil (such as lemon). And then shake these ingredients together.

To really save the pounds you can even simply use old newspapers or t-shirts to wipe the windows down. Try to avoid using paper towels though as they tend to leave lint on them.

Seeing clearly

The use of natural products within your home can extend to further than your windows. You can achieve a non-toxic environment on the floors in your home too.

Obviously, before you begin to wash your floors thoroughly sweep or vacuum them first.

To create the cleaning mixture, add a few drops of essential oil or a 1/4 cup of vinegar into warm water. Be sure that the water is warm as this will evaporate faster than cold water. Once you have washed your floors down, buff them dry with a soft cloth or towel.

There are variations on this natural cleaner and many people add 1/2 cup of lemon juice to the water too. However, bear in mind that repeated use of citrus on some surfaces can damage the finish.

A little known secret is to use tea to clean your floors. Brew a pot of black tea and either fill a spray bottle to mist the floor or make enough to immerse your mop in a bucket. As before, wring out your mop so it is as dry as possible.

Finally, remember that contrary to popular belief, don't use a steam cleaner on wooden or laminate flooring as this can take the protective layer of finish off your hardwood floor.

Shed some light

LAMPSHADES can often be the final thing we think about when decorating our homes.

But these simple covers can make or break the look you're aiming for within your home.

They can come in every shape and size, from pendant lampshade fixtures that hang from the ceiling to floor lamps that lighten your favourite reading chair.

A DELIGHTFUL part of any garden is the presence of butterflies.

In the Mediterranean climate there are two main periods where they flutter about seeking nectar and partners to enjoy their short time free to fly about as they will. The end of spring to early summer you can see many of them meeting on lavender, lantana and other flowers while dodging bees, wasps and other insects to find their meals of purest delight from the flowers.

In autumn after the first rains and before the onset of winter cold they again emerge, often in greater number, to fill the garden with gentle activity and spectacular colours as they visit their favourite autumn flowers.

It can be fascinating to try and identify the different species with such interesting names as admiral, southern speckled wood and brown argus.

Not all that flutter are butterflies. Moths can also be present although they tend to emerge more at night. Other than by reputation, moths and butter-

flies are very similar. Moths have feathery type antennae and butterflies have a club like antennae.

Another difference is moths' forewings and hind wings are joined so they can fly better with the wings in unison while

a butterflies are not, so they may seem a little more clumsy. Butterflies overall tend to be larger and more colourful than moths, but there are small butterflies and larger colourful moths.

If you do not have many butterflies in your garden it may be that the environment does not have enough of the right plants that they live on as caterpillars and feed from as butterflies. It can also be that insecticides have eliminated them if you are near agricultural areas.

farming conventionally becomes less attractive to young people and the interest in sustainable agriculture increases. This has allowed a return of many more butterflies in the garden.

My lavender bushes were covered in butterflies and bees this morning. On a walk through the field to collect the ripened apricots, the whole field appeared to be active with butterflies busy on the native wild flowers I leave growing in the field until July when they are cut to reduce fire hazard.

If you wish to encourage butterflies

to your garden, most of the Mediterranean native flowers have a place to breed, shelter or feed butterflies.

So if you have the space to allow wild flowers to grow it will assist in rejuvenating a healthy ecology. It is a part of the ecology that plants are eaten for the wildlife to survive. We cannot have perfect plants and have butterflies, and other insects.

Yet without butterflies and other insects to pollenate we cannot have plants for very long either.

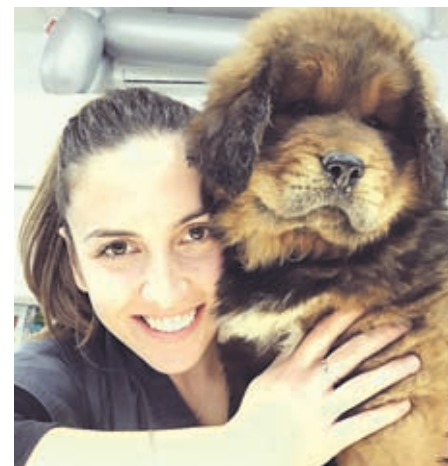

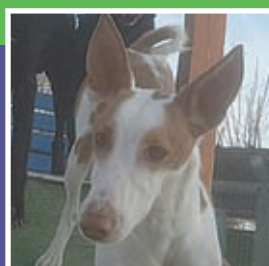

GERMAN car maker BMW has finally unveiled its new 8-series.

The two-door grand tourer now becomes the manufacturer's new flagship car, replacing the 6-series and with a firebreathing 650bhp V8 M8 model still to come next summer.

Looking broadly similar to the concept that was last year revealed at the 2017 Villa d'Este concourse in Italy, the car forms part of a new 'design language' for the brand which aims to be cleaner and more contemporary.

The headlights are narrow and can be fitted with lasers if certain options are ordered, and they sit aside a giant kidney grille which uses active aero aids and 'an almost fully-sealed underbod' which offers increased aerodynamic performance.

It can be bought with one of two engines from launch, an 840d and a M850i, both of which come with the xDrive all-wheel drive system and an eight-speed 'Steptronic' automatic gear box as standard.

The diesel features a 3.0-litre straight-six turbo engine with

306bhp and 520lb ft of torque, and is capable of 0-100kph in 4.9 seconds.

The M850i comes with a 4.4-litre twin-turbo V8 generating 523bhp and 553lb ft of torque, and will do 0-100kph in 3.74 seconds.

Under normal driving

conditions the xDrive system sends all power to the rear wheels to aid efficiency, but if the car de-

fects slip or is heavily loaded the front pair are engaged to improve grip.

BMW's 'integral active steering,' or rear wheel steering, is also fitted as standard.

In order to keep the 8-series as light as possible the roof, doors, bonnet and front bulkhead are made of aluminium, while the centre transmission tunnel through the cockpit is forged from carbon fibre reinforced plastic, of which other parts can also be specced.

Inside, the car is fitted with the latest version of the iDrive infotainment and instrument display system with a large centre console, while cruise control, a heads-up display and active parking is all fitted as standard.

The 'live cockpit professional' tech features a 12.3 inch instrument display and a 10.25 inch infotainment screen with Microsoft Office plus smart phone, Amazon Alexa and Google assistant connectivity.

There are rear seats fitted and the boot is a sizeable 420 litres, with prices set to start at around €87,000 for the 840d and upwards of €110,000 for the M850i.

Hatch made in heaven

AUDI is set to take on Mini with its new A1 Sportback.

The supermini is packed with technology, safety kit and new premium features, and is set to go on sale in November.

The outgoing first-generation model is the German brand's

third best-selling model in the UK, and has only once notched annual sales of less than 90,000 across Europe every year since it was launched in 2010.

In 2017 Mini shifted 215,549 units, meaning Audi has yet to reach its potential in the sector.

The new A1 looks sportier than the old model, with a single frame front grille and three flat bonnet slits reminiscent of the original 1984 Sport Quattro.

It is available only with five doors and has been made longer to increase cabin space and boot volume, the latter adding 65 litres.


There will be no diesel option, rather a range of turbocharged TFSI petrol engines, including a 95bhp 1.0-litre three cylinder, plus 1.5-litre and 2.0-litre four-cylinder options.

The standard gear box is a six-speed manual with a seven-speed S tronic automatic transmission available, while the fastest model, the 40 TFSI, comes with a six-speed S tronic box.

A 250bhp all-wheel-drive model is lined up for 2019, while active damping is optional.


The car comes with a 10.25 inch all-digital instrument cluster and multi-function steering wheel, while all but entry-level models are equipped with an 8.8 or 10.1 inch infotainment touchscreen.

Prices are expected to start at more than €18,500.

Pride of England

Harry the hero as Lions march on

GARETH SOUTHGATE will be looking to improve England's wastefulness in front of goal ahead of their second game in World Cup Group G.

The Three Lions play Panama, who lost 3-0 to Belgium in their first tie, at 2pm on Sunday in Nizhny Novgorod.

And there is a strong chance the coach could opt to tweak the starting line-up which spurned a raft of chances following good approach play against Tunisia on Monday.

Raheem Sterling - who has not scored for 21 internationals - Jesse Lingard and Dele Alli were most guilty but even John Stones, England's best central defender on the night, shanked a volley with the goal at his mercy.

Marcus Rashford and Ruben Loftus-Cheek both staked their claims to replace Sterling and Alli, respectively, after impressing during their cameos, while Danny Rose could come in for Ashley Young at left back after the Manchester United player won only five of 20 duels and gave the ball away 13 times.

Southgate's selection dilemmas come after captain Harry Kane's stoppage-time winner saw the Three Lions pick up their first win in the opening game of a major tournament since defeating Paraguay in the 2006 World Cup.

It was just reward after England were by far the better team in Volgograd, racking up eight shots on target to Tunisia's one.

The team started brilliantly, flying at their opponents and passing the ball with speed and accuracy before Kane turned in the opener after 11 minutes.

England continued to apply the pressure and missed opportunities to extend the lead until they were punished for Kyle Walker's clumsy elbow on Fakhreddine Ben Youssef, Ferjani Sassi equalising from the spot.

Walker was criticised for facing his own goal in the wake of referee Wilmar Roldan's harsh decision, but centre back is not his natural

position and he remains a work in progress there.

Tunisia dug in with their physical approach and frustrated England in the hot and humid conditions as the game wore on, with Dele Alli particularly out of sorts in the second period after picking up a thigh injury before half time.

But the team never gave up and fully deserved the victory secured by Kane's clever late header after the striker had earlier been wrestled to the

ground in the penalty area on two occasions when VAR officials should have given penalties.

And it was a vitally important win for a young and inexperienced England side which can now face its remaining group fixtures with confidence and momentum.

Southgate said afterwards he would have been proud of his players performances "if we'd drawn," but Spain, Portugal,

Argentina, Brazil and Germany failed to

win their opening games at this tournament while England did not.

complete motorsport's 'triple crown,' since he has already finished top of the podium at Monaco Grand Prix twice.

Only English legend Graham Hill has ever won all three classic races.

Former F1 driver Nakajima put the Toyota hybrid machine on pole position and the first half of the gruelling race saw the lead swing between Alonso's team and the number seven car piloted by Briton Mike Conway, Japanese Kamui Kobayashi and Ar-

gentine Jose Maria Lopez.

Buemi, also an ex-F1 star, was then hit with a 60-second stop-and-go penalty for speeding in a caution zone, leaving the number eight outfit two-thirds of a lap and more than two minutes behind.

But Alonso pulled the time back during a series of night-time stints behind the wheel, and Nakajima retook the lead in the 16th hour before the team held on for victory and a Toyota one-two.

British driver Jenson Button,

the 2009 F1 world champion, failed to complete the race after his Russian SMP team's car spent two hours in the pits before retiring.

The Japanese manufacturer was the only team entering a hybrid

car in the top LMP1 class.

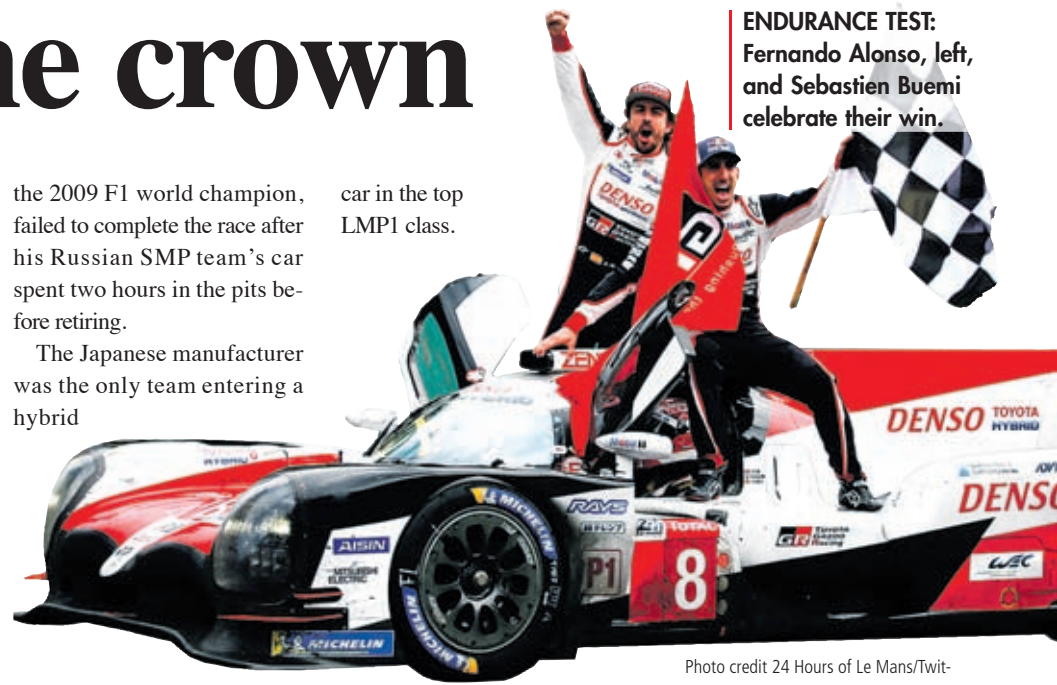
