

Drugs gang busted



CAUGHT: Bar and club employees were arrested for selling drugs in Benalmadena's party district.

NATIONAL POLICE have broken up an alleged drugs gang that was selling narcotics from a string of businesses in the party district of Benalmadena.

An operation, codenamed Waka, was put into action after police received several reports that drugs including hashish, cocaine and marihuana were being sold by employees at several bars

and clubs in the nightlife area of the town.

After carrying out surveillance, officers arrested six people and searched three houses in Benalmadena and Malaga.

According to the National Police, the gang's ringleaders prepared individual doses of the drugs at their homes, where they were picked up by a network of

During the operation, the investigators seized numerous doses of drugs already prepared for distribution. A total of 48 grammes of cocaine, 147 of hashish, 522 of marihuana, 2,700 grammes of cutting substance for cocaine and two cans of hashish oil were seized.

In addition, police confiscated €1,500 cash, a vehicle, 16 mobile phones, a tablet and drug preparation paraphernalia.

'Smelly passenger' dies Guitarist had flesh-rotting disease

A MAN who forced a Spanish flight packed with holidaymakers to make an emergency landing due to his 'unbearable' stench has died from a flesheating disease.

Russian musician Andrey Suchilin was travelling on a Transavia service from Gran Canaria to Amsterdam's Schipol Airport when passengers began to complain of his smell.

Some reportedly started fainting and vomiting, and the Boeing 737 aircraft was diverted to Faro on Portugal's Algarve so he could be removed after cabin crew tried to make him sit in the

Belgian flyer Piet van Haut at the time described the reek as 'unbearable

He added: "It was like he hadn't washed himself for several

A Transavia official said: "The aeroplane diverted because of medical reasons, but it is indeed right that he smelled quite a bit."

But now it has emerged that the 58-year-old was subsequently diagnosed with gangrene, a form of tissue necrosis caused by a loss of blood supply to the skin.

He later posted on Facebook how he had picked up an infection while on holiday, as he component of this whole situation is that I caught a disease, which (let's not say how and why) makes a man quite stinky."

He added his health insurance had expired, leaving him with no 'money, consular support or medical care

He had tried to arrange treatment before leaving Spain, but his partner Lidia Tikhonovich said a doctor gave him antibiotics for what he told them was

hospitalised, but his condition worsened as medics struggled to unearth the cause of the infec-

Lidia even tried to raise money from friends when he was moved into intensive care.

Mr Suchilin was later placed in a medically-induced coma and underwent several operations before she wrote, "there is nothing more to cut," adding that antibiotics were not working.

A fortnight later his heart. lungs and kidneys began to fail, before he died last week.

A Transavia statement said that the airline 'sympathises with the family and wishes them strength in processing their loss.'

According to local media in Russia, Mr Suchilin had been considered a 'rock music pioneer' in the former Soviet Union, and was 'one of the top guitar



Height restriction

Shocking time

A 12-YEAR-OLD girl has been taken to hospital after being electrocuted in a courtyard in a block of flats in Malaga City. Emergency services were called out to Calle Carboneros at around 2pm last Tuesday, with the girl taken to Malaga Children's Hospital after being revived following a cardiac arrest.

Bad brownie

THREE young women and a man were taken to hospital after eating a brownie laced with marihuana. Emergency services were called to a lifeguard booth on Marbella's Playa del Cable after passers-by spotted the youngsters, two aged 17 and two 18 'in a bad way.' They were all discharged from hospital later the same day.

Boy injured

AN 11-year-old boy and three adults were injured when two cars collided in Torremolinos. The accident happened on Avenida Manuel Fraga Iribarne on Sunday at 4pm. The child, a man of 73 and two women aged 40 and 69 years were taken to the Hospital Clínico Universitario in Malaga.

Feeling bullish?

IT'S among the most controversial animal festivals in the world.

And the 2018 San Fermin celebrations get underway tomorrow (Friday), with the notorious Running of the Bulls, encierro in Spanish, taking place daily for a week from Saturday.

Each run sees more than 1,000 thrill-seekers take part in a hair-raising four-minute dash in front of half-adozen bulls over a course through the city's cobbled

Most entrants dress in the event's traditional clothing which includes a white shirt and trousers with a red waistband (faja) and neckerchief (pañuelo).

Broadcast live on national television each morning, a rocket set off at 8am lets the runners know that the corral gate is open, with a second signalling the release of the bulls. Two more rockets are fired when all six of the animals have reached the bull ring, where they are normally killed in fights later the same day.

Injuries and even deaths are quite common, with three people gored on the first day last year, including one who was impaled through the testicles, while in 2016 a 29-year-old was killed.

And while it attracts hundreds of thousands of revellers every year, the festival has also been routinelyslammed by animal rights campaigners.

Fat cats slim down

COUNCIL fat cats will have to slim down after a mayor decreed a salary cut for his highest paid staff.

Around 30 senior managers at Torremolinos Council and its municipal companies currently earn more than Mayor Jose Ortiz.

By law, the mayor of a town of between 50,000 and 70,000 inhabitants can be paid €66,307 a year. Ortiz in fact takes €61.999. But on finding that numerous employees earn more than both figures he declared that the €66,307 cap should apply to all workers both at the town hall and in municipal companies. Anyone currently earning more than this amount will see their salaries cut. It is thought lower caps may be applied in certain departments.

It is not known how much money Torremolinos Council - which is € 180 million in debt - will save by these measures

by hitting her on the back of the head then throwing her down the stairs in a bid to inherit her €3,000 a month pension.

Malaga Prosecutor's Office is asking judges to jail the man, who has not been named, for 25 years.

The prosecution case alleges that at 7pm on February 11, 2016 the man visited his wife at her home in

Pueblo Lopez, Fuengirola. Despite being separated for 20 years, they still had a good relationship.

The prosecutor told a Malaga court that the man had approached his wife from behind and hit her with a sharp object, causing a traumatic

He then threw her down the stairs in order to simulate a fall, before exiting the house, leaving his wife lying in a pool of blood.



Jaw dropping f

AN ancient series of bones found in a Spanish cave have been confirmed as the oldest-known fossils of a human ancestor found in Western Europe.

The skeleton belonged to an individual of the species Homo antecessor, believed to be the last shared relative between modern Homo sapiens and Neanderthals before the two diverged.

It has been dated to between 772,000 to 949,000 vears old, pushing earlier estimates of the split back by at least 250,000 and up to 433,000 years.

And while some older human remains have been found in Europe, this new discovery is unique because none could be identified to species level.

It means that the evolution of modern humans could have taken far longer than genetic studies

The fossils were found at the Gran Dolina archaeological site near Atapuerca in Burgos Province, Castilla y Leon, where experts have been working since the 1990s.

Remains and artefacts from a range of early humans, including hunter-gatherer groups, Bronze Age occupants and much later settlers have been

unearthed from a series of caves in the surrounding hills

A tooth from the latest find was used in a complex carbon dating process to estimate its age by Professor Rainer Grün and Dr Mathieu Duval of the Australian Research Centre for Human Evolution and an international team of researchers.

The team also analysed soil samples from the dig site, and Professor Grün said: "We had to use the most advanced analytical techniques to date this tooth fragment, and had to go several times to the site in order to accurately reconstruct the sedimentary environment."

Homo antecessor is one of the earliest human species with remains dating back to around a mil-

It is said to have been around as tall as modern humans, although its brain was significantly smaller, and could have used a very basic language.

Previous studies claimed that modern humans and Neanderthals split around 516,000 years ago, but this new Spanish discovery appears set to rewrite such beliefs.



A BRITISH couple holidaying on the Costa del Sol have told Euro Weekly News of their sadness at finding a Benalmadena lake filled with plastic waste.

Joe and Janet Calton, 69 and 67 respectively, approached the Euro Weekly News head office while staying in Fuengirola to tell their story and share pictures from the Parque La Palo-

The Wrexham couple said they often took their grandchil-

dren to the park which is filled with wildlife. Janet Calton, who works for the UK's National Trust, said after seeing a swan with a plastic bag in its mouth they were now concerned about taking them in the future.

"Our grandkids are both learning about the environment in school. We're worried if they see what we're seeing how they might react," Janet Calton said.

"To see a beautiful animal like that eating that bag was dreadful. It could have killed itself," she added.

Joe Calton, a retired accoun-

tant, said the couple had been holidaying in Spain for over 20

"We go to the Parque La Paloma quite often, it's a beautiful place. On the day we saw the swan we were going down for a picnic.

"We have the same problem with plastic litter at home too, it's a shame," he said.

Tourists arrive on the Costa del Sol

THE flood of summer tourists has arrived, with Costa del Sol hotels expecting to welcome more than 800,000 travellers this month alone.

Dolphin found

A DOLPHIN has been taken to a marine life rescue centre after being found swimming close to the shore of a Benalmadena beach.

Swimmers alerted lifeguards to the animal after it was spotted approaching the shoreline of Los Molinos de Viento at around 5pm yesterday (Wednesday).

Witnesses said the dolphin appeared confused and that it struggled to stay afloat in the strong waves.


Three people, including lifeguards, attempted to keep the dolphin above water while specialists from the Aula del Mar centre made their way to the beach.

Vets met the group and the animal when it was brought to shore. It bore a large wound on one side of its body and the dolphin has since been taken to the centre for treatment.

It was originally thought the dolphin was a baby because of its size. Specialists from the rescue centre later confirmed it was an adult by examining its teeth.

Dolphins are commonly found in the Alboran Sea, the body of water which lies between Spain's southern coast and Africa.

The sea is home to the largest population of dolphins and bottlenose dolphins in the Western Mediterranean. The World Wildlife Foundation (WWF) has previously raised concerns about driftnet fishing on the animals

Hotting up

A HEATWAVE heading to Spain is expected to send temperatures up to 45 degrees next week

A warm front from Africa is forecast to scorch areas such as Badajoz and Zaragoza on Monday, with maximum temperatures of 40 degrees. Madrid and Sevilla will hover around 38-39 degrees, with the Valencia and Barcelona areas feeling 'fresher' with highs of 33 for Monday, but they are set to raise as the week goes on.

The rest of Andalucia is set to stay

above 40 degrees, with meteorologists fearing parts inland will hit 45 degrees in the shade.

Malaga will see highs of around 36 on Monday but again they are expected to increase over the course of the

Mallorca and Valencian health officials have also issued warnings due to the expected rise in temperatures, with children and the elderly advised to stay in the shade as much as possible and to drink plenty of water.

OUR VIEW

Another cunning plan

AS both Plan A and Plan B covering Britain and the Customs Union have fallen foul of different factions of the Conservative Party, Plan C is due to be unveiled tomorrow (Friday).

What can be described as a schism within the government is becoming more apparent and there are even rumours that up to six current ministers are planning to challenge Mrs May for the leadership. The old saying about the difficulty of herding cats seems to apply to the current situation and this plan which is being trailed as offering 'the best of both worlds' will be discussed by the Cabinet at Chequers and then may form the basis of a white paper if agreement can be reached.

That is a big 'if' and the fact that the government finally has an agreed position, doesn't then mean that the 27 European Member States will agree unanimously to the British position.

On a wider platform, the EU itself appears to be in a fairly parlous state, with immigration in particular causing splits and with so many coalition governments in place around the Union, those Nationalist parties who would normally be in the minority are heavily involved in dictating policy.

Even Angela Merkel who is considered to be the most liberal of politicians has had to agree to open border camps for immigrants and to tighten control between Germany and Austria despite the Schengen agreement.

Spain is once again ruled by a minority government which attracted support not necessarily because of its policies but because so many opposition politicians wanted to see the end of Mariano Rajoy. Hopefully however, the next few weeks will see a clearer road to Brexit.

POLICE say that they have broken up a gang that targeted mobile phone stores for rob-

In a joint investigation, Guardia Civil and National Police have arrested seven people accused of involvement in 15 robberies in the provinces of Malaga, Sevilla and Cordoba.

Officers searched five homes in Malaga, Fuengirola and Casabermeja, with €9,000,53 mobile phones and 52 kilos of hashish being seized.

Guardia Civil first opened their investigation in January after several robberies with force were committed at mobile phone shops in the Guadalhorce valley.

At the same time National Police in Velez-Malaga had opened their own investigation after four similar robberies in the Axarquia.

According to the investigation, the criminal organisation had a network of receivers that sold on stolen phones at a discount on retail price.

The alleged robbers, all of whom are Spanish, were arrested on May 21 after an attack on a store in Cordoba Province. They have been charged with being members of a criminal organisation, robbery with force and receiving stolen goods. Police say they were involved in a total of 15 robberies.

Brit teen survives fall

A BRITISH teenager has survived after plunging from the fifth floor of a Magaluf hotel whilst celebrating England's World Cup win over Colombia.

The 18-year-old was taken to hospital after falling from the Flamboyan Caribe hotel where he had been partying with his friends and girlfriend.

A kebab shop worker called an ambulance after finding him lying outside the hotel.

According to reports he was in a 'serious but conscious' condition when he was taken to Son Espases Hospital in Mallorca.

It is believed the young England fan fell at around 1.30am, just hours after England beat Colombia on penalties to earn their place in the quarter finals.

Jaws-dropping!

Huge great white shark spotted

A GIANT great white shark has been spotted off the coast of Mallorca.

The five-metre long predator was filmed for 70 minutes as it cruised in clear water in the Cabrera Archipelago National Park, 10 kilometres to the south of the holiday island.

Biologists from the AL-NITAK 2018 Scientific Expedition announced the historic sighting on their Facebook page, writing that it is the first time one of the huge fish, known scientifically as Carcharodon carcharias, has been spotted in Spanish waters for three decades.

"There have been unconfirmed sightings and rumours in recent years, but this is the first scientific observation of Carcharodon in Spanish waters for at least 30 years," the post said.



SOME FIN REMARKABLE: It is the first documented sighting of the predator in Spain for 30 years.

"On this occasion the historic sighting was photographed, filmed and observed by a crew of 10 people from five countries."

Led by Spanish-Dutch biologist Ricardo Sagarminaga van Buiten, the team also included 16-year-old scholarship students Miguel Felix Arboledas and Nahim Lasgaa Capo, plus British environmentalist and writer Georgina Stevens.

Alnitak is a Spanish marine research and education centre dedicated to the conservation of marine habi-





The trial follows a probe into the alleged stealing of babies from the San Ramon clinic during between 1961 and 1981.

Prosecutors have requested that Vela be handed an 11-year prison sentence should he be found guilty. The case continues.

Doorstep shooting

Man held over UK doorstep attack on boy and his mum

A MAN has been held in Spain in connection with the shooting of a seven-year-old boy and his mother on the doorstep of their UK home.

Greater Manchester Police (GMP) confirmed that the unnamed 28-year-old was wanted for conspiracy to murder after Christian Hickey and mum Jane, 30, were gunned down in Winton, Salford.

Both victims were shot in the legs when they answered the door on October 12, 2015.

The suspect was held at an unconfirmed location in Spain after a European Arrest Warrant was issued in his name and he is likely to be extradited shortly.

GMP's Det Ch Insp, Carl Jones, said the swoop was completed by Spanish National Police with help from the UK's National Crime Agency.

He added it was 'part of the

Pilots support strike



STRIKE ACTION: Ryanair pilots claim the airline doesn't take their grievances seriously.

RYANAIR pilots have voted to back strike action. putting holiday flights at risk.

Members of the Irish Airline Pilots' Association at the low-cost airline voted almost unanimously in favour, with 99 per cent supporting downing

The union said Ryanair was not taking their demands over working and pay conditions, and how annual leave is dealt with, seriously.

Some 120 union members, most of them captains, are directly employed by Ryanair and are able to strike.

The Dublin-based airline said it would contact customers affected if the strike goes ahead and has invited the union to its offices for talks. A Ryanair

spokesperson said in a statement, "Since Ireland accounts for less than 7 per cent of Ryanair flights, we expect that 93 per cent of our customers will be unaffected by any strike."

Pilots are planning to down tools for 24 hours from 1am on July 12.

The budget airline also faces strike threats from cabin crew members across Europe, who are calling for Ryanair to follow labour laws in each country staff are employed and to guarantee the same conditions for agency workers.

Sources say the unions will be giving a longer notice than the 10-day minimum, in an attempt to give the low-cost airline a chance to restart

Sexual assault sparks outcry

one male vouth in Gran Canaria in connection with allegations of sexual assault has sparked outrage across Spain.

The suspects were reportedly members of a group selfstyled as 'La nueva manada' (new wolf pack). The attack is alleged to have taken place during the recent San Juan festival, with the victim reportedly aged 16.

The name is believed to be a reference to five men who were convicted of sexually assaulting a girl at the San Fermin Running of the Bulls festival in Pamplona. The group coined the term for themselves while being held, according to Spanish media.

They were members of a group they dubbed 'La Manada' (the wolf pack), the court heard during their trial.

The five new suspects, one aged 15, were arrested in the town of Maspalomas, with four bailed after appearing before a court in San Bartolome de Tirajana last week

They have been barred from leaving Gran Canaria, or from going to the town where the alleged victim lives, as part of their bail conditions. The 15-

year-old has been held in custody by a juvenile court.

A students' union called protests in Gran Canaria over the case in the island's capital of Las Palmas on Saturday.

"We are tired of this patriarchal justice system, we're not going to shut up," the group said on Twitter.

Great ball of fire

AN observatory has published pictures of what it said was rock from a comet entering the Earth's atmosphere over Malaga Province.

The University of Huelva's Calar Alto telescopes, based in Almeria, spotted the space debris flying over the provinces of Malaga, Sevilla and Cordoba in the early hours of Monday.

It was recorded from that observatory as well as at one in La Hita in Toledo and La Sagra in Granada.

These sites are part of the SMART project which records and documents observations of space objects and ac-

Calar Alto said initial analysis from the site's principal investigator Professor Jose Maria Madiedo showed the 'fireball' phenomenon was created when the debris entered the earth's atmosphere.

The University of Huelva academic's work found that it was travelling at around 118,000 kilometres per hour.

It was flying around 99 kilometres above ground level when it passed over Malaga Province before crossing the provinces of Sevilla and Cordoba and falling to about 31 kilometres.

Murdered Brit woman's husband jailed

THE man who beat his British wife in their home in Gran Canaria has been jailed.

Jayne Railton, 58, was so severely beaten she had virtually all her ribs broken and her pancreas split in a vicious attack in July 2016.

She died just over a month after the assault at Doctor Negrin Hospital in Gran Canaria after failing to recover from her injuries.

Jayne's husband Angel Perez Reyes, 64, has been sentenced to 22 years, six months and one day in prison after a jury found him guilty at a court in Las Palmas.

The pair had been together for 11 years and shared a home in La Angostura but on July 21. Reyes beat his partner so hard one rib was fractured four times according to reports.

He then tried to cover up his assault by telling one of Jayne's daughters she had fallen after drinking too much and insisted on putting her to

Judge Nicolas Acosta Gonzalez said jurors had agreed Jayne's common-law husband had "dealt her a series of direct and very violent blows with kicks to her chest and abdomen with which he intended not only to cause her death, but also to increase her suffering."

A doctor who gave evidence at the trial described her injuries as some of the most severe she had ever seen. Reyes has also been ordered to pay his victim's children € 150,000.

Theft on the beach

THIEVES in the holiday resort of Magaluf have been making off with the clothes and belongings of British tourists while they cavort on the beach at night.

Holidaymakers in the area popular with British travellers have returned to where they left their possessions after swimming nude or making love to find they have vanished, according to reports.

It comes as tourists have recently being slapped with fines for rowdy behaviour in Magaluf. Police there and in the neighbouring Palma Nova have stepped up night patrols on beaches and have also made a number of arrests.

The crackdown follows vows made by local politicians to clean up the area's reputation. Magaluf is known for rowdy behaviour on the part of holidaying revellers.

Eight people have been arrested recently for having sex in public, with fines of around €226 dished out by authori-

A total of 411 violations of by-laws passed in a bid to control rowdy behaviour were recorded by authorities in May, up from 66 at the same time last year.

The majority, 267 were handed down for illegal street selling and there were 34 recorded for 'unauthorised massages,' 31 for drinking in the streets and 28 for drugs offences.

Homes shown the door

THE Malaga-based holiday rental company Spain-Holiday.com, has removed 275 properties from its website that were not formally registered.

As a result, the company can now say that 100 per cent of the properties it advertises are registered.

Spain-Holiday.com has been working closely with the authorities since housing regulations changed in 2016, and has also been advising all managers of tourist properties to ensure they obey the law.

The same approach is being taken by rental giants Airbnb, who are looking for greater transparency in their operations.

Removing the properties obviously negatively impacts business, but the companies hope to get them back in due course.

Spain-Holiday.com advertises 12,000 homes across Cataluña, the Balearic Islands and Valencia.

Electric quad patrol

MARBELLA police will be patrolling the city's beaches cleanly and quietly this summer now that they have taken delivery of electric quads.

The local council hopes that the initiative will help citizen safety and security, without causing any noise pollution to those enjoying a few quiet hours on the beach.

This is part of a series of options that have been put in place this summer, explained the mayor of Marbella, Ángeles Muñoz. In addition, the number of lifeguard watch towers has been increased to 15 and a team of 30 has been assembled to keep the beaches clean.

A new mobile phone application is also being launched, via which people can report any problems they observe on Marbella's beaches. In total €1.5 million has been budgeted for beach services this year.

'Most wanted' fugitive

ONE of Britain's most wanted fugitives, originally believed to have been hiding in Spain, has been arrested in Switzerland.

Avon and Somerset Police appealed for help in Spain when Mark Acklom, 45, vanished in 2012 after conning a divorcee out of her £850,000 (€960.525) life savings.

The victim stated that Acklom first claimed to work in the banking world in Switzerland and was very wealthy.

He then went on to claim he worked for an intelligence agency.

Acklom arranged for the victim to live in one of the properties he claimed to own in Bath.

He stated he had cash flow problems that were hindering renovation work, and the victim gave him numerous loans

totalling £850,000. It later transpired that Acklom did not own the property. The victim never received any of her money

Police believed Acklom was with his wife Maria Rodriguez and their two daughters in Murcia, but a spokesperson confirmed the 45-year-old was in Zurich awaiting an extradition hearing.

Wrong court files destroyed

RED faced court officials are trying to piece together 78 sets of judicial proceedings after the case files were accidently destroved.

The Fuengirola court had sent the files to the judicial warehouse in Malaga for safe keeping, but unfortunately the contractor responsible for the management of the files made a mistake.

It would appear that the files were placed next to a pile of cases to be destroyed, and they all got carted away for destruc-

The incident happened in October, but has only recently come to light when the court asked to retrieve a case.

To date about a dozen of the court cases have been reconstructed by the judicial authorities, leaving them with a long way to go before all the court proceedings can go ahead.

It is no easy matter, as all parties in each of the proceedings must now supply copies of all the relevant documents. Provided all sides agree that the documents resubmitted are in order, then a decree will be issued to declare the proceedings reconstituted.

However, if there is any disagreement all interested parties and the public prosecutor will need to be summoned to court to examine the case and see if there is any possibility of it going ahead.

The judicial archive has drawn criticism in the past. To deal with complaints of its dilapidated condition, it is planned to rent a new 45,000 square metre warehouse.

Bodies unearthed

ARCHAEOLOGISTS working in Cadiz City have found the remains of two people in what they believe could be a mass grave dating from the Spanish Civil War.

The researchers, from the city's council and a historical association, found the bodies after five months of working at the site in the San Jose cemetery. They said the skulls of the skeletons showed signs of bullet

Archaeologists believe there are two mass graves in the cemetery. They estimate there are corpses of at least

141 victims of dictator Francisco Franco's reprisals against his opponents, after his forces took the city in July 1936 in one.

The other burial pit is yet to be properly surveyed but initial estimates place the number of those buried there at anything up to 550.

Jose Luis Gutierrez, a historian with the Platform of Historical Memory in Cadiz, said many of those who died were likely killed during reprisals in August 1936.

"We must bear in mind that a council of war was established in Cadiz and that was where the sentences were is-

sued," he said.

Researchers are now set to document the physical characteristics of the remains found and to undertake DNA analysis to identify them and trace any surviving relatives.

Martin Vila, the Cadiz Council's democratic memory spokesperson, said works in the area in 1979 left a part of the grave empty, making a full documentation of the bodies difficult.

Nursery fire

FIVE fire appliances were needed to extinguish a fire in a Torremolinos plant nursery, that forced the delay of local trains as a precaution.

About 3,000 square metres of ground was affected, with the presence of dried leaves, unpruned palm trees and other combustible materials blamed by witnesses for the rapid spread of the blaze.

Initially three teams of firefighters attended. The steep terrain meant the firefighters needed to use more water than usual, and a shortage of water forced the teams to call for help from Malaga and Benalmadena fire departments, who each sent a water tanker. The fire, which broke out at about 4am last Friday took an hour to be controlled and was not completely extinguished until 6.30 am.

FUENGIROLA'S municipal auditor has issued a harsh report after works to Jacinto Benavente street suffered a cost overrun of nearly €50,000. Councillors argue that the extra costs were unforeseeable and had to be made to complete the project.

Jobs jump

ACCORDING to a report on tourism by a trade union, the sector will increase employment by 3 per cent this summer. The report also indicates that there will be a 2.6 per cent increase in tourists.

Bus boost

MIJAS Council has announced the M122 bus that links Fuengirola and Mijas. and the M220 that connects Fuengirola and Marbella, have extended their frequency for the summer season.

New Gibraltar cable

Since then, things have changed dramatically, especially the number of tourists who visit Gibraltar arriving by land, sea and sky.

A proposal has been submitted which would see new stations both at the lower point in Grand Parade and on the Upper Rock which will be fitted with solar panelling to produce some of the electricity needed to power the cars.

The rebuild will see a reduc-

tion of parking spaces by 22 (a little more than 5 per cent of the capacity) and will possibly cause the small number of disabled spaces to be moved elsewhere. However, government plans presently in place to completely repurpose the Grand Parade Car Park could avoid this problem.

The entire project, which will also take into consideration environmental concerns and the macaques, is yet to be considered by the planning committee. But it does suggest that MH Bland isn't concerned about the effect of Brexit on visitor numbers.

Marina clean up

BENALMADENA'S Puerto Marina will finally be dredged nearly 10 years after the project was first drawn

More than 40,000 cubic metres of sand are expected to be extracted in the operation, which will help clear accumulations dumped by storms over the years.

A study made last year revealed banks of mud and sand, which were in danger of blocking access to the port and the sailing club.

The dredged sand will be used to replenish local beach-

National Park status coming

MALAGA'S Sierra de las Nieves will soon become Spain's 16th national park.

Spain's Minister for Ecological Transition, Teresa Ribera, announced that a bill will be presented to parliament for approval by the end of the year.

She was speaking to the senate during a commemorative act marking the centenary of the nation's first two national parks - the Picos de Europa and Ordesa.

The Sierra de las Nieves covers 23,000 hectares and encompasses eight municipalities, including Ronda.

Last February, the Council of Ministers gave the green light to the joint proposal of the Ministry of the Environment and the Junta de Andalucia regional government, the step prior to the drafting of the bill.

At the moment Spain has 15 national parks in 12 autonomous communities, covering a total of 400,000 hectares.

Fairground horror

A MOTHER and her daughter have been injured after safety mechanisms 'malfunctioned' on a fairground ride in Vigo. Spain.

The woman, who was seriously injured, told news outlets that "no supervisor came to check" the bar was secure and that she had to pull it down herself before the Coia ride began.

She said the moment the ride began the bar "half opened" flinging her out of her seat and she was left hanging on with one arm.

The woman was then slammed "against the floor and fencing that surrounded the perimeter.'

When asked why she had not fastened her seatbelt, the moth-

According to the Security Councillor of Vigo the ride has two safety mechanisms in place, a sensor which tells the computer system monitoring it that it has locked and a supervisor to visually check each seat before the ride begins.

Two mechanisms which "clearly failed," he concluded.

Retired driving instructor Clive Block said his wife Bev asked for a glass of water to help calm her nerves following the ordeal.


But she was told by a flight attendant she would still have to pay for a bottle of water.

So next time that you are in the UK be warned that there may be fewer machines in operation and the use of them could be more expensive.

"We have achieved a fundamental objective, an agreement. Our position is more ambitious and this agreement will allow us to continue moving towards bringing migration to the European level," he said.

He added he thought the deal could have gone much further.

Sanchez previously said unilateralism and negative language would not solve the migration crisis, as he gathered with fellow European Union leaders for the summit last

He added in a joint interview with British, French and German media that a shared response was needed to deal with the issue.

"I think the Italian government needs to reflect on whether unilateralism is an effective response to a global challenge such as migrants,"

Sanchez told reporters.

He added that he was in favour of cooperating with the government of Libya to ensure their borders were functioning properly.


"As effective as the inflammatory rhetoric from some Italian leaders may be in electoral terms, from the point of view of responding effectively to a humanitarian crisis like the one we're seeing in the Mediterranean and on the Italian coast, it's not the answer," he said.

That comment has been interpreted as a reference to Italian Deputy Prime Minister and Interior Minister Matteo Salvini. The leader of the far-right Lega Nord, appointed following recent elections, said migrants are cargo of 'human flesh' and those on the Aquarius would only see Italy 'on a

Those comments came as Spain previously agreed to allow the Aquarius and another boat carrying 630 people in total to dock in Valencia after it was turned away by Italy and

"I think the fundamental philosophy should be that when a small boat arrives on the shores of Tarifa, Malta or Lesbos, it's arriving in Europe. It's not arriving in Spain, Malta or Greece," he said.

"The fundamental point is that you can't have a national or unilateral perspective when it comes to a shared challenge. I'm calling for a shared response to a shared challenge," he added.

She and her husband purchased their first property in Calahonda some 35 years ago as a holiday home with the intention that it would become more of a permanent bolt hole when they retired.

Twenty years ago, they moved 'temporarily' to Spain although they kept a property in Surrey and at the same time, Margaret sold her company and they purchased a larger detached house in La Cala.

For some time she was sharing her time between the UK and Spain but found that work got in the way of having a social life and decided to concentrate the bulk of her time on one country and that was Spain.

Sadly, her husband developed signs of Alzheimer's and

she spent 10 years looking after him before he died just three years ago.

Although she never considered that they were that heavily involved in charity, as she reappraised her life, she realised that in actual fact they had spent a great deal of time

Both of them were heavily committed to the Polish community in London as Margaret's husband had strong Polish roots.

Once she was alone (al-

though she had plenty of friends and family), she decided that although she could have a busy social life, she wanted to do something for the community in which she lived.

Margaret became a Lion just three years ago and discovered that this was a genuinely caring charity which works hard to help others.

Generally, there are just 30 to 35 Lion members to a club and each pays an annual fee of €90 as well as a €25 joining fee and this helps to fund certain legal requirements of the club such as accounting.

Members are also expected to participate at various fundraising lunches and other events which tend to be help every month.

The bulk of the funds raised come from the three interconnected charity shops based in La Cala and apart from electricity and other unavoidable overheads, all money collected from this venture goes straight to those who need

Renting out property



THE rules that as owner you have to follow to rent your property to tourists in Spain are a complete hieroglyph today.

What is the law that regulates tourist rental?

Currently, there are 43 different Tourism regulations in the Spanish national territory. The City Councils can also add requirements from the competences they have in planning matters.

Can the Community of Owners prohibit tourist rental?

The Community of Owners does not have the power to limit the owner's rights. among which is to rent the property. They can regulate and enforce the statutes that regulate the use of common elements of the community.

Is it always necessary to communicate

your renting to tourists to the regional government?

Yes, it is, this being the only point where all the autonomic regulations coincide, together with the need for registration at Tourism Registries.

Is it foreseeable that the regulations will be unified in the future?

Yes, in fact, the National Commission of markets and competition has created a working group with regional authorities. This commission is meeting with each Community and City Council for discussion and work on this common regulation.


How profitable is it to rent your property in summer to tourists?

It depends on the location: some examples: €36,000 in Barcelona, €33,000 in Ibiza, €21,000 in San Sebastian, €20,000 in Tarifa (Cádiz), €18,000 in Marbella. €9,000 in Gandía, Calpe or Denia.



Fixed rate or variable rate mortgage?



DIFFERENT from the UK, changing your mortgage in Spain after you have signed the deeds, can both be expensive and difficult.

This makes it important to choose your mortgage wisely from the very start.

In Spain, you have two main types of mortgages. The most common is variable rate mortgages, known as tracker mortgages, where the interest changes once a year, always at the same date.

When fixing the interest rate for the following year, they use the Euribor 12 months rate that is the same all across Europe.

The other option is a fixed rate mortgage. Different from the UK, the rate is fixed for the full term and for the full mortgage amount. You can fix the interest rate for up to 30 years.

"Do you recommend a fixed or variable rate mortgage, is a normal question we get from the clients," Sara Stannard says.

She works as a British client advisor at Bank in Spain and specialises in expatatriate and international clients buying their holiday

"We never recommend any of the two options." she continues "since there is not any one correct answer."

Sara mentions two important factors that will help the client decide on what is best for them. "If the client plans to pay the mortgage off quicker than the agreed term, a variable rate is normally the best. Due to the higher early repayment charges on fixed rate mortgages, the client is better off choosing a variable rate."

The other factor is how they can handle a future increase in the interest rate and how they value the certainty of knowing exactly what to pay every month for the next 15-30

With record low rates in the Euro and negative Euribor rates for more than two years, it has never been cheaper to opt for a fixed rate mortgage. This is also reflected in the number of fixed rate mortgages that were arranged in Spain last year.

"What used to be a niche product five years ago when only one out of 16 new mortgages had a fixed rate, last year we saw that more than one out of three mortgages were fixed rate mortgages," Sara explains.

It currently flies from Buenos Aires, Los Angeles, Boston, and San Francisco to Barcelona, and New York to Paris and Madrid.

But it will from July 17 begin flights from Vienna to 14 destinations including London Gatwick, Barcelona,

Madrid, and Mallorca using four Airbus A321 planes in a bid to take on established budget carriers.

Simon Calder, travel editor of the Independent said the bold move by IAG would spark a "massive fares

He added: "British Airways' parent company has astonished the aviation market by launching a new Viennabased subsidiary with less than three weeks' notice."

IAG's chief executive Willie Walsh said there will be "more flight choices

He added: "These flights will be branded as Level to build upon the huge success of our new long-haul low-cost operation.

Flights from London to the Austrian capital with Level currently start at €24, although as with rivals, passengers must pay extra fees to choose a seat or to check in a hold bag.

IAG recently tried to buy its lowcost long-haul rival Norwegian Air Shuttle and Vienna-based Niki, losing out to Irish airline Ryanair in the latter

EU agrees hike in migrant cash

Pound stumbles, US dollar accelerates

Ask the expert Peter Loveday

Euro

EUR/GBP: Up from £0.87 to £0.88 EUR/USD: Down from \$1.17 to \$1.16

The euro (EUR) has traded in wide range again in June, with easing concerns over Italy's commitment to the Eurozone being unwound by the European Central Bank's (ECB) latest policy

Initially the single currency strengthened this month as Italy's new government dispelled fears that it was planning to ditch the euro.

However this meant little in the face of June's ECB policy meeting.

This saw the single currency nosedive as the bank's announcement of plans to unwind its stimulus programme was undermined by the ECB's accompanying pledge to leave interest rates on hold well into 2019.

The single currency did a serviceable job in clawing back some of these gains by the end of the month however, with some upbeat PMI figures aiding its road to recovery.



JULY: Could see a more substantial lift in the euro.

Looking ahead, July could see a more substantial lift in the euro should Eurozone data continue to print positively, which would help ease fears of a sustained slowdown across the bloc.

GBP/EUR: Down from €1.14 to €1.13 GBP/USD: Down from \$1.33 to \$1.32.

Sterling (GBP) fell back once again in June, with the pound bowing before the pressures on rising Brexit uncertainty and subdued eco-

While May's better-than-expected PMI readings helped Sterling to get off to a positive start this month, it was soon undone by the UK's latest wage growth and inflation figures, both of which dragged on the pound as they printed below ex-

The only notable lifeline offered to GBP in June came in the form of a hawkish swift from within the Bank of England (BoE), with Chief

mediate rate hike at this month's policy meeting prompting markets to be on the lookout for an August rate hike

Indeed, if there is any more evidence supporting a summer rate hike, it may be possible for the pound to find some strength in July, so long as the shadow of Brexit doesn't return to drag on

US Dollar

USD/GBP: Up from £0.74 to £0.75 USD/EUR: Unmoved at €0.85

While the US dollar (USD) continued to appreciate in June, its advance slowed noticeably in comparison to its meteoric rise in May.

Just as in May, this month has seen the US dollar continue to find support from some solid domestic data, while a widely-anticipated rate hike from the Federal Reserve also lent strength to the

However the dominant force behind USD in June proved to be the sharp rise in global trade tensions, with the currency fluctuating as Donald Trump stepped up the rhetoric.

This trend is likely to continue throughout July as well, with the US dollar likely to remain in a position of strength as upbeat economic data and ongoing trade uncertainty helps to drive demand for the 'Greenback.

So, as always, I appeal to all communities to keep looking at your debtor lists, because no matter what fantastic sports events or royal weddings we are watching and enjoying, there remain those that continue to enjoy all the benefits of our communities but do

not pay for the privilege.

This 'World Cup Season' does start me thinking about the numerous UK football clubs LPL currently work for. You see, it is not just communities and general suppliers that have debt prob-

In the world of football, many clubs suffer from unpaid hospitality bills, banqueting arguments, and in some cases complex contractual issues surrounding agent payments and the like.

Just like transfer fees, the general unpaid bills that the clubs suffer are very high. Only recently we successfully recovered a £35,000 unpaid hospitality bill for a well-known Premier League club, probably more efficiently than their recent league table performance! Fortunately, this club had incorporated within their terms and conditions a clause to cover them for collection costs, so in the end the collection cost the club nothing as we managed to get all the costs back from the

The matter of cost of collection was also a point of discussion recently with one of our valued Spanish Administrators. Their particular community in southern Spain did not have any provision for surcharges or extra costs of any kind on accounts that are overdue. Such costs and charges must be incorporated within the community by-laws.

If there is to be a provision for costs/surcharges on overdue or late payments it must be discussed and voted on at an AGM, minutes of the meeting properly recorded and then included in the by-laws. Then these extra amounts can, and must, be incorporated within the community statements (Libro Mayor) and presented to owners showing balance of account, dates of payments and balances due, if in ar-

Should collection then be passed to LPL, we can, in nearly all cases, collect these further charges, which often negate the cost of collection. The general addition is between 10 - 20 per cent on the overdue quarterly unpaid

Such charges, properly added in accordance with the Community by-laws have, so far, never

been challenged in the UK or Spanish courts.

Must they pay wealth tax?

With reference to your advice regarding property wealth tax. We have owned a property in Torrevieja for 18 years but have only paid tax on it for four years. The property is now valued at €50,000. We are non-residents.

If we start to pay tax now, will we open a can of worms and what would be the worst-case scenario?

D.C. (Costa Blanca)

There is no 'property wealth tax.'

1. There is an annual

property tax, the IBI

David Searl You and the Law in Spain

(Impuesto sobre Bienes Inmuebles), which is the equivalent of the 'rates' in the UK. You pay this tax every year, based on the rated value of your property. In your case, it should not be more than a few hundred

2. Then there is the Spanish 'wealth tax,' the Impuesto sobre el Patrimonio. This is a tax on all capital assets, not only houses and flats. It includes stocks and shares, money in bank accounts, yachts and gold bars under the mattress. Even non-residents have an exemption of €700,000 per person, so you probably are exempt.

If you have not paid the IBI, the Tax Agency can claim back tax on the previous four years.


Whatever their individual merits, from the PP's point of view

Looky Look-see!! Marbella needs you!



DID you read the article in last week's EWN on the holidaymaker who blacked up and walked around Ibiza imitating the 'looky looky men?

I did and found myself reading other articles, blogs and posts that popped up online on this subject.

I was beyond shocked to see the long list of insults ranging from apparent lack of intelligence to lack of rights and the general assumption that they become aggressive when turned away.

There are apparently now 147 nationalities inscribed on our Marbella town census (the padrón) and these people my friends, are one of them! I have written about this nationality of fellow foreigner previously to share my little knowledge of the Wolof language which is the official language spoken by the Wolof tribe, from which most of our Senegalese looky lookies originate.



Not so much a nuisance as a member of the community.

I've been back on the coast for quite a few years now and got to know many of them by face, at least enough to wave in recognition to say 'hello.' They live here, like we do, working to have a better life - which in itself is an indication of how hard they must have it back home if traipsing up and down the beaches in scorching sunshine day in and day out is a better life!

Just this weekend whilst sitting on the beach and minding our own business a young man laden with handbags suddenly appeared at the foot of the sunbed. His name was Momo, from the Wolof tribe. We know this as instead of turning away from him we had politely said 'no thank you' in his language.

He was so surprised but even more so when my son-in-law continued on the conversation and asked him his name, in his native tongue. Within minutes our family group, now all familiar with the basic Wolof greetings were chatting as best we could with this young man and I really think we made his day and certainly ours didn't suffer for

One of the things I always ask is if they are inscribed on the local town census (the padrón). So far and without exception the reply has been yes. This simple document gives them many privileges and benefits including essential social care, which they are entitled to even though they are living here without the correct documentation or work

I would think therefore that the town census must surely be just an internal document to show the inhabitants that are living in the area to justify the investment per capita owed to them by central government, otherwise these illegal immigrants wouldn't dare sign up.

I thought I'd share this little detail with you as so many people fear registering on our town census (the padrón), mainly it would seem because of potential financial repercussions or taxes. However it would also seem that it's just benefits all round and potentially even the right to vote in the upcoming elections! So why not take a 'looky look-see' and see how you can benefit too?



THE other day a friend invited me to fondle her new equipment. No, not that. She had bought a very fancy, state-of-the-art laptop. And she simply got too much for her money.

Straight out of the box, her shiny new notebook was full of junk. Bloatware, as it's known in IT circles, or indeed its other far less userfriendly name, which we shall rename slightly in this family newspaper as clapware.

A time-limited trial office suite, anti-virus, toolbars, games and questionably useful apps squatted flatulently on what should have been a clean new hard-drive, all hoping to lock her into clicking Yes when their period of grace (soon) expired, and the consequent pain in the purse.

Those of us with plenty of ICT savvy, and no life, would show the junk the door with some fairly radical uninstalling. But we're not the target in what is, essentially, advertising what the buyer has actually paid to have.

"Can I safely delete this?," my friend would ask plaintively each time, and all power to her timidity.

Pushing out the bloat

Terence Kennedy suggests what to do when your new lean, mean machine isn't.



BATTLE OF THE BLOAT: Clean up your new PC.

It's what these digital intruders count on. Who wants to cripple a lovely new laptop by zapping something vital by mistake?

It's not just your storage which is affected by this pre-loaded junk. A survey comparing two otherwise identical top-of-the-range laptops, one with the

pre-loaded bloatware and the other without, revealed that the lean machine started 104 per cent faster, shut down 35 per cent quicker and had 28 more minutes of battery life. Ouch.

If you're reasonably confident, you can safely uninstall anything you know you won't need, Microsoft Office trialware eats up lots of disk space and can safely be zapped by going to PC Settings | Apps | Apps & Features and then clicking it. Then download LibreOffice as a perfectly serviceable free alternative.

You can also safely uninstall preloaded virus and security suites to replace them with the (free) solution of your choice - or live a little more dangerously and depend on the adequate Windows Defender built into your operating system.

When in doubt, there are several safe and free solutions for reclaiming all the hard-drive space, and processing power, that you paid for in a new computer.

Should I Remove It is exactly what its title suggests, or you could go for Slim Computer or AdwCleaner - and in all cases read their websites carefully so you know exactly what it will do

Or you could just download PC Decrapifier. It's the registered name of the best-known of the cleaner-uppers, so please don't sue me for ob-

Phone clog

TODAY'S Android phones are notorious for their preloaded junk, and most of it can be safely disabled or

All it takes is a quick trip to the Settings menu, then Apps (or Applications), then click each unwanted app in turn. Third-party apps generally have an Uninstall button, while many of Android's, or the manufacturer's, own apps will only allow you to Disable them. If there are unintended consequences simply go back and Enable again.

Or you can download Disable Bloatware from the Google Play store, but be aware this generally just hides unwanted junk rather than actually deleting it.

The bottom line is that the great populist philosopher Mick Jagger was wrong: you CAN always get what you want - with a little de-clapifying.



My German neighbour and her colleagues spend much of their time doing precisely that in the Benissa and Moraira area.

They catch the cats, take them to the vet for checking and neutering and insert an identity chip in the cat's ear. Litters of kittens and their feral mums are taken home for care and attention.

They foster many, find homes for many and some go to Germany for rehousing through a German sister organisation. They set up feeding stations when appropriate. They get many requests for help including occasionally from the town hall and respond to all requests.

They receive no official funding and thus have a charity shop at Moravit to help defray costs. They are called Pluto Protectora Animales.


Having said that, doctors do recommend that you drink some milk due to its high calcium content, just take note that you don't drink too

height of all children in England is measured when they start reception school and when they leave primary school.

Figures showed for children in reception school about one in 40 (15,000 out of 629,000) was

classed as severely obese.

But by the time they left primary school more than one in 25 children (22,000 out of 556,000) were in this category.

This is the first time the national child measurement programme data has included the 'severely obese' category.

Neck Manipulation and Stroke Risk - Health Warning

SOME stories about people's previous medical care are deeply upsetting. A recent example has prompted me to write this article.

What is a stroke?

A stroke happens when blood supply to part of the brain is restricted. The lack of oxygen can cause brain cells to become damaged.

This damage can have a huge range of effects and there can be a variety of causes.

But there is one particular type of stroke called a VBA (Vertebrobasilar Arterial stroke) which can be caused by a Cervical Arterial Dissection (damage to an artery) that I want to talk about.

Anatomy of the neck

Your Cervical Spine is an amazing construction - through the centre of this small stack of seven bones runs every nerve and, up each side, your vertebral arteries,

part of the blood supply for the brain.

Applying force

This structure is strong! Your spinal discs are tougher than car tyres and it's surrounded by muscle. To move them you need a lot of force.

But when you move the strong bone support structure you affect the soft structures it is protecting, like nerves, lymphatic and blood.

With enough force you can temporarily cut off the blood supply. In laymen's terms cause a stroke.

Signs of stroke from a vertebral artery dissection include:

- Slurred speech
- Sensory loss, weakness or clumsiness of the arm or leg on one side of the body
- Vertigo or difficulty walking
- Trouble swallowing
- Neck pain
- Vomiting

These can occur within hours or sometime a few days later. You MUST go to hospital immediately.

Managing Risk

To be or not to B-12

YOU won't want to feel weak or fatigued as the social demands of the summer increase.

So be sure that you are getting sufficient B-12 into your system.

B-12 is an essential vitamin for the health of your red blood cells and your nervous system, as well as the creation of DNA and cell division.

As it is stomach acid which liberates B-12 from the

food into your body, a common cause of B-12 deficiency is a lack of stomach acid.

Sleepless cyan

RECENT research has shown that the colour cyan - between green and blue - affects our sleep

Biologists based in the University of Manchester say that higher levels of cyan keep people awake, whilst lower levels induce sleep.

It is hoped that the results will mean that computer screens and phones could increase or decrease the levels of cyan in the screen.

Existing 'night mode' set-

tings for phones and laptops are the result of previous research which showed a link between blue light and sleep. However, this research, published in the journal Sleep, shows the particular impact of the colour cyan.

Participants in the research were exposed to more or less cvan in order to measure the different levels of the sleep hormone melatonin.

The researchers suggest that shades of cyan could be used on computer screens to keep people awake, such as those working on night shifts for example.

Or shades and colours which give the same affect, but don't actually have cyan, could be used if the aim was to reduce anything that impedes sleep.

The findings could be particularly useful to help families with teenagers who stay up at night using their mobile phones.

IT was in 2012 that Eli McCarthy and Jason Godwin opened a tiny shop selling locally made chocolate in Mijas Pueblo through the Chocolate Factory.

At first, the pair were not completely aware of the origin of the cacao they were purchasing and made a decision quite early on that they wanted to ensure that their chocolate was environmentally friendly and did not use child labour or exploited workers in any way.

As their output was understandably quite small, they had to purchase from a wholesaler and asked for written confirmation that the raw material they were purchasing was not from one of the countries that took advantage of farmers and workers.

When this wasn't forthcoming they searched for a supplier who could issue a 'green' certificate and now all of their cacao is shipped in from an organic co-operative in the Dominican Republic as well as an environmentally friendly plantation in the Congo.

This means that every piece of chocolate they sell is ethically sourced and they have visited the farms to see the work being undertaken to cultivate the cacao themselves.

As part of their business ethic, the company supports various animal charities in areas most affected by deforestation and they ensure that all of their product is as pure as possible.

This change to traceable and organic material

has cost them more, but they have generally held their retail prices and absorbed the extra costs.

Now an award-winning operation, they have two café/shop outlets in Mijas Pueblo as well as the Chocolate Factory where visitors can see the various chocolate types being made and a fascinating museum where the whole practice of manufacture can be viewed and understood. Both outlets offer a range of chocolates, (milk, plain and white) and amazingly, like wine, chocolate can take on flavours of different environments depending on where it is grown.

Baked items such as gluten free Brownies are available to eat with a range of drinks and because Spain can get so hot, they have also introduced a range of ice cream which is made from fresh ingredients and organic milk.

Anxious to educate and share their knowledge of chocolate, it is possible for youngsters and families to take an express workshop lasting 15 minutes where participants can design, mould and decorate three good size bars for just € 11.70, the same price as buying ready-made bars

I WANT to talk about diets this week. We have been inundated with fake science about cutting saturated fats from our diet and eating more carbohydrates.

The result is that obesity and Type 2 Diabetes are much more prevalent than they have ever been. The link between saturated fat, cholesterol and heart disease is yet more fake science. The theory is that blood vessels are like pipes supplying hot water to radiators. If the water is 'hard' and contains lots of soluble compounds that become insoluble and then coat the inside walls of the

The pressure becomes greater due to the decreased volume of the pipes. which is simple physics. The simile to the human circulatory system ends there. Our arteries do not 'fur up' like water pipes, the fatty deposits are within the walls of the arteries and within the blood vessels of the heart, making them thicker and reducing blood flow. The problem with a carbohydrate rich diet is both starch and sugars create a spike in blood sugar causing the pancreas to make more insulin.

Fake science in your diet



NO WORRIES: A dinner or protein, vegetables, fibre and wine is easy on the hips.

Fats are metabolised more gradually, leading to the urge to eat to occur later. Over the long term this means the consumption of less calories and consequently less weight gain. More fake science concerns the high calorie count of alcoholic drinks leading to weight

It is impossible for ethyl alcohol, which is the intoxicating part of booze alone, to produce body fat, it is the carbs that go with it. The beer, sweet wines and liqueurs will all cause weight gain. A large gin with a slice of lemon and a slimline tonic, will not increase body weight by as much as a

gram! Another fallacy is eating later during the day will cause obesity, and that breakfast is the most important meal of the day. Basura!

A dinner with a mix of protein, vegetables and fibre with a few glasses of dry red and-or dry white wine is the perfect end to a day when eaten about two or three hours prior to bedtime.

The best and most effective diet ever with only five words is Eat Less and Move More!

Following the interval, all of the acts returned but for some real light entertainment, volunteers from the audience were called on stage to learn how to dance the tango correctly.



Secret addition to give a boost to your plants

Promotes health, greenery, flowers and better quality fruit

A HEALTHY, safe and productive garden is the aim of most gardeners.

Well prepared soil, potting mixes, manures and compost can make a big difference to how a garden performs. There are however some extra additions that can make an ordinary garden into a much more lively one.

A not so well kept secret addition to improve the greenery, flower blooming and the uptake of other nutrients, such as nitrogen and phosphorous, that has been around for generations, but is still not widely known except by avid gardeners, is a natural mineral combination that was discovered in Surrey, England centuries ago.

It is a natural product and frequently used by organic gardeners as a remedy for weak growth and under performing vegetables. It is called a salt but is not the sodium chloride of table salt, in fact its main nutrient benefits are neither of these elements.

Epsom salts are well-known as an

addition to the bath for your own health but it can also be applied to plants with great benefits. Epsom salts are more technically known as Magnesium sulphate which indicates the main nutrients are magnesium and sulphur, which are generally in short supply in Mediterranean soil.

The magnesium assists with photosynthesis to improve plant functions. Adding this nutrient to fruit and vegetables is also a benefit to us who eat them as magnesium is something we need for our well-being that is often deficient in many foods.

The sulphur part of Epsom salts is acid by nature but this is beneficial in the alkaline soils of the Mediterranean. Sulphur is also an effective natural fungicide to reduce the problems of the various diseases that fungus can cause. So the combination of elements in Epsom salts improve growth and reduce infirmities

for the plants.

Another good thing about Epsom salts is that you only need about a teaspoon for smaller plants such as annual flowers to a tablespoon for plants such as tomatoes, peppers and a couple of tablespoons for rose bush size plants. It can be just sprinkled about the base of the plants or dissolved in water and sprayed on the foliage at cooler times of the day or watered evenly into the soil

It can be applied at planting time and before crucial moments for the plants such as before flower and fruit forming times. Too much applied is not toxic to plants but as it leaches away it is just wasted. It is better to apply a little often to get the most benefit.

Epsom salts can be used to treat leaf curl on many stone fruit trees and many other poor health issues of trees. If you want your trees to be healthier apply Espom salts around them from the truck out to the drip line of the foliage.

Try it on your favourite trees and you could be surprised by the results.

Good dog grooming



GROOMING is a pleasurable social activity among wild dogs, carried out by mutual

Primates engage in intense bouts of hair care and flea picking and horses love to nibble each other's manes and backs. Grooming is, therefore, an important behavioural interaction between man and dog.

It also establishes us as the dominant one. The dog recognises this dominance when it 'grooms' us by licking our hands and exposed skin, if we allow it.

The Zoom Groom, sold in most pet shops, provides the ultimate massage and grooming experience for your dog. It has rubber 'fingers' that reach through thick or matted hair to the underlying skin and gently pluck out dead hair and dirt.

Start grooming as early as possible. Check and handle the ears, eyes, teeth and nails. All dogs need grooming, some more than others. Generally, the longer the hair, the more frequently the grooming will be

Introduce the brush and comb as a pleasant experience for short, but frequent, periods while the dog is still a puppy.

Even though not a lot of grooming will be required, this will result in a young adolescent dog not regarding the brush and comb as unpleasant and making grooming a struggle for you.

Do not wait until your dog becomes knotted and tangled or its fur is clogged with

dried mud before you think of grooming it. This is the surest way to make your dog hate grooming. Badly knotted fur should only be dealt with by experts. Consult your vet or a grooming specialist.

Some breeds such as Cocker Spaniels, Yorkshire Terriers, Scotties, Schnauzers and Poodles need to have their fur trimmed regularly. Enquire if you are in any doubt.

Bathing regularly is not a good idea as a rule. Even dog shampoo removes natural oils from the coat and dogs do not have pores through which to produce more oil quickly. Over-bathing can cause skin irritations and a dull coat.

Have you noticed that whenever you bath your dog it goes straight out and rolls in the garden and makes itself all dirty again, or when you take it for a walk after rain it finds a muddy puddle and rolls in it? Washing a dog washes away its identity, its smell. This can result in stress. The dog does not feel good or natural. So it rolls in dirt to try to get its identity back.

A similar thing applies when it rolls in dung. By nature, dogs are hunters and instinct tells it that, to get close to a herd to kill for food, it should smell like the herd.

Don't forget that when nails are very long, cutting should be carried out by a vet because it is easy to cut into a vein in the nail, which causes bleeding as well as being painful. A vet will be able to cauterise it at once should this happen. The best way to keep your dog's nails in trim is to take lots of walks on hard surfaces.

If you do buy a special cutter from a vet or pet shop, only cut the very end of the nail. If the dog is nervous, handle its paws daily until it gets used to this, and then cut the claws on one foot a day.

ROAD TEST

SEAT'S Arona compact SUV shares the same chassis and engines as its Ibiza stablemate, but offers more visual cachet and more practicality.

Arona is a little taller, has head-turning styling and with prices starting at €19,118 (£16,750) is attractively priced, with the entry SE version having automatic emergency braking, tyre pressure monitoring, alloy wheels, aircon, cruise control, auto headlights and a touch-screen infotainment unit among its standard features.

There are five other versions with increasing levels of

Costing €24,277 (£21,270), it has a top speed of 204 kph (127 mph), a nippy 0-100 kph time of 8.3 seconds and fuel economy of 19.6 kpl (55.4 mpg). Emissions figure is 115 g/km.

Extra features on this version include upgraded infotainment system with larger screen, built-in sat-nav, DAB

radio, wireless phone charging, Apple CarPlay and Android Auto smartphone mirroring. You also get rear parking sensors, and Drive Profile which enables the driver to adjust the weight of the steering.

The Arona makes a pleasing impression with its looks and top-notch VW-Audi the dashboard is logically laid out for easy

Five adults will fit in at a squeeze though four will be more comfortable, with good head and leg room in the rear.

The 400-litre boot is typical of class standards, and the 60/40 rear seats fold to expand capacity though the re-

lease buttons are

awkward-

sited. While the rear seats don't slide, you can adjust the boot floor height to make loading easier.

Arona has excellent road manners with light precise steering, agile handling with imal cornering pitch, and good ride quality. It's an engaging car to drive and its nimble feel gives it an edge in urban traffic and in tight parking situations.

Spanish-based SEAT is a manufacturer noted for standout styling and new Arona has more than enough charisma and plus-points to make an indelible mark in the increasing crowded

SUV sector.




Horsepower challenge in Barcelona

Thirty years since the launch of the Volvo-440

THE Volvo 440 has just celebrated its 30th birthday after being presented for the first time in June 1988. This was a fivedoor family car that shared its technology with the 480 sports coupé. Volvo now demonstrated in earnest that front-wheel drive was the way forward.

Work on what later became the Volvo 440 began back in 1978. This was a new project that would lead the company to the Volvo cars of the future. Free thinking and aiming for the stars were the name of the game - and so the project was dubbed Galaxy.

In September 1980, the first front-wheel drive prototype was ready. Although its primary aim was to test the various functions, in terms of appearance it resembled what later became the Volvo 440. The G4, as the prototype was called, displayed the attributes that Volvo was looking for. It had front-wheel drive, and it

was fun to drive. Interior spaces were good, while external dimensions remained com-

The Galaxy project later culminated in the launch of two model series. The big 850, which was presented in the summer of 1991, had the greatest impact, but the 400 pro-

gramme actually came about several years previously. That part of the project was taken over by Volvo subsidiaries in the Netherlands in 1992, and this was where development work continued.

The first of Volvo's new frontwheel drive models was the 480 sports coupé, which was officially launched at the Geneva Motor Show in 1986. This distinctive niche product paved the way for the 440, which was presented two years later and ended up battling in earnest for car buyers in the mid-range class.

Production of the Volvo 444 60 was discontinued in November 1996.

Russia make Spain pay the penalty


WORLD CUP hosts Russia pulled off the biggest shock of the tournament so far as they beat 2010 winners Spain on penalties, to reach the quarter finals for the first time in 48

After extra-time ended with the score locked at 1-1, goalkeeper Igor Akinfeev was Russia's penalty hero, denying Koke and then Iago Aspas to spark delirium at Moscow's Luzhniki Stadium.

Coach Stanislav Cherchesov's side, at 70 the lowest ranked team in the competition and 60 places below Spain, now face Croatia in the last eight in Sochi on Saturday.

Their unlikely progress is reward for their resolute defending during the match, and the part played by their ebullient fans.

There were few signs of the Spanish disaster to come when veteran Russian defender

Sergei Ignashevich turned a cross into his own net in the 12th minute

But Spain failed to turn their overwhelming dominance of possession into further chances and paid the price when Gerard Pique's clumsily outstretched arm gave away a penalty shortly before half

Striker Artem Dzyuba stepped up to send David De Gea the wrong way and scenes of wild celebration broke out in the stadium.

The pattern of play did not change after the break, with Spain trying to pass their way through Russia's packed defence, but lacking the inspiration to create anything meaningful before the penalty

Spain simply ran out of ideas, and join Germany and Argentina as other giants to make limp early exits.

CHRIS FROOME'S anti-doping case has been dropped by cycling's world governing body, the UCI.

The British four-time Tour de France winner, 33, was under investigation after more than the allowed level of legal asthma drug salbutamol was found in his urine.

The World Anti-Doping Agency, which worked closely with the UCI, has accepted that there was no breach and recommended the case be dropped.

Froome, who suffers from asthma, said he was "grateful and relieved to put an end to the matter.

"It has been an emotional nine months," he said.

"I meant it when I said that I would never dishonour a winner's jersey and my results would stand the test of time.

"I have never doubted that this case would be dismissed for the simple reason that I have known throughout I did nothing wrong."

Team Sky said Froome was only 19 per cent over the legal limit of salbutamol - not double as had been reported in some circles - and the result has since been adjusted to take account of dehydration.

Team principal Sir Dave Brailsford said he always had



total confidence in Froome's integrity and that he was looking forward to helping him challenge for a fifth Tour de France.

Molinari storms to first Verstappen PGA tour win snatches


FRANCISCO MOLINARI shot a stunning final-round 62 to win his first PGA Tour title by eight shots (-21) at the Quicken Loans National in Maryland.

The 35 year-old began the final round level with Mexico's Abraham Ancer on 13 under-par, but carded six birdies and an eagle to win from American Ryan Armour.

He is the first Italian to win on US soil since Toney Penna in 1954, while Tiger Woods claimed his second-best result of the season, tied in fourth on 11 under.

Woods, a 14-time major winner ended with a fourunder final round of 66 and has only finished higher once since August 2013.

But Molinari ensured those chasing him were of

little threat as after making two birdies on the front nine, he made a 50ft eagle putt on the 10th hole and followed it with four consecutive birdies.

The two-time European Ryder Cup team member moved from 123rd to 42nd in the Fed Ex Cup standings, justifying his decision to play in the tournament rather than take part in the European Tour's French Open.

"It wasn't an easy decision," said Molinari. "I thought until the last minute whether to go to France or to come here but it seems like it was the right choice in the end."

Verstapper snatches win as Hamilton retires

LEWIS HAMILTON lost the world championship lead after retiring from a depressing Austrian Grand Prix for Mercedes, as Max Verstappen clinched an unexpected victory for Red Bull.

Hamilton retired due to a loss of fuel pressure with eight laps to go following a Mercedes strategy blunder and tyre problems.

Title rival Sebastian Vettel finished third in his Ferrari behind teammate Kimi Raikkonen, putting Vettel into a one-point lead heading into this weekend's British Grand Prix.

Mercedes will head to Silverstone with plenty to think about as they ponder how what had looked set to be an easy one-two finish in a race they had dominated, fell apart.

Their problems handed a first win on their home track to Red Bull, for whom Verstappen drove flawlessly to close out the win.

Hamilton's teammate Valterri Bottas had started in pole position, but a poor start saw him slip back into fourth.

However, a wonderful overtaking manoeuvre around the outside of Verstappen and Raikkonen saw him move up to second place, only to retire on lap 14 with a loss of hydraulic pressure.

The British Grand Prix is the third race of F1's first 'triple-header' and with the track's high-speed nature and sweeping corners, Mercedes are expected to get back to winning ways.

England march on

ENGLAND won a World Cup penalty shootout for the first time on a night of high drama in Moscow, edging past Colombia to secure a quarterfinal meeting with Sweden on Saturday.

Amid a feverish atmosphere inside Spartak Stadium, Eric Dier scored the winning penalty after Jordan Pickford's brilliant save from Carlos Bacca.

Manager Gareth Southgate celebrated with his staff while his players mobbed the heroes Pickford and Dier, after their first win at the knockout stage of a major tournament since 2006.

Southgate's side looked to have emerged unscathed from an ill-disciplined match courtesy of Harry Kane's penalty, only for Colombia's Yerry Mina to equalise in the closing seconds of stoppage time.

The extra 30 minutes could not separate the sides and led to a nerve shredding penalty showdown that has so often been England's undoing.

No previous world champions stand between England and the final, and should they get past Sweden, they will face either Croatia or hosts Russia for

a place in the Moscow showpiece on July 15.

FIFA's rankings suggest England goes into the quarterfinal against Sweden as favourites - they are 12th while Sweden are 24th - but former manager Sven-Goran Eriksson believes it will be an "extremely difficult" assignment due to Sweden's collective work ethic.

For his part, Gareth Southgate said:

"I'm proud of the way my team played. I thought we controlled the game in the 90 minutes, played with great discipline, we were very composed with the ball and in a big game that was very impressive from a young group of players."
