A SPANISH teenager who went missing last year ago has been rescued from a satanic sect in the Amazon rainforest.

Patricia Aguilar, 19, vanished from her home in Alicante on the Costa Blanca 18 months ago, but she has now been found in central Peru.

Investigators have also held Peruvian Felix Steven Manrique Gomez, 35, a former trainee electrician suspected of heading the Gnosis cult which kept three women as sexual slaves.

According to the victim's relatives, she was lured to the South American country by Gomez through social media.

They say he targets emotionally unstable girls promising to save them from the end of the world, urging them to leave their families as soon as they turned 18.

Referring to himself as 'Prince Gurdjeff,' he reportedly considers himself to be a messenger from God sent to Earth ahead of the planet's imminent destruction, which he announced in a series of online clips posted under false names.

He used a text-reading soft-

### Gender crime silence held

COUNCILLORS in Benidorm have held a minute's silence to pay tribute to the latest victims to die in gender violence-related cases since last Friday in Spain. The deaths, which took place in Madrid, Asturia and Lepe, brings the total number of women killed as a result of gender violence to 21 this year.

### Road deaths


A 40-YEAR-OLD man has died and his eight-year-old son was injured after being hit while on their bicycles on the road running from Villena to Biar. ### 'Theft' probe

TWO 25-year-olds have been arrested en route from Valencia to Palma in Mallorca in connection with alleged robberies across Alicante Province, including in Campello. Proceedings for the case have been sent to local courts, with the pair suspected of robbing an ice cream shop and bar in the town.

### Strike vote

OFFCIALS from a textile workers' trade union have unanimously backed a strike at a plant in Ontinyent claiming the owners failed to uphold a wage agreement. The walkout, due to go ahead next Thursday July 19, comes as union bosses recently reached an agreement with emplovers to set an annual minimum wage of  $\leq 14,000$ .

Emergency services including paramedics, firefighters and Guardia Civil officers were called out to the Baños de la Reina after the fall.

It is believed the boy was with friends when he leaped from the cliff and fell some five metres before hitting his head on rocks

Emergency services were alerted shortly after the fall which took place at around 6.30pm last Sunday.

Officers and other emergency personnel gave the 14-year-old first aid treatment while waiting for an ambulance.

He was later taken to hospital with medics stating they suspect he has suffered injuries to his neck and possibly to his spine. The fall comes as local authorities on the Costa Blanca have warned against diving near rocks.



# Nazi sub found

THREE Spanish divers have found the wreckage of a German Second World War U-boat off the coast of northern Spain.

The crew blew the U996 vessel up using timed charges after it was badly damaged by Allied bombers in November 1943.

Eight of the 52 men on board died trying to reach the shore near Estaco de Bares, a peninsula in La Coruña Province, Galicia.

The desperate move came after US Navv and RAF Liberator bombers targeted the submarine for an entire day, with one plane, believed to be an RAF Caralina flying boat, shot down by its anti-aircraft gun.

One RAF Wellington bomber also joined the battle and dropped depth charges before the crew scuttled their ship.

Naval historian Yago Abilleira, who was part of the team which unearthed the wreck after years of searching, said U-966 was abandoned "in desperation, as Allied planes were attacking them on all sides and they

knew time was running out."

Its remains were found scattered over a wide rocky area at a depth of 24-26 metres, and the men are now aiming to find the Allied plane which they think lies close to the submarine.

The precise location will not be revealed since it constitutes a war grave.

Three local fishing boats reportedly saved some of the German crew after they were found clinging to offshore rocks.

The U-boat, nicknamed Gut Holz (Good Wood), was returning from a mission in North America when it came under attack on November 10, 1943 having been launched just 10

Commander Eckehard Wolf flew to Germany a year later under a false name, according to German website *Ubootarchive.de*.

Spain's fascist leader at the time, the dictator Francisco Franco, is also thought to have helped other members of the crew return home

# Fight for life

# Ex-BBC host punched in bar

By Matt Ford

THE family of an ex-BBC host have released a heartbreaking photo of their dad fighting for his life in hospital as they appeal for help tracing his attacker.

Comic Jimmy Carol, 63, is hooked up to a ventilator in the picture, and his son James Everall said he is on life support after being punched when trying to defend a group of women being harassed by drunks in Benidorm.

The performer from Burscough in Lancashire has a fractured skull and bleeding on the brain.

He said: "Today I arrived in Alicante and went straight to my dad's bedside in the

"Unfortunately after Friday's positive report there is no further similar update.

"My dad was not responsive to me today and quite honestly it was difficult to be with him.

"He is on life support and the machine is doing his breathing.

"He has a third CT scan on Monday to see if the bleeding and haemorrhaging reduce but due to his multiple skull fractures the medical team are unable to per-

form surgery yet."

James, from Chapel-en-le-Frith, Derbyshire, also confirmed a £20,000 cash reward is on offer for information leading to the attacker being



James earlier said the at-

tacker, who hit his dad so hard he was unconscious when he hit the floor, was six feet tall and wearing a red England shirt.

He added: "Please pray for my brother and I who are obviously shaken and disturbed by all of this.

"And please pray for the person who did this. Pray that they realise the gravity of their drunken actions and that they have the courage to turn themselves in."



# First Choice sued

THE family of a schoolgirl who nearly drowned when her hair got tangled inside a hotel swimming pool filter is suing travel operator First Choice

Darcey Morgan, who is now seven, turned blue after she became trapped underwater for two minutes while on holiday in Spain with family in April 2017.

The girl was taken to hospital from the H10 Rubicon Palace in Lanzarote, and the traumatic incident has apparently left her with psychological problems.

Mum Alex Morgan explained that seeing her daughter in such a state had been a 'nightmare,' made worse by a perceived lack of action by the hotel and tour company.

Mrs Morgan said: "The whole incident was an absolute nightmare and we truly thought at one point that we were going to lose our little girl.

"A huge amount of hair was ripped from Darcey's head, yet following what happened we never saw the hotel close the pool, turn off the

feature or examine the filter at all.

"We have been hugely frustrated by the response of both the hotel and the tour operator in relation to what happened, and just want to get some reassurances that lessons will

"No parent should face what Gareth and I went through and we hope this action will not only raise awareness of issues relating to hotel swimming pools, but also lead to clear safety improvements.

"This simply cannot be allowed to happen again."

Mrs Morgan had reportedly been told by other holidaymakers that they had reported the problematic filter to staff.

Two days prior to Darcey's ordeal, a boy had got his swimming trunks sucked into the device and ripped apart.

Philip Banks of Irwin Mitchell solicitors commented: "This is a truly shocking case and, while Darcey survived, the incident has had a lasting impact on her and she will likely need access to specialist support in order to put what happened behind her.'

A spokesman for First Choice said at the time that it had taken 'immediate action' to resolve the issue, and had been in contact with Mrs Morgan to 'update and reassure them on the steps we have taken.

THE Spanish Defence Ministry has announced it plans to change its entry rules after a woman was told she could not join due to her tattoo.

Estela Martin argued she was being discriminated against after being told a tattoo of a lotus on her foot broke army uniform regulations. The armed forces have yet to confirm if she can be allowed to reapply, she said.

Current rules require tattoos, piercings and other body modifications be covered up by men and women while in uniform.

Martin was told hers would be visible if she wore a skirt, optional for

women in the army who typically wear trousers. Military officials since

announced rules will be changed so that tattoos, rings and other body modifications will not be allowed to be shown in uniforms common to men and women. The wording excludes skirts in order to resolve the issue Martin had

Martin said she was happy for other women that the rules were set to change but added the military had not contacted her to offer her a chance to

"When I saw this new measure, at first I felt happy to know that it will not happen to other women. But then I wondered ... what about me?" she said.

"If they change the rules they are acknowledging they were unfair to me but I have not had an answer from them," she added.

Martin applied to join the Spanish Army as a psychologist this year after leaving her job at a hospital in Madrid two years ago. She sat her civil service exam last month.

Martin was taking part in a swimming test when an examiner noticed the tattoo and told her she could not continue with the entry process. It may have been seen if she wore a skirt, he added.

She claimed men who bore tattoos in similar places to hers were not pulled out of the session.

### PM safe this week?

JUST when it seemed that the British government had reached a modicum of agreement over the Brexit plans, first David Davis and then Boris Johnson decided to resign from the cabinet.

There were rumours that the influential 1922 committee of Conservative backbenchers were considering calling for a vote of no confidence in Prime Minister May but those opposing her did not find 48 MPs prepared to sign such a declara-

At the end of the day it appears that the Tories are more interested in trying to influence the final Brexit deal from within rather than deciding to tear the minority government apart when there is still so much to do before March 2019.

Two voices which had been strident in calling for Brexit, Liam Fox and Michael Gove have kept relatively low profiles during the last week with Gove actually saying that he is 100 per cent behind Mrs May's Brexit plan (if he was talking about a football manager, you would know that they were about to be sacked).

Tellingly, the four arguably most important positions in government, Prime Minister, Chancellor, Foreign Secretary and Home Secretary are now all held by MPs who voted to Remain so to some extent it would appear that a softer exit is

Having said that, both Davis and Johnson are now likely to be more voluble about their opposition to the plans and Jacob Rees Mogg has made it clear that not only is he opposed to the plan, but thinks Boris Johnson would make an excellent Prime Minister.

# Tourism backlash goes on

# Bus packed with holidaymakers targeted

A TOURISTIC bus came under attack on Monday, by two members of Arran, the youth movement of the radical CUP party.

The Marxist pro-Cataluña independence group was protesting overcrowding of holiday hotspots.

The activists boarded the open top bus, as it stopped outside the Olympic village, lighting green and white flares and displaying a huge sign saying: 'Stop mass tourism in the Catalan countries.

Arran posted a picture of the demonstration on its Facebook page. The groups also warned of further protests and threatened to take their protest to other parts of Spain to show their discontent at systematic overcrowding of holiday hotspots.

Arran claims it is not against tourism but rather the 'massification' of tourism which they claim is ruining local people's lives.

Adding the uncontrolled large scale tourism ruins residential areas, prices locals out of holiday destinations and long term rental properties at the same time ruining beaches and landscapes.

The action in Barcelona was followed hours later by a further two members of the organisation storming a touristic bus in Valencia and displaying the same message.

Other Arran stunts include attacking a sightseeing bus filled with British holidaymakers last summer in Barcelona, near the Nou Camp and causing havoc in Palma's high end marina last August.

Two weeks ago, in a less publicised stunt Arran activists had to be cut free after chaining themselves to a famous Gaudi sculpture in Barcelona.

Sources from Barcelona's metropolitan services (TMB) tried to down play the incident claiming no damage was caused to property, or any delays to the bus service schedule. Adding the protesters left soon after displaying their sign.

Gerardo Pisarello, first deputy of the mayor of the Barcelona City Hall, played down the incident calling it a 'symbolic



# € 220 million traffic boost

TERRITORIAL Urban planners have requested building work from the Development board in eight Costa Blanca municipalities including Altea, Ondara, Pedreguer, Alfaz del Pi, Javea and La Nucia.

The territorial councillor for development, Maria Jose Salvador presented the Spanish Ministry of Development a plan issued to improve the accessibility of eight municipalities to the AP-7 motor-

The plan would be implemented once the motorway that connects Alicante and Cataluña becomes toll free by December 31, 2019, according to promises made by new development minister Jose Luis Albalos.

The forecasted costs reach €220 million at the moment but according to claims by the Director General of Transport, Carlos Domingo, the outlay could drop significantly by the final budget, basing this on previous projects like the Altea ring road that plummeted from an original budget of €80 million to €30 million

In the province of Alicante they want improvements to the N-332 motorway between Gata de Gorgos and Pedreger improving safety while at the same time increasing overall

Altea and Oliva motorists face serious problems with congestion, pollution and safety especially in the sum-

According to Ms Salvador, the study carried out concentrated on analysing the mobility around the AP-7 motorway that runs through Valencia, having paid special attention to the coastal corri-

These problems are particularly serious on the N-332 stretch which passes through urban centres whereas in other areas the CV-10 motorway allow these problems to be mitigated to a certain extent.

In general there are two fronts for proposed improvement on the current road system. One approach lies in creating new links between the AP-7 with the N-332 and N-340, therefore improving connections allowing traffic to flow from higher to lower density congestion areas.

The second aim is to improve capacity and safety on existing road systems that connect the soon to be public AP-7 toll roads to urban centres or other existing roads with unacceptable congestion

"Sovereignty falls on all inhabitants but recognising the diversity of the regions. Selfdetermination does not exist because Cataluña was part of the great pact that is the Spanish Constitution," she said.



# Claims firms fly off with cash

PERSONAL claims firms are preying on holidaymakers at airport arrival gates in a bid to whip up a compensation storm for flight de-

Those who fall for their schemes could lose hundreds of pounds despite being able to claim what they are owed for free.

Passengers are entitled to statutory compensation of up to €600 if their plane lands more than three hours late.

They can easily make the claim themselves for free via the airline, but claims firms have spotted a sly opportunity to do the chasing on their behalf.

The agents catch weary passengers on their way through arrivals halls - urging them to fill out forms on the spot - which they then take to the airlines.

However, many claims firms help themselves to a big chunk of the final payout (in the smallprint), sometimes over 40 per cent.

The scourge has been on the rise in the past 18 months as agents hunt for alternatives to payment protection insurance (PPI) claims, which are being clamped down on.

The problem is aggravated by the failure of many airlines to inform passengers of their entitlement to apply for compensation directly.

Passengers whose flights are cancelled should be booked on other flights and compensated for the resulting delay in their arrival, or given a full refund.

# Pool dive paralysis

Brit father loses use of legs after pool accident

A BRITISH father is facing major surgery and can no longer use his legs after he hit his head on the bottom of a pool while holidaying in Mallorca.

Keith Dungait, 42, was said to be critically ill in hospital following the head-first dive into a pool at a hotel in the resort of Cala d'Or on the island.

The father of two was on holiday with wife Christina and friends when the accident took place. They have since launched a fundraising drive which aims to get him treatment so he can walk again.

Friends said on the appeal's Just Giving page that Dungait had dived into the pool and hit his head on the bottom.

"A moment that took just seconds has left Keith in a critical condition with five fractures in his back and

without the use of his legs," they said.

"Keith's family know there is a long road ahead, and we hope that the funds we raise through this appeal will help make that rehabilitation possible and get Keith back on his feet," they added.

Shelly Kitching, a Facebook friend of Dungait's, said the 42-year-old had insurance but that he could remain in hospital for "a while" longer.

"We are raising money to help bring him back to Britain and for his family. Wishing our crazy fun-loving friend Keith a speedy recovery!" she wrote in a post.

More than €43,600 of the roughly € 56,480 has so far been raised on the page.

# Blaze traps hikers

A RAGING fire took hold on the slope of the Montgó mountain between Denia and Javea on Sunday, with many fearing that winds would beat those battling so hard to extinguish it.

The fire started near the Camí de la Colònia on the Denia side of the mountain and was initially spotted by the castle's watchman around

Quickly aerial support began bombarding the mountain with water, as ground crews navigated a group of three hikers to safety as their exit

had been blocked by the flames.

Despite nine aerial support teams constantly bombing the area with water, the fire continued to spread over the mountain towards Javea, with visibility being a key problem for the pilots.

The continued efforts by the fire services both in the air and on the ground resulted in the fire being stabilised just after 6pm and classified as controlled at 7.45pm.

Residents were asked to keep away from the area with the Denia Civil Protection taking to social media and requesting that certain roads were kept clear for emergency vehicles.

As work continued through the night to ensure that the fire was out, on Monday morning further aircraft were despatched to the area to ensure that no further outbreaks had occurred

Whilst an estimated six hectares of land was dam-



# A never-ending court case

ALEJANDRO PONSODA, mayor of Polop, was shot by hired killers in October 2007 and died several days later in hospital.

His murder was allegedly plotted in Club Messalina, a Finestrat brothel, and the principal instigators were named as fellow Partido Popular politician Juan Cano, who succeeded

Ponsoda as mayor, together with local businessman Salvador Ros. Between the plotters and the two Czechs and a Spaniard who carried out the shooting, a total of seven men were finally due to stand trial almost 11 years after Ponsoda

The case has been shelved and reopened several times but

on May 3 when the trial was due to start, the Alicante High Court returned the case to the examining judge in Villajoyosa.

The tribunal assigned to hear the case detected a procedural irregularity, according to Spanish media sources, and this must be corrected to prevent later objections from the seven men's defence lawyers.



# Homophobic neighbour

A DENIA resident has been arrested following allegations from his neighbours of hate crimes.

# months in prison.

As a result the Javea Council has issued a denuncia to the villa owners, with the Ministry of Environment asked to take action. The penalty for such events can be as much as  $\leq$  18,000.

# Delays with NIE

ESTATE AGENTS in the Marina Alta area of the region have complained that a delay in processing applications for NIEs is having an effect on their businesses.

The national identity document is an essential requirement for non-nationals to carry out any property purchase. Currently the

National Police station in Denia is the processing office, but appointments can be as much as two months in advance, even using the digital service.

Authorities say that they have recognised that this is a problem and are working hard on ways to resolve the delays.

# Caught in the act

NATIONAL POLICE officers in Benidorm have arrested a man who was spotted offering drugs near to where they were standing.

The arrest, which in part could be attributed to the higher than normal number of officers in the resort for the World Cup, resulted in a total of 102 doses of cocaine being taken off the streets.

Officers patrolling the area noticed that the man was offering something to a tourist whilst acting in a suspicious manner. Approaching the defendant they then conducted a frisk search and found that he had four individual packets of the drug hidden in his clothing. A more detailed inspection of his belt found a further 19 doses of cocaine hidden in

Armed with a warrant the officers proceeded to the man's home where a further 79 packets, already prepared for sale, were confiscated.

The man has been charged with drug trafficking.





# In loving memory of Pompeia Maxima

EXCAVATIONS during the installation of underground rubbish containers in Denia unearthed details of two early

As so often happens when digging in the town centre, workmen soon saw that the 20-square-metre site contained archaeological remains and immediately advised the municipal architect.

A subsequent investigation, led by Josep Marques, unearthed a late second century AD Roman funerary inscription and vestiges of an Arab funduq, or guesthouse, from the 11th century.

'To Pompeia Maxima, who lived 36 years. Nonius Victor to his esteemed wife' reads the inscription which would have marked the tomb of this woman who died nearly 2.000 vears ago.

The finds were unearthed at the junction of Calle La Mar and Calle Foramur, a meeting

of centuries old roads that sheds more light on urban expansion east of the promontory where the castle now

"This was clearly a residential zone with homes and a cemetery in Roman times, as central Dianium was situated on the other side of the castle

in Hort de Morand where the Forum and port were located," the director of Denia's Archaeological Museum, Josep A Gisbert, explained.

"The funduq at the same spot also provides further clues to Denia's layout as a town in the 11th century," he

# Girl footballers cry foul

Less than half would have been Calpe girls, and many would not have been able to spend time travelling to other autonomous regions.

### No tickets to ride

IT is nearly two years since the Calpe-Denia stretch of Line 9 track closed for modernisation.

This section is covered by a coach service but a recent spotcheck one morning showed that only five of 49 passengers had paid their fares.

A check the previous day produced similar results as the 27 passengers had only three tickets between them.

The ongoing situation was revealed to the local Spanish media by a habitual user who explained that passengers want to pay but cannot acquire tickets.

A local woman, whose two daughters use the service, explained that they pay when boarding the bus but this is impossible on their return journey.

Tickets are available at the railway stations in Calpe and Denia where the service starts and finishes, but not at intermediate stops in Benissa and Gata.

The coach stops at the roadside, not the stations, and the driver, subcontracted by the region's rail service FGV, does not collect fares. There are no ticket machines and passengers can buy a ticket only when an inspector boards the bus. This, they say, rarely happens.

FGV employees blamed the situation on staff shortages while the rail operator maintained that inspectors were assigned in the same proportion to all lines, including Line 9. It was also possible to buy a return ticket at any station, a spokesman said.



# Harsh lesson from Education department

TEULADA-MORAIRA'S town hall issued a communique lamenting that the Generalitat was again sidelining the town.

The regional government's Education department has eliminated the local Official Language School (EOI) centre which for years taught official English courses.

Worse still, this was done without a formal notification, said Teulada-Moraira's Education councillor Daniel Ibanco.

After hearing rumours that the EOI centre was to close, he tried to contact the regional government and the General Directorate of Linguistic Policies without being able to speak

directly to the Head of Service or receiving any kind of reply.

It was true that there were fewer pupils at the Teulada-Moraira OEI than there were at others owing to the size of the local population but many students from neighbouring towns attended the centre thanks to its closeness, the councillor pointed out.

The Generalit had overlooked the fact that some would now have to travel much further to attend an official OEI course Ibanco said

The town hall also drew attention to the way that principal members of the regional Education department ignored invitations to meetings on Education-related issues in Teulada-Moraira.

Official snubs and neglect from the Education department had been patent for years, Ibanco claimed, and the town hall wished to express its dissatisfaction after ignored requests for vocational courses in cooking at the local high school.

The town hall was no happier at the regional government's failure to take action over repairs to the high school's pavilion roof, which the municipality had paid for in order to hurry along procedures, Ibanco added.




would have needed 'many kilos' of explosives, could be seen kilometres away and appeared to be the creation of a professional pyrotechnician, locals said.



# The competence of special courts dealing with mortgage floor clauses has been extended until the end of 2018

DEAR Readers.

In today's article, we have to inform you that the General Council of the Spanish Judiciary (CGPJ) announced on June 27, 2018, that it has decided to extend for another six months, (that is, until December 31, 2018), the emergency plan, which was approved more than a year ago, in relation to claims before the courts, presented by consumers relating, among others, to mortgage floor or suelo clauses.

Therefore, unfortunately, it is still necessary, in order to claim for the return of overcharged interest by the bank, (due to a floor clause), to go to the special court that was designated for each province.





Thus, for example, in the Valencian Community, the special courts are:

For the entire province of Alicante, the court of first instance No. 5-bis.

For the entire province of Valencia, the court of first instance No. 25-bis.

For the entire province of Castellon, the court of first instance No. 6-bis.

As we have said in previous articles, the intention of this plan is that the thousands and thousands of claims foreseen for these is-

sues do not overburden the normal courts (for example courts in Denia, Benidorm, etc), but the problem is that these special courts, (there is only one per province), are completely overwhelmed and the resolution of these issues is and will be extremely slow.



# Javid: sanctions not on the table

BRITAIN'S Home Secretary has said Whitehall has "no current plans" to slap more sanctions on Russia in the wake of two people being poisoned in Amesbury. Sajid Javid's comments come as Dawn Sturgess died in hospital and as Charlie Rowley was in critical condition after the couple were exposed to the Novichok nerve agent. Russia denied any involvement.

### Sanctions broadened

THE European Union has extended sanctions passed after Russia annexed the Crimean peninsula in 2014. The bloc has prolonged measures restricting economic activity benefiting defence, financial and energy sectors until 2019 and extended a ban on EU companies investing in Crimea.

# Veterans' Syria call

FORMER soldiers have said the government in Moscow should come clean about deploying private contractors to fight in Syria. Several ex-senior officers jointly signed a letter claiming Rus-

sia had not provided social, medical or financial support to them, with the Kremlin denying the existence of the operation.

# Retirement changes

■ AROUND 90 per cent of Russians said they opposed government plans to raise the country's retirement age, according to a survey. The Levada poll follows proposals made by Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedey to raise the age to above the life expectancy of some people in the country. Those against claim the Kremlin is using the World Cup as cover for the plans.

# **Stereotypes 'broken'**

■ PRESIDENT Vladimir Putin has said Russia's hosting of the World Cup has dispelled stereotypes about the country. Putin added: "People have seen Russia is a hospitable country, a friendly one for those who visit." His comments follow the country's football team losing to Croatia in the tournament's quarter final.

# 'Baccy sales are on a roll

# TSB blunder sparks squabble

AN IT meltdown which left hundreds of thousands of TSB customers unable to access their personal accounts has reportedly left owner Sabadell considering whether to offload the UK-based bank.

The row erupted over the role of Sabadell's in-house IT provider Sabis in the slip-up, leading TSB chief executive Peter Pester vowing to "insource" in a letter to

He added that Sabadell's "written attestations" over its new IT platform were "instrumental" in his

company's decision to migrate customer data.

TSB chairman Richard Meddings recently told the Treasury Select Committee that only 29 per cent of complaints received in nine weeks since the botched upgrade took place had been resolved.

And an unnamed senior figure added that TSB has paid €2.25 million to customers for the inconvenience and a further €13.5 million to those defrauded in the wake of the blunder.

Sabadell paid around € 1.6 billion to acquire TSB in 2015 in what was seen as a key move for the group to reduce reliance on the Spanish mar-

TSB said in a statement: "Our absolute focus is on fixing the remaining issues, and we are working together with Sabadell to achieve this. We have made a firm commitment that no customer will be left out of pocket as a result of the recent IT issues and no complaint will go unanswered. We are working hard to do this as quickly as possible."

# EIB to fork out €100m in deal

THE European Investment Bank (EIB) has inked a € 100 million deal with Spanish car interior firm Antolin Group.

Part of the European Fund for Strategic Investments, the cash will be used to develop new lightweight components for the next generation of energy-efficient, connected and autonomous vehicles.

EIB Vice-President Emma Navarro said: "As the EU bank, we are pleased to support a project fostering innovation investment in a key sector for the European economy, while also promoting highly skilled employment."

SPANISH diners are up in arms over the soaring price of octopus.

The delicacy has become increasingly expensive recently and is currently selling wholesale for up to €10.25, a 26 per cent jump from last year and 45 per cent more than in 2016, according to industry data.

In the north of Spain, depleted stocks and re-

duced quotas have seen demand outstrip supply, whereas in Mediterranean provinces catches have remained similar while the market has grown.

And the predicament has reportedly seen suppliers and restaurateurs turn to foreign octopus to make up the deficit, with much of the tentacle treat served in eateries now sourced from Morocco, Mauritania and Portugal.







# Did you buy a property off-plan? Did you not recover the money paid?

The Supreme Court states Banco Popular (Banco Pastor), SGRCV and BBVA are to return the money paid for off-plan properties, for not issuing compulsory individual bank quarantees.

Buyers who received a Bank Guarantee / Insurance Policy to cover payments made towards their property (or even those who never had this because the developer or bank failed to comply with the Law) could benefit from a Supreme Court of Spain Judgement, which has ordered these entities return all the money invested, plus interest, from the time payments were made, to the buyers of off-plan properties.

### The Supreme Court has made clear that:

if other buyers in the same resort received individual bank guarantees, then all buyers should have received them. Not having an individual bank guarantee would not stop them from claiming the money from the bank.

if the amount covered by the bank guarantee is lower than the money actually paid to the developer, the bank should pay back the full paid amount plus interest.

if there is not an individual bank guarantee, but there is a general bank guarantee, this should cover all buyers as though they were issued an

individual bank guarantee.

there is no need to sue the developer, before suing the bank.

If you bought a property off-plan, paid a deposit or even made stage payments, whether you received the compulsory individual bank guarantee or not, you might be interested to learn more about your rights.

This is only general information. It is recommended that all legal matters pertaining to specific cases are referred to a lawyer for advice, guidance and execution.

# Recall for certain blood pressure drugs

A PRESCRIPTION drug recall is underway across Europe following emerging concerns about drugs produced in China.

Impurities have been found in the manufacturing process of the active substance valsartan.

The facility where the issue was identified supplies this active substance to other drug manufacturers

The impurity (N-nitrosodimethylamine), which may have carcinogenic potential, was the result of a change in the facility's manufacturing process.

This active substance is used in a number of medicines marketed in Europe to treat high blood pressure and heart conditions. The European Medicines Agency and other EU regulators are working together to investigate the extent of the issue and any impact for patients.

Dr Sam Atkinson, MHRA's Director of the Inspection, Enforcement and Standards Division said: "People taking valsartan medication affected by this recall are advised to not stop taking their medication, but to speak to their doctor for



# Healthy outdoor lifestyle

ANYONE living in Spain will probably be among the first to agree with the following statement ... 'spending time outside is good for you.'

This has also been backed up by a major study undertaken from almost 300 million people who were analysed as part of a review into the supposed benefits of nature.

The researchers found that an outside lifestyle can dramatically cut the risk of type 2 diabetes, heart disease, stress and high blood pressure.

Miss Twohig-Bennett added: "We hope that this research will inspire people to get outside more and feel the health benefits for themselves. Hopefully our results will encourage policymakers and town planners to invest in the creation, regeneration, and maintenance of parks and green spaces."

# Palm honey is worth a gold medal

SINCE my last missive, we've sung, dressed up, danced traditional dances, eaten and drank too much, and generally enjoyed Canaries Day, as we do every May 30.

It's a celebration of all things Canarian, marking the Canary Island parliament's first session, which was on May 30, 1983, since which time the islands have constituted one of Spain's autonomous regions.

The then Provisional Parliament had to choose a date for Dia de Canarias which: 'Has a historical, but at the same time contemporary, significance, with a future focus (!).' This, understandably, created lots of argument and near fracas for the fledgling parliament. Commemorating the date of the first Canarian Parliament then saved the day. Politicians like a bit of immortality.

Dia de Canarias has become an institution, featuring national dress that's rocketed in popularity over the last 35 years, with each island boasting its own. There are romerias, fiestas, sporting events, concerts, school parties as well as performances of Canarian legends and history.

To mark the date, worthy Canarians are award-

ed the Canarian Gold Medal. The list of winners is long and dignified, but let's skip to the 'Los Guaraperos de La Gomera, for keeping alive a 500-year-old tradition' award.

These guaraperos (palm sap tappers) climb tall, swaying palms to work with sharp tools at the top. It's risky. The award, sadly, comes too late for father-of-three Jesus, a leading guarapero who was found dead under a palm tree in March.

"On the islands, the indigenous population made honey from palm trees. This liquid looks like cloudy lemon water and has a very agreeable flavour. When concentrated by boiling, it produces a syrup known as miel de palma (palm honey) used in the confection of desserts and sweets," said A J Benitez in Historia de las Islas

When the Spanish arrived in the 15th century, the native populations of all seven islands were tapping guarapo and drinking it, or boiling it down to make palm honey, and had done so for millennia. Since then, the practice has disappeared everywhere but La Gomera.

The guarapero climbs to the top to clean off greenery and expose the crown. He uses a chisel to gradually form a hollow there, inserting a hori-

zontal length of cane to drain the guarapo off into a bucket suspended below. Early next morning, it's collected and filtered. Once a palm's been tapped, the delicate, exposed area needs protecting from sunlight. New fronds quickly sprout. The palm mustn't be tapped again for three or four years. The guarapero's work is sustainable. Palms aren't harmed.

Today, guarapo is poured into stainless steel cauldrons, slowly cooked for several hours and gradually becomes thicker, darker and sweeter. When a thin, continuous string of boiled guarapo falls from a spoon, it's miel de palma and is left to cool before bottling for sale. Try some if you can get it. It's delicious! Congratulations to all Canarian Gold Medal winners, especially Los Guaraperos de La Gomera. Rest in peace Jesus.

My too-geeky answer about needing a Lightning connector is lost on pretty much anyone without an Apple computer which has one. But should the everyday Joe and Jose be using that fabled cloud?

Just to be clear, St Peter hasn't suddenly been surrounded by bits and bytes because 'The Cloud' began seeping into our tech awareness over the past 18 years or so. That's despite any number of wacko data storage ideas which have even included internet access from balloons.

'Cloud' is a misnomer. Saving your precious family snaps to the cloud actually sends them somewhere far less romantic: a gigantic sprawling data-centre near Dublin, most likely, or Microsoft's server farms in Seattle, or winging off to the monstrous Googleplex in California.

Cloud storage has become possible thanks to our growing high-speed data access from our Internet Service Providers. Sceptics quite rightly see 'The World As We Know It' coming

to an end, come the day we suddenly can't just click and download - better then, they say, to keep all our own data on our own storage, whether that's hard-drives, flash sticks, increasingly-obsolescent data DVDs and CDs, or clay tablets.

But there are compelling reasons

for using the cloud. Let me name the

\* Backup: the computing 'rule of threes' says you should always have at least three copies of any important data, one of them 'off-site'. If your computer breaks, or goes walkabout, your data will still be safe up there in the cloud when you're ready to reinstall it. And cloud services can automatically back-up everything you do.

\* Synchronisation: most cloud services will synchronise between any devices registered to your account. Draft the day's documents in your office, then access them to continue at home without faffing around with flash drives.

\* Sharing: if you're embarrassed sending out scads of pictures of your utterly unique pussycat to your entire address book, just put the photos in the cloud instead and let friends and family choose whether to subject themselves to your moggy or not.

\* Collaboration: there's a whole free office suite in the cloud for the asking, and several people can work on the same document, which will always be up to date.

Nay-sayers grumble that cloud services can be hacked. Well, so can your own computer. If your stuff really is that sensitive, just keep it on a flash drive in your underground bunker with your stash of corned beef and gas masks.

## Cloud: 'Nein'?

CLOUD computing is a cirrus business these days (sorry).

Mostly, it's free to try. Microsoft provides One-**Drive free with Windows** 10, for 5 GB of data. Dropbox gives you 2 GB free, while Google Drive ups the ante with a generous 15 GB to start you off.

These and others hope to hook you (but mainly corporate users) into buying more storage. But free is fine for most of us.

With a reasonable broadband connection, you can set most of these programs to backup everything you do automatically.

Keeping copies of your data locally is also prudent of course, but come the crash (and it will, eventually), it's comforting to know your precious information is still available from the cloud. As long as there's no thunderstorm.







# London Pride

# Great low maintenance flowering ground cover

#### **GRAEME TYRRELL**

THE Mediterranean climate allows the use in the landscape of many plants that in northern Europe can only be used as indoor plants.

One of them is London Pride (Crassula multicava). It is a wonderful, easy to grow, self spreading succulent.

I use it as a ground cover around taller bushes and trees. It grows quickly when planted in autumn and spreads quickly with the cooler weather and moist soil in winter.

In spring it has a profusion of small, very fine white to pink flowers on long stems that look very attractive rising high above the leaves. In summer it tolerates the heat very well with minimal watering requirements.

Its advantages are that it covers the

soil with attractive foliage with minimal maintenance.

It is not invasive as it is so easy to remove from places that you do not want them to spread to. This can be a disadvantage if you have animals in the garden that scratch or dig as the plants can be quickly damaged.

A visitor to my garden, who is a professional gardener, recognised the succulent and was fascinated to see how well it had established all around the shrub beds of my terrace. He had only known it as an indoor

It is a great pot plant as it is so hardy. It will proliferate with even poorer soil mixes for years and is usually tolerant of irregular watering. In northern Europe it is a popular pot plant but most regions are too cold to grow it as a landscape plant in an open garden. The London Pride originates from Africa.

In the Mediterranean garden it will grow so easily. Pieces can be broken off established plants and planted wherever you want more to grow. They also seed prolifically and so renew themselves in the garden and self spread in this way.

The Crassula family of succulents, which London Pride belongs to, includes Jade plants and the Silver Dollar plant that are also more commonly grown in containers. I also grow these as landscape features in

The garden needs to have good drainage so it is necessary to have compost and you can even add fine stones to ensure that the soil does not

get waterlogged in wet weather or when watering. They do not tolerate wet feet for long. They are shallow rooted so a good mulch of compost can be sufficient to grow London Pride successfully in the garden without having to cultivate deeply in established shrub beds.

You only need to water them when you see the leaves are becoming thin and perhaps wrinkled. They will normally recover quickly and swell up

again to store the water that enables them to survive long periods without additional watering.

I tend to just water the shrubs in the garden as required and the London Pride take advantage of this watering, so they are not additional work to water and the thick ground cover means that there are few weeds that can compete in the dry conditions that the London Pride can survive in summer.







Hamilton drove superbly to recover from a first-lap collision with Vettel's teammate Kimi Raikkonen, and the result hinged on two late safety cars, when world champion Hamilton's Mercedes team took a strategic gamble.

The decision promoted Bottas, who had run second from the start, to the lead ahead of Vettel, while Hamilton was propelled two places up to third.

It was a gamble that paid off for the Briton - winning him crucial points in his title fight with Vettel and limiting the damage that could have been caused after the first

However, it didn't work for Bottas, whose tyres ran




RAISED EXPECTATIONS: Vettel has extended his lead in the standings.

# Brailsford slams brakes on Lappartient

"The quicker he can learn his responsibilities, the better it will be for everyone."
