A HOMELESS man allegedly paid €100 by a British stag party to have the groom's name and address tattooed on his forehead has called for them to be jailed.

Polish-born Tomek Matuszewski, 34, says he has reported the offenders to the police after returning to Benidorm from Granada in Andalucia. where he spent a few days with friends.

And he marched to the Foreign Tourists' Office to file a complaint about the incident before being taken for a medical check-up.

He said being handed the money while drunk was "like winning the lottery," but was horrified when he woke up the

The inking was supposed to read 'Jamie Blake, North Shields NE28,' but only the first two letters of the post code were completed because Tomek was in too much pain, and now he wants those responsible to face

said: "I'd like to see the culprit go to jail as well as the tattooist. I want justice and I hope karma will come back to them."

Mr Blake, 36, earlier denied his involvement in the stunt having recently moved to Benidorm and deciding to go ahead with his stag party despite separating from his fiancée.

He told the Newcastle Evening Chronicle: "I was not

there at the time. There was a big group of around 30 of us drinking in the bar.

"There was a group of Irish lads there as well and Tomek. He isn't homeless he lives with my friend and works on the strip.

"I got drunk and was asked to leave the bar. I was never in the tattoo parlour and as far as I know he was not paid money.'

The incident has sparked outrage among expatriates in the holiday hotspot, and Karen Maling Cowles, president of the Benidorm British Business Association, has been leading a fundraising campaign to get the tattoo removed.

She said: "Tomek has contacted us. He was emotional and overwhelmed by the publicity given by the media and acts of kindness by the public.

"We are looking for help with various things for Tomek including somewhere not expensive for him to stay while we get things organised with doctors and so on."

Maureen Daniels added: "Well done for standing up to help this poor man. He has gone from an encounter with the worst of British in Benidorm to the very best. I hope his problems will soon be on the way to being solved."

Holidaymaker Paul, a 35year-old lorry driver, told The Sun: "Today I've seen in the papers that Jamie has said it was nothing to do with him and Tommy wasn't homeless. That's a joke - it was his idea."

Police have confirmed they are probing the incident.

Terror attack fears

PASSENGERS on a train in Valencia City centre feared a terrorist attack when a group of robed men with a megaphone declared the carriage was full of sinners who were going to die and burn in hell.

The nine German men are said to part of an evangelical group, and also carried a large cross and pamphlets during the frightening

They have since been arrested on charges of public disorder and bail has been set at €12.000

A statement from the police and the Metrovalencia control service confirmed 'the volume and content of the proclamations generated panic reactions among some passengers, who thought it was a terrorist attack.'

After two stops passengers were seen pushing their way out of the carriage and running away via the internal video circuit.

Shortly afterwards, the driver stopped the convoy and the men were arrested.

Conman caught out A FUGITIVE walked into a

Benidorm police station to fill out paperwork and now faces up to 15 years in prison for fraud in his home country.

The Moldovian man was wanted by Interpol, and while completing documents in the station, officers discovered there was an order for international detention against him.

A National Police spokesman said the detainee conned €540,000 out of nine Cypriots as part of an organised real estate scam, offering land at low prices and pocketing the cash.

Once he had made a considerable amount of money, he fled to Spain, where he has been in hiding.

The defendant faces a penalty in his country that can be up to 15 years in prison according to the Moldovan Penal Code.

He has been handed over to the Central Court of Instruction acting as a guard of the National Court to be extradit-

PIONEERING research has suggested British author George Orwell was killed by tuberculosis he caught in a Spanish hospital.

The Nineteen Eighty-Four penman died from a haemorrhage in January 1950.

And while the cause of his death is well known, it has remained unclear where he contracted the condition. But scientific tests on a letter the author sent to Sergey Dinamov, editor of the Soviet journal Foreign Literature, appear to have solved the mystery.

It was written in July 1937, shortly after Orwell returned to Britain after fighting against the military uprising of General Francisco Franco. The analysis was carried out by Israeli researcher Gleb Zilberstein, who in an earlier study verified traces of kidnev disease on the manuscript of Russian writer Mikhail Bulgakov's The Master and Margarita.

He used acetate film to extract bacteria and morphine from the document, which were checked against archived medical registration records for those that fought in the Spanish Civil War, which broke out in 1936 and ended in 1939. Zilberstein told The Times: "The level of infection was very high and the [hygiene standards of] hospitals were very poor.

"The civil war in Spain was the last war in the

20th century without penicillin.

"Most wounded people got infections in hospital in Spain and mortality was higher from infections.

"Orwell got TB at a period of the civil war when there was a higher probability of hospital infections."

Orwell went to Spain to write about and fight in the war, during which Franco's fascist regime battled the Republican government for control of the country, eventually becoming a lieutenant in the militia of the communist, anti-Stalinist Workers' Party of Marxist Unification. He was shot in May 1937 through the neck by a sniper while moving through trenches at the Aragon Front, with the injury permanently affecting his voice.

Zilberstein says there is a "very high probability" the author was infected while recovering in hospital, although contaminated food could also have been to blame.

The traces of morphine are believed to have come from painkillers administered to him at the time.

Orwell later moved to the Scottish island of Jura, where he completed Nineteen Eighty-Four as his tu-

The book was published in June 1949 and the novelist - real name Eric Blair - died six months later, aged 46.



Faeces shut beaches

THREE Costa Blanca beaches were shut to bathers at the height of the holiday season after raw sewage was found to be contaminating the wa-

The red flag was flying from lifeguard masts, not to warn swimmers of stormy waters or strong currents, but because of the health hazard posed by faecal matter bobbing in the sea.

The cause of the contamination at Moraira's popular Portet beach is not known. Routine hygiene tests had shown up the problem and led to the red flag being flown to ban swimming.

It remained flying until further tests could confirm the contamination had cleared.

At Pego's Molinell beach bathing was banned in the river that runs into the sea at that point. High levels of bacteria were found, indicat ing sewage was contaminating the water.

However, council officials still allowed swimming in the sea, saying the problem appeared to be confined to the fresh water.

Heading up the coast to Valencia, heavy rain was the culprit at Pinedo beach where swimming had also been

A sudden downpour overwhelmed the town's waterworks, causing raw sewage to be flushed through the rainwater pipes

and out to sea. This is because Valencia uses the same pipes for both raw

sewage and rainwater,

so a sudden increase in

flow can be more than the waterworks can deal with leading to faecal matter being washed directly to the sea.







Water woes



DRYING UP: Residents say the cuts have caused 'chaos.'

RESIDENTS and holidaymakers in parts of Altea have been banned from drinking or preparing food with household water.

An official order has been released by the town mayor's office 'forbidding the consumption' of domestic water until further notice, amid fears of high levels of chlorine.

The affected zone includes a large residential area in Altea Hills and the sea front areas of Masacrat, where users are also suffer-

ing nightly water cuts due to a shortage.

According to members of the Sierra Altea Neighbours' Association, water in that particular area is supplied by Aprobera, unlike the rest of the town.

The group's web coordinator Terrance Miles, said: "The water drought is causing chaos and serious problems in the urbanisation surrounding Altea.

"The water is reported to be at minimum levels for supply to the Sierra and is being turned off at night between midnight and 8am.

"This is causing even further problems for the lower part of the Sierra as it is creating air locks in the main water pipe, thus stopping any water reaching those

The Directorate General of Public Health officially deemed the water 'unfit for human consumption,' and residents are urged to adhere to the ban until further tests are carried out and an official statement made.

It is unkown how long the water cuts will continue for.

Fraudster foiled

AN internet scam which swindled victims across Spain out of €35,000 has been thwarted following the arrest of a man in

The 39-year-old is the alleged creator of several profiles on different internet platforms for buying and selling products.

He was found to be charging purchasers without ever delivering the goods, and has been accused of a continued crime of fraud.

A National Police statement confirmed officers are investigating six crimes in Madrid, Pamplona, Santiago de Compostela and Bilibao, committed over a six-month period although more people are believed to have fallen prev to the trickster's antics.

A team of officers dedicated to technical crime from the Brigade of Judicial Police of the Commissariat of Benidorm began following the alleged fraudster's trail, after a victim brought the hoax to light, and they discovered he had opened five different bank accounts to try to hide his identity.

The statement reads: "The prisoner had made the scam his only way of life. The alleged fraudster advertised all kinds of objects, particularly electronic material, at a price below its market value to quickly capture his victims."

Once the buyer was interested in the article for sale, they were given instructions about the bank account or application which he had to use to make the payment.

The spokesperson added: "But instead of giving the buyer the object purchased as agreed, he appropriated the money."

Double drowning woe

TWO people drowned within minutes of each other in two separate incidents on the Costa Blanca.

The first casualty, a 75-year-old woman, died while swimming in the sea at Muntanyar beach in Javea.

Emergency services arrived at the scene but could not revive her.

Minutes later, a 60-year-old got into trouble and drowned in the Jose Trenzano municipal pool in Alcoy. Again, emergency services were unable to assist and could only confirm the death.

As of July 31 this year, there have been 184 cases of people drowning in public aquatic spaces in Spain.

Figures show that 58 people lost their lives in public swimming areas in July alone.

A spokesperson pointed out that although this is an alarming figure, the number is significantly lower than the 95 drownings recorded during the same month last year.

In 2017, 544 people drowned in Spain, almost half of those killed in traffic accidents last year.

€1m house for free

SOUATTERS have moved into six empty homes that were once valued at €1 million each, just days after security surveillance on the houses was stopped.

Up until recently the houses, which have been empty for eight years, have had regular security patrols. But squatters were quick to move in to the luxury houses which, although nearly finished, have never been put up for sale.

In total 11 houses were built but never sold due to the financial crisis which hit Spain. They sit on an enormous plot in Via Parque, Alicante, where hundreds of homes were due to

OUR VIEW

Heatwave or climate change?

THERE seems to be almost inevitability at the way in which the temperature across Europe is increasing so dramatically.

There have been heatwaves in the past, the most memorable perhaps in the UK the summer of 1976 but that was something of a freak, although 1977 also had hot periods.

This however is different as the temperatures are rising to unprecedented levels and although there is a forecast by the University of Alicante that this latest bout of hot weather has officially finished, they also believe that it will return again in September with a vengeance.

The mainstream media doesn't seem to find this particularly bothersome, although it does allow for some useful 'scorchio' headlines, but the reality seems to be that climate change is becoming more likely than ever to be the reason for this increased heat.

Many of us moved to Spain in order to enjoy the warm weather but when it becomes so hot, both day and night, that it is difficult to breathe let alone take walks; we have to sit up and take note!

For older people, the heat can be dangerous and there is also the likelihood of increased outbreaks of wildfire due to the parched undergrowth, although it appears there haven't been as many disastrous outbreaks as last year (although

At the end of the day, please be careful during the very hot weather, keep hydrated, use sun block and if you have animals make sure that they aren't exposed to danger.

So far 19 arrests have been made after 19 homes were searched. A total of 11 laptops, 23 mobile phones, four tablets, 11 external hard drives, seven pen drives and five large capacity memory cards were seized and found to contain millions of child porn images and videos.

Police are now trying to identify the children abused.

Those arrested had tried to use sophisticated encryption programs to hide their illegal activities.

A specialist unit of the National Police was able to penetrate the networks and identify 14 chat groups, 58 users and huge amounts of shared

Investigators also discov-

ered that the illegal activity was not limited to Spain, but extended to another seven countries in Europe and America.

Those arrested came from Alicante, Oviedo, Barcelona, Burgos, Cordoba, Granada, Palma de Mallorca, Jaen, Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, Leon, Madrid, Murcia, Santander, Tarragona, Teruel, Valencia and Valladolid.

Too hot to handle



THE death toll has risen to at least nine after Spain was gripped by a scorching heatwave.

A 40-year-old German holidaymaker walking the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage was the latest victim after he succumbed to heatstroke in the eastern region of Extremadura.

It comes after the mercury soared to 46°C in parts of the country over the weekend, just short of the all-time record of 47.3°C set in Montoro, Cordoba, last summer.

And firefighters were left battling a

series of forest blazes which broke out in the wake of the sizzling conditions.

Alerts for extreme fire risk were issued across the country, with Civil Protection warning against throwing cigarette ends from vehicles or leaving rubbish, especially empty glass bottles, in the sun.

Nature scare

Two wildfires in Huelva Province. Andalucia, were eventually brought under control by more than 200 firefighters, 10 helicopters and four large capacity aeroplanes after flames ripped through forest near the tourist village of Almonaster la Real and nearby Calañas.

They followed hours after more than 1,700 hectares of land were burned in the municipality of Nerva, also close by, with police now probing whether the three incidents were the result of ar-

And a blaze near La Jonquera in the Pyrenees mountains, Cataluña, forced the closure of the border with France for several hours

Thousands evacuated

Thousands of people were evacuated from their homes as fire ripped through the mountain range of of Llutxent in Valencia.

An estimated 1,400 hectares of forest is believed to have been destroyed in the blaze which saw 2,500 people seek refuge.

The Military Emergency Unit dispatched 120 troops, 25 vehicles, and nine aircraft, 12 forestry brigades.

The fire started in the Pujol de Llutxent area but continued to move uncontrollably northwards until it

Panic in Portugal

Hundreds of firefighters were deployed in the Algarve to tackle a wildfire which spread towards the Spanish

At least 740 firefighters, 12 aircraft

and 122 vehicles headed to the Sierra de Monchique to tackle the blaze which broke out last Friday and remained out of control five days later, with smoke clouding the skies of beaches packed with sunbathers.

Spain sent two large aircraft to help Portuguese emergency services fight the fire and unconfirmed reports on Monday placed the number of personnel on the ground at more than 1,000.

The blaze later spread near to the towns of Tavira and Vila Real de Santo Antonio, both of which lie near Portugal's border with Huelva.

At least 29 people were injured and several firefighters received medical attention for exposure to heat and smoke.

This was the first time that an 'inci-

dent of these characteristics' had occurred, the concessionary added.

The unit was regularly inspected by the regional government's Health department and the number of staff assigned to the unit was adequate for the number of in-patients.

Nevertheless, the hospital has launched an investigation to discover the motives for the suicide and intends to introduce 'possible improvements.'



Balcony plunge horror

Brit fell six floors while 'having a poo'

A BRITISH holidaymaker is fighting for his life after plummeting six floors while allegedly relieving himself over a Mallorca hotel balcony.

The unnamed 25-year-old is believed to have fallen from the sixth floor of the TRH Magaluf and hit an interior patio head first.

Local reports suggest he lost his balance after dropping his trousers and squatting over the edge of the balcony just before 3.30am.

Images of the victim lying on the ground surrounded by police officers and medics appeared in a Spanish newspaper.

And distressing video footage shows a tourist thought to be a friend or relative breaking down in tears after arriving at the scene.

He can be hear shouting "no, no, no" before a blonde woman appears to comfort him and the pair are led away by a police officer.

Guardia Civil investigators confirmed they are probing the incident as an official confirmed: "The matter is under investigation."

British holidaymaker Andrew Rhys Phillips was last May hospitalised after falling from the first floor at the same hotel.

It comes days after Irish teen Padraig Morgan was left fighting for his life after plunging from a second-floor balcony at the Hotel Apartments Deya in Santa Ponsa.

The 18-year-old from West Belfast hurt his

hip and spine and medics said he had been admitted to intensive care at Palma's Son Espases Hospital.

SPAIN'S Supreme Court is set to decide on whether to hear a case in connection with allegations that the leader of the conservative Partido Popular (PP) wrongfully gained a degree.

Judge Carmen Rodriguez-Medel, an investigative judge in Madrid, has referred the case to Supreme Court justices after finding signs of wrongdoing over a regional law masters awarded to Pablo Casado.

The PP leader got the degree from the University of King Juan Carlos' Public Law Institute in Madrid in

Casado said there was no evidence he was guilty of the charges.

"What they've done to me, they haven't done to anyone else in this country or in any other country. I am not under investigation by any court and there is no evidence of guilt against me," he said.

Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez, of the governing left-leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE), said the PP leader owed the Spanish people 'explanations' over the allega-

Casado has admitted that he did not attend classes at the Public Law Institute. He added he did not sit exams or present his dissertation.

The university waived 18 out of 22 modules as he already had a law degree from Madrid's Complutense University. He was required to produce four papers which are now subject to an investigation.

Judge Rodriguez-Medel's court said it could not hear the case as Casado is protected by immunity laws for public officials. The Supreme Court will decide whether the case can go ahead in light of the immunity status.

Casado was a regional deputy when he obtained the degree. This means he could have a case to answer over accepting gifts offered based on his public position and for abetting illegal decisions from civil servants.

The probe comes as Cristina Cifuentes, the PP President of the Madrid region, was forced to resign in April after facing allegations she falsified her degree. Casado was elected as leader of the PP on July 21.

The medicines regulator in Spain confirmed yesterday (Saturday) that it had launched an investigation into concerns that northern Europeans may be more at risk of side effects from Nolotil.

The painkiller has not been licensed in many countries, including the United States, Britain and Sweden. because of a possible side effect which can lead to blood poisoning and death.

Dr Rashmi Shah, a former senior clinical assessor at the

Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency, London, said: "We have known for a long time that because of genetic differences people from particular ethnic groups can have higher probability of risk or benefit from certain medi-

The regulators, therefore. require analysis of safety and efficacy data by population, gender and age.

The Spanish Agency of v and Medical Devices said it was gathering more evidence

Boehringer Ingelheim, the manufacturer of Nolotil, responded in a statement:

"We take very seriously every case where a patient suffers an adverse event.

"Nolotil must not be given without a prescription. There is no scientific evidence on specific populations that are prone to develop any side ef-

Drug driver kills

TWO cyclists were killed and two others injured following a collision with a car driven by a drug driver in the north of Spain.

An 18-year-old man was arrested at the scene and has since been charged with reckless driving and driving under the influence of narcotics as well as causing the death of the two cyclists, thought to be aged between 50 and 60.

Two other riders, who were cycling with the victims, were slightly injured having been rammed by the same vehicle on the T-310 at Tarrogona on Sun-

The Catalan Traffic Service believes the driver swerved into the opposite lane, 'overwhelming' the group of cyclists, and causing the instant death of two of them.

Nothing to quake about

EARTH tremors are normal geological events in the north of Alicante Province, Pedro Alfaro Garcia said.

With a doctorate in Geology, Alfaro lectures in Geodynamics at Alicante University and sent out a reassuring message regarding the Marina Alta's six recent tremors.


The latest, a very mild 1.9 on the Richter scale, was the second with an epicentre beneath Benissa, but like the first was at a depth between 11 and 12 kilometres. It was hardly noticeable and caused no damage.

The magnitude 5 earthquake that devastated Lorca (Murcia) in 2011 unleashed an energy 1,000 times greater than the magnitude 3 earthquake which heralded the Marina Alta's recent seismic activity, Alfaro

"In Alicante Province, we have a line linking Alicante City with Elche, Crevillente. Albatera and Abanilla in Murcia. where there is one type of geology above it to the north and another type below it to the south," the geologist said.

"The south, which has the most important faults, is the most active. They are the best-known and this is where most earthquakes occur," he explained.

"The northern half of Alicante Province which is the most mountainous, historically has less activity so it has been investigated less and its faults are much less known.' Alfaro Garcia continued.

A FORMER head of the Basque nationalist ETA terror group has been released from a Salamanca prison after being behind bars for 31 years on a string of murder convictions.

Santiago Arrospide Saradola, also known as Santi Potros, was pictured walking

Ex-ETA boss freed

out of Topas prison last Sunday at around 8.15am. He was accompanied by three family members and did not stop to make a statement to reporters.

Potros was found guilty of

being behind some 40 killings which resulted from ETA attacks he helped to plan. He served 13 years of his sentence in France and 18 in Spain and was originally jailed for 70 years

Attacks included one in Madrid's Plaza de la Republica Dominicana in 1986 and another at the Hipercor shopping centre in Barcelona which left some 21 people dead in 1987.

Groups including the Association of the Victims of Terrorism (AVT) have said they are concerned Potros could receive a hero's welcome from supporters when he returns to the Basque Country.

Carmen Ladron de Guevara, an AVT lawyer, said psychologists with the group would be monitoring victims of ETA attacks who were most likely to be affected by his release.

The Collective of Victims of Terrorism (COVITE) said on Twitter that the release made Sunday a day to remember victims of the group's attacks.

Fernando Grande-Marlaska,

Spain's Interior Minister, said the government would be monitoring the situation.

"If there is a crime which constitutes the glorification of terrorism or contempt for its victims then that is what the state security forces are there for," Grande-Marlaska said.

Potros first joined the ETA in 1968 and was arrested in France in 1987 on 11 charges in connection with the group's attacks.

ETA, or Euskadi Ta Askatasuna (Basque Homeland and Liberty), was established in 1959 in the Basque region of northern Spain and southern France

It morphed from a group promoting Basque culture, language and traditions into a paramilitary organisation dedicated to achieving independence for the region by violent means.

It wound up its operations after announcing it had given up its weapons and ceased activities earlier this year.

Several countries have listed the group as a terrorist organisation and more than 820 people, including 340 civilians, were killed during its attacks. More than 300 of its members are in prison in Spain, France and elsewhere.

Refugee camp opens

New arrivals flood coast as populism fears grow

SPAIN'S Interior Ministry has opened a temporary refugee camp in the Algeciras area to house the growing number of migrants arriving in

It comes after Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez said his government will set up a command centre to coordinate Madrid's response to the increasing influx of Africans crossing the Strait of Gibraltar into Spain.

The site, set up on a field in Crinavis near San Roque in Cadiz Province, is set to house migrants arriving at three ports in the province.

It comes as European Union (EU) officials said the handling of the migrant situation could fuel a rise in anti-immigration political populism.

The first 442 people arrived at the camp last Saturday. The facility, which has beds, toilets and showers, can house a maximum of 600 people

Jose Medina, a migrant co-ordinator, said the camp would shelter people rescued and taken to Tarifa, Barbate and Algericas.

The facility is set to take in 400 people every 24 hours as those who complete their 72-hour stav leave, Medina added.

Pepe Villahoz, of the Acoge immigration ad-

vocacy group, said they were concerned by the uncertainty arrivals faced.

"Protocols to deal with migrants have never been established and resources have not been allocated to solve the issue." Villahoz said.

The opening of the camp follows a pledge from European Union member states to set up migrant reception centres at June's Paris summit.

The new facility also comes as EU officials said they would support Spain on migration.

Dimitri Avramopoulos, the EU Commissioner

for Migration, said during his Madrid visit last Friday that Spain would receive additional resources to address the issue.

"Spain has the full support of the European Commission in dealing with the increased arrivals along the western Mediterranean Sea route," he said.

EU officials are concerned the Spanish electorate could be wooed by politicians standing on radical anti-immigration platforms.

The officials reportedly fear a rerun of populist

ing elected and the success of others in Austria

"At the moment, we cannot afford to lose Spain," one unnamed senior EU official report-

Pablo Casado, the new leader of the conservative Partido Popular (PP), has begun moving his party to the right on migration.

He recently claimed Spain could not accommodate the 'millions' of people arriving on its southern frontier. The far right Vox political party also organised a meeting in Algeciras on Wednesday to address what they claimed was a migrant 'invasion.'

Sergio Carrera, of the Centre for European Policy Studies (CEPS) think tank, said the Spanish government had the right approach to the issue. "The response of the Spanish government has been correct, putting the figures in perspective and showing that we are not facing a crisis,"

Many of the migrants are refugees fleeing war, conflict and poverty in sub Saharan Africa. More than 23,000 migrants have arrived in Spain so far this year, according to statistics from the United

Graffiti sparks outrage

AUTHORITIES at the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela have spoken out after arriving at the holy site to find a statue covered in graffiti mimicking the American rock band Kiss.

Vandals are believed to have targeted the statue, which dates from the 12th century, at the cathedral which is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The building is located in the Galicia re-

The city council said workers arrived at the holy building to find the statue defaced last Monday. The sculpture is located on one of the building's facades and those responsible remained at large yesterday (Thursday).

Martin Noriega, Santiago's mayor, said on Twitter the graffiti was an attack on the city's heritage and on its cit-

"It shows a lack of civility and respect," the mayor said.

Pictures of the statue showed its face covered with graffiti which mimicked the make-up of Kiss drummer Peter Criss, also known by his stage name 'The Catman.' The vandal also scrawled the band's name on a document the figure is holding.

Roman Rodriguez, Galicia's culture

spokesperson, said the graffiti was a "barbarity" and a cultural attack.

"Penalties for such actions can range from ≤ 6.000 to ≤ 150.000 ." he said.

Daniel Lorenzo, the director of the cathedral's foundation said workers had begun cleaning the statue last Mon-

The Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela is believed to be the burial place of St James, one of Jesus Christ's 12

The site marks the traditional end of the Way of St James pilgrimage route and thousands visit it and the city every

Mayor Noriega said the city was very open and tolerant towards visitors but added it would not tolerate the vandalising of its historical sites.

Kiss were formed in New York City in 1973. They went on to score hits with the songs such as Love Gun and Crazy Crazy Nights.

Bleach attack charge

A WOMAN in her 60's has been jailed for killing her friend with bleach fumes after an attack of extreme violence in Alfafar, Valencia.

A jury heard how the two sextagenarians were in the bathroom of the victim's home when an argument exploded into extreme vio-

Harsh words led to the victim pushing her friend an act that would lead to her

own death.

A red mist descended on the killer, who knocked the victim to the floor, snatched up a porcelain toilet brush and hit the woman over the head with it so hard it snapped.

Stunned and by now helpless, the victim then had her head repeatedly smashed against the edge of a bathtub.

The killer then sprayed the unconcious woman's wounds with bleach before closing the bathroom door due to the strong fumes - an act which would finish the victim off.

Emergency services were called by the aggressor's son, but they were unable to save the woman who died in the ambulance on the way to hospital due to fluid in the lungs and brain, which was caused by a lack of oxygen and the bleach fumes.

Judges at a Valencia court jailed the unnamed aggressor for 15 years after applying a reduction for the killer's full confession.

PSOE tops election poll

THE results of an opinion survey have found that Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez's left -leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE) would win a general election if one is called early.

The poll, from the Sociological Research Centre (CIS), found that almost 30 per cent of its respondents would vote for PSOE in an early election. The party came to power two months ago following a no confidence motion.

Adriana Lastra, the party's spokesperson in the Congress of Deputies, said it was the first time since 2009 that the PSOE had topped the survey.

The poll placed the conservative Partido Popular

(PP), who were ousted from government following the motion, second with 20.4 per cent of respondents backing them. They came joint second with the centrist Ciudadanos party.

Support for political parties



A total of 15.6 per cent of those surveyed said they would vote for the leftist anti-austerity Podemos party in the CIS's latest quarterly survey.

The previous quarterly survey, re-

leased in April, placed the PSOE second with 22 per cent of respondents backing them. The PP, in government at the time, came first with 24 per

There are currently 84 PSOE members in the Congress of Deputies, Spain's lower house of parliament, out of 350 lawmakers. The party has 62 out of 266 seats in the Senate, making

it the government with the smallest minority in Spain's democratic histo-

The poll was taken shortly before the PP chose Pablo Casado to succeed predecessor, and former prime minister, Mariano Rajoy.

Casado stood on a platform of moving the party to the right on a number of issues including abortion and migration. He also floated banning independence parties such as those in Cataluña in a bid to thwart their independence ambitions.

The new PP leader met with Sanchez in Madrid at his official residence of La Moncloa on Wednesday.

The results of the poll come as the PSOE marked two months since they toppled the PP government on Wednesday.

The party came to power after the then ruling PP became embroiled in the Gurtel corruption scandal.

The motion passed with 180 votes in favour and 169 against, after Sanchez secured the backing of regionalist parties.

The PP became the first party to be ousted by a no confidence motion since Spain transitioned to democracy in the late 1970's.


TWO Alfaz schools will begin the next academic year with experimental classes for two-year-olds.



A rubbish situation

SOME of the anglers who use the ancient, hidden pesqueres are leaving an antisocial amount of litter behind them.

Once, the local men who fished from outcrops of rock on Javea's cliffs did so out of necessity to help feed their families, but now these are used by anglers who do not always take their empty tins, picnic wrappers, bait boxes and used lines away with them.

"Although they are in a minority," municipal sources said, "they are damaging an already delicate ecosystem.

Most of the anglers clean up conscientiously before leaving their privileged perches - aware

that the survival of the historic pesqueres depends on protecting the environment.

Groups like the L'Institut de Recerca Oceanografica de Xabia (IROX) have called for the pesqueres to receive town hall protection. Many are no

longer usable as access is blocked by clifftop villas, and IROX members regularly clean up the mess that some of the anglers leave on the cliffs.

"Vehicles obstruct the road, making it difficult for others to pass, and the constant coming and going is creating chaos despite the new roundabout at the end of the Portitxol beach," municipal sources admitted.

Drones work hard

MARINA ALTA mayors and councillors recently met to analyse drone images of the July 8 fire on

Javea was represented by Public Safety Gisbert, while the mayors of Denia, Pego and Jesus Pobre also were present at the meeting organised by the region's Safety and Emergency Response Agency (ASRE).

The ASRE director Jose Maria Angel explained that the working meeting highlighted the possibilities that new technology and Remotely Piloted Air Systems (RPAS) can provide.

"Drones are equipped with instruments which tell us what is happening in real time and they allow us to analyse the terrain after a big fire," Angel said.

"But they also provide information when rescuing a person or during a road accident and can provide indicators enabling professionals to respond better in an emergency," he added.

Non-residents' income tax

AS we do every summer, we wish to remind readers who are non-tax residents in Spain that they may still be required to pay tax on the value of their property in Spain even if they have no income here.

This tax is based upon the value of your property regardless of whether you rent it out or just use it for your own holidays.

Wealth Tax:

If you are considered a non-tax resident in Spain, or even if you live in Spain but are not registered with the taxman as a tax resident or you do not submit taxes as tax residents, you could be legally considered as a nontax resident, since no notice may have been given for-



mally to the tax authority.

Non-tax residents could be liable to pay wealth tax, but only if the value of their assets in Spain (after deducting debts, eg pending capital on any mortgage, etc) is in excess of €700.000.

Income Tax:

If you are a non-tax resident in Spain (or you are not legally tax resident in Spain), you will need to pay tax for income in Spain (Income Tax for Non Residents, IRNR): rents from a

letting, interest on bank accounts, etc.

If you do not have any income but you own a property or a share on a property, your tax bill will be based on a calculation as per the Cadastral Value (value that appears on your Spanish local rates receipt from the town hall, the SUMA office or the equivalent).

Even now it is quite common for people who are non-fiscal residents in Spain (or are not legally tax resident in Spain) to simply not pay this tax; usually due to ignorance or neglect especially when they have no income in Spain and only own a house.


Please notice that if you let your property in Spain, you have an obligation to submit the taxes every three months and not only once a

ALCOY City Hall is restoring the municipal archive's oldest Notarial Register.


It was kept between 1296 and 1303 during the reign of Jaume II and is the city's oldest book, after Esborrany de la Cort del Justicia (Court of Justice Notes) which was written between 1263 and 1265.

The Notarial Register measures 290 x 225 millimetres and is written in gothic script. It was bound in parchment and the cover bears the notary's seal but omits his name. although according to entries inside the book he was either Pere Miro or Jaume Jofre.

The documents were copied by various scribes and apart from three in Valenciano all were written in Latin.

The restoration will be carried out by the Valencian Institute of Conservation and Restoration which will be meeting half of the €4,400 cost.

The Institute's experts said

that the Hispano-Arab paper was 'of extraordinarily good quality and made from textile fibre.' The volume has been badly affected by damp and is 'extremely fragile' they added, but the restorers will take steps only to conserve it,

without altering its technical and structural characteristics

It is one of the few books remaining in the Valencian Community from this period and because of this is extremely valuable, the Institute

Dip into the past

THE regional government's Culture department has begun visits to the Bou Ferrer underwater archaeological site in Vil-

These are open to certified divers accompanied by one of the project technicians.

The Bou-Ferrer, named after the two divers who discovered the wrecked Roman galley one kilometre off the Villajoyosa coast in 1999, is the only underwater archaeological site in Spain that can be visited.

Divers have a unique opportunity of viewing a Roman merchant ship that was more than 30 metres long and sank between 64 and 68AD carrying a cargo of more than 2,000 amphorae containing fish sauce and five tons of lead ingots that bear the stamp of the emperor

Depending on weather conditions, the Bou-Ferrer can be visited by groups of 10 divers on Saturdays and Sundays until September 30.



Reverend Canon Peter Edwards

A MEMORIAL communion service has been planned to celebrate the life of Fr Peter, retired senior chaplain of the Costa Blanca Anglican Chaplaincy, who died suddenly on May 4 this year. He was 68.

Canon Peter Clive Edwards attended Ardingly School and then the College of St Mark and St John, Chelsea, where he graduated in 1972 with a degree in English. He taught at Sir William Borlase Grammar School in Marlow, and later at Caterham School.

In 1983, he began training at St Stephen's House, was ordained deacon in 1985 and priest in 1986 in the diocese of Southwark. Peter served his title at St Augustine's, Lee, in Grove Park, before moving to Christ the King, Salfords, where he was vicar from 1990 to 1997. He then moved to St Mary's, Newington, before moving to Spain in 2003.

After a short sabbatical rest, he took up a post in 2004 as a chaplain in the team of Holy Spirit, Costa Blanca, and became senior chaplain in 2009. In 2012, Peter was made a canon of the cathedral chapter of the diocese in Europe. He retired in 2015.

Suffragan Bishop, the Right Reverend Dr David Hamid writes:

"Fr Peter Edwards first moved to Spain to experience a more relaxed pace of life.

"It was not long, however, before his extensive experience as a priest was called upon, and he left his intended retirement to accept the call to lead the team of priests serving the parish of Holy Spirit, Costa Blanca, which is the largest chaplaincy in the diocese in terms of numbers on the electoral roll.

"Under his proficient pastoral oversight as senior chaplain he nurtured a warm, open, accommodating and gently Catholic expression of church life across the eight congregations of the chaplaincy.

"On a personal level, as a bishop I was always grateful for Peter's straightforward advice to me, as well as his own genuine care for me as a person and in my ministry. May our Lord now receive his faithful servant Peter into the peace of eternal life."

The memorial service for Father Peter will be held at La Merced church in Calpe, at 4pm on September 12.







bet365 swoop on footy clubs

BRITISH gambling firm bet365 has been accused of 'colonising' Spain's La Liga in the wake of a dramatic sponsorship swoop.

It comes as the Stoke-on-Trent based conpany announced new sponsorship deals with half of the country's top flight football clubs.

The agreements run until 2020, and will see the betting brand's logo appear on the websites, coaches, facilities including stadiums, at press conferences, and social networks of Athletic de Bilbao, Betis, Celta, Eibar, Español, Getafe, Huesca, Rayo Vallecano, Valladolid and Villarreal

Anti-corruption boss on trial

THE chief of a Spanish anti-corruption group is to stand trial for extortion.

Miguel Bernad, founder of Manos Limpias (Clean Hands), and Luis Pineda, who set up Ausbanc, a legal support service for bank clients, are also accused of fraud and membership of a criminal organisation, according to a National Court statement.

They are suspected of demanding large sums of money from companies, institutions and individuals in exchange for withdrawing criminal cases they had lodged against them.

Manos Limpias filed hundreds of law-

suits after being created by Bernad, a prominent figure within the Spanish far

They include the indictment of judge Baltasar Garzon, who investigated crimes against humanity by the Franco regime, and accusing Spanish King Felipe VI's younger sister Princess Cristina of tax evasion in a corruption scandal surrounding her husband's business practices.

During the high-profile trial, the defence team claimed Manos Limpias had requested a bribe be paid to drop the allegations, but her lawyers refused.

but partner Inaki Urdangarin was convicted of diverting public funds for his own gain via the non-profit Noos Institute and was sentenced to five years and 10 months behind bars

Virgina Lopez, the lawyer representing Manos Limpias in the trial, and seven other people connected to the case have also been accused of extortion in the al-

Prosecutors have reportedly requested a 118-year jail sentence for Pineda, seen as the ringleader, more than 24 years for Bernad and 12 years for Lopez.

Tax vow sparks diesel decline

SALES of diesel cars plummeted across Spain in July.

The plunge followed Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez's government pledging to slash the exisiting 30 per cent gap between diesel and petrol taxes. And Energy and Environment Minister Teresa Ribera recently told parliament: "Diesel's days are numbered." While new car sales saw a 19 per cent year-on-year rise over the course of the month, diesel sales dropped by 31 per cent, according to trade association ANFAC.

A scandal over emission-test cheating is thought to have triggered the backlash.





IT was a good-looking, low-key, high-impact gesture when the former president of the Spanish government, Mariano Rajoy, packed his bags after the vote of no confidence.

Back to nature



MATT FORD, the long-serving editor of the Euro Weekly News, is set to leave the company to join a European-wide nature conservation project.

Matt, a biologist by trade, first joined EWN in April 2016 as a translator.

He soon climbed the ranks of the editorial team before being chosen to sit in the editor's chair in March last year.

Matt said he had thoroughly enjoyed working at the paper but added he could not pass up on the opportunity to return to his field and passion.

"It's been great working at EWN. I never would have imagined I would end up editing a newspaper," he said.

Matt said he first moved to Spain in 2008 and later undertook a Biology masters at the University of Barcelona. He later moved to Andalucia with his partner after she found out she was going to have a baby.

Matt soon found himself working as a reporter for EWN and following his appointment as editor he received extensive training from a former journalist.

"I was very lucky to have that. I'd written before for magazines and conservation science websites but that training turned me into a journalist.

"Once I had that grounding I enjoyed it. It gave me an insight into the journalism profession, into newspapers and into the expatriate community," he added.

Matt said highlights for him included working on a campaign for the family of a child who passed away in Almeria and following the ongoing Kirsty Maxwell case.

"I got the most of out of working on stories like that," he said.

Matt has now hung up his reporter's notepad and pen and is preparing to relocate to the German capital Berlin where he will join a PhD conservation research programme.

He will be working at the Liebniz Institute of Freshwater Ecology with leading scientists in the field of conservation biology while partially based at Cambridge University's David Attenborough building for stints with the International Union for Conservation of Nature, the global authority on the status of the natural world.

"The reason this project was created was to assess the European Union's ability to meet conservation targets set by the United Nations.

"The chance to do this is a dream come true for me. I have always had a passion for nature and I remember drawing pictures of birds and animals from being a small child. I'm basically a nature geek.

had picked up as a journalist with him into his Biology work. "I'll never forget the people I've worked



SINCE the 15th century, when the Spanish took the Canaries as both a practice and way station for subsequent trans-Atlantic plundering adventures, the islands have been a bridge between Africa and the Old and New Worlds

The New World needed slaves, we're close to Africa, the rest is history.

Centuries later, oppressed Canarians migrated to the Americas. Many stayed - lots came and went. A musical melting pot is one of the more obvious results, making provincial capital, Santa Cruz de Tenerife, the perfect venue for a recent revamp of the traditional bridge role.

The recently held, second edition of the South Atlantic Performing Arts Market (Spanish initials MAPAS) morphed Santa Cruz into an international cultural showcase of some clout.

Long may it last! Think state of the art performing arts and music trade fair, add networking, training and information exchange, and you've got it.

Although performances were public, free and popular, the 56 acts from 16 countries were there to impress some 150 programmers, bookers and agents, who'd come from 40 countries to shop for festival and event acts.

More than 18 large bins were removed, which have always been adequate even in the summer months when the urbanisation has a lot of holiday lets and summer visitors in situ. Then, with no other bins available. they began to build a small shed to house the much smaller, and fewer bins. For a few days, there were no bins on the urbanisation or in Orba at

Everyone in Orba had to queue (sometimes up to 90 minutes) to get a personal access code and/or the recycling bins.

The access code keyboard didn't work for a while and now the handle on the door has broken, although the lock works with the code entered. Many houses are currently empty, so they have not registered to get their access code, nor will they know the new system when they return to Spain.

The biodegradable bags split easily, and the collection for food waste is once a week. Food waste sits there rotting, and the bin lids are often left open and overflowing.







Food for thought

MANY of the best tasting foods are the worst, because they are artificially constructed flavours and not like those found naturally.

Research has found that eating red or processed meat every day increases the risk of cancer by 22 per cent.

Consuming alcohol may damage DNA, which may lead to cancer. Research has found the more alcohol you drink, the higher risks for developing certain cancers which include head and neck, liver, mouth, breast and colorectal cancers.

Alcohol consumption is thought to be the second leading cause of cancer worldwide after smoking.



Eat Well to Live Well by Andrew Harding

THIS week I will discuss vitamin B complex. It is complex because there are more than one, but less than 12, which is the largest numeral ascribed to a B vitamin.

The first B vitamin to be discovered was called 'water-soluble B.' That meant that it was only the second vitamin ever identified (the first was fat-soluble A). Riboflavin was discovered next, so water-soluble B became B1, and riboflavin became B2. The system began to get confusing in 1926, when researchers realised that vitamin B1, was actually two vitamins, thiamine and niacin. Thiamine kept the B1 name. B2 was already taken, so Niacin became B3.

As vitamin research continued, scientists found a number of substances they thought at first were new B vitamins. Some, however, turned out to be the same B's that had already been discovered, while others turned out not to be vitamins at all. These phantom B's are the missing numbers. To avoid confusion, scientists now prefer to use the B vitamin names instead of the numbers. There are no vitamins 4, 8, 10 and 11. I will split the B vitamins into fourparts; one this week and the rest over the

next two weeks

Thiamine (vitamin B1) helps to break down and release energy from food and is essential for a healthy nervous system. Good sources include: peas, fresh and dried fruit, eggs, wholegrain breads, some fortified breakfast cereals and liver. Symptoms of deficiency include: loss of appetite, fatigue, irritability, tingling in the arms and the legs as a result of nerve damage (this is one of the earliest symptoms displayed), blurred vision and delirium.

Riboflavin (vitamin B2) helps to keep skin, eves and the nervous system healthy and allows the body to release energy from food. Good sources of riboflavin include: milk, eggs, fortified breakfast cereals and rice. Ultraviolet light can destroy riboflavin, so ideally these foods should be kept out of direct sunlight. Symptoms of deficiency include: weakness or fatigue, mood change, a sore throat is usually the first presenting system, skin

cracking, dermatitis and anaemia.

• This week's recipe: **Italian Stewed Beef**

Serves 4

1 kg stewing beef, cubed

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 large onion, skinned and chopped

6 whole garlic cloves, skinned and

1 stick celery, sliced

500 ml red wine

1 tin chopped tomatoes

4 whole bay leaves

1 tablespoon Italian dried herbs

2 whole beef stock cubes, crumbled

1. Place beef with the oil in a frying pan and fry to seal.

2. Add the onion, garlic and celery and contnue to fry for another two or three

3. Add the red wine and simmer until the smell of alcohol has disappeared.

4. Pour into a slow cooker set on high and add the remaining ingredients.

5. Allow to cook for a minimum of three hours, ideally four to five.

6. Serve with ribbon pasta (tagliatelle, pappardelle, fettuccine, etc).

Hint: If you don't have a slow cooker, place in a lidded-casserole dish in the oven at 170 Celsius (Conventional)/ 160 Celsius





"We have kept the building's naval identity, but we also wanted to take Spain's sun, flavour and colour to northern Europe.'

The group also recently added the new Room Mate Gorka in Spain to its portfolio.

The hotel is located in Plaza Guipuzcoa, San Sebastian, near to the beach of La Concha.

In 2018 the Room Mate Group brand was formed, combining the hotel division, tourist apartments and the consultancy X-Perience

A secluded sanctuary

MOST people find out about La Donaire hotel, tucked away in the mountains of Andalucia, by word of mouth.

This old Spanish cortijo (farmhouse) holds just nine bedrooms, a few yurts, a sybaritic spa and two spring-water-fed pools.

It has been operating for the past two years as an eco-friendly farm with rooms, part of a growing trend of boutique agroturismos.

This is a form of agricultural hospitality which celebrates farm-to-table food, a laid-back atmosphere and, above all, authenticity.

It is popular in places such as such as rural Italy and Ibiza, but it is the first hospitality experience of its kind in Andalucia. La Donaire is located in the middle of the dramatic Sierra de Grazalema Natural Park, framed by craggyfaced mountains and undulating green farm-

A rustic feel pervades across the house, with worn brown leather seats, wreathes of dried flowers, trough-like sinks and beamed ceilings.

Four-poster beds sit next to Maria Vargas paintings and copper bathtubs, and a 70's theme pervades the living room with low sofas, shaggy rugs and chrome lamps.

However, the real highlights of the property are the huge picture windows with stunning views, reminding guests exactly where they are.

La Donaire's biodynamic farm runs a 'soil school,' teaching local farmers better practices through workshops by experts in permaculture.

All the food provided is either grown on the farm or sourced from a local producer, and it isdelicious. The fact that all visitors come away from La Donaire singing its praises means that its 'heard-it-through-the-grapevine' nature could soon be a thing of the past.

Planning gardens to survive the summer



I AM now enjoying my 30th summer in Spain without expensive air conditioning and with fresh ecological salad vegetables daily from the garden.

The solution was to: live in an inland valley that had a breeze most days; retain and train natural trees for maximum shade in the summer and maximum sun in the winter; keep windows and shutters closed in the summer until shaded after 5pm and open windows and shutters 9am to 5pm in the winter; recognise that only early and late sun is required for salad vegetables but the roots need to be kept constantly damp - to help this a five kilo box of handy TerraCottem has been kept and used whenever planting new plants.

That is just a brain dump of things that come to mind first. This list is increased and expanded on to several-hundred in the booklet *How to Use Less Water in your Garden* - a practical guide to water-wise Mediterranean-

style gardening worldwide.

This is available inexpensively from Amazon in English and Spanish.

Luckily many plants have a defence mechanism when the weather is very hot and slow down their activity with growth and flowering being reduced, except for true tropical and semi-tropical flowering plants and trees.

But even then most plants welcome shelter from the hottest suns in semi-

or full shade for at least part of the day. Likewise so do humans, pets, insects and garden wildlife such as geckoes and frogs.

When we purchased our house we kept old trees and planted more, we maximised the use of the natural shade for part of the day on the north side and for much of the day on the western side. Likewise we now take maximum advantage of large trees on the eastern

southern and western boundaries, trailing climbers over pergolas or wires from trees to the house wall. With very few spots in the garden that are not in at least dappled shade for at least part of the day there is always somewhere to rest, read or work in the shade and one can stroll the entire perimeter of the plot largely in the shade.

Thinking about planting-up some areas of the garden, especially those

which you see when resting or taking a siesta, with cooling plantings that are predominantly white, grey, blue and mauve as suggested in chapter 2.6 in 'Your Garden in Spain - from planning to planting and maintenance.' This was chapter 4.17 in the earlier version of the book.

Possible plants include white and blue agapanthus, mauve tulbaghias, white flowering petunias, begonias, solanum, jasmine and roses, the grey foliage of echiums, lavenders, some gazanias and sages.

Likewise white walls, white plant pots, rocks in rockeries, areas of white stone chippings, light versus dark coloured paths and terraces and whitewashed trunks of citrus trees - which also helps to prevent them from splitting in the sun - can help cool down the garden.

Lastly but not least, the sight and sound of water can be stimulating, soothing and cooling. A fountain can be purchased and immediately installed, but a pond with a fountain or cascading waterfall is a project for the winter - to be ready for next year.

How to keep your garden hydrated

WITH the arrival in the hot summer months of temperatures of up to 40 Celcius, keeping your garden maintained is extremely difficult.

TAKE special care of your dog in hot summer months - dogs have inefficient cooling systems compared to humans. The sweat glands are in the tongue and paw pads, the primary method of sweating being the obvious one of panting

If a muzzle or a respiratory blockage interferes with this ability to pant, a dog may overheat quickly. Obese dogs suffer most. Never exercise a dog in the heat of the day and keep its weight under control. Make sure there is plenty of shade and water

Temperatures of more than 40°C can result in rapid panting, bright red gums, tongue and other mucus membranes, vomiting, watery and bloody diarrhoea and staggering. Thick saliva is also a sign of an impending heat stroke. If a dog is not treated immediately it is possible that coma, respiratory collapse and death can result.

If there are signs of heat stroke, cool the dog off by submerging it in tepid water before taking it to a vet. Flap a towel to fan the dog and allow gradual cooling.

Cooling a dog that is in shock too fast with cold water can cause further problems,

even hypothermia. Certainly do not use ice water for this could result in a narrowing of the arteries to the skin, meaning the dog will retain the heat longer.

Do not leave dogs in cars even with the windows down, and do not allow them to travel with their heads out of the car windows. If you see a dog in an unattended car in hot weather for more than five minutes call the police. Keep water in the boot of the car and out of the sun, dogs do not like warm or hot water.

Hot pavements, tarmac and sand on a beach can burn paws. Jogging with your dog running behind is also unwise, as is making your dog run behind a car.

Remember young or small dogs take 10 steps to our one and young dogs need most of their energy for growing.

Don't clip long-haired dogs too short otherwise there is the danger of the skin being sun burnt, their coats are for protection against cold weather and the sun.

It is not natural for dogs that have been bred for cold climates, such as Huskies and Ankitas, to be taken to warm climates for then behavioural and health problems will

Brexistential crisis?

THE claim: If Brexit negotiations fail it will make it harder to travel with pets from the UK to the EU. Reality check verdict: If there is no deal then it will indeed be harder to take pets to the EU. The pet passport scheme includes countries that are not EU members, but a deal would need to be done.

EU negotiator Michel Barnier has warned French newspaper Le Journal du Dimanche of some of the consequences of the UK leaving the EU without a deal.

Among those, he spoke about 'the ability ... of dogs and cats to cross the Channel.'

At the moment you can take your pet dog, cat, or indeed ferret, from the UK to the EU and back again without quarantine provided that certain conditions are met, such as having a pet passport and your pet being microchipped.

Pet passports are issued by EU countries and a short list of other countries such as Greenland, Iceland and Switzerland.

The UK could be added to this list, but clearly agreements would be needed to make that happen - it would not be automatic. At 11pm on March 29, 2019, the United Kingdom will officially leave the European Union or at least it will begin a 21month transition period aimed at smoothing the way toward post-Brexit relations. But for worried observers of the process that was set into motion on June 23, 2016, when the leave vote was narrowly victorious in a referendum, the process has been anything but smooth until now.





Volkswagen Touareg has star power

WITH its starship looks and when fully kitted out with Volkswagen's Innovision Cockpit, the new Touareg is unlike anything else currently on sale.

It was always going to need to make a statement to grab the attention of buyers, its predecessor has been under siege from rivals for 15 years.

This new model shares its underpinnings with the Audi Q7, Bentley Bentayga and Lamborghini Urus, among others.

Longer and wider than before, albeit a fraction lower, this new Touareg looks like a beast on the road, with a grille that appears to stretch across its entire front.

Despite its size, the Touareg remains a fiveseater, meaning it lacks the versatility of a Q7 or Volvo XC90.

However, the five seats you do get are generously proportioned, with easily enough room for three adults to sit across the back,

and ample headroom even with the enormous panoramic sunroof installed.

As with the smaller Tiguan, these rear seats slide fore and aft, and have adjustable backrests, all allowing you to trade some rear legroom for additional boot space.

The quality of the interior surpasses any other VW to date - with soft, smooth leather

and absurdly comfortable seats.

At night the ambient lighting emits a gentle glow, and that the Touareg does all of this without any of the bling so often associated with these enormous SUVs is to VW's credit.

The 12-inch digital dials can display a full satnav map as well as the usual trip computer and audio controls, leading to an almost endless range of possible configurations.

Despite all the usual range of driving modes, the Touareg is at its best if you just leave everything in the default, normal setting.

It may be a two-ton SUV but if you put your foot down the 282bhp Touareg really goes, and the engine is well matched to the gearbox.

Volkswagen thinks it's got a class leader in its hands and if you value comfort and technology over a sporty drive or a posh logo, you may well agree.

A licence to sell

THE '2 GTO' licence plate could potentially be the most expensive ever to be sold in the UK. The registration plate could end up on a Ferrari 250 GTO, the most expensive car ever sold.

Once licensed to an Austin Healey 'Frogeye' Sprite, the '2 GTO' plate has belonged to the same owner since 1970. The iconic number plate has now been put up for auction with an official estimate of €225,000 to €337,000, however it may fetch much


Now retired, the owner prefers to remain anony-

The world's most expensive classic car to date is a 1963 model sold for € 58 million last month.

Currently on sale for an asking price of €16million is the 'F1' registration plate, licensed to a 2013 Bugatti Veyron, having been bought for €422,000 from Essex Council in 2008.

in 2019. They come as the company has faced declining US sales in recent years.

The LiveWire will be followed by 'twist and go' electric twowheelers over the next few years which will be lighter and smaller.

The company is set to continue making big bikes and its new models will include a more technology-advanced touring and cruiser motorcycle.

Harley-Davidson is developing smaller bikes with 250-500cc engines to make them more accessible to customers in Asia and India, where sales are rising.



While India came up short, their performance was a far cry from their dismal tour four years ago and bodes well for the remainder of what promises to be a hotly contested five-Test series.

Hall claims Women's Open

ENGLAND'S Georgia Hall hopes she can encourage more young girls to take up golf after winning the Women's British Open at Royal Lytham & St Annes.

The 22-year-old is only the third British winner since the event became a major championship in 2001.

Hall, who won by two shots at 17 under par, also hopes to help attract new sponsors to the Ladies European Tour.

"I want to be a good role model for young girls in Britain and hopefully I can encourage a lot of them to take up the game," she said.

Victory meant the 2013 British ladies' amateur champion emulated compatriot Karen Stupples and Scot Catriona Matthew, the other two British winners since this event became a major.

It also secured the Bournemouth-based golfer a €429.000 prize.



Peaty took a huge lead on the first 50m before pulling away further to win by 1.54secs from fellow Englishman Wilby.

"I can't believe I beat what I did at the Olympics," said

Britain also won gold in the mixed 4x100m medley relay, breaking the European record in the process.
