Nuclear option

A GROUP of Almeria environmentalists have called on Spain's National Court to push for a deadline for the cleanup of radioactive waste from the town of Palomares.

The Ecologists in Action group said in a letter to the court that it should ask the country's Nuclear Safety Council to move forward with clearing the debris.

The waste fell from a United States (US) Air Force plane carrying four thermonuclear bombs which crashed in midair in 1966 in what was later dubbed the Palomares Incident

The environmentalists were responding to claims made before the National Court by lawyers acting for the Spanish government.

They argued that a cleanup plan drawn up with the US in 2010 was now completed 'down to the last detail' and would be undertaken within the next three years.



go to jail as well as the tattooist. I want justice and I hope karma will come back to them."

Mr Blake, 36, earlier denied his involvement in the stunt having recently moved to Benidorm and deciding to go ahead with his stag party despite separating from his fiancée.

He told the *Newcastle Evening Chronicle*: "I was not there at the time. There was a big group of around 30 of us drinking in the bar.

"There was a group of Irish lads there as well and Tomek. He isn't homeless, he lives with my friend and works on the strip.

"I got drunk and was asked to leave the bar. I was never in the tattoo parlour and as far as I know he was not paid money." The incident has sparked outrage among expatriates in the holiday hotspot, and Karen Maling Cowles, president of the Benidorm British Business Association, has been leading a fundraising campaign to get the tattoo removed.

She said: "Tomek has contacted us. He was emotional and overwhelmed by the publicity given by the media and acts of kindness by the public.

"We are looking for help with various things for Tomek including somewhere not expensive for him to stay while we get things organised with doctors and so on."

Maureen Daniels added: "Well done for standing up to help this poor man. He has gone from an encounter with the worst of British in Benidorm to the very best. I hope his problems will soon be on the way to being solved."

Holidaymaker Paul, a 35year-old lorry driver, told *The Sun*: "Today I've seen in the papers that Jamie has said it was nothing to do with him and Tommy wasn't homeless. That's a joke - it was his idea."

Police have confirmed they are probing the incident.

#### Man held at port

NATIONAL POLICE officers have arrested a 23-year-old Moroccan man at Almeria City's port wanted in connection with an alleged house burglary in Germany. The detainee, whose case has been sent to Almeria's Court of Instruction Number Five, was subject to arrest warrants from authorities in Bosnia, Germany, Lithuania, Morocco and Romania.

#### **Drugs bust**

GUARDIA CIVIL officers have seized more than 5,000 marihuana plants, a weapon and machinery from a farm in Alcolea near El Ejido. Police arrested a 64-yearold in connection with the haul and sent proceedings to Berja's Court of Instruction and the investigation remains open with officers refusing to rule out further arrests.

#### **Jobless rise**

UNEMPLOYMENT in Almeria Province rose by 624 people in July and now stands at more than 62,724 compared with June, according to Spain's Welfare Ministry. Data also found the number of people jobless at the end of July this year was 2,224 less than those unemployed at the end of July 2017.

#### **'Theft' probe**

FOUR people, including two youths, have been arrested in Huercal de Almeria in connection with the alleged theft of four motorcycles and other items valued at around  $\in 40,000$ . The detainees include an 18-year-old from Santa Fe de Mondujar, a resident of Alhama de Almeria, 24 and two 16year-olds.

#### Train delay

A TRAIN from Sevilla City bound for Almeria City arrived late at the latter after technical issues resulted in it being delayed. Passengers on the train, which left Sevilla last Thursday, got off in Almeria around 45 minutes after the scheduled arrival time, according to Spain's rail company Renfe.

#### **Body tests**

A 46-YEAR-OLD man whose body was found under a bridge in Almeria City last Thursday died of natural causes, according to the results of a post-mortem examination. Coroners ruled the remains of the man, who was reported missing on July 12, showed no signs of having died a violent death. #### THE view is out of this world.

This stunning shot shows the Milky Way emerging over the three peaks of the Tre Cime di Lavaredo in Italy's Dolomite mountain range.

And it landed Spanish snapper Carlos F Turienzo on the shortlist for the 2018 Insight Astronomy Photographer of the Year contest.

Organised by the Royal Observatory Greenwich in association with *BBC Sky at Night Magazine*, the competition this year received more than 4,200 entries from 91 countries.

And after making the final cut, the Galician photographer

said: "We had been travelling for 24 hours without sleeping to reach our destination before the one night where clear skies were forecasted ended.

"After reaching the hut and having a nice dinner, we climbed up to the cliff and waited for night-time to come.

"Unfortunately it came with a cloudy sky. We stood there being optimistic, knowing that all our efforts would be rewarded, and eventually the clouds disappeared and the magic happened: a beautiful Milky Way emerged over the mountains! "It was amazing being there together enjoying the magnificent spectacle, truly a dream come true."

## **Body found**

EMERGENCY SERVICES personnel were called out to a beach in the Nijar area after receiving reports of a corpse sighted in the water off the shoreline.

Guardia Civil officers, medical personnel, Local Police and coastguards were despatched to Los Genoveses beach after two witnesses reported seeing the body at around 8.50pm on Saturday.

The body was found around 250 metres out to sea. Andalucia's 112

Emergency Services line confirmed the find on social media at around 1pm on Saturday afternoon.

The Guardia Civil said legal protocol had now been activated following the find. The body is that of a man but its identity or the reason why it reached the Nijar beach was unknown at the time of the find.

The news comes as emergency services found two bodies in the space of less than 24 hours in the Cabo de Gata area last month.

## Five hurt in crash

FIVE people were taken to hospital after their vehicle left the road and plunged down a ravine near Huer-cal-Overa.

Emergency services said they received calls from several witnesses who told them the vehicle careered off the A-334 road at kilometre 83 between Alfoquia and Zurgena. The crash is believed to have taken place shortly before 3.00pm last Thursday.

Emergency personnel including Guardia Civil officers, paramedics

and firefighters were despatched to the scene of the crash.

Firefighters were not required as Guardia Civil officers were able to pull the five people from the vehicle. Several people nearby also helped to get them out, Andalucia's 112 Emergency Services line said.

Paramedics took the five people to La Inmaculada Regional Hospital in Huercal-Overa for treatment. The extent of their injuries is unknown, with the vehicle later removed from the ravine by the A-334.



Orwell went to Spain to write about and fight in the war, during which Franco's fascist regime battled the Republican government for control of the country, eventually becoming a lieutenant in the militia of the communist, anti-Stalinist Workers' Party of Marxist Unification. He was shot in May 1937

through the neck by a sniper while moving through trenches at the Aragon Front, with the injury permanently affecting his voice. Zilberstein says there is a "very high probability" the author was infected while recovering in hospital,

although contaminated food could also have been to blame.

The traces of morphine are believed to have come from painkillers administered to him at the time.

Orwell later moved to the Scottish island of Jura, where he completed Nineteen Eighty-Four as his tuberculosis worsened.

The book was published in June 1949 and the novelist - real name Eric Blair - died six months later, aged 46.

### **PM plots Almeria holiday** Sanchez floats Mojacar visit despite security concerns

SPAIN'S prime minister said he plans to spend some of his August break in Almeria amidst concerns from his security detail over his location of choice's safety

Pedro Sanchez, of the governing left-leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE), is set to divide his time between the Almeria resort of Mojacar and his official summer residence at Doñana in Sevilla. He is due to host German chancellor Angela Merkel at the Sevilla residence this weekend.

The prime minister's security detail had previously said they would stop Sanchez from holidaying in Mojacar with his wife and two children.

Sanchez owns a holiday apartment in the resort which is popular with British tourists and expatriates. He said previously in a media interview that Mojacar was the place he would most like to 'lose himself.'





## Man held as police help elderly



#### ELDERLY HELP: Officers have stepped up efforts to aid the elderly.

GUARDIA CIVIL officers have arrested a 43-year-old man from Huercal-Overa in connection with an alleged mugging which targeted an 87-year-old.

The probe into the mugging, conducted in partnership with the town's Local Police force, comes as the Guardia Civil has stepped up its work with the elderly.

Officers have held more than 30 talks as well as activity sessions with older residents of Almeria as part of its Greater Security Plan initiative.

The 87-year-old who was

the alleged victim of the mugging claimed he had been assaulted by three people while walking down the street. He told police they took thousands of euros in cash.

Proceedings for the 43year-old's case have been sent to Huercal-Overa's Court of Instruction.

The Greater Security Plan was launched by Spain's government in 2010. It was designed to help prevent threats against the elderly, give them confidence in the police force and improve officer response rates to incidents targeting them

#### Car crash kills and injures

A 61-YEAR-OLD man has died and four people were injured in a road accident on the N-340A passing through Tabernas, Almeria.

Witnesses to the collision between two cars immediately alerted the emergency services.

All those caught up in the accident were taken to Torrecardenas hospital, but one of the drivers lost his life.

The road in question was closed while the victims were treated at the scene.

The initiative has a Twitter slogan #SexoSinFakes, and directs people to correct information about the issue, as well as advice about practising safe sex.

This campaign has already been run in Roquetas de Mar. Vicar and Almocita, and will be taken to Almeria, Adra, Carboneras,

Garrucha and Huercal-Overa.

The importance of condom use among young people is being re-emphasised, and charities involved include the Red Cross and Doctors of the World.

As part of the initiative, volunteers man tents and distribute educational leaflets advice and other literature.

A parallel campaign on social media contrasts correct information on STIs and safe sex, with information that has been debunked.

It is presented in a language which is fresh and youthful, so that the target audience can engage and connect with it.

Issues covered include pregnancy, emergency contraception, condoms, male and female contraception, and sexually transmitted diseases.

# Too hot to handle



THE death toll has risen to at least nine after Spain was gripped by a scorching heatwave.

A 40-year-old German holidaymaker walking the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage was the latest victim after he succumbed to heatstroke in the eastern region of Extremadura.

It comes after the mercury soared to 46°C in parts of the country over the weekend, just short of the all-time record of 47.3°C set in Montoro, Cordoba, last summer.

And firefighters were left battling a

series of forest blazes which broke out in the wake of the sizzling conditions.

Alerts for extreme fire risk were issued across the country, with Civil Protection warning against throwing cigarette ends from vehicles or leaving rubbish, especially empty glass bottles, in the sun.

#### Nature scare

Two wildfires in Huelva Province, Andalucia, were eventually brought under control by more than 200 firefighters, 10 helicopters and four large capacity aeroplanes after flames ripped through forest near the tourist village of Almonaster la Real and nearby Calañas. They followed hours after more than 1,700 hectares of land

were burned in the municipality of Nerva, also close by, with police now probing whether the three incidents were the result of arson.

And a blaze near La Jonquera in the Pyrenees mountains, Cataluña, forced the closure of the border with France for several hours.

#### Thousands evacuated

Thousands of people were evacuated from their homes as fire ripped through the mountain range of of Llutxent in Valencia.

An estimated 1,400 hectares of forest is believed to have been destroyed in the blaze which saw 2,500 people seek refuge.

The Military Emergency Unit dispatched 120 troops, 25 vehicles, and nine aircraft, 12 forestry brigades.

The fire started in the Pujol de Llutxent area but continued to move uncontrollably northwards until it

threatened the natural area of El Surar, an environmental reserve protected for its ecological wealth.

**Panic in Portugal** Hundreds of firefighters were deployed in the Algarve to tackle a wild-

fire which spread towards the Spanish border.

At least 740 firefighters, 12 aircraft

and 122 vehicles headed to the Sierra de Monchique to tackle the blaze which broke out last Friday and remained out of control five days later, with smoke clouding the skies of beaches packed with sunbathers.

Spain sent two large aircraft to help Portuguese emergency services fight the fire and unconfirmed reports on Monday placed the number of personnel on the ground at more than 1,000.

The blaze later spread near to the towns of Tavira and Vila Real de Santo Antonio, both of which lie near Portugal's border with Huelva.

At least 29 people were injured and several firefighters received medical attention for exposure to heat and smoke.

## **PSOE tops election poll**

THE results of an opinion survey have found that Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez's left -leaning Partido Socialista (PSOE) would win a general election if one is called early.

The poll, from the Sociological Research Centre (CIS), found that almost 30 per cent of its respondents would vote for PSOE in an early election. The party came to power two months ago following a no confidence motion.

Adriana Lastra, the party's spokesperson in the Congress of Deputies, said it was the first time since 2009 that the PSOE had topped the survey.

The poll placed the conservative Partido Popular (PP), who were ousted from government following the motion, second with 20.4 per cent of respondents backing them. They came joint second with the centrist Ciudadanos party.

A total of 15.6 per cent of those surveyed said they would vote for the leftist anti-austerity Podemos party in the CIS's latest quarterly survey.

The previous quarterly survey, released in April, placed the PSOE second with 22 per cent of respondents backing them. The PP, in government at the time, came first with 24 per cent.

There are currently 84 PSOE members in the Congress of Deputies, Spain's lower house of parliament, out of 350 lawmakers. The party has 62 out of

266 seats in the Senate, making it the government with the smallest minority in Spain's democratic history.

The poll was taken shortly before the PP chose Pablo Casado to succeed predecessor, and former prime minister, Mariano Rajoy.

Casado stood on a platform of moving the party to the right on a number of issues including abortion and migration. He also floated banning independence parties such as those in Cataluña in a bid to thwart their independence ambitions.

The new PP leader met with

Sanchez in Madrid at his official residence of La Moncloa on Wednesday.

The results of the poll come as the PSOE marked two months since they toppled the PP government on Wednesday.

The party came to power after the then ruling PP became embroiled in the Gurtel corruption scandal.

The motion passed with 180 votes in favour and 169 against, after Sanchez secured the backing of regionalist parties.

The PP became the first party to be ousted by a no confidence motion since Spain transitioned to democracy in the late 1970's.

# Refugee camp opens

## New arrivals flood coast as populism fears grow

#### By Joe Gerrard

SPAIN'S Interior Ministry has opened a temporary refugee camp in the Algeciras area to house the growing number of migrants arriving in Spain.

It comes after Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez said his government will set up a command centre to coordinate Madrid's response to the increasing influx of Africans crossing the Strait of Gibraltar into Spain.

The site, set up on a field in Crinavis near San Roque in Cadiz Province, is set to house migrants arriving at three ports in the province.

It comes as European Union (EU) officials said the handling of the migrant situation could fuel a rise in anti-immigration political populism.

The first 442 people arrived at the camp last Saturday. The facility, which has beds, toilets and showers, can house a maximum of 600 people for 72 hours.

Jose Medina, a migrant co-ordinator, said the camp would shelter people rescued and taken to Tarifa, Barbate and Algericas.

The facility is set to take in 400 people every 24 hours as those who complete their 72-hour stay leave, Medina added.

Pepe Villahoz, of the Acoge immigration advo-

cacy group, said they were concerned by the uncertainty arrivals faced.

"Protocols to deal with migrants have never been established and resources have not been allocated to solve the issue," Villahoz said.

The opening of the camp follows a pledge from European Union member states to set up migrant reception centres at June's Paris summit.

The new facility also comes as EU officials said they would support Spain on migration. Dimitri Avramopoulos, the EU Commissioner for Migration, said during his Madrid visit last Friday that Spain would receive additional resources to address the issue.

"Spain has the full support of the European Commission in dealing with the increased arrivals along the western Mediterranean Sea route," he said.

EU officials are concerned the Spanish electorate could be wooed by politicians standing on radical anti-immigration platforms.

The officials reportedly fear a rerun of populist

parties including the far right La Liga in Italy being elected and the success of others in Austria and elsewhere.

"At the moment, we cannot afford to lose Spain," one unnamed senior EU official reportedly said.

Pablo Casado, the new leader of the conservative Partido Popular (PP), has begun moving his party to the right on migration.

He recently claimed Spain could not accommodate the 'millions' of people arriving on its southern frontier.

The far right Vox political party also organised a meeting in Algeciras on Wednesday to address what they claimed was a migrant 'invasion.'

Sergio Carrera, of the Centre for European Policy Studies (CEPS) think tank, said the Spanish government had the right approach to the issue.

"The response of the Spanish government has been correct, putting the figures in perspective and showing that we are not facing a crisis," he said.

Many of the migrants are refugees fleeing war, conflict and poverty in sub Saharan Africa. More than 23,000 migrants have arrived in Spain so far this year, according to statistics from the United Nations.

## **Balcony plunge horror** Brit fell six floors while 'having a poo'

A BRITISH holidaymaker is fighting for his life after plummeting six floors while allegedly relieving himself over a Mallorca hotel balcony.

The unnamed 25-year-old is believed to have fallen from the sixth floor of the TRH Magaluf and hit an interior patio head first.

Local reports suggest he lost his balance after dropping his trousers and squatting over the edge of the balcony just before 3.30am.

Images of the victim lying on the ground surrounded by police officers and medics appeared in a Spanish newspaper.

And distressing video footage shows a tourist thought to be a friend or relative breaking down in tears after arriving at the scene.

He can be hear shouting "no, no, no" before a blonde woman appears to comfort him and the pair are led away by a police officer.

Guardia Civil investigators confirmed they are probing the incident as an official confirmed: "The matter is under investigation."

British holidaymaker Andrew Rhys Phillips was last May hospitalised after falling from the first floor at the same hotel.

It comes days after Irish teen Padraig Morgan was left fighting for his life after plunging from a second-floor balcony at the Hotel Apartments Deya in Santa Ponsa.

The 18-year-old from West Belfast hurt his

hip and spine and medics said he had been admitted to intensive care at Palma's Son Espases Hospital.

The accidents are the latest in a spate of balcony falls involving British and Irish tourists in Mallorca this year, in which seven people have died.



## Airport 'suicide'

A RYANAIR pilot found dead at a Spanish airport is thought to have committed suicide.

It comes after Captain Jouke Schrale, 45, failed to turn up for a short-haul flight from Malaga

to Brussels. The Dutchman, who lived in Mijas on the Costa del Sol and was known to friends as Jake, reportedly died in his vehicle in

a staff car park. The 8.30am flight was delayed for hours while a replacement pilot was organised.

A well-placed source told UK media: "He'd never missed a flight in 15 years and so people knew something must be wrong."

An official from the budget Irish airline said: said: "His colleagues are in deep shock. We offer our deepest sympathy."

Captain Schrale had been flying with the carrier for a decade, and leaves behind



## 'Wolfpack' member jailed



IN COURT: Angel Boza appeared before Sevilla's Court of Instruction Number 16 yesterday.

A COURT in Sevilla has remanded Angel Boza, the youngest member of the La Manada ('Wolfpack' in English) gang, in custody without bail after he was charged with attempted robbery.

Boza, 26, was arrested in Sevilla on Thursday. He stands accused of attempting to steal a pair of sunglasses worth almost €200 and of trying to run over two security guards.

Agustin Martinez, the lawyer acting for Boza, called on justices not to add more bail conditions to ones previously handed down by Navarra's Superior Court of Justice. The Navarra court bailed Boza and the four other men convicted of sexually assaulting an 18-year-old woman at Pamplona's San Fermin festival pending an appeal.

"The conditions connected with the Pamplona case were strictly observed. It would not make sense for them to be expanded," Martinez said.





BRITISH gambling firm bet365 has been accused of 'colonising' Spain's La Liga in the wake of a dramatic sponsorship swoop.

It comes as the Stoke-on-Trent based conpany announced new sponsorship deals with half of the country's top flight football clubs.

The agreements run until 2020, and will see the betting brand's logo appear on the websites, coaches, facilities including stadiums, at press conferences, and social networks of Athletic de Bilbao, Betis, Celta, Eibar, Español, Getafe, Huesca, Rayo Vallecano, Valladolid and Villarreal.

suits after being created by Bernad, a prominent figure within the Spanish far right.

They include the indictment of judge Baltasar Garzon, who investigated crimes against humanity by the Franco regime, and accusing Spanish King Felipe VI's younger sister Princess Cristina of tax evasion in a corruption scandal surrounding her husband's business practices.

During the high-profile trial, the defence team claimed Manos Limpias had requested a bribe be paid to drop the allegations, but her lawyers refused. She was in 2016 cleared of all charges, but partner Inaki Urdangarin was convicted of diverting public funds for his own gain via the non-profit Noos Institute and was sentenced to five years and 10 months behind bars.

Virgina Lopez, the lawyer representing Manos Limpias in the trial, and seven other people connected to the case have also been accused of extortion in the alleged plot.

Prosecutors have reportedly requested a 118-year jail sentence for Pineda, seen as the ringleader, more than 24 years for Bernad and 12 years for Lopez.

## Tax vow sparks diesel decline

SALES of diesel cars plummeted across Spain in July.

The plunge followed Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez's government pledging to slash the exisiting 30 per cent gap between diesel and petrol taxes. And Energy and Environment Minister Teresa Ribera recently told parliament: "Diesel's days are numbered." While new car sales saw a 19 per cent year-on-year rise over the course of the month, diesel sales dropped by 31 per cent, according to trade association ANFAC.

A scandal over emission-test cheating is thought to have triggered the backlash.

## Spanish pilots to sue

SPANISH pilots' union SEPLA has revealed it is suing Irish budget airline Ryanair in a dispute over contracts.

The organisation said in a statement it has filed a lawsuit with the country's High Court, adding: "After a year of negotiations, the failure of Ryanair to recognise Sepla and apply Spanish labour legislation for the pilots who operate in Spain forces the union to take a legal path to attain this objective." SEPLA represents around 500 of 800 Ryanair pilots in Spain, and although the carrier agreed to recognise unions for the first time last December it has struggled to strike deals, leading to

strikes across Europe.

LAWMAKERS in Cataluña regional say they will not be held to ransom by Formula 1 over the Spanish Grand Prix.

"The regional government is of course looking to extend the contract, but obviously not at just any price," said Enterprise Minister Angels Chacon during an interview. "F1 cannot be a blank cheque."

And she added the new deal must be strongly linked to the circuit's new 'viability plan,' after the track last year suffered losses of  $\in$  7.4 million, much of which was linked to the Grand Prix weekend.

## Is ruling a threat to democracy?

#### LEAPY LEE SAYS IT OTHERS THINK IT

LAST week's decision to accept a sharia law ruling into a British court, is yet another highly predictable nail in the crumbling coffin of both Christianity and western culture.



#### **Bad planning**

I HAVE photos of the unacceptable horror and unhygienic reality of the new 'basura' recycling situation on the El Aspre/Orbeta urbanisation.

More than 18 large bins were removed, which have always been adequate even in the summer months when the urbanisation has a lot of holiday lets and summer visitors in situ. Then, with no other bins available. they began to build a small shed to house the much smaller, and fewer bins. For a few days, there were no bins on the urbanisation or in Orba at all.

# **Cup winner**

SCIENTISTS say a hot drink will you cool you down more than an ice-cold beverage.

According to Professor Peter McNaughton, a neuroscientist at the University of Cambridge, drinking hot tea or hot water will raise core body temperature. This makes people sweat more.

Nerves in our mouths and upper digestive tract react to the heat of the drink, making the brain produce more sweat.

As it evaporates, the sweat effectively cools you down.

McNaughton suggests that instead of grabbing an ice-cold drink on a hot day, he recommends 'a good cup of hot tea,' because it doesn't have other effects - like huge levels of caffeine.

# Truth or myth?

SOME say eating late leads to weight gain, some say it has no effect. Which is true?

Weight gains only happen when there is a change in calories consumed or calories burned.

If you feel full, you are less likely to snack. High protein meals for breakfast have been shown to reduce food cravings and help reduce snacking later in the day.

A high protein meal triggers a release of dopamine, a neurotransmitter which stimulates feelings of reward. The reward response is an important part of eating because it helps to regulate how much food you eat. What you eat also controls your drive to be physically active. Eating a big dinner makes you feel heavy and less motivated so there is less chance of burning calories. Eating late at night is linked to weight gain and obesity.

Different cultures have different approaches to eating patterns. In Spain, a large midday meal followed by an afternoon siesta and evening tapas is very common.

According to the research by University of Murcia, overweight women who ate a larger lunch and smaller dinner lost more weight than those who had a larger evening meal.

This shows that changes in meal timing can influence obesity and success of weight loss.

# Perk up in the morning

EXCERCISING in the morning on an empty stomach burns more fat than exercising at other times of the day.

Exercise increases how awake we feel and raises our core temperature. Burning calories is not the only benefit of an 'early bird work out.'

Working out in the morning is great for the mind and body.

It is advisable to take supplements before exercising on an empty stomach. Iron deficiency is one of the leading causes of tiredness in women, with 27 per cent not getting enough.

Eat a lunch rich with animal produce, otherwise known as carnitine. Products like meat, fish, poultry, and milk are the best sources.

In general, the redder the meat, the higher its carnitine content. Carnitine converts fat to your cells so it can be used as energy, while not having enough can cause dizziness and muscle weakness.

Snacks in between meals should involve three key components: protein, fibre and complex carbohydrates. Apple with some oatcakes and peanut butter keeps blood sugar lev-



THIS week I will discuss vitamin B complex. It is complex because there are more than one, but less than 12, which is the largest numeral ascribed to a B vitamin.

The first B vitamin to be discovered was called 'water-soluble B.' That meant that it was only the second vitamin ever identified (the first was fat-soluble A). Riboflavin was discovered next, so water-soluble B became B1, and riboflavin became B2. The system began to get confusing in 1926, when researchers realised that vitamin B1, was actually two vitamins, thiamine and niacin. Thiamine kept the B1 name. B2 was already taken, so Niacin became B3.

As vitamin research continued, scientists found a number of substances they thought at first were new B vitamins. Some, however, turned out to be the same B's that had already been discovered, while others turned out not to be vitamins at all. These phantom B's are the missing numbers. To avoid confusion, scientists now prefer to use the B vitamin names instead of the numbers. There are no vitamins 4, 8, 10 and 11. I will split the B vitamins into fourparts; one this week and the rest over the

Thiamine (vitamin B1) helps to break down and release energy from food and is essential for a healthy nervous system. Good sources include: peas, fresh and dried fruit, eggs, wholegrain breads, some fortified breakfast cereals and liver. Symptoms of deficiency include: loss of appetite, fatigue, irritability, tingling in the arms and the legs as a result of nerve damage (this is one of the earliest symptoms displayed), blurred vision and delirium.

Riboflavin (vitamin B2) helps to keep skin, eyes and the nervous system healthy and allows the body to release energy from food. Good sources of riboflavin include: milk, eggs, fortified breakfast cereals and rice. Ultraviolet light can destroy riboflavin, so ideally these foods should be kept out of direct sunlight. Symptoms of deficiency include: weakness or fatigue, mood change, a sore throat is usually the first presenting system, skin

- Serves 4 1 kg stewing beef, cubed

- 500 ml red wine
- 1 tin chopped tomatoes
- 4 whole bay leaves
- 1 tablespoon Italian dried herbs
- 2 whole beef stock cubes, crumbled

**1.** Place beef with the oil in a frying pan and fry to seal.

2. Add the onion, garlic and celery and contnue to fry for another two or three minutes

3. Add the red wine and simmer until the smell of alcohol has disappeared.

4. Pour into a slow cooker set on high and add the remaining ingredients.

5. Allow to cook for a minimum of three hours, ideally four to five.

6. Serve with ribbon pasta (tagliatelle, pappardelle, fettuccine, etc).

*Hint:* If you don't have a slow cooker, place in a lidded-casserole dish in the oven at 170 Celsius (Conventional)/ 160 Celsius (Fan).

# Health centre cash

A MEDICAL centre in Albox is one of 13 throughout Almeria Province which is set to receive funding totalling more than  $\in 1$  million from the Andalucian Health Service (SAS).

The SAS money totals €1,141,224 and is partly financed by the European Union's Regional Development Fund (ERDF).

The funding is part of wider plans to renovate hospitals and clinics across Andalucia, according to the region's Junta.

Works are set to include improving access to entrances and exits, adapting toilets, and building and replacing ramps.

Gracia Fernandez Moya, the Junta de Andalucia's health spokesperson in Almeria Province, unveiled the funding while visiting a health centre in Santa Maria del Aguila near El Ejido. The clinic is one of those set to receive a share of the money

cost of €420,548.

A centre in Albox and three in Almeria City are set to get the grants. Funding has also been given to centres in Berja, El Ejido, Garrucha, La Mojonera, Roquetas de Mar, Olula del Rio, Velez-Rubio and Vera.

Upgrades to fire systems in the clinics, as well as the replacement of generators, space


improvements and bringing in new furniture are all set to be part of the works.

The revamps were organised according to a survey of the clinics and their needs and have been part-financed by the Spanish Federation of Rare Diseases (FEDER).

Authorities are reportedly planning to prioritise deprived areas which have been declared Social Transformation Zones (ZNTS).

Around 107,000 people are expected to benefit from the initial renovations, according to the Junta

# **Irrigators** are piping up

IRRIGATION officials in the Baza district are to join with their counterparts in Almanzora to present a project before the Guadalquivir Hydrographic Confederation (CHG), which will see a new channeling system run from the Negratin reservoir.

The plans envisage a network of piping that will supply 9,000 hectares of land, and will ensure greater energy efficiency for Almanzora.

This project would double the amount of water being transferred to the communities of the Baza district, while also reducing both the environmental impact and financial costs.

The proposals will be

presented in September to the CHG before being scrutinised by the Ministry's General Directorate of Water.

They are expected to pave the way for agricultural development while

lowering electricity bills.

Jose Antonio Azor, a Baza councillor who is leading the project, said the new infrastructure is necessary to bring forth a 'generational change' in the system.

# Playing it by the book

THE Provincial Delegation of Almeria is nearing the end of a highly successful reading programme for children which has been based on animated characters.

A variety of activities have been put on for the reading clubs in the Almanzora area, and the initiative has lasted from January to August.

There will also be a play based on the Christian and Moorish history of the region, performed by the children today (Thursday).

In total, 53 children have enjoyed the reading project led by poet Ana Azorin and writer Diego Ruiz.

The initiative has achieved its aim of both informing and entertaining the children, while promoting the cognitive benefits of reading.

The children have met once a week in libraries and other public buildings to read a range of books. ALMERIA'S Diputacion has drawn up plans worth € 5.8 million to secure the supply of water to towns in the Almanzora Valley and across the province.

Almost 40 urban centres are set to benefit from the scheme to incorporate them into the Integrated Water Cycle Network.

A total of 51 towns and cities have been a part of the Network which is managed by the publicly-run utility company Galasa.

Oscar Lira, the provincial authorities' development spokesperson, said 80 per cent of the projects had already been undertaken, with the rest are being tendered.

"We have invested  $\in 30$ million in water networks throughout the province since 2011. We have solved the issue over a lack of water and we are now working to ensure it continues to reach people's taps," Lira said.

Thousands of metres of

pipeline have reportedly been replaced in the town of Almanzora. Works also include drilling to source more water and building storage tanks for it across the development area.

Provincial authorities have also created remote control systems to make water management more efficient across Almeria. They are designed to detect breakdowns and leaks so that workers can take immediate action.

Cuevas del Almanzora is set to see works under the latest plans. Other towns set to benefit are Albanchez, Antas, Bedar, Fines, Huercal-Overa, Laroya, Macael, Mojacar, Pulpi, Sierro, Somontin, Sufli Taberno, Tijola and Turre.

Towns in the Almanzora Valley and across Almeria Province have been included in Galasa's Infrastructure Renewal Plan since 2016. The Plan incorporates the works on the Integrated Water Cycle Network.

# Kept at arm's length

IT was a good-looking, low-key, high-impact gesture when the former president of the Spanish government, Mariano Rajoy, packed his bags after the vote of no confidence.

As a high-ranking civil servant, the post of Property Registrar in Santa Pola (Alicante) had been kept open for him for 28 years and was his to return to whenever he wished.

"I've come to Santa Pola to stay," he said in June, but less than two months later he announced a transfer to the Property Register in Madrid's Paseo de la Castellana, a stone's throw from the Partido Popular's party headquarters in Calle Genova.

Earlier the PP's new leader Pablo Casado drew attention to Rajoy's Santa Pola connection and commented that his wife's family always spent the summer there. No doubt he would prefer his former boss to spend the entire year there, reassur-

ingly distant from Calle Genova. After all, Casado is an Aznar man.

But although she has never before been so publicly tested or rejected, Saenz de Santamaria is tough enough to survive and revive, not least because Casado still has the little matter of his curiously-acquired Master's Degree in Autonomic Law to explain away.

In the meantime, the ex-vice president has declared, "I shall, as always, be loyal," which is never a good sign.

Loyalty should be a given, not a promise.

# Planning gardens to survive the summer

#### DICK HANDSCOMBE

I AM now enjoying my 30th summer in Spain without expensive air conditioning and with fresh ecological salad vegetables daily from the garden.

The solution was to: live in an inland valley that had a breeze most days; retain and train natural trees for maximum shade in the summer and maximum sun in the winter; keep windows and shutters closed in the summer until shaded after 5pm and open windows and shutters 9am to 5pm in the winter; recognise that only early and late sun is required for salad vegetables but the roots need to be kept constantly damp - to help this a five kilo box of handy Terra-Cottem has been kept and used whenever planting new plants.

That is just a brain dump of things that come to mind first. This list is increased and expanded on to severalhundred in the booklet *How to Use Less Water in your Garden* - a practical guide to water-wise Mediterranean-style gardening worldwide.

This is available inexpensively from Amazon in English and Spanish.

Luckily many plants have a defence mechanism when the weather is very hot and slow down their activity with growth and flowering being reduced, except for true tropical and semi-tropical flowering plants and trees.

But even then most plants wel-

come shelter from the hottest suns in semi- or full shade for at least part of the day. Likewise so do humans, pets, insects and garden wildlife such as geckoes and frogs.

When we purchased our house we kept old trees and planted more, we maximised the use of the natural shade for part of the day on the north side and for much of the day on the western side. Likewise we now take maximum advantage of large trees on the eastern southern and western boundaries, trailing climbers over pergolas or wires from trees to the house wall. With very few spots in the garden that are not in at least dappled shade for at least part of the day there is always somewhere to rest, read or work in the shade and one can stroll the entire perimeter of the plot largely in the shade. Thinking about planting-up some areas of the garden, especially those which you see when resting or taking a siesta, with cooling plantings that are predominantly white, grey, blue and mauve as suggested in chapter 2.6 in '*Your Garden in Spain - from planning to planting and maintenance.*' This was chapter 4.17 in the earlier version of the book.

Possible plants include white and blue agapanthus, mauve tulbaghias, white flowering petunias, begonias, solanum, jasmine and roses, the grey foliage of echiums, lavenders, some gazanias and sages.

Likewise white walls, white plant pots, rocks in rockeries, areas of white stone chippings, light versus dark coloured paths and terraces and whitewashed trunks of citrus trees which also helps to prevent them from splitting in the sun - can help cool down the garden.

Lastly but not least, the sight and sound of water can be stimulating, soothing and cooling. A fountain can be purchased and immediately installed, but a pond with a fountain or cascading waterfall is a project for the winter - to be ready for next year.







# Volkswagen Touareg has star power

WITH its starship looks and when fully kitted out with Volkswagen's Innovision Cockpit, the new Touareg is unlike anything else currently on sale.

It was always going to need to make a statement to grab the attention of buyers, its predecessor has been under siege from rivals for 15 years.

This new model shares its underpinnings with the Audi Q7, Bentley Bentayga and Lamborghini Urus, among others.

Longer and wider than before, albeit a fraction lower, this new Touareg looks like a beast on the road, with a grille that appears to stretch across its entire front.

Despite its size, the Touareg remains a fiveseater, meaning it lacks the versatility of a Q7 or Volvo XC90.

However, the five seats you do get are generously proportioned, with easily enough room for three adults to sit across the back,

and ample headroom even with the enormous panoramic sunroof installed.

As with the smaller Tiguan, these rear seats slide fore and aft, and have adjustable backrests, all allowing you to trade some rear legroom for additional boot space.

The quality of the interior surpasses any other VW to date - with soft, smooth leather

and absurdly comfortable seats.

At night the ambient lighting emits a gentle glow, and that the Touareg does all of this without any of the bling so often associated with these enormous SUVs is to VW's credit.

The 12-inch digital dials can display a full satnav map as well as the usual trip computer and audio controls, leading to an almost endless range of possible configurations.

Despite all the usual range of driving modes, the Touareg is at its best if you just leave everything in the default, normal setting.

It may be a two-ton SUV but if you put your foot down the 282bhp Touareg really goes, and the engine is well matched to the gearbox.

Volkswagen thinks it's got a class leader in its hands and if you value comfort and technology over a sporty drive or a posh logo, you may well agree.



# A licence to sell

THE '2 GTO' licence plate could potentially be the most expensive ever to be sold in the UK. The registration plate could end up on a Ferrari 250 GTO, the most expensive car ever sold.

Once licensed to an Austin Healey 'Frogeye' Sprite, the '2 GTO' plate has belonged to the same owner since 1970. The iconic number plate has now been put up for auction with an official estimate of  $\notin$  225,000 to  $\notin$  337,000, however it may fetch much more.

Now retired, the owner prefers to remain anonymous but admits that the coveted plate has previously been used on ordinary, run of the mill cars.

At the moment the most expensive plate ever sold in the UK is '25 O,' registered to a  $\in$  11.25 million Ferrari 250 GT SWB in 2014, costing  $\in$  656,000.

The world's most expensive classic car to date is a 1963 model sold for €58 million last month.

Currently on sale for an asking price of  $\in$  16million is the 'F1' registration plate, licensed to a 2013 Bugatti Veyron, having been bought for  $\in$  422,000 from Essex Council in 2008.



# Mazda Cosmo is a real star

INTEREST in Japa n e s e classic cars of the 1960's and 1970's is on the up and one of the undoubted stars at the moment is the Mazda Cosmo Sport.

It was an innovative and diminutive coupé which set the company on a path to perfecting rotary engines for its road and racing cars, and the 1967 Cosmo is the one which started it all.

A willingness to confront technical challenges head-on has been a defining Mazda trait for decades, ever since the firm bought into the rotary concept with NSU in the early 1960's.

There were many technical issues to overcome, not least the scraping of the combustion chambers by the tips of the rotors.

Mazda's engineers referred to this as the 'devil's nail marks' but after extensive testing they developed a new apex seal which solved the problem.

Known as the Mazda 110S in export markets, 343 of the first series were built before an updated car was introduced in 1968 with a bit more


power, along with a longer wheelbase and a five-speed gearbox.

Only 833 of the latter were built: a total production of less than 1,200 cars underlining quite how rare the Cosmo Sport really is.

It is a delightful little car to drive and the characteristic rotary buzz and free-revving nature are both hallmarks of the Wankel engine.

The beautiful design is an odd mix of European and American styling influences, and the name reflects spacerace inspired optimism.

Mazda's enthusiasm for proving rotary technology in racing started with the 1968 Marathon de la Routes, continuing through the next two decades, culminating with a win at the 1991 Le Mans 24 Hours for the ear-splitting 787B.



# Harley Davidson reinvents itself

MOTORBIKE makers Harley Davidson are reportedly hoping to broaden their appeal with a series of new models including a new electric bike.

The models, which include the LiveWire bike, are set for release in 2019. They come as the company has faced declining US sales in recent years.

Matt Levatich, the company's CEO, said Harley Davidson wanted to inspire future riders with the new models.

"We want to inspire those who haven't yet even thought about the thrill of riding, alongside our existing loyal riders, with the next revolution of two-wheeled freedom," he said.

Harley Davidson, whose motorbikes are known for their roaring, rumbling engines, said it plans to introduce the electric LiveWire bike to make riding easier. It is set to feature no clutch and no gears, the company added.

The firm said it planned to release 100 new motorcycles over the next 10 years and that it wanted to win over two million new riders to combat falling sales.

The LiveWire will be followed by more 'twist and go' electric two-wheelers over the next few years which will be lighter and smaller.

The company is set to continue making big bikes and its new models will include a more technology-advanced touring and cruiser motorcycle.

Harley-Davidson is developing smaller bikes with 250-500cc engines to make them more accessible to customers in Asia and India, where sales are rising.

US President Donald Trump recently criticised the company over their plans to move production abroad to avoid newly imposed European Union tariffs.

Sales in the US have fallen by around 8.7 per cent in the first six months of this year. They fell in Canada by 4.9 per cent during the same period.

The company also faces the aging of their traditional customers. The Motorcycle Industry Council said the average age of American motorcycle owners has gone up from 32 to 47 since 1990.

Around 46 per cent of riders are over 50 and about 10 per cent are aged 30-34.
