Locksmith taxed by arrest

OFFICERS of the National Police have detained a 22year-old man at Almeria port, using a European arrest warrant.


The Moroccan man is a professional locksmith and repair man, but has been charged with fraud and forgery in Austria after issuing false pay receipts to the country's Treasury.

At the time of the arrest the man was travelling from Spain to Nador (Morocco) with his 17-year-old sister.

According to the Prosecutor's Office of Korneuburg, Austria, the suspect defrauded the amount of €6,389 between December 2017 and June 2018, and is liable to be sentenced to three years in prison for the offence.

The detainee carried out locksmith services and repairs in Korneuburg, but when he referred his selfemployed accounts to the Treasury, he made no allowances for the country's tax system.

He has been placed before the court of Almeria for trial.

THE Guardia Civil has dismantled two indoor greenhouses in Vicar that were cultivating 1.054 marihuana plants, arresting four people in the process.

In the first of two raids, officers initially noticed a van with a French licence plate outside a house, with the keys in the ignition and signs of having been broken into, but with no one inside.

As they were making inquiries into the ownership of the van, four people came out of the house but on seeing the policemen looked startled, and turned to go back inside.

Observing their reaction, the officers followed them and arriving on the patio they detected a strong smell of marihuana.

When the four men were questioned about this, they replied that they did not own the plants, they only looked after them.

A total of 794 plants were seized from the house, along with air conditioning ma-

chines, filters, lights, and an illegal electricity network.

The detainees are aged 36, 41, 36 and 22, and are all residents of Vicar.

In a separate incident, the Guardia Civil noticed a man iumping over a wall into a street in Vicar, but when he noticed the officers he ran away.

As he fled, he jumped over a metal fence into a farm and managed to escape from the police.

However, they inspected the house from which the man had exited, and discovered 260 marihuana plants, as well as a range of electrical equipment used to grow them.

There was also a pitbull running loose in the back yard, which was handed over to a local animal charity.

Parents' tribute

THE parents of an Irish girl who drowned in a Costa del Sol swimming pool have paid tribute to their 'tiny Wonder Woman.'

It comes after four-year-old Georgia Anne Callan drowned at a rented villa on Calle San Joaquin, just off Marbella's Golden Mile.

The youngster from Ardclough, Co Kildare, is believed to have climbed out of a paddling pool before falling into the adult pool.

One of the victim's parents was with her at the time and well-placed sources said she was briefly distracted while talking with other adults who are believed to be friends.

They are understood to have been coming to the end of a month-long family holiday when the tragedy struck.

The alarm was raised at 10.30 in the morning on Saturday July 28, but medics were unable to resuscitate her.

'Devastated by her loss'

Mums Emeline Callan and Jacqueline Russell said in a statement they are "devastated by her loss.'

They added: "Georgia was our own tiny Wonder Woman.

"A happy, playful, brave, gentle and funny girl, she loved nothing more than making new friends and wearing princess dresses everywhere.

"Georgia loved everyone,

and her pets were amongst her dearest friends.

"She sought beauty, goodness and fun wherever she was. She brought immense joy to our lives and to the lives of everyone who knew

"We love her deeply. We will miss her more than we can say. We are devastated by her loss.

"We ask that you respect our privacy, and the privacy of our family and friends at this incredibly difficult and sad time."

The family thanked the police, medics, and Irish Embassy staff for 'their professionalism, support and care.'

Georgia's funeral took place last Friday and mourners were asked to 'dress cheerfully' in a bid to ensure her 'bright, sparkling personality lives on.'

Spanish police have confirmed they are treating the death as accidental.

School's in

ALMERIA Council has allocated €770,000 to improve the air conditioning and energy efficiency of 11 of its schools. The move follows a €130,000 expenditure on toilets and sanitation facilities, which is part of a broader policy to provide quality education which is inclusive and promotes equal opportunities.

Film funds

THE Junta de Andalucia is issuing a feasibility study for the creation of a new cinema in Almeria which will become a focal point for the area's cultural development. The study has a budget of €60,000 and reflects the Junta's wish to boost the performing arts while generating employment.

Fire erupts

A WAREHOUSE which was storing fireworks exploded twice on the same night, totally destroying the premises and leaving two people injured. The accident occurred in the Ejido La Blanca, and while the blaze was contained by firefighters, the cause is unknown, but an investigation is underway.

Debt relief

EL EJIDO Council has managed to cut its debt by more than €80 million since 2011, a reduction of 30 per cent. After introducing a system of strict budgetary discipline, it even expects to be able to save €12 million more by the end of the year.

Streets in colour

THIS is Barcelona, but not as you know it.

Iakov Filimonov's picture shows one of the city's streets decked out in glorious colour bunting for its annual Fiesta Mayor de Gracia in 2015. This year's edition kicked off yesterday (Wednesday).

The festival, which includes concerts, dances and model displays, pays homage to the Catalan capital's Gracia district.

The area was once a town until Barcelona incorporated it in 1897. The fiesta has been used to assert the district's identity since the early 19th century.

Local monks chose to throw a festival on August 15, the day of the assumption of the Virgin Mary, after a convent was demolished in 1812.

When Gracia briefly became an independent entity with its own town hall in 1850 it adopted the celebration as an annual event. The decking of streets in a variety of multicoloured styles also began around this time.

The festival took on a rebellious nature during the dictatorship of Francisco France who attempted to repress Catalan culture. Fiesta goers used it as a means to demonstrate against his regime.

It began to fall out of fashion in the 1970's until Cataluña's regional government declared it a festival of national interest in 1997.

Story surfaces

AN unpublished short story from American author Ernest Hemingway about life in Paris after the Second World War is set to be released for the first time.

A Room on the Garden Side was written in 1956. The author, who spent much of his life in Spain as well as France, talks about his affection for both countries through the story's narrator and main character, Robert.

"I loved France and Spain next to my own country. I loved other countries too but the debt was paid and I thought that the account was closed, not knowing the accounts are never closed," Robert says.

The story has until now only been seen by a handful of scholars and academics. It sees characters debating 'the dirty trade of war' in one of Hemingway's favourite haunts, the Paris Ritz hotel.

Andrew F Gulli, an editor at Strand which is publishing the short story, said in a note introducing the work that Hemingway was paying homage to Paris in it.

"Hemingway's deep love for his favourite city as it just emerging from Nazi occupation is on full display, as are the hallmarks of his prose," Strand said.

The author sent the story along with several others to his publisher Charles Scibner Jr and told him they were 'a little shocking' due to their themes of war.

'Anyway, you can always publish them after I'm dead,' he said in a note to Scribner.

War and travel were prominent themes in many of Hemingway's books. The Sun Also Rises, one of his first successes, centres on the protagonist Jake Barnes and his friends who journey to Pamplona to witness the Running of the Bulls.

Hemingway lived in various places across Spain in the 1930's. He travelled to Madrid in 1937 following the outbreak of the Spanish Civil War the previous year to make The Spanish Earth, a documentary about the Republican war

The experience went on to inspire Hemingway's novel For Whom The Bell Tolls. The story follows an American volunteer named Robert Jordan who is sent behind fascist lines near Segovia to fight with Republican guerrillas.





Sanchez Merkel meeting

SPAIN'S Prime Minister and the German Chancellor have said they have found 'European solutions' to migrant arrivals on Spain's and the continent's southern frontiers following a meeting last Satur-

Pedro Sanchez and Angela Merkel held a joint press conference following talks at Sanlucar de Barrameda in Cadiz Province. Merkel was staving at the Prime Minister's summer residence in the Doñana National Park in Huelva Province.

Sanchez said the two had agreed to push for more dialogue and co-operation with countries such as Morocco which many migrants travel through in order to reach Spain.

He added he and the German Chancellor had agreed to begin talks with the European Union (EU) with a view to making more aid available for

border security in Morocco. The Spanish enclaves of Ceuta and Melilla share a land border with the North African coun-

Merkel said the EU's existing Dublin system, which states that each member state is required to process asylum requests for those arriving on its soil, was not working.

She added her and Sanchez had spoken about trying to find a system that would fairly distribute arrivals across the bloc's member states

"Germany and Spain are counting on European solutions." Merkel said.

The German Chancellor added she was now seeking to strike a similar deal with Greece, another leading destination point for migrants travelling to Europe.

The meeting comes as an agreement between Germany and Spain on migrant transfers came into force yesterday.

The deal means migrants arriving in Germany but who are already registered in Spain will be returned within 48 hours.

There have been no cases since mid-June where the arrangement would apply, according to German media re-

EU leaders are now set to meet in Salzburg in Austria for a summit on migration in September. Sanchez and Merkel are expected to take their proposals from last weekend's meeting to the talks. They are expected to be backed by the leaders of France and Portugal but they could face opposition from countries such as Italy, Austria and Hungary. Anti-immigration feelings hold sway among senior officials in the latter states.

At least around 23,500 migrants arrived in Spain since the start of this year, more than arrived in 2017 and a larger amount than Italy and Greece have taken in.

Many of the migrants coming to Europe are refugees fleeing war and conflict in sub-Saharan Africa, according to United Nations officials.









Barcelona attacks - one year on

Spain remains on high alert as authorities claim several plots foiled

AUTHORITIES in Spain remain concerned about possible terrorist attacks in the country as Cataluña approaches the one-year anniversary of strikes there to-(Thursday) tomorrow (Friday).

Senior police officials said they had foiled around a dozen plots over the past four years which included gun raids and a plan to poison water supplies in major cities.

The plotters were linked in most cases to the Islamic State and other fundamentalist terror organisations, they added.

The attacks in Barcelona and Cambrils and explosions in Alcanar on August 16 and 17 in 2017 claimed the lives of 24 people including eight attackers. More than 152 people were injured.

Spain's Interior Ministry has kept the country's terror threat level at four out of five since last year, meaning the risk of an attack is high.

Francisco Jose Vazquez, a senior Guardia Civil officer. said the threat level was justified given the amount of plots uncovered.

"We can assure the public that jihadist activity is cur-

rently latent in Spain. Recently we have investigated and raided cells that were plotting attacks similar to the ones seen in Berlin in 2016 and on Westminster Bridge in London in 2017," Vazquez

The Berlin attack saw several people run over by a truck at a Christmas market in the city. Khalid Masood ran over pedestrians on Westminster Bridge before stabbing a police officer as he attempted to get onto the Houses of Parliament estate in March last year.

The Cataluña incidents saw one house explode on August 16. The cause is believed to have been a stockpile of explosives accidently going off and a second blast occurred during evacuation

Younes Abouyaaqoub drove a Fiat Talento van down the pavement of Barcelona's La Rambla the following day at high speed before fleeing on foot.

He hijacked a car in the city's university quarter, stabbed the driver to death and fled before being killed in a shootout with police in Subirats on August 21.

Houssaine Abouyaaqoup, Omar Hichamy, Mohamed Hichamy, Moussa Oukabir and Said Aalla bought four knives and an axe and donned fake bomb vests before ramming pedestrians in Cambrils on August 18.

Four of the attackers were shot and killed on site and a fifth died in hospital. A 63year-old Spanish woman was stabbed to death in the strike and six other people were injured.

Police later said the five were linked to the attacker in Barcelona. The motives in all cases were said to be support for the Islamic State and other terror groups

Others cited Western intervention in countries such as Syria and Iraq which Spain has played a minor role in.



Saudi arms sales

SPAIN'S arms industry sold more than €361 million in armaments last year to states that are part of a coalition led by Saudi Arabia currently fighting in Yemen's civil war.

The sales figures, from an annual Spanish government report sent to the country's Parliament, show the Saudis were the leaders in the exports.

About €270.2 million in arms was sold to the Saudi state including a transport plane, drones, mortar shells, artillery, ammunition and other equipment.

The figures come as Spain saw a record year last year in terms of arms sales. Around €4.4 billion in weapons was bought from the country, an increase of 7.3 per cent on 2016 levels.

They also come as two

political parties in Granada called on public prosecutors to investigate the alleged illegal shipment of arms from the port of Motril.

The parties claimed the shipping of weapons from the civilian port broke a number of Spanish and European Union (EU) regula-

NGOs including Oxfam and Amnesty International called on Spain to halt weapons shipments to the Saudis earlier this year.

They claimed the weapons were being used in strikes that cause civilian deaths in Yemen, which has been gripped by civil war since 2015.

The war has seen the involvement of Saudi Arabia. as well as the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Morocco and Sudan, on the side of the Hadi government.

They have been fighting

against Houthi rebels which are allegedly backed by Iran and the Lebanese Shi'a organisation Hezbol-

There have been around 17.062 civilians killed and injured in Yemen from March 2015 to last August 10, according to estimates from the United Nations High Commission for Refugees. A total of 6,592 of those lay dead and 10,470 have been wounded.

The High Commission estimates that the majority of casualties, about 10,471, were as a result of Saudiled coalition airstrikes.

Riot squad chief held

LOCAL POLICE in Benidorm have arrested a senior National Police officer in connection with an alleged scuffle with a taxi driver in the city's 'guiri zone' on Friday.

Two Local Police officers were left with slight injuries as a result of the arrest. The incident took place on Calle Ibiza at around 11pm and went on until the early hours of Saturday morning, according to police sources.

The arrested officer is the chief of the Valencia region's riot police.

He was taken to a police station in Benidorm before being released on charges of assault and resisting arrest.



Exchange of information – what changes in September?

across the world, including Spain and the UK, began sharing and receiving new information on their taxpayers' offshore assets and income.

This is carried out under the Common Reporting Standard (CRS) for automatic exchange of financial account information. More than 100 countries have so far committed to obtain information from their financial institutions and pass it on to the clients' country of residence. Over 45 more countries are in the pipeline.

Forty-nine jurisdictions began collecting data from 2016, making the first exchange in September 2017. Another 53, including Switzerland, Hong Kong, Singapore, United Arab Emirates, Australia, Canada, Panama and many Caribbean jurisdictions, began collecting data last year, ready to share it by the end of this September.

This automatic information exchange will be repeated every year

The information being shared about the financial assets you own outside your country of residence includes your name and address, country of tax residence, tax identification number, investment income you earned over the year (interest, dividends, income from certain insurance contracts, annuities, etc), account balances and gross proceeds from the sale of financial

When local tax offices receive this information, they can verify whether

the taxpayer has accurately reported their worldwide income and assets on their tax returns. In Spain, the authorities can also compare data with Modelo 720 declarations.

The UK's Requirement to Correct (RTC) - higher penalties from October.

Last year HM Revenue & Customs introduced a statutory requirement requiring UK taxpayers to disclose any undeclared offshore tax liabilities. Under the 'Requirement to Correct' (RTC), the deadline for those affected to get their affairs in order is September 30, 2018. From October 1, the penalties for undeclared offshore income and gains will shoot up to 200 per cent under a much tougher

This will coincide with the time HMRC will receive its next wave of information from abroad. Once the deadline has passed, tax investigators will use the information received to find those who still have undeclared offshore income

The RTC affects people with outstanding UK tax liabilities on their offshore interests, whether bank accounts, investments, property, etc. It relates to income tax, capital gains tax and inheritance tax, covering non-compliance committed before April 6, 2017.

Note that paying tax in the country where the income is generated (for example, if you paid local tax on rental income from an overseas property) does not automatically excuse you from paying tax in Britain if you are a UK tax resident. You have to follow the double-tax treaty correctly.

HMRC has reportedly sent warning letters to taxpayers it believes have not correctly declared offshore income. The letters remind the recipients of the new penalties and suggest they carry out a 'tax health check.'

Anyone who lives in one country and has assets or earns income in another needs to take care with their tax planning and ensure they are declaring income as required by

both country's laws and paying tax correctly. This can vary from country to country, depending on the particular double tax treaty.

Valencia wild fire extinguished

A FIRE that burned 3.270 hectares of land, destroyed or damaged 40 homes and forced the evacuation of 2,620 people was finally put out a week after it started.

At its height the blaze which was started by a lightning strike in the Llutxent area of Valencia threatened the seaside resort town of Gandia.

More than 700 groundbased personnel and 31 helicopters and planes were drafted in from Valencia, Castellon and Alicante, as well as from the forestry service and military units to contain the fire

which had been whipped up by strong gusts of winds.

By Friday the blaze, which had started in the early hours of Monday morning, was declared 'stabilised' and it was finally extinguished by 8pm on Sunday.

The municipal districts of Gandia, Llutxent, Pinet, Ador, Barx and Quatretonda were affected, with 120 people from Pinet joining 2,500 evacuees from La Drova and the Montesol and Montepino urbanisations.

Those people evacuated have been allowed back to their homes to assess any

damage, with the national government pledging to support those affected with grants to repair damage.

Local authorities may also be helped with cash to reforest affected areas. So far this summer, fire has destroyed a total of 11,722.90 hectares in Spain, according to the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, but these figures do not include the latest blazes in Nerva, Moguer, Almonaster Huelva, or Llutxent.

It is still 84.63 per cent less than in the same period of the previous year (76,625

Hundreds injured in stage collapse at Vigo



A SECTION of wooden jetty collapsed at a sports and music festival in Spain, injuring more than 330 people, five se-

The stage was right on the seafront of the north-west city of Vigo, Galicia, and was crowded with people watching a rap artist at the O Marisquiño event.

Police stated that there were no known fatalities, but witnesses described chaotic scenes as people - many of them teenagers - tried to claw themselves to safety.

Some fell into the sea and people's belongings eg mobile phones and handbags were left strewn on the ground.

Emergency services attended to the injured, and divers were deployed to the sea to check for people, as the wooden boards had cracked along a central section.

Reports suggest that the incident happened shortly before midnight on Sunday during the performance of Mallorcan rapper Rels B.

In a tweet Rels B wished 'strength' to the injured and

told concerned relatives or friends to contact the emergency help desk set up by festival organisers.

It is not clear why the platform collapsed, and Vigo's mayor Abel Caballero has confirmed an investigation is underway.

A week earlier Elena Muñoz Fonteriz, President of the Vigo Popular Party, had warned on social media that the jetty was unsound and that officials should examine it before the concert went

15 arrested in 9,000kg hash bust

THE Guardia Civil in Almeria has arrested 15 people who are charged with belonging to a criminal organisation that was trying to traffick 9,000 kg of hashish into mainland Spain.

Officers acted after gathering evidence as part of 'Operation Knight' which was developed in the provinces of Almeria and Cadiz.

The 15 arrested individuals comprised 11 Spaniards, three Moroccans and one Romanian, and the hashish they were trying to smuggle was hidden

ments on boats.

A total of 24 police raids have been carried out across the towns of Adra, Balanegra, and El Ejido, as well as one in Algeciras in Cadiz.

In addition to the hashish, a wide range of material and equipment has been seized, including vehicles and boats used by the criminal group.

The organisation was hierarchical, with four of its leaders reportedly based in Almeria, and they all had specific

roles to play within the group.

Once the boats had anchored, the packages of narcotics would allegedly be hidden on the shore with GPS coordinates.

When the coast was literally clear, expert divers would then withdraw the packages and attach them to a recreational boat or even a fishing boat.

A total of €39,640 in cash was also seized, along with numerous mobile phones, GPS equipment and diving

Heist murder rap

AN international jewel thief has been convicted of murdering a 28-year-old Spanish man and his friend.

Colombian-born Gonzalo Andreas Gomez-Remolina aged 36, and his brother Christian - who killed himself in prison before his own murder trial - stabbed Ruben Fuente and Carlos Ayala in Clapham, south London, in 2007.

Mr Ayala had helped the defendant in at least one burglary and named his killer with his dying breath, the Old Bailey heard.

Spaniard Mr Fuente was in the 'wrong place at the wrong time' and stabbed eight times as he tried to escape, the jury were

Prosecutor Brian O'Neill OC said Mr Ayala and the Gomez-Remolinas brothers had 'fallen out... over dividing the spoils.'

It escalated when Mr Ayala got some friends to break into the brothers' flat and the Colombians were beaten, their girlfriends tied up and watches and cash stolen.

The Gomez-Remolinas retal-

iated by attempting to run over Mr Ayala and Mr Fuente in a car park.

During his trial, the defendant denied being involved in the killings, saying he had bolted when Mr Ayala produced a knife and that his brother had confessed to the killings whilst the brothers fled on a Eurostan service to Paris

However, the jury did not believe him and convicted him of





SPANISH fighter jets stationed in Estonia have had their flights suspended after Spain's Ministry of Defence and NATO opened probes into the misfiring of a mis-

One of the Spanish planes fired an air-to-air missile during the manoeuvres. All the planes later returned to the Siauliai air base in Lithuania without incident.

The cause remains unknown but it is suspected to have being accidental, according to Spain's Ministry of Defence.

Estonian media has speculated as to the location of the missile, with almost 60 people alerting authorities to possible sites.

It is believed to have exploded in mid air over Jogvera County in central Estonia, according to the country's air force commander Riivo Valge.

Valge said his team were almost certain the missile was destroyed but they would be 'cautious' while they confirmed this.

Estonia's Prime Minister said the missile caused no damage and repeated his country's commitment to NATO.

"The NATO mission makes an important contribution to the security of Estonia and the entire alliance." Ratas said.



Cultural tourism rises

THE number of tourists paying a visit to Spain's cultural sites and attractions has risen by 23 per cent this summer compared to last year, according to a study.

The total number of holidaymakers who arrived in Spain was about 8.5 million during June, according to the latest statistics from tourism officials.

Elias Bendodo, the head of the Costa del Sol tourist board, said the authority estimated tourists would bring an extra €7.4 billion to the region's economy. The southern destination is currently the most popular with tourists out of those in

Baby left in car dies

A BABY girl has died after being left in a scorching car for eight hours in 30C heat in Mallorca

The 10-month-old's grandfather told police he forgot she was in the back of his car when he went for a coffee at 7am.

He only discovered his mistake when he returned to his vehicle at 3pm.

Police questioned the 56-year-old on suspicion of manslaughter, but released him without charges pending an ongoing investi-

A passing doctor is said to have tried to revive the child but as in the case of paramedics who attended, could not save the youngster's life.

The first officers called to the tragic scene are believed to have broken down in tears

after it was confirmed she was dead.

Police confirmed today an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the baby girl's death was underway and a local judge would now have to decide whether to press charges.

The child is understood to have been asleep when her grandfather left her in the back of a Renault Megane Scenic in s'Hort des Cabre Street in the Mallorcan town of

He suffered an anxiety attack after realising what he had done and had to be treated at Manacor Hospital before being questioned by police.

It's not yet been revealed where he had gone after having a coffee.

An autopsy is due to take place.

Brit held for rape

A BRITISH man has been arrested after allegedly 'tying up, raping and beating' a woman in her flat in Mallorca.

Dylan Rogers, 26, who apparently lives and works in the resort of Magaluf, is alleged to have attacked the 22-year-old victim at an apartment in s'Arenal, near the island's airport.

She was taken to hospital after her ordeal with bruising to her arms, legs and face.

Police sources confirmed the victim appeared to have been physically assaulted as well as sexually attacked.

Officers were called to the crime scene around 4.30pm last Wednesday and made the arrest in the early hours of the following

A source said: "She was bound with insulating tape and had bruises on her legs, arms and face.

"The suspect was located in a neighbouring flat and arrested several hours later after officers obtained a key and a warrant to access the property."

The victim, believed to be 'foreign' is said to have alerted police after freeing herself from her binds.

Rogers has not been charged with a crime yet, as is normal in Spain where charges are only laid shortly before trial.

Led into the courts in shorts and t-shirt on Friday, he was questioned by a judge as part of an ongoing criminal investigation. It's reported that he was remanded in custody.





€2.8bn state aid plunge revealed

SPAIN has placed third bottom in a European Union-wide ranking of financial support offered to compa-

A new report by the National Commission of Markets and Competition has revealed how state aid to firms based in the country has been slashed by €2.8 billion - almost half - since 2009

This represents just 0.26 per cent of gross domestic product with only Italy (0.22 per cent) and Ireland (0.2) contributing less.

And the UK (0.36) also fares badly, falling below the EU average 0.7 per cent.

Mango losses reduced

ALTHOUGH at one time the Mango fashion chain was pushing Inditex (owner of Zara and other high street names) for financial dominance, recently it has been in the doldrums.

Founded in Barcelona by brothers Isak and Nahman Andic it became one of the biggest fashion firms in the world, but having moved into negative profit for a number of years, it is beginning to see a reduction in losses.

At one time, employing 9,000 staff and with a turnover of more

than €2 billion which produced significant profits, its 2017 report shows that it has reduced losses by 45 per cent to €33 million, although sales have dropped €2.194

At least its gross operating profit has increased by some €115 million which is 50 per cent up on 2016, but this would have been much higher had it not been for a very hot second half of the year in its main markets which saw overall

Indeed according to the company, had the results of the first half of the year carried through to the second half, then it would have seen a return to profit.

Sleeping in the heat

WHEN it's hot outside and you don't have air conditioning, it can be a nightmare getting off to

But there are ways to get and stay cool for long enough to drift

It's advisable to do any exercise a few hours before getting into bed, and to drink plenty of water.

Body temperature is raised during strenuous activity and you retain heat. It's also a good idea to keep a glass of room temperature water by your bedside. Ice cold water slows down digestion and metabolism by constricting blood vessels, thereby decreasing the body's ability to cool off.

Eating a heavy meal or spicy food before bedtime may make you feel hotter, so eat a light dinner at least two or three hours before bed.

And contrary to popular belief, avoid a very cold shower before hitting the sack as it can have a rebound effect. Tepid shower or

Another idea is to soak your hands and feet - the body's radiators - in tepid water to cool down.

Heat rises, so the lower to the ground or in the house you are, the more comfortable you will be.

And avoid heavy bedding, light cotton or bamboo mats are preferable. If possible, put bedding in the freezer 30 minutes before bed-

Eat Well to Live Well by Andrew Harding

THIS week I will continue the discussion about B group vitamins:

Niacin (Vitamin B3). Niacin helps the body utilise the energy that is present in food and keeps the skin and nervous system in good order. Good sources are; mushrooms, cereals, eggs, meat, green vegetables, nuts and beans. Symptoms of mild niacin deficiency include fatigue, canker sores, vomiting, depression, poor circulation and indigestion.

Pantothenic Acid (Vitamin B5). Pantothenic acid, like the rest of the B complex vitamins, helps turn carbohydrates into glucose. Glucose is the only carbohydrate that the human body can use directly, starch and sucrose have to be converted to glucose. B5 is also is necessary for creating red blood cells, various hormones and maintain healthy digestion. Sources include; mushrooms, legumes and lentils, avocados, milk, eggs, and cabbage. Deficiency is very rare and only found in the severely malnourished.

Pyridoxene (Vitamin B6). Vitamin B6 is important in maintaining a healthy body and developing a healthy brain, so it is essential to make sure high levels are

maintained during pregnancy and infancy. Sources of B6 include beans, poultry, fish, fortified cereals, dark leafy greens, papayas, oranges and Cantaloupe melons. Severe deficiency is rare, but if slight can produce the following: A weak immune system, anaemia, rashes, scaly skin on the lips, cracks at the corners of the mouth and a swollen tongue.

Biotin (Vitamin B7, AKA, Vitamin H: Confused? So am I!) This split-personality vitamin is synthesised by the bacteria in the gut but is also found in organ meats (liver, kidneys), eggs, fish, meat, seeds, nuts, it helps to keep the skin, nails and hair healthy. Biotin deficiency is rare.

This week's recipe is a Caribbean Curry, Curries are normally associated with India, Pakistan, Thailand and to a lesser extent, China. I am not a great fan of adding fruit (except for the citrus varieties) to savoury dishes, but fruits like mango and pineapple can be added to this recipe five minutes before serving.

Caribbean Chicken Curry

Serves 4

1 kg chicken breast meat skinned, boned and cubed

2 tablespoons of rapeseed or sunflower seed oil

- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 teaspoon allspice, ground
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon curry powder
- 2 chicken stock cubes
- 1 teaspoon celery salt
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 teaspoon of ground mace
- 2 tablespoons dried coconut
- 2 tablespoons mango powder
- 1 can of tomatoes
- 1 jigger dark rum
- 200ml orange juice
- 1 bunch cilantro leaf, chopped
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch, mixed with a little water

Fry chicken in oil until browned. Add onion and garlic and fry until both golden. Add curry powder, fry for two minutes on a very low heat. Add all the other ingredients, except for the cornstarch.

Simmer for 15 minutes or until chicken cooked. Add cornstarch/water mix slowly and constantly stirring, to thicken the sauce. Serve with steamed rice.



THE Junta de Andalucia has announced it has put contracts out to tender for more than €2.330.00 in renovation and extension works to a school in Cuevas del Almanzora.

Junta education officials said works to Alvares de Sotomayor public infant and junior school would include the demolition of one of its buildings. A new building is set to be constructed in its place, according to Junta plans.

Education officials from the Junta visited the school last week to unveil the plans. They

said the works would result in the centre having a total of 675 places once completed.

The news comes as the Jaroso secondary school in Cuevas del Almanzora is also set to be expanded under Junta plans.

Gracia Fernandez, an Almeria-based Junta official, said the renovations showed regional authorities were committed to providing quality public schools.

"The amount invested by the Junta in the school system from 2017 will stand at more than €60 million by the end of next

year," Fernandez said.

The new building is set to include six classrooms, toilets, a communal space and adapted facilities for children with special ed-

There is set to be a room for the parent and teachers' association to meet. The school is also set for a new gym with storage space.

In addition there will be extensions made to existing buildings at the site which will see the creation of another three classrooms and

Workers are due to overhaul the school's fire safety and electrical systems and clean and repair its fixtures

The project has received joint grants from the Junta and from the European Union's Regional Development Fund. A total of 120 projects are currently being financed by that fund in Almeria Province with more than €30 million invested.

Archaeology call

ECOLOGISTS and local history enthusiasts in Cuevas del Almanzora have called on authorities to step up conservation efforts at the Villaricos archaeological site which they claimed had been 'abandoned.'

Locals and activists have asked the town's council and the Junta de Andalucia to act on what they said was the 'deplorable' state of the site.

The Villaricos site, home to the ruins of a Phoenician settlement, is classed as being one of Cultural Interest meaning it is protected until Junta heritage laws.

Ecologists in Action said in a statement that Cuevas del Almanzora Council and the Junta de Andalucia should work together to improve the site.

"The site is in a deplorable situation. Rubbish is often dumped there, there are no signs stating where

the site begins and there is a scarce amount of information about its historical value there," the group said.

The ecologists added authorities should clean the area and put up adequate signs to mark out the area as a minimum.

The Villaricos site covers an area of more than 301,630 square metres and it is near the mouth of the Almanzora river on its left

The site is home to a series of monumental burial sites, the oldest of which date back to the 7th century

There are carvings with the tombs which are hewn into the rock face.

Villaricos was excavated by the Belgian archaeologist Luis Siret in the 19th century. Several finds from the site are housed in museums across Spain.

Hitting the jackpot

Taken by storm

HEAVY rainfall across the Almanzora Valley left Albox partially cut off from Oria after a ravine in Chirivel burst its banks for the second time in a week.

The storms, which struck the area last week, also caused damage to crops such as almond trees due to hail falling according to Spain's Met Office. Farmhouses were also damaged as a result of the weather, AEMET added.

Francisco Torrecilla, the mayor of Albox. said in a statement that water from the ravine had flooded fields across the areas surrounding Albox.

"There were storms over the fields of Oria

and many of the districts and towns on the edge of the Chirivel ravine which meets with that of Albox, with both of them flowing into the River Almanzora." Torrecilla said.

"It is good to have water in the ravines because it helps to boost supply, but damage has been caused," the mayor added.

"Roads were also damaged and thoroughfares on either side of the ravine were cut off although areas nearby to them were not entirely isolated. Machinery has been sent in to clear them," he said.

The Chirivel ravine begins in the town of the same name.

Almond yields down

A FARMING association in Almeria has said their forecasts showed the almond crop in Albox and across Almanzora is set to be lower than usual this year due to weather.

The ASAJA said almond trees in Albox, Olula and Seron had seen 'significant' falls in crop yields due to frosts earlier in the year. Long term droughts in the region have also had an impact, the association added.

Adoracion Blanque, the general secretary of the ASAJA's Almeria branch, said rainfall was crucial to the amount of almonds produced by the trees.


"We have to take into account that the vast majority of our almonds have not seen enough rainfall. There has not been enough rainfall or snowfall to make a significant contribution to the growth of trees this season and yields are therefore still scarce," Blanque said.

The general secretary added the lack of frosts in the spring in areas such as Fiñana and Abrucena meant farmers there were likely to have a good harvest.

Albox is known for its almond industry. Provincial authorities regularly organise walking tours through the

area's almond orchards in the spring when trees blossom due to its distinctive colour.

Almeria typically produces around 30 per cent of the almond output in Andalucia. Low yields in recent years have caused that figure to fall to about 13 per cent, in large part due to droughts according to the ASAJA.

Benefits of reducing watering in the garden

GRAEME TYRRELL

ONCE summer is here the effects of the heat on the garden becomes apparent. It is usually too late to save poorly designed gardens without the need to apply a lot of water.

Sometimes it is better to just let the garden survive the best it can and learn from the experience. What has enabled plants to survive the summer is what can be replicated to have a more successful garden the next year.

One of the biggest problems is the incompatibility of the plants we like with the ability of the garden environment to grow the plants we want. The best solution is to learn to like the plants that grow naturally in the Mediterranean climate. They are many and varied.

If you do some research to find the Mediterranean plants that suit your garden environment and the effect you want from your garden then you have the easiest of work to make a garden. If you have natural soil in your garden and the plants are native, preparation and maintenance of a garden is minimal. The need to water the garden will be greatly reduced.

In a truly native garden the watering would principally be to establish new plants that have been introduced to the garden and assist some plants during extended dry and hot periods. Water use in the garden is minimal.



CONTROLLING WATER: Is important for the benefit of everyone.

Normally we garden though to enjoy caring for plants and benefiting from the flowers, fruits and other produce which are not native to the region. We also like to attract and support wildlife in our garden environment. This increases the need to have more water available in

To minimise this need, soil improvement is

the most important issue to retain moisture in the soil. Soil protection is also very helpful so a good mulch and appropriate shading of zones to reduce direct sun exposure of the soil and plants will also make a big difference to water reten-

Application of water is also very important to regulate the amount of water needed to keep the

rigation is the most effective way to apply water just where it is needed with minimal time and effort.

There is always a place for a hose to water just what you want and to ensure plants get what they need. The best times to apply water in summer is in the early morning and late evening to reduce evaporation.

Capturing water for the garden can also make a big difference to supply and availability. If you can channel water into storage containers for the garden it will reduce the need for water from other sources. A large container can be enough to supply water for birds for weeks.

Even hilling up ridges around the garden plants and trees can allow the capture of summer storm rain water so it does not just run off into drainage systems. In winter the ridges can be raked out if they are not necessary.

The value of water as a resource needs to be measured against the value of the garden to provide the environmental benefits and produce to support our quality of lifestyle. Gardens are a haven for wildlife so providing water and moisture in a garden can make it an oasis for many birds and beneficial insects.

Reducing the need for water however allows the benefits of water to be shared more widely. Responsible conservation of water allows us to have gardens for the benefit of everyone.



Watch out, wasps about

AS temperatures continue to soar, a dip in the pool has never been more appealing.

But one thing sure to ruin those long summer afternoons is a sharp sting from a wasp or bee that happens to

While it's tempting to kill them, they are good for the environment, and there are other ways to rid your sanctuary of the little invaders.

Wasps love raw meat! So

hanging a small piece of leftover cheap steak or beef in an area away from your pool can help entice them away.

Relatively cheap fake wasp nests are available and can be hung around the pool area. Be sure to place them early in the season before they start building their own nests.

But if a large group of the insects have moved in, call in a removal pro.

Bees are a bit easier to remove without having to destroy them.

They are basically looking for a drink, so set up an alternative water source. Keep it going all summer and put a small stone inside in case a bee falls in.

It's important to set it up before you open your pool for the season so they already have an established water source.

While tumble dryer sheets smell nice to us, bees hate them.

Arrange them around your pool in baskets or use underneath other objects to keep the bees at bay, but change them weekly.

Again, if these solutions don't work, call an exterminator who can humanely remove the nest.





The open topped coupe has a white and brown Americana-style body with chrome trim and a beige folding roof.


The interior has been perfectly kept and maintained, including plum-coloured seats and a vintage chrome stereo.





Raheem Sterling put City ahead in the 14th minute when he rifled home from the edge of the area, and Arsenal rarely threatened afterwards.

City appeared to be able to shift gears at will, and killed off the game when Benjamin Mendy,

who assisted both goals, pulled the ball back for Bernardo Silva to blast in a second.

Arsenal have another tough game at Chelsea on Saturday, while City will entertain Huddersfield on Sunday.

For their part Chelsea enjoyed a comfortable 3-0 win over Huddersfield, despite leaving World Cup heroes Eden Hazard and Olivier Giroud on the bench.

A volley from N'Golo Kante, a penalty from debutant Jorginho and a late third from Pedro gave new manager Maurizio Sarri an ideal start to the campaign.

Manchester United praised 'monster' Paul Pogba after he scored the opening goal and controlled the game in the 2-1 win over Leicester City.

Left back Luke Shaw then scored the first senior goal of his career after converting Juan Mata's aerial pass to double their lead.

Substitute Jamie Vardy headed a late consolation for the Foxes, after Ricardo Perreira's cross had hit a post.

United will head to Brighton on Sunday, with Leicester hosting Wolves on Saturday.

Other fixtures this weekend will see Fulham head to Tottenham on Saturday, Everton host Southampton, and West Ham entertain Bournemouth.

La Liga Preview

Barca still team to beat

BARCELONA will look to extend their spell of domestic dominance in La Liga, but the likes of Real Madrid and Atletico Madrid will be keen to put a stop to it.

The Catalan club cruised to the title last season, scoring 99 goals and losing just once, while Real Madrid claimed the Champions League crown for the third year in a row.

Barca kick off their title defence at home against Alaves, and they are firm favourites to continue where they left off in April.

Diego Simeone's Atletico side will be hoping to make their mark in the

However, Los Blancos will not accept a whole season of transition and Welsh forward Gareth Bale will be expected to fill Ronaldo's sizeable scoring shoes.

They kick off their domestic campaign at home against Getafe, a game which should cause them few problems.

Nadal aces Rogers Cup

WORLD number one Rafael Nadal beat unseeded Stefanos Tsitsipas to win the Rogers Cup in Toronto, bringing the Greek's stunning run to an end.

Tsitsipas, who turned 20 on Sunday, beat Dominic Thiem, Novak Djokovic and Alexander Zverev en route to the final but lost 6-2 7-6 (7-4) against the Spanish great.

Tsitsipas, who was the first unseeded finalist in Canada since Germany's Nicolas Kiefer in 2008, has won new fans with some brilliant shot making and an extrovert personality.

But Nadal, 32, was in no mood to pander to the crowd, who were firmly behind the birthday boy appearing in his first Masters Series final. The French Open champion raced through the first set, but was broken for the first time when serving for the match at 5-4 in the second set.

That handed the momentum to Tsitsipas, who then had a set point at 6-5 only for Nadal to benefit from a net-cord volley.

Nadal regrouped in the tie-break to win his 80th ATP Tour title, sinking to his knees and roaring to the skies.

Earlier, Romania's Simona Halep beat American Sloane Stephens in three sets to win the women's event in Montreal.

In a rerun of the French Open final in June, Halep eventually came out on top 7-6 (8-6) 3-6
