Back up

REINFORCEMENTS from Guardia Civil forces across Spain have been arriving in Algeciras to bolster local efforts to deal with rising crime and general activity in the Campo Gibraltar area this summer.

A total of 56 officers arrived in the town on Monday. They came from the Guardia Civil's maritime, tax, environment, civil protection and judicial units.

Officers have begun gearing up for Operations Crossing the Strait and Summer

which aim to manage increasing traffic to and from Morocco and rising numbers of tourists from elsewhere.

The reinforcements also come as authorities pledged to tackle rising cases of drugs being trafficked across the Strait of Gibraltar.

The Algeciras Guardia Civil currently has a total of 162 officers on hand for operations across the Campo Gibraltar.

They have been supplied with bulletproof vests and have been armed with customised weapons, the first

force in Spain to have the latter.

Police sources said the number of reinforcements was exceptional for this time of year.

Alfonso Rodriguez Gomez de Celis, the Spanish government's representative in Andalucia, said the reinforcements were part of "necessary measures" to tackle crimes such as drug trafficking.

The official added around €7 million in funding had been made available for both technical and human resources.

Celis denied claims made by some critics of the Guardia Civil that the ongoing migration situation was leading to drugs trafficking cases being ignored.

"Not a single investigation into drug trafficking has been affected by migration," the official said.

The reinforcements come as police officers gathered in La Linea de la Concep-

cion to demonstrate in solidarity with colleagues working on drugs cases and to demand wage increases.

Sky high

Parents' tribute

THE parents of an Irish girl who drowned in a Costa del Sol swimming pool have paid tribute to their 'tiny Wonder Woman.'

It comes after four-year-old Georgia Anne Callan drowned at a rented villa on Calle San Joaquin, just off Marbella's Golden Mile.

The youngster from Ardclough, Co Kildare, is believed to have climbed out of a paddling pool before falling into the adult pool.

One of the victim's parents was with her at the time and well-placed sources said she was briefly distracted while talking with other adults who are believed to be friends.

They are understood to have been coming to the end of a month-long family holiday when the tragedy struck.

The alarm was raised at 10.30 in the morning on Saturday July 28, but medics were unable to resuscitate her.

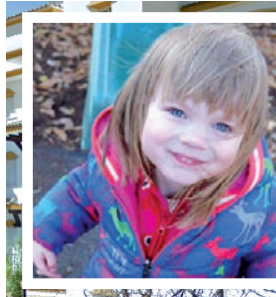

Mums Emeline Callan and Jacqueline Russell said in a statement they are "devastated by her loss."

They added: "Georgia was our own tiny Wonder Woman.

"A happy, playful, brave, gentle and funny girl, she loved nothing more than making new friends and wearing princess dresses everywhere.

"Georgia loved everyone,

and her pets were amongst her dearest friends.

"She sought beauty, goodness and fun wherever she was. She brought immense joy to our lives and to the lives of everyone who knew her.

"We love her deeply. We will miss her more than we can say. We are devastated by her loss.

"We ask that you respect our privacy, and the privacy of our family and friends at this incredibly difficult and sad time."

The family thanked the police, medics, and Irish Embassy staff for "their professionalism, support and care."

Georgia's funeral took place last Friday and mourners were asked to 'dress cheerfully' in a bid to ensure her 'bright, sparkling personality lives on.'

Spanish police have confirmed they are treating the death as accidental.

Baby body probe call

GUARDIA CIVIL officers have appealed for information over the remains of a newborn baby found at a rubbish dump in the Casares area of Malaga City. Police said the body, which was found last month by a site worker in the plant's treatment area, appeared to be male and European.

Ride fine

A MALAGA CITY court has fined a defendant €480 who was convicted of traffic offences over the riding of a mobility scooter. The 67-year-old was caught driving the Scooter XL at speeds of no more than 15 kilometres per hour on the MA-21 motorway near Puento de la Azucarera earlier this year.

Drugs haul

NATIONAL POLICE officers have seized more than half a ton of cocaine, 130 blocks of hashish and marihuana worth a total of €34 million in Alhaurin de la Torre. Officers arrested five people, including four Dutch nationals, in connection with the haul some of which was allegedly disguised as foodstuffs.

Tourist stats

THE number of British tourists holidaying on the Costa del Sol this summer is expected to be 7.4 per cent less compared to last year, according to data. The decline comes as regional tourist board figures estimated there would be more Finnish, Polish and French tourists visiting between June and September this year.

Six held

OFFICERS in Torremolinos, Benalmadena and Malaga City have arrested six people in connection with a gang allegedly responsible for a spate of robberies in those areas. Several items including an unspecified amount of cash, jewellery and weapons were seized as part of the probe and the suspects have been brought before the courts.

Call figures

EMERGENCY SERVICES personnel in Malaga Province took a total of 1,193 calls from 3.00pm last Friday to midnight last Sunday. Statistics for the 112 line, from the Ministry of Justice, showed the single most called about issue was health at 543 incidents, followed by alleged crimes at 289 and traffic incidents at 104.

Streets in colour

THIS is Barcelona, but not as you know it.

Iakov Filimonov's picture shows one of the city's streets decked out in glorious colour bunting for its annual Fiesta Mayor de Gracia in 2015. This year's edition kicked off yesterday (Wednesday).

The festival, which includes concerts, dances and model displays, pays homage to the Catalan capital's Gracia district.

The area was once a town until Barcelona incorporated it in 1897. The fiesta has been used to assert the district's identity since the early 19th century.

Local monks chose to throw a festival on August 15, the day of the assumption of the Virgin Mary, after a

convent was demolished in 1812.

When Gracia briefly became an independent entity with its own town hall in 1850 it adopted the celebration as an annual event. The decking of streets in a variety of multicoloured styles also began around this time.

The festival took on a rebellious nature during the dictatorship of Francisco Franco who attempted to repress Catalan culture. Fiesta goers used it as a means to demonstrate against his regime.

It began to fall out of fashion in the 1970's until Cataluña's regional government declared it a festival of national interest in 1997.

Identity case reopens

A COURT has ordered an investigation be reopened into a man cleared last year of stealing the identity of a 25-year-old and claiming to have HIV over evidence concerns.

Malaga's Provincial Court said it was not satisfied with the alibi of the man who was reported to authorities in October 2016 before the case was shelved in 2017.

Justices said they may possibly need to co-operate with authorities in Colombia due to the defendant

claiming someone from the country he had met on social media was responsible.

The courts provisionally dismissed the case last year. The alleged victim's lawyer filed an appeal but the court turned it down.

The Third Section of the Provincial Court has now said all avenues in the previous probe were not exhausted in violation of Spain's criminal procedure rules. It has instructed Judicial Police to act on the matter.

Migrant donations

LOCALS in Gibraltar have donated several items to a collection for migrants staying at a homeless shelter in La Linea.

Prams, clothes, food, baby baths and cash were among donations from residents in the British enclave to those staying at the centre on the Spanish side of the border.

A group of 18 women, including eight who are pregnant, arrived at the Hogar Betania centre earlier this month amidst the growing number of migrants and refugees

arriving in Spain.

Begoña Araña Alvarez, the centre's manager, said Local Police had asked them if the women could stay there after they were processed.

"We took them in and immediately took them to the hospital for a medical check up.

"Some of those arriving are pregnant and two of them have had their babies since arriving. They're all welcome to stay as long as necessary," she said.

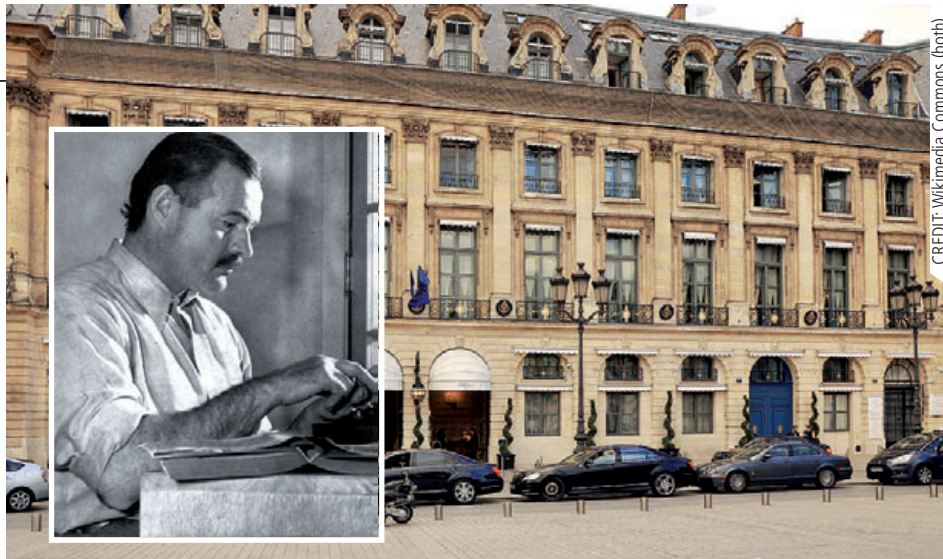

Story surfaces

AN unpublished short story from American author Ernest Hemingway about life in Paris after the Second World War is set to be released for the first time.

A Room on the Garden Side was written in 1956. The author, who spent much of his life in Spain as well as France, talks about his affection for both countries through the story's narrator and main character, Robert.

"I loved France and Spain next to my own country. I loved other countries too but the debt was paid and I thought that the account was closed, not knowing the accounts are never closed," Robert says.

The story has until now only been seen by a handful of scholars and academics. It sees characters debating 'the dirty trade of war' in one of Hemingway's favourite haunts, the Paris Ritz hotel.

Andrew F Gulli, an editor at Strand which is publishing the short story, said in a note introducing the work that Hemingway was paying homage to Paris in it.

"Hemingway's deep love for his favourite city as it just emerging from Nazi occupation is

on full display, as are the hallmarks of his prose," Strand said.

The author sent the story along with several others to his publisher Charles Scribner Jr and told him they were 'a little shocking' due to their themes of war.

'Anyway, you can always publish them after I'm dead,' he said in a note to Scribner.

War and travel were prominent themes in many of Hemingway's books. The Sun Also Rises, one of his first successes, centres on the protagonist Jake Barnes and his friends who journey to Pamplona to witness the Running of the Bulls.

Hemingway lived in various places across Spain in the 1930's. He travelled to Madrid in 1937 following the outbreak of the Spanish Civil War the previous year to make The Spanish Earth, a documentary about the Republican war effort.

The experience went on to inspire Hemingway's novel For Whom The Bell Tolls. The story follows an American volunteer named Robert Jordan who is sent behind fascist lines near Segovia to fight with Republican guerrillas.

TOWELS: Dish the dirt on illegal holiday lets.

Illegal renters warned

by Rhys Adam

ILLEGAL holiday lets in Spain are being found out by police due to the large number of towels on balconies.

Whistle-blowers in tourist hot spots across the country are turning up at council offices and dishing the dirt on private homeowners, who often don't pay tax on the 'black market' rentals.

Under new rules, owners of flats and villas must get a licence to rent out their homes or face hefty fines.

In the Balearics, permanent residents of apartment blocks have been told to report any neighbour who is il-

legally renting out their home.

In July, 28 flats in Ibiza were officially reported and more are expected to follow due to an increase in police inspectors who are hot on the trail of any leads.

Warnings are in place to all homeowners across Spain who are considering renting out their homes - which are seen as unfair competition to hotels - without a licence.

Getting caught would mean having to withdraw the property from the market and could mean facing a fine of up to €40,000 with reductions for early payment.

Car blaze

FIREFIGHTERS in Marbella were called out to put out a blaze that engulfed a car in the Puerto Banus area last Sunday.

The blaze happened at around 8pm while four people were in the car on the road near to the port of the area, which is popular with holidaymakers. Firefighters extinguished it shortly after it broke out.

Those inside were able to get out of the car without injuries, according to Marbella's mayor Angeles Muñoz.

Muñoz said on Twitter that

she was grateful for the quick response from firefighters in putting out the blaze. She added authorities had now moved the car off the road.

One theory on the cause of the fire was reportedly said to be that the car's battery had overheated. This has not yet been confirmed.

Local Police cordoned off the area while firefighters tackled the blaze.

Witnesses reported hearing explosions, one of which left a 24-year-old woman with an ear

injury according to emergency services, who added a 50-year-old man was also hurt. Both were treated at the scene.

A video posted to Facebook showed onlookers and police officers watching on as flames spread across the car. The column of smoke was visible from other parts of Puerto Banus, witnesses said.

Those inside the car were reportedly not Spanish, but their nationalities were unknown in immediate reports after the blaze.

Well done councils

ALTHOUGH Spanish councils can have something of a tendency to be bureaucratic they are often very different from UK councils in the way in which they look after residents.

The concept in the UK of having an overseas resident's councillor or department (except perhaps in areas where there is large scale immigration from Africa or the sub-continent) would be quite unusual and on the face of things, there are now far more coalition councils in Spain which means that they are in many faces more balanced.

Rubbish collection for purposes of hygiene and the heat is generally daily and in many towns, particularly those near to the coast, there is a daily watering of the streets and cleaning of the beaches.

Apart from the regular fairs and fiestas, councils go out of their way to provide entertainment with many towns now offering weekly or one off music events and they don't just bring in local amateur groups, but often pay quite high amounts for some well-known Spanish bands.

In some ways, there is almost too much entertainment and it can be quite irritating to neighbours who are disturbed by the noise of the music and the coming and going of the crowds.

All in all however, we have to admire the way in which so many councils endeavour to look after their residents and hopefully the days of corrupt local politicians are in the past so the money collected through tax will be used on the people rather than disappearing into a small number of pockets.

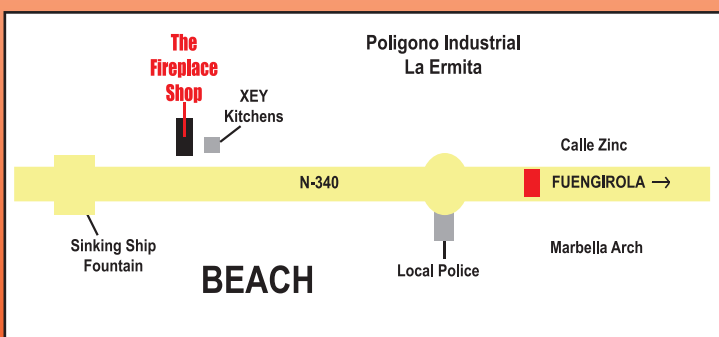

Saudi arms sales

SPAIN'S arms industry sold more than €361 million in armaments last year to states that are part of a coalition led by Saudi Arabia currently fighting in Yemen's civil war.

The sales figures, from an annual Spanish government report sent to the country's Parliament, show the Saudis were the leaders in the exports.

About €270.2 million in arms was sold to the Saudi state including a transport plane, drones, mortar shells, artillery, ammunition and other equipment.

The figures come as Spain saw a record year last year in terms of arms sales. Around €4.4 billion in weapons was bought from the country, an increase of 7.3 per cent on 2016 levels.

They also come as two political parties in Granada called on public prosecutors to investigate the alleged illegal shipment of arms from the port of Motril.

The parties claimed the ship-

ping of weapons from the civilian port broke a number of Spanish and European Union (EU) regulations.

NGOs including Oxfam and Amnesty International called on Spain to halt weapons shipments to the Saudis earlier this year.

They claimed the weapons were being used in strikes that cause civilian deaths in Yemen, which has been gripped by civil war since 2015.

The war has seen the involvement of Saudi Arabia, as well as the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Morocco and Sudan, on the side of the Hadi government.

They have been fighting against Houthi rebels which are allegedly backed by Iran and the Lebanese Shi'a organisation Hezbollah.

There have been around 17,062 civilians killed and injured in Yemen from March 2015 to last August 10, according to estimates from the United Nations High Commission for Refugees. A total of 6,592 of those lay dead and 10,470 have been wounded.

The High Commission estimates that the majority of casualties, about 10,471, were as a result of Saudi-led coalition airstrikes.

NEWS EXTRA

Police seize tobacco

LOCAL POLICE officers in La Linea de la Concepcion have uncovered around 3,500 contraband cigarettes on Calle Gibraltar which they claimed had a street value of €13,825, with a suspect having been reported to customs authorities.

Park vote

COUNCILLORS in Benalmadena have passed measures to create a new park across an area of roughly 11,000 square kilometres as part of a package of urban development measures for the area near the town's fair-ground.

Works halt

WORKERS in Marbella had to stop renovations to a fountain in the city after mistakenly cutting the wrong section of stone, with repairs set to be done to the Plaza de los Naranjos water feature.

Protest law fines

ONE in every three fines for Spain's so-called 'gag law' has been paid by Andalucians.

Sevilla accumulated the most fines in 2017, totalling 15,420 and amounting to almost €9 million.

Malaga comes in second with 14,300 fines (down from 22,000 in 2016), the equivalent of €8 million.

The law for the Protection of Citizens was created in a cloud of controversy and its status continues to be questioned three years later.

It refers to laws in which certain liberties, in context, are declared crimes eg expression, in-

formation and demonstration.

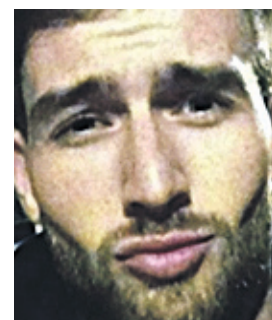
President Sanchez has partially repealed the so-called law, but has not yet found the 'legislative framework' or the time to address it.

The initial law came into place in March 2015 and provoked an outcry as a perceived unnecessary restriction, as 'any serious public disturbance' against the Congress, the Senate or the autonomous governments was strictly forbidden.

Feminist activists, journalists, NGOs and even Twitter users have been prosecuted under the legislation.

Brit held for rape

A BRITISH man has been arrested after allegedly 'tying up, raping and beating' a woman in her flat in Mallorca.

Dylan Rogers, 26, who apparently lives and works in the resort of Magaluf, is alleged to have attacked the 22-year-old victim at an apartment in s'Arenal, near the island's airport.

She was taken to hospital after her ordeal with bruising to her arms, legs and face.

Police sources confirmed the victim appeared to have

been physically assaulted as well as sexually attacked.

Officers were called to the crime scene around 4.30pm last Wednesday and made the arrest in the early hours of the following morning.

A source said: "She was bound with insulating tape and had bruises on her legs, arms and face.

"The suspect was located in a neighbouring flat and arrested several hours later after officers obtained a key and a warrant to access the

property."

The victim, believed to be 'foreign' is said to have alerted police after freeing herself from her binds.

Rogers has not been charged with a crime yet, as is normal in Spain where charges are only laid shortly before trial.

Led into the courts in shorts and t-shirt on Friday, he was questioned by a judge as part of an ongoing criminal investigation. It's reported that he was remanded in custody.

France asylum offer

THE French government has said it would be prepared to take migrants from a rescue boat that picked up migrants near Libya and docked in Algeciras last Thursday.

The French Presidency said it would offer to accommodate around 20 of the people from the Open Arms rescue ship in a show of 'European solidarity.'

The announcement from French officials and the decision by Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez to allow the ship to

dock follows its turning away by both Italy and Malta.

The people from the boat, including 12 youths, are now set to face an asylum application process which could take them up to two years to complete, according to reports. It includes health tests, interviews and identity checks.

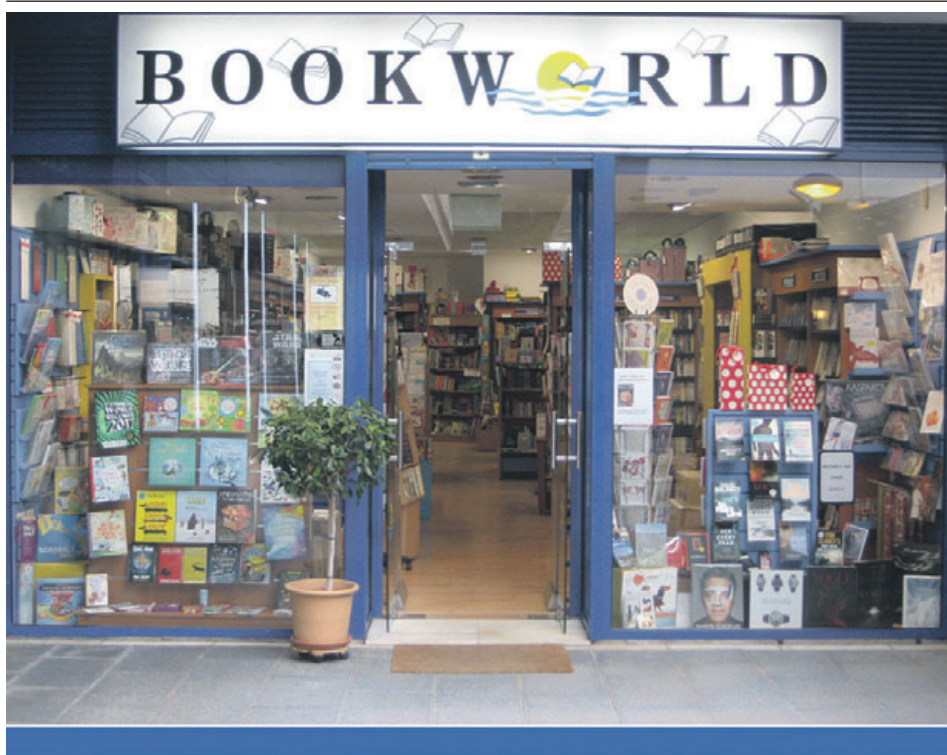
French officials are due to travel to Spain to begin speaking to the migrants about their potential applications to seek asylum in the former country.

The news comes as Spain

opened its first refugee camp in Cadiz Province earlier this week to accommodate the growing number of arrivals.

Pedro Sanchez said Madrid was also planning to open a new Migrant Processing Centre in Algeciras at a cost of around €30 million.

More than 23,000 migrants, many of which are refugees fleeing war in sub Saharan Africa, have arrived in Spain since the start of this year according to United Nations figures.

Baby left in car dies

A BABY girl has died after being left in a scorching car for eight hours in 30C heat in Mallorca.

The 10-month-old's grandfather told police he forgot she was in the back of his car when he went for a coffee at 7am.

He only discovered his mistake when he returned to his vehicle at 3pm.

Police questioned the 56-year-old on suspicion of manslaughter, but released him without charges pending an ongoing investigation.

A passing doctor is said to have tried to revive the child but as in the case of paramedics who attended, could not save the youngster's life.

The first officers called to the tragic scene are believed to have broken down in tears

after it was confirmed she was dead.

Police confirmed today an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the baby girl's death was underway and a local judge would now have to decide whether to press charges.

The child is understood to have been asleep when her grandfather left her in the back of a Renault Megane Scenic in s'Hort des Cabres Street in the Mallorcan town of Manacor.

He suffered an anxiety attack after realising what he had done and had to be treated at Manacor Hospital before being questioned by police.

It's not yet been revealed where he had gone after having a coffee.

An autopsy is due to take place.

Migration ship refused docking

SPAIN has rejected an appeal from a boat carrying 141 migrants picked up in the Mediterranean that previously sent out an SOS docking request to European Union (EU) countries.

The Aquarius, which rescued the 84 men and boys and 57 women and girls off the coast of Libya last Friday, has had other requests rejected by Malta and Italy.

Spain's ports were not the nearest for the vessel and were therefore not the safest, according to sources from the government in Madrid.

The Italian transport minister said the British should take responsibility for letting the vessel dock due to it flying the flag of Gibraltar.

"The ship is now in Maltese wa-

ters and under the flag of Gibraltar, at which point Britain must take responsibility for it and its passengers," he said on Twitter.

Local officials in Barcelona said the city's council would be willing to take the boat despite Madrid's refusal.

Laia Ortiz, a council social rights spokesperson, said Barcelona would always be committed to saving lives.

"Members of the European Union need to take responsibility because these people are fleeing dire circumstances and need to be rescued," she said.

Jean-Claude Gaysot, the head of the port of Sete in France, said he would be willing to allow the boat to dock there.

"The only condition is getting the

green light from French authorities," he said.

Gaysot said he understood there were concerns about smuggling and trafficking which crossed over into the issue but added that was secondary to saving lives.

"Everything must be second in relation to saving the lives of families, women and children. This is about human lives and the problem is first and foremost a humanitarian one," he said.

French authorities did not rule out allowing the boat to dock earlier this week but they also did not state they would do so.

Spain allowed the Aquarius and one other boat to dock in Valencia City in June and authorities arranged for the 629 passengers to be granted asylum in the country.

The news comes as Amnesty International accused the EU of presiding over migration policies that have led to rising deaths in the Mediterranean.

Matteo de Bellis, an asylum specialist with the group, said the number of deaths had increased 'significantly' in recent months.

"The responsibility for these growing numbers rests with European governments who are more concerned with keeping migrants and refugees out of their borders than saving lives," De Bellis said.

"European governments are in cahoots with the Libyan government to contain refugees and migrations there despite the terrible violations they are enduring from coastguards and in detention centres," he added.

Barcelona attacks - one year on

Spain remains on high alert as authorities claim several plots foiled

AUTHORITIES in Spain remain concerned about possible terrorist attacks in the country as Cataluña approaches the one-year anniversary of strikes there today (Thursday) and tomorrow (Friday).

Senior police officials said they had foiled around a dozen plots over the past four years which included gun raids and a plan to poison water supplies in major cities.

The plotters were linked in most cases to the Islamic State and other fundamentalist terror organisations, they added.

The attacks in Barcelona and Cambrils and explosions in Alcanar on August 16 and 17 in 2017 claimed the lives of 24 people including eight attackers. More than 152 people were injured.

Spain's Interior Ministry has kept the country's terror threat level at four out of five since last year, meaning the risk of an attack is high.

Francisco Jose Vazquez, a senior Guardia Civil officer, said the threat level was justified given the amount of plots uncovered.

"We can assure the public that jihadist activity is currently latent in Spain. Recently we have investigated and raided cells that were plotting attacks similar to the ones seen in Berlin in 2016 and on Westminster Bridge in London in 2017," Vazquez said.

The Berlin attack saw several people run over by a truck at a Christmas market in the city. Khalid Masood ran over pedestrians on Westminster Bridge before stabbing a police officer as he attempted to get onto the Houses of Parliament estate in March last year.

The Cataluña incidents saw one house explode on August 16. The cause is believed to have been a stockpile of explosives accidentally going off and a second blast occurred during

evacuation efforts.

Younes Abouyaaqoub drove a Fiat Talento van down the pavement of Barcelona's La Rambla the following day at high speed before fleeing on

foot.

He hijacked a car in the city's university quarter, stabbed the driver to death and fled before being killed in a shootout with police in Subirats on August 21.

Houssaine Abouyaaqoub, Omar Hichamy, Mohamed Hichamy, Moussa Oukabir and Said Aalla bought four knives and an axe and donned fake bomb vests before ramming pedestrians in Cambrils on August 18.

Four of the attackers were shot and killed on site and a fifth died in hospital. A 63-year-old Spanish woman was stabbed to death in the strike and six other people were injured.

Police later said the five were linked to the attacker in Barcelona. The motives in all cases were said to be support for the Islamic State and other terror groups.

Others cited Western intervention in countries such as Syria and Iraq which Spain has played a minor role in.

Ambulance crew attacked

AN ambulance crew trying to attend to a patient had to take refuge inside their own vehicle as a man attacked them, repeatedly spearing the bonnet with a beach umbrella.

They had been called out to a home in the El Palo district of Malaga to care for a member of the public, but once there they were confronted by an angry relative of the patient.

He was described as being so violent his own family threw him out of the house to allow the doctor, nurse and medic to attend to the patient.

But while inside giving their patient the assistance needed, the attacker started to take his anger out on the ambulance by throwing a chair at it, according to Medical Union of Mala-

ga (SSM) official, Jose Becerra.

Once finished with the medical call the emergency workers went out to the ambulance only to be confronted by the attacker. He had the sharp end of a beach umbrella in his hand and was threatening them.

The crew had to hide inside their own ambulance and call police while the attacker continued his rage outside.

He attacked the bodywork of the ambulance with such force he left gaping holes in the bonnet. Now the vehicle has had to be taken off the road during one of the busiest periods of the year.

National Police have arrested a man in connection with the incident.

Migrants arrive in Malaga

A TOTAL of 150 men out of 207 people who arrived at Malaga City's port after

being picked up in the Mediterranean have been housed in a local sports centre.

The 150 migrants, mainly of sub-Saharan African

origin and many of them refugees, arrived at the Jose Paterna centre in the El Palo area of the city late last Monday.

A total of 45 men of the

207 people rescued in the Alboran Sea have been taken to police stations in the city.

Red Cross volunteers have been tasked with looking after 12 women and 75 of the 207 required medical attention according to the Spanish government's representative in Malaga Province.

The arrival of the migrants follows the rescue of a total of 531 people in the Alboran Sea on Monday.

At least one child was among those crossing the sea in a total of 13 boats,

some of them inflatables.

The crew of the Maritime Rescue mission were dispatched in the early hours of Monday morning when reports emerged that boats had been spotted near the Strait of Gibraltar.

A total of 207 out of the 531 migrants rescued on Monday were selected for processing in Malaga's port.

The efforts of coastguards were part of wider operations to rescue migrants which have been ongoing this week and for the past few months.

Valencia wild fire extinguished

A FIRE that burned 3,270 hectares of land, destroyed or damaged 40 homes and forced the evacuation of 2,620 people was finally put out a week after it started.

At its height the blaze which was started by a lightning strike in the Llutxent area of Valencia threatened the seaside resort town of Gandia.

More than 700 ground-based personnel and 31 helicopters and planes were drafted in from Valencia, Castellon and Alicante, as well as from the forestry service and military units to contain the fire which had been whipped up by strong gusts of winds.

By Friday the blaze, which had started in the early hours of Monday morning, was declared 'stabilised' and it was finally extinguished by 8pm on Sunday.

The municipal districts of Gandia, Llutxent, Pinet, Ador, Barx and Quatretonda were affected, with 120 people from Pinet joining 2,500 evacuees from La Drova and the Montesol and Montepino urbanisations.

Those people evacuated have been allowed back to their homes to assess any damage, with the national government pledging to support those affected with grants to repair damage.

Local authorities may also be helped with cash to reforest affected areas. So far this summer, fire has destroyed a total of

11,722.90 hectares in Spain, according to the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, but these figures do not include the latest blazes in Nerva, Moguer, Almonaster Huelva, or Llutxent.

It is still 84.63 per cent less than in the same period of the previous year (76,625 hectares).

Union deal

OFFICIALS from a Trade Union representing staff members at the container terminal of the port of Algeciras have reached an agreement with managers there on working conditions for their members after years of disputes including a strike in 2015.

Ryanair pilots strike

A RYANAIR pilots' walkout saw the cancellation of four flights in Malaga last weekend out of 78, covering destinations throughout Europe and grounded across Spain.

The strike was part of industrial action taken across Europe as part of a long-running dispute between pilots and company bosses over pay and conditions. Malaga airport and that of Sevilla were two of the most severely affected in Andalusia.

All four flights grounded to and from Malaga were either arriving from or leaving for Germany. There were two departures and two arrivals linking the Costa del Sol airport with Frankfurt and Dusseldorf, according to Ryanair.

The Spanish Pilots' Union (SEPLA), which did not strike over the weekend, said it wanted to express solidarity with crew taking industrial action elsewhere in Europe.

"Ryanair pilots elsewhere in

Europe are demanding real dialogue with the company and an end to delays to ongoing talks which our union has also experienced," SEPLA said in a statement.

The union added it had filed a complaint with Spain's National Court over Ryanair's alleged failure to apply the coun-

try's labour standards to its workers.

"The only thing we want is for our pilots to have the rights they are entitled to under Spanish labour regulations, as well as the ability to bargain collectively," SEPLA said.

Ryanair said in a statement that the strikes were 'regret-

table' and 'unjustified' and added it was grateful to those pilots who still attended work.

"We want to apologise to customers affected by this unnecessary disruption and we ask the striking unions to continue negotiations instead of calling any more unjustified

strikes," the company said.

A total of 400 flights were axed as part of the 24-hour Europe-wide strike. An estimated 70,000 passengers are estimated to have been affected across the continent last weekend.

Delays continued into next week after air traffic control staff walked out in France, Germany, Spain, Greece and Croatia. About 220 out of 2,493 of Ryanair's flights were affected by those strikes on Monday.

The strikes follow a long running dispute between Ryanair crew and the company. Ryanair's refusal to recognise trade unions led to walkouts late last year and the company later agreed to open talks with union representatives.

Some unions including SEPLA claimed these talks have been delayed or are not progressing. Ryanair claimed union members' walkouts were preventing dialogue.

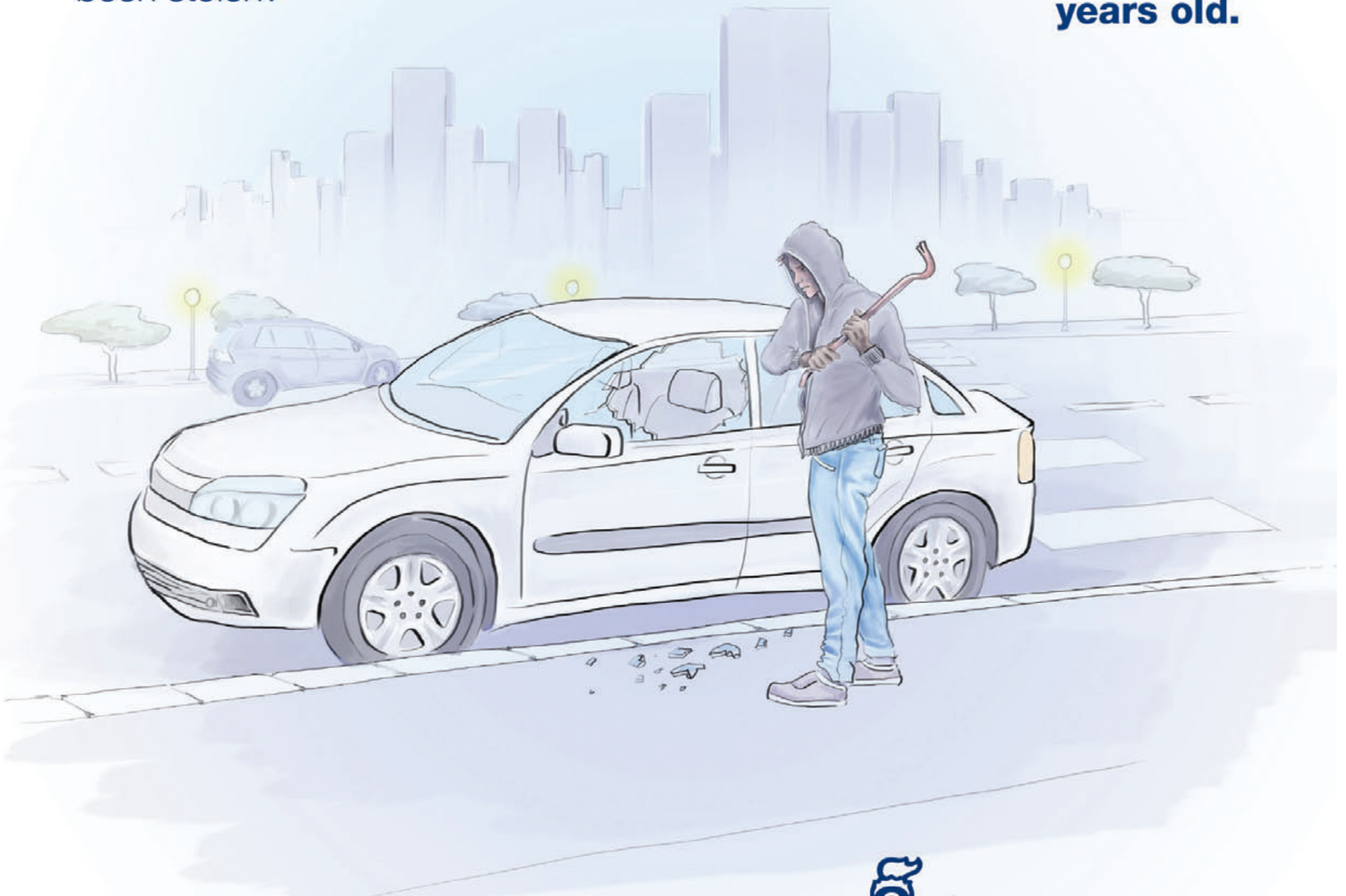

Cultural tourism rises

THE number of tourists paying a visit to Spain's cultural sites and attractions has risen by 23 per cent this summer compared to last year, according to a study.

The total number of holidaymakers who arrived in Spain was about 8.5 million during June, according to the latest statistics from tourism officials.

Data showed that those holidaying in Spain still tended to opt for beach holidays in areas such as the Costa del Sol and Costa Blanca.

The figures also showed the share of tourists taking in the country's culture offering was rising as a share of the total, according to the Weekendesk website's study.

The Guggenheim Museum in Bilbao in the Basque Country was one of the most popular. The gallery displays modern and contemporary art and is also famous for its avant-garde architecture.

Visits to aquariums, zoos and areas such as national

parks have risen by 20 per cent so far this summer in comparison to the same time last year. The Cabarceno Nature Park in Cantabria was the most popular of its type of attraction.

Data analysts said statistics from Cantabria and elsewhere in the north of Spain showed growth in off-beach holidays

in those areas.

Figures also showed beach tourism continued to grow during June in comparison to last year. The number of travellers expected to travel to the Costa del Sol between June and September numbers more than seven million, a 1.5 per cent in-

crease on summer 2017.

Elias Bendodo, the head of the Costa del Sol tourist board, said the authority estimated tourists would bring an extra €7.4 billion to the region's economy. The southern destination is currently the most popular with tourists out of those in Spain.

Cruise stats



RISING NUMBERS: A total of 4.5 million cruise passengers came to Spain up to June.

THE number of people arriving in Spain aboard cruise ships rose to 4.5 million in the first months of this year, according to data from the country's port authorities. Authority statistics showed around 1,990 docked in Spanish ports in the months up to and including June, an increase of 251 on last year's figures. Ornella Chacon, president of the authority, said efforts should be made to promote the industry.

"Cruise passengers generate direct and indirect jobs in local economies which also improves the quality of life for thousands of families," Chacon said. The Canary Islands led the way in the increases, with the number of cruise passengers arriving there increasing by 35.6 per cent to 1.3 million.

They were followed by Spain's Mediterranean ports at 19.9 per cent to 2.76 million and its Atlantic ports with 14.8 per cent. Cruises have been a divisive issue in Spain. Protestors demonstrated against the arrival of the Symphony of the Seas in Palma in Mallorca earlier this year. Locals in Almeria City have previously complained about the impact of ships arriving in its port on their health and well-being. Those in favour of the ships argue it boosts local economies and increases wealth while those against cite environmental concerns and 'touristification.'

The latter term refers to price increases that follow rising tourist numbers and small areas often having to cope with more people.

Sanchez Merkel meeting

SPAIN'S Prime Minister and the German Chancellor have said they have found 'European solutions' to migrant arrivals on Spain's and the continent's southern frontiers following a meeting last Saturday.

Pedro Sanchez and Angela Merkel held a joint press conference following talks at Sanlucar de Barrameda in Cadiz Province. Merkel was staying at the Prime Minister's summer residence in the Doñana National Park in Huelva Province.

Sanchez said the two had agreed to push for more dialogue and co-operation with countries such as Morocco which many migrants travel through in order to reach Spain.

He added he and the German Chancellor had agreed to begin talks with the European Union (EU) with a view to making more aid available for border security in Morocco. The Spanish enclaves of Ceuta and Melilla share a land border with the North African country.

Merkel said the EU's exist-

ing Dublin system, which states that each member state is required to process asylum requests for those arriving on its soil, was not working.

She added her and Sanchez had spoken about trying to find a system that would fairly distribute arrivals across the bloc's member states.

"Germany and Spain are counting on European solutions," Merkel said.

The German Chancellor added she was now seeking to strike a similar deal with Greece, another leading desti-

nation point for migrants travelling to Europe.

The meeting comes as an agreement between Germany and Spain on migrant transfers came into force yesterday.

The deal means migrants arriving in Germany but who are already registered in Spain will be returned within 48 hours.

There have been no cases since mid-June where the arrangement would apply, according to German media reports.

EU leaders are now set to meet in Salzburg in Austria for a summit on migration in September. Sanchez and Merkel are expected to take their proposals from last weekend's meeting to the talks. They are expected to

be backed by the leaders of France and Portugal but they could face opposition from countries such as Italy, Austria and Hungary. Anti-immigration feelings hold sway among senior officials in the latter states.

At least around 23,500 migrants arrived in Spain since the

start of this year, more than arrived in 2017 and a larger amount than Italy and Greece have taken in.

Many of the migrants coming to Europe are refugees fleeing war and conflict in sub-Saharan Africa, according to United Nations officials.

Probe grounds fighters

SPANISH fighter jets stationed in Estonia have had their flights suspended after Spain's Ministry of Defence and NATO opened probes into the misfiring of a missile.

Juri Luik, Estonia's Defence Minister, said the launch of the air-to-air missile from a Spanish Eurofighter was "extremely rare" and "regrettable."

Luik added the Estonian government's priority was to guarantee security and continue to work in co-operation with NATO allies.

Estonia's Prime Minister Juri Ratas spoke with NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg about the incident which took place on Tuesday August 7. He has asked the head of the alliance for an explanation.

Ratas said no one was injured and added he had asked NATO to clarify how the pro-

jectile was fired in Estonian airspace 'without delay.'

"I told Jens Stoltenberg that it was a serious incident and that we are understandably worried," Ratas said in a statement.

Spain's Ministry of Defence said the incident took place when two Spanish Eurofighters were taking part in an exercise with two French Mirage 2000 warplanes.

One of the Spanish planes fired an air-to-air missile during the manoeuvres. All the planes later returned to the Siauliai air base in Lithuania without incident.

The cause remains unknown but it is suspected to have been accidental, according to Spain's Ministry of Defence.

Estonian media has speculated as to the location of the

missile, with almost 60 people alerting authorities to possible sites.

It is believed to have exploded in mid air over Jogvera County in central Estonia, according to the country's air force commander Riivo Valge.

Valge said his team were almost certain the missile was destroyed but they would be 'cautious' while they confirmed this.

Estonia's Prime Minister said the missile caused no damage and repeated his country's commitment to NATO.

"The NATO mission makes an important contribution to the security of Estonia and the entire alliance," Ratas said.

The Eurofighter, from the Vilkas Bap-47 squadron, was taking part in NATO's wider operations in the Baltic.

Heist murder rap

AN international jewel thief has been convicted of murdering a 28-year-old Spanish man and his friend.

Colombian-born Gonzalo Andreas Gomez-Remolina, aged 36, and his brother Christian - who killed himself in prison before his own murder trial - stabbed Ruben Fuente and Carlos Ayala in Clapham, south London, in 2007.

Mr Ayala had helped the defendant in at least one burglary and named his killer with his dying breath, the Old Bailey

heard.

Spaniard Mr Fuente was in the 'wrong place at the wrong time' and stabbed eight times as he tried to escape, the jury were told.

Prosecutor Brian O'Neill QC said Mr Ayala and the Gomez-Remolinas brothers had 'fallen out... over dividing the spoils.'

It escalated when Mr Ayala got some friends to break into the brothers' flat and the Colombians were beaten, their girlfriends tied up and watches and cash stolen.

The Gomez-Remolinas re-

taliated by attempting to run over Mr Ayala and Mr Fuente in a car park.

During his trial, the defendant denied being involved in the killings, saying he had bolted when Mr Ayala produced a knife and that his brother had confessed to the killings whilst the brothers fled on a Eurostar service to Paris.

However, the jury did not believe him and convicted him of both murders.

After the trial, Mr Fuente's family said they had 'endured the greatest heartache.'

€170m coke bust sees drug lord, 85, held

A NOTORIOUS drugs kingpin has been held in a cocaine smuggling crackdown during police raids across Spain.

Manuel Charlin, 85, was arrested after armed officers swooped on his palatial mansion in Vilanova de Arousa, Galicia.

It comes after 2.5 tonnes of the drug worth more than €170 million was seized from a boat near the Azores archipelago, Portugal.

At least 18 other suspects have been held in connection with the probe, including his son Melchor Charlin, as investigators

stormed properties in four other villages in the northern region plus private homes in Toledo, Huelva and Marbella.

Charlin is among the most powerful drugs lords in the country and in 1999 received a 20-year sentence for sailing 600 kilos of cocaine from Colombia to Galicia.

His Charlines clan is described by local media as 'without a doubt the most violent organisation' operating in Galicia.

In 2003, he and 13 others were jailed for 15 years and fined more than €2.9 million for money laundering and tax fraud.

The sentence was later reduced to 13 years and he was freed in 2010.

Hundreds injured in stage collapse at Vigo



CONCERT CHAOS: Victims of the accident are treated in a makeshift tent.

A SECTION of wooden jetty collapsed at a sports and music festival in Spain, injuring more than 330 people, five seriously.

The stage was right on the seafront of the north-west city of Vigo, Galicia, and was crowded with people watching a rap artist at the O Marisquiño event.

Police stated that there were no known fatalities, but witnesses described chaotic scenes as people - many of them teenagers - tried to claw themselves to safety.

Some fell into the sea and people's belongings eg mobile phones and handbags were left strewn on the ground.

Emergency services attended to the injured, and divers were deployed to the sea to check for people, as the wooden boards had cracked along a central section.

Reports suggest that the incident happened shortly before midnight on Sunday during the performance of Mallorcan rapper Rels B.

In a tweet Rels B wished

'strength' to the injured and told concerned relatives or friends to contact the emergency help desk set up by festival organisers.

It is not clear why the platform collapsed, and Vigo's mayor Abel Caballero has confirmed an investigation is underway.

A week earlier Elena Muñoz Fonteriz, President of the Vigo Popular Party, had warned on social media that the jetty was unsound and that officials should examine it before the concert went ahead.

Ticketmaster shuts down SeatWave

TICKETMASTER, the American ticket sales and distribution company, has decided to close down their SeatWave programme due to user complaints.

A statement released by the company said: 'We've listened to your comments and we hear you: secondary sites aren't working any more and you're sick of seeing others grab tickets just to resell at a profit.'

As an alternative to the programme, the company is launching a new website with the ex-

change service included.

The ticket giant said their new website will launch across Europe early next year. They added they won't publish any new events on SeatWave, although what's been posted until now will still be in effect.

Ticketmaster want to make sure concert tickets fall straight into the hands of 'true fans' without them having to pay unfair prices in a '100 per cent transparent and secure environment.'

'Child abuse' probe

A TORREMOLINOS beach bar was allegedly the site of a sexual assault last Sunday.

The alleged events occurred in the bathroom of a bar in the La Carihuela area of the town.

Police claimed the perpetrator was an employee of the bar in question. The complainant, a girl under the age of 15, claimed to have been sexually assaulted around midnight in the toilets despite attempting to resist.

The girl made the claims to her parents who took her to a Malaga hospital.

Migrant boat sails

OPEN ARMS, the Proactiva NGO's migrant rescue vessel, has left Algeciras and begun its journey north to Barcelona.

The boat is sailing to restock supplies and to swap

crew members before making its way to the Libyan coast to resume its migrant rescue mission.

In its most recent outing the vessel was responsible for the successful rescue of 87 migrants, including 12 children.

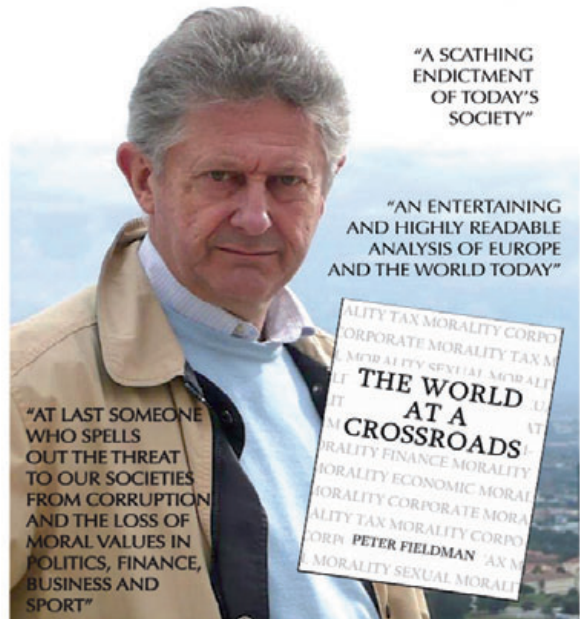

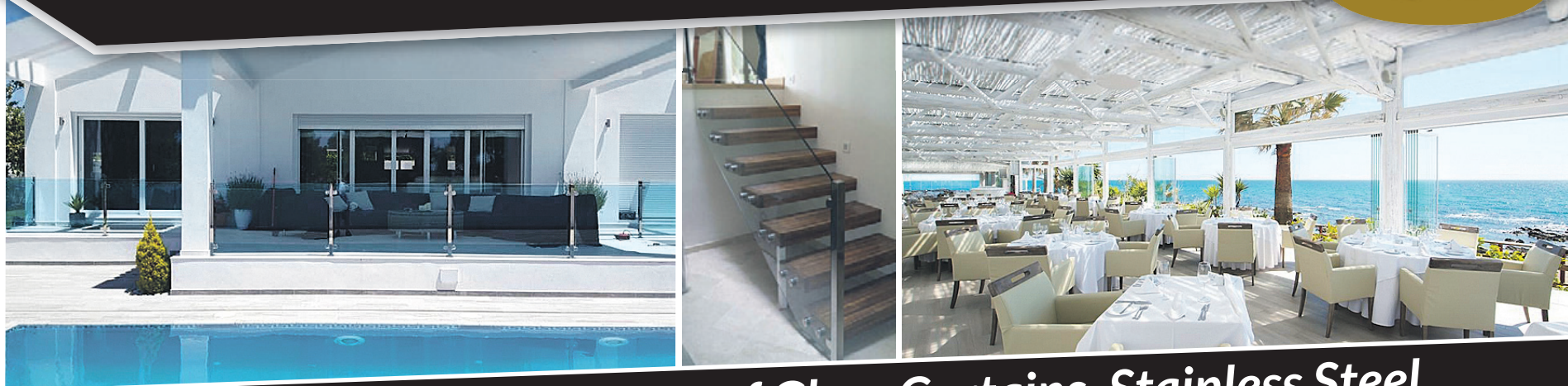

A RECENT writ of accusation by a Murcia-based prosecutor is a stark reminder that certain illegal practices by toxic tenants, and other occupants of real estate, will not enjoy impunity.

The writ refers to a non-paying tenant who - in the middle of an eviction process - chose to retaliate against the landlord by stealing, among other items, two fans, a mattress, a washing machine, a dishwasher, hobs, curtains, a coffee machine, a microwave oven, a table and four chairs.

The State Prosecutor is asking that the tenant serves a minimum of two years in prison as the value of items stolen exceeds €400.

In a similar case, Criminal Court 15 in Valencia has imposed a 14-month prison sentence to a tenant for misappropriating furniture items and a €3,000 fine for causing damage to various others, consequence of 'a

deep resentment and a direct intention of causing financial and emotional harm to the owner,' according to the sentencing Judge.

In Barcelona, the Appeal Court (Section 10) passed a prison term to a tenant that, with the intention of causing the maximum possible damage, knocked walls,

pulled pipes and cables, broke shutters and tore curtains and generally, left the property in a lamentable state of despair.

It's worth noting that in all the rulings, the actions caused by the tenant exteriorise a deliberate and intentional desire to cause monetary loss to the owner.

If the above scenarios want to be avoided by both tenants and owners, it is highly recommendable that parties carefully examine the property to be rented and draw up an inventory (photographic or video if possible) before granting possession.

AID workers in Calais have submitted a formal complaint to France's human rights watchdog after accusing the country's police of harassing them in a total of 600 incidents while working with migrants between November 2017 and last month.

Jail ruling

A PARIS appeal court has upheld a ruling to keep Islamic scholar Tariq Ramadan in prison while a probe into his alleged rape of two women continues after the former academic's lawyer failed to get the charges dropped.

BELGIUM

Asylum plea

A FORMER Rwandan army major sentenced to 20 years in prison over the deaths of 10 Belgian soldiers has applied for asylum in the country after being released early, with Bernard Ntuyahaga's request causing outrage among military members.

War ride

MORE than 70 horse riders are set to trek to Belgium from France in September to mark the 100-year anniversary of the end of the First World War in a 100-kilometre ride organised by the International Cavalry Association.

Ivory haul

AUTHORITIES in Belgium have seized more than 270 kilos of ivory goods since the launch of a crackdown on the material in May and citizens of the country were able to deposit ivory items in containers until last Sunday.

Holiday fears

A DROUGHT in Belgium could mean there are less Christmas trees available in the country this year after data from a nurserymen's union suggested up to 30 per cent of those growing in the Ardennes forest have died from heat.

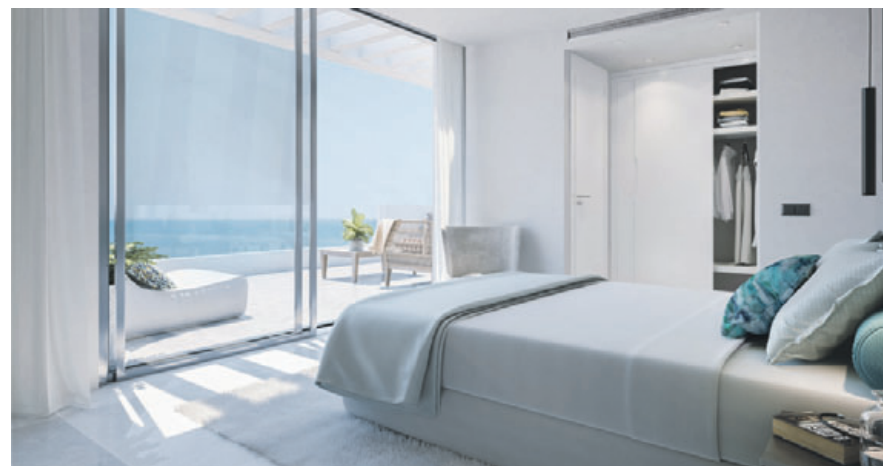

Activist banned from travelling

■ A MEMBER of the Pussy Riot rock band has been barred from leaving Russia over allegations of dodging community service handed down for protests. Maria 'Masha' Alyokhina tweeted airport security had stopped her from flying to London for the Edinburgh Fringe Festival where she was scheduled to perform last week. The ban could reportedly last up to six months.

Prisoner 'barely alive'

■ A JAILED Ukrainian filmmaker who went on hunger strike more than 90 days ago in protest against alleged political detentions claimed he was 'barely' alive in a letter. Oleg Sentsov, from Crimea, is in a prison north of the Arctic Circle serving a 20-year sentence on terror convictions.

Petition gets backing

■ ELECTION authorities in Russia have approved a petition for a referendum on whether to raise the country's retirement age. The Central Election Commission (CEC) gave the go ahead to petitions which called for a poll on plans to raise

retirement ages to 65 for men and 63 for women.

Policy support slump

■ A TOTAL of 16 per cent of Russians back President Vladimir Putin's foreign policy amidst domestic initiatives such as plans to raise the retirement age, according to a survey. Denis Volkov, of the Centre, said many Russians wanted politicians to put their country first instead of intervening abroad. Support stood at 22 per cent two years ago.

Sanctions slammed

■ DIPLOMATS at Russia's Washington DC embassy have claimed new United States sanctions targeting their country in the wake of the alleged poisoning of Sergei and Yulia Skripal are 'draconian.' The penalties, the news of which caused Russian stock and currency prices to tumble last week, follow claims that Russia targeted the Skripals. The embassy branded the accusations 'far-fetched.'

Off the rails

■ A LONDON-BASED media company has produced a guide to Moscow's metro network in an effort to give visitors all the information needed to track down its architectural gems. The Moscow Metro Architecture and Design Map comes in a yellow on red Soviet style booklet reminiscent of the era that spawned the 'People's Palaces,' or stations, of the 1930's. It highlights 43 out of 214 stops.

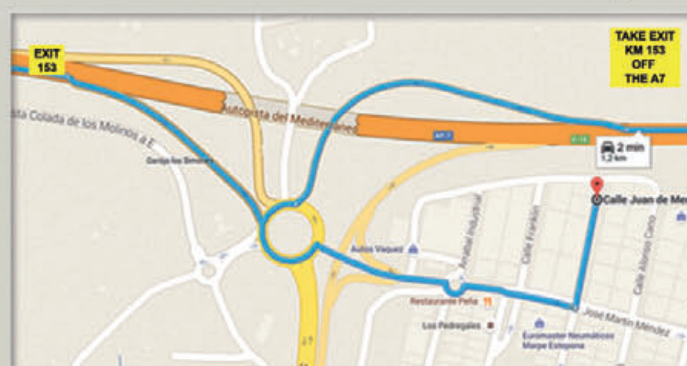

€2.8bn state aid plunge revealed

SPAIN has placed third bottom in a European Union-wide ranking of financial support offered to companies.

A new report by the National Commission of Markets and Competition has revealed how state aid to firms based in the country has been slashed by €2.8 billion - almost half - since 2009.

This represents just 0.26 per cent of gross domestic product with only Italy (0.22 per cent) and Ireland (0.2) contributing less.

And the UK (0.36) also fares badly, falling below the EU average 0.7 per cent.

Mango losses reduced

by John Smith

ALTHOUGH at one time the Mango fashion chain was pushing Inditex (owner of Zara and other high street names) for financial dominance, recently it has been in the doldrums.

Founded in Barcelona by brothers Isak and Nahman Andic it became one of the biggest fashion firms in the world, but having moved into negative profit for a number of years, it is beginning to see a reduction in losses.

At one time, employing 9,000 staff and with a turnover of more

than €2 billion which produced significant profits, its 2017 report shows that it has reduced losses by 45 per cent to €33 million, although sales have dropped €2.194 billion.

At least its gross operating profit has increased by some €115 million which is 50 per cent up on 2016, but this would have been much higher had it not been for a very hot second half of the year in its main markets which saw overall

sales depressed.

Indeed according to the company, had the results of the first half of the year carried through to the second half, then it would have seen a return to profit.

Interim figures for 2018 are encouraging and if they continue to follow the trend of the first six months then final results should be encouraging, especially as the company has reduced its debt €617 million to €415 million.

Mango now has 2,190 stores in 110 countries.

National bank's crypto scheme

SPAIN'S central bank has claimed that cryptocurrency and blockchain technology could help the country's economy.

It comes after the Banco de España (BDE) released a report probing the pros and cons of introducing a virtual version of the state currency.

And according to industry boffins, digital coins and ledgers would particularly benefit monetary policy and financial infrastructure.

BDE senior economist Galo Nuño was the man behind the study, and he argues that blockchain technology could help track the nation's money supply.

It's still cheaper to live in Spain

Good news for expats

A RECENT report suggests that although prices have increased, it is still much cheaper to live in Spain than in the United Kingdom.

Naturally there are regional differences in both countries and there may be a negative affect for new arrivals following Brexit but overall, there are some significant savings to be made for any Brits who want to emigrate to the Iberian Peninsula.

The company thinkSpain highlights the main savings that can be made, with the most striking being in the cost of property with average prices per square metre as much as five times cheaper in Spain with certain costs such as heating also significantly lower.

Public transport is cheaper as well and there are special discounts which can be obtained for pensioners who are looking to travel relatively long journeys by train.

Petrol is still cheaper although by only a few per cent, but if you are lucky enough to live near to Gibraltar, you can pop in there and fill up saving up to a stunning

20 per cent on Spanish prices.

Eating out is generally much cheaper with a choice of set menus at prices that may astound the tourist used to London prices and although the Spanish have increased the margins on wines and

spirits sold in restaurants and bars, it is still possible to buy a decent bottle of wine in a store for around €3 and something drinkable can be as cheap as €1.50.

Whilst looking at 'vices,' beer, spirits and cigarettes are generally

cheaper than the UK and apart from Gibraltar, there are also bargains to be had in both Andorra and the Canary Islands.

There are some negatives, especially with regards to inheritance tax for foreigners and the fact that a spouse may not be able to be left the family property if there are children or other family members in the country, but a good lawyer will be able to advise on the best form of Will and which country it should be prepared in.

If you decide to take up work and are registered with Spanish Social Security then you and your family will be able to take advantage of the health care system and for expatriate pensioners, the UK will currently advise the Spanish health service of your eligibility to be included.

So life (including most 'council taxes') is cheaper, but there is also the added bonus of the warm weather which suits many, although it would be a good idea to check average temperatures across the year as some areas can see exceptional heat in the summer months.

Mercadona phases out plastic bags

AFTER introducing a trial in 66 of its supermarkets throughout Spain, the Mercadona group has announced that with effect from 2019 it will cease to supply new plastic bags to customers.

The company declared that it supported a sustainable policy as early as 2011 and for the future it will be offering consumers the opportunity to purchase recycled plastic, paper or at a slightly higher cost a raffia basket.

The basket in particular has been quite popular with shoppers and has seen an overall reduction in consumption of other types of bags.

Another part of its strategy will be to phase in new household goods such as buckets and brooms also made from recycled plastic.

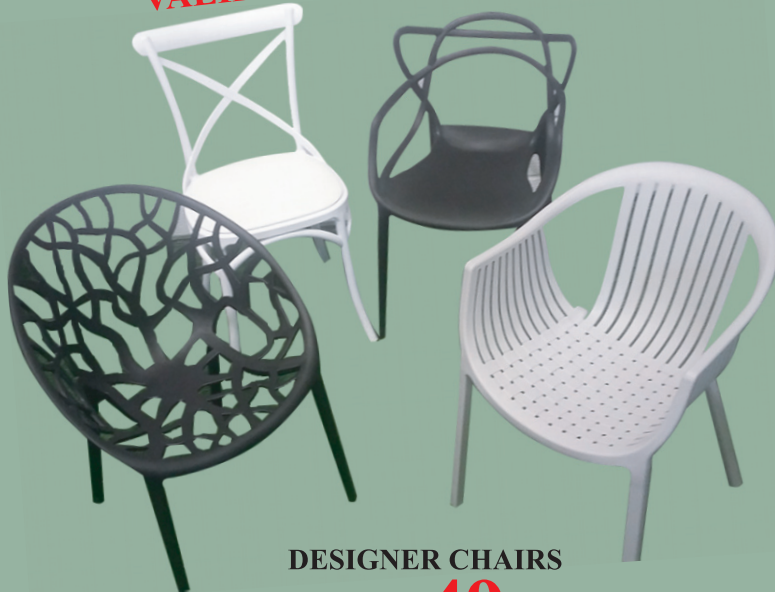

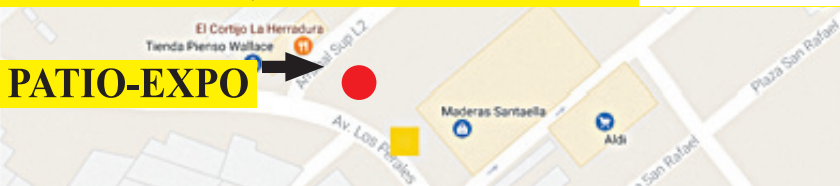

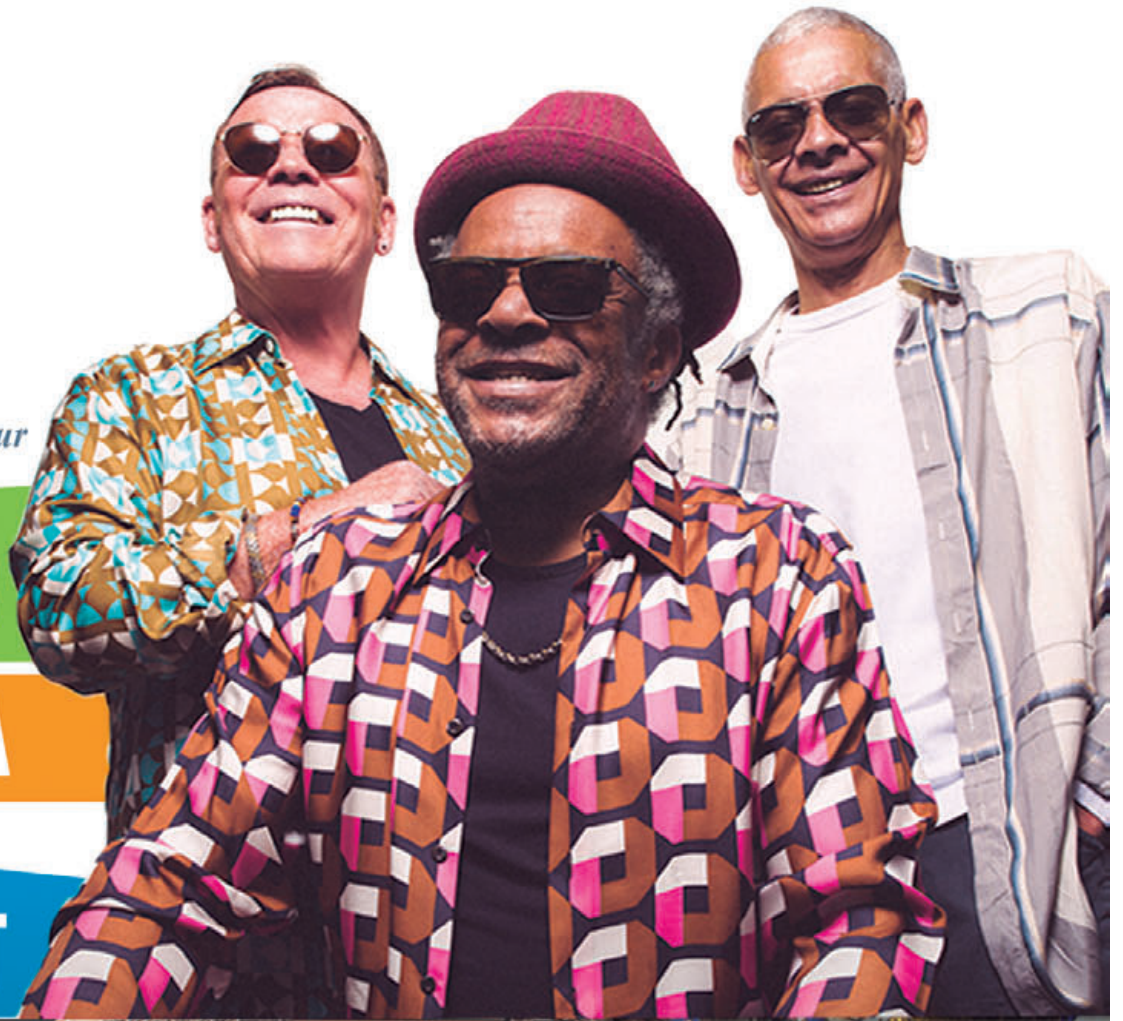

Money grabbing reds are taking fans to cleaners

THIS season, it will cost a supporter a staggering £110 (€123) to buy a replica Manchester United shirt... utterly outrageous!

The weekly salary of the Cambodian textile workers who make the shirts is just £31-a-week (€34.70).

The money-grabbing Premiership club - the most hated football club in the world by the way - already has £3.6 billion (€4.1bn) in the bank from its American owners, the Glazers, plus an annual income of £70m (€78.5m) from Adidas.

There's also a £429m (€481m) seven-year shirt sponsorship with Chevrolet, £285m (€32m) per annum comes in from various commercial deals and almost £200m (€224m) from broadcasting rights.

The club pays out around £275m (€308m) in annual wages (including salaries of £23m (€25.8m) to

Heat can cause traffic accidents

THE August holiday police operation 'salida' sees around 150,000 injuries per year in Spain due to traffic accidents, with young people particularly at risk.

In fact, 17 per cent of traffic accidents may be due to excessive temperatures, according to studies conducted by Prevensis, a company specialised in the analysis of driver behaviour.

When a car's interior temperature reaches 30°C, it increases the risk of driver error by 20 per cent and reduces reaction time by 22 per cent.

Experts from the hospitals Quironsalud Torrevieja and Valencia warn that heat affects the capabilities and behaviour of the driver.

According to Dr Ignacio Garcia, Traffic Unit specialist and assistant to the medical management at Hospital Quironsalud Valencia, "the excess of temperature that we capture in our body surface is transmitted to an area of our brain, the hypothalamus. the attention, reducing the reaction times before a certain circumstance.

Dr Alfredo Perez Cortada, Traffic Unit specialist at Hospital Quironsalud Torrevieja warns, "we should avoid travel in the hottest hours, it is better to do it early in the morning or at the end of the afternoon, but always with daylight."

In addition, an interior car temperature between 35 and 40° is just as dangerous as having drunk five beers. With this heat, the driver stops perceiving between 15 and 20 per cent of traffic signals and the chance of error increases up to 35 per cent.

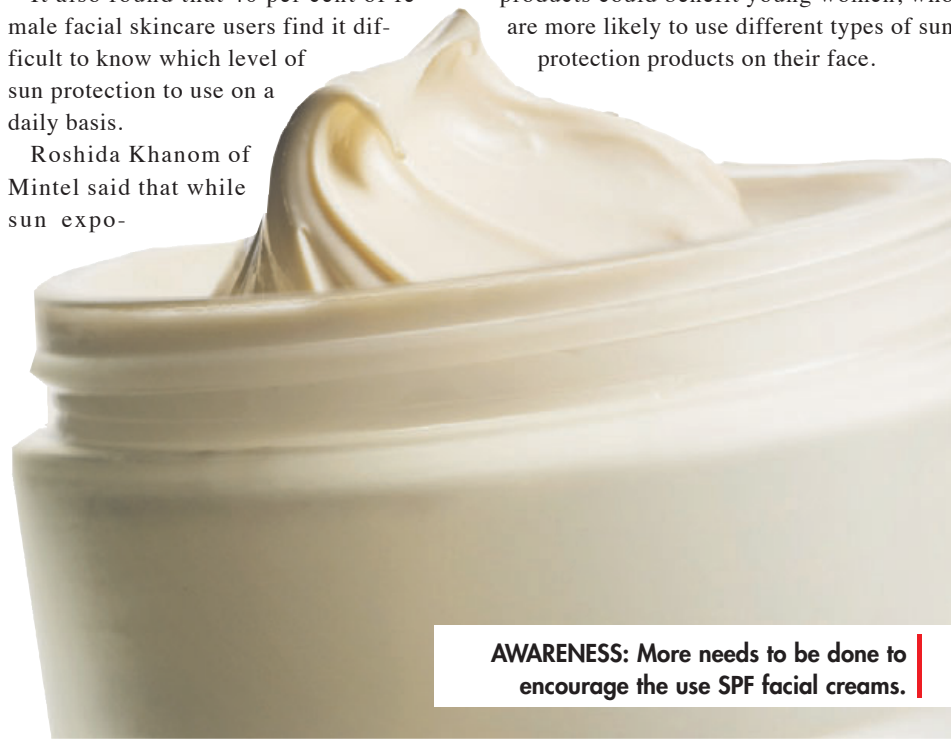

Roshida Khanom of Mintel said that while sun expo-

sure is considered the biggest external factor impacting the appearance of skin, usage of SPF on the face is relatively low.

“Confusion in the sector could be a reason, presenting an opportunity for brands to help women understand how best to use sun protection daily.”

She added that Apps that recommend products could benefit young women, who are more likely to use different types of sun protection products on their face.

Research has shown that the footwear actually changes the way wearers walk, sometimes permanently.

There is no arch or heel support, and you have to grip them with your toes to keep them on.

This can all impact on the rest of the body, with noticeable effects on everything from posture to gait.

According to a Consumer Product Safety Commission report on emergency room visits

due to shoe-related injuries, 27,000 were associated with flip flops in 2016.

Driving in flip-flops is illegal in Spain for good reason. Just like any backless shoe, there's a possibility that they will slip off your feet and get stuck under the

It's a good idea to keep a pair of driving shoes in the back of your car for this reason.

Podiatrists also advise wearing flip-flops for running, hiking, walking long distances, standing for a long time or play-

Sleeping in the heat



PREPARATION:
There are ways to get cool enough to drop off to sleep.

WHEN it's hot outside and you don't have air conditioning, it can be a nightmare getting off to asleep.

But there are ways to get and stay cool for long enough to drift off.

It's advisable to do any exercise a few hours before getting into bed, and to drink plenty of water.

Body temperature is raised during strenuous activity and you retain heat. It's also a good idea to keep a glass of room temperature water by your bed-

side. Ice cold water slows down digestion and metabolism by constricting blood vessels, thereby decreasing the body's ability to cool off.

Eating a heavy meal or spicy food before bedtime may make you feel hotter, so eat a light dinner at least two or three hours before bed.

And contrary to popular belief, avoid a very cold shower before hitting the sack as it can have a rebound effect. Tepid shower or bath is best.

Another idea is to soak your

hands and feet - the body's radiators - in tepid water to cool down.

Heat rises, so the lower to the ground or in the house you are, the more comfortable you will be. And avoid heavy bedding, light cotton or bamboo mats are preferable. If possible, put bedding in the freezer 30 minutes before bedtime.

Don't sleep naked as this does not allow moisture to evaporate between your body and the sleeping surface. Cotton is best.



Luscious locks

SUMMER sun, hot dry air, salty water and chlorine are a heady cocktail of trouble for our tresses.

So it's no wonder we are constantly battling split ends, oily scalps and dull and lifeless locks. But healthy locks can be maintained all summer long.

Messy buns and braids as opposed to a coifed or blow dried hair are the norm during the summer, but it's important to have regular trims. Desert heat dries everything out - including the shaft of the hair, and as the hair grows, it continues to split up the shaft causing more damage.

Like any other part of the body, hair and the scalp needs protection from damaging UV rays.

The seeds of life

THE humble pumpkin could be a man's best friend when it comes to improving sexual health.

And the pumpkin, 'pepita de calabaz' in Spanish, is one of them, in particular its seeds.

An ideal snack, the seeds, or 'pipas,' are available all-year-round and packed with nutrients.

According to a study published in *Indian Journal of Urology*, they are commonly used to strengthen the prostate gland and promote healthy hormone function in men. It claims they may help with benign prostatic hyperplasia, a condition that causes problems with urination due to an enlarged prostate gland.

It's also believed that reduced



sperm quality and even infertility in men may be associated with low zinc levels, a mineral found in abundance in the seeds.

Can he sue the mechanic?

Q. My neighbour, a mechanic, offered to repair my car for an hourly rate. He stripped down the piece involved and I bought the necessary parts. He spent seven hours working on it, for which I paid him.

He then decided he didn't want to work on it any more because he is too busy with other jobs. I said that I could wait until he had time, but he said I should find somebody else. Do we have a verbal contract? Can I seriously threaten to denounce him if he doesn't complete the job?

W C (Costa del Sol)

A. Yes, you have a verbal contract, and, yes, you can bring a case against your mechanic, but your prospects are not good.

First, what does your contract actually say? Did your mechanic promise to finish the job, or only to work on it? Do you have a witness? You cannot 'denounce' him because he has not committed any crime. You would have to sue him for your financial loss. Your legal expenses would surely come to more than you can reasonably claim from him, and your chances of winning are small.

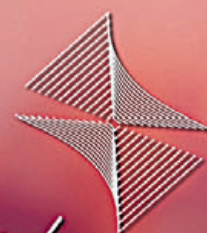

However this is a process that again could be potentially wasting time that is not to spare whilst waiting to be put

through to the relevant country, county, department. This is why it is good to know that our local authorities also have direct lines.

Now it can be confusing as there are direct lines for everything; plus the fact that they have two types of police in

Spain, the National Police and the Civil Police; each with their own responsibilities and numbers.

Red Cross 11811

Emergencies of any kind cannot be planned; otherwise they'd be called appointments. We need to be prepared. However if you don't have a great head for numbers the list above can be overwhelming; so just make sure you know at least these two main emergency numbers: 112 and 092.

Hopefully you may never need to use them but if you do, it will be one less thing to worry about.

NB: For further peace of mind there is also an alert cops app giving a direct line of communication with the police if needed for yourself or to report something you witness.

It also provides your location directly to the relevant authorities should they need to come find you and you don't know how to explain yourself (as is often the case due to language barriers). <https://alertcops.ses.mir>

NOW in its 32nd year, the Malaga Jazz Festival runs from October 29 until November 4 at the Teatro Cervantes.

On October 31, American born Madeleine Peyroux brings her five-piece band to Malaga City to perform her mix of jazz, blues and mainstream. She learnt her craft as a busker on the streets of Paris, but now nine albums into her successful recording career;

she will be playing numbers from her latest album Anthem.

Tickets for this concert cost from €12 to €36.

THIS week I will continue the discussion about B group vitamins:

Niacin (Vitamin B3). Niacin helps the body utilise the energy that is present in food and keeps the skin and nervous system in good order. Good sources are; mushrooms, cereals, eggs, meat, green vegetables, nuts and beans. Symptoms of mild niacin deficiency include fatigue, canker sores, vomiting, depression, poor circulation and indigestion.

Pantothenic Acid (Vitamin B5). Pantothenic acid, like the rest of the B complex vitamins, helps turn carbohydrates into glucose. Glucose is the only carbohydrate that the human body can use directly, starch and sucrose have to be converted to glucose. B5 is also necessary for creating red blood cells, various hormones and maintain healthy digestion. Sources include; mushrooms, legumes and lentils, avocados, milk, eggs, and cabbage. Deficiency is very rare and only found in the severely malnourished.

Pyridoxene (Vitamin B6). Vitamin B6 is important in maintaining a healthy body and developing a healthy brain, so it is essential to make sure high levels are

maintained during pregnancy and infancy. Sources of B6 include beans, poultry, fish, fortified cereals, dark leafy greens, papayas, oranges and Cantaloupe melons. Severe deficiency is rare, but if slight can produce the following: A weak immune system, anaemia, rashes, scaly skin on the lips, cracks at the corners of the mouth and a swollen tongue.

Biotin (Vitamin B7, AKA, Vitamin H: Confused? So am I!) This split-personality vitamin is synthesised by the bacteria in the gut but is also found in organ meats (liver, kidneys), eggs, fish, meat, seeds, nuts, it helps to keep the skin, nails and hair healthy. Biotin deficiency is rare.

This week's recipe is a Caribbean Curry, Curries are normally associated with India, Pakistan, Thailand and to a lesser extent, China. I am not a great fan of adding fruit (except for the citrus varieties) to savoury dishes, but fruits like mango and pineapple can be added to this recipe five minutes before serving.

Caribbean Chicken Curry

Serves 4

1 kg chicken breast meat skinned,
boned and cubed
2 tablespoons of rapeseed or sunflower
seed oil

1 large onion, chopped
4 garlic cloves, chopped
1 teaspoon allspice, ground
1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 tablespoon curry powder
2 chicken stock cubes
1 teaspoon celery salt
2 bay leaves
1 teaspoon of ground mace
2 tablespoons dried coconut
2 tablespoons mango powder
1 can of tomatoes
1 jigger dark rum
200ml orange juice
1 bunch cilantro leaf, chopped
2 teaspoons cornstarch, mixed with a
little water

Fry chicken in oil until browned. Add onion and garlic and fry until both golden. Add curry powder, fry for two minutes on a very low heat. Add all the other ingredients, except for the cornstarch.

Simmer for 15 minutes or until chicken cooked. Add cornstarch/water mix slowly and constantly stirring, to thicken the sauce. Serve with steamed rice.

TWO superb new September rock concerts have been announced for the Benalmadena Auditorium.

Benefits of reducing watering in the garden

GRAEME TYRRELL

ONCE summer is here the effects of the heat on the garden becomes apparent. It is usually too late to save poorly designed gardens without the need to apply a lot of water.

Sometimes it is better to just let the garden survive the best it can and learn from the experience. What has enabled plants to survive the summer is what can be replicated to have a more successful garden the next year.

One of the biggest problems is the incompatibility of the plants we like with the ability of the garden environment to grow the plants we want. The best solution is to learn to like the plants that grow naturally in the Mediterranean climate. They are many and varied.

If you do some research to find the Mediterranean plants that suit your garden environment and the effect you want from your garden then you have the easiest of work to make a garden. If you have natural soil in your garden and the plants are native, preparation and maintenance of a garden is minimal. The need to water the garden will be greatly reduced.

In a truly native garden the watering would principally be to establish new plants that have been introduced to the garden and assist some plants during extended dry and hot periods. Water use in the garden is minimal.

CONTROLLING WATER: Is important for the benefit of everyone.

Normally we garden though to enjoy caring for plants and benefiting from the flowers, fruits and other produce which are not native to the region. We also like to attract and support wildlife in our garden environment. This increases the need to have more water available in the garden.

To minimise this need, soil improvement is

the most important issue to retain moisture in the soil. Soil protection is also very helpful so a good mulch and appropriate shading of zones to reduce direct sun exposure of the soil and plants will also make a big difference to water retention.

Application of water is also very important to regulate the amount of water needed to keep the

root zone of plants moist. Well designed drip irrigation is the most effective way to apply water just where it is needed with minimal time and effort.

There is always a place for a hose to water just what you want and to ensure plants get what they need. The best times to apply water in summer is in the early morning and late evening to reduce evaporation.

Capturing water for the garden can also make a big difference to supply and availability. If you can channel water into storage containers for the garden it will reduce the need for water from other sources. A large container can be enough to supply water for birds for weeks.

Even hilling up ridges around the garden plants and trees can allow the capture of summer storm rain water so it does not just run off into drainage systems. In winter the ridges can be raked out if they are not necessary.

The value of water as a resource needs to be measured against the value of the garden to provide the environmental benefits and produce to support our quality of lifestyle. Gardens are a haven for wildlife so providing water and moisture in a garden can make it an oasis for many birds and beneficial insects.

Reducing the need for water however allows the benefits of water to be shared more widely. Responsible conservation of water allows us to have gardens for the benefit of everyone.

Watch out, wasps about

AS temperatures continue to soar, a dip in the pool has never been more appealing.

But one thing sure to ruin those long summer afternoons is a sharp sting from a wasp or bee that happens to have the same idea.

While it's tempting to kill them, they are good for the environment, and there are other ways to rid your sanctuary of the little invaders.

Wasps love raw meat! So hanging a small piece of leftover cheap steak or beef in an area away from your pool can help entice them away.

Relatively cheap fake wasp nests are available and can be hung around the pool area. Be sure to place them early in the season before they start building their own nests.

But if a large group of the insects have moved in, call in a removal pro.



Bees are a bit easier to remove without having to destroy them.

They are basically looking for a drink, so set up an alternative water source. Keep it going all summer and put a small stone inside in case a bee falls in.

It's important to set it up

before you open your pool for the season so they already have an established water source.

While tumble dryer sheets smell nice to us, bees hate them.

Arrange them around your pool in baskets or use underneath other objects to keep the bees at bay, but change them weekly.

Again, if these solutions don't work, call an exterminator who can humanely remove the nest.

BUZZ OFF: Stinging insects can be a pain.

How dogs could give you a killer disease: Superbugs. Parasites.

Read on and you may never let your pet lick your face again

THEY are mankind's loyal companions. But according to a new study, dogs could be a serious risk to our lives.

Last week, vets warned that many people are overlooking the potentially deadly diseases we could catch from our pets. They carry and spread salmonella, and can infect us with parasites, fungal infections, tapeworm, roundworm and superbugs.

Furious pet owners say the benefits of a dog far outweigh any health risks. So are the vets right?

Tuberculosis

If dogs come into contact with an infected cow, get into a fight with a diseased badger or eat meat infected with the bacteria, they can develop tuberculosis - and pass the potentially deadly lung disease on to you.

The risks are tiny, but real. In 2013, a child caught TB from a family dog in Gloucestershire. The child, who was under 10, made a full recovery, but the dog was put down.

Roundworms

Two-thirds of public playgrounds are thought to be contaminated with roundworm eggs - stomach-churning parasites that grow up to 14in long in canine guts.

The eggs are shed in dog mess and survive for months on the ground. If you garden without gloves or eat food you've dropped on the floor, the eggs can end up inside you.

Once inside the human body, the larvae cannot grow into adult worms, but migrate to the lungs, liver, eyes and brain, potentially causing serious internal damage and even blindness.

"Roundworm look like cooked spaghetti and are probably the most common intestinal parasite in dogs," says Vicki Larkham, a vet with the People's Dispensary for Sick Animals.

'You know if you dog has them because they will be vomiting or you will see the worms.'

Deadly eight-legged ticks

Most dog owners have had to remove a tick from their pet.

The voracious eight-legged insects live in bracken and tall grass and jump onto an animal and bury their jaws into the skin.

They can be as small as a poppy seed, but swell to the size of a pea as they gorge on blood.

Getting them out quickly without squeezing their bodies or leaving their mouths behind is essential because many carry the bacteria for Lyme disease, which causes joint pain, lameness and a high fever.

Dogs can't spread Lyme disease directly to owners, but they can bring ticks into your home.

Tapeworms

Tapeworms are revolting. Some varieties grow 30ft long inside your intestines and live for 20 years. While most are harmless, one potentially deadly species called echinococcosis is putting people at risk in hotspots in Wales, the Welsh borders and the Western Isles.

After dogs eat echinococcosis eggs in infected animal carcasses, the worms grow to adulthood in their guts and shed eggs in dog faeces. Dogs spread the eggs to people by licking their faces after cleaning themselves.

In people the tapeworm causes cysts on the liver, lungs or brain, which can grow 12in across and cause organ failure and even death.

It can take years after infection for symptoms to show.

Caroline Reay, veterinary surgeon at the animal charity Blue Cross, said: "You can prevent tapeworm by the regular use of wormers. If you have a dog in an echinococcosis hotspot you want to worm it every six weeks."

Serious food poisoning

Dogs don't just use their tongues to clean themselves, they happily shove their faces into anything smelly - including dead birds, animal carcasses and fox droppings.

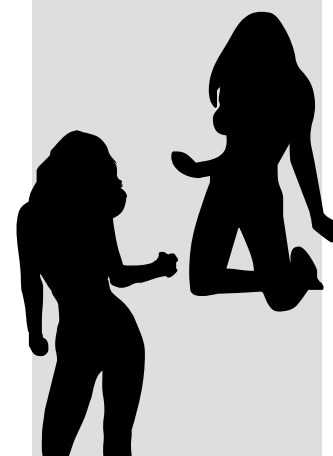

1962 Ferrari 250 GTO: On course to break records

A RARE 1962 Ferrari 250 GTO is expected to sell for between €38 and €50 million in the RM Sotheby's Monterey sale on August 25, making it the most valuable car ever offered at auction.

Between 1962 and 1964, just 36 models of this ultimate racing Ferrari were built, and astonishingly, every single one of them survives to this day.

The GTO was the final evolution of Ferrari's 250 series, which began in 1953 and ended when the final GTO was built in 1964.

The current record price for a car

bought in a public sale is €33 million, for another Ferrari 250 GTO (naturally), paid at auction in 2014.

This Monterey sale takes place during the week of the annual Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, widely considered the most prestigious concours event in the world.

The car up for sale boasts an impressive racing history, including winning the 1962 Italian National GT Championship and class victories in the 1963 and 1964 Targa Florio.

It retains its original engine, gear-

box, and rear axle, as well as its factory Series II body.

"We are thrilled at the rare opportunity to offer a legendary Ferrari 250 GTO at auction," says Shelby Myers, car specialist at RM

Sotheby's.

"Due to the evolution of technology and safety regulations that

followed, the GTO was essentially the final true road racer, marking the end of an era when drivers really got their hands dirty."

Premier League Preview

Liverpool off to a flyer

JURGEN KLOPP described Liverpool's emphatic 4-0 victory over West Ham as "better than I could have expected," as Mohamed Salah's goal set Liverpool on their way to their biggest opening home league win since 1932.

The Reds' superiority was clear from the start and they doubled their advantage when Sadio Mane turned in James Milner's cut-back from six yards.

The Senegalese forward added his second early in the second half when he latched onto Roberto Firmino's clever through pass and guided the ball into the bottom corner.

In a game which saw Naby Keita impress in midfield for Liverpool, substitute Daniel Stur-

ridge rounded off the scoring from a corner with his first touch, seconds after coming on.

Liverpool will travel to Crystal Palace on Monday, while West Ham host Bournemouth on Saturday.

Arsenal were comfortably beaten 2-0 by Manchester City in the Gunners' first competitive game without Arsene Wenger in

charge since 1996.

Raheem Sterling put City ahead in the 14th minute when he rifled home from the edge of the area, and Arsenal rarely threatened afterwards.

City appeared to be able to shift gears at will, and killed off the game when Benjamin Mendy, who assisted both goals, pulled the

ball back for Bernardo Silva to blast in a second.

Arsenal have another tough game at Chelsea on Saturday, while City will entertain Huddersfield on Sunday.

For their part Chelsea enjoyed a comfortable 3-0 win over Huddersfield, despite leaving World Cup heroes Eden Hazard and Olivier Giroud on the bench.

A volley from N'Golo Kante, a penalty from debutant Jorginho and a late third from Pedro gave new manager Maurizio Sarri an ideal start to the campaign.

Manchester United praised 'monster' Paul Pogba after he scored the opening goal and controlled the game in the 2-1 win over Leicester City.

Left back Luke Shaw then scored the first senior goal of his career after converting Juan Mata's aerial pass to double their lead.

Substitute Jamie Vardy headed a late consolation for the Foxes, after Ricardo Pereira's cross had hit a post.

United will head to Brighton on Sunday, with Leicester hosting Wolves on Saturday.

Other fixtures this weekend will see Fulham head to Tottenham on Saturday, Everton host Southampton, and West Ham entertain Bournemouth.

La Liga Preview

Barca still team to beat



MINI MAESTRO: Lionel Messi will once again be key to Barcelona's success.

BARCELONA will look to extend their spell of domestic dominance in La Liga, but the likes of Real Madrid and Atletico Madrid will be keen to put a stop to it.

The Catalan club cruised to the title last season, scoring 99 goals and losing just once, while Real Madrid claimed the Champions League crown for the third year in a row.

Barca kick off their title defence at home against Alaves, and they are firm

favourites to continue where they left off in April.

Diego Simeone's Atletico side will be hoping to make their mark in the league, and they are the only other side outside Barca and Real to have won it in the last 14 years.

But of all the title contenders, it is Atletico who have the trickiest start, taking on Valencia who have big expectations of their own.

There may be a period of

adjustment at the start of the season for Real, who lost both Cristiano Ronaldo and manager Zinedine Zidane in the summer.

However, Los Blancos will not accept a whole season of transition and Welsh forward Gareth Bale will be expected to fill Ronaldo's sizeable scoring shoes.

They kick off their domestic campaign at home against Getafe, a game which should cause them few problems.

Nadal aces Rogers Cup

WORLD number one Rafael Nadal beat unseeded Stefanos Tsitsipas to win the Rogers Cup in Toronto, bringing the Greek's stunning run to an end.

Tsitsipas, who turned 20 on Sunday, beat Dominic Thiem, Novak Djokovic and Alexander Zverev en route to the final but lost 6-2 7-6 (7-4) against the Spanish great.

Tsitsipas, who was the first unseeded finalist in Canada since Germany's Nicolas Kiefer in 2008, has won new fans with some brilliant shot making and an extrovert personality.

But Nadal, 32, was in no mood to pander to the crowd, who were firmly behind the birthday boy appearing in his first Masters Series final.

The French Open champion raced through the first set, but was broken for the first time when serving for the match at 5-4 in the second set.

That handed the momentum to Tsitsipas, who then had a set point at 6-5 only for Nadal to benefit from a net-cord volley.

Nadal regrouped in the tie-break to win his 80th ATP Tour title, sinking to his knees and roaring to the skies.

Earlier, Romania's Simona Halep beat American Sloane Stephens in three sets to win the women's event in Montreal.

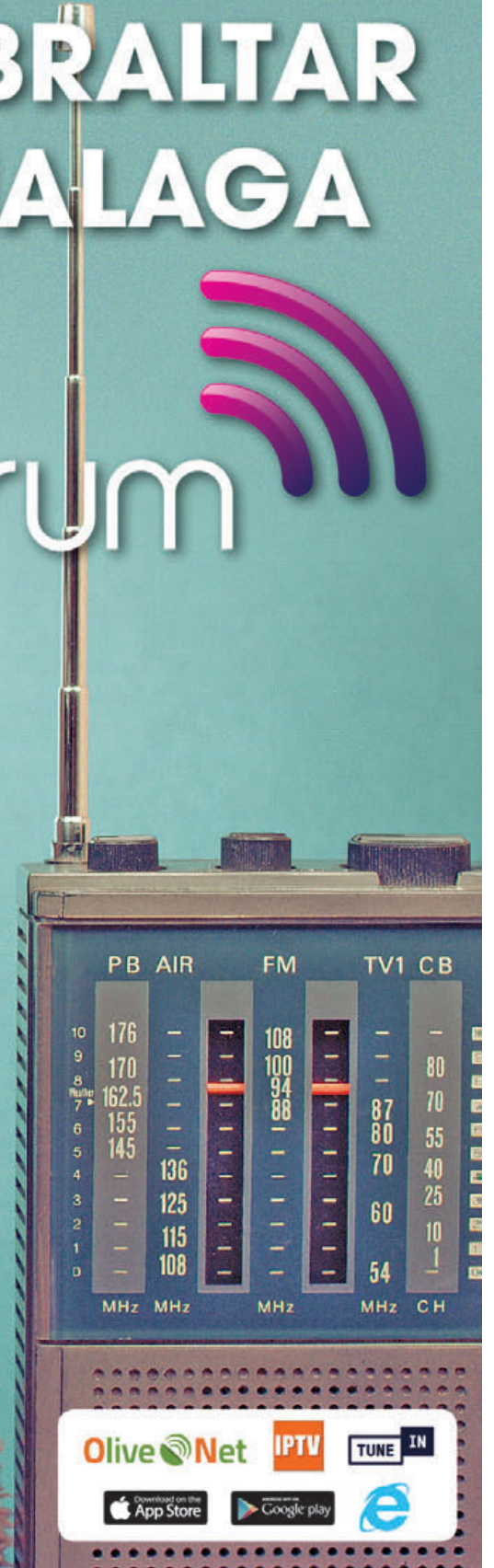
In a rerun of the French Open final in June, Halep eventually came out on top 7-6 (8-6) 3-6 6-2.

Barca edge Sevilla in Super Cup

MARC-ANDRE TER STEGEN saved a last-minute penalty as Barcelona beat Sevilla 2-1 to win the Spanish Super Cup in Tangier, Morocco.

Pablo Sarabia put Sevilla ahead when the video assistant referee gave a goal which had been ruled out for offside.

But Gerard Pique levelled from close range and Ousmane Dembele then fired Barca into the lead.

Sevilla had a late penalty

when Ter Stegen fouled Aleix Vidal but he held Wissam Ben Yedder's weak spot-kick.

Barcelona have been involved in nine of the last 10 Super Cups, but this was the first to take place over just one leg and in a foreign country.

Sevilla, under new boss Pablo Machin, were impressive and led after Sarabia received Luis Muriel's pass and placed it past the goalkeeper

early on, with a goal eventually awarded following a VAR review.

Barca equalised late in the first half when Lionel Messi's free-kick hit the post and the back of goalkeeper Tomas Vaclik, and Pique poached the rebound.

But it was Dembele who sealed the game when he drilled a fierce shot home from 20 yards via the underside of the crossbar in the 79th minute.

Asher-Smith sprints into history

DINA ASHER-SMITH won her third gold medal of the European Championships as she led Great Britain to victory in the women's 4x100m relay final in Berlin.

The 100m and 200m champion ran a superb final leg to pass Germany, Switzerland and Netherlands in the final 30 metres for a fitting end to her campaign.

As a result Asher-Smith became the first woman since German Katrin Krabbe in 1990 to win three European sprint titles at one championship.

Britain then won the men's 4x100m relay in the final event of the competition.

Laura Muir took 1,500m gold for her first major outdoor title, with teammate Laura Weightman claiming bronze.

Another Briton, Eilish McColgan, clinched silver in a dramatic women's 5,000m final, and the five medals on Sunday meant Great Britain finished top of the athletics table with 18: seven gold, five silver and six bronze.

They finished second in the overall table, behind Russia, winning 74 medals.

India beaten at Lord's

ENGLAND completed an emphatic innings and 159-run victory over India at Lord's to take a 2-0 series lead.

James Anderson took 4-23 to finish with nine wickets in the match and Stuart Broad shone with 4-44 as India were bowled out for 130.

The hosts had declared on 396-7, with Chris Woakes finishing on 137 not out, before Anderson reduced India to 17-2.

Rain delayed play twice but India lost wickets regularly and Woakes took the final scalp to secure a crushing win.

England enjoyed the better of the bowling conditions in the match, but India produced two dismal batting performances.

Ravichandran Ashwin and Hardik Pandya's 55-run partnership for the seventh wicket was India's only real stand of the innings and the tourists never looked comfortable under grey skies at Lord's.

Only once has a team come back to overturn a 2-0 deficit to win a Test series, and that was an Australia side that contained Donald Bradman in the 1936-37 Ashes.

There are also concerns for India over the fitness of captain Virat Kohli, who received treat-

ment on the field for a sore back after missing much of the morning session.

Questions still remain over England's top order - they were struggling at 89-4 on Saturday - but Woakes' all-round performance is a promising sign for the hosts.

US PGA Championship: Koepka holds off Tiger charge

AMERICAN Brooks Koepka won his second major of 2018 by fending off a resurgent Tiger Woods to claim the US PGA Championship.

The US Open champion, 28, had led by two shots overnight and shot a four-under 66 to win by two on 16 under par.

Excitement grew at Bellerive as Woods pushed for a first major since 2008, falling short despite a final-day 64.

Koepka made birdies on the 14th and 15th to keep clear of Woods and Adam Scott (67), who finished on 13 under.

It was 14-time major winner Woods' lowest final round at either the Masters, US Open, The Open or US PGA.

However, his efforts were still not enough as Koepka became the first man since Woods in 2000 to win the US Open and US PGA in the same season.

Koepka, watched by his mother and girlfriend from the side of the 18th green, fought back tears after tapping in a par to set a new 72-hole PGA Championship scoring record of 264.

Spain's Jon Rahm finished as the leading

European player on 11 under after a 68, a shot ahead of Belgium's Thomas Peters.

Their performances will have encouraged European captain Thomas Bjorn in the run-up to next month's Ryder Cup in Paris, along with Spaniard Rafa Cabrera Bello's final round of 64.

Chadwick makes history in British F3

JAMIE CHADWICK says her British Formula 3 win shows there needs to be a "step forward" in getting more women involved.

The 20-year-old Briton became the first woman to win a British F3 race on Saturday.

In doing so, she added her name to a prestigious list of former winners who include F1 legends Ayrton Senna, Mika Hakkinen and Daniel Ricciardo.

In a male-dominated sport it was Chadwick's older brother Ollie who

got her interested in racing, and she started karting at the age of 11.

A scholarship got her into the Ginetta Junior Championship before signing for Aston Martin in the GT4.

Together with teammate Ross Gunn they secured the British GT4 title in their first year, and Chadwick became the youngest driver and first female to win the title.

She moved to single seaters in 2017 and made the podium in the British F3 Championship in her

first season, eventually finishing ninth in the championship.

Chadwick says apart from a different changing room, she is treated no differently in the paddock.

"My engineer says he deals with me like every other racing driver and that is exactly how I wanted to be treated," she said.

"It does require a lot of backing, but if the right person comes along, there is no reason why a female can't make it in F1," added Chadwick.
